received in the Council Office on 17.11.2015 and after detailed deliberations decided to reiterate its earlier decision of 28.10.2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted the pending items arising out of the decisions taken by the Executive Committee.

4. Minutes of TEQ Sub-Committee meeting held on 30.9.2015.

Read: the minutes of TEQ Sub-Committee meeting held on 30.9.2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the minutes of the TEQ Sub-Committee meeting held on 30.9.2015 and approved item nos. 2,8,9,11,13 &14 and with regard to rest of the items, the Committee observed as under pointwise:-

Item No.1 Minutes of the TEQ Committee Meeting held on 17.06.2015 – Confirmation of.

Item No.3 – Request for confirmation of eligibility for the post of Asstt.Prof. in the Deptt. of Surgical Gastroenterology in respect of Dr.Pankaj Kumar in a medical college.

The Postgraduate Committee has already recognized Surgical Gastroenterology qualification at the said Institute on the basis of new appointments to the post of Asstt.Prof. Therefore it is now for the TEQ Sub-Committee to decide the eligibility of Dr. Pankaj Kumar.

Item No.6 – Request for confirmation of eligibility for the post of Asstt. Prof. in the department of Biochemistry in respect of Dr.Bindu Sharma.

Eligibility of Dr. Bindu Sharma: The item be resubmitted with full details of earlier decision & observation of E.C. on that decision. Further, the decision of TEQ Committee to treat period from 20/04/2008 to 20/04/2011 as Tutor cannot be accepted unless the institute issues such orders and proper joining reports of Dr.Bindu Sharma with these changes are submitted.

Item No.3 Confirmation of eligibility for the post of Professor in the department of Biochemistry in respect of Dr. Mohammad Muzaffir Mir in Medical College.

Not approved since it is noted that Dr. Mohammad Muzaffir Mir had done M.Sc. Biochemistry from Univ. of Kashmir in 1983 from science faculty and Ph.D. Medical Biochemistry in 1989. He was Asstt.Prof. for 4 years, Assoc. Prof. for 3 years and Addl. Prof. for 7 years at SKIMS, Srinagar. He was never holding the post of Professor till the time he took voluntary retirement from the said college. Therefore, cannot be eligible as Professor in the deptt. of Biochemistry.

Item No.4 Confirmation of eligibility for the post of Assistant Professor in the department of Nephrology in respect of Dr. Girish P. Vakarani in a medical college.

If the candidate has passed D.M. (Nephrology) from a private trust hospital, it is not necessary for him to have 2 years' special training which is a requirement only for those who do not possess requisite super specialty qualification. The fact whether VIIMS & RC, Bangalore has been permitted to run D.M. (Nephrology) course and whether it is DNB (Nephrology) or DM (Nephrology) be verified from PG Section itself.

Referred back with these observations.

Item No.5 Inclusion of eligibility criteria for teaching faculty for DM (Critical Care Medicine) course in the Minimum Qualifications for Teachers in Medical Institutions Regulations, 1998 as amended.

The Committee observed that the TEQ for DM (Critical Care Medicine) has already been prepared and sent to the Central Government, Ministry of Health & F.W., vide letter dated 27.11.2015 for approval.

Item No.6 Inclusion of eligibility criteria for teaching faculty for DM (Pulmonary Medicine) course in the Minimum Qualifications for Teachers in Medical Institutions Regulations, 1998 as amended.

The EC decided to refer the matter to Academic Committee to examine the quantitative and qualitative difference in curriculum in DM (Pulmonary Medicine) and MD (Pulmonary Medicine) keeping in mind the suggestion of TEQ Sub-Committee.

Item No.7 Complaint against misconduct of Dr. U.C. Garga of PGMER & RML Hospital, New Delhi.

The EC considered the recommendations of the TEQ Sub-Committee as well as email dated 26.11.2015 from Dr. Rajeev Sood and decided to constitute a Sub-Committee consisting of the following members to study the same and submit the report:

Item No.9 Confirmation of eligibility for the post of Assistant Professor/Associate Professor in the department of Paediatric Oncology in respect of Dr. Nitin C. Joshi in a Medical College.

Approved. However, explanation be asked from Section Head as to why such an inordinate delay has occurred in preparing the detailed note

Item No.10 Confirmation of eligibility for the post of Associate Professor in the department of Obst. & Gynae in respect of Dr. R. Sankareswari.

Academic Committee has already recommended and Executive Committee has approved the criteria for research papers and as per these criteria, case reports are not to be considered as research publications. Hence her promotion to the post of Asso. Prof. cannot be accepted unless she has two research publications as defined by the Executive Committee and already circulated to all colleges. Further, even if research publications are accepted, the promotion from Asst. Prof. to Asso. Prof. requires minimum 4 years of experience as & no promotion within 3 years can be considered eligible.

Item No.12 Confirmation of eligibility of Ms. Garima Baradia for the post of Assistant Professor in the department of Biochemistry in a medical college.

Although it is stated that facts about PG degrees & teaching experience are resubmitted, no such enclosure is found with the minutes.

Referred back with these observations. To be resubmitted thereafter.

5. Teerthanker Mahaveer Medical College & Research Centre, Moradabad– Renewal of Permission for admission of 3rd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

Read: the matter with regard to Teerthanker Mahaveer Medical College & Research Centre, Moradabad– Renewal of Permission for admission of 3rd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (21st & 22nd September, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to renew the permission for admission of 3rd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Teerthanker Mahaveer Medical College & Research Centre, Moradabad under Teerthankar Mahaveer University, Moradabad for the academic year 2016-17.

The Committee also perused complaint dated 28.10.2014 of Dr. Sheo Dutt, Bhopal received through the Head of Branch, CBI/ACB, Ghaziabad as well as comparative chart prepared by the office on the said complaint and decided that the complaint dated 28.10.2014 of Dr. Sheo Dutt, Bhopal received through the Head of Branch, CBI/ACB, Ghaziabad alongwith the comparative chart prepared by the office be referred to the Ethics Committee of the Council.

6. Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun – Renewal of Permission for admission of 2nd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

Read: the matter with regard to Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun – Renewal of Permission for admission of 2nd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (16th & 17th October, 2015) alongwith additional information/documents dated 23/11/2015 from all three Assessors with regard to assessment dated 16th & 17th October, 2015 and noted the following:-

1. Bed occupancy 69.37%
2. FMT department-Autopsy room not in working condition.
3. Nursing Hostel does not have mess.
4. Interns, PG Residents, JR, SRs, few faculties, few non-teaching staff are all residing in one and the same hostel. Some residents are not staying in the hostel at all.
5. Huge Overlapping between parent department and super speciality departments example, General Surgery, Urology, Neurosurgery, Plastic Surgery. They have exclusive super speciality ards, OTs, Clinics as evident by papers but they show all the patients, operations and investigations under parent department. They have excess of beds. The wards contains mixed type of patients like uro, neuro, plastic trauma so it is difficult rather impossible to define clearly general surgery beds and most importantly teaching beds because no segregation of emergency, super specialities and parent department beds is possible and above all, all the beds are paying except very few for BPL patients. That is why it looks inflated and similar is the situation for faculty.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun under Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna Garhwal University, Srinagar for the academic year 2016-17.

7. Indira Gandhi Govt. Medical College, Nagpur– Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

Read: the matter with regard to Indira Gandhi Govt. Medical College, Nagpur– Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (12th and 13th October, 2015) and noted the following:

2. Wards: In many wards, Doctors' Duty room is shared between 2 departments.
3. Workload of CT Scan is only 11 on day of assessment.
4. CT Scan is 2 slice against requirement of 16 slice CT Scan.
5. Blood Component Separation facility is not available even though institute is running PG courses.
6. Central Research Laboratory: Facilities are inadequate.
7. Nursing Staff: 354 Nurses are available against requirement of 372.
8. Examination Hall: Only functional Examination Hall has capacity of 150 which is inadequate. Two other Examination Halls are non-functional due to lack of furniture.
9. Lecture Theater: Hospital Lecture Theater is not available.
10. Central library: It is not air-conditioned. Available Internet nodes are only 09.
11. Students' Hostels: They are not furnished.
12. Interns' Hostel: It is not furnished.
13. Residents' Hostel: It is not furnished.
14. Residential Quarters: Faculty quarters are not available.
15. Gymnasium is not available.
16. Biochemistry department: Only 1 Demonstration Room is available against requirement of 2.
17. Forensic Medicine department: Only 1 Demonstration Room is available against requirement of 2.
18. Website: Toll free number to report ragging is not provided.
19. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Indira Gandhi Govt. Medical College, Nagpur under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for the academic year 2016-17.

