Read: the matter with regard to Item 15 of the Minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 04th March, 2016: Note from Legal Section regarding Indian Optometry Federation V/s Government of India & Ors.- Writ Petition (Civil) No. 5577 of year 2015 in the Hon'ble Delhi High Court at New Delhi - referred back by Executive Committee meeting held on 28th April, 2016.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the following legal opinion of the Law Officer of the Council:-

It is to be noted that the right to practice medicine is a statutory right conferred by Section 15 of the IMC Act, 1956. Such right is conferred upon those holding recognized medical qualification under the IMC Act, 1956 and enrolled on the State Medical Register. The minimum registerable qualification for enrolment on State Medical Register is MBBS (or its equivalent). Appendix B of the Graduate Medical Education Regulation lays down a comprehensive list of skills recommended as desirable for Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) Graduate. Concerning Ophthalmic procedure following is laid down:

IX. Ophthalmic Procedures:

- (a) To invert eye-lids;
- (b) To give Subconjunctival injection;
- (c) To perform appellation of eye-lashes;
- (d) To measure the refractive error and advise correctional glasses;
- (e) To perform nasolacrimal duct syringing for patency

The right to provide treatment to patients for eye ailments at primary level by Optometrist, thus, is not permissible as it forms integral component of right to practice medicine that is statutorily available only to holders of recognized medical qualification enrolled on State Medical Register.+

The Executive Committee after due and detailed deliberations, decided to approve the opinion of Law Officer.

6. **Item 9 of the Minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 04th March, 2016: Sub: Editorial published in the Indian Journal of Medical Ethics, vol. XII No. 4 October-December 2015 titled 'Regressive trend: MCI's approach to assessment of medical teachers'.**

Read: the matter with regard to item 9 of the Minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 04th March, 2016: Sub: Editorial published in the Indian Journal of Medical Ethics, vol. XII No. 4 October-December 2015 titled 'Regressive trend: MCI's approach to assessment of medical teachers'

The Members of the Executive Committee perused the report of Academic Committee & the Editorial published in Indian Journal of Medical Ethics, Vol. XII, No. 4 and observed as under:

- (1) Many a times multiple authors whose contribution to the research is either minimal or even NIL are included; hence it would be prudent to restrict to 1st / 2nd author.
- (2) It has been observed that there is a big problem of connectivity in almost the whole country; in such circumstances, downloading these journals and their readership and referrals cannot be established. Till reasonably good connectivity across India is available, e Journals cannot be included in the list of acceptable journals.
- (3) With regard to Vancouver system of citation, it was observed that not all journals have accepted the system. Therefore present system of following citation as prescribed by the journal may be continued.
- (4) MCI is an independent Statutory body established for Regulation of Medical Education. Its function is limited but specialized in the field of Medical Education which is not the case with UGC which caters to all disciplines. With regard to Medical Education, MCI is fully competent body to frame its own Regulations which may not be in full consonance with UGC guidelines.

- (5) Case reports, review articles, etc. though being of academic interest do not contribute to research. The emphasis behind this Regulation is to promote research in medical colleges & therefore emphasis is on Research Publications.
- (6) With regard to not considering Impact Factor, it was observed that after many deliberations, even the Science & Technology Committee of House of Commons has concluded that research institutions should be cautious not to attach too much weight to publication in high impact factor journals when assessing individuals for career progression. Doubts have been expressed about genuineness of impact factor.

In view of above, after detailed deliberations, it was decided by the Executive Committee to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting dt. 28/04/2016 which reads as under:

“Members of Executive Committee observed and decided that in the minutes of Academic Committee the salient points of the article are not incorporated. With regard to inclusion of Corresponding author, many a times his name is 5th or 6th in the list of authors and therefore the present practice of limiting consideration to 1st & 2nd author only may be continued. With regard to Vancouver system of citation, it was observed that not all journals have accepted the system. Therefore present system of following citation as prescribed by the journal may be continued.”

12. Central Library: Available seating capacity of StudentsqSeating room (Outside) is 184 against requirement of 200.
13. StudentsqHostels: Ancillary facilities are inadequate in Visitorsqroom. Computers & Internet Nodes are not available in Study room.

