The Executive Committee of the Council confirmed the minutes of the last meeting held on 03-01-2014.

2. **Minutes of the last meeting of the Executive Committee – Action taken thereon.**

To note the action taken on the minutes of the Executive Committee Meeting held on 03-01-2014.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted the action taken on the minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 03-01-2014 with the following observations:-

1. The Executive Committee noted that legal opinion in certain cases had not yet been obtained even after period three weeks and directed the Law Officer to furnish the opinion in a time bound manner. The Committee also noted that the action taken report was incomplete since the action taken by the Assessment Cell on the files referred to it had not been included. It was also noted that legal opinion on land documents and opinion of the Accounts Officer on the financial documents enclosed with the UG applications were not being received in a time. Both the sections were directed to provide the same in a time bound manner.
2. Executive Committee also deliberated on the ways to improve the assessment system/forms/processes. The committee also deliberated on the suggestions made by Dr. Ramesh Reddy. In this regard it was decided that the office would write to all the General Body members to send their inputs on method of improvement in the Assessment process by 6.2.2014. The office was directed to compile the replies received and circulate them to all Executive Committee members so that necessary changes could be made in the assessment system so as to make it more transparent and objective.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (20/21st December, 2013) and noted the following:-

1. Shortage of teaching faculty is 11.43% as under:
 - Professor – 4

 - Assistant Professor – 2
 - Tutor-2

2. Data of clinical material is blank for the day of assessment.
3. Seating capacity of the demonstration room in Microbiology is inadequate.
4. In Forensic Medicine, demonstration room, museum and departmental research laboratory is not available.
5. In Community Medicine, demonstration room, museum, practical laboratory and research laboratory are not available.
6. RHTC Bettahalasur is not under the control of Dean. Residential accommodation is not available at RHTC. Messing arrangements are not available.
7. UHC is ESI Hospital, Peenya. No separate UHC is available.
8. Any other deficiencies as pointed by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (30/31st December,2013) and noted the following:-

1. Shortage of teaching faculty is 5.4% as under –
 Professor: 2 (1 each in Physiology & Microbiology)
 Associate Prof. : 3 (1 each in Microbiology, Community Medicine, Anaesthesia).

2. Average daily OPD attendance is 457 which is inadequate (Requirement: 500). On the day of assessment, it is still less at 440.
3. Number of major surgical operations per day is inadequate. (6 total major operations of all specialities combined).
4. Radiological investigations are grossly inadequate (total x-rays 41 per day)
5. Laboratory investigations are grossly inadequate
6. Lecture theatres are not air-conditioned
7. Paediatrics, Eye & ENT OPDs have only 3 rooms each against requirement of 4 each
8. Casualty beds are only 10 against requirement of 20.
9. Blood bank is not functional. License for the same is not available.
10. Any other deficiencies as pointed by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 3rd batch of 100 MBBS students for the academic session 2014-2015 at Lord Buddha Koshi Medical College and Hospital, Saharsa, Bihar.

9. **Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch (100 seats) of Govt. Sivagangai Medical College, Sivagangai, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: the matter with regard to the assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch (100 seats) of Govt. 2. Histopathology & cytopathology investigations are inadequate.
3. Journals in Central Library are inadequate (21 available against 40 required)
4. Hostel capacity is inadequate. (Available 250 against required 300)
5. Residents' accommodation is inadequate (Available 60 against 85)
6. Non-teaching staff quarters are inadequate (Available 32 against 36 required)
7. Registration counters are not computerized
8. Special radiological investigations are not routinely done.
9. Casualty beds are only 10 against 20 required.
10. Although x-ray machines are available, the number has not mentioned in the report.
11. Details of website have not been provided in the report.
12. Any other deficiencies as pointed by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 3rd batch of 100 MBBS students for the academic session 2014-2015 at Govt. Sivagangai Medical College, Sivagangai, Tamilnadu.

10. Continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Anantpur – consideration of Compliance verification Assessment report - Regarding.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (19/20th November, 2013) and noted the following:-

1. Shortage of faculty is as under -

Professor: 8 (1 each in FMT, Tb & Chest, Skin & VD, Psychiatry, ENT, Ophthalmology, OBG, Anaesthesia)

Assoc. Prof.: 5 (1 each in Anatomy & Physiology, 3 in General Surgery)

Asstt. Prof.: 7 (1 each in Anatomy, RHTC, UHC, Epidemiologist)

Tutor: 27 (Physiology1, FMT 1)

(b) Shortage of Senior Residents is as under:

Senior Resident: 25 (Radiodiagnosis:4, General Medicine:6, Psychiatry:1, General Surgery:6, Orthopaedics:2, Anaesthesia:6)

