Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for recognition/approval of Chennai Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Irungalur, Trichy under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R Medical University, Chennai against the 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree for academic year 2014-2015.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for recognition/approval of Chennai Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Irungalur, Trichy under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R Medical University, Chennai against the 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree for academic year 2014-2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (18th & 19th February, 2014) and noted the following-

1. OPD attendance on the day of assessment is 960 against requirement of 1200.
2. Bed occupancy was 60 % on the day of assessment.
3. Total X-rays done are only 99 which is inadequate.
4. Number of deliveries is less. (< 1 / day).
5. Occupancy in RICU is 60 % & in PICU & NICU is 20 %.
6. In CSSD, bowl sterilizer & instrument washing machine are not available.
7. RHTC is taken on lease. No delivery or Copper T insertion records or family planning service records are available at RHTC. Immunization services are not provided.
8. UHC is taken on lease. No delivery or Copper T insertion records or family planning service records are available at UHC. Immunization services are not provided.
9. Department wise attendance registers are not maintained properly.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Executive Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to grant recognition/approval to Chennai Medical College Hospital & Research Centre,

The Executive Committee considered the matter with regard to Recognition/approval of School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida for the award of MBBS degree for 100 seats granted by Sharda University and decided to recommend to the Central Government for recognition u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 from 2014.

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ...

(2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of MBBS degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

(3) The procedure for 'Renewal' of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for recognition/approval of Bundelkhand Medical College, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh under Dr. Harisingh Gour University, Sagar, Madhya

Pradesh against the 100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree for academic year 2014-2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (12th & 13th Feb., 2014) and noted the following-

1. Deficiency of teaching faculty is 21.37 % as under:
 - (a) Professors: 7 out of 21.
 - (b) Asso. Prof.: 11 out of 23.
 - (c) Asst. Prof.: 6 out of 46.
 - (d) Tutor: 1 out of 27.
2. Shortage of Residents is 50.98 % as under:
 - (a) Senior Residents: 25 out of 46;
 - (b) Junior Residents: 27 out of 56.
3. Paramedical staff is grossly inadequate.
4. Nursing staff is grossly inadequate as only 182 nurses are available against requirement of 247.
5. C.T. Scan is not available.
6. Special radiological investigations are not performed.
7. Auditorium is under construction.
8. Area of Central library is 725 Sq.m. against requirement of 1600 Sq.m.
9. Audiometry & Speech therapy are not available.
10. Teaching beds are deficient by 10 beds in Tb & Chest.
11. Radiological & Laboratory investigations are less as compared with OPD & indoor patients.
12. MRD is not computerized. ICD X classification is not followed.
13. There are only 4 beds in casualty against requirement of 20 beds. Resuscitation equipment is inadequate.
14. In OT, central Oxygen & Nitrous Oxide are not available. There is no designated OT for Ophthalmology & ENT.
15. RICU is not available.
16. AERB approval is not available for X-ray machines. PNDT approval is not available for USGs. Only 2 mobile machines are available against requirement of 6. Only 3 static machines are available against requirement of 5. Log book is not available.
17. CSSD is not available.
18. In Anatomy museum, MRI & CT films are not available.
19. In Biochemistry, research laboratory is not available.
20. In Forensic Medicine, post-mortems are not performed by the department. Research laboratory is non-functional. Specimens are inadequate.
21. RHTC Banda is not under the control of Dean. Hostel & messing are not available.
22. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Executive Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to grant recognition/approval to Bundelkhand Medical College, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh under Dr. Harisingh Gour University, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

7. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (150 seats) of Velammal Medical College Hospital & Research Institute, Madurai, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (150 seats) of Velammal Medical College Hospital & Research Institute, Madurai, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (19th & 20th February, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 20 %.
2. Shortage of Residents is 46 %.
3. No basic course workshop in MET is conducted.
4. There was no Serology, Histopathology & Cytopathology workload on the day of assessment.
5. Audiometry & speech therapy are not available.
6. In MRD, ICD X classification of diseases is not followed. MRO is not available. Records maintained are not satisfactory.
7. In central clinical laboratory, technical staff is inadequate in Biochemistry. Biochemistry data are not maintained properly.
8. Occupancy in ICCU & MICU was 20 %, SICU, NICU / PICU was 40 % & RICU was nil.
9. Pathology: Research laboratory is not available. Audiovisual aids are not available.
10. Pharmacology: Catalogues are not available in museum.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch of 150 MBBS students at Velammal Medical College Hospital & Research Institute, Madurai, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.