8. Govt. Medical College, Jammu – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

Read: the matter with regard to Govt. Medical College, Jammu – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (8th and 9th October, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 24.85 % as detailed in the report.
2. OPD: Teaching area is not available in some departments.
3. Wards: Male/Female wards are common in General Surgery, General Medicine & Orthopaedics.
4. Medicine Emergency/Casualty is heavily crowded requires expansion, increase in infrastructure, para medical staff and various equipments.

5. MRD: It is not computerized. ICD X classification for disease is not followed for indexing.
6. Labour Room: Septic labour room is not available.
7. Only 4 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5.
8. Number, Size & Capacity of Demonstration Rooms in Preclinical & Paraclinical departments are less & smaller than required. There is no Demonstration room in Microbiology & Forensic Medicine departments.
9. Examination Hall: Deficiency of one examination hall. Area & Capacity are also less than required as per Regulations.
10. Lecture Theaters: E class facility is not available.
11. Central Library: Available area is 1,510 sq.m. against requirement of 2,400 sq.m. There are no separate Students Reading Rooms (Outside) & (Inside). Recent editions of last 2 years of foreign journals are not available.
12. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls is common.
13. Students' Hostels: Available accommodation is 319 against requirement of 452.
14. Interns' Hostel: It is not available.
15. Gymnasium is not available.
16. RHTC: Residential accommodation is not available.
17. Promotion policy of promoting faculty without publications is not as per TEQ Regulations as amended as detailed in report. Three tier system is not implemented.
18. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Govt. Medical College, Jammu under Jammu University, Jammu for the academic year 2016-17.

9. Govt. Medical College, Miraj – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

Read: the matter with regard to Govt. Medical College, Miraj – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (12th and 13th October, 2015) and noted the following:

1. OPD: Registration counters are not computerized.
2. Workload of Special Investigations like Ba, IVP is NIL on day of assessment.
3. Workload of CT Scan is only 07 & of MRI only 05 on day of assessment.
4. Radiodiagnosis department: AERB approval is not available.
5. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
6. Lecture Theaters: Capacity of available lecture theaters is 130 against requirement of 180 each. Hospital lecture theater is not available. E class facility is not available.
7. Central Library: It is not air-conditioned. Students' reading Room (Outside) is not available. Capacity of Staff reading room is 20 against requirement of 30.
8. Anatomy department: Only 100 Lockers are available against requirement of 150.
9. Physiology department: Only 1 Demonstration room is available against requirement of 2.
10. RHTC: It is not clear whether it is under full control of Dean. It needs to be clarified.
11. Website: Toll free number to report ragging is not provided.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Govt. Medical College, Miraj under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for the academic year 2016-17.

10. Dr. Vaishampayan Memorial Govt. Medical College, Solapur – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

Read: the matter with regard to Dr. Vaishampayan Memorial Govt. Medical College, Solapur – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (12th and 13th October, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 13.7 % as detailed in the report.
2. Five faculty are being paid nominal amount of Rs. 1,500 p.m. as detailed in the report; whether they are full time employees or not needs to be clarified.
3. OPD attendance is 1,077 against requirement of 1,200 on day of assessment.
4. Casualty: Crash cart is not available.
5. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
6. Central Library: It is partly air-conditioned. Available area is 1,654 sq.m. against requirement of 2,400 sq.m. Capacity of Students' seating room (Outside) is 100 against requirement of 150.
7. Students' Hostels: Available capacity is 486 against requirement of 565.
8. Anatomy department: Available Lockers are 105 against requirement of 150.
9. There is no staff in Central photography Section.
10. Common rooms for Boys & Girls do not have attached toilets.
11. RHTC: Mess is not available.
12. UHC: Medical Social Worker is not available.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Dr. Vaishampayan Memorial Govt. Medical College, Solapur under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for the academic year 2016-17.

11. Bankura Sammilani Medical College, Bankura – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

Read: the matter with regard to Bankura Sammilani Medical College, Bankura – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (14th and 15th October, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. OPD: It is overcrowded. General hygiene is poor. Teaching cubicles are inadequate. Separate examination tables with privacy need to be provided in all OPDs.
2. Wards: Distance between 2 beds is < 1.5 m. Seminar room & Teaching room facilities are maintained poorly & partly used as Store room.
3. Investigative workload of Plain X-rays was only 47 on day of assessment which is inadequate.

4. MRD is partly computerized. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed for indexing.
5. Lecture Theaters: Hospital lecture theater is under construction. Audiovisual aids are available only in 1 lecture theater.
6. Central Library: It is not air-conditioned. Available area is 1,592 sq.m. against requirement of 2,400 sq.m. Even out of this, only 792 sq.m. is used. Students' reading room (Outside), Staff reading room, Residents' reading room are not available. Only 50 journals are available against requirement of 100. Available Internet nodes are 12 only against requirement of 40.
7. Hostels: Hygiene is poor in mess.
8. Central Research Laboratory is not available.
9. Size of Demonstration rooms of Anatomy, Physiology & Biochemistry is smaller than required. Faculty rooms are also of disproportionate size.
10. Hospital Infection Control Committee is non-functional. There is poor management of training, execution & function of Biomedical Waste Disposal.
11. UHC: Specialists' visits are not organized.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Bankura Sammilani Medical College, Bankura under West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata for the academic year 2016-17.

12. Sri Bhausaheb Hire Govt. Medical College, Dhule – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 50-100 for the academic session 2016-17.

Read: the matter with regard to Sri Bhausaheb Hire Govt. Medical College, Dhule – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 50-100 for the academic session 2016-17.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (12th and 13th October, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 28.71 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 45.76 % as detailed in the report.
3. OPD attendance is 600 on day of assessment.
4. Bed occupancy is 53 % on day of assessment.
5. OPD facilities are inadequate. Plaster room & Plaster Cutting room are common. Waiting area is inadequate. Teaching areas are inadequate.
6. Teaching beds are deficient as under:

7. Wards: Ancillary facilities are grossly inadequate. Nursing station, Pantry, Examination cum treatment room, Store room, Duty room, Demonstration room are not available in any ward. Distance between 2 beds is < 1.5 m as required under Regulations.
8. There were only 06 major operations on day of assessment.

9. CT Scan is of 6 slice against 16 slice required. Radiological investigation workload is inadequate.
10. Audiometry & Speech therapy facilities are inadequate.
11. ICUs: ICCU is not available. There was NIL patient in SICU on day of assessment.
12. CSSD: ETO Sterilizer is not available. Receiving & Distribution points are not separate.

8. There was NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment.
9. Laboratory investigations workload is inadequate.
10. MRD is manual. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed.
11. Casualty: Available beds are 10 against required 15. Separate Casualty for O.G. is not available.
12. O.T.: Only 4 O.T.s are available against requirement of 5.
13. ICUs: ICCU & ICUs are non-functional.
14. NIL mobile X-ray machines are available. Only 2 static X-ray machines are available against required 3.
15. CT Scan is not available.
16. CSSD is not available.
17. Nursing Staff: Only 56 Nurses are available against requirement of 198.
18. Paramedical & Non-teaching staff: Only 104 are available against requirement of 160.
19. Examination Hall: It is not available.
20. Lecture Theater: Hospital Lecture Theater is not available. E class facility is not available.

3. Most of Senior Residents & 50 % of Junior Residents are not staying in campus. Most of the rooms in Residents' hostel were vacant. There were no personal belongings, books, etc. in the rooms. Most of the rooms were open & Residents did not have keys to their rooms.
4. 18 faculty & Residents have not been considered due to reasons given in the assessment report.
5. In respect of more than 10 faculty, address given in the Declaration Form does not match with that provided by Dean.
6. In respect of Dr. Naveen, Resident in Medicine, signature done in the morning does not match with signature taken in afternoon on day of assessment.
7. In respect of Dr. Ajay Kumar, Resident in O.G., signature in attendance sheet does not match that in Declaration Form.
8. During rounds, the following was observed by assessors with regard to fake / dummy patients:
 - (a) Fake Register- Inside lab. Near by pediatric ward, register were showing 11 patients name which were entered on dated 28.10.2015 but on verification no patient were found in ward as well as their names were not entered in admission and discharge register of the ward.
 - (b) The case sheet/record sheet of some of the indoor patients in some of the wards were not available.

