The Executive Committee of the Council while noting the action taken on the minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 2nd March, 2015 observed the following:-

- Item No.7 Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 4th batch (150 seats) of Mayo Institute of Medical Sciences, , Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Awadh University, Faizabad, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.
- Item No.8 Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch (100 seats) of Sardar Rajas Medical College, Hospital and Research Centre, Jaring, Kalahandi, Odisha under Sambalpur University, Sambalpur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted that action has not yet been taken by the Council on part 1 & 2 of the decision and directed the Section to submit the action taken at its next meeting.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted that the letter for withdrawal of show cause notice was sent to the college authorities on 05.03.2015 with copy to Central Government and other concerned authorities.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted that Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Delhi had not yet submitted compliance of discharge of students viz. Ms. Zara Khan & Ms. Sama Rizvi and therefore decided to write to the concerned university to not to enroll these students and to the State Medical Council for not registering these students. A copy of the communication be sent to college authorities. The Committee further directed the college to inform the concerned candidates of the said decision since the onus of informing them was with the college.

The Executive Committee of the Council also decided that the above decision may be applied to all those medical colleges where discharge notices have been issued and the college has not yet complied.

D.F. from the 2nd institute is stated to be not available. The office is directed to trace all such D.F. and submit the report incorporating such D.F., also stating the reasons for non-availability of D.F. of 2nd institute, and the circumstances of the disappearance of these D.F. to the sub-committee. This exercise should be completed within 4 weeks. The sub-committee should meet again and prepare a report and submit to the Executive Committee.</p> <p>(2) In several instances, the fact of his being present at assessment of the 1st institute has been clearly mentioned by the concerned faculty in his/her D.F. and yet was accepted as faculty by the assessors. Ms. Zara Khan & Ms. Sama Rizvi, letter of Principal to only one candidate – Ms. Zara Khan is included in the item. It was further observed that even this letter is in nature of clarification of Principal to the father and discharge notice per se.</p> <p>In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council directed the office to ascertain from the Institute whether these two candidates have been issued discharge notices or not and if yes, it may be asked to submit copies of discharge notices along with present status.</p>		<p>The Executive Committee of the Council noted that the college authorities has not yet complied with the decision of the Executive Committee and directed to write to the concerned university to not to enroll these students and to the State Medical Council for not registering these students. A copy of the communication be sent to college authorities. The Committee further directed the college to inform the concerned candidates of the said decision since the onus of informing them was with the college.</p> <p>The Executive Committee of the Council also decided that the above decision may be applied to all those medical colleges where discharge notices have been issued and the college has not yet complied.</p>

4. Admission of 1st year MBBS students at North Delhi Municipal Corporation Medical College, Malka Ganj, New Delhi in the academic year 2013-14.

Read: the matter with regard to admission of 1st year MBBS students at North Delhi Municipal Corporation Medical College, Malka Ganj, New Delhi in the academic year 2013-14.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the letter of the In-charge (Admissions), Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University dated 04/02/2015 and observed as under:

“ ... It is stated here that all the six students, whose names have been mentioned in your letter no. 514/Dean/MC/2015, dated 04/02/2015, were admitted in NDMC(MC) during the “Waiting List Admission for MBBS and BDS programme” which was held on 30/09/2013. All these candidates were registered in the Waiting List prepared by the University on 16/08/2013 as per the All India NEET Rank.

- The Vacant seat created even on 30/09/2013 itself in NDMC(MC), conveyed vide letter dated 30/09/2013, which was consequent to transfer to state quota.
- As per the University's Notification dated 28/09/2013 (Copy enclosed) the wait listed candidates were directed to report at the University at 04:00 PM. This admission process also involved shifting of candidates from one medical college to another medical college; which also appeared to have had taken time.
- These candidates deposited the requisite counseling fee at the time of admissions and no admission has been done in MBBS after 30/09/2013."

The Executive Committee of the Council further perused the opinion of Law Officer which reads as under:

"These Candidates deposited the requisite counseling fee at the time of admission and no admission has been done in MBBS after 30/09/2013. The above clarification may be in my view accepted as the University authorities have clarified that no admission has been made after 30/09/2013."

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided that no further action is required in the matter and the discharge notice be withdrawn.

5. Approval of the minutes of the Building Committee meeting held on 08/01/2015.

Dr. G.B. Gupta, Member of the Committee expressed his appreciation on putting up of signages at various location/crossings for directions to reach MCI. Some other members drew the attention of the Committee towards the maintenance of Guest House which required a lot more work to be done.

6. Approval of the minutes of the Ethics Committee meetings held on 28.01.2015 and 5th & 6th February 2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council approved the minutes of the Ethics Committee meeting held on 28.01.2015.

The Committee further approved the minutes of the Ethics Committee meeting held on 06.02.2015 except the following items which may be referred back to Ethics Committee:-

Item 13. *The date on which certified copy of the order of Hon'ble U.P. High Court was received by the applicant be ascertained. If the appeal is filed within the period stipulated by Hon'ble High Court from date of receipt of order by the appellant, it be considered by Ethics Committee on merits.*

Item 19. *From the facts narrated, it is not clear who is the owner of Sai Ram Hospital. This be ascertained first and only thereafter decision be taken. Further in the second last para it is recorded that "the punishment awarded to Dr. Goli Vekateshwar Rao by Andhra Pradesh Medical Council is **not** as per Code of Ethics." However, in the next para it is recorded that 'Dr. Goli Vekateswar Rao ... is found guilty in this case.'" This is in direct contravention to finding in immediately preceding para. This be clarified.*

Item 22. *Ethics Committee has quoted order of Hon'ble Supreme Court in a totally different matter which is not related to field of medical practice or medical ethics at*

all. Also, the primary objection raised by the appellant that the judges at both the Councils, viz. DMC & MCI were same has not been addressed at all. If that be the case, the decision itself can be held to be void ab initio. Hence the matter be examined afresh and legal opinion be obtained on these two issues and decision be recorded thereafter.

Medical College, Thiruvarur for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (16th & 17th February, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government for recognition/approval of Thiruvarur Govt. Medical College, Thiruvarur for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ...

(2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of MBBS degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

(3) The procedure for 'Renewal' of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.

(4) Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute."

The Committee decided to place the matter before the General Body of the Council.

The minutes of the above item were read and confirmed in the meeting itself.

