1. **Minutes of the last meeting of the Executive Committee - Confirmation of.**

The minutes of the last meeting of the Executive Committee held on 3.1.99 were confirmed.

2. **Minutes of the last meeting of the Executive Committee - Action taken thereon.**

The Executive Committee noted the action taken by the office on the various items included in the minutes of the last meeting of the Executive Committee held on 3.1.99.

3. **Starting of Yenepoya Medical College at Mangalore by Islamic Academy of Education, Mangalore - Request received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956. - Reg.**

Read : The Council Inspectors report (2nd & 3rd March, 99) for starting of Yenepoya Medical College at Mangalore by Islamic Academy of Education, Mangalore request of which has been received through the Central Govt. u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee considered the Council Inspectors report (2nd & 3rd March,99) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of Yenepoya Medical College at Mangalore by Islamic Academy of Education, Mangalore u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act,1956 with an annual intake of 100 (hundred only) students from the academic year 1999-2000.

4. Starting of new medical college at Asthal Bohar, Rohtak by Shri Baba Masthnath Ayurved and Sanskrit Shikshan Sansthan, Asthal Bohar, Rohtak u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : The Council Inspectors report (6th March, 1999) for starting of new medical college at Asthal Bohar, Rohtak by Shri Baba Masthnath Ayurved and Sanskrit Shikshan Sansthan request of which has been received through the Central Govt. u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee considered the Council Inspectors report (6th March, 99) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of new medical college at Asthal Bohar, Rohtak by Shri Baba Masthnath Ayurved and Sanskrit Shikshan Sansthan u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 in view of shortage of staff and other deficiencies pointed out and observations made in the inspection report.

5. Starting of a new medical college at Jammu by Krishna Hira Nand Memorial Society, Nagrota Jammu u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : The inspection report (8th & 9th March, 1999) carried out for verification of the compliance report received through the Central Govt. for starting of a medical college at Nagrota Jammu.

The Executive Committee considered the inspection report (8th & 9th March, 99) carried out for verification of the compliance report and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of a medical college at Nagrota Jammu in view of shortage of staff, inadequate clinical material and other deficiencies.

6. Govt. Medical College, Jammu - Increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 120 - request received from the Central Govt. u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : The inspection report (11th & 12th March, 1999) carried out for verification of the compliance received through the Central Govt. to grant permission for increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 120 at Govt. Medical College, Jammu.

The Executive Committee considered the inspection report (11th & 12th March, 99) carried out for verification of the compliance report and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue letter of Permission for increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 120 at Govt. Medical College, Jammu u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 with prospective effect.

The Committee also noted that letter of Intent for increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 120 at Govt. Medical College, Jammu was issued by the Central Govt. vide its letter dated 17th April, 1997 with prospective effect. From the inspection report carried out in March, 1999 it is noted that the college is admitting more than 120 students from the session 1996-97 without getting the letter of Permission from the Central Govt. and decided to initiate action u/s 10B of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 for the excess number of admissions made by the college authorities.

7. Adichunchunagiri Instt. of Medical Sciences, Mandya District, Karnataka - Increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : The Council Inspectors report (27th & 28th Jan., 1999) for increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at Adichunchunagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, Mandya District, Karnataka request of which has been received through Central Govt. u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee considered the Council Inspectors report (27th & 28th Jan., 99) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at Adichunchunagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, Mandya District, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 in view of shortage of staff, inadequate clinical material and other infrastructural facilities as noted in the inspection report.

8. Rajah Muthiah Medical college, Annamalainagar - Renewal of permission for increase of MBBS seats from 125 to 150 for admission of the students in the 2nd batch i.e. for the session 1999-2000.

Read : The Council Inspectors report (10th & 11th March, 1999) for renewal of permission for increase of MBBS seats from 125 to 150 for admission of the students in the 2nd batch i.e. for the session 1999-2000.

The Executive Committee considered the Council Inspectors report (10th & 11th March, 99) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to renew the permission for increase of MBBS seats from 125 to 150 for admission of students in 2nd batch i.e. for the session 1999-2000 at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar, Tamil Nadu. However the attention of the authorities concerned be drawn to comply with the observations made by the Council Inspectors in the inspection report.

9. Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal - Increase of MBBS seats from 50 to 100 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : The Central Govt. letter dated 29/12/98 requesting to reconsider the matter regarding increase of MBBS seats from 50 to 100 at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal in light of the decision taken by the Executive Committee at its meeting held on 14/10/98.

The Executive Committee considered the Central Govt.'s letter dated 29.12.98 and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken by it at its meeting held on 14.10.98 recommending the Central Govt. to issue letter of permission for increase of MBBS seats from 50 to 100 at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 for a period of one year. However, the college authorities be advised to rectify all the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report within 3 months and compliance to this effect be sent to the Council for verification.

10. MBBS (Rajasthan University) - Continuance of recognition in respect of students being trained at S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur.

Read : The compliance verification report (19th & 20th Feb., 1999), compliance report and periodical inspection report (Feb., 1995) for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Rajasthan University in respect of students being trained at S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur.

The Executive Committee considered the compliance verification report (19th & 20th Feb., 99), compliance report and periodical inspection report (Feb., 1995) and decided to recommend that MBBS degree granted by Rajasthan University in respect of students being trained at S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur be continued with annual admission of 150 students per year.

11. MBBS (Bombay University) - Continuance of recognition in respect of students being trained at LTM Medical College, Mumbai.

Read : The periodical inspection report (29th & 30th April, 1998) alongwith the compliance report received from the college authorities on the remarks made by the Inspectors in their report for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Bombay University in respect of students being trained at L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai.

The Executive Committee considered the periodical inspection report (29th & 30th April, 1998) along with the compliance report and noted that the Council Inspectors in their inspection report have made an observation that the college authorities are admitting students having 45% marks in PCB which seems to be against the regulations of the Council. As it does not clarify whether this percentage of marks is for reserved categories or for general category, the Committee decided to obtain a clarification from the Dean of the college in this regard and authorised the President to decide the matter regarding continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Bombay University in respect of students being trained at L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai.

12. MBBS (Gujarat University) - Continuance of recognition in respect of students being trained at Smt. NHL Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad.

Read : The periodical inspection report (Oct., 1996) alongwith the compliance report received from the college authorities on the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Gujarat University in respect of students being trained at Smt. NHL Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad.

The Executive Committee considered the periodical inspection report (Oct., 96) along with the compliance report received from the college authorities and noted that the Committee at its meeting held on 25/8/98 had given final three months time to the institution to comply with the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee on going through the compliance report now submitted noted that certain deficiencies are yet to be complied with, hence, decided to give final three months time to the authorities for sending compliance touching on all the deficiencies pointed out for further consideration in the matter.

13. MBBS (Amravati University) - Continuance of recognition in respect of students being trained at Dr. Panjabrao Alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati.

Read : The periodical inspection report (July, 1997) alongwith the compliance report received from the college authorities on the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Amravati University in respect of students being trained at Dr. Panjabrao Alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati.

The Executive Committee considered the compliance report received from the authorities of Dr. Panjabrao Alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati on the deficiencies pointed out in the periodical inspection report (July, 97) for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Amravati University.

The Committee decided to verify the compliance report by way of an inspection for further consideration.

14. MBBS (Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya, Indore) - Continuance of recognition in respect of students being trained at MGM Medical College, Indore.

Read: the inspection report (Feb., 1998) alongwith the staff list received from the college authorities for purpose of continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya, Indore in respect of students being trained at MGM Medical College, Indore.

The Executive Committee considered the inspection report (Feb., 98) carried out for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya, Indore in respect of students being trained at MGM Medical College, Indore alongwith the latest staff list received from the Dean, MGM Medical College, Indore vide his letter dated 9/2/99 in response to the decision of the Committee taken at its meeting held on 3/1/99 and noted that the gross deficiencies in staff still persist for the present number of admissions being made by the college i.e. 140 students.

In view of above, the Committee decided to issue a show cause notice to the concerned authorities as to why steps should not be initiated to reduce the number of seats in consonance with the facilities available. The authorities be granted one month's time to respond to the show cause notice and if no reply is received within the stipulated period action be initiated for reducing the number of seats as decided.

Copy of letter sent to the authorities be also marked to the Chief Secretary, Secretary (Health), Director of Medical Education, Registrar of the University and member of the Council representing the State Govt.

15. MBBS (Bombay University) - Continuance of recognition in respect of students being trained at Grant Medical College, Mumbai.

