4. **Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (100 seats) of ESIC Medical College, Chennai, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015 – Compliance Regarding.**

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (100 seats) of ESIC Medical College, Chennai, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 11.06.2014 received from the Dean, ESIC Medical College, Chennai furnishing the compliance report for rectification of deficiencies pointed out by the Council assessors in the assessment report as forwarded by the Central Government vide letter dated 23rd June, 2014 received in the Council Office on 24th June, 2014 alongwith the previous assessment report (11th & 12th April, 2014) and noted the following:

1. Faculty deficiency still remains at 17.39 % (i.e. 16 out of 92). Out of original deficiency of 24 faculty, compliance dt. and Dean's further letter dt. 14/06/2014 show that 6 have joined and 2 who were absent are now available. Regarding others, in compliance, it is only stated that "*Other faculty/Prof./Assoc. Prof./ Asstt. Prof./ have been selected and will join shortly and hence there may not be any deficiency.*" In Dean's letter, it is stated that "*Now faculty have been recruited and offer of appointment have been issued. They will be joining immediately. Total faculty now recruited is 20+2 Tutors*". However, D.F. of only 8 faculty have been sent.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

2. Deficiency of Lecture Theaters is partially rectified. Two lecture theaters of capacity 300 are not available. Three lecture theaters in hospital are not of gallery type.
3. Deficiency of Central Library remains as it is.
4. Deficiency of Common Room for Boys is not rectified.
5. Deficiency of Paramedical Staff is not rectified.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee decided to convey the deficiencies still persisting after submission of compliance to the Institution/State authorities.

1. Faculty deficiency still remains at 15.28 % (i.e. 22 out of 144) as in the compliance, only 2 Professors against deficiency of 7, 2 Asso. Prof. Against deficiency of 8, 5 Asst. Prof. Against deficiency of 12 & 3 Tutors against deficiency of 7 have joined. Thus, only 12 faculty are shown as having joined against total deficiency of 34; resultantly deficiency of 22 still remains. For the remaining, it is only stated that "*Departmental promotion is underway and posting will be made within 2 months.*"
2. Shortage of Residents still remains at 12.60 % (i.e. 12 out of 95) as in the compliance, 11 Residents are shown as having been posted against total deficiency of 23.
3. Shortage of 1 lecture theater of 180 capacity still persists.
4. Deficiency in Central Library still persist. Shortage of journals is partially rectified.
5. Deficiencies in OPD are partially rectified.
6. Deficiency of MRD still persists.
7. AERB approval is not available for some X-ray machines.
8. Website is not operational.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

2. With regard to deficiency of faculty, it is stated as under:
 - (a) Professors: Deficiency: 5. - 3 Professor i.e. Orthopaedics-1, Anatomy-1, Biochemistry-1 has been appointed. Post of 2 Professor i.e. Microbiology-1 & Radio-diagnosis-1 has been advertised & will be filled soon.
 - (b) Associate Professors: Deficiency: 19 - 05 Associate Professors working on contractual basis were not considered by assessors. For 10 post appointments have already been made & for remaining 04 posts, recruitment process is going on.
 - (c) Assistant Professors: Deficiency: 23. - Assistant Professors working on contractual basis have not been considered by assessors. As per MCI norms there is deficiency of only One Assistant Professor i.e. Forensic Medicine, for which advertisement has been published & will be filled soon. Hence the deficiency shown is not valid.
 - (d) Tutors: Deficiency: 8 - Appointments have been made. However, in no case any further details have been provided. No joining reports or D.F. have been given.
3. Deficiency of mobile X-ray machine is not rectified.
4. Deficiency of Intercom is not rectified.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in assessment report.

What is stated in compliance is that "*Frantic steps are undertaken to promote the eligible faculty, transfer excess faculty indentified at other Government medical college and initiatives are taken to appoint new staff members at local level.*"
2. Deficiency of lecture theater of capacity 180 is partially rectified.
3. Deficiency of Girls' hostel is not rectified.
4. Deficiency of Speech therapy is not rectified.
5. Deficiency of MRD is not rectified.
6. Deficiency of inadequate number of mobile & static X-ray machines is not rectified.