NOTE – The Executive Committee noted that since all the assessments that were being conducted were without prior intimation to the colleges as per order of the Hon'ble High Court, many of the faculty members/Residents were found to be on leave due to various reasons resulting in faculty/Residents deficiency. The Executive Committee therefore decided that a Committee be formed to deliberate and decide on the types of leave to be accepted as genuine leaves. 8. **Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch (100 seats) of Govt. Medical College, Kannauj, Uttar Pradesh under King George's Medical University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.**

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch (100 seats) of Govt. Medical College, Kannauj, Uttar Pradesh under King George's Medical University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (18th & 19th February, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 48 %.
2. Shortage of Residents is 58 %.
3. Average OPD attendance is 552 against requirement of 600. On day of assessment it was 474.
4. There was no major operation & only 1 minor operation on day of assessment.
5. Radiological & laboratory investigations are inadequate.
6. Facility for E class is not available in lecture theaters.
7. MRD: ICD X classification is not followed.
8. Disaster trolley & crash cart are not available in casualty.
9. There was no patient in intensive care unit on day of assessment.
10. AERB approval is not available for X-ray machines.
11. RHTC Tirva is under joint control of CMO Kannauj & Dean which is not permissible. Residential facilities are not available at RHTC.)
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 3rd batch (100 seats) of Govt. Medical College, Kannauj, Uttar Pradesh under King George's Medical University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.

9. **Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for recognition/approval of Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of Medical Sciences, Madurangatham, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R Medical University, Chennai against the 100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree for academic year 2014-2015.**

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for recognition/approval of Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of

Medical Sciences, Madurangatham, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R Medical University, Chennai against the 100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree for academic year 2014-2015.

The Executive Committee considered the matter with regard to Recognition/approval of Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of Medical Sciences, Madurangatham, Tamilnadu for the award of MBBS degree for 100 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R Medical University, Chennai and decided to recommend to the Central Government for approval u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 from 2014.

Read: the matter with regard to Shri Krishna Medical College, Muzaffarpur – renewal of permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 100 for the academic session 2014-15 and also continuance of recognition of the college for the award of M.B.B.S. degree (50 seats).

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (10th & 11th February, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Details are not provided on college website as detailed in report.

2. Lecture theaters are of non-gallery type. Capacity is only 50 against requirement of 120. Facility for E class is not available. No lecture theater is available in the hospital.
3. Child guidance clinic & Child rehabilitation clinic are not available.
4. MRD is not computerized. ICD X classification is not followed.
5. SICU is not available. MICU has 4 beds against requirement of 5.
6. AERB approval is not available.
7. In Anatomy, dissection tables are less in number.
8. In Pathology museum, catalogues are inadequate.
9. In Microbiology, museum is small.
10. In Forensic Medicine, museum is very small. Supporting staff is inadequate.
11. Residential accommodation is available at RHTC. Messing facilities are not available.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 100 for the academic session 2014-15 at Shri Krishna Medical College, Muzaffarpur and also disapprove for continuance of recognition of the college for the award of M.B.B.S. degree (50 seats).

11. Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru – recognition/approval of the college for award of MBBS degree granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada against increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 – Assessment regarding.