Read: the letter dated 17/2/99 received from the Secretary to the Govt. of Maharashtra, Medical Education & Drugs Deptt. for purpose of continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Bombay University in respect of students being trained at Grant Medical College, Mumbai.

The Executive Committee noted that the inspection for verification of compliance as received from the college authorities in response to the decision of the Committee taken at its meeting held on 2.7.98 has already been fixed.

The Committee further considered the letter of the Secretary to the Govt. of Maharashtra, Medical Education & Drugs Department, Mantralaya, Mumbai dated 17/2/99 informing that most of the shortcomings pointed out in the inspection report have been complied with, however, certain deficiencies with regard to filling up of posts of Professors and Associate Professors in certain subjects such as Orthopaedics, Radiology, Skin & Venereal Diseases and Psychiatry have been tried to overcome by appointing honorary medical teachers and requested the Council to take a realistic view about the staff position and deem the Honorary System as an acceptable way by which the vacancies can be filled till the full timers are made available. The Committee did not agree with the request of the Secretary to the Govt. of Maharashtra and decided to communicate to the authorities concerned to fill up the posts by appointing full time teachers at the earliest.

16. **MBBS degree - Continuance of recognition in respect of students being trained at Medical Colleges in U.P. i.e. (i) S.N.Medical College, Agra, (ii) M.L.N.Medical College, Allahabad and (iii) GSVM Medical College, Kanpur.**

Read: The letter dated 11/2/99 received from the Secretary, Medical Education, Govt. of U.P., Lucknow informing the action taken by the State Govt. on the deficiencies pointed out in the periodical inspection reports in respect of (i) S.N. Medical College, Agra (ii) M.L.N. Medical College, Allahabad and (iii) GSVM Medical College, Kanpur.

The Executive Committee noted the contents of the letter dated 5/11.2.99 received from the Secretary, Medical Education, Govt. of U.P., Lucknow informing the action taken by the State Govt. on the deficiencies pointed out in the periodical inspection reports of the following 3 medical colleges:-

- (i) S.N. Medical College, Agra
- (ii) M.L.N. Medical College, Allahabad
- (iii) GSVM Medical College, Kanpur.

In view of above, the Committee decided to grant extension of time to the extent of 3 months to the authorities for completing all the deficiencies and further decided to communicate to the Health Secretary that before the admissions are made to the next academic session i.e. 1999-2000 all deficiencies should be rectified and a compliance to that effect be submitted immediately thereafter.

17. **Recognition of MBBS degree granted by Sri Ramachandra Medical College and Reserach, Instt. (Deemed University), Porur, Madras - Request received u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the request received from the Registrar Sri Ramachandra Medical College and Research, Instt. (Deemed University) thorough the Central Govt. u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for recognition of MBBS degree granted by the Deemed University.

The Executive Committee considered the request of Sri Ramachandra Medical College and Research Instt., Porur, Chennai (Deemed University) received through the Central Govt. u/s 11(2) of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 for recognition of MBBS degree granted by the Deemed University and noted that Sri Ramachandra Medical College and Research Institute is approved by the Council for the award of MBBS degree granted by the Madras University/Tamilnadu Dr.MGR Medical University whose medical qualifications are already recognised and included in the Ist Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956.

The Committee decided to recommend that MBBS degree granted by Sri Ramachandra Medical College and Research Institute, Porur, Chennai (Deemed University) be recognised and included in the Ist Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 being the change of affiliating university of the college.

18. MBBS - (Calcutta University) Continuance of recognition in respect of students being trained at Medical College, Calcutta.

Read : the matter with regard to Continuance of recognition of MBBS degree in respect of students being trained at Medical College, Calcutta.

The Executive Committee considered the Govt. of West Bengal, Deptt. of F.W. letter dated 22.1.1999 along with the compliance submitted on the defects and deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report (March, 1996) and decided to verify the same by way of an inspection.

19. Recognition of Perundurai Medical College, Perundurai for the award of MBBS degree granted by the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

Read:- the letter received from the Director, Instt. of Road Transport, Chennai alongwith the court order dated 10/11/98 for recognition of Perundurai Medical College, Perundurai for the award of MBBS degree.

The Executive Committee considered the letter received from the Director, Instt. of Road Transport, Chennai dated 2.12.1998 alongwith the interim order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 10/11/98 annexed with the Director's letter and decided to obtain legal opinion in the matter.