Medical College, Latur, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for the academic session 2014-15.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated nil received from the Director, Medical Education & Research, Govt. of Maharashtra, Mumbai furnishing the compliance report for rectification of deficiencies pointed out by the Council Assessors in the assessment report as forwarded by the Central Government vide letter dated 4th July, 2014 received in the Council Office on 4th July itself alongwith the previous assessment report (22nd and 23rd May, 2014) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty remains at 40.26% (i.e. 60 out of 149). What is stated in compliance is that "*Immediate steps are undertaken to promote the eligible faculty, transfer excess faculty identified at other government medical colleges and initiatives are taken to appoint new staff members at local level*".
2. Shortage of residents remains at 40.36 % (i.e. 44 out of 109). What is stated in compliance is that "*Senior residents pots are now created and will be filled soon*".
3. Deficiency of Examination hall cum Auditorium is not rectified.
4. Deficiency of Lecture Theater of capacity 250 is not rectified.
5. Deficiency of Central Library is not rectified.
6. Deficiency of Interns' Hostel is not rectified.

award of MBBS degree against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956– compliance thereof.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated dt.18.06.2014 received from Director Medical Education, Chhattisgarh alongwith a letter No.MC/MCI-Cell/2014/3314 dated 04.03.2014 of Dean, Pt. JNM Medical College, Raipur furnishing the compliance report for rectification of deficiencies pointed out by the Council Assessors in the assessment report as forwarded by the Central Government vide letter dated 1st July, 2014 received in the Council Office on 1st July itself alongwith the previous assessment report (11th and 12th December,2013) and observed the following:

1. Shortage of Residents remains at 58 %. In the compliance it is only stated that “*Senior Residents & Junior Resident are being appointed on regular basis every month by walking interview. This will fulfill the requirement SR substantially.*”
2. Deficiency of Lecture Theater remains as it is.
3. Deficiency of Central library remains as it is.
4. Deficiency of control of RHTC & UHC remains as it is.

The Executive Committee further decided to request/advise the Dean of the college as well as Secretary (Health) of the concerned State to attend the Council office in-person on 12.07.2014 during the meeting of the Executive Committee with proof of rectification of deficiencies alongwith supporting documents and a specific undertaking correcting all the deficiencies mentioned in the assessment report in a time bound manner.

74. Consideration of compliance received from Pvt. Medical Colleges / institutions – req.

Read: the matter with regard to consideration of compliance received from Pvt. Medical Colleges / institutions.

The Members of the Executive Committee of the Council perused the letters of the Central Govt. dated 23.06.2014, 26.06.2014, 01.07.2014, 02.07.2014, 04.07.2014. The Central Govt. by the said letters has forwarded communications of following private medical colleges claiming compliance with the deficiencies in infrastructural, teaching and other facilities, which had been pointed by the MCI on the basis of the respective inspection reports - with a request to verify the correctness of such claims of the medical colleges and to make fresh recommendations with specific reasons by 10.07.2014. Such communications of the medical colleges forwarded to the MCI by the Central Govt. are in relation to the following :-

The Members of the Executive Committee observed that the Council, with regard to the aforementioned medical colleges had already sent its recommendation to the Central Govt. prior to the last date i.e. 15th June 2014 (extended by the Hon'ble Supreme Court for the present academic year 2014-15 from 15th of May 2014 to 15th of June 2014).

The Members of the Executive Committee in this regard, as to whether the Council could consider / reconsider any application / scheme for establishment of new medical college / renewal of permission and increase of seats in MBBS course in the existing medical colleges after the cut off dated i.e. 15th June 2014, is required to take into account and follow the stipulations contained in the regulations and various directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court including in the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Mridul Dhar & Anr. Vs. UOI & Ors.- (2005) 2 SCC 65, wherein the time schedules for establishing a medical college / renewal of permission and increase of seats in the existing medical college has been upheld. The relevant portion of the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court are given hereunder:-

“

27. In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 10-A read with Section 33 of the Act, the MCI made the establishment of new medical colleges, opening of higher courses of study and increase of admission capacity in Medical College Regulation, 1993. The Regulations, inter alia, provided as a qualifying criteria that the eligible organization shall abide by Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 as modified from time to time and the regulations framed thereunder and shall qualify to apply for permission to establish new medical colleges only if the conditions therein are fulfilled.