- (c) In female medical ward patient (Kuster Unissa IP No. 014448/15) admitted on 27.10.2015 with history of DM type 2 but in last two days blood sugar was not done at least once.No sugar charting was available with case sheet.
- (d) In psychiatric ward one patient was admitted 13 to 14 days prior to inspection (Mayamma IP Reg No. 13786/2015, OPD 183653/2015) but history examination and investigation were not found in case sheet.
- (e) In TB ward (Patient name – Nararulla Sharif, IP No. 014560/15) was actually admitted on 29.10.2015 but SR was not aware and was telling that this patient was in the ward from last 4 days during inspection.
- (f) In few wards like in TB & Chest and surgical ward on inspections inspectors found the history and examination written by somebody else and the handwriting in this ticket were not matching with hand writings of Junior Residents of the same ward so many tickets were incomplete and history examination investigation were absolutely blank (IP No. 14510, Dept. of Surgery, Patient Name- Vinodamma, Date 29.10.2015.
- (g) Patient admitted in TB & Chest ward Name-Chandrashekar D, IP No. 014566/2015 is having no evidence of Tuberculosis and even x-ray, Chest was not done for above mentioned patient.
9. Fake Information with regard to rooms occupied in Residents' hostel was provided to assessors as under:
- (a) As per written statement of Dean in female resident hostel R.No. 305, 3 residents Dr. Sai Moulika, Junor Resident C. Medicine, Dr. Sree Lasya Senior Resident, Psychiatry, Dr. T. Rajeswari Junior Resident C. Medicine are staying. But as per written statement of Dr. Sree Lasya Senior Resident, Psychiatry in room no. 305 she is staying alone. No other residents are staying with her.
- (b) As per written statement of Dean in Male resident Hostel R.No. 204 Dr. Shivaprasad, Junior Resident, Anaesthesiology, Dr. Mallavenue, Junior Resident, Orthopaedics, Dr. Prakash Gowda Junior Resident, Orthopaedics, Dr. Balaji Senior Resident Surgery are staying. But during the rounds in R.No. 204, one tutor of Anatomy department Mr. P.K. Senthil Ganesh, was found as per his written statement, he was taying with two other residents in R.No. 204. Also as per written statement of Dr. Balaji,he was not staying in R.No. 204. Dr. Balaji SR in the department of Gen. Surgery has given wrong information repeatedly and also misguided the assessors. His registration No. 63361/20-11-2009 with Karnataka Medical Council. After giving false information and he has given written apolgy letter for the same.
10. Dr. M.H. Raman, Deputy Medical Superintendent tried to misguide the assessors by providing false & misleading information to assessors as detailed in assessment report.
11. Wards: Demonstration room is not available in each ward. In some wards like O.G., Nursing station was not functional or it was placed in such a way that Nurses were not in a position to see all the patients. Skin & VD and Psychiatry wards are cubicles of 2-3 beds and Nursing station is far away which is not as per MCI norms.
12. OPD attendance in opinion of assessors is 300; authorities have given a figure of 894 which is inflated and not matching with observation of assessors. There were very few patients found on registration counter and at the same time about 100 persons were sitting in front of registration counters who were not looking like patients. One person with OPD # 191986/2015 does not look like a true patient.
13. Bed occupancy is 64.40 % on day of assessment against requirement of 75 %. Many beds were occupied by patients with insignificant problems not requiring admission.
14. There were only 06 Major operations for the whole hospital on day of assessment.

15. Radiological & Laboratory investigation workload is inadequate on day of assessment.
16. O.T.s: Separate registers for department wise O.T.s are not available.
17. ICUs: ABG Analyzer is not available.
18. Nursing & Paramedical staff: During rounds it was observed that paramedical & Non-teaching staff were inadequate. Authorities were instructed to assemble all Nursing staff & Paramedical staff for head counting but this was not fulfilled.
19. Students' Hostels: Available accommodation is 448 against requirement of 452. Boys' & Girls' hostels are G+5 structures but lift is not available. Permission for building use / construction is not provided for G+5 structures. Railing is not available along with stair case. There is no Visitors' room. There is no Warden's office in Girls' hostel.
20. Residents' Hostel: It is of dormitory type. In some rooms there are 7 beds while in others there are 5/4 beds which is not permissible. There is only 1 building which is used by male Residents & male Nursing staff. It is not furnished adequately. There is no Visitors' room, A.C. Study room with computer & Internet and Recreation room. For female Residents, top floor of non-teaching staff quarters is shown as Residents' hostel.
21. Nurses' Hostel: There is no separate Nurses' hostel.
22. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch (150 seats) of MBBS students at Shridevi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Hospital, Tumkur, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017 and further decided to issue a show cause notice as to why the recommendation for invoking clause 8(3)(1)(d) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 be not made in view of the fake information provided by the college authorities to the Council Assessors. The said clause 8(3)(1)(d) reads as under:-

“8(3)(1).....

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked/forged documents:

The Executive Committee of the Council further perused the Order of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa dated 18.11.2015 in WP (C) No. 12224 of 2015 – Subhalaxmi Dash, which reads as under:-

"Heard Mr.Asim Amitav Das, learned Senior Counsel for the petitioners; Mr.Jyoti Pattnayak, learned Addl. Government Advocate for the State; Mr.Rajani Chandra Mohanty, learned counsel for the Medical Council of India; Mr.Pradipta Kumar Mohanty, learned Senior Counsel for the Medical College (Opposite Parties 5 & 6); Mr.Anup Kumar Bose, learned. Asst. Solicitor General on behalf of the Union of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare and Mr.Pitambar Acharya, learned Senior Counsel for the intervenor-student (Sai Smruti).

2. An affidavit has come to be filed by the Principal Secretary to Government of Odisha, Health and Family Welfare Department. The same is taken on record.

3. This writ application has come to be filed by the students of Sardar Rajas Medical College and Research Centre, Kalahandi bringing to the notice of the Court the situation that prevailed in the institution, due to which, it was not possible for them to pursue further education at the said institution and praying to pass necessary direction to protect the educational needs of the students.

4. This Court by Order No.11 dated 14.09.2015 dealt with various issues raised in course of the writ application and insofar as the students of Sardar Rajas Medical College and Research Centre, Kalahandi is concerned, since the future of 124 students was in jeopardy, we directed the State

Government as well as the Medical Council of India to take necessary steps for the purpose of their transfer to any other medical college so that, their education will not be in jeopardized as a one time measure.

5. Challenging the said order, the Medical Council of India approached the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Special Leave to Appeal (C) No.28037 of 2015 and by order dated 30.9.2015, the Hon'ble Supreme Court passed an interim direction staying operation of the order insofar as it related to the M.K.C.G. Medical College, Berhampur and VSS Medical College, Burla.

It was made clear in the said interim order that the order would not come on the way of the High Court to re-examine the request of the writ-petitioner-students to transfer them to the colleges which are recognized by the Medical Council of India and to pass appropriate orders in this regard for the academic session 2015-16. To that extent, the impugned order of this Court dated 14.9.2015 vis-a-vis Sardar Rajas Medical College stood modified and it was clarified that the pendency of the SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court shall not come in the way of the High Court to decide the case on merits.

6. Subsequent thereto, by order dated 30.10.2015, the Special Leave to Appeal pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court came to be disposed of, directing that the ad interim relief granted by the Hon'ble Supreme Court shall continue to operate till the High Court finally decides the petitions and the Hon'ble Supreme Court also observed that, it was open to the parties to make all submissions before the High Court and the High Court will decide the matter in accordance with law.

7. Subsequent to the aforesaid direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, the State of Odisha made a proposal to the Medical Council of India on 8.10.2015 for accommodation of the students in the following manner:

"xx xx xx With, reference to the above matter, I am directed to request you for consideration of re-allocation of students of Sardar Rajas Medical College, Jaring, Kalahandi, as per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 30.9.2015 in SLP (C) No.28037/2015.

The following is proposed for shifting/transfer of the students to three different recognized Medical Colleges of the State with request for increase of seats mentioned against each with one time permission.

For Students admitted in Sardar Rajas Medical College 2013-14-Total No.100.

- A. Hi-tech Medical College & Hospital, Bhubaneswar-increase of 34 seats.
 - B. IMS & Sum Hospital, Bhubaneswar-Increase of 33 seats
 - C. KIIMS, Bhubaneswar-Increase of 33 seats
- Total-100 seats

For Students admitted in Sardar Rajas Medical College 2014-15-Total-24

- A. Hi-tech Medical College & Hospital, Bhubaneswar-increase of 8 seats.
 - B. IMS & Sum Hospital, Bhubaneswar-Increase of 8 seats
 - C. KIIMS, Bhubaneswar-Increase of 8 seats.
- Total - 24 seats.