2. OPD: Paediatrics OPD has only 2 examination rooms against requirement of 4.
3. MRD: It is both manual & computerized.
4. Only 4 mobile X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6 as per Regulations.
5. Only 4 static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5 as per Regulations.
6. CSSD: ETO sterilizer is not available.
7. Anatomy department: Mounted specimens available are only 70. MRI/CT films are not available.
8. Community Medicine department: Practical laboratory is shared with Microbiology.
9. RHTC: Posting roster of students was not available. Residential accommodation is not equipped. Mess is not available. Immunization records or records of survey / MCH / Family Welfare are not available. No records of activities under national Health Programmes is available.
10. UHC: Posting roster of students was not available. Records of regular OPD, survey / MCH / Family Welfare are not available. No records of activities under national Health Programmes are not available.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

1. Deficiency of faculty is 18.1 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 58 % as detailed in the report.
3. Bed occupancy is 51 % in the own hospital of the college.
4. Shortage of paramedical staff remains as it is – 116 are available against 179 required.
5. C.T. Scan is outsourced. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. Special investigations are still not performed. Deficiency remains as it is.

7. Auditorium is still under construction. Deficiency remains as it is.
8. MRD: It is manual. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed. Deficiency remains as it is.
9. Casualty: Equipment like ABG Analyzer, Crash cart are not available. Drugs are inadequate.
10. O.T.: Nitrous Oxide line is not functional. Designated O.T. for Ophthalmology & ENT is not available.
11. Ventilator is not available.
12. Radiodiagnosis department: Only 3 static machines are available against requirement of 5 as per Regulations. Only 2 mobile machines are available against requirement of 6 as per Regulations. AERB approval is not available. Log book is not available. Only 2 USG machines are available against requirement of 3 as per Regulations. Deficiency remains as it is.
13. CSSD is not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
14. RHTC: Mess is not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

5. Wards: Most of the wards are not as per MCI norms. One Paediatric ward of 29 beds was closed. Tb & Chest and Skin & VD wards were totally empty. Psychiatry ward was common for males & females. Space between 2 beds is < 1.5 m. as required as per Regulations. Even for 60 bed ward there is only one Nursing station at one corner of ward. Two beds share Nursing station. Pantry is outside ward and is only an eating area. During assessment, no faculty / Residents were available in the wards.
6. Clinical material: data given by the institute of OPD attendance & Casualty attendance are inflated. At the time of round, there were a few patients in OPD. Later on many healthy persons were brought.
7. Bed occupancy is 33 % on day of assessment.
8. Number of Major & Minor operations on day of assessment was only 3 & NIL on day of assessment which is grossly inadequate.

9. Casualty: Disaster Trolley, Crash cart, Ventilator are not available.
10. O.T.s: Number of Defibrillators & Infusion Pumps are inadequate.
11. ICUs: Patients in SICU were normal post-operative patients not requiring ICU care. There is no Ventilator in PICU.
12. Students' Hostel: Study room is not air-conditioned. It does not have computer with internet.
13. Residents' Hostel: Study room is not air-conditioned. It does not have computer with internet.
14. Anatomy department: There is shortage of Embalming machine.
15. Pathology department: There is shortage of 10 microscopes.
16. Microbiology department: Only 1 Demonstration room is available against requirement of 2 as per Regulations.
17. Forensic Medicine department: Only 1 Demonstration room is available against requirement of 2 as per Regulations.
18. RHTC: Commuting time to RHTC Kazhakottam is 1 h 30 m which is more than that prescribed under Regulations.
19. UHC: It is almost non-functional. Students & Interns are not posted. No record of visit of students was available. Survey/Immunization/MCH/Family Welfare registers are not available.
20. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

If it is observed during any regular inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <80%, such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses."

In view of above, it was decided not to consider the Institute for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the current Academic year (2015-16) and to issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to intimate the Postgraduate Section of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) for this Institute for information and further necessary action.

49. Recognition/Approval of Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, Sikkim for the award of MBBS degree granted by Sikkim Manipal University, Gangtok, Sikkim against the increased intake i.e. from 50-100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/Approval of Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, Sikkim for the award of MBBS degree granted by Sikkim Manipal University, Gangtok, Sikkim against the increased intake i.e. from 50-100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (10th & 11th March, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Teaching beds are deficient as under:

2. Wards: Wards are not as per MC I norms. They are very small with capacity of 4, 8, 11 & 18 beds. Many wards do not have examination rooms, Demonstration rooms, Doctors' duty room, Pantry, Store room, etc. In small wards, no spate Nursing station is available.
3. OPD attendance on day of assessment was 762 which is inadequate. However, on physical verification during round it appears to be less than 500.
4. Bed occupancy was 31 % on day of assessment which is grossly inadequate.
5. Number of Major & Minor operations on day of assessment was only 3 & 5 respectively which is inadequate.
6. Radiological investigations are inadequate. Workload of special investigations like Ba, IVP is NIL.
7. Histopathology workload is only 3 on day of assessment.
8. Only 4 mobile X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6 as per Regulations.
9. Anatomy department: Mounted specimens are only 98. Cold storage is not available.
10. Dr. Indralal Sharma, Asso. Prof. has submitted TDS certificate issued by the Dean which contradicts with that mentioned in D.F. There is data mismatch between joining date & experience dates.
11. Deficiency of teaching faculty is 8.2 % as detailed in report.
12. Shortage of Residents is 33.9 % as detailed in report.
13. Dean has stated on P. 61 that he does not agree with the report as (i) Excess Asst. Prof. have not been counted as Senior Residents & (ii) Faculty & workload of STNM Hospital has not been counted.
With regard to first observation, it cannot be accepted as Executive Committee vide its decision dt. 01.10.2014 has already decided that excess Asst. Prof. will not be counted towards deficit of Senior Residents and this decision has been included in the Assessors Guide which is placed on website of MCI and is well publicized before the assessments began.
With regard to second observation, the Executive Committee noted clause 2(5) of the Qyalifying Criteria of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 which reads as under:-

"That the person owns and manages a hospital of not less than 300 beds with necessary infrastructural facilities capable of being developed into teaching institution in the campus of the proposed medical college".....

These Regulations being Statutory Regulations are mandatory and binding in character and are required to be strictly adhered to all authorities as per directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Mridul Dhar's case.

Therefore, the Executive Committee of the Council decided that the observation (ii) cannot be accepted.