28. The time schedule for the receipt of applications for establishment of new medical colleges and processing of the applications by Central Government and the Medical Council of India is fixed under the schedule to 1999 Regulations. The said schedule is as under-

"SCHEDULE FOR RECEIPT OF APPLICATIONS FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW MEDICAL COLLEGES AND PROCESSING OF THE APPLICATIONS BY THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT AND THE MEDICAL COUNCIL OF INDIA

1.	Receipt of applications by the Central Government	From 1st August to 31st August (both days inclusive) of any year
2.	Receipt of applications by MCI from the Central Government	30th September

Note: (1) The information given by the applicant in Part-I of the application for setting up a medical college that is information regarding organization, basic infrastructural facilities, managerial and financial capabilities of the applicant shall be scrutinized by the Medical

Council of India through an inspection and thereafter the Council may recommend issue of Letter of intent by the Central Government.

(2) Renewal of permission shall not be granted to a medical college if the above schedule for opening a medical college is not adhered to and admissions shall not be made without prior approval of the Central Government."

.....

30. It cannot be doubted that proper facilities and infrastructure including teaching faculty and Doctors is absolutely necessary and so also the adherence to time schedule for imparting teaching of highest standards thereby making available to the community best possible medical practitioners

.....

32. Having regard to the professional courses into consideration, it deserves to be emphasized that all concerned including Governments, State and Central both, MCI/DCI, colleges, new or old, students, Boards, universities, examining authorities etc. are required to strictly adhere to time schedule wherever provided for; there should not be mid-stream admission; admission should not be in excess of sanctioned intake capacity or in excess of quota of any one, whether State or Management. The carrying forward of any unfilled seats of one academic year to next academic year is also not permissible.

.....

35. Having regard to the aforesaid, we issue the following directions:-

1-.....

4. It shall be the responsibility of all concerned including Chief Secretaries of each State/Union Territories and/or Health Secretaries to ensure compliance of the directions of this Court and requisite time schedule as laid down in the Regulations and non-compliance would make them liable for requisite penal consequences.

11

12. The time schedule for grant of admission to postgraduate courses shall also be adhered to.

13.

14. Time schedule for establishment of new college or to increase intake in existing college, shall be adhered to strictly by all concerned.

15. Time schedule provided in Regulations shall be strictly adhered to by all concerned failing which defaulting party would be liable to be personally proceeded with.

....."

The Members of the Executive Committee further observed that the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Priya Gupta Vs. State of Chhattisgarh- (2012) 7 SCC 433, was pleased to re-emphasize the requirement of strict adherence to the time schedule. The Hon'ble Supreme Court vide its judgment

dated 08.05.2012 in Priya Gupta Vs. State of Chhattisgarh- (2012) 7 SCC 433 has held that every person, officer or authority who disobey or fails to strictly comply with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court shall be liable to be prosecuted under the provisions of Contempt of Court Act. The relevant portion of the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court are given hereunder:-

“

40. The schedules prescribed have the force of law, in as much as they form part of the judgments of this Court, which are the declared law of the land in terms of Article [141](#) of the Constitution of India and form part of the Regulations of the Medical Council of India, which also have the force of law and are binding on all concerned. **It is difficult to comprehend that any authority can have the discretion to alter these schedules to suit a given situation, whether such authority is the Medical Council of India, the Government of India, State Government, University or the selection bodies constituted at the college level for allotment of seats by way of counseling. We have no hesitation in clearly declaring that none of these authorities are vested with the power of relaxing, varying or disturbing the time schedule,** or the procedures of admission, as provided in the judgments of this Court and the Medical Council of India Regulations.

41. Inter alia, the disadvantages are:

.....

(3) The delay in adherence to the schedule, delay in the commencement of courses etc., encourage lowering of the standards of education in the Medical/Dental Colleges by shortening the duration of the academic courses and promoting the chances of arbitrary and less meritorious admissions.