In view of the order dated 1.10.2015 of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa, the shifting/transfer process is to be completed within a period of two weeks, hence necessary one time permission as per the above proposal may kindly be accorded and communicated for further' immediate action at this end to comply the orders of the Hon'ble Courts. xx xx xx"

8. Thereafter, the Government of India, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare convened a meeting with the Medical Council of India on 12.10.2015 and the following minutes were recorded:

"xx xx xx The stand of MCI was conveyed as under:-

- a) *Transfer of students can be allowed only if the State Government gives undertaking/declaration that the college would be closed down.*
- b) *Students admitted under Government quota should be transferred to Government Colleges of the State only.*
- c) *Students admitted under management quota should be transferred to private colleges of the State. xx xx xx"*

9. *In terms of the aforesaid minutes of meeting, the Government of Odisha were called upon to make a revised proposal for consideration by the Government of India, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare as well as the Medical Council of India and the revised proposal was submitted by the State of Odisha on 15.10.2015, the relevant portion of which is quoted as hereunder:*

"xx xx xx With reference to the above matter, I am directed to submit herewith the revised proposal for transfer of 124 students of 2013-14 and 2014-15 batches from Sardar Rajas Medical College, Jaring, Kalahandi to three recognized Medical Colleges of the State, as per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 30.9.2015 in SLP (C) No.28037/2015 and orders of Hon'ble High Court of Orissa dated 1.10.2015.

Proposal for shifting/transfer of the students to three different recognized Medical Colleges of the State with request for increase of seats mentioned against each with one time permission was submitted to GOI as well as MCI in the following manner.

*For Students admitted in Sardar Rajas Medical College 2013-14-
Total No.100*

- A. *Hi-tech Medical College & Hospital, Bhubaneswar-increase of 34 seats.*
- B. *IMS & Sum Hospital, Bhubaneswar-Increase of 33 seats*
- C. *KIMS, Bhubaneswar-Increase of 33 seats*
Total-100 seats

*For Students admitted in Sardar Rajas Medical College 2014-15-
Total-24*

- A. *Hi-tech Medical College & Hospital, Bhubaneswar-increase of 8 seats.*
- B. *IMS & Sum Hospital, Bhubaneswar-Increase of 8 seats*
- C. *KIMS, Bhubaneswar-Increase of 8 seats.*
Total-24 seats. xx xx xx"

10. *This revised proposal dated 15.10.2015 was considered by a joint meeting by the Government of India, Ministry of Health, and Family Welfare; Medical Council of India and the representatives of the State of Odisha on 9.11.2015 with the following outcome:*

"Minutes of meeting held in Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, New Delhi on 09.11.2015 at 03.00 PM with the representatives of MCI and State Government of Odisha in compliance with the order dated 03.11.2015 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa in W.P. No.12224 of 2015-Subhalaxmi Dash and others Vs. State of Odisha and others.

In compliance with the directions passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa in the above referred case, a meeting was convened by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare with the representatives of the Govt. of Odisha and the Medical Council of India at 3.30 PM on 09.11.2015 in Room No.149-A Wing, Nirman Bhawan, New Delhi to discuss and resolve the issue of transfer of MBBS students from Sardar Rajas Medical College. The list of participants is annexed.

02 *At the outset, Joint Secretary (ME) invited the participants and informed that the Ministry had already taken a decision to permit the State Govt. of Odisha to transfer students from Sardar Rajas Medical College to other Medical*

Colleges subject to certain conditions, which was conveyed to the State Govt. of Odisha and the MCI on 06.11.2015.

- 03 Principal Secretary (Health), Govt. of Odisha expressed reservation of the State Govt. to one of the conditions laid down in the letter dated 06.11.2015 regarding shifting of students admitted in State Quota to Govt. Medical Colleges of the State and handed over a letter dated 07.11.2015 in this regard which quotes as under:-

"As per your letter that the students admitted under State quota shall be admitted in Government Medical Colleges of the State is not equitable as the students admitted in the Private Medical Colleges under Government (State) quota are also drawn from AIPMT list. It is an admitted fact that the students having highest percentile ranking, in order of merit opt for Government managed Medical Colleges as against the Private Colleges which are opted for by the students having secured far less percentage in terms of marking.

So far as the students in the instant case are concerned, in terms of the order of merit they stand substantially lower in merit to those who have secured admission in Government Medical Colleges as well as other Private Medical Colleges. Thus placing students of Sardar Rajas Medical College at par with those of Government Medical Colleges would be giving unfair advantage to these students, as well as depriving other students having got admission in other private Colleges from availing of similar such benefits. Procedural lapses by the said Colleges cannot give a premium to the students of the College and the same would run counter to the principles of equality, justice and fair play. Every seat in the State run College is at an extreme premium and with a lot of efforts students manage to procure admission in these premium seats. The disparity in fee structure also is a matter of concern since students studying in other private Medical Colleges are deprived of similar benefits.

Whereas on account of default of the institute, the students of the said institute would gain undue advantage. Permitting the institute like Sardar Rajas Medical College committing such irregularities and then pass off their responsibilities would set a precedent and encourage such institutions perpetuating such breach of norms. In view of the facts stated supra, whilst the State Government is conscious of the predicament of the students considering the various aspects of the matter including the disparity of the marks and merit of the students and the fee structure, the workable solution arrived at by the State Government for transferring all the students admitted in the said college under the State Quota as well as the Management quota to the private Medical Colleges in consultation with the concerned private medical colleges, two of which are running under two Deemed Universities. The private medical colleges have agreed to the fees structure and allocation of the students of the Sardar Rajas Medical College."

04. Principal Secretary (Health), Govt. of Odisha has further clarified that 85% of the seats in Sardar Rajas Medical College were filled on the basis of AIPMT list and the remaining were filled under NRI quota. It has also been clarified that the State Govt. has negotiated with three private medical colleges for shifting the students and this fact has also been placed before the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa. She has therefore requested the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare to reconsider the matter and revise the conditions laid down in the Ministry's letter dated 06.11.2015.

05. Secretary, Medical Council of India informed that the matter is required to be placed before the Executive Council of the MCI, as normally shifting of students is allowed only to Government Colleges.

06. Based on the above, the following decisions were taken:

- (i) The matter would be referred to MCI who in turn will convey its view expeditiously.
- (ii) A short adjournment would be requested from the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa."

11. Mr. R.C.Mohanty, learned counsel for the Medical Council of India submits that the Executive Committee Meeting has been called to be held on 27th November, 2015 to consider the proposal of the State of Odisha.

12. In the light of the aforesaid facts and circumstances as noted hereinabove, it appears that the main issue of difference between State of Odisha as well as the Medical Council of India relates to Clause-(b) of the Minutes of Meeting dated 12.10.2015 where Medical Council of India had suggested to the following effect:

"b) The students admitted under Government quota should be transferred to the Government Colleges of the State only."

It further appears that the State of Odisha for reasons which are highlighted in the affidavit filed by the State today have recorded objections to such a suggestion of the Medical Council of India, inter alia, on the ground that the students admitted in Sardar Rajas Medical College had not obtained the ranking required for admission into Government Medical Colleges and consequently, the State of Odisha was of the view that admitting such students into Government Medical colleges would essentially unfair.

Mr. R.C.Mohanty, learned counsel for the Medical Council of India submits that until the Executive Committee meets on 27th of November, 2015 and take a decision on the request of the State Government, Medical Council of India is unable to take any further decision but, it has no objections if the State accepts the earlier recommendations made by the Medical Council of India for accommodating students admitted under Government quota in the Government colleges of the State.

13. In the light of the situation that has arisen herein, we are anguished to note that since early July, this litigation regarding the future academic career of the students remains pending before this Court and we have practically been hearing this case till the end of the month of November. Unless the State of Odisha, Medical Council of India and the Union of India act in unison to protect the interest of the students, the academic career of the students remains jeopardy. We further find that the ground reality of the matter is otherwise.

14. Another fact which is of vital important also needs to be recorded herein. The State of Odisha have been seeking additional seats for two medical colleges i.e. Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (VIMSAR), Burla and The Maharaja Krishna Chandra Gajapati (MKCG) Medical College 86 Hospital, Berhampur. Although such approvals for increase of seats have not yet been granted by the Medical Council of India, yet, it is the stand of the State in its application before the Medical Council of India that the necessary infrastructure as well as the man-power required for increase of seats is available with it subject to, of course, the verification by the Medical Council of India as per the new guidelines.

