The Executive Committee of the Council confirmed the minutes of the meeting held on 13th Jan, 2015.

2. **Minutes of the last meeting of the Executive Committee – Action taken thereon.**

The Executive Committee of the Council while noting the action taken on the minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 13th Jan, 2015 observed the following:

Item No.39 **Patna Medical College, Patna- Renewal of Permission for admission of 3rd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2015-16.**

The Executive Committee of the Council noted that the Medical Superintendent does not possess postgraduate qualification and therefore cannot be accepted as per Minimum Qualifications for Teachers in Medical Institutions Regulations, 1998. This may also be communicated to the Central Government as well as other concerned authorities.

3. **Pending Items arising out of the decisions taken by the Executive Committee.**

The Executive Committee of the Council noted the pending items arising out of the decisions taken by the Executive Committee.

4. **Increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra for the academic session 2015-16.**

Read: the matter with regard to increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (6th& 7th January, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant Letter of Permission for increase of seats from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 in respect of Dr. Ulas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for the academic year 2015-16.

5. **Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at Govt. Coimbatore Medical College, Coimbatore for the academic session 2015-16.**

Read: the matter with regard to increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at Govt. Coimbatore Medical College, Coimbatore for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (9th & 10th January, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 17.98 % as detailed in report.
2. Number of Minor Surgeries for the whole hospital is 9 on day of assessment.
3. Lecture Theaters: There are 7 lecture theaters of 250 capacity each against requirement of 6 of capacity 300 each. Lecture theater of capacity 650 is not available. Facility for E class is not available in hospital lecture theater.
4. Examination hall cum Auditorium: Auditorium of area 1,200 sq.m. & 2 Examination halls of total area 1,080 sq.m. are available against requirement of one hall of 2,000 sq.m.
5. Area of Central Library is not provided.
6. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls are smaller than required.
7. Accommodation for Residents is inadequate.
8. MRD: It is not fully computerized. ICD X classification of diseases is not used for indexing. Statistician is not available.

9. Website: it is not updated.
10. Anatomy department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
11. Physiology department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
12. Biochemistry department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
13. Pathology department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
14. Microbiology department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
15. Pharmacology department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
16. Forensic Medicine department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
17. Community Medicine department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
18. RHTC: Residential accommodation is not available.
19. Hostel: 5 Girls are staying in 1 room which is not as per Regulations (Maximum 3 / room of 27 sq.m. area). Interns' hostel is overcrowded with unhygienic conditions.
20. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats from 150 to 250 u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 in respect of Govt. Coimbatore Medical College, Coimbatore under the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai for academic year 2015-16 and also continuance of recognition of the college for the award of M.B.B.S. degree(150 seats) at Govt. Coimbatore Medical College, Coimbatore under the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

6. Increase of MBBS seats from 155 to 250 at Govt. Madurai Medical College, Madurai for the academic session 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to increase of MBBS seats from 155 to 250 at Govt. Madurai Medical College, Madurai for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (9th & 10th January, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of teaching faculty is 14.6 % as detailed in report.
2. Lecture Theaters: Only 4 lecture theaters of capacity 155 each are available against requirement of 6 of 350 capacity each as per Regulations. Facility for E class is not available.
3. Central Library: Available area is 700 sq.m. against requirement of 4,000 sq.m. Capacity of students' reading room (outside) & students' reading room (inside) is 150 & 50 respectively against requirement of 250 each as per Regulations. Capacity of staff reading room is 12 against 50 required. Journals available are 87 against requirement of 100. Only 12 Internet nodes are available against requirement of 50.
4. Common Room for Boys' is smaller than required. Girls' common room is available near girls' hostel.
5. Details of accommodation available for Residents is not given.
6. OPD: Registration counters are not computerized. Staff is inadequate. Waiting area is inadequate. Only 2 big rooms are available as Examination Rooms for all major departments against requirement of 4 rooms for each department. Dressing room for males & females is common.
7. Wards: Demonstration rooms are not available in all the wards. Audiovisual aids are not available. Pantry is not available in all the wards.

8. MRD: It is manual.
9. Casualty: Disaster Trolley & crash cart are not available.
10. O.T.: Each O.T. has more than 1 table which is not as per norms.
11. Only 4 static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6.
12. CSSD: ETO sterilizer is not available.
13. Nursing staff: 681 Nurses are available against 703 required.
14. Anatomy department: Only 2 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4. Microscopes are inadequate. MRI/CT films are not available.
15. Physiology department: Only 2 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4.
16. Biochemistry department: Only 2 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4. Laboratory capacity is inadequate.
17. Microbiology department: Only 2 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4.
18. Pharmacology department: Only 2 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4.
19. Forensic Medicine department: Only 1 Demonstration room is available against requirement of 4.
20. Community Medicine department: Only 2 Demonstration rooms are available against requirement of 4.
21. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats from 155 to 250 u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 in respect of Govt. Madurai Medical College, Madurai under the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai for academic year 2015-16.

7. Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 200 at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Nalgonda for the academic session 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 200 at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Nalgonda for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (8th & 9th January, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant Letter of Permission for increase of seats from 150 to 200 u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 in respect of Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Nalgonda under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for the academic year 2015-16.

8. Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at Government Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli for the academic session 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at Government Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (9th & 10th January, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 16.73 % as detailed in report.
2. Shortage of residents is 26.59 % as detailed in report.
3. Teaching beds are deficient as under:

4. Lecture Theaters: Available lecture theaters are 4 of capacity 180 each & 1 of capacity 400 against requirement of 6 of capacity 300 each & 1 of capacity 650.
5. OPD attendance on day of assessment was 2,657 on day of assessment.
6. Daily average of major Surgical operations is only 7 which is inadequate.
7. Central Library: Available area is 3,043 sq.m. against requirement of 4,000 sq.m. Capacity of Students' Reading Room (Outside) & Students' Reading Room (Inside) is 150 each against requirement of 250 each. 80 journals are available against requirement of 100. Only 4 Internet nodes are available against requirement of 50.
8. Wards: Distance between 2 beds is not 1.5 m in some wards. In some wards, Nursing station is located in such a way that Nurses cannot see all the patients.
9. Students' Hostels: Accommodation available is for 642 students against requirement of 937.
10. Interns' Hostel: Accommodation available is for 150 Interns against requirement of 250.
11. Residents' Hostel: Accommodation available is for 1110 Residents against requirement of 186.
12. Residential Quarters: 36 quarters for faculty are available against requirement of 46.
13. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls are smaller than required.
14. MRD: Statistician is not available.
15. Casualty: Only 13 beds are available against requirement of 30. Disaster Trolley, Crash cart & Ventilator are not available.
16. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
17. Nursing staff: Only 496 Nurses are available against requirement of 703.
18. Website: it is not updated since last 6 months.
19. Anatomy department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4. Cold storage was not working on day of assessment. Only 150 Lockers are available against requirement of 250. Number of Cadavers available is only 9 which is inadequate.
20. Physiology department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
21. Biochemistry department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
22. Pathology department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
23. Microbiology department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
24. Pharmacology department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
25. Forensic Medicine department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4. Museum does not have prototype firearms & slides. Library is small & has old books & journals.
26. Community Medicine department: Only 2 Demonstration Rooms are available against requirement of 4.
27. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, as the applicant college do not meet the Qualifying Criterion 3(6)(B)(i) of Opening of New or Higher Courses of Study or Training (including Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) and increase of Admission Capacity in any course of Study or Training (including Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) (Amendment) Regulations, 2009 (Part-III), the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for increase in MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at Government Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli under the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 for academic year 2015-16 recommending disapproval of the scheme to the Central Govt. as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the Regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

9. Increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Sharda University, Greater Noida for the academic session 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Sharda University, Greater Noida for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (13^h & 14th January, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Shortage of teaching faculty 13.44%
2. Shortage of Residents 6.3%.
3. The institute has applied for increase from 100 to 150 seats. Hence beds should be increased from 500 (required for 100) to 540 (1/5th of increment of 200 = 40 to be increased). However, total number of teaching beds are only 500. Hence there is deficit of 40 beds.
4. Wards: In some wards, particularly in Orthopaedic wards, nursing stations were not positioned in such a way that all patients could be visualized.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 in respect of School of Medical Sciences & Research, Sharda University, Greater Noida under Sharda University for academic year 2015-16.

10. Increase of MBBS seats from 60 to 100 at Mata Gujri Memorial Medical College, Lions Seva Kendra Hospital, Kishanganj, Bihar for the academic session 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to increase of MBBS seats from 60 to 100 at Mata Gujri Memorial Medical College, Lions Seva Kendra Hospital, Kishanganj, Bihar for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (13^h & 14th January, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant Letter of Permission for increase of seats from 60 to 100 u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 in respect of Mata Gujri Memorial Medical College, Lions Seva Kendra Hospital, Kishanganj, Bihar under B.N. Mandal University for the academic year 2015-16.

11. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Akbarpur, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh by Rajiv Memorial Academic Welfare Society, Uttar Pradesh with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Akbarpur, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh by Rajiv Memorial Academic Welfare Society, Uttar Pradesh with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (06th & 07th January, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty is 15 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 11 % as detailed in report.
3. Names of several faculty members as detailed in report in General Surgery & allied specialties do not exist in any O.T. registers.
4. Teaching Beds: No unit-wise demarcation / labeling is made.
5. OPD: OPD attendance was 280 on day of assessment against requirement of 600 as per Regulations. Casualty attendance was only 15.
6. Bed occupancy is only 17 % on day of assessment.
7. There was only 1 normal delivery & NIL Caesarean on day of assessment.
8. Dean's office is under construction.
9. Lecture Theaters are under construction.
10. Anatomy department: Only 48 specimens are available. There are no cadavers.
11. Physiology department: it is under construction.
12. Biochemistry department: It is under construction.
13. Students' Hostels: Accommodation is available for 64 students only against requirement of 113 as per Regulations. They are partly furnished. Visitors' room, A.C. study room with computer & Internet and recreation room are not available.
14. Residents' Hostel is under construction.
15. Residential Quarters for faculty & non-teaching staff are under construction.
16. Recreational facilities are not available.
17. Dean's office & Medical Superintendent's office in the hospital are only 18 sq.m. against requirement of 36 sq.m.
18. Speech therapy is not available.
19. Radiological & Laboratory investigations are inadequate on day of assessment.
20. MRD: It is partly computerized. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed for indexing.
21. ICUs: There was no patient in ICCU, MICU, NICU/PICU on day of assessment. In the whole month of December 2014, only 4 patients were admitted in NICU & PICU each.
22. There was no woman in labour Room on day of assessment.
23. Nursing staff: Only 84 Nurses are available against requirement of 175 as per regulations.
24. Paramedical staff: Only 60 paramedical staff are available against requirement of 100 as per Regulations.
25. MEU, College Council are not available.
26. Pharmaco Vigilance Committee is not constituted.
27. Website: Available information is sketchy.
28. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of permission for establishment of a new medical college at Akbarpur, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh by Rajiv Memorial Academic Welfare Society, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

12. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for Establishment of new medical college at Rohini, New Delhi, (Dr. BSA Medical College & Hospital) by Govt. of NCT of Delhi with an annual intake of 100 MBBS students under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of new medical college at Rohini, New Delhi, (Dr. BSA Medical College & Hospital) by Govt. of NCT of Delhi with an annual intake of 100 MBBS students under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (13th & 14th January, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of teaching faculty is 100 % as detailed in report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 73 % as detailed in report.
3. Teaching beds are deficient as under:

4. Wards: There are no Central pipelines. Demonstration Rooms are not available.
5. Bed occupancy is only 35.64 % on day of assessment.
6. College building is under construction.
7. Adequate office space for Dean's office & college office are not available.
8. Preclinical departments of Anatomy, Physiology & Biochemistry are not established.
9. Lecture theaters are under construction.
10. Central Library is under construction.
11. Students' hostels are not available.
12. Residential quarters for teaching faculty are not available.
13. OPD: Injection room for males/females are not available. Dressing room is common for males/females. Plaster cutting room is not separate.
14. MRD: It is partly computerized. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed for indexing.
15. Central clinical laboratory is not available.
16. ICUs: SICU has only 3 beds against requirement of 5.
17. Labour Room: There is no Eclampsia room.
18. Only 1 static X-ray machine is available against requirement of 2.
19. CSSD: Receiving & Distribution points are not separate. Staff is inadequate.
20. Canteen: It is non-functional.
21. Website: it is not available.
22. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above and as the applicant has failed to meet the qualifying criteria u/s 3(2)(5) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 pertaining to the person owning and managing a hospital of not less than 300 beds, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for establishment of a new medical college at Rohini, New Delhi, (Dr. BSA Medical College & Hospital) by Govt. of NCT of Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

13. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for Establishment of new medical college at Israna, Panipat, Haryana by Shanti Devi Charitable Trust, Pitampura, New Delhi with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Pandit Bhagwat Dayal Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of new medical college at Israna, Panipat, Haryana by Shanti Devi Charitable Trust, Pitampura, New Delhi with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Pandit Bhagwat Dayal Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council decided to defer the consideration of the matter.

14. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for Establishment of new medical college at Paripally, Dist. Kollam, Kerala by Employees' State Insurance Corporation, New Delhi with an annual intake of 100 MBBS students under Kerala University of Medical Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of new medical college at Paripally, Dist. Kollam, Kerala by Employees' State Insurance Corporation, New Delhi with an annual intake of 100 MBBS students under Kerala University of Medical Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (12th & 13th January, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty is 53.70 % as detailed in report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 52.08 % as detailed in report.
3. OPD: Separate registration counters for males/females are not available. Separate counters for OPD/IPD are not available. They are not computerized. Adequate examination rooms as required are not available. Some parts are under construction. Enquiry desk is not available. Dressing room is common for males & females. Proper Dressing room / Minor procedure room is not available in Ophthalmology OPD.
4. Bed occupancy is 56 % on day of assessment.
5. There is no delivery – normal or Caesarean – on day of assessment.
6. USG was not performed on day of assessment.
7. Histopathology workload is NIL both on day of assessment as well as in daily average.
8. Casualty: Only 7 beds are available against requirement of 10. Separate casualty for O.G. is not available. CMOs posted are inadequate.
9. O.T.s: Presently 3 O.T.s are in use against requirement of 4.

10. There is no Dean.
11. Preclinical departments of Anatomy, Physiology & Biochemistry are under construction and non-functional.
12. Dr. K. S. Solanki, Medical Superintendent does not possess any PG medical qualification and not eligible to hold the post of Medical Superintendent.
13. Lecture Theaters: There are no furniture or benches. Facility for E class is not available.
14. Central Library: Available books are 1,153 against requirement of 1,400. No journals are available. Staff is not available.
15. Central Photography Unit: Staff is not available. Equipment is inadequate.
16. Students' hostels are under construction.
17. Residents' hostel is under construction.
18. Nurses' hostel is under construction.
19. Speech therapy is not available.
20. MRD: It is manual. Statistician is not available.
21. ETO sterilizer is not available.
22. Intercom is not functional.
23. Nursing Staff: Only 98 Nurses are available against requirement of 175.
24. Paramedical staff: Only 52 are available against requirement of 100.
25. Website: Information is sketchy.
26. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of permission for establishment of a new medical college at Paripally, Dist. 10. There are no separate Departmentwise, Unitwise beds. No separate wards are available for individual specialties. All the bed are pooled currently.
11. MRD: It is manual. ICD X classification of diseases is not available for indexing. Staff is inadequate.
12. Central Clinical laboratory: Departmentwise arrangement is not available.
13. O.T.s: Two O.T.s have 2 tables which is not as per norms.

Dr. PD Gorav has submitted a letter that Dean as well as faculty has not been appointed for this college till date. Dr. PD Gorav, Nodal Officer and Civil Surgeon Dr. UR Mane, Additional Civil Surgeon has the SA II report. College has not prepared SA-I, Form A and Form B. Since there is no faculty available hence declaration forms are also not available. SA-I report alongwith DVDs of videography of hospital are being enclosed in sealed envelope."

2. Deficiency of faculty is 100 % as detailed in report.
3. Shortage of Residents is 100 % as detailed in report.
4. College has no land and no building.
5. OPD: Registration counters are not computerized. Only 1 examination room is available against requirement of 4 for each department. Teaching areas are not available. Enquiry desk is not available. Separate Injection room for males/females is not available. Separate Dressing room for males/females is not available. Minor O.T. is not available. In Orthopaedics OPD, Plaster room & Plaster cutting room are not available. In Ophthalmology OPD, Refraction room, Dark room, Dressing room are not available. Facilities are inadequate in Paediatrics & O.G. OPD.

10. Radiological & Laboratory investigations workload is inadequate.
11. MRD: It is manual. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed for indexing. Medical Records officer & Statistician are not available.

12. Casualty: Separate casualty for O.G. is not available. There is no separate dedicated medical staff for Casualty. Central suction is not available. Disaster Trolley, Defibrillator, Ventilator are not available.
13. Central Clinical Laboratory: Departmentwise segregation is not available.
14. O.T.: Each of 4 O.T. has 2 tables which is not as per norms.
15. ICUs: ICCU & SICU are not available.
16. Labour Room: Eclampsia room is not available.
17. Radiodiagnosis department: Only 1 static X-ray machine is available against requirement of 2 as per Regulations. AERB approval is not available.

19. CSSD: Staff is inadequate. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
20. Nursing staff: Only 109 Nursing staff is available against requirement of 175 as per Regulations.

10. OPD: Separate registration counters for OPD/IPD are not available. Teaching area has only 23 chairs. There are no audio visual facilities available. In Minor O.T., there are no emergency drugs and no record of operations done.

12. Wards: In Demonstration Rooms, audiovisual aids are not available. Pantry in General Medicine is not furnished.

19. Area of Common Rooms for Boys & Girls is less.
20. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

13. OPD attendance is 230 on day of assessment against requirement of 400.
14. Radiological & Laboratory investigations workload is inadequate.
15. MRD: It is manual. ICD X classification of diseases is not used for indexing.
16. Casualty: Only 2 beds are available against requirement of 10. Crash cart & Ventilator are not available. Separate casualty for O.G. is not available.
17. ICUs: SICU is not available.
18. AERB approval is not available.
19. Nursing staff: 134 Nurses are available against 175 required.
20. Website is not available.
21. Preclinical departments of Anatomy, Physiology & Biochemistry are not functional as the college building is under construction.
22. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

 11. Details of AERB approval are not provided.
 12. Lecture Theaters: facility for E class is not available.
 13. Central Library: Area is not provided. Staff is not available.
 14. Central Photography Section: Equipment & Staff are not available.
 15. Students' Hostels: They are non-functional. Visitors' room, A.C. study room with computer & Internet are not available.
 16. Residents' Hostel: It is under construction.
 17. Nurses' Hostel: It is under construction.
 18. Residential quarters for non-teaching staff are under construction.
 19. Speech therapy is not available.
 20. MRD: It is manual. ICD X classification of diseases is not used for indexing of diseases.
 21. Nursing Staff: Only 56 Nurses are available against requirement of 175 as per Regulations.
 22. Paramedical staff: Only 20 are available against requirement of 100 as per Regulations.
 23. Anatomy department: There are no specimens, models, MRI/CT films in the museum. Bone sets are not available. Cadavers are not available.
 24. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

6. Teaching & other facilities including Teaching Beds, OPD, Wards, MRD, Casualty, Central Clinical laboratory, O.T., ICUs, Labour Room,

Radiological facilities, etc. in the hospital have not been shown to assessors.