.....

42. The Medical and Dental Councils of India, the Governments and the Universities are expected to act in tandem with each other and ensure that the recognition for starting of the medical courses and grant of admission are strictly within the time frame declared by this Court and the Regulations. It has come to the notice of this Court that despite warnings having been issued by this Court and despite the observations made by this Court, that default and non-adherence to the time schedules shall be viewed very seriously, matters have not improved. Persistent defaults by different authorities and colleges and granting of admission arbitrarily and with favouritism have often invited criticism from this Court.

45. The maxim *Boni iudicis est causas litium dirimere* places an obligation upon the Court to ensure that it resolves the causes of litigation in the country. Thus, the need of the hour is that binding dicta be prescribed and statutory Regulations be enforced, so that all concerned are mandatorily required to implement the time schedule in its true spirit and substance. It is difficult and not even advisable to keep some windows open to meet a particular situation of exception, as it may pose impediments to the smooth implementation of laws and defeat the very object of the scheme. These schedules have been prescribed upon serious consideration by all concerned. They are to be applied *stricto sensu* and cannot be moulded to suit the convenience of some economic or other interest of any institution, especially, in a manner that is bound to result in compromise of the above-stated principles.

.....

47. All these directions shall be complied with by all concerned, including Union of India, Medical Council of India, Dental Council of India, State Governments, Universities and medical and dental colleges and the management of the respective universities or dental and medical colleges. **Any default in compliance with these conditions or attempt to**

overreach these directions shall, without fail, invite the following consequences and penal actions:

47.1. Every body, officer or authority who disobeys or avoids or fails to strictly comply with these directions *stricto sensu* **shall be liable for action under the provisions of the Contempt of Courts Act.** Liberty is granted to any interested party to take out the contempt proceedings before the High Court having jurisdiction over such Institution/State, etc.

47.2. The person, member or authority found responsible for any violation shall be departmentally proceeded against and punished in accordance with the Rules. **We make it clear that violation of these directions or overreaching them by any process shall tantamount to indiscipline, insubordination, misconduct and being unworthy of becoming a public servant.**

47.3. **Such defaulting authority, member or body shall also be liable for action by and personal liability to third parties who might have suffered losses as a result of such default.**

.....
78.4. With all the humility at our command, we request the High Courts to ensure strict adherence to the prescribed time schedule, process of selection and to the rule of merit. We reiterate what has been stated by this Court earlier, that except in very exceptional cases, the High Court may consider it appropriate to decline interim orders and hear the main petitions finally, subject to convenience of the Court. We may refer the dictum of this Court in the case of *Medical Council of India v. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences* (2004) 6 SCC 76, para 14 in this regard.

78.5. We have categorically returned a finding that all the relevant stakeholders have failed to perform their duty/obligation in accordance with law. Where the time schedules have not been complied with, and rule of merit has been defeated, there nepotism and manipulation have prevailed. The stands of various authorities are at variance with each other and none admits to fault. Thus, it is imperative for this Court to ensure proper implementation of judgments of this Court and the Regulations of the Medical Council of India as well as not to overlook the arbitrary and colourable exercise of power by the concerned authorities/colleges.

.....”

The Members of the Executive Committee further observed that recently the Hon'ble Delhi High Court in W.P (C) No.3976/2014- Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society & Anr. Vs. Medical Council of India & Ors. dt. 03.07.2014 on the issue whether the MCI can conduct any inspection after 15th of June 2014, has held as below:-

“.....”

Present writ petition has been filed seeking quashing of the letter dated 17th May, 2014 as well as issuance of an appropriate writ seeking a direction to the respondents to grant renewal of permission for third Batch of MBBS students for the academic session 2014 -2015.

A perusal of the impugned letter reveals that as many as 34 discrepancies/deficiencies were pointed out by the respondent-MCI after inspecting the petitioner's facilities.

Learned counsel for petitioner contends that discrepancies/deficiencies pointed out are minor and non existent. He further states that deficiencies pointed out by MCI vide impugned letter have now been removed/clarified. He prays that a fresh inspection by MCI be ordered at petitioner's cost.