14. Central Research Laboratory: There is no functional equipment.

7. Casualty: Separate Casualty for O.G. is not available.
8. Radiodiagnosis department: Available Mobile X-ray machines are 3 against requirement of 4 & static machines available are 3 against requirement of 5.
9. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
10. StudentsqHostels: Visitorsqroom in BoysqHostel is not furnished.
11. ResidentsqHostel: It is in worst condition.
12. Residential Quarters: There are no separate quarters for faculty & Non-teaching staff. Total 48 quarters are available against combined requirement of 21 + 36 = 57 quarters.
13. Detailed Information about Teaching Programme is not complete.
14. RHTC: It is under control of Director, Health & not under Dean. Students are not posted. Residential accommodation is under construction. Specialistsqvisits are not organized.
15. UHC: It is under control of Director, Health & not under Dean. Students are not posted. Specialistsqvisits are not organized.
16. Website: Information provided is sketchy. It is not uploaded regularly.
17. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

14. O.T.s: Available Post-operative beds are NIL.

16. There was NIL woman in Labour Room.
17. There are only 2 Static X-ray machines available against requirement of 5.
18. Blood Bank: NIL unit was dispensed on day of assessment.
19. ETO Sterilizer is not functional.
20. Studentsq Hostel: Dental & Medical students share the same hostel. Boysq hostel is common for Medical, Dental, Physiotherapy students.
21. Nursing Staff: 202 Nurses are available against requirement of 247.
22. Pathology department: Studentsq Laboratory facilities are inadequate.
23. Website: Information provided is sketchy. Citizensq charter is not available.
24. Letter from assessors was perused & the following was observed:

Item 12. Request for confirmation of eligibility for the post of Associate Professor in the department of Obst. &Gynae in respect of Dr. R. Sankareswari in a medical college.

Referred back to Sub-Committee. It is not shown what is her academic qualification, from where she has acquired that qualification, what is her experience as Asst. Prof., whether her publications are eligible for consideration for promotion. Matter be resubmitted after incorporating above details & taking appropriate decision.

Item 13. Request for confirmation of eligibility for the post of Professor & HOD in the department of Biochemistry in respect of Dr. Shashikant Vasant Nikam in a Medical College.

Approved.

Item 14. Request for confirmation of eligibility for the post of Professor in the Department of Physiology in respect of Dr. Arghya Sur in a Medical College.

Not approved. Retrospective changes are not permissible. If the teaching experience is deficient, she is not eligible for appointment as Professor. This be communicated to Dr. Arghya Sur.

Item 15. Request for confirmation of eligibility for the post of Assistant Professor in department of Orthopedics in respect of Dr .Rakesh Kumar in Medical College.

Referred back to Sub-Committee to ascertain whether he has got experience as Resident for 3 y in a medical college department of O.G. before appointment as Senior Resident or not. If not, his appointment as Senior Resident is not as per Regulations. Matter to be resubmitted after taking appropriate decision in the matter considering above factor.

Item 16. Complaint made by Dr. Amal Kumar Bhattacharya with regard to fraud committed on MCI through forgery and false declaration by a teacher and Dean of M. P. Shah Medical College, and violation of MCI rules and regulations by them.

Approved.

Item 17. Deletion of post of Lecturer in Pharmaceutical Chemistry in the Department of Pharmacology as prescribed in the %Minimum Qualifications for Teachers in Medical Institutions Regulations, 1998+

Noted.

Item 18. Compliance with Order dated 3.12.2015 W.P. No. 335 of 2012 . Swati SinkuKujurVs. State of Chhattisgarh &Ors in the matter of appointment for the post of Assistant Professor in the department of Ophthalmology by the Chhattisgarh Public Service Commission, Raipur (C.G.).

Approved.

Note: It be ascertained from Legal section whether any time limit has been set by Hon'ble High Court for MCI to decide in the matter. If so, decision be taken within that time limit and matter be submitted.

Item 19. Confirmation of eligibility for the post of Professor in the department of Nephrology in respect of Dr.Manjunath S. Shetty in a medical college.

Approved.