14. On day of assessment, in Paediatric ward, out of 30 beds, total 28 patients were shown to assessors. However, most of patients were not ill enough to warrant admission. None of the patients were on I.V. fluids. One patient named Phurzang Lepcha, certain symptoms as told by patient did not match with Sister's & Resident doctor's verbal statements. Resident doctor told assessors that blood investigation of this patient had been done but the patient denied his blood being taken. Professor & HOD Paediatrics accepted and gave a written statement that half of the patients of Paediatric ward were not genuine and they were brought for purpose of examination.
15. In Ophthalmology, number of major operations performed were only 1, 3, 2 & 1 during the months of March, February, January 2015 & December 2014 respectively which is grossly inadequate.
16. Part I of SAF shows OPD timing as 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. but it is not mentioned in OPD building, Hospital building or in record papers.
17. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to recognise/approve Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, Sikkim for the award of MBBS degree granted by Sikkim Manipal University, Gangtok, Sikkim against the increased intake i.e. from 50-100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

The Executive Committee of the Council further noted that the Institute has admitted students for 2014-2015 pursuant to order of Hon'ble Supreme Court after filing undertaking dated 29/09/2014 by the college authorities which states as under:

- 1) *Whereas by an Act of the State Legislature called the Sikkim Manipal University of Health Medical and Technological Sciences Act, 1995 (Act No.9 of 1995) published in the Sikkim Government Gazette No.184 dated 15.10.1995. The Petitioner Institution was established.*
- 2) *The Petitioner University had filed WP No.34 of 2014, praying the Hon'ble Court to issue an appropriate writ, order or direction quashing and setting aside the impugned order contained in File No.U-12012/682/2014-ME(P-II) dated 15th July, 2014 of the respondent no.1 disapproving the scheme of renewal of permission of 5th Batch of 50 to 100 students of MBBS course for the academic session 2014-15 and consequently to quash the letter No.MCI-37(1)(R1075)(UG)/2013-Med./113914, dated 10.06.2014 of the respondent No.2 recommending the Central Government not to renew the permission of 5th batch of MBBS students against the increased intake from 50 to 100 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 and issue an appropriate writ, order or direction commanding the respondents herein to consider the prayer of the petitioners herein to increase the intake capacity from 50 to 100 students for admission to the 1st year of the MBBS course for the academic session 2014-15 in the light of the compliance report filed by the petitioners on 09.07.2014 and if necessary to carry out a compliance verification inspection forthwith and issue an appropriate writ, order or direction restraining the respondents 1 & 2 from reducing the intake capacity of the petitioner college from 100 to 50 for the academic session 2014-15 for admission to the 1st year of the*

MBBS course and permit the petitioners herein to admit 100 students to the 1st year of the MBBS course for the academic session 2014-15 during the pendency and till final disposal of the writ petition by this Hon'ble court.

- 3) *The Sikkim Manipal University, undertakes to this Hon'ble Court that, there is no deficiency considering the STNM hospital and its specialists Medical Officers and such other staff of the Hospital are part of this institution as per the Judgement of This Hon'ble Court in WP No.37/2011, and there are no deficiencies as pointed out by the Medical Council of India.*
- 4) *In the event the institution for any reason whatsoever does not comply with this solemn Undertaking, this Hon'ble Court may, if it so chooses, direct that the Bank Guarantee/Security furnished by this Institution to the Medical Council of India be forfeited.*
- 5) *The admission to the academic year 2014-15 with respect to the seats to be filled will be in accordance with the norms of the Medical Council of India and the candidates will be admitted from the merit list prepared by the petitioner university and the fees to be charged from the students admitted through this process will be in accordance with the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court."*

In view of the deficiencies listed above, it is amply evident that the institute has failed to rectify previous deficiencies which are still persisting.

The Executive Committee of the Council also perused the order of Hon'ble Apex Court dt. 18/09/2014 & 25/09/2014, the operative part of which reads as under:

"The relevant portion of the order dated 18.09.2014 passed in W.P. (C) No. 469/2014 by the Hon'ble Supreme Court is reproduced hereunder:-

" Heard the learned senior counsel appearing for both the sides.

Looking at the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case and, especially, when several seats for medical admission are likely to remain vacant for the academic year 2014-15, we are of the view that these matters require urgent consideration and we are giving these interim directions under the provisions of Article 142 of the Constitution of India.

There is one more reason for passing this interim order. We are conscious of the fact that number of physicians in our country is much less than what is required and because of non-renewal of recognition of several medical colleges, our citizens would be deprived of a good number of physicians and therefore, we are constrained to pass this order, whereby at least there would be some increase in the number of physicians after five years. We are running against time because the last date for giving admissions to MBBS Course for the academic year 2014-15 is 30th September, 2014.

We also desire to reconsider the directions given by this Court in the judgment of Priya Gupta v. State of Chhattisgarh [(2012) 7 SCC 433], but at this juncture, as we do not have sufficient time to decide all these petitions finally, we are passing this interim order and the matter with regard to reconsideration of the aforesaid judgment would be considered while finally disposing of this group of petitions.

It has been submitted on behalf of the learned senior counsel appearing for all the petitioners/ respondents, who are managing medical colleges, that the defects which had been recorded at the time of the last inspection by the representatives of the Medical Council of India have been duly rectified and at present, the defects pointed out in the reports do not exist. The said fact can be ascertained only by having a fresh Compliance Verification/Inspection. However, the stand taken by the Central Government and the Medical Council of India is to the effect that no such inspection can be undertaken in the present academic session because of paucity of time and it would violate the time schedule laid down by this Court in the case of Priya Gupta (supra).

The learned senior counsel appearing for the Medical Council of India has also submitted that the petitioners do not have any legal right for getting renewal of the recognition, especially in view of the fact that the Verification/Inspection Reports are not available for the period in question. The learned senior counsel has relied upon some of the Judgments to substantiate his case and according to him, it would not be just and proper to permit the said medical colleges to take fresh batch of students.

Looking at the peculiar facts of the case and the circumstances stated hereinabove, we direct the petitioners to file undertakings by President/Chairman and Secretary of the petitioners' institutions running medical colleges within 10 days from today, to the effect that there is no defect in the medical colleges run by them and they would also state that their deposit with the MCI, which is around Rs.10 Crores, be forfeited by way of penalty if the statement made in the undertaking is found to be incorrect at the time of the next inspection. A draft undertaking has been given to this Court. A copy of the undertaking, which might be filed by the institutions, shall be served upon the office of the Medical Council of India as well as to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

We also record the fact that in the recent past, the Medical Council of India has renewed recognition of Government Medical Colleges on the basis of undertakings and therefore, we see no reason not to permit the private colleges to admit students on the basis of undertakings given by their office bearer as a special case.