Mr. T. Singhdev, learned counsel for MCI states that a fresh inspection cannot be carried out as the time for carrying out inspection and making recommendation to the Central Government by the MCI has

expired on 15th June, 2014. In this regard, he refers to the schedule laid down by Supreme Court in Priya Gupta Vs. State of Chattisgarh & Ors., (2012) 7 SCC 433. He further states that Supreme Court during 2014 vacations has extended the limitation for MCI till 15th June, 2014 and for Central Government till 15th July, 2014 to take a decision. He has handed over the applications filed by the MCI before the Vacation Bench of the Supreme Court. Same is taken on record.

Mr. Singhdev, lastly contends that deficiencies pointed out by MCI in its report are serious.

Mr. Pushkarna, learned counsel appearing for the UOI states that there is no prayer against the Central Government. He submits that a fresh hearing under Section 10(A)(4) of IMC Act 1956 is only given to new medical colleges/institutions or to those colleges who have increased their MBBS seats for the first time.

Having heard the parties, this court is of the view that as time for carrying out fresh inspection and making recommendations by the MCI has, expired on 15th June 2014, petitioner's oral prayer for re-inspection by MCI cannot be granted. However, as a compliance report has been filed by the petitioner with the Central Government, same is directed to be considered before passing of an order by the Central Government /MCI on or before 15th July, 2014.

In the event, petitioner is aggrieved by the final decision taken by the Central Government/MCI, it shall be open to the petitioner to challenge the same in accordance with law. Consequently, at this stage no interdiction is called for.

With the aforesaid directions, writ petition stands disposed of.....”

In this regard, the Ld. Solicitor General of India has opined and has advised the Council that in view of the binding directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, it is not permissible and the MCI cannot carry out any fresh inspection regarding any application / scheme of a medical college after 15.06.2014 for the present academic year 2014-15. It has further been advised that in view of the dicta of the Hon'ble Supreme Court any authority requiring the querist (MCI) to carry out any fresh or compliance verification inspection after 15.06.14 would attract the initiation of proceedings under the Contempt of Court Act, 1971. The relevant portion of the opinion of the Id. Solicitor General of India is as under:-

- (i) **“The querist (MCI) cannot carry out any fresh inspection regarding any application / scheme of a medical college after 15th June 2014 for the present academic year 2014-15.**
- (ii) **In view of the dicta of the Hon'ble Supreme Court any authority requiring the querist (MCI) to carry out any fresh or compliance verification inspection after 15th June 2014 would attract the initiation of proceedings under the Contempt of Court Act, 1971.”**

The Members of the Executive Committee also noted that the claims made by various private medical colleges of removing deficiencies in relation to infrastructural, teaching and other facilities through their respective compliance reports [deficiencies as found during the initial inspection], require physical verification by conduct of inspections. Besides the aspect of complete impermissibility in this regard, verification by inspections can even otherwise is not possible physically. It was reiterated that it is not permissible for the MCI to undertake any such exercise after 15.06.2014. In view of the binding directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court as has also been advised by the Ld. Solicitor General of India. Accordingly, it was resolved to inform this position to the Ministry of Health, Govt. of India and refer back to the Ministry of Health, Govt. of

India all such communications of the medical colleges, mentioned above and the Council would not be retaining any copy of these compliance report.

75. Consideration of compliance with regard to renewal of permission u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to consideration of compliance with regard to renewal of permission u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the D.O. letter dated 09.06.2014 received from Sh. Rajender Rathore, Minister, Health & Med. Education, Jaipur as forwarded by the Central Government vide letter dated 1st and 4th July, 2014 received in the Council Office on 1st & 4th July respectively and noted the status of the following medical colleges in the State of Rajasthan:

1. SMS Medical College, Jaipur – SMS Medical College, Jaipur is already renewed for number of seats from 150 to 250 for 2nd batch for the academic year 2014-15.
2. JLN Medical College, Ajmer – JLN Medical College, Ajmer is also renewed for 2nd batch for number of seats i.e. from 100 to 150 for the academic year 2014-15
3. Medical College, Jhalawar – Already recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and no fresh application has been received for the academic year 2014-15.
4. RNT Medical College, Udaipur – Considered separately as item no.53.