Read: the matter with regard to Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru – recognition/approval of the college for award of MBBS degree granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada against increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee considered the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru for the award of MBBS degree granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and observed that while computing faculty requirement, the team of assessors has not taken into account PG component in those subjects in which Postgraduate courses are run by the institute. Hence it was decided to call the team of assessors immediately to MCI office and recompute faculty requirement and shortfall after taking into consideration PG component in those subjects in which Postgraduate courses are run by the institute and to defer the consideration of item till then.

Note: It was also decided to convene a meeting of the Executive Committee on 27/03/2014 to consider such deferred items.

12. Pt. B.D. Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak– Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 200 for the academic session 2014-15 – Assessment regarding.

The Executive Committee considered the matter with regard to renewal of permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 200 for the academic session 2014-15 at Pt. B.D. Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak and observed that while computing faculty requirement, the team of assessors has not taken into account PG component in those subjects in which Postgraduate courses are run by the institute. Hence it was decided to call the team of assessors immediately to MCI office and recompute faculty requirement and shortfall after taking into consideration PG component in those subjects in which Postgraduate courses are run by the institute and to defer the consideration of item till then.

Note: It was also decided to convene a meeting of the Executive Committee on 27/03/2014 to consider such deferred items.

13. Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur - (i) Renewal of permission for admission of 5th batch of MBBS students against increase intake i.e. from 130 to 150 for the academic year 2014-15 and also Compliance verification for renewal of permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against increase intake i.e. from 130 to 150; (ii) Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 200 from the academic year 2014-15 - req.

Read: the matter with regard to Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur - (i) Renewal of permission for admission of 5th batch of MBBS students against increase intake i.e. from 130 to 150 for the academic year 2014-15 and also Compliance verification for renewal of permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against increase intake i.e. from 130 to 150; (ii) Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 200 from the academic year 2014-15 - req.

The Executive Committee considered the matter with regard to renewal of permission for admission of 5th batch of MBBS students against increase intake i.e. from 130 to 150 for the academic year 2014-15 and also Compliance verification for renewal of permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against increase intake i.e. from 130 to 150 at Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur and observed that while computing faculty requirement, the team of assessors has not taken into account PG component in those subjects in which Postgraduate courses are run by the institute. Hence it was decided to call the team of assessors to MCI office and recompute faculty requirement and shortfall after taking into consideration PG component in those subjects in which Postgraduate courses are run by the institute and to defer the consideration of item till then.

With regard to the matter of increase of MBBS Seats from 150 to 200 from the Academic Year 2014-15 at Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur, and observed that OPD on day of assessment is 1850 which is less than minimum required as per qualifying criteria 6 (a) (ii) of Opening new or higher course or increase of admission capacity Regulations as amended. Thus the institute does not fulfill the eligibility criteria. In this view of matter, it was decided to recommend to the Central Government to disapprove the scheme submitted by the institute for increase in admission capacity from 150 to 200 and return the application to the institute as the eligibility criteria prescribed in Opening new or higher course or increase of admission capacity Regulations as amended are not fulfilled.

NOTE - It was also decided to convene a meeting of the Executive Committee on 27/03/2014 to consider such deferred items.

The Executive Committee further decided that no college should be considered for further increase of seats unless it is recognized for the existing number of seats.

14. Recognition/Approval of PSG Institute of Medical Sciences, Coimbatore for award of MBBS degree granted by the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. University, Chennai against increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and also continuance of recognition of the college for the award of M.B.B.S. degree(100 seats).

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/Approval of PSG Institute of Medical Sciences, Coimbatore for award of MBBS degree granted by the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. University, Chennai against increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and also continuance of recognition of the college for the award of M.B.B.S. degree (100 seats).

The Executive Committee considered the matter with regard to approval of PSG Institute of Medical Sciences, Coimbatore for award of MBBS degree granted by the TamilNadu Dr. M.G.R. University, Chennai and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant approval for increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 from 2014 and also approved for continuance of recognition of the college for the award of M.B.B.S. degree (100 seats).