7. Clinical material has not been shown to assessors.
8. No information is provided about land availability & possession.
9. College building does not exist. No facilities are available.
10. Website is not available.
11. Form SAF I has not been filled by the college.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above and as the applicant has failed to meet the qualifying criteria u/s 3(2)(5) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 pertaining to the person owning and managing a hospital of not less than 300 beds, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for establishment of a new medical college at Almora, Uttarakhand by Govt. of Uttarakhand under HNB Uttarakhand Medical Education University, Dehradun to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

5. OPD: Registration counters are not computerized. Separate injection room for males/females is not available. Separate dressing room for males/females are not available. In Ophthalmology OPD, Dark Room and Dressing Room / Minor Procedure Room are not available.
6. Audiometry Room is neither A.C. nor soundproof. Speech therapy is not available.
7. Wards: Nursing station is placed in such a way that beds are not visible. Pantry & Store Room are not available in any ward.
8. There was no major operation done on day of assessment.
9. There was no delivery – normal or Caesarean – on day of assessment.
10. Radiological & USG workload is NIL.
11. Histopathology & Cytology workload is NIL.
12. Lecture Theater: Hospital lecture theater is not available.
13. Central Library: Journal Room & Photocopy room are not furnished and not functional. A.C. Computer Room with Medlar & Internet facility are not available.
14. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls: Attached toilets are not available.

28. Biochemistry department: Number of stools in the practical laboratory are inadequate. Instruments like pH meter, Spectrophotometer, Flame Photometer are not available.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Dehradun, Uttarakhand by Dr. Jagat Narain Subharti Charitable Trust, Dehradun, Uttarakhand with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna Uttarakhand Medical Education University, Dehradun u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (22nd & 23rd January, 2015) and noted the following:

1. OPD attendance was only 249 on day of assessment.
2. Bed occupancy was 13 % on day of assessment.
3. There was no delivery – normal or Caesarean – on day of assessment.
4. Radiological investigation workload is inadequate.
5. Laboratory Investigations: Proper registers are not maintained.
6. Record of clinical material & investigations of randomly selected dates in the past was not provided.
7. ICUs: There was no patient in ICCU, SICU, NICU/PICU on day of assessment.
8. Deficiency of faculty is 6 % as detailed in the report.
9. Shortage of Residents is 15 % as detailed in the report.

10. Students' Hostel: Accommodation is available for 110 students against requirement of 113 as per Regulations.
11. Residents' Hostel: It is under construction.
12. Nurses' Hostel: It is under construction.
13. Wards: Demonstration Room, Doctors' duty room, Pantry, Examination cum Treatment Room & Nursing Station are common for some wards.
14. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
15. Nursing Staff: Only 85 Nurses are available against requirement of 175 as per Regulations.
16. Paramedical Staff: Only 48 are available against requirement of 100 as per regulations.
17. Website: It is under construction.
18. Physiology department: Audiovisual aids are not available.
19. Biochemistry department: Furniture was inadequate in one Demonstration room.
20. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

The Executive Committee of the Council also noted that 3(three) complaints dated 29/01/2015 through email has been received from Maneeshvondn@gmail.com against Dr. Jagat Narayan Subharti Charitable Trust, Dehradun, Uttarakhand. The complainant claims to be Settlor & Chief Trustee of Sri Sri 1008 Charitable Trust and a Former Minister of Uttarakhand Government. He has made various allegations against the Jagat Narayan Trust including that the property held by is subject matter of litigation. The Committee noted that the Tehsildar, Vikas Nagar, Dehradun vide his Certificate dated 16.12.2014 has interalia stated that land held by the Jagat Narayan Trust is undisputed. Further, merit if any, in the allegations leveled in the complaints can be done by concerned authorities of the State Government.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Permission for establishment of a new medical college at Dehradun, Uttarakhand by Dr. Jagat Narain Subharti Charitable Trust, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna Uttarakhand Medical Education University, Dehradun u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

37. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Bhadwar, Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh by Heritage Hospitals, Ltd., Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Mahatma Gandhi Kashi Vidyapith, Varanasi u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Bhadwar, Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh by Heritage Hospitals, Ltd., Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Mahatma Gandhi Kashi Vidyapith, Varanasi u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (22nd & 23rd January, 2015) and noted the following :-

1. Wards: Nursing station is not available in some wards. Ancillary facilities like Pantry, Examination/Treatment room, Store room, Duty room are not available in some wards. Demonstration room is not available in some rooms.
2. There was only 1 normal delivery and NIL Caesarean section on day of assessment. Average normal deliveries are only 21/month (i.e. < 1/day) & Caesarean sections are 5/month (i.e. 0.16/day).

3. Radiological investigations are grossly inadequate both on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected dates.
4. Laboratory investigations are inadequate both on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected dates.
5. Casualty: Defibrillator is not available.
6. ICUs: There were only 2 patients on day of assessment in MICU.
7. Anatomy department: Mounted specimens are only 50. Only 2 cadavers are available.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Permission for establishment of a new medical college at Bhadwar, Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh by Heritage Hospitals, Ltd., Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh under Mahatma Gandhi Kashi Vidyapith, Varanasi u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

38. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Kaithal, Haryana by Dr. Puran Chand Dharmarth Trust, Gurgaon, Haryana with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak, Haryana u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Kaithal, Haryana by Dr. Puran Chand Dharmarth Trust, Gurgaon, Haryana with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak, Haryana u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council decided to defer the consideration of the matter.

39. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Indore, Madhya Pradesh by Shri Astha Foundation for Education Society, Indore with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Indore, Madhya Pradesh by Shri Astha Foundation for Education Society, Indore with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (21st & 22nd January, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty is 23.33 % as detailed in report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 97.70 % as detailed in report.
3. OPD attendance is 360 on day of assessment.
4. Bed occupancy is only 8.7 % on day of assessment.
5. There are only 3 Major & NIL Minor operations on day of assessment.
6. There was no delivery – Normal or Caesarean – on day of assessment.
7. Radiological & Laboratory Investigations workload is grossly inadequate. Investigations in Microbiology, Serology, Histopathology & Cytology were NIL.
8. Average Statistics given by the institute is inflated and does not correlate with patient statistics on day of assessment. In the ward registers, fake data is entered. A patient named Jyoti from Gynaecology ward was found

- to be a fake entry. Case sheets in wards are not written properly. Daily notes are not entered. In OPD, departmental registers are not maintained.
9. College building is under construction.
 10. Lecture Theaters: In one lecture theater, benches with capacity 180 is available. No other facilities are available. In second, no seating arrangement or other facilities are available.
 11. Central Library: It is under construction. Books and journals are kept in one separate room. Internet nodes are not available. Staff is inadequate.
 12. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls are under construction.
 13. Central photography Unit is not available.
 14. Students' Hostels: They are under construction.
 15. Residents' Hostel: It is not furnished. Mess is not available. Hygiene is poor. Visitors' room, A.C. study room with computer & Internet and Recreation room are not available. It is not occupied by Residents.
 16. Nurses' Hostel: Nursing College hostel is shown as Nurses' quarters.
 17. Residential quarters are under construction.
 18. OPD: Four examination rooms for various departments are not available. Teaching area is not available. In Ophthalmology OPD, Dressing Room/Minor Procedure Room is not available. Facilities in Paediatrics & O.G. OPD are not adequate.
 19. Audiometry & Speech Therapy is not available.
 20. Wards: Nursing stations are not located in a way which can have overview of all patients. Ancillary facilities like Examination cum treatment Room, Pantry, Store room are not available. Demonstration rooms are not available.
 21. MRD: ICD X classification is not followed on case sheets.
 22. Casualty: Separate casualty for O.G. is not available. Ventilator is not available.
 23. O.T.: Only 3 O.T.s are available against requirement of 5 as per Regulations. No Minor O.T. is available. Defibrillators are available.
 24. ICUs: ICCU & SICU are not available. In MICU, PICU/NICU, ABG Analyzer & Ventilator are not available. In PICU/NICU, there was no patient.
 25. Labour Room: Septic room & Eclampsia room are not available.
 26. CSSD is not available.
 27. Intercom is nonfunctional.
 28. Website: Information provided is sketchy. Citizens' charter is not available.
 29. Preclinical departments of Anatomy, Physiology & Biochemistry departments are under construction and not functional.
 30. With regard to the following faculty, it was found that they were doing private practice during working hours of the college which is not permissible as per Regulations. Hence they cannot be accepted as teaching faculty:

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Permission for establishment of a new medical college at Indore, Madhya Pradesh by Shri Astha Foundation for Education Society, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 and also to refer the matter with regard to the faculty found doing private practice during working hours of the college to the Ethics Committee of the Council.

40. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Chitradurga, Karnataka by Govt. of Karnataka with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Chitradurga, Karnataka by Govt. of Karnataka with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (19th & 20th January, 2015) and noted the following:

1. There is no establishment by the name of Government Medical College or Chitradurga Institute of Medical Sciences in the city of Chitradurga.
2. On visit to District Hospital, District Surgeon Dr. K. Jagdish informed that the State Government has planned to set up the new medical college in the premises of existing District Hospital only. However no documents were provided.
3. There is no Dean / Medical Superintendent / faculty / staff (technical & non-technical).
4. There is no college building. Construction work has not even started. District Surgeon showed a barren vacant piece of land where the proposed medical college is to come up. It was totally empty land, no sign board, no leveling, no excavation, no construction.
5. Later, District Surgeon got assessors telephonically connected to DME with whom assessors had detailed discussion. Assessors were informed by him that the State Government had postponed the plans to start new medical college at Chitradurga to 2016-2017 and it did not want to proceed with 2015-2016 project. The DME also informed that a communication has been sent to MCI in this regard.
6. After that the District Surgeon refused to share the hospital record and asked the team of assessors to stop inspection.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above and as the applicant has failed to meet the qualifying criteria u/s 3(2)(5) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 pertaining to the person owning and managing a hospital of not less than 300 beds, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for establishment of a new medical college at Chitradurga, Karnataka by Govt. of Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore, Karnataka to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

41. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for Establishment of new medical college at Port Blair, Andaman & Nicobar by U.T Anadaman & Nicobar Administration with an annual intake of 100 MBBS students under Pondicherry University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of new medical college at Port Blair, Andaman & Nicobar by U.T Anadaman & Nicobar Administration with an annual intake of 100 MBBS students under Pondicherry University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (22nd & 23rd January, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of teaching faculty is 81.4 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 100 % as detailed in the report.
3. College Council is yet to be formed.
4. Pharmaco-vigilance Committee is yet to be constituted.
5. Lecture Theater: Facility for E class is not available. There are no audiovisual aids in 1 theater.
6. Central Library: Area available is only 230 sq.m. against requirement of 1,600 sq.m. Capacity of Students' reading room (outside) and Student's reading room (inside) is 40 & 12 respectively against requirement of 100 each as per Regulations. Staff reading room is not available. Books are deficient by 34. No journals are available against requirement of 20 as per Regulations. Internet nodes are not available. Staff is inadequate.
7. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls: Not available.
8. Central Photography section is not available.
9. Students' Hostel: Boys' hostel is not furnished. Girls' hostel is partially furnished. Only space is available for mess. Visitors' room, A.C. study room with computer & Internet, Recreation room are not available.
10. Residential Quarters for faculty & non-teaching staff are not available.
11. The administrative experience of Dr. B.G. Lall is not mentioned in the D.F. Hence it is not possible to verify whether he is eligible to hold the post or not.
12. Area of Medical Superintendent's office is smaller than required as per Regulations.
13. OPD: There are only 2 examination rooms for each department against requirement of 4 as per Regulations. There are no teaching areas. Injection room is common for males/females. Dressing room is common for males/females. Minor O.T. is not available. In Orthopaedics OPD, Plaster room & Plaster cutting room are not available.
14. Teaching beds: There is no Unitwise distribution of beds in subjects of General Medicine, Paediatrics, General Surgery & Orthopaedics.
15. Wards: Distance between 2 beds is grossly inadequate. There are no Pantry and Doctors' duty room. Teaching areas are not available.
16. MRD: It is manual. ICD X classification of diseases is not used for indexing. Medical Records Officer and Statistician are not available.
17. Casualty: Only 7 beds are available against required 10 as per Regulations. Separate Casualty for Obstetrics is not available. Crash Cart, Ventilator are not available. Minor O.T. is not available.
18. Central Clinical Laboratory: Staff is inadequate.
19. O.T.: Central oxygen is not available.
20. ICUs: ICCU & SICU are not available.
21. Labour Room: Separate septic labour room & Eclampsia room are not available.
22. AERB approval is not available.
23. CSSD is not available.
24. Nursing Staff: There is deficiency of 6 Nurses.
25. Website: It is not available.
26. Preclinical departments of Anatomy, Physiology & Biochemistry are yet to be furnished and equipped and hence non-functional.
27. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Permission for establishment of a new medical college at Port Blair, Andaman & Nicobar by U.T Anadaman & Nicobar Administration under Pondicherry University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