With regard to the following colleges, no compliance has been submitted by the college authorities till date and therefore the matter with regard to the renewal of permission cannot be considered:-

5. Dr. S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur (4th batch of 100 to 150 & 2nd batch of 150 to 250)
6. S.P. Medical College, Bikaner (4th batch of 100 to 150 & 2nd batch of 150 to 250)
7. Govt. Medical College, Kota (4th batch of 100 to 150)

76. Consideration of renewal of permission at (1) PMCH, Dhanbad and (2) MGM Medical College, Jamshedpur – Reg.

Read: the matter with regard to Consideration of renewal of permission at (1) PMCH, Dhanbad and (2) MGM Medical College, Jamshedpur.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 06.06.2014 of Sh. Rajender Pd. Singh, Ministry for Commerce & Med. Education, Jharkhand, Ranchi as forwarded by the Central Government vide letter dated 1st July, 2014 received in the Council Office on 1st July and noted that no compliance has been submitted by the college authorities till date and therefore the matter with regard to the renewal of permission cannot be considered:-

1. Patliputra Medical College & Hospital, Dhanbad (2nd batch of 50 to 100)
2. MGM Medical College, Jamshedpur (2nd batch of 50 to 100)

77. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch (100 seats) of Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Vidyagiri, Satara, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015 - Compliance regarding

Read: the matter with regard renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch (100 seats) of Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Vidyagiri, Satara, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015 - Compliance regarding

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 13.06.2014 received from the Dean, Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Vidyagiri, Satara, Maharashtra furnishing the compliance report for rectification of deficiencies pointed out by the Council Assessors in the assessment report as forwarded by the Central Government vide letter dated 13th June, 2014 received in the Council Office on 18th June, 2014 alongwith the previous assessment report (21st and 22nd March, 2014) as well as the complaint dt. nil from Sh. Digvijay Dilip Patil, Distt. Satara (Maharashtra) as well as order of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi dt. 03.07.2014 and passed the following order:

1. This decision is being passed in pursuance of the Order dated 03.07.2014 in WP (C) No. 3796/2014 captioned as Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Educational Society and Anr. Vs. Union of India & Ors of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi.

2. Brief facts necessary for the passing of this decision are as under:-

(a) An Assessment Report with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch (100 seats) of Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Vidyagiri, Satara, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015 was conducted on 21st & 22nd March 2014. This was considered by the Executive Committee at its meeting held on 9th May, 2014 and in view of gross deficiencies (34 in number) found in the College during inspection the Executive Committee *decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 3rd batch (100 seats) of Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Vidyagiri, Satara, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.* The above decision of the Executive Committee was communicated to the Central Government vide this Council letter dated 17.05.14.

(b) The Central Government vide letter dated 13/06/2014 (received on 18/06/2014) has forwarded a copy of letter/compliance dated 13/6/2014 received from Dean, Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Vidyagiri, Satara, Maharashtra in which the College stated that all the deficiencies as pointed in the Council letter dated 17.05.14 are rectified by the College and there are "no deficiencies as on today". The College also requested that the said compliance of deficiencies by way of inspection within one week under intimation to the College be carried out.

(c) The College being aggrieved by the recommendation of the Council for disapproval filed a Writ Petition (C) No. 3976/2014 captioned as Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society & Anr. vs. Medical Council of India & ors. The Writ came to disposed of by the Hon'ble High Court on 03.07.2014 and the Hon'ble Court was pleased to pass the following Order:-

"Present writ petition has been filed seeking quashing of the letter dated 17th May, 2014 as well as issuance of an appropriate writ seeking a direction to the respondents to grant renewal of permission for third Batch of MBBS students for the academic session 2014 -2015.

A perusal of the impugned letter reveals that as many as 34 discrepancies/deficiencies were pointed out by the respondent-MCI after inspecting the petitioner's facilities.

