1. Minutes of the BOG's meetings dated 23.12.2011 & 26.12.2011 - Confirmation of.

The Board of Governors confirmed the minutes of the meeting of the BOGs held on 23.12.2011 & 26.12.2011.

1(a). Corrigendum in the minutes of the Board of Governors meeting held on 25.11.11 regarding consideration for Grant of Permanent Registration to Pakistani Migrant Doctors, who have migrated to India in year 2000.

In the last meeting held on January 3, 2012 Board had enquired about the basis of including the three Universities in the opinion of Law Ministry and the same may be incorporated in the next meeting.

2. Report of Functioning of Assessment Cell - reg.

Read: the matter with regard to report of Functioning of Assessment Cell.

The Board of Governors reviewed the report of the functioning of Assessment Cell, including the available personnel, infrastructure and the procedure adopted in generation and dispatch of the appointments letter to the assessors for the assessment. The board approved the requests of the assessment cell headed by Prof. S.Mantha, Consultant Examination, for increase of two personnel, inclusion of additional professors in the assessment list to increase the pool of assessment list for randomization and proposal to inform travel agent at the time when the assessors expressed willingness to conduct assessment rather than at the time of their dispatch appointment letters. As an immediate measure the Board directed the Council office to provide the services of Dr. Chandana Das, Consultant for the assessment cell. Dr. Purshotam Lal, Member BOG gave several suggestions to improve the assessment process and to maintain transparency at the site of inspection such as videography at pertinent areas during inspection as decided by the assessor, involvement of trained assessors from Quality Council of India, Undertaking accompanied by the affidavit from the Chancellor and VC in case of Deemed University, by Chairman and the Principal in case of private medical colleges and the Principal in case of Government

Medical Colleges and surprise verification visit in addition to the routine assessment. Since provision for videography had been kept in cases whenever assessors deemed it necessary, therefore, the Board decided videography be now carried out in all assessments at the site of inspection of the pertinent areas as deemed necessary by the assessors. The facility for videography (with DVD/CD) will be provided by the college. Regarding affidavit by the respective authorities as opined by the legal Retainer necessary amendment in the Regulation is necessary, therefore, the Board decided to bring out necessary amendment notification. Regarding involvement of QCI, it being an outside agency cannot be involved in the discharge of Regulatory functions.

3. Consideration of recommendations of the UG committee meeting held on 20th September, 2011 and 10th October 2011 with regard to recognition and continuation of recognition.

Read: the matter with regard to consideration of recommendations of the UG committee meeting held on 20th September, 2011 and 10th October 2011 with regard to recognition and continuation of recognition.

The Board of Governors considered the minutes of the UG committee meeting held on September 20, 2011 & October 10, 2011 with regard to continuance of recognition assessment and decision of the Board is as follows. In general the Board decided that in some of the very old established colleges their applications should not be rejected for continuation of recognition solely on the basis of some infrastructural deficiencies. However, the Board directed the Council office to write to the Chief Secretary and Secretary Health & DME to get deficiencies rectified within 3-6 months before considering their application for increase of seats in MBBS or starting of new PG courses.

The Board of Governors considered the matter with regard to approval of Phasewise requirements of the teaching hospitals for various strength of admissions - E-mail from Dean, MAMC and Chairman, Sub-Committee on Minimum Standard Requirement for MBBS admissions (MSR) and decided to have a detailed discussion with the Sub-Committee on MSR in the BOGs meeting to be held on 30th January, 2012.

5. SLP © No. 15865-15908/2003 - Medical Council of India Vs. Dr. Biju Paulose and Ors. in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

Read: the matter with regard to SLP © No. 15865-15908/2003 - Medical Council of India Vs. Dr. Biju Paulose and Ors. in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

The Board of Governors considered the matter with regard to SLP © No. 15865-15908/2003 - Medical Council of India Vs. Dr. Biju Paulose and Ors. in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and took note of the fact that the said Regulations were framed with the prior approval of the Central Government. Secondly, the Hon'ble Supreme Court had held that the Regulations framed under the IMC Act were mandatory and binding in character; and thirdly, the MCI had itself had filed the SLP to challenge the judgment of Hon'ble High Court of Karantaka on this issue.

In view of the above the Board of Governors decided that it would be appropriate to await the verdict from the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the matter and directed the council office to inform the Ministry accordingly.

6. Recognition of PG courses at Rohilkhand Medical College, Bareilly.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition of PG courses at Rohilkhand Medical College, Bareilly.

The Board of Governors considered the matter related to complaint forwarded by Supdt. of Police, CBI, Lucknow to CVO, Medical Council of India stating therein that the current investigation by the CBI is not related to charges mentioned in the complaint. According to noting of the CVO, the CBI is investigating the charges with regard to MBBS course only and the complaint is particularly against the postgraduate inspection and officers of MCI and there is no role of CBI in this matter and complaint may be disposed at the level of MCI.

The Board directed the Council office to get pointwise reply to the complaint from the college before taking any decision on further course of action.

7. Increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at National Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Jaipur, u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at National Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Jaipur, u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Board of Governors perused the matter with regard to increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at National Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, (NIMS) Jaipur, u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 and the matter of change of University name from Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur to NIMS (Deemed University) and the board directed to get report from CVO and the Law Officer to submit a report with all the facts in the next meeting.

8. **1) Approval for correction in Nomenclature for MD Infectious Diseases to DM Infectious Diseases.**

2) Minimum Standard Requirement and TEQ to be approved by the Board.

Read: the matter with regard to (1) Approval for correction in Nomenclature for MD Infectious Diseases to DM Infectious Diseases. (2) Minimum Standard Requirement and TEQ to be approved by the Board.

The Board of Governors considered the matter with regard to postgraduate course in Infectious Diseases and noted that the MD (Infectious Diseases) was notified dt. 21.07.2009 and later DM (Infectious Diseases) was notified vide notification dt. 08.12.2010 and included in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000. The Board also noted that in response to the notifications for MD (Infectious Diseases) there are two applications received for the academic year 2012-13 for starting of MD(Infectious Disease).

The Board considered the report of the Sub-Committee on Infectious Disease and decided to withdraw MD (Infectious Disease) course in the light of the recommendations of the Sub-Committee and the national requirement. The Board directed the Council office to take necessary action for denotifications for withdrawal of the MD (Infectious Disease) course. Regarding the two applications received by the office of the Council for starting of MD (Infectious Disease) course, the Board decided to provide an opportunity to the applicants to upgrade their applications for MD (Infectious Disease) to starting of DM (Infectious Disease) course for the year 2012-13.

The Board approved the curriculum, Minimum Standard Requirement and TEQ for DM (Infectious Disease) as recommended by the Academic Council.

9. **Delayed admission at Mohan Kumaramangalam Govt. Medical College, Salem in respect of Dr. Narumalar.**