Notwithstanding any direction given in the case of Priya Gupta (supra), if undertakings as stated hereinabove are filed by the institutions managing medical colleges for the academic year 2014-15, admissions shall be given to the students from the merit list prepared by the States and they shall be charged fees prescribed by the Government Medical Colleges of their respective States. The State Authorities, i.e., the Directorate of Medical Education & Research, of the respective States shall send students, in order of their merit, to the medical colleges run by the petitioners, which are situated within their States, within one week from the date of receipt of a copy of this order and the said students shall be admitted to the MBBS Course in accordance with the rules and regulations of the MCI and also regulations dated 16.04.2010 framed by the Medical Council of India, provided undertakings as mentioned above are filed on behalf of the concerned institutions.

It is also clarified that there would be no further counseling in respect of the students who are to be given admission, even if it might result into some heartburning among other students, but in the peculiar facts of the case, we give this direction.

In no case, the admission shall be given after 30th September, 2014. This order shall also apply to all the institutions which had filed their petitions earlier for renewal of their recognition for the academic year 2014-15, but their petitions were rejected or withdrawn for whatever reason, provided undertakings as stated hereinabove are filed by President/Chairman and the Secretary of those institutions. All those petitions shall be deemed to have been revived and this order shall be deemed to have been passed in those cases also. This order shall only be in respect of renewal of recognition and not for creation of additional seats or for new colleges.

We also record that the Union of India has supported the petitioners in the interest of students. We also direct the Union of India to give wide publicity to this order in print as well as electronic media in the interest of the concerned students.

It is directed that the list of students getting admission in pursuance of this order shall be placed on record of this Court by 1st October, 2014 by the concerned institutions and a copy thereof shall also be sent to the MCI.

These matters shall be treated as part-heard and shall be notified for further hearing in the month of December, 2014."

The Hon'ble Supreme Court thereafter vide its order dated 25.09.2014 issued certain clarification in respect to the order dated 18.09.2014 in W.P. (C) No. 469/2014, which are reproduced hereunder:-

"After hearing the learned counsel for the parties we deem it appropriate to issue following clarifications with regard to our earlier order dated 18th September, 2014. These clarifications shall be read into the said order as if they were always part thereof:-

1. The order dated 18th September, 2014 shall also apply to cases where colleges or institutions were seeking increase in intake capacity and in the current year have been denied permission to admit students after first or second or third or fourth renewal/inspection. In our view such institutions where Renewal/Inspection with respect to increase in capacity were conducted in the present academic year are also entitled to the benefit under the order dated 18th September, 2014.

2. We also clarify that fees chargeable from the students admitted pursuant to our order dated 18th September, 2014 shall be at the same rates as applicable to the students in Government medical colleges in respective States and such fees shall

be at the same levels as that of the Government medical colleges till the students so admitted pass out from the private medical colleges or institutions.

3. Our order shall also apply to all similarly situated institutions irrespective of the fact whether any petitions were or are pending in this Court or in any of the High Courts or even if they had not approached any court at all. This order shall also apply even in cases where there were orders of stay in favour of the Medical Council of India restraining the colleges from admitting students for the current academic session.

4. The order shall not apply to colleges or institutions which have been disqualified by the Medical Council of India and/or the Central Government and have been prohibited from making any admissions for the current academic year 2014-15.

5. In cases where two separate lists are prepared and sent by the State agencies one relating to State quota and the other relating to management quota in private institutions, we clarify that for the current academic year there shall be only one list and that shall be the "State quota" alone. There shall not be any management quota list to be sent to the private colleges or institutions taking the benefit under our order dated 18th September, 2014. The Management quota shall also be filled through the State list and the fees chargeable for the management quota shall also be charged at the same levels and rates as applicable to State quota list.

6. We further clarify that private institutions taking benefit under our order dated 18th September, 2014 shall have to take students only from the State agencies and at fees chargeable for students in Government medical colleges as stated above, regardless of their status or claim as Minority Institutions or Deemed Universities."

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council further decided to invoke/forfeit the Bank Guarantees submitted by the Institute and directed the Institute to submit fresh bank guarantee within 2 weeks.

The Executive Committee of the Council also noted that the college has not taken action regarding discharge of students but has filed a Writ Petition for stay against the MCI letter dated 23.01.2015 in the Hon'ble Sikkim High Court, Gangtok and the matter is listed on 02.04.2015.

Further the Executive Committee of the Council decided to take legal opinion with regard to application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

If it is observed during any regular inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <80%, such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses."

In view of above, it was decided not to consider the Institute for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the current Academic year (2015-16) and to issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to intimate the Postgraduate Section of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) for this Institute for information and further necessary action.

50. Approval of the minutes of the Migration Sub-Committee meeting held on 9th February 2015.

Read: the matter with regard to approval of the minutes of the Migration Sub-Committee meeting held on 9th February 2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council approved the minutes of the Migration Sub-Committee meeting held on 9th February 2015 except item no. 6 where the Committee observed that the Sub-committee has decided that legal opinion be obtained in the matter; however the minutes have been placed before the Executive Committee without obtaining the same. The Committee directed the office to obtain legal opinion as decided by the Sub-Committee and place it again before it along with legal opinion for taking a final decision in the matter.

51. Establishment of new medical college at Akathumuri, Varkala, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala by S.R. Educational & Charitable Trust, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to establishment of new medical college at Akathumuri, Varkala, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala by S.R. Educational & Charitable Trust, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (10th and 11th March, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty is 83.01 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 97.91 % as detailed in the report.
3. OPD attendance on day of assessment was only 38 which is grossly inadequate. At the time of round, there were no patients in OPD.
4. Past record of clinical material could not be verified as previous registers are not available.
5. There were no indoor patients admitted in the hospital on day of assessment.
6. There were no Major & Minor operations on day of assessment.
7. There were no Normal delivery or Caesarean section on day of assessment.
8. Radiological investigations: Plain X-rays were only 42 which is inadequate. USG is not done.
9. Laboratory investigation workload is inadequate. Histopathological & Cytopathological workload is NIL.
10. Casualty: Disaster Trolley, mobile X-ray unit is not available.
11. ICUs: There was no patient in ICCU or any ICU on day of assessment.
12. Labour room: There is no bed in septic labour room.
13. ETO sterilizer is not available.
14. Central Library: Staff is inadequate.
15. MRD: Statistician is not available.
16. Students' Hostel: A portion of Girls' hostel is under construction. Visitors' room, Study room with computer & internet & Recreation room are not available.
17. Residents' Hostel: Accommodation is available for 32 Residents against requirement of 42 as per Regulations. Visitors' room, Study room with computer & internet & Recreation room are not available.