Learned counsel for petitioner contends that discrepancies/deficiencies pointed out are minor and non existent. He further states that deficiencies pointed out by MCI vide impugned letter have now been removed/clarified. He prays that a fresh inspection by MCI be ordered at petitioner's cost.

Mr. T. Singhdev, learned counsel for MCI states that a fresh inspection cannot be carried out as the time for carrying out inspection and making recommendation to the Central Government by the MCI has expired on 15th June, 2014. In this regard, he refers to the schedule laid down by Supreme Court in Priya Gupta Vs. State of Chattisgarh & Ors., (2012) 7 SCC 433. He further states that Supreme Court during 2014 vacations has extended the limitation for MCI till 15th June, 2014 and for Central Government till 15th July, 2014 to take a decision. He has handed over the applications filed by the MCI before the Vacation Bench of the Supreme Court. Same is taken on record.

Mr. Singhdev, lastly contends that deficiencies pointed out by MCI in its report are serious.

Mr. Pushkarna, learned counsel appearing for the UOI states that there is no prayer against the Central Government. He submits that a fresh hearing under Section 10(A)(4) of IMC Act 1956 is only given to new medical colleges/institutions or to those colleges who have increased their MBBS seats for the first time.

Having heard the parties, this court is of the view that as time for carrying out fresh inspection and making recommendations by the MCI has, expired on 15th June 2014, petitioner's oral prayer for re-inspection by MCI cannot be granted. However, as a compliance report has been filed by the petitioner with the Central Government, same is directed to be considered before passing of an order by the Central Government /MCI on or before 15th July, 2014.

In the event, petitioner is aggrieved by the final decision taken by the Central Government/MCI, it shall be open to the petitioner to challenge the same in accordance with law. Consequently, at this stage no interdiction is called for.

With the aforesaid directions, writ petition stands disposed of.”

3. The Executive Committee at its Meeting held on 08.07.14 as directed by the Hon'ble High Court considered the compliance submitted by the College and after considering the deficiency and compliance submitted by the College conveys its finding in Column III of the Table below:-

4. The Executive Committee also took note of the fact that the assessment report was shown to the Dean of the Institute who has signed on each page of the report. At that point of time, he has not pointed out any discrepancy in the report to the assessors or to the Council.

5. The Executive Committee also took note of complaint dated nil (received in the Council office on 24/6/2014) from Mr. Digvijay Dilip Patil, District Satara (Maharashtra) against the above college in which he has leveled allegation regarding malpractices, irregularities and non-availability of the facilities in the college. The complainant has also alleged that the same land is shown and declared for different institutions to different regulatory authorities.

6. In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council is of the considered opinion that the deficiencies as reported by the assessors in the assessment dated 21-22.03.2014 are serious, gross and fundamental in nature and compliance report dated 13.06.2014 forwarded by the College through the Ministry fails to convincingly and satisfactory provides explanation about the rectification of the deficiencies and this has been duly noted above against each deficiency. Moreover, the deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report dated 21-22.03.2014, cannot be verified without carrying out a compliance verification inspection and the same cannot be carried out after the last date i.e. 15th June 2014 in view of the dicta of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Mridul Dhar and Priya Gupta. Therefore, in largest public interest and interest of students the Executive Committee of the Council has decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to grant renewal of permission for admission of 3rd batch (100 seats) of MBBS students in the Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Vidyagiri, Satara, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.

78. Recognition/approval of Bundelkhand Medical College, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh under Dr. Harisingh Gour University, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh against the 100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree for academic year 2014-2015- compliance regarding.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Bundelkhand Medical College, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh under Dr. Harisingh Gour University, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh against the 100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree for academic year 2014-2015- compliance regarding.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 30.06.2014 received from the Dean, Bundelkhand Medical College, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh furnishing the compliance report dt. 04.06.2014 for rectification of deficiencies pointed out by the Council Assessors in the assessment report as forwarded by the Central Government vide letter dated 2nd July, 2014 received in the Council