In the light of the aforesaid fact, we are of the considered view that no real purpose would be served if this difference of opinion between the State Government and Medical Council of India is allowed to continue to fester and effectively result in loss of academic career of the students. We think that the circumstances in the present case warrant our intervention in this matter and consequently, while not questioning the logic or rational stated by the State Government in its affidavit filed today, we are of the considered view that the best interest of the State as well as the students would be sub-served if the conditions recorded under Clause-(b) 8s (c) in

the minutes of meeting held on 12.10.2015 by the Government of India, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare with the Medical Council of India are immediately complied with by the State Government. The said condition/stand of the Medical Council of India, for the sake of clarification, is noted as hereunder:

- a) *Transfer of students can be allowed only if the State Government gives undertaking/declaration that the college would be closed down.*
- b) *Students admitted under Government quota should be transferred to Government Colleges of the State only.*
- c) *Students admitted under management quota;-, should be transferred to private coil*" of the State.*

Insofar as Clause-(a) is concerned, the same cannot be given effect to in view of our order dated 14.9.2015, where we have noted as follows:

"It is in the best interest of the State and the Nation that such an institution is not allowed to close down but, remedial steps be taken by the State in consultation with all the stake holders i.e. how to revive the institution'in order to serve the needs of the public of the State and the local area in which it is located."

Therefore, insofar as Clause-(b) & (c) are concerned, since adequate infrastructure and academic teaching staff are available, at least at two Government medical colleges, in which seats increase is sought for from the Medical Council of India, there is no justifiable reason as to why the students who have been admitted in Government quota at Sardar Rajas Medical College cannot be accommodated either at VIMSAR, Burla or MKCG Medical College, Berhampur whichever may be suitable. Insofar as the other students admitted under management quota is concerned, the State is at liberty to offer them seats at any other private medical college.

15. We are of the considered view that rather than raising disputes between the State and Medical Council of India, the focus ought to be on the future educational needs of the students and keeping with such spirit, the aforesaid order has been directed. Therefore, we are of the further view that the revised proposal of the State of Odisha pending before the Executive Committee of the Medical Council of India need not be considered in view of our aforesaid direction. The State Government may take expeditious steps to comply with this direction preferably, within a period of two weeks from today and report thereof be filed within a further period of one week therefrom, apart from intimating the Medical Council of India as to the institutions where these students have been accommodated....."

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch (100 seats) of MBBS students at Sardar Rajas Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Jaring, Kalahandi, Odisha under Sambalpur University, Sambalpur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017.

82. Pre-PG Assessment – Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Raichur Institute of Medical Sciences, Raichur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

Read: the matter with regard to Pre-PG Assessment – Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Raichur Institute of Medical Sciences, Raichur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the matter and noted that no compliance has been received in spite of repeated requests and as the institute has failed to meet Statutory requirement of having adequate faculty, Residents, Infrastructure, etc. the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the applications for starting of PG courses at Raichur Institute of Medical Sciences, Raichur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

83. Increase of salary in respect of Sh. Praveen Rawat, Consultant (Civil Engineer).

Read: the matter with regard to Increase of salary in respect of Sh. Praveen Rawat, Consultant (Civil Engineer).

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the matter with regard to increase of salary in respect of Sh. Praveen Rawat, Consultant (Civil Engineer) and decided to refer the matter to the Finance Committee of the Council.

84. Approval of the minutes of the Registration & Equivalence Committee meeting held on 29.10.2015.

Read: the matter with regard to approval of the minutes of the Registration & Equivalence Committee meeting held on 29.10.2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council approved the minutes of the Registration & Equivalence Committee meeting held on 29.10.2015 with regard to item Nos. 3,4,12,13,14,15,16,17,18,19,20,21,22,23,24 & 26. For the remaining items, the Executive Committee observed as under pointwise:-

Item No.5 Grant of Registration for Additional Qualification i.e Member, Royal college of Emergency Medicine (MCEM) in respect of Dr. Srinivas Yamsani u/s 26(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The sub-committee has decided to defer the decision till directions are received from the Executive Committee of the Council or legal opinion on the Govt. of India notification dated 07.03.2008 regarding acceptance of foreign postgraduate medical qualifications. In this view of matter, it has been placed prematurely before Executive Committee.

Item No.6 Grant of Registration for Additional Qualification i.e Member, Royal college of Emergency Medicine (MCEM) in respect of Dr. Gurusamy Suthamar u/s 26(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The sub-committee has decided to defer the decision till directions are received from the Executive Committee of the Council or legal opinion on the Govt. of India notification dated 07.03.2008 regarding acceptance of foreign postgraduate medical qualifications. In this view of matter, it has been placed prematurely before Executive Committee.

Item No.7 Grant of Registration for Additional Qualification i.e Member, Royal college of Emergency Medicine (MCEM) in respect of Dr. Chenna Kesava Reddy u/s 26(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The sub-committee has decided to defer the decision till directions are received from the Executive Committee of the Council or legal opinion on the Govt. of India notification dated 07.03.2008 regarding acceptance of foreign postgraduate medical qualifications. In this view

of matter, it has been placed prematurely before Executive Committee.

Item No.8 Grant of Registration for Additional Qualification i.e Member, Royal college of Emergency Medicine (MCEM) in respect of Dr. Sheth Tanvir Aalam u/s 26(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The sub-committee has decided to defer the decision till directions are received from the Executive Committee of the Council or legal opinion on the Govt. of India notification dated 07.03.2008 regarding acceptance of foreign postgraduate medical qualifications. In this view of matter, it has been placed prematurely before Executive Committee.

Item No.9 Grant of Registration for Additional Qualification i.e Member, Royal college of Emergency Medicine (MCEM) in respect of Dr. Het Atulbhai Patel u/s 26(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The sub-committee has decided to defer the decision till directions are received from the Executive Committee of the Council or legal opinion on the Govt. of India notification dated 07.03.2008 regarding acceptance of foreign postgraduate medical qualifications. In this view of matter, it has been placed prematurely before Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted that items 5 – 9 pertain to grant of registration in respect of Member, Royal College of Emergency Medicine. It has been brought out by the sub-committee that MCI has denied registration to some candidates while it has approved registration of 2 candidates – viz. Dr. Rahul Jain & Dr. Rahul Bansal. The sub-committee be directed to prepare a comprehensive report in this regard incorporating all details and submit it before E.C.

Item No.10 Grant of Registration for Additional Qualifications i.e Membership of Royal College of Physicians of the UK (MRCP in Nephrology) in respect of Dr. Kolhatkar Meetal Sanjay u/s 26(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The sub-committee has decided to defer the decision till directions are received from the Executive Committee of the Council or legal opinion on the Govt. of India notification dated 07.03.2008 regarding acceptance of foreign postgraduate medical qualifications. In this view of matter, it has been placed prematurely before Executive Committee. Further, on perusal of minutes, no reasons can be found for deferring a decision in this matter. The sub-committee is advised to take a decision in the matter and resubmit.

Item No.11 Grant of Registration for Additional Qualifications i.e (i) Fellowship of Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow (FRCS) and (ii) Fellowship of Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow (FRCS – Trauma and Orthopaedic surgery) in respect of Dr. Pagolu Samual Vara Prasad u/s 26(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The sub-committee has decided to defer the decision till directions are received from the Executive Committee of the Council or legal opinion on the Govt. of India notification dated 07.03.2008 regarding acceptance of foreign postgraduate medical qualifications. In this view of matter, it has been placed prematurely before Executive Committee.

Item No.25 Grant of Registration for Additional Qualification i.e. (i) Membership, The Royal New Zealand College of General Practitioners (MRNZCGP) and (ii) Fellowship, The Royal New Zealand College of General Practitioners (FRNZCGP) in respect of Dr. Srividya Jandhala u/s 26(1) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The sub-committee has decided to defer the decision till directions are received from the Executive Committee of the Council or legal opinion on the Govt. of India notification dated 07.03.2008 regarding acceptance of foreign postgraduate medical qualifications. In this view of matter, it has been placed prematurely before Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee of the Council advised all the Sub-Committees to prepare minutes separately in respect of items in which final decision has been taken and in respect of those items which have been kept pending and no final decision has been taken by the Sub-Committee. Only those items in which final decision has been taken by the Sub-Committee be placed before Executive Committee for approval. Copy of this decision should be placed before Chairmen of all Sub-Committees for necessary action.

85. Report of the Sub Committee constituted to consider the matter with regard to Functioning of Medical Council of India.

Read: the matter with regard to report of the Sub Committee constituted to consider the matter with regard to Functioning of Medical Council of India.