18. Nurses' hostel is under construction.
19. Residential Quarters: Only 12 quarters are available for non-teaching staff against requirement of 20 as per Regulations.
20. Dean's office in hospital is not available.
21. OPD: Only 2 Examination rooms in minor branches are available against requirement of 4 for all departments as per Regulations. Plaster cutting machine is not available.
22. Audiometry & Speech therapy: Room is available but equipment is not installed.
23. Nursing staff: 166 Nurses are available against requirement of 175.
24. Anatomy department: No cadavers are available. Students' lockers are not provided. Museum facilities are inadequate.
25. Physiology department: All infrastructure was closed and could not be assessed.
26. Videographers were not provided by the institute on first day of assessment – i.e. 10/03/2015.
27. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of permission for establishment of a new medical college at Akathumuri, Varkala, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala by S.R. Educational & Charitable Trust, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

52. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch of 100 seats of Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Ongole, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. N.T.R University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch of 100 seats of Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Ongole, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. N.T.R University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council decided to defer the consideration of the matter for the next meeting.

53. Establishment of new medical college at Bhopal by Jain Sarvodaya Vidhya Gyanpith Samiti, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Barkatullah University, Bhopal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to establishment of new medical college at Bhopal by Jain Sarvodaya Vidhya Gyanpith Samiti, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Barkatullah University, Bhopal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (10th and 11th March, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty is 78.3 % as detailed in report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 84.4 % as detailed in report.
3. OPD: Separate registration counters for males/females are not available. Separate registration counters for OPD/IPD are not functional. They are not computerized. Staff is inadequate. Examination rooms, teaching areas are under construction. All facilities are under construction.

4. Teaching beds are deficient as under:

5. Wards: They are under construction. None of the beds are occupied. Ancillary facilities like Examination cum Treatment room, Pantry, Doctors' duty room, Demonstration room are not available. Nursing station is not equipped. Residents, Nurses & Wardboys are not available in any ward.
6. OPD attendance is NIL on day of assessment. OPDs are not adequately equipped.
7. Bed occupancy is Zero on day of assessment. None of the wards are equipped for admission.
8. Data of clinical material provided by the institute does not appear to be genuine. Indoor case registers were not provided on repeated requests. Number of admissions & discharge cases do not match.
9. O.T.: No O.T. is functional at present.
10. There was no Normal delivery or Caesarean section on day of assessment.
11. There was no Radiological or laboratory investigation on day of assessment. None of the laboratories are functional. No record is available.
12. MRD: It is under construction.
13. Casualty: Medical officers are inadequate. No Nurse is available on day of assessment. Duty records are not available. Oxygen & Suction facility are not functional. Crash cart, Defibrillator are not available.
14. Central Clinical laboratory is not available.
15. ICUs: They are under construction.
16. Labour Room: It is under construction.
17. CSSD: It is not available.
18. Preclinical departments of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry are under construction.
19. College office: Staff room & College Council hall are under construction.
20. Lecture Theater: They are under construction.
21. Central Library: It is under construction.
22. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls: They are under construction.
23. Hostels for Students, Residents & Nurses: They are under construction.
24. Residential Quarters: They are under construction.
25. Hospital offices are not adequately equipped.
26. Intercom is not available.
27. Laundry, Kitchen, Canteen are not available.
28. Only 10 Nurses are available against requirement of 175 as per Regulations.
29. Only 50 paramedical staff are available against requirement of 100 as per Regulations.
30. Pharmaco Vigilance Committee is not yet formed.
31. Website is not available.
32. Local holiday of Rangpanchami was cited as a reason for absence of faculty & staff. However, even the staff for essential services like Casualty, ICUs, Emergency O.T., Trauma services were not available and inadequate.
33. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above and as the applicant has failed to meet the qualifying criteria u/s 3(2)(5) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 pertaining to the person owning and managing a hospital of not less than 300 beds, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for establishment of a new medical college at Bhopal by Jain Sarvodaya Vidhya

Gyanpith Samiti, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh under Barkatullah University, Bhopal to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

54. Establishment of new medical college at Bhopal by Advance Medical Sciences and Educational Society, Bhopal with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Barkatullah University, Bhopal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to establishment of new medical college at Bhopal by Advance Medical Sciences and Educational Society, Bhopal with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Barkatullah University, Bhopal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (10th and 11th March, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty is 66.67 % on day of assessment.
2. Shortage of Residents is 97.78 % on day of assessment.
3. OPD attendance was NIL on day of assessment.
4. Bed occupancy was 4 % on day of assessment.
5. There was NIL Major & Minor operations on day of assessment.
6. There was NIL Normal delivery or Caesarean Section on day of assessment.
7. There was no Radiological or Laboratory investigation on day of assessment.
8. OPD: Registration counters are manual. Examination rooms are not furnished. ECG Room, Minor O.T., Plaster cutting room are not available. In Ophthalmology OPD, Dark room, Refraction room, Dressing room are not available. Facilities are inadequate in Paediatrics & O.G. OPD. Infrastructure is not ready.
9. Wards: Unitwise distribution of beds is not shown. Nursing stations are not properly placed. Oxygen cylinders are not available. Saline stands are also very few.
10. Casualty: List of doctors posted was not submitted. Disaster Trolley, Crash cart, Emergency drug tray are not available.
11. O.T.s: Equipment like Defibrillator, Ventilator, Infusion Pumps are not available.
12. ICUs: There was no patient in ICCU, MICU, SICU, NICU/PICU on day of assessment. Central oxygen/suction is not available.
13. Labour room: Separate room for Eclampsia is not available.
14. ETO sterilizer is not available.
15. Audiometry & Speech therapy are not available.
16. MRD: It is partly computerized.
17. Preclinical departments of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry are not functional.
18. Dean's office is functioning from the hospital as the college building is not yet ready.
19. Lecture Theaters: They are not available.
20. Central Library: It is under construction.
21. Hostels for Students, Residents & Nurses are under construction.
22. Residential quarters are under construction.
23. Recreational facilities are not available.
24. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls: They are not functional.
25. Central Photography Section: It is not functional.
26. Website: Information is not updated.
27. Videography of various facilities was carried out but at last moment it was disclosed by the college authorities that the said Videography and

photographs were deleted inadvertently and DVD of the same has not been provided by the college authorities to be forwarded to MCI.

28. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of permission for establishment of a new medical college at Bhopal by Advance Medical Sciences and Educational Society, Bhopal under Barkatullah University, Bhopal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

- 55. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch of 100 seats of ESIC Medical College, Gulbarga, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch of 100 seats of ESIC Medical College, Gulbarga, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council decided to defer the consideration of the matter for the next meeting.