42. Councils reply on draft audit para - Irregular up gradation of posts and incorrect fixation of Pay - req.

Read: the matter with regard to Councils reply on draft audit para - Irregular up gradation of posts and incorrect fixation of Pay - req.

The Executive Committee of the Council accepted the following report of the Sub-Committee meeting held on 30.01.2015:-

"The members perused the draft reply prepared by the office in respect of the audit objections raised by the office of Director General of Audit (Central Expenditure), Govt. of India. Dr. Ved Prakash Mishra explained that while preparing the draft reply 4 important letter/circulars were taken into consideration (1) Letter from Joint Secretary, Shri B.S. Lamba, Govt. of India, dated 26.10.1994 MOHFW regarding creation of new posts in MCI and revision of new pay scale of its staff stating that "If the MCI does not want Govt. Grants for the new posts/revised pay scales and can meet the expenditure out of its own resources, it may take its own decision in the matter"(2) Circular (Office Memorandum) from DOPT dated 25.05.1998 on the subject "Fifth Central Pay Commission's recommendations – Revision of pay scales – Amendment of Service Rules/Recruitment Rules" (3) Circular (Office Memorandum) from DOPT dated 24.03.2009; and (4) Office Memorandum from DOPT, Ministry of Public Grievances and Pensions, dated 07.09.2010.

Furthermore, in terms of the legal opinion dated 15.03.2013 furnished by Advocate Amit Kumar, the then Standing Counsel, MCI in response to the query as to whether "Confirmation can be done on posts which are not therein recruitment rules", it has been brought out that "perusal of sub-section 3 of section 9 confers the power on the MCI to create the posts. The said power has been given by Parliament to the MCI. Likewise, the power towards creation of posts is also vested in the MCI. As such, if the posts have been created by the Council and recruitments have been made on the basis of recruitment rules, services of such employees can be confirmed by the competent authority without their being any reference of the same in the recruitment rules.

It was also brought out that recruitment rules have been notified in the official gazette of Govt. of India vide authority vested in it in terms of Section 33(f) of the IMC Act, 1956.

During the impending period revision of pay scales of the employees of the Council have been raised on various decisions taken by the Executive Committee and General Body of the Council in terms of the said official communication/circular from the Govt. of India.

The draft reply to the audit objection be updated in terms of the position brought out hereinabove."

43. Digital Approach to Medical Education – Decisions of the MCI thereon.

Read: the matter with regard to Digital Approach to Medical Education – Decisions of the MCI thereon.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the matter with regard to Digital Approach to Medical Education and directed that a letter be sent to MedRC Edu Tech directing them to withdraw the said letter. Further, an Advisory be sent to all medical colleges from MCI.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided that the notice be placed on Website of MCI and also decided to constitute a Sub-Committee to examine the matter.

44. Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at VSS Medical College, Burla, Orissa for the academic session 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to Increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at VSS Medical College, Burla, Orissa for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (20th & 21st January, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of teaching faculty is 32 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 27.17 % as detailed in the report.
3. OPD: There are 2-3 Examination Rooms for each department against requirement of 4 as per Regulations. ECG room is not available. Dressing room for males/females is not separate. Plaster room & Plaster cutting room are not separate. Hygiene is not properly maintained. Minor O.T. has no sterility and is open to anybody from outside.
4. Teaching beds and Units are deficient as under:

5. Wards: Distance between 2 beds is less than 1.5 m as required. Hygiene is very poor.
6. OPD attendance is only 2,764 against minimum 3,000 required.
7. There are total only 20 major operations for the whole hospital on day of assessment.
8. Radiological investigation workload is inadequate.
9. O.T.s: Major O.T.s available are 10 against requirement of 11. All O.T.s are having 2 tables which is not as per norms.
10. Radiodiagnosis department: Only 4 static X-ray machines are functional on day of assessment against requirement of 6. AERB approval is available for only one machine.
11. Examination Hall cum Auditorium: New Examination Hall cum Auditorium complex is under construction.
12. Lecture Theaters: One lecture theater of capacity 650 is not available.
13. Central Library: Area available is 2,823 sq.m. against requirement of 4,000 sq.m. as per Regulations. Staff is inadequate.
14. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls are smaller than required.
15. Central Photography section is not available.
16. Students' Hostels: Accommodation available is for 791 students against requirement of 940 as per Regulations.
17. Interns' Hostel: Accommodation available is 182 Interns against requirement of 250 as per Regulations.
18. Dean's office is not available in the affiliated teaching hospital.
19. MRD: It is manual. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed for indexing. Medical Records Officer & Statistician are not available.
20. Casualty: Only 20 beds are available against requirement of 30. Medical officers available are less. Separate ICU for Obstetrics is not available.
21. CSSD: It is one big room of size 15'x15' having 2 horizontal autoclaves and nothing else which is inadequate. Staff is inadequate.
22. Anatomy department: Facilities are poorly maintained.