The Executive Committee of the Council decided to defer the consideration of the matter for the next meeting.

86. Admission of MBBS student at Sri Venkateswaraa Medical Hospital & Research Centre, Pondicherry for the Academic Year 2014-15.

Read: the matter with regard to admission of MBBS student at Sri Venkateswaraa Medical Hospital & Research Centre, Pondicherry for the Academic Year 2014-15.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the matter of one(01) excess student admitted in the management quota at Sri Venkateswaraa Medical Hospital & Research Centre, Pondicherry for the Academic Year 2014-15 and noted that the college authorities had failed to surrender one(01) seat to the Government quota as per Council letter dated 02.09.2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council further perused the judgement dated 12.01.2005 in Mridul Dhar Vs. Union of India, relevant portion of which reads as below:

“

11. If any private medical college in a given academic year for any reason grants admission in its management quota in excess of its prescribed quota, the management quota for the next academic year shall stand reduced so as to set off the effect of excess admission in the management quota in the previous academic year”.....

The Committee also perused the relevant part of the order dated 8th May, 2012 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Priya Gupta Vs. State of Chhatisgarh & ors case as under:

“

30. Thus, the need of the hour is that binding dicta be prescribed and statutory regulations be enforced, so that all concerned are mandatorily required to implement the time schedule in its true spirit and substance. It is difficult and not even advisable to keep some windows open to meet a particular situation of exception, as it may pose impediments to the smooth implementation of laws and defeat the very object of the scheme. These schedules have been prescribed upon serious consideration by all concerned. They are to be applied *stricto sensu* and cannot be moulded to suit the convenience of some economic or other interest of any institution, especially, in a manner that is bound to result in compromise of the above- stated principles. Keeping in view the contemptuous conduct of the relevant stakeholders, their cannonade on the rule of merit compels us to state, with precision and esemplastically, the action that is necessary to ameliorate the process of selection. Thus, we issue the following directions in rem for their strict compliance, without demur and default, by all concerned.

i) The commencement of new courses or increases in seats of existing courses of MBBS/BDS are to be approved/recognised by the Government of India by 15th July of each calendar year for the relevant academic sessions of that year.

ii) The Medical Council of India shall, immediately thereafter, issue appropriate directions and ensure the implementation and commencement of admission process within one week thereafter.

iii) After 15th July of each year, neither the Union of India nor the Medical or Dental Council of India shall issue any recognition or approval for the current academic year. If any such approval is granted after 15th July of any year, it shall only be operative for the next academic year and not in the current academic year. Once the sanction/approval is granted on or before 15th July of the relevant year, the name of that college and all seats shall be included in both the first and the second counseling, in accordance with the Rules.

iv) Any medical or dental college, or seats thereof, to which the recognition/approval is issued subsequent to 15th July of the respective year shall not be included in the counseling to be conducted by the concerned authority and that college would have no right to make admissions in the current academic year against such seats.

v) The admission to the medical or dental colleges shall be granted only through the respective entrance tests conducted by the competitive authority in the State or the body of the private colleges. These two are the methods of selection and grant of admission to these courses. However, where there is a single Board conducting the state examination and there is a single medical college, then in terms of clause 5.1 of the Medical Council of India Eligibility Certificate Regulations, 2002 the admission can be given on the basis of 10+2 exam marks, strictly in order of merit.

vi) All admissions through any of the stated selection processes have to be effected only after due publicity and in consonance with the directions issued by this Court. We vehemently deprecate the practice of giving admissions on 30th September of the academic year. In fact, that is the date by which, in exceptional circumstances, a candidate duly selected as per the prescribed selection process is to join the academic course of MBBS/BDS. Under the directions of this Court, second counseling should be the final counseling, as this Court has already held in the case of Ms. Neelu Arora & Anr. v. UOI & Ors. [(2003) 3 SCC 366] and third counseling is not contemplated or permitted under the entire process of selection/grant of admission to these professional courses.

vii) If any seats remain vacant or are surrendered from All India Quota, they should positively be allotted and admission granted strictly as per the merit by 15th September of the relevant year and not by holding an extended counseling. The remaining time will be limited to the filling up of the vacant seats resulting from exceptional circumstances or surrender of seats. All candidates should join the academic courses by 30th September of the academic year.

viii) No college may grant admissions without duly advertising the vacancies available and by publicizing the same through the internet, newspaper, on the notice board of the respective feeder schools and colleges, etc. Every effort has to be made by all concerned to ensure that the admissions are given on merit and after due publicity and not in a manner which is ex-facie arbitrary and casts the shadow of favouritism.

ix) The admissions to all government colleges have to be on merit obtained in the entrance examination conducted by the nominated authority, while in the case of private colleges, the colleges should choose their option by 30th April of the relevant year, as to whether they wish to grant admission on the basis of the merit obtained in the test conducted by the nominated State authority or they wish to follow the merit list/rank obtained by the candidates in the competitive examination collectively held by the nominated agency for the private colleges. The option exercised by 30th April shall not be subject to change. This choice should also be given by the colleges which are anticipating grant of recognition, in compliance with the date specified in these directions.

31. All these directions shall be complied with by all concerned, including Union of India, Medical Council of India, Dental Council of India, State Governments, Universities and medical and dental colleges and the management of the respective universities or dental and medical colleges. Any default in compliance with these conditions or attempt to overreach these directions shall, without fail, invite the following consequences and penal actions:-

a) Every body, officer or authority who disobeys or avoids or fails to strictly comply with these directions *stricto sensu* shall be liable for action under the provisions of the Contempt of Courts Act. Liberty is granted to any interested party to take out the contempt proceedings before the High Court having jurisdiction over such Institution/State, etc.

b) The person, member or authority found responsible for any violation shall be departmentally proceeded against and punished in accordance with the Rules. We make it clear that violation of these directions or overreaching them by any process shall tantamount to indiscipline, insubordination, misconduct and being unworthy of becoming a public servant.

c) Such defaulting authority, member or body shall also be liable for action by and personal liability to third parties who might have suffered losses as a result of such default.

d) There shall be due channelization of selection and admission process with full cooperation and coordination between the Government of India, State Government, Universities, Medical Council of India or Dental Council of India and the colleges concerned. They shall act in tandem and strictly as per the prescribed schedule. In other words, there should be complete harmonisation with a view to form a uniform pattern for concerted action, according to the framed scheme, schedule for admission and regulations framed in this behalf.

e) The college which grants admission for the current academic year, where its recognition/approval is granted subsequent to 15th July of the current academic year, shall be liable for withdrawal of recognition/approval on this ground, in addition to being liable to indemnify such students who are denied admission or who are wrongfully given admission in the college.

f) Upon the expiry of one week after holding of the second counseling, the unfilled seats from all quotas shall be deemed to have been surrendered in favour of the respective States and shall be filled thereafter strictly on the basis of merit obtained in the competitive entrance test.

g) *It shall be mandatory on the part of each college and University to inform the State and the Central Government/competent authority of the seats which are lying vacant after each counseling and they shall furnish the complete details, list of seats filled and vacant in the respective states, immediately after each counseling.*

h) *No college shall fill up its seats in any other manner.*

.....”

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided that the Institute be directed to surrender 01 seat from its quota to Govt. and DME, Pondicherry be requested to increase State quota correspondingly by 01 seat in next academic year.

87. Konaseema Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Foundation, Amalapuram - increase of intake of seats for MBBS (UG) course the Academic year 2016-17 – Withdrawal of application.

Read: the matter with regard to Konaseema Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Foundation, Amalapuram - increase of intake of seats for MBBS (UG) course the Academic year 2016-17.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 26.10.2015 received from the Dean, Konaseema Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Foundation & KIMS General Hospital, Vijayawada stating that “...due to technical difficulties, we are herewith withdrawing the application submitted for the increase in admission into MBBS (UG) Degree course from 150 to 200 intake for the year 2016-17 at Konaseema Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Foundation, Amalapuram.”

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for increase of intake of seats for MBBS (UG) course at Konaseema Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Foundation, Amalapuram for the academic year 2016-17 recommending disapproval of the scheme to the Central Govt. as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the Regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

88. Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, Balagangadharanatha Nagara, Mandya Distt. – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

Read: the matter with regard to Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, Balagangadharanatha Nagara, Mandya Distt. – Renewal of Permission for admission of 4th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (5th and 6th November, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, Balagangadharanatha Nagara, Mandya Distt. under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore for the academic year 2016-17.