- 56. Clarification on Section2 (5) of the 'Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999' - req.**

Read: the matter with regard to clarification on Section2 (5) of the 'Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999.

The Executive Committee of the Council decided to obtain the opinion of Senior Advocate.

- 57. Recognition/approval of Great Eastern Medical School & Hospital, Ragolu, Srikakulam, A.P. for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Great Eastern Medical School & Hospital, Ragolu, Srikakulam, A.P. for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council decided to defer the matter till the opinion of senior counsel is made available.

- 58. Establishment of new medical college at Distt. Sangli, Maharashtra by Prakash Shikshan Mandal, Urun-Islampur, Maharashtra with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.**

Read: the matter with regard to establishment of new medical college at Distt. Sangli, Maharashtra by Prakash Shikshan Mandal, Urun-Islampur, Maharashtra with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the letter dated 10/03/2015 from the Chairman, Prakash Sikshan Mandal Urun- Islampur, District Sangli which reads as under:

“With reference to above mentioned subject the management of Prakash Shikshan Mandal’s Prakash Institute of Medical Sciences & Research at Islampur, Tal. Walwa, Distt. Sangli, Maharashtra has decided ‘not to pursue the application for establishment of our new medical college for the academic year 2015-16.’ However, if MCI Regulations permit our institutes application may be kept pending and considered for next academic year i.e. 2016-2017.”

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of scheme for establishment of new medical college at Distt. Sangli, Maharashtra by Prakash Shikshan Mandal, Unun-Islampur, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik as there is no provision under IMC Act, 1956 or Regulations framed thereunder to keep the application pending with the Council.

59. Consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Amritsar.

Read: the matter with regard to consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Amritsar.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Compliance Verification assessment report (Sept.,2014) along with the additional information and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 20.6 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 16.79 % as detailed in the report.
3. Lecture Theaters: Facility for E class is not available.
4. Interns’ Hostel: Accommodation is available only for 100 interns against requirement of 150.
5. OPD: Registration counters are not computerized.
6. Cytopathology: Daily average workload is only 10 which is inadequate.
7. MRD is manual. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed for indexing.
8. O.T.s: There are 30 tables in 22 O.T.s indicating more than 1 table in several O.T.s which is not as per norms.
9. Only 3 static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5 as per Regulations.
10. ETO sterilizer is not available.
11. Only 1 Demonstration Room each is available in the departments of Physiology, Biochemistry, Pathology, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine, Community Medicine departments against requirement of 2 demonstration rooms each as per Regulations.
11. UHC: Specialists’ visits are not organized.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Amritsar and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance of rectification of the above deficiencies within 03 months.

60. Amendment in the Establishment of Medical College Regulations 1999.

Read: the matter with regard to amendment in the Establishment of Medical College Regulations 1999.

The Executive Committee of the Council approved the following amendments to Section 8(3)(1)(a) and 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999:

8(3)(1)(a) **Colleges in the stage of LOP upto II renewal (i.e. Admission of third batch)**

If it is observed during any regular inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 30% and/or bed occupancy is \leq 50 % (45 % in North East, Hilly terrain, etc.), such an institute will not be considered for issue of LOP/renewal of permission in that Academic Year.

8(3)(1)(c) **Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses**

If it is observed during any regular inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is $<$ 70%, such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.”

8(3)(1)(d) **Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked/forged documents: shall be substituted as under:-**

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked/forged documents; multiple appearances in the assessments in the same academic year in different institute and in same cadre and non disclosure thereto during the assessment of the colleges or has disclosed wrong information in Declaration Form; is found doing private practice during duty hours outside college campus and not stating this fact in Declaration Form submitted at the time of assessment, such an institute will not be considered for issue of LOP and for renewal of permission/recognition for award of MBBS degree/processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years-i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also, as the case may be.

(2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of MBBS degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

(3) The procedure for ‘Renewal’ of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.

(4) Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute.”

The minutes of the above item were read and confirmed in the meeting itself.

61. Time Schedule for receipt of applications for Establishment of Medical College and increase of admission capacity for issue of LOP for Undergraduate courses.

Read: the matter with regard to Time Schedule for receipt of applications for Establishment of Medical College and increase of admission capacity for issue of LOP for Undergraduate courses.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the following Section 10A (4) which reads as under:

4. The Central Govt. may after considering the scheme and the recommendations of the Council under sub-section (3) and after obtaining, where necessary, such other particulars as may be considered necessary by it from the person or college concerned, and having regard to the factors referred to in sub-section (7), either approve (with such conditions, if any, as it may consider necessary) or disapprove the scheme, and any such approval shall be a permission under sub-section (1): Provided that no scheme shall be disapproved by the Central Government except after giving the person or college concerned a reasonable opportunity of being heard; Provided further that nothing in this sub section shall prevent any person or medical college whose scheme has not been approved by the Central Government to submit a fresh scheme and the provisions of this section shall apply to such scheme, as if such scheme has been submitted for the first time under sub-section (1).

The Executive Committee of the Council noted that bare reading of this section makes it evident that it refers to approval or disapproval of scheme only. However, once LOP is granted the scheme is deemed to be approved and it comes into existence; thereafter the question of disapproval of the scheme does not arise. Hence provision of Section 10A (4) cannot be applied in cases of Renewal of permission where scheme has already come into existence by grant of LOP and therefore there cannot be any hearing as deemed under Section 10A(4) in cases of Renewal of permission.

The Committee therefore decided to take legal opinion in the matter.

62. Increase of seats in MBBS course from 100 to 150 at Rama Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Kanpur, UP for the academic session 2015-16 in pursuance of Hon'ble Supreme Court order dated 01.08.2014 in CA No. 7117/2014 – Rama Medical College Hospital Vs. UOI & Anr.

Read: the matter with regard to increase of seats in MBBS course from 100 to 150 at Rama Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Kanpur, UP for the academic session 2015-16 in pursuance of Hon'ble Supreme Court order dated 01.08.2014 in CA No. 7117/2014 – Rama Medical College Hospital Vs. UOI & Anr.