23. RHTC: letter for administrative control with Dean is not available. There is no ward.
24. UHC: Specialists' visits are not organized.
25. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, as the applicant college does not meet the Qualifying Criterion 6(b)(i) & 6(b)(ii) of Opening of New or Higher Courses of Study or Training (including Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) and increase of Admission Capacity in any course of Study or Training (including Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) (Amendment) Regulations, 2009 (Part-III) as number of teaching beds are 810 as against required 1100 and OPD attendance is 2,764 as against the required 3,000, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for increase in MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at VSS Medical College, Burla, Orissa under Sambalpur University u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 for academic year 2015-16 recommending disapproval of the scheme to the Central Govt. as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the Regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

45. Increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at Saraswati Institute of Medical Sciences, Hapur for the academic session 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to Increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at Saraswati Institute of Medical Sciences, Hapur for the academic session 2015-16 –

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (27th & 28th January, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. There is no meeting of Pharmaco Vigilance Committee in the previous year.
2. Examination hall cum Auditorium: Area available is 750 sq.m. against requirement of 800 sq.m. as per Regulations. Available capacity is 400 against requirement of 500.
3. Central Library: Area available is 1,800 sq.m. against requirement of 2,400 sq.m. Capacity of Reading room (outside) & Reading room (inside) is 140 & 135 respectively against requirement of 150 each as per regulations. More than 10 copies of many titles have been counted which is not permissible. Journals for 2014 are not available.
4. Wards: Space is less than 1.5 m. required as per Regulations. Audiovisual aids are not available in some demonstration rooms.
5. Bed occupancy is 67 % on day of assessment.
6. There are only total 16 major operations for the whole hospital on day of assessment which is inadequate.
7. There was no delivery – normal or Caesarean – on day of assessment.
8. ICUs: There was no patient in MICU & only 1 patient in SICU on day of assessment.
9. Labour Room: Space between 2 beds is inadequate.
10. Anatomy department: Number of catalogues in museum is inadequate.
11. Physiology department: Seating capacity in Clinical Physiology laboratory is inadequate.
12. Biochemistry department: Audiovisual aids are inadequate in demonstration room.
13. Audio visual aids are not adequate in departments of Microbiology, Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine and Community Medicine.
14. Shortage of Residents is 19 & as detailed in the report.
15. Dr. Mumtaz Sanghmitra, Professor of O.G. is also Member of Parliament and hence cannot be considered as full time faculty.

18. Shortage of Residents is 17.34 % (i.e. 17 out of 98) as under:
 - (a) Senior Resident: 15 (General Medicine: 4; Paediatrics: 1; Skin & VD: 1; Ophthalmology: 1; Anaesthesiology: 5; O.G.: 2; Dentistry: 1.)
 - (b) Junior Resident: 2 (General Medicine: 1)
19. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to increase of MBBS seats from 100 to 150 at Saraswati Institute of Medical Sciences, Hapur under Ch. Charan Singh University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

- (c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

47. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for Establishment of New Medical College at Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh by Shree Durga Maa Shiksha Seva Samiti, Kanpur with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University, Kanpur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

3. OPD attendance is 213 on day of assessment which is grossly inadequate.
4. Bed occupancy is 30 % on day of assessment which is grossly inadequate.
5. There was no delivery – normal or Caesarean – on day of assessment.
6. Radiological & laboratory investigations workload is grossly inadequate.
7. Histopathology & Cytopathology workload is NIL on day of assessment.
8. ICUs: There was only 1 patient in SICU on day of assessment.
9. CSSD: Staff is inadequate. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
10. Anatomy department: No cadavers are available.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

51. Teerthankar Mahaveer Medical College and Research Centre, Moradabad – Renewal of Permission for admission of 2nd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2015-16 – regarding.

Read: the matter with regard to Teerthankar Mahaveer Medical College and Research Centre, Moradabad – Renewal of Permission for admission of 2nd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (28th & 29th January, 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Teerthankar Mahaveer Medical and Research Centre, Moradabad under Teerthankar Mahaveer University, Moradabad for the academic year 2015-16.

The minutes of the above item were read and confirmed in the meeting itself.

52. Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, Bhubaneswar – Renewal of Permission for admission of 2nd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, Bhubaneswar – Renewal of Permission for admission of 2nd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessors report (27th & 28th January, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 29.68 % as detailed in the report. There was discrepancy in the salary amount mentioned in appointment order, emolument statement and Form 16.
2. Shortage of Residents is 96.33 % as detailed in the report. Many Residents are not staying in the hostel.
3. As many as 71 faculty & Residents as detailed in the report have submitted fake address proof of mobile bill. Original bill was not produced

- and the person could not tell mobile number mentioned on the respective bill. On dialing the number, there was no response.
4. Dr. Swati Banerjee, Tutor in Physiology; Dr. P.K. Sengupta, Tutor in Physiology and Dr. S. Sarkar, Tutor in Biochemistry have submitted fake salary certificates from the institute as they are inservice PG candidates also drawing salary from the Govt. of Odisha.
 5. OPD on day of assessment was 450 against requirement of 1000 as per Regulations.
 6. Bed occupancy was 28 % on day of assessment against requirement of 75 % as per Regulations.
 7. There were only 12 major & NIL Minor operations on day of assessment.
 8. Data given by the institute is grossly inflated.
 9. Lecture Theaters: Facility for E class is not available in lecture theatre of capacity 250 and also in Hospital lecture theater.
 10. Residents' Hostel: Residents & Students from Dental College are also staying. Resultantly, capacity is not adequate.
 11. Residential Quarters: No quarters are available for non-teaching staff.
 12. Wards: Wards are not as per Regulations. All so called wards are small / medium sized rooms with no one having bed capacity of 30. More than 90 % of these rooms do not have toilet facility. Doctors' duty room, Pantry, Examination cum Treatment room, Store Room & Demonstration Rooms are not available. Essential life saving medicines were not available.
 13. Casualty: Disaster Trolley, Emergency Drug Tray & Crash Cart are not available.
 14. Only 1 mobile X-ray & 3 static X-ray machines are available which are inadequate.
 15. Pathology department: Only 3 catalogues are available in the museum.
 16. Students' Hostels: Study room is not air-conditioned. In Boys' hostels, students from Dental & Nursing colleges are staying.
 17. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 2nd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 of Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, Bhubaneswar under KIIT University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016 and further decided to apply clauses 8(3)(1)(c) & 8(3)(1)(d) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

If it is observed during any regular inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <80%, such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses."

In view of above, it was decided not to consider the institute for renewal of permission/recognition for award of MBBS degree/processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years i.e. that academic year (i.e. 2015-16) and the next academic year (i.e. 2016-2017) and to *issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.*

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to refer the matter to the Ethics Committee.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to intimate the Postgraduate Section of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) for this Institute for information and further necessary action.