89. Renewal of permission for MBBS course of 5th batch (150 seats) of Madha Medical College & Hospital, Thandalam, Chennai under the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course of 5th batch (150 seats) of Madha Medical College & Hospital, Thandalam, Chennai

under the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (16th Oct., 2015) alongwith previous assessment report (31st December, 2014 & 1st January, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 63.63 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 87.06 % as detailed in report.
3. Bed occupancy is 45 % on day of assessment.
4. Many patients were fake. Notes of case papers were not matching with history & examination of patients. E.g. in case of one patient (Regn. No. 500392), as per notes he was a patient of Fracture Right Leg for which Nailing was done under General Anaesthesia. On examination, it was found that no surgery was performed on his leg and he was walking. Such discrepancies were observed in other wards also.
5. OPD attendance as verified by assessors between 1:30 p.m. – 2:00 p.m. was only 611; however institute has provided inflated data of 1,108 patients.
6. Wards: Pantry, Examination Room, Doctor's room are common between 2 wards. There is no lift. Deficiencies remain the same.
7. ICUs: There were only 2 patients in combined ICCU & ICU. In SICU, there were 2 patients but both were medical patients.
8. Cytopathology workload is only 05 which is inadequate.
9. There was only 1 Major & 1 Minor operation on day of assessment which is inadequate.
10. There was NIL Normal Delivery & NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment.
11. Radiological & Laboratory investigation workload was inadequate.
12. Examination Hall cum Auditorium: Actual area as per diagram and measurement given by Engineer is 449 sq.m. against requirement of 1,200 sq.m.
13. Students' Hostels: Available accommodation is 374 against requirement of 565 as per Regulations. Cupboards are not provided. A.C. study room with computer & Internet is not available in any hostel. There is no lift in 5 storeyed building.
14. Interns' Hostel: No hostel is available as such. There are 28 flats with total capacity of $28 \times 4 = 112$.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch (150 seats) of MBBS students at Madha Medical College & Hospital, Thandalam, Chennai under the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

90. Recognition/approval of Malabar Medical College & Research Centre, Calicut, Kerala for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by the Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Malabar Medical College & Research Centre, Calicut, Kerala for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by the Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the letter from assessors dated 04/11/2015 which reads as under:

"In reference to mentioned subject and reference, we were asked to verify the compliance on the deficiencies pointed out in the MCI inspection dated 25th August, 2015 for recognition/approval of Malabar Medical College & Research Centre, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats).

As per your directions, to carry out the assessment, we reached at Malabar Medical College & Research Centre, Calicut on 4th November, 2015. Assessment was denied by Chairman, Mr. V. Anilkumar stating that matter is subjudice. Original letter mentioning not to conduct assessment signed by Chairman and Vice Principal Dr. Shankaraiah (since Principal was not present) is attached herewith."

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to recognise/approve Malabar Medical College & Research Centre, Calicut for the award of MBBS degree granted by the Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within one month for further consideration of the matter. It was further decided that this fact be placed before the Hon'ble Court through Council Advocate.

91. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission of 3rd batch (100 seats) of R.U.H.S College of Medical Sciences, Jaipur, Rajasthan for the 2016-2017.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission of 3rd batch (100 seats) of R.U.H.S College of Medical Sciences, Jaipur, Rajasthan for the 2016-2017.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the letter dated 05.11.2015 of the Principal & Controller, RUHS College of Medical Sciences & Hospital, Jaipur. The Committee further perused the letter from assessors dated 05/11/2015 which reads as under:

"In compliance to your above said letter, we three (coordinator and two assessors) reached the college campus situated at Sector-18, Kumbh Marg, Tonk Road, Jaipur at 9am sharply today. The college campus had deserted look and with the help of guard we reached the Principal office. The office was locked however we could see a lecture theatre with some students sitting in it. On enquiry they said that Dr. Sarik had taken Anatomy Lecture class. It was gallery type of LT with AC and necessary audio visual installations. Then we went to Principal office and Principal Dr. Rajesh Sharma arrived at around 10am. We introduced ourselves and told him the purpose of our visit. He instantly informed that Diwali vacation has started from 2nd Nov and faculty members are on vacation and will report back on 16th Nov 2015 and hence he will not proceed with inspection. The Principle Dr. Rajesh Sharma by his letter no. 9151-56 dated 05/11/2015 gave us in writing. Dr. S.N Sharma informed this immediately to Dr. Barik who asked to visit hospital and see the facilities and faculty there. Principal was initially resisting this fact but on further insistence he asked community medicine Asst Prof Dr. Wasim Baig and HOD/Physiology Dr. S. Kakkar to accompany MCI team to Hospital. Before hospital visit the coordinator requested Principal to allow a visit Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry dept. The Coordinator with HOD Physiology and /anatomy - visited Dept. of Anatomy on ground floor and Physiology on first floor. Dept. of PHARMA & BIO Chem was not open. The above inspection was video graphed by the college videographer. In the mean while, Principal has left the college.

Around 1 pm we reached hospital campus i.e Rukmani Devi Beni Prasad Jaipuria hospital, which is 10kms from college campus. The hospital Supt Dr. Mrs Rekha Singh alongwith 8-10 other faculty doctors accompanies us to few wings of hospital. Dr. Dipty Jain visited 6 bedded NICU which had one ventilator, warmers and phototherapy units. She also visited 24v bedded Paediatric ward, Gynaec, ANC and Labour wards. Labour ward had a resuscitation corner. At 1.30pm OPD was closed and Paediatric OPD had immunization clinic, child welfare clinic and Child Rehabilitation Centre.

Dr. S.N Sharma with Dr. Mamtha visited Blood Bank, Central Diagnostic Lab, MRD unit and a medicine ward. Then, they visited 5 major OTs on first floor. In surgery OT-a Laparoscopic Cholecystostomy was being performed Ortho OT had C-Arm. Other OTs were ENT, Ophthalmology, Gynaec and emergency OT. OTs was having Boyles machine defibrillator, monitors and central oxygen supply.

MRD is having a statistician, a clerk and other 2-3 staff & it was computerized. Centre Diagnostic in charge was Asst Prof of Biochemistry. There were one A P Pathology and Microbiology posted also.

The OPD and IPD figures of 5th Nov 2015 were demanded from MSR, Central clinical Lab but was not given. Inspection of blood bank, central diagnostic lab, OT complex and MRD was video graphed by MR Sachin, who was asked to prepare CD/DVD in presence of Supt, HOD physiology and other faculty members. However, we are pained to say that this was not provided till 9pm on 5th Nov 2015. Dr. Rajesh Sharma was informed on phone regarding this lapse and was requested to provide it in hotel till tomorrow morning but did not give an affirmative answer. He & HOD Physo Dr. Sahcin was sent an SMS also.

There was no electricity around 7.30 pm and we were compelled to leave the campus and type this report at our hotel.

In summary, we state that the college administration was non cooperative and unwilling to get the assessment done. This fact was informed to Dr. Barik on phone.”

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 3rd batch (100 seats) of MBBS students at R.U.H.S College of Medical Sciences, Jaipur, Rajasthan under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017.

92. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch (150 seats) of GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar, Gujarat under Gujarat University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch (150 seats) of GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar, Gujarat under Gujarat University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (17th and 18th November, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch (150 seats) of MBBS students at GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar, Gujarat under Gujarat University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017.

93. Matter with regard to Ragging at Rajendra Instt of Medical Sciences, Ranchi.

Read: the matter with regard to ragging at Rajendra Instt of Medical Sciences, Ranchi.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted that the matter with regard to a complaint of ragging received from various batches of students of Rajendra Instt. of Medical Sciences, Ranchi was considered by the Administration & Grievance Committee of the Council at its meeting held on 8/9/2015 wherein it was decided as under:-

“.....Since the college authorities have failed to curb the menace of ragging i.e. ineffective/non-existent Anti-Ragging Committee, resulting in wide spread ragging in the college and acts of indiscipline, like putting different type of flags in the hostel and other anti-social activities by the students, the Committee decided that no application from the college should be entertained for increase of seats received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 during current year.....”

The operative part of the Legal opinion obtained in the matter is as under:-

“.....The Administration Committee had recommended that “no application from the College should be entertained for increase of seats received u/s. 10A of the IMC act, 1956 during current year.”