36. Complaint against misconduct of Dr. U.C. Garga of PGMER & RML Hospital, New Delhi.

Read: the matter with regard to complaint against misconduct of Dr. U.C. Garga of PGMER & RML Hospital, New Delhi.

The Executive Committee perused the report of Sub-Committee which reads as under:

1. *“Dr.U.C.Garg was appointed on specialist Grade II post of Radiologist in the non-teaching specialist sub cadre of CHS and posted in Poly Clinic (KheI Gaon) in April, 1986 (copy of appointment order – **Annexure I**).*
2. *He was transferred to RML Hospital, New Delhi on 3.12.2003. (copy of transfer order – **Annexure II**)*
3. *As per Notification dated 15.3.2005 equated teaching designations could be given only to those who had the experience of working for a period of not less than 18 years and 10 years in the teaching and other general departments in institutions or hospitals, not attached to any Medical College, where with the affiliation from any University, postgraduate teaching is being imparted as contemplated under sub-regulation (1A) of Regulation 8, shall respectively be eligible to be equated as Professor and Associate Professor respectively in the Department concerned. Notification dated 15.3.2005 is reproduced below and enclosed as **Annexure III**.*

“(d) Consultants of specialists who have the experience of working for a period of not less than 18 years and 10 years in the teaching and other general departments in the institutions or hospitals, not attached to any medical college, where with the affiliation from any university, postgraduate teaching is being imparted as contemplated under sub-regulation (1A) of regulation 8, shall respectively be eligible to be equated as Professor and Associate Professor in the department concerned. The requisite experience for equating a Consultant or Specialist working in the super-specialty departments of the said institutions or hospitals as Professor and Associate Professor shall respectively be 16 years and 8 years. Consultants or Specialists having postgraduate degree qualification, working in such an institution or hospital, who do not have the said period of experience, shall be eligible to be equated as Assistant Professor in the department concerned.”

4. *It is stated that he was given additional part time attachment in RML Hospital, New Delhi vide order dated 9.7.1986 (copy not available) and this seems to be the basis on which Dr.C.P.Singh and Dr.N.K. Chaturvedi, Medical Superintendents of RML Hospital issued certificates to Dr.U.C.Garga that he worked in RML Hospital from July, 1986 onwards and probably these certificates were the basis on which he was given equated teaching designation by GGSIP University, New Delhi. Copies of these two certificates enclosed as **Annexure IV & Annexure V**.*

However, Medical Council of India does not consider any part-time/additional attachment for experience. It has to be full time.

In view of the above, the Committee is of the considered opinion that Dr. U.C.Garg had shifted to RML Hospital, New Delhi full time only on 3.12.2003 and he was not entitled to be given equated teaching designation of Professor or Associate Professor in 2005. The recommendations of TEQ dated 7.11.2014 and approved by the Executive Committee on 20.11.2014 are in order. This is for information and considered decision of Executive Committee.”

After detailed deliberations, the Executive Committee decided to approve report of sub-committee and office was directed to communicate the decision to all parties.

37. Pre-PG Assessment – Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Indira Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Puducherry under Pondicherry University.

Read: the matter with regard to Pre-PG Assessment . Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Indira Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Puducherry under Pondicherry University.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Assessment report (2nd and 3rd June, 2016) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 40.7 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 11.7 % as detailed in the report.
3. Bed occupancy is 64 % on day of assessment.
4. Radiodiagnosis department: Only 4 Mobile X-rays are available against requirement of 6. Only 2 USG machines are available against requirement of 3.
5. Central Research Laboratory is not available.
6. Nursing staff: Only 187 Nurses are available against requirement of 372.
7. Paramedical & Non-teaching staff: 153 Paramedical & Non-teaching staff are available against requirement of 182.
8. Central Library: It is not air-conditioned. Available books are 10,432 against 11,000 required. 88 Journals are available against requirement of 100. There is no Librarian.
9. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls do not have attached toilets.
10. StudentsqHostels: Visitorsqroom, Study room & Recreation room are not properly furnished.
11. ResidentsqHostel: There is no accommodation within campus.
12. NursesqHostel: It is not available.
13. Residential Quarters: NIL quarters are available in the campus.
14. Anatomy department: Cold storage facility for storage of dead bodies is not available in the department.
15. Physiology department: Size of Mammalian laboratory is smaller than required.
16. Community Medicine department: Only 1 Demonstration room is available against requirement of 2.
17. RHTC: Mess is not available.
18. MEU: Facilities are inadequate.
19. Central Photography Section is not functional.
20. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to grant one month time to the institute to submit the compliance on rectification of deficiencies to the Council.

38. Continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Manipal Academy of Higher Education (Deemed University), Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore.

Read: the matter with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Manipal Academy of Higher Education (Deemed University), Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore.

The Executive Committee considered the assessment report 25th & 26th May, 2016 and noted as under:-

1. Wards: Wards & beds are located in 3 hospitals. Distance between 2 beds is < 1.5 m required as per Regulations. Wards are not as per MSR Regulations. Teaching space is inadequate.
2. General Surgery operations are less on day of assessment.
3. Casualty: Separate Casualty for O.G. is not available in college's own hospital.
4. O.T.s: There is only 1 General Surgery O.T. in college's own hospital. There is no Emergency O.T. in either College hospital or in Govt. hospital.
5. ICUs: There were only 2 patients in ICCU on day of assessment.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Manipal Academy of Higher Education (Deemed University), Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance of rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

39. Matter with regard to holding of meeting of Raghavan Committee.

Read: the matter with regard to holding of meeting of Raghavan Committee.

The Executive Committee considered the matter with regard to holding of meeting of Raghavan Committee.

The Executive Committee observed that the Council vide its letter dated 8/12/14 has informed to Shri S.Shankar, Deputy Secretary, Ministry of HRD as under:-

With reference to your E-mail dated 2nd December, 2014 and telephonic conversation with Dr.Ajay Kumar, Chairman, Administrative & Grievance Committee of Medical Council of India, I am directed to inform you that this Council agree with your proposal to postpone the proposed meeting of the Anti-Ragging Monitoring Committee which was scheduled to be organized by MCI on 18th of December, 2014 to 2nd week of January, 2015 in view of your heavy engagement during the winter session of the Parliament as informed by you. Your proposal to hold the meeting in Chennai shall be discussed in the meeting of the Administrative & Grievance Committee of this Council and you will be informed accordingly.

With regard to payment of TA/DA to out station non-government members and transportation to local members, we are unable to bear the said expenditure. In case if there is a meeting of Anti-Ragging Monitoring Committee in near future, the Medical Council of India may be invited where the team of MCI- Anti-Ragging Monitoring Committee Cell shall attend to apprise about our activities in the matter and also will try to answer all the queries of the members on the issues which has not been addressed by us properly due to the reasons which shall be explained when we will present the report of the Anti-Ragging Cell of this Council.+

The Committee further observed that a meeting of the Coordination Group of Ragging Cell of UGC was held on 4/1/2016 and on receipt of the same from the UGC the minutes were placed before the Admin & Grievance Committee of this

Council at its meeting held on 8/3/16 and *“the Committee decided to refer the matter to the Executive Committee for further decision in this matter and further observed that there is no precedence of holding such kind of meeting with different organizations which do not fall under the protocol of the Council.”*

In view of above, it was decided to obtain opinion of Legal Officer and office was directed to resubmit the matter with legal opinion.

40. Updation of status of Subharti Medical College, Meerut in MCI website.

Read: the matter with regard to updation of status of Subharti Medical College, Meerut in MCI website.

The Executive Committee considered the matter with regard to updation of status of Subharti Medical College, Meerut in MCI website and observed that MBBS degree of Subharti Medical College, Meerut is recognized Medical qualification when degree granted by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra from 2006 onwards.

It is observed from the available records that the college authorities had applied for change of affiliation of University from Dr.B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra to Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut through the Central Govt. in 2011. However, as per procedure, the college authorities have to apply for the change of University through the Central Govt. at the time of first batch of students appearing in the final MBBS examination under the new University u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956. As per record first batch of MBBS students were admitted in the 2008-2009 batch under Swami Vivekanand Subharti University.