The minutes of the above item were read and confirmed in the meeting itself.

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats from 100 to 150 u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 in respect of Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun Uttarakhand under H.N.B. Garwhal University for academic year 2015-16.

The minutes of the above item were read and confirmed in the meeting itself.

54. Increase in MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at MKCG Govt. Medical College, Berhampur for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the matter with regard to Increase in MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at MKCG Govt. Medical College, Berhampur for the academic year 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered fax letter dated 28.01.2015 received from the Under Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi where he has referred to the letter No. ME.I.IM-01/2011(pt.) 32325/H dated 26.12.2014, received from the Commissioner-Cum-Secretary, Govt. of Odissa, requesting to consider their

application for increase in MBBS seats from 150 to 250 at MCKG Govt. Medical College, Berhampur, Odisha.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 16.12.2014 since no fee has been received with the application for the academic year 2015-16.

55. Establishment of New Medical College at Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh by Gandhi Institute of Technology and Management (GITAM), Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (29th & 30th January, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty is 17 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 31 % on day of assessment.

3. OPD attendance is only 205 against requirement of 400 as per Regulations.
4. Bed occupancy is only 21 % against requirement of 60 % as per Regulations.
5. There were only 2 Major & 2 Minor operations on day of assessment.
6. There was no delivery – normal or Caesarean – on day of assessment.
7. Radiological & Laboratory investigations workload is grossly inadequate.
8. Previous data of clinical material have not been submitted by the institute.
9. Casualty: Separate casualty for Obstetrics is not available.
10. ICUs: There was no patient in ICCU, SICU, PICU/NICU and only 1 patient in MICU on day of assessment.
11. Nursing Staff: Only 96 Nurses are available against requirement of 175 as per Regulations.
12. Paramedical Staff: Only 24 are available against requirement of 101 as per Regulations.
13. There is no boundary or land earmarked for the medical college. Engineering College, Dental College, Pharmacy College, Law College are located in the same campus. Hence it cannot be verified that a unitary plot of 20 Acres is available.
14. Lecture Theaters: facility for E class is not available.
15. Students' Hostels: Accommodation is available for only 48 boys against requirement of 75 as per Regulations. No separate hostel for girls of medical college is available. It is semi-furnished. Mess is not furnished. In Boys' hostel, ground floor is used by Residents. Ancillary facilities of Visitors Room are partly available.
16. Residents' Hostel: Separate hostel is not available. Accommodation is provided for 32 Residents against requirement of 42 as per Regulations. Ancillary facilities are not available.
17. Nurses' Hostel: Accommodation is provided for 30 Nurses only against requirement of 35 as per Regulations. It is semi furnished. Toilet facilities are inadequate. Mess is not available.
18. Residential Quarters: No quarters for non-teaching staff are available.
19. Website: It is under construction.
20. Anatomy department: Embalming room is not available. Only 49 specimens are available in the museum. MRI/CT films are not available.
21. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

3. Biochemistry department: Laboratories and faculty offices are not furnished.
4. Central Library: Space is available but not furnished. Only 300 books are available against requirement of 150. Journals & Internet Nodes are not available.
5. Lecture Theaters: Facility for E class is not available.
6. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls are not furnished.
7. Students' Hostels: They are not furnished. Mess is not available. Ancillary facilities like Visitors' room, A.C. study room, recreation room are not available.
8. Residents' Hostel: it is not furnished.
9. Nurses' Hostel: It is not furnished.
10. OPD: Only 2 examination rooms are available in General Surgery and 1 each in General Medicine against requirement of 4 rooms in each department. Teaching areas are not available.
11. Audiometry & Speech therapy are not available.
12. Casualty: Disaster Trolley is not available.
13. O.T.: O.G. O.T. has 2 tables which is not as per norms.
14. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Permission for establishment of a new medical college at Junagadh, Gujarat by Gujarat Medical Education & Research Society, Gujarat students under Saurashtra University, Rajkot u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

59. Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for Establishment of New Medical College at Himmatnagar, Gujarat by Gujarat Medical Education & Research Society, Gujarat with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University, Patan u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

Read: the matter with regard to Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for establishment of New Medical College at Himmatnagar, Gujarat by Gujarat Medical Education & Research Society, Gujarat with an annual intake of 150 MBBS students under Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University, Patan u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (28th & 29th January, 2015) and noted the following:

1. Lecture Theaters: They are under construction.
2. Central Library: It is under construction.
3. College building is under construction.
4. Students' Hostels: They are under construction.
5. Residents' Hostel: It is under construction.
6. Residential Quarters: They are under construction.
7. OPD: Separate registration counters are not available. Waiting area for patients is inadequate. There is only 1 examination room in each department instead of 4 required as per Regulations. Teaching areas are not available. Injection room for males/females is common. Minor O.T. is

- not available. Dressing room is common for males/females. Facilities are inadequate in Paediatrics & O.G. OPD.
8. Audiometry room is neither air-conditioned nor sound proof. Speech Therapy is not available.
 9. Wards: There are no patients in Psychiatry, Skin & VD, Ophthalmology & ENT. Examination room, Pantry, Store room, Doctors' duty room are not available in any ward. Demonstration rooms are not available in any ward.
 10. There was no Major operation and 2 Minor operations on day of assessment.
 11. USG workload is NIL on day of assessment.
 12. Histopathology workload is 1 & Cytology workload is 2 on day of assessment.
 13. Casualty: Ventilator is not available.
 14. O.T.: There is only 1 Minor O.T. against requirement of 2. Infusion Pumps are not available. Defibrillator & Ventilator are not available. At the time of assessment, no surgery was being performed in any O.T.
 15. Central Oxygen & Central Suction are not available.
 16. ICUs: ABG Analyzer is not available.
 17. One static X-ray machine is not working. Hence only 1 is available against requirement of 2. There is no USG in Radiodiagnosis department as both the machines are in O.G. department.
 18. CSSD: Receiving & distribution points are not separate. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
 19. Intercom is not available.
 20. Website: It is under construction.
 21. Preclinical departments of Anatomy, Physiology & Biochemistry are under construction and non functional.
 22. Shortage of Residents is 15.5 % as detailed in the report.
 23. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Permission for establishment of a new medical college at Himmatnagar, Gujarat by Gujarat Medical Education & Research Society, Gujarat under Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University, Patan u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.