The Executive Committee of the Council accepted the opinion of Law Officer which reads as under:

"I have perused the letter dated 16.02.2015 of the College, whereby it has withdrawn its application for increase of seats from 100 to 150 for the academic year 2015-16. Hence, no further action on that is required to be taken as the applicant is well within his right to withdraw the application. A communication to that effect may be made to the Central Government as the Central Government vide its letter dated 20.02.2015 has forwarded the compliance dated 12.02.2015. It is to be noted that the letter dated 16.02.2015 is addressed to the MoHFW and MCI, and the communication that is to be made to the MoHFW is on the basis of letter dated 16.02.15 of the College authorities. However, the process as regards withdrawal of recognition that has been initiated by the Executive Committee would be required to be taken to logical end."

In view of above, the office was directed to take consequential steps to logical end in accordance with the decision of the Executive Committee dt. 20/11/2014.

With regard to application, the Committee perused the letter from the Institute dated 16.02.2015 from the Principal & Dean, Rama Medical College, Kanpur stating therein as under:-

“Kindly refer to Ministry letter No. 12012/1057/2015 –ME(P-II) dated 3rd February,, 2015 thereby giving opportunity of for submissions of compliance and personal hearing on the subject cited above. Accordingly in that refer, the undersign appear before the hearing committee on 12th February, 2015 on the schedule date and had also submitted compliance vide letter No. RMCHRC/Estt./Pri.0./2015/173 dated 12.02.2015.

With above reference we are withdrawing our claim and application for enhancement of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 seats for the academic session 2015-16.”

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of scheme for increase of seats in MBBS course from 100 to 150 at Rama Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Kanpur, UP for the academic session 2015-16 as there is no provision under IMC Act, 1956 or Regulations framed thereunder to keep the application pending with the Council.

The Committee further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment),2010(Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

If it is observed during any regular inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <80%, such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.”

In view of above, it was decided not to consider the Institute for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the current Academic year (2015-16) and to issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to intimate the Postgraduate Section of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) for this Institute for information and further necessary action.

63. Repealing of the Indian Medical Degrees Act, 1916.

Read: the matter with regard to repealing of the Indian Medical Degrees Act, 1916.

The Executive Committee of the Council accepted the following observations of the Chairman, Academic Committee of the Council:-

*“This has reference to a communication dated 11th March, 2015 from Under Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & F.W. addressed to President, Medical Council of India on the subject **“Repealing of the Indian Medical Degrees Act, 1916”** wherein they have requested the Medical Council of India to*

furnish clear cut comments/views on repealing of the said Act, by 11.3.2015 so that the Prime Minister's office may be apprised accordingly.

It is a matter of record that **Indian Medical Degrees Act, 1916** is a Regulatory Act for the grant of titles implying qualification in Western Medical Science. Further, Medical Council of India came to be constituted by an Act enacted by the Parliament titled "**The Indian Medical Council Act, 1933.**" The said Act was repealed by the **Indian Medical Council Act, 1956** which was enacted for the purpose of reconstituting the Medical Council of India and the maintenance of the Medical Register for India and for matters connected therewith.

The said Bill to amend **Indian Medical Council Act, 1933** was passed by both the Houses of Parliament and received the assent of the President on **30.12.1956** and became a Statutory Law.

In the said Act, at Section 2 titled definition the word "**approved institutions**" has been defined at **seriatim (a)** "**which means a hospital, health centre or other such institutions recognized by the University as an Institution in which a person may undergo the training, if any, required by his course of study before the award of any medical qualification to him**".

Likewise, the word "**medical institution**" has been defined at **seriatim (e)** "**which means any institution, within or without India which grants degrees, diplomas or licenses in Medicine**".

Under the very section at 2(h) "**recognized medical qualifications**" have been defined as "**any of the medical qualifications included in the schedules.**" Likewise u/s 2 (l) the word "**university**" has been defined as "**University means any University in India established by law and having a medical faculty.**" As such, these definitions clearly spelt out u/s 2 of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 are "self explanatory" and being a part of the Parliamentary enactment have the required mandatory force and binding effect.

Further, the word "**University**" as defined in the Indian medical Council Act, 1956 for its totalistic interpretation is required to be read with the definition of the word university as incorporated in "**University Grants Commission Act, 1956**" at its sub-section 2(f) which reads as under:-

"University means a University established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, a Provincial Act or a State Act and includes any such institution as may, in consultation with the University concerned be recognised by the Commission in accordance with the Regulations made in this behalf under this Act".

Further, section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 contemplates "**application of Act to institutions for higher studies other than Universities**", where-under it is clearly stipulated that "**The Central Govt. may, on advise of the commission, declare by notification in the official Gazette, that any institution for higher education, other than a University, shall be deemed to be a University for the purposes of this Act, and on such a declaration being made, all the provisions of this Act, shall apply to such Institution as if it were a University within the meaning of clause (f) of section 2.**"

As such, the entire recourse to conferment of "**Degrees, Diplomas**" in the stream of modern medicine is sumptuously dealt with by the clearly spelt out provisions with well laid out definition in the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956. **There is no reason, rationale and purpose left in any manner whatsoever to fall back on Indian Medical Degrees Act, 1916 in the context of completeness that Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 has rendered on the said count.**

In view of the above, Indian Medical Degrees Act, 1916 in respect of conferment of degrees in Modern Medicine within the ambit and domain of Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 has been rendered operationally redundant. As such, it is advisable that the Indian Medical Degrees Act, 1916 be repealed."

64. Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at Prathima Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar, Andhra Pradesh for the academic session 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at Prathima Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar, Andhra Pradesh for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (12th and 13th March 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 5.37 % as detailed in report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 29.25 % as detailed in the report.
3. Large number of Senior Residents were not counted for the following reasons:
 - (a) Appointment as Junior Resident did not specify the department in which they were appointed;
 - (b) Joining report as Junior Resident and/or completion report of 3 years in the concerned department were not present;
 - (c) They could not produce evidence of receiving stipend or pay vide Form 16 or bank transfer during the period of Junior Residency;
 - (d) Some SRs were found to be not staying in the campus and doing private practice;
 - (e) Appointment after having PG Diploma but without one year's additional Junior Residency to have 3 years' experience in the subject.
4. Pharmaco Vigilance Committee: No meetings have been held during the year.
5. Lecture Theaters: One lecture theater of 300 capacity is not functional. Lecture theater of 650 capacity has only chairs; there are no benches. Capacity of Hospital Lecture Theater is 250 only against requirement of 300 as per Regulations.
6. Central Library: Reading room (Outside) & Reading room for Residents is not air-conditioned.
7. OPD: Dressing room for males/females is common. Audiometry & Speech Therapy are in a common room. Emergency tray was not equipped with life saving medicines.
8. Wards: Demonstration rooms are not available in wards of Paediatrics, Psychiatry, Orthopaedics. Pantry is not available in any ward. Emergency drug tray is ill equipped. In most of wards space between 2 beds is < 1.5 m prescribed as per Regulations.
9. Large proportion of patients in wards did not merit admission.
10. O.T.: Ophthalmology O.T. has 2 tables with patients being operated simultaneously on 2 tables which is not as per norms.
11. ICUs: ABG Analyzer is not available.
12. AERB approval is not available for 4 mobile X-ray machines & 3 static X-ray machines.
13. CSSD: Equipment is inadequate.
14. Website: Details of faculty & non-teaching staff are not provided.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at Prathima Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar, Andhra Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

If it is observed during any regular inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <80%, such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses."