2. Nursing staff is inadequate
3. Registration counter not computerized.
4. Radiological, Ultrasonography & laboratory investigations like histopathology & cytopathology are grossly inadequate
5. Journals in the central library are inadequate (88 available against 100 required).
6. Capacity of common rooms for boys and girls is inadequate (30 sq.mt. available against 100 sq.mt.)
7. Accommodation in students' hostel is inadequate (300 available against 375 required).
8. Accommodation in interns' hostel is inadequate (90 available against 100 required).
9. Residents' accommodation is grossly inadequate (24 available against 85 required)
10. No details of nurses' accommodation is given (required 48)
11. MRD is not computerized. ICD X classification is not followed.
12. Only 2 static units are available against 5 required. Only 2 mobile units are available against 6 required.
13. Intercom is not available.
14. Equipment in CSSD is inadequate.
15. Residential accommodation is not available at RHTC.
16. Dean & Medical Superintendent are not available. Professor of Pathology is officiating as Principal. Professor of Medicine is officiating as Medical Superintendent.
17. Any other deficiencies as pointed by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

The Executive Committee decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Anantpur and to give 3(three) months time to the college to rectify the deficiencies. It was further decided to keep the matter in abeyance till the deficiencies are satisfactorily rectified and only then the matter would be considered. Failure to submit compliance within the stipulated period would be construed as non-fulfillment of requirement as per Minimum Standard Requirements and request for Continuance of Recognition would not be considered.

11. **Continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church Medial College, Kolenchery – consideration of Assessment report – Regarding.**

1. Pharmaco-vigilance committee is not available
2. Lecture theatres are not air-conditioned
3. Area of Central library is 1355 sq.mt. against requirement of 1600 sq.mt.
4. Size of Medical Superintendent's office is small (15 sq.mt.)
5. Beds of TB & Chest (20 beds) & Skin & VD (10 beds) have been kept together in General Medicine Ward V which is not as per Regulations .
8. Details of hostels & accommodation not provided in report.
9. Any other deficiencies as pointed by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

The Executive Committee decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church Medial College, Kolenchery and to give 3(three) months time to the college to rectify the deficiencies. It was further decided to keep the matter in abeyance till the deficiencies are satisfactorily rectified and only then the matter would be considered. Failure to submit compliance within the stipulated period would be construed as non-fulfillment of requirement as per Minimum Standard Requirements and request for Continuance of Recognition would not be considered.

Note: The Executive Committee also noted that the Assessment Report was incomplete and several columns had been left blank. The office is directed to issue a notice/memo to the Assessors asking for explanation on the same and remove his/her name from the Assessor Bank.

16. Judgment of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in WP (C) No. 6261/2013 in Raipur Institute of Medical Sciences vs. Union of India.

Further it was decided to work out the feasibility of videography particularly when the inspections shall be surprise one. The assessment cell be informed accordingly.

Medical College, Raigarh, Chattisgarh under Chattisgarh Ayush and Health Sciences University, Raipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (3/4th January, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Shortage of faculty is 79.23% as under:
 - a. Professor : 13/15
 - b. Assoc.Prof.: 10/13
 - c. Asstt. Prof.: 26/32
 - d. Tutor: 12/17

Shortage of Residents is 66.12% as under:

- a. Senior Resident: 20/31
- b. Junior Resident: 21/31

2. Although the institute is permitted for intake of 50, for Academic Year 2013-2014, it appears that it has admitted 72 students are shown in the table of admitted

students. (S.C. 15 + S.T. 05 + General 34 + AIEE Quota 18 = 72). This may be verified from the list of admitted students and if correct, clarification be asked.

3. Paramedical staff is grossly inadequate. There are no paramedical personnel in the departments of Microbiology, Blood Bank, Anaesthesia, Labour Room, CSSD, Mortuary, Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine, Community Medicine, UHC & RHTC.
4. Nursing staff is grossly inadequate as only total 44 nursing staff are available.
5. Buildings are under construction and they are yet to be handed over to the institution.
6. No CME programmes have been held by the institute in the last year.
7. Only 1 lecture theatre of capacity of 120 is available which is inadequate. Audiovisual aids are not available.
8. Common room for girls is not available. Common room for boys is inadequate as it has capacity of 20 only.
9. Central photography section is not available.
10. Hostel for girls is not available.
11. Residential quarters are not available.
12. Teaching area in the hospital is not available.
13. In OPD in ENT speech therapy is not available. In Paediatrics, child welfare and child guidance clinics are not available.
14. There are only 6 beds in casualty.
15. Separate sections for Pathology, Microbiology & Biochemistry are not available in Central Laboratory.
16. There is only 1 O.T. which is inadequate. There are 3 tables in the O.T. which are not as per norms. Pre anaesthetic checkup facility is not available.
17. Only 2 beds are available in ICCU against requirement of 5. There were no patients on the day of assessment. Other ICUs are not available.
18. In labour room, no separate beds for septic cases is available.
19. In Radio-diagnosis, only 1 static machine of 300 mA is available which is inadequate. 50 mA machine is not available.
20. Blood bank license has expired. As pointed out by licensing authority, 35 deficiencies have been found during inspection for renewal of license.
21. CSSD is not available.
22. Intercom is not available.
23. Central Laundry is not available.
24. Preclinical departments are not available.
25. Paraclinical departments are not available.
26. On the day of assessment, no students were available in the college.
27. Any other deficiencies as pointed by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch of 50 MBBS students for the academic session 2014-2015 at Late Shri Lakhi Ram Agrawal Memorial Govt. Medical College, Raigarh, Chattisgarh.