2. The Council has in order to curb the menace of Ragging with the prior approval of Central Government had notified the Medical Council of India

(Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) Regulations, 2009. Clause 8 of the said Regulations carves out a three-tier level for the Awardable Punishments:-

- 8.1 At the Medical College/Institution level;
 - 8.2 Penal consequences for the head of the institutions/administration of the institution who do not take timely steps in the prevention of ragging and punishing those who rag; and
 - 8.3 At the MCI level.
3. In this instance, the “awardable punishment” at MCI level has to be decided upon, therefore it would be appropriate to refer to the said provision that reads as under:-

8.3 At the MCI level

8.3.1 Impose an exemplary fine of Rs. 1 lakh for each incident of ragging payable by erring medical college / institution to such authority as may be designated by the appropriate Govt., as the case may be.

8.3.2 Declare the erring Medical College / Institution / University as not having the minimum academic standards and warning the potential candidates for admission at such institution through public notice and posing on the MCI website.

8.3.3 Declare the erring Medical College / Institution / University to be ineligible for preferring any application u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 for a minimum period of one year, extendable by such quantum by the Council as would be commensurate with the wrong.

4. The recommendation of the Administration Committee as regards “awardable punishment” at MCI level for non-processing of application under section 10A falls within clause 8.3.3 of the Ragging Regulations.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to apply clause 8.3.1 of (Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) Regulations, 2009 and impose an exemplary fine of Rs. 1 lakh on the erring medical college / institution payable to such authority as may be designated by the appropriate Govt.

94. Consideration of attendance period of Ms. Rushna Bano at J.N. Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal for the examination of IInd Prof. examination.

Read: the matter with regard to consideration of attendance period of Ms. Rushna Bano at J.N. Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal for the examination of IInd Prof. examination.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted that no explanation is received from Dean, B.R.D. Medical College, Gorakhpur as to why Ms. Rushna Bano was allowed to appear in II Professional examination. In view of this, the Executive Committee of the Council decided that a final reminder be sent to the Dean. A copy of the letter be also sent to Medical Education Secretary & DME also.

95. Mediciti Institute of Medical Sciences, Ghanpur – Renewal of Permission for admission of 5th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

Read: the matter with regard to Mediciti Institute of Medical Sciences, Ghanpur – Renewal of Permission for admission of 5th Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2016-17.

The Executive Committee of the Council defer the consideration of the matter for the next meeting.

96. Increase of seats in MBBS course from 150-250 for the academic session 2015-16 at M.K.C.G. Medical College, Brahmapur.

Read: the matter with regard to increase of seats in MBBS course from 150-250 for the academic session 2015-16 at M.K.C.G. Medical College, Brahmapur.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (17th and 18th November, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 25 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 20.31 % as detailed in the report.
3. OPD: Registration counters are not centralized. Waiting area is not adequate. Teaching area is not adequate. Injection room is common for males & females. Child Rehabilitation Clinic is not available in Paediatrics OPD.
4. Teaching Beds: There is deficit of 45 beds in Orthopaedics.
5. OPD attendance is only 1,191 against requirement of 3,000.
6. There were only 09 Major operations for the whole hospital on day of assessment.
7. Workload of Special investigations like Ba, IVP is NIL on day of assessment.
8. Workload of Histopathology is only 09 & of Cytopathology only 10 on day of assessment.
9. Casualty: Central O₂ & Central Suction are not available. Disaster Trolley, Ventilator are not available. Separate Casualty for O.G. is not available.
10. O.T.s: There are only 10 Major O.T.s available against requirement of 11. Central O₂ & Central Suction are not available.
11. ICUs: MICU has only 4 beds against 5 required. SICU, PICU/NICU are not available.
12. Labour Room: Septic room & Eclampsia room are not available.
13. Radiodiagnosis department: Only 3 mobile X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6. Static machines available are 4 against requirement of 6. CT Scan is single slice against dual slice required. AERB approval is not available for any machine. Only 1 USG is available against requirement of 3.
14. Intercom is not available.
15. CSSD: Receiving & Distribution points are not separate. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
16. MRD: It is not centralized. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed for indexing.
17. College Office: There is no staff room. There is no room for College Council.
18. MEU: There are no equipment or room for MEU.
19. Examination Hall: Two small halls with total capacity of 150 are available against requirement of 3 halls of 250 each.
20. Lecture Theaters: Hospital Lecture Theater is not available.
21. Central Library: Available area is 1,100 sq.m. against requirement of 4,000 sq.m. Students' seating room (Outside) is not available. Students' seating room (Inside) has capacity of 184 against requirement of 250. Residents' reading room has capacity of 22 against requirement of 50. Only 7 Internet nodes are available.

22. Common Room for Boys is not available. Common Room for Girls does not have attached toilets.
23. Central Photography Section: There is no new digital equipment.
24. Students' Hostels: Available accommodation is 570 against requirement of 938. Hostels are not well maintained.
25. Interns' Hostel: Available accommodation is 150 against requirement of 250.
26. Residents' Hostels: Accommodation is not available for all PG Residents.
27. Nursing staff: Only 410 Nurses are available against 552 required.
28. Anatomy department: Specimens available are only 140. Only 6 cadavers are available. Only 150 Lockers are available against requirement of 150. Cold storage is inadequate.
29. Physiology department: Only 2 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4. Clinical Physiology laboratory is inadequate. Audiovisual aids are inadequate.
30. Biochemistry department: Only 3 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4. Out of them, 2 are smaller than required. Audiovisual aids are inadequate.
31. Pathology department: Only 2 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4. Practical laboratory is shared with Microbiology department.
32. Microbiology department: Only 1 Demonstration room is available against requirement of 4 and that too is smaller than required. . Practical laboratory is shared with Microbiology department.
33. Pharmacology department: Only 1 Demonstration rooms available against requirement of 4.
34. Forensic Medicine department: Only 2 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4.
35. Community Medicine department: Only 2 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4.
36. Website: Information provided is sketchy and incomplete as detailed in report.
37. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MBBS course from 150 to 250 u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 in respect of M.K.C.G. Medical College, Brahmapur under Berhampur University for academic year 2015-16.

97. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch (100 seats) of Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, New Delhi under Jamia Hamdard (Hamdard University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017.

3. Many Residents as detailed in the report are not staying in the campus.
4. OPD: Injection room is common for males & females. Dressing room is common for males & females. Special clinics facilities are not available in Paediatrics OPD.
5. Teaching beds are deficient as under:

6. Wards: They are not as per MSR Regulations. Ancillary facilities are not inside the wards and they are common between 3-4 wards. Almost all wards have 12 beds. Nursing station is outside the wards in corridor.
7. OPD attendance as provided by institute is 674 against requirement of 800. Even this figure is inflated.
8. Bed occupancy is 45.03 % on day of assessment.
9. There were only 07 Major operations & 04 Minor operations on day of assessment which is inadequate.
10. There was only 1 Normal Delivery & NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment till 12 p.m.
11. Data of Biochemistry, Haematology & Histopathology investigations were not provided.
12. MRD could not be verified as assessment was stopped by Dean.
13. Radiodiagnosis department facilities could not be verified as assessment was stopped by Dean.
14. Other ancillary facilities could not be verified as assessment was stopped by Dean.
15. CSSD: ETO Sterilizer is not available. Receiving & Distribution points are not separate.
16. Measurements of Dean's office, Staff Room, etc. are not provided.
17. MEU: Details of programmes conducted by institute have not been supplied.
18. CME: Details of CME programmes conducted have not been supplied.
19. College Council: Details of meetings & Minutes are not supplied.
20. Pharmaco Vigilance Committee: Details of meetings & Minutes are not supplied.
21. Infrastructure facilities could not be verified as assessment was stopped by Dean.
22. Facilities in departments of Biochemistry, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine, Community Medicine could not be verified as assessment was stopped by Dean.
23. RHTC: Cold chain equipment is not available. Survey/MCH/FP/Immunization registers are not available.
24. UHC: Survey/MCH/FP/Immunization registers are not available.
25. Form A I is not provided by Dean.
26. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch (100 seats) of MBBS students at Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, New Delhi under Jamia Hamdard (Hamdard University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-2017.

Those who fulfill the basic requirements would be considered at the next stage...."

The Executive Committee of the Council also noted that the college authorities have furnished a fresh Essentiality Certificate dated 29.10.2015 from the State Government of Haryana for establishment of new medical college at Faridabad which is after the cut off date i.e. 31.08.2015 of Central Government and 30.09.2015 of MCI.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to reiterate its earlier decision conveyed to the Central Government vide letter dated 19.10.2015 to return the application for establishment of new medical college at Faridabad, Haryana (Ah-Falah School of Medicine Science & Research Centre, Faridabad, Haryana) by Al-Falah Charitable Trust, New Delhi to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the scheme u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.