Office on 3rd July alongwith the previous assessment report (12th and 13th February, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty still remains at 11.11 %. Out of deficiency of 7 Professors, 11 Asso. Prof., 6 Asst. Prof. & 1 Tutor, compliance states that 3 Professors, 4 Asso. Prof., 4 Asst. Prof. & 1 Tutor have joined, leaving deficiency of 4 Professors, 7 Asso. Prof. & 2 Asst. Prof. – i.e. 13 out of 117.
2. Shortage of Residents remains at 50.98 % (i.e. 52 out of 102). What is stated in compliance is that "*Filled by walk in interview. Interviews are conducted on every working day since 02/06/2014. (Annexure -2)*". No other details or joining reports are given.
3. Deficiency of Auditorium is not rectified.
4. AERB approval is not available.
5. Deficiency of inadequate number of mobile & static X-ray machines remains as it is.
6. Deficiency of RHTC Banda is not rectified.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee decided to convey the deficiencies still persisting after submission of compliance to the Institution/State authorities.

The Executive Committee further decided to request/advise the Dean of the college as well as Secretary (Health) of the concerned State to attend the Council office in-person on 12.07.2014 during the meeting of the Executive Committee with proof of rectification of deficiencies alongwith supporting documents and a specific undertaking correcting all the deficiencies mentioned in the assessment report in a time bound manner.

79. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (100 seats) of Government Medical College, Manjeri Malappuram Distt., Kerala under Kerala University of Health and Allied Sciences, Thrissur, Kerala u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015 – compliance regarding.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (100 seats) of Government Medical College, Manjeri Malappuram Distt., Kerala under Kerala University of Health and Allied Sciences, Thrissur, Kerala u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015 – compliance regarding.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter received from the Principal, Government Medical College, Manjeri and the Secretary to Government of Kerala furnishing the compliance report for rectification of deficiencies pointed out by the Council Assessors in the assessment report as forwarded by the Central Government vide letter dated 4th July, 2014 received in the Council Office on 4th July itself alongwith the previous assessment report (11th & 12th March, 2014) as well as the undertaking received from the Principal Secretary to Govt. of Bihar, Deptt. Of Health, Patna vide letter dt. 02.07.2014 and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty was 44.7 %. As per the compliance "*All the required professors have joined in the college. The required number of Associate professors have been appointed in the college. The required number of Assistant Professors have been posted in the college.*" No further details, joining reports or D.F. have been submitted. It is not clear how many have actually joined the college.
2. Shortage of Residents remains at 73 % (i.e. 49 out of 67). What is stated in compliance is that "*Steps have already taken to fill the vacancies of Senior Residents and Junior Residents.*"
3. Deficiency of Histopathology & Cytopathology workload is not rectified.
4. Deficiency of quarters for non-teaching staff is not rectified.

5. Deficiency of Hostels for Residents & Nurses is not rectified.
6. Deficiency of X-ray equipment is not rectified.
7. Deficiency of OPD facilities is partially rectified.
8. Deficiency of MRD is not rectified.
9. Deficiency of ICCU & SICU is not rectified.
10. Deficiencies of equipment in Pathology & Microbiology department are not rectified.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee decided to convey the deficiencies still persisting after submission of compliance to the Institution/State authorities.

The Executive Committee further decided to request/advise the Dean of the college as well as Secretary (Health) of the concerned State to attend the Council office in-person on 12.07.2014 during the meeting of the Executive Committee with proof of rectification of deficiencies alongwith supporting documents and a specific undertaking correcting all the deficiencies mentioned in the assessment report in a time bound manner.

80. First information Report No. 9(A)/2014-AC.III, dated 25.06.2014 registered by the Central Bureau of Investigation, New Delhi against Dr. Davinder Kumar, Joint Secretary, MCI

Read: The matter with regard to First information Report No. 9(A)/2014-AC.III, dated 25.06.2014 registered by the Central Bureau of Investigation, New Delhi against Dr. Davinder Kumar, Joint Secretary, MCI which reveals that Dr. Davinder Kumar, Joint Secretary has amassed assets disproportionate to his known source of income. The FIR shows that most of the assets are acquired by Dr. Davinder Kumar from 2010 onwards. The CBI has calculated the disproportionate assets acquired by Dr. Davinder Kumar by taking check period from 01.04.2010 to 31.03.2012.