But as per available records till date, the Council has not received any request for change of affiliation u/s 11(2) from the Registrar, Swami VivekanandSubharti University through Central Government.

Further, the recognition of the increased intake u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 is under consideration of the Council.

In view of above, it was decided that there cannot be any change in the status till the Council receives any request for change of affiliation u/s 11(2) from the Registrar, Swami Vivekanand Subharti University through Central Government or the increased intake is recognized by the Council in accordance with provisions of Section 11(2) of IMC Act, 1956.

41. Consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr. Vasantrao Pawar Medical College & Hospital & Research Centre, Nashik.

Read: the matter with regard to consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr. Vasantrao Pawar Medical College & Hospital & Research Centre, Nashik.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (1st June,2016) along with previous assessment reports (11th September, 2014 & 9-10, May, 2013) and noted as under:-

1. Bed occupancy is 66 % on day of assessment.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr. Vasant Rao Pawar Medical College & Hospital & Research Centre, Nashik and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016, which reads as under:-

8(3)(1)ö ..

(c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

If it is observed during any inspection/assessment of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <70%, compliance of rectification of deficiency from such an institute will not be considered for issue of renewal of permission in that Academic year and further such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in that Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 along with direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.+

In view of above, it was decided not to consider the Institute for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the current Academic year (2017-18) and to issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, along with direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance of rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to intimate the Postgraduate Section of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) for this Institute for information and further necessary action.

42. Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalai University- Change the status.

Read: the matter with regard to Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalai University- Change the status.

The Executive Committee perused the letter dated 28.04.2016 from the Registrar I/c, Raja Muthiah Medical College, Tamil Nadu, operative part of which reads as under:

“.... I request you to kindly arrange to change the status of the Rajah Muthiah Medical College from Management college i.e. “Trust” to “Government”. It is also requested that Rajah Muthiah Medical College may please be brought under the category of “Government” and treated on par with other Govt. Medical Colleges for all procedures.”

The Committee decided to accede to request of the institute and the office was directed to change the status of the institute accordingly.

43. Continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Tripura University, Suryamaninagar in respect of students being trained at

Tripura Medical College & Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Memorial Teaching Hospital, Agartala.

Read: the matter with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Tripura University, Suryamaninagar in respect of students being trained at Tripura Medical College & Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Memorial Teaching Hospital, Agartala.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the inspection report (30th & 31st May, 2016) and decided to recommend that recognition of MBBS degree granted by Tripura University, Suryamaninagar in respect of students being trained at Tripura Medical College & Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Memorial Teaching Hospital, Agartala be continued restricting the number of admission to 100 (One Hundred) students.

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April, 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ð

- (2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.
- (3) The procedure for ~~Renewal~~of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.
- (4) Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute.

The Committee decided to place the matter before the General Body of the Council.

44. Continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Sree Uthradom Thiurnal Academy of Medical Sciences, Thiruvanthapuram.

Read: the matter with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Sree Uthradom Thiurnal Academy of Medical Sciences, Thiruvanthapuram.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment report (30th and 31st May, 2016) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 30.47 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 85.07 % as detailed in the report.
3. Very few Residents are staying in the campus.
4. OPD attendance was only 408 on day of assessment.
5. Bed occupancy is 51.27 % on day of assessment.
6. CT Scan was out of order on day of assessment.
7. Workload of Special investigations like Ba, IVP was NIL on day of assessment.
8. Workload of Histopathology was only 02 & of Cytopathology was only 02 on day of assessment.
9. Casualty: Available beds are 16 against requirement of 20. Separate Casualty for O.G. is not available. Mobile X-ray unit is not working. There is no Ventilator.
10. O.T.: Available Pre-operative beds are only 02 & Post-operative beds are only 04 which are inadequate.