In view of above, it was decided not to consider the Institute for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the current Academic year (2015-16) and to issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to intimate the Postgraduate Section of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) for this Institute for information and further necessary action.

65. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (150 seats) of F.H Medical College, Firozabad, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Agra, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (150 seats) of F.H Medical College, Firozabad, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Agra, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (05th & 06th February, 2015) and assessment report (13th March, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 42 % on day of assessment.
2. Shortage of Residents is 47 % on day of assessment.
3. Bed occupancy was only 14 % on day of assessment.
4. There were only 9 Major & NIL Minor operations on day of assessment. In departments of ENT & Orthopaedics, number of major operations was NIL. In department of O.G. it was only 1 & in General Surgery, only 2 operations were performed on day of assessment.
5. There was NIL normal delivery & only 1 Caesarean section on day of assessment.
6. Radiological investigative workload is grossly inadequate – only 47 plain X-rays, 12 USG, NIL special investigations.
7. Laboratory investigation workload is inadequate.
8. ICUs: There was no patient in ICCU, SICU & PICU/NICU & only 2 patients in ICCU on day of assessment.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch (150 seats) of F.H Medical College, Firozabad, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Agra, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(a) of

Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment),2010(Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 which read as under:-

“8(3)(1).....

(a) Colleges in the stage upto II renewal (i.e. Admission of third batch)

If it is observed during any regular inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 30% and/or bed occupancy is <60%, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic Year.”

66. Establishment of new medical college at Bhilai, Chhattisgarh by Shri Gangajali Education Society Foundation, Bhilai, Chhattisgarh with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Chhattisgarh Ayush and Health Sciences University, Chhattisgarh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to establishment of new medical college at Bhilai, Chhattisgarh by Shri Gangajali Education Society Foundation, Bhilai, Chhattisgarh with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Chhattisgarh Ayush and Health Sciences University, Chhattisgarh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (11th and 12th March, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty is 68.3 % on day of assessment.
2. Shortage of Residents is 68.8 % on day of assessment.
3. Teaching beds are deficient as under:

4. Bed occupancy is NIL on day of assessment. (P. 18)
5. There were NIL Major & Minor operations on day of assessment. (P. 19)
6. There were Nil Normal delivery or Caesarean section on day of assessment.
7. Radiological investigations are grossly inadequate – plain X-rays only 20; USG NIL, Special investigations NIL.
8. OPD: There are 2 Examination rooms in Orthopaedics & NIL Examination rooms in ENT OPD. Dressing rooms for males/females are not available. Plaster room & Plaster cutting room are not available. In Ophthalmology OPD, Refraction room, Dark room & Dressing cum Procedure room are not available.
9. Laboratory investigations are inadequate on day of assessment.
10. Histopathology & Cytopathology workload is NIL on day of assessment.
11. Audiometry & Speech Therapy are not available.
12. MRD: It is partly computerized. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed for indexing of diseases. Statistician is not available.
13. Casualty: Disaster Trolley, Crash cart, Ventilator are not available.
14. Central Clinical Laboratory: Separate sections for Pathology, Microbiology, Biochemistry are not available.
15. ICUs: There was NIL patient in ICCU or any ICU.
16. Labour Room: Septic room & Eclampsia room are not available.
17. ETO sterilizer is not available.

18. Pharmaco Vigilance Committee is not constituted.
19. Lecture Theaters: Facility for E class is not available.
20. Central Library: Available area is 1,800 sq.m. against requirement of 2,400 sq.m. as per Regulations. Students' reading room (outside) & Staff reading room are not available. Only 11 journals are available against requirement of 20 as per Regulations. No foreign journals are available.
21. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls: They are not furnished. Attached toilets are not available.
22. Central Photography section: Equipment is not available.
23. Students' Hostels: Visitors room, A.C. Study room with Computer & Internet & Recreation room are not available.
24. Residents' Hostel: it is not available.
25. Nurses' Hostel: It is not available.
26. Residential Quarters are not available.
27. Gender harassment committee is not constituted.
28. Website: Information is sketchy.
29. Anatomy department: Students' lockers are inadequate – available 66 against requirement of 150 as per Regulations. Cadavers are not available. Faculty offices are not furnished.
30. Physiology department: Amphibian & Haematology laboratories are not available. Clinical Physiology laboratory is inadequate.
31. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above and as the applicant has failed to meet the qualifying criteria u/s 3(2)(5) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 pertaining to the person owning and managing a hospital of not less than 300 beds, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for establishment of a new medical college at Bhilai, Chhattisgarh by Shri Gangajali Education Society Foundation, Bhilai, Chhattisgarh under Chhattisgarh Ayush and Health Sciences University, Chhattisgarh to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

67. Review of suspension of Dr. Davinder Kumar, Joint Secretary (Under Suspension)

Read: the matter with regard to review of suspension of Dr. Davinder Kumar, Joint Secretary (Under Suspension).

The Executive Committee of the Council approved the recommendations of the Review Committee which met in the Council office on 16/03/2015 at 10.00 a.m. recommending extension of suspension of Dr. Davinder Kumar, Joint Secretary (U/S) for a further period of 90 days w.e.f. 04/04/2015.

69. Grant of Special Allowance to the officials of the Council.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted that the Administration and Grievance Committee at its meeting held on 05/05/2014 had proposed to reward punctual and efficient employees of the Council which was duly approved by the Executive Committee of the Council at its meeting held on 02-03-2015.

The Committee further noted Nabhi's Book on Referencer for Central Government Employees, for special allowance (Special Pay) it has been prescribed as under : -

"Special Allowance is the new name for Special Pay which means an additional, in the nature of pay to the emoluments of a post/employee granted for the specially arduous nature of the duties for a specific addition to the work or responsibility.

The rates of Special Allowance shall be doubled w.e.f. 01.09.2008. Further, the rate shall be increased by 25% every time the DA in revised pay structure goes up by 50%."