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

9. Audiometry & speech therapist are not available.
10. Child welfare clinic & Child guidance clinic are not available.
11. Teaching Beds: requirement at this stage is 350 which is distributed in 2 hospitals. In Psychiatry, only 3 beds are available against requirement of 5. Facilities in wards like pantry, utility rooms, demonstration rooms, etc. are not available. Treatment room & Doctors' duty room are available in a few wards only. In all wards, space between two beds is not 1.5 m as required as per Regulations.

22. Residential accommodation & messing facilities are not available at RHTC Bandipur.
23. UHC is not under control of Principal.
24. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

20. There are 2 demonstration rooms which are shared by 4 departments of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry & Community Medicine.
21. Physiology: Space for laboratory is inadequate.
22. Pharmacology: Space for Experimental Pharmacology is 21 Sq.m. against requirement of 150 Sq.m. Area of museum is 32.68 Sq.m. against requirement of 100 Sq.m.
23. UHC is not under control of Dean.
24. Central Research Laboratory is not available.
25. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

2. Clinical Material

- OPD attendance on 29.1.2014 was 505 approx. out of 900 expected at 4th renewal.
 - Bed occupancy was 43.5% (231 patients only), Obstetrics workload was grossly inadequate with just 1-2 deliveries per day.
 - Impression – clinical material grossly inadequate.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee decided not to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch (4th renewal) of 100 MBBS students at L.N. Medical College, Bhopal as per clause 8(3)(1)(b) of Gazette Notification dt. 16.4.2010 of Establishment of Medical College Regulations (Amendment),2010.

The Executive Committee considered the matter with regard to establishment of New Medical College at Mainpuri, Uttar Pradesh by Sai Foundation, Mumbai, Maharashtra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15 and approved the recommendations of the Scrutiny Committee and decided to disapprove the scheme and return the application to the Central Govt.as it appears from the financial statement of expenditure that the running hospital was not available at the time of issuance of Essentiality Certificate & Consent of Affiliation because no such expenses are found there, which are necessary for running of hospital.

52. Minutes of the Academic Council meetings held on 26.02.2014 and 12.03.2014 – approval of .

Read: the matter with regard to Minutes of the Academic Council meetings held on 26.02.2014 and 12.03.2014 – approval of.

The Executive Committee after detail deliberations approved the minutes of the meeting of Academic council dt. 26.02.2014. The committee further approved the minutes of academic council dt. 12.03.2014 with modifications as under.

1. Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting of the Academic Council held on 12th March, 2014

The Chairman, Academic Council welcomed the members to the meeting and informed them that the current meeting was requisitioned urgently since the Executive Committee meeting is scheduled to be held on 14th March, 2014 and the General Body of the Council on 28th March, 2014. The recommendations of the Academic Council would be required to be placed before the Executive Committee and thereon before the General Body of the Council for their approval so that they can be implemented.

The Minutes of the Academic Council meeting held on 26th February, 2014 were confirmed.

2. Action taken on the minutes of the Academic Council meetings held on 20.1.2014 & 26.2.2014.

The Action taken on the minutes of the Academic Council meetings held on 20.1.2014 & 26.2.2014 were approved.

3. Rationalization of Regulations on Minimum Standards Requirements for colleges with annual intake of 50/100/150/200/250 admissions annually, in the context of :-

(a) Number of beds in the Unit:

Academic Council recommended that the number of beds per unit as of now in all the clinical subjects should continue to remain the same **except recommended at 3(c).**

(b) Requirement of Sr. Residents:

Academic Council recommended one Senior Resident for every Clinical teaching Unit, for every clinical subject, except for the subjects of Radiodiagnosis & Anaesthesiology where the number of Senior Residents would continue to remain as prescribed under the MSR Regulations for the respective intake and for the subject of Pathology where the number of Tutors would continue to remain as prescribed under MSR Regulations for the respective intake.. The presence of one Senior Resident would be mandatory for completion of the 'teaching complement' of the said unit for undergraduate as well as postgraduate courses.