11. Radiodiagnosis department: Only 2 Mobile X-ray machines are available against requirement of 4. Only 2 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5. Only 2 USG machines are available against requirement of 3; out of which only 1 is functional.
 12. Blood Component Separation facility is not available.
 13. ETO Sterilizer is not functional.
 14. OPD: Teaching areas are inadequate.
 15. Audiometry room is not air-conditioned. Speech Therapist is not available.
- Central Research Laboratory is not available.
16. Nursing staff: Only 146 Nurses are available against 247 required.
 17. Nursing stations are not available in most of the wards.
 18. Lecture Theaters: Only 3 Lecture Theaters are available against requirement of 4. Lecture Theater in the hospital has capacity of 100 against requirement of 150.
 19. Central Library: It is not air-conditioned. 79 Journals are available against requirement of 100. Only 7 Internet Nodes are available; 3 Internet Nodes are not functional.
 20. NursesqHostel: Hygiene is poor.
 21. Residential Quarters: NIL quarters are available for faculty or Non-teaching staff in the campus.
 22. Capacity of Demonstration Room in Biochemistry is only 25 which is inadequate.
 23. Pathology department: Catalogues are not available in Museum.
 24. Microbiology department: Only 3 Service Laboratories are available against 7 required. Ancillary facilities are inadequate.
 25. RHTC: It is under control of State Govt. & not under Dean. Residential accommodation is not available.
 26. UHC: It is under control of State Govt. & not under Dean. Specialistsq visits are not organized.
 27. Several lifts in college & hospital buildings are not functional.
 28. Website: Citizensqcharter is not available.
 29. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Sree Uthradom Thiurnal Academy of Medical Sciences, Thiruvanthapuram and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016, which reads as under:-

8(3)(1)ö ..

- (c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

If it is observed during any inspection/assessment of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <70%, compliance of rectification of deficiency from such an institute will not be considered for issue of renewal of permission in that Academic year and further such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in that Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 along with direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.+

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to intimate the Postgraduate Section of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) for this Institute for information and further necessary action.

45. Pre-PG Assessment – Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Tagore Medical College & Hospital, Chennai under the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

Read: the matter with regard to Pre-PG Assessment . Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Tagore Medical College & Hospital, Chennai under the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Assessment report (2nd and 3rd June, 2016) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 29.45 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of residents is 40.47 % at time of visit.
3. Bed occupancy was only 08.15 % on day of assessment.
4. Girlsqcommon room does not have attached toilets.
5. Wards: Most of the wards of General Medicine & allied specialties and General Surgery & allied specialties were not functional on day of assessment. Pantry, Store room, Treatment room, Doctorsq duty room were not functional and were found locked at time of assessment. In a few wards, Pillows were kept stacked in Pantry. All Nursing stations were not functional. Nursing staff was inadequate.
6. Data of clinical material, OPD attendance, Casualty attendance, Number of admissions and discharge, Radiological & Laboratory investigations as provided by institute are highly inflated. There were very few patients at 09:30 a.m. in OPD.
7. There were only 04 Major & 1 Minor operation on day of assessment.
8. There was NIL Normal Delivery & NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment. Last Normal Delivery as verified from Birth register was on 30/05/2016 & Last LSCS was on 28/05/2016.
9. In Histopathology register, entry of specimens of 18 patients were received on 01/06/2016 . i.e. a day prior to day of assessment. On verification, not a single specimen could be located.
10. Casualty: No CMO was present at time of visit. Sterilized tray of instruments was dated 24/03/2016 . i.e. > 2 months.
11. O.T.: Out of 2 Post-operative rooms, 1 was locked at time of visit. In the 2nd room, there were only 2 patients who were operated on previous day.
12. ICUs: PICU was locked at time of visit. There was NIL patient in ICCU. There were only 2 patients in SICU.
13. CSSD: No record available for 02/06/2016 . i.e. day of assessment.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation

(Amendment),2010(Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016, which reads as under:-

8(3)(1)ö ..

(c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

If it is observed during any inspection/assessment of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <70%, compliance of rectification of deficiency from such an institute will not be considered for issue of renewal of permission in that Academic year and further such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in that Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956 along with direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.+

Approved with modification that Registration under section14(1) be issued by the office with the approval of the Chairman REC committee.

Members of the Executive Committee observed that Certificate in Interventional Cardiology is not a Diplomat degree conferred by American Board. It is an added qualification; but it is not stated whether the said qualification is awarded after passing an examination or not.