President was authorized to take a decision in the matter on receipt of the legal opinion.

20. K.J. Somaiya Medical College, Mumbai - Increase of MBBS seats from 50 to 100 - request received from the Central Govt. u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read:- the compliance report submitted by the authorities of K.J. Somaiya Medical College, Mumbai on the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report through the Central Govt. for recommendation of the Council to grant permission for increase of MBBS seats from 50 to 100.

The Executive Committee noted that the application for

increase of MBBS seats from 50 to 100 at K.J. Somaiya Medical College, Mumbai was received through the Central Govt. u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 and the Central Govt. after taking into consideration of the scheme and the recommendations of the MCI had issued letter of Intent for increase of seats from 50 to 100 at the college on 23rd Feb., 1999 with prospective effect.

The Committee further considered the compliance report now, submitted by the authorities of K.J. Somaiya Medical College, Mumbai after the letter of Intent issued by the Central Govt. on the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report (Oct., 98) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue letter of Permission for increase of MBBS seats from 50 to 100 at K.J. Somaiya Medical College, Mumbai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for a period of one year prospectively. However the attention of the authorities concerned be drawn towards rectification of defects and deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

21. Establishment of a Central Museum at the PSG Instt. of Medical Sciences, Coimbatore.

Read: the letter received from the Principal, PSG Instt. of Medical Sciences, Coimbatore seeking comments/clearance of the MCI for establishment of a Central Museum at the PSG Instt. of Medical Sciences, Coimbatore.

The Executive Committee considered the letter received from the Principal, P.S.G.Instt. of Medical Sciences, Coimbatore regarding establishment of a central Museum at the institute to house the museums of all the departments in an integrated fashion in view of the revised curriculum of the MCI stressing the need for integrated teaching making an arrangement with all specimens at one central area in order to help the student community to learn better by integrating the learning material (specimens). The Committee decided to defer the consideration of the matter till such time the clarifications with regard to following are

received:-

1. Approximate distance of the central museum being so established from the department of Anatomy and Pathology etc.
2. The total area allocated for the establishment of museum.
3. The exact site and location of the museum i.e. whether it will be in the same building where the departments of Anatomy and Pathology are housed or it will be established in a separate building.

22. Request of Shri Ravindra Narayan Andhale a student of Rural Medical College, Loni received through the Controller of Examination, Pune University alongwith the court order for granting additional attempt to appear in the Ist MBBS examination.

Read: the request Shri Ravindra Narayan Andhale a student of Rural Medical College, Loni received through the Controller of Examination, Pune University alongwith the court order for granting additional attempt to appear in the Ist MBBS examination.

The Executive Committee considered the request of Shri Ravindra Narayan Andhale received through the Controller of examination Pune University alongwith the court order for granting additional attempt to appear in the Ist MBBS examination and decided that an additional attempt may be granted to the candidate for appearing in the 1st MBBS examination provided the University has no objection.

23. Regulations on establishment of new medical/dental colleges - establishment of a college on a leased land against the provision of land on ownership basis.

Read: the Central Govt. letter dated 21st Jan., 1999 seeking comments of the Council regarding establishment of a new medical college on a leased land against the provision of land on ownership basis.

The Executive Committee considered Central Govt.'s letter dated 21.1.1999 regarding the establishment of a college on a leased land against the provision of land on ownership basis and accepted the suggestion of the Govt. that to accept the possession of land by the applicant obtained on the basis of lease for 60 years extendable to 99 years for establishment of new institution.

24. Enhancement of fee for temporary permission to practice medicine in India u/s 14(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter regarding Enhancement of fee for temporary permission to practice medicine in India u/s 14(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee considered the matter and agreed with the observations made by the Chairman Registration & Equivalence Committee with regard to enhancement of fee from Rs. 500/- to Rs. 5000/- for temporary permission to practice medicine in India u/s 14(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

25. Verification of documents by issuing authorities in respect of candidates applying for registration u/s 13(3) of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to charging fee for verification of the documents by issuing authorities in respect of candidate applying for registration u/s 13(3) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee considered the proposal of the Chairman, Registration & Equivalence Committee to charge a fee from the candidates for verification of their documents required by the verification authority in particular the J & K State Board of School Education. The Committee was of the opinion that it will be difficult for the Council to collect the fee on behalf of the J & K State Board of School Education from the candidates. However, if such a fee is required by the concerned authorities

they may directly obtain the same from the candidate(s) concerned on receipt of the documents for verification from this Council.