(c) Number of teaching beds in Departments like Dermatology, ENT, Ophthalmology, TB & Chest Diseases & Psychiatry where the trend is on 'day care services' :

Academic Council recommended as under:-

Number of beds in various subjects be modified as under:

(a) For 100 admissions: Number of beds in Tb & Chest & E.N.T. be reduced to 15 each; Number of beds in Obstetrics & Gynaecology be increased from 60 to 70.

(b) For 150 admissions: Number of beds in Obst. & Gynaecology be reduced to 90; in Ophthalmology to 20; Tb & Chest & E.N.T. be reduced to 15 each; in Skin & VD, Psychiatry be reduced to 10 each. Number of beds in General Medicine & General Surgery be increased to 180 each.

(d) Requirement of Auditorium:

Academic Council recommended that prescribed requirement of Auditorium be deleted.

(e) Requirement/capacity of examination halls:

The Academic Council recommended as under:-

For 50/100/150 admissions, annually, the capacity requirement in the Examination Halls would be calculable on the basis of sanctioned annual intake x 3 plus 50 shall be available at the time of 1st renewal.

For 200/250 admissions, annually, the capacity requirement in the Examination Halls would be calculable on the basis of sanctioned annual intake x 3 plus 50 shall be available at the time of 1st renewal.

The seating capacity in the Examination Hall will not be of gallery type.

(f) Requirement for hostels for students:

The Academic Council recommended that hostels should be available for undergraduate students would be 75% of the annual intake capacity on year to year basis till the recognition.

(g) Requirement of staff Quarters (teaching/non teaching):

The Academic Council recommended as under:-

The requirement of the staff quarters for teaching and non-teaching staff would be in terms of 20% of the sanctioned strength on year to year basis till the recognition.

(h) Requirement of separate Autopsy block:

The Academic Council recommended that Autopsy block is to be shared by the Department of Pathology and Forensic Medicine respectively.

(i) Rationalization of faculty & residents in departments of Anaesthesiology

The executive committee observed that present Regulations as amended prescribe less number of faculty in department of Anaesthesiology for 250 students than for 150 /200 students as under:

It is recommended to rationalize the requirements as under:

The aforesaid recommendations be suitably incorporated as proposed amendments to the governing regulations on Minimum Standard requirement for the annual intake of 50, 100, 150, 200 and 250 respectively and to the required extent in the regulations on postgraduate medical education.

4. Structuring the definition of Sr. Residents & accruality of teaching experience thereto:

The Academic Council defined that Senior Resident is one who is doing his residency in the concerned subject after obtaining PG degree or after completing 3 years of residency in the subject in a teaching hospital. The upper age limit of senior resident shall be 40 years.

The recommendation maybe suitably incorporated as proposed amendments to the governing regulations on Minimum Standard requirement for the annual intake of 50, 100, 150, 200 and 250 respectively and to the required extent in the regulations on postgraduate medical education.

5. Rationalization of Sr. Residency in TEQ:

The Academic Council recommended that three years junior residency in a clinical subject resulting in conferment of PG Degree + one year Senior Residency in a recognized / permitted / approved medical college shall be the minimum eligibility requirement for the post of Assistant Professor in a clinical subject.

6. Equivalence of Scheduled Qualifications with those of DNB in the context of Sr. Residency.

The Academic Council recommended that a candidate with DNB postgraduate qualification from a non-teaching hospital would be eligible for the post of Assistant Professor in a recognized / approved / permitted medical college exclusively on acquiring experience of three years of full time as Resident or Tutor in a recognized / permitted / approved medical college. The same is warranted primarily on the consideration that the DNB teaching programme in non-teaching hospital and does not have the requirement of three years of Residency as is mandatory in case of regular scheduled postgraduate degree programmes run in recognized / approved / permitted medical colleges.

The aforesaid recommendation be appropriately incorporated as a required amendment in the Teacher Eligibility Qualification Regulation.

