Minutes of the meeting of the Executive Committee held on 27th March, 2014 at 11.00 a.m. in the Council office at Sector 8, Pocket 14, Dwarka, New Delhi.

1. **Pt. B.D. Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak– Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 200 for the academic session 2014-15 – Assessment regarding.**

Read: the matter with regard to Pt. B.D. Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak– Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 200 for the academic session 2014-15

The Executive Committee considered the matter and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against the increased intake from 150 to 200 at Pt. B.D. Sharma PGIMS, Rohtak for the academic year 2014-15.

2. **Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur - (i) Renewal of permission for admission of 5th batch of MBBS students against increase intake i.e. from 130 to 150 for the academic year 2014-15 and also Compliance verification for renewal of permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against increase intake i.e. from 130 to 150; (ii) Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 200 from the academic year 2014-15 - reg.**

Read: the matter with regard to Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur - (i) Renewal of permission for admission of 5th batch of MBBS students against increase intake i.e. from 130 to 150 for the academic year 2014-15 and also Compliance verification for renewal of permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against increase intake i.e. from 130 to 150; (ii) Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 200 from the academic year 2014-15.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (7th & 8th February, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. OPD on the day of assessment was 1850 which is less than the minimum required as per qualifying criteria 6(a) (ii) of opening new or higher course or increase of admission capacity Regulations as amended. Thus the institute does not fulfill the eligibility criteria.
2. There are 20 tables in 11 O.T.s which is not as per MCI norms.
3. AERB approval is not available for X-ray machines.

4. Blood Component separation facility is not available.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt :-

- (i) Not to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch of MBBS students against increase intake from 130 to 150 for the academic year 2014-15;
- (ii) Not to permit Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 200 for the academic year 2014-15.

3. **Katuri Medical College & Hospital, Guntur– Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 for the academic session 2014-15 – Assessment regarding.**

Read: the matter with regard to Katuri Medical College & Hospital, Guntur– Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 for the academic session 2014-15.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (24th & 25th February, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Faculty is deficient for PG courses run in the departments of Anesthesiology, General Medicine, Paediatrics, Psychiatry, Ophthalmology, ENT & Gen.Surgery. Total deficiency after considering PG courses run in the institute works out as under:-
 - a) Assoc. Professor – 7 (Anaesthesiology-2, Gen.Med.-1, Paediatrics-1, Ophthalmology-1, Gen.Surgery-1, pathology-1).
Asstt.Professor- 16 (Gen.Med.-5, Paediatrics-3, ENT-1, Gen.Surg.-5, Community Medicine-1, Dentistry-1)
Tutor – 1 (Pharmacology-1)
 - b) Total shortage of Residents after considering PG courses run by the institute is 32.23% as Senior Resident – 26 out of 44 & Jr.Resident – 13 out of 77.
2. Only 4 static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5.
3. Microbiology – only rooms are available for 7 service laboratories. They are non-functional. Research laboratory is not available.
4. Most of the faculty did not have original appointment letters. Appointment letters did not mention service conditions and salary.
5. OT Registers are not properly maintained.
6. Casualty register did not mention admission records of patients admitted on the day of assessment.

7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against increased intake from 100 to 150 at Katuri Medical College & Hospital, Guntur for the academic year 2014-15.

4. **Govt. Medical College, Akola – renewal of permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 for the academic session 2014-15 and also continuance of recognition of the college for the award of M.B.B.S. degree(100 seats)– Assessment regarding.**

Read: the matter with regard to Govt. Medical College, Akola – renewal of permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 for the academic session 2014-15 and also continuance of recognition of the college for the award of M.B.B.S. degree(100 seats).

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (4th & 5th March, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Teaching areas in OPD are small having capacity of 20. Examination rooms are congested.
2. Central clinical laboratory functions only during OPD hours.
3. Speech therapy is not available.
4. In none of wards, water coolers are available.
5. Disaster trolley is not available in casualty.
6. Resuscitation equipment is inadequate in O.T.s
7. SICU & RICU are not available.
8. AERB approval is not available.
9. Only 2 mobile X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6. Both are non-functional. Only 3 static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5.
10. Anatomy – students lockers are less by 100.
11. Specialists visits are not available at RHTC & UHC.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake from 100 to 150 for the academic session 2014-15 and also not to grant continuance of recognition of the college for the award of M.B.B.S. degree(100 seats) at Govt. Medical College, Akola

5. **Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru – recognition/approval of the college for award of MBBS degree granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada against increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 – Assessment regarding.**

Read: the matter with regard to Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru – recognition/approval of the college for award of MBBS degree granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada against increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee considered the matter and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant recognition/approval to Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru for the award of MBBS degree granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada against increased intake from 100 to 150 u/s 11(2) of IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ...

(2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of MBBS degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

(3) The procedure for 'Renewal' of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.

(4) Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute."

6. **Suspension of Smt. Sarabjeet Chopra, LDC & Shri Vikas Tanwar, LDC.**

Read: the matter with regard to suspension of Smt. Sarabjeet Chopra, LDC & Shri Vikas Tanwar, LDC.

The Executive Committee discussed the issue of suspension of Smt. Sarabjeet Chopra, LDC & Shri Vikas Tanwar, LDC and noted that Sh. Suresh Kumar, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Central Bureau of Investigation, New Delhi had informed the office of the Council on 26/03/2014 that they have arrested two employees of the Council viz. Smt. Sarabjeet Chopra and Sh. Vikas Tanwar.

The Executive Committee also perused, Rule 10(2)(a) of CCS(CCA) Rules, which states as under:-

- “(2) *A Government servant shall be deemed to have been placed under suspension by an order of Appointing Authority-*
- (a) *with effect from the date of his detention, if he is detained in custody, whether on a criminal charge or otherwise, for a period exceeding forty-eight hours;”*

After considering the above facts, the Executive Committee decided that since Smt. Sarabjeet Chopra, LDC and Sh. Vikas Tanwar, LDC have been arrested by the CBI and detained in custody, approved the suspension as conveyed vide orders dated 27.03.2014.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