Note: Assessor's report is incomplete. For example, in the columns of office space in part A II to be filled by assessors, the remark is "yet to be verified." Details of facilities available in wards are not given. Clinical material on the day of assessment is not available. The office is directed to issue a notice/memo to the Assessors asking for explanation on the same and remove his/her name from the Assessor Bank.

18. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 4th batch (100 seats) of Career Institute of Medical Sciences & Hospital, Lucknow under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 4th batch (100 seats) of Career Institute of Medical Sciences & Hospital, Lucknow under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (30/31st December, 2013) and noted the following:-

1. Radiological investigations are low (48 x-rays on the day of assessment) and do not match with the number of outdoor attendance and bed occupancy claimed by the institute.
2. On the day of assessment, there was only 1 patient in ICCU, MICU, SICU, PICU & NICU each, resultantly bed occupancy in ICCU & ICUs was only 20% on the day of assessment.
3. No special investigations carried out at all.
4. In blood bank, only 4 units are stored on the day of assessment. Only 2 units were dispensed which reflects inadequate number of major operations being performed in the institute.
5. Residential accommodation at RHTC is available only for 4 students which is inadequate.
6. Any other deficiencies as pointed by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of 100 MBBS students for the academic session 2014-2015 at Career Institute of Medical Sciences & Hospital, Lucknow.

2. Occupancy in MICU is 40% & PICU/NICU is 20%.
3. On the day of assessment, number of normal delivery was only 1. There was no caesarean section. Average Caesarean Section number is only 10/month which is inadequate.
4. Any other deficiencies as pointed by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 3rd batch of 150

MBBS students for the academic session 2014-2015 at Mayo Institute of Medical Sciences, Utter Pradesh.

21. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (150 seats) of IQ City Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (150 seats) of IQ City Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee considered the Council Assessor report (2nd & 3rd January, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Bed occupancy 61%
2. Resuscitation equipment is inadequate in septic O.T. Defibrillator and ventilator are not available.
3. Occupancy on the day of assessment in PICU is nil. In SICU & NICU, it is only 20%.
4. Number of specimens in Anatomy museum is only 40.
5. RHTC, Loudoha is not under the control of Dean.
6. It is not clear from the report whether the institute has blood bank or not. The license seems to be in name of another institute.
7. Lecture hall is not Air conditioned.
8. Normal delivery & caesarean section
9. Any other deficiencies as pointed by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch of 150 MBBS students for the academic session 2014-2015 at IQ City Medical College, Burdwan.

22. Assessment of the physical and other facilities available for recognition/approval of the University College of Medical Sciences & GTB Hospital, Delhi against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 under Delhi University, New Delhi u/s 11(2) of IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to Assessment of the physical and other facilities available for recognition/approval of the University College of Medical Sciences &

1. There are only 3 lecture theatres of 180 capacity against requirement of 4. The capacity of another theatre is only 270 against requirement of 350.
2. Capacity of common rooms for boys and girls is inadequate.
3. Number of beds in Psychiatry are only 8 against requirement of 15.
4. Only 4 mobile X-ray units are available against requirement of 6. Only 4 static X-ray units are available against requirement of 6.
5. RHTC is not under the control of Dean. It is under the control of Delhi Government.
6. Any other deficiencies as pointed by the Assessor in the Assessment report.

The Executive Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to grant recognition/approval to University College of Medical Sciences & GTB Hospital, Delhi against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 under Delhi University, New Delhi u/s 11(2) of IMC Act, 1956.

23. Recognition/approval of Indira Gandhi Government Medical College, Nagpur for award of MBBS degree against the increase intake i.e. from 60 to 100 granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik.

The Executive Committee considered the Assessor report (11/12th January,2014) and noted the following:-

1. Website of college is not updated with regard to details of infrastructure, details of admitted students and details of anti-ragging committee.
2. Average daily OPD is 1150.
3. Capacity of examination hall cum auditorium is only 250 which is inadequate.
4. Lecture theatre of capacity of 350 is not available.
5. Number of beds in casualty are only 21 against requirement of 25. Resuscitation equipment in casualty is inadequate. It needs to be upgraded and modernized.
6. In O.T. there are 14 tables in 10 O.T. which is not as per norms.
7. In Radiodiagnosis, only 3 mobile units are available against requirement of 6. Only 3 static units are available against requirement of 6. The only CT scan was under service and repair.
8. In Anatomy, cadaver storage tanks need to be increased. In museum, X-rays & CT scans should be made available.
9. In Community Medicine museum, there are no specimens and catalogues. Residential accommodation at RHTC is inadequate. UHC is not under control of Dean.
10. Details of Microbiology department are not given in report.

In view of the above, the members of the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to grant recognition/approval to Karnataka Institute of Medical Sciences, Hubli for award of MBBS degree granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 11(2) of IMC Act, 1956.

25. Grant of Provisional/Permanent registration certificate to the candidates graduate from various foreign medical institute u/s 25(1) and 13(3) of the IMC Act. 1956.