7. Simultaneous permissibility of DNB courses in recognized colleges running full time scheduled PG courses.

The Academic Council recommended that PG courses are interpolated on the basis of three cardinal criteria namely the ratio of intake to recognized PG teaching faculty, to no. of teaching beds, and to available clinical material on the said teaching beds. As such, permissibility of DNB Courses in approved/permitted/recognized medical colleges exclusively against the availability of a surplus postgraduate teacher is illogical, irrational and is also ending up in

resultant dilution of the academic standards the maintenance of which is so vital to the quality of postgraduate medical education and the capacity of the trained specialist manpower generated out of it. Hence, in approved, permitted, recognized medical colleges under the supervisory jurisdiction of the Medical Council of India, simultaneous running of PG courses and DNB courses should not be permitted.

8. Structuring of annual targets for yearly renewal for annual intake of 200/250 admissions.

The Academic Council approved the draft documents prepared in regard to structuring of targets to be met with at the time of annual renewals and recognition for the annual intake of 200 and 250 in terms of the regulations in vogue pertaining to the minimum standard requirements for the said intake and further recommended that all MSRs (50/100/150/200/250 admissions annually) should be amended on the basis of the recommendations made by Academic Council in this meeting upon the approval to the same by the Executive Committee and General Body respectively of the Medical Council of India. Consequent upon the same the documents bringing out fulfillment of targets at the time of annual renewals and the recognition for the annual intake of 50/100/150/200 and 250 with the said amendments be brought out.

9. Upgradation of FDP in MCI website.

- (a) The Academic Council recommended that the details of the Faculty Development Programme (FDP) until December, 30th 2013 may be uploaded on the MCI website for the public information.

The Academic Council also made the following two recommendations: (1) the recommendations of the Academic Council meeting dt. 20th January, 2014 that “Three best Nodal/Regional Centres in MET, in terms of the number of faculty trained, would be ceremonially awarded Certificate of Appreciation under the signature of President, MCI” .

may be amended to read as under:-

“The MCI Nodal/Regional Centres in MET, who have carried out training of 1000 or more than 1000 faculty from medical colleges in Medical Education Technologies until December 30, 2013 would be ceremonially awarded Certificate of Appreciation under the signature of President, MCI” .

- (2) If any Regional Centre has the required number of faculty with prescribed qualifications in advanced training as given in the policy document approved at the meeting of the Conveners of Nodal Centres held on 3rd February, 2014, and approved by the Executive Committee of the Council at its meeting held on 18th February, 2014, the same may be upgraded as Nodal Centres on solicitation subject to the fulfillment of the prescribed eligibility whereby they would be entitled to conduct the Advance course in MET. The Academic Cell would submit the necessary information in this regard to the President, Medical Council of India, who in consultation with Chairman, Academic Council may take the appropriate decision in the matter.

- 10.(a) Letter from Dr. R.L. Jalappa, President, Sri Devaraj Urs Academy of High Education and Research, Kolar on the subject of – Relaxation of Minimum Standard Requirements for the Private Medical Colleges.**

The Academic Council recommended that the recommendations of the Academic Council meeting held on 12th March, 2014 may be conveyed to him.

- 10(b) Letter from Surg. Commodore G. Vishwanath, Director & Dean, Institute of Naval Medicine, Mumbai on the subject of - Inclusion of MD Marine Medicine in Schedule of Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations of MCI.**

The Academic Council opined that the matter may be referred to the PG Committee whose suggestions may be placed before the General Body and if approved, PG Section may take necessary action to seek an appropriate amend Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, by the Govt. of India.

- 10(c)** The members raised the issue of the MCI curricula being copied by individuals/institutions and used under their own name/logo. This was considered as a serious issue and the Academic Council recommended that all Curricula and their contents should be brought under the Copyright of the Medical Council of India in the name of its Secretary in the capacity as Registrar of the Medical Council of India.

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ...

(2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of MBBS degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

(3) The procedure for 'Renewal' of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.

(4) Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute.”