26. Registration to practice medicine in India u/s 13(3) of the IMC Act, 1956, Indian National possessing qualification recognised u/s 13(4) of the Act - Dr. Vandana Dalela and Dr. R.C. Tripathi.

27. Holding of screening test for students obtaining medical qualification from foreign institutions.

To ratify the action taken by the President of the Council with regard to holding of screening test for students obtaining medical qualification from foreign institutions.

The Executive Committee ratified the action taken by the President communicating the modified views of the Council recorded as under to the Central Govt., Ministry of Health & F.W:-

- (i) As regards, the holding of the pre admission screening test, it was decided that the Central Board of Secondary Education may select candidates for this purpose separately from the same All India Entrance Examination for filling up of 15% of the total number of seats as per the Supreme Court order. The pre admission screening test may not be linked with the entrance test being held by CBSE for admission to medical colleges under the control of MAHE.
- (ii) Post admission screening test as already intimated by the Council in our letter dated 7th September, 1998 may be conducted by any other body like the AIIMS, New Delhi; Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education & Research, Chandigarh; National Board of Examinations, New Delhi or any other body identified by the Govt.

28. To note the Central Govts. letters granting permission for establishment of new medical colleges and increase of MBBS seats u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee noted the Central Govt. letters granting permission for establishment of new medical colleges and increase of MBBS seats u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 as under:-

Rajendra Prasad Medical College, Tanda.

The Central Govt., vide its dated 14.1.99 has granted permission for establishment college with an annual intake of 50 students with prospective effect. This permission of the Central Govt. is granted for a period of one year for one batch of students only.

Vinayaka Missions Medical College kariakal Pondicherry

The Central Govt. vide its letter dated 19.2.99 has renewed the permission for admission of 3rd batch of

students during 1998-99 at
Vinayaka Mission's Medical
college, Karaikal,
Pondicherry.

B.J.Medical College, Ahmedabad &
Govt. Medical College, Baroda.

The Central Govt., vide its
letter dt.9.3.99 has renewed
the permission for admission
of the students against the
increased capacity at

The Executive Committee deferred the consideration of the matter and decided that the Central Govt. letter be circulated to the members of the General Body of the Council to get their opinion in the matter.

32. Migration of MBBS students from various medical colleges in India to Postgraduate Instt. of Medical Sciences, Rohtak.

Read: the matter with regard to Migration of MBBS students from various medical colleges in India to Postgraduate Instt. of Medical Sciences, Rohtak as referred by the Migration Sub-Committee at its meeting held on 22/3/99.

The Executive Committee deliberated upon the matter with regard to migration of six MBBS students carried out in April, 1998 from various medical colleges in India to Postgraduate Instt. of Medical Sciences, Rohtak and noted that as per decision of the Migration Sub-Committee arrived at its meeting held on 28/10/98, the University authorities were requested to cancel all the migrations carried out by them under the cover of their being an autonomous body and that all the migrated students be sent back to their parent medical college with immediate effect. The Committee further noted the letter dated 8/2/99 received from the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Rohtak, clarifying that the migrated students have already completed eight months of their study in the medical college at Rohtak and that in future migration of the students may be decided by the MCI as per Graduate Medical Education Regulations. The Committee did not agree with the request of the Vice-Chancellor for regularisation of migrations carried out by the University in April, 1998 in the absence of any other relevant documents like No Objection Certificate, the reasons for migration, affidavit by individual candidate for undergoing full 18 months study in transferee medical college after the date of migration permitted by the Council as prescribed under the Regulations of the Council on Graduate Medical Education - 1997.

33. Condonation of Internship period in respect of Dr. Vaishali Hainath Wankhade.

Read: the matter with regard to Condonation of Internship period in respect of Dr. Vaishali Hainath Wankhade.

The Executive Committee did not agree with the request made by Dr.Vaishali Hainath Wankhande to condone the Internship period as no reduction in the period of 12 months compulsory Rotation Internship as envisaged in the Undergraduate Medical Curriculum can be allowed under any circumstances. However, marginal adjustment not exceeding 30 days could be made under very exceptional circumstances with prior approval of this Council.
