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The Executive Committee further perused the proceedings of the Ethics Committee meetings held on 21st & 22nd December, 2017, 11th & 12th January, 2018 and 24th & 25th January, 2018 and observed as under:-

1.	The matter with regard to RTI Application filed by Sh. BabuLal Prasad, Patna, Bihar forwarded by Sh. Yashovardhan Azad, Commissioner, CIC, New Delhi – reg.	21 st & 22 nd December, 2017
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The Executive Committee while approving the proceedings of the Ethics Committee directed the office that communications be sent to bring notice of all Health Secretaries of the respective State Medical Councils in their States. A copy of the communication be sent to CIC as well.

4.	Implementation of the World Medical Association (WMA) policy statement on participation of doctors in executions – reg.	24 th & 25 th January
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The Executive Committee observed as under:

- (1) It appears that the matter has been considered by Ethics Committee without it being considered by General Body as was the decision of the Executive Committee dt. 22/11/2017;

- (2) The matter pertaining to imposition of capital punishment is squarely an issue to be decided by law makers & is beyond the scope of MCI;
- (3) The capital punishment is always awarded by a Trial Court after following due process of law as it stands to-day and is confirmed by Hon'ble Supreme Court / Hon'ble High Courts as per the law on Statute books;
- (4) Actual punishment is almost always carried out after Mercy Petitions have been declined by the President of India;
- (5) Roster of persons who would be present at the actual act of execution and their precise rolls is decided by a Judge who issues Death Warrant.

In view of above, it was decided to obtain opinion from Ld. ASG with regard to the issue that whether consideration of request of WMA is within the purview of MCI and whether MCI is competent Authority to issue guidelines as requested.

5. Approval of the minutes of the Registration & Equivalence Committee meeting held on 20thFebruary, 2018.

Read: the matter with regard to approval of the minutes of the Registration & Equivalence Committee meeting held on 20thFebruary, 2018.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted and approved the recommendations of the Registration & Equivalence Committee meeting held on 20th February, 2018 in respect of item nos. 3,5,6,7,8,9,10,11 & 12 (Part-I &II).

The Executive Committee further perused the recommendations of the Registration & Equivalence Committee meeting held on 20th February, 2018 and observed as under:-

Item No.2.

Issuance of Eligibility Certificate in respect of Ms. Rabia Mohammad IsimaelUmer in terms of Clause 4(1) of the Screening Test Regulation, 2002.

The Executive Committee observed that from the minutes, it is not clear as to why application for Eligibility Certificate is presently made when the admission was taken in 2006 and the Medical course is completed in 2013. Even the Internship is completed in 2014. The reason for such late application be ascertained from the candidate. Further this is a case of Indian National who has passed qualifying examination from Libya and also Medical course from Libya. The Committee directed that opinion of Law Officer be taken in this regard whether Eligibility Certificate was required to be obtained in 2006 as per the then prevalent Regulations.

Matter is referred back to REC Sub-committee with above observations and the matter be resubmitted at the next meeting.

Item No.4.

Grant of Registration for Additional Qualifications i.e. (i) Diplomat, Internal Medicine, (ii) Diplomat , Pulmonary Medicine and (iii) Diplomat, Critical Care Medicine of American Board of Internal Medicine in respect of Dr. Vikesh Gupta u/s 26(1) of the IMC Act, 1956. (F.No. 17-100300).

The Executive Committee observed that the basic issue raised by the Executive Committee earlier that "... the candidate's training for these courses is by way of combined Fellowship in Pulmonary & Critical Care which is not equal to having received separate training in both these fields." is still not resolved. The Committee directed that the opinion of Law Officer be obtained as to whether the opinion of Ld ASG with regard to qualifications from English speaking countries covers this aspect as well and the matter be resubmitted at the next meeting.

6. **Meeting of the Sub-Group to discuss the VIP Reference from Sh. Rakesh Singh, Hon'ble MP (Lok Sabha) regarding revised plan of Medical Education, held on 5th January, 2018.**

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the minutes of the Sub-Group to discuss the VIP Reference from Sh. Rakesh Singh, Hon'ble MP (Lok Sabha) regarding revised plan of Medical Education, held on 5th January, 2018 as under:-

2. The salient points of the proposal & recommendations.

The salient points of the revised plan for medical education are as under:

- a. *After PMT, students complete preclinical disciplines like Anatomy, Physiology & Biochemistry and also, basic Pathology (excluding Systemic Pathology), Microbiology and basic principles of Pharmacology excluding therapeutics) in one & half to 2 years. This is followed by pre-PG examination and students will be offered choice of Medicine, Surgery, Pediatrics or a basic science degree – MSc like Anatomy, Biochemistry, Microbiology etc. on merit basis.*

In the next 02 years, students choosing clinical subjects will spend time in a teaching hospital. They will also be taught applied aspects of Anatomy, Physiology, systemic Pathology, Therapeutics, Forensic Medicine & Preventive & Social Medicine. In the next three years, students can choose any one specialty for which currently MD/MS is offered. Thus, an entrant to medical college will get MD/MS in 07 years instead of the current eight and half years.

Recommendation: This requires wider consultation because it involves fundamental structural changes in the plan of medical education.

- b. *Superspecialty programme: two years + one year residency.*

c. ***Establishment of colleges of Basic Medical Sciences***

Establishment of colleges of Basic Medical Sciences is proposed for providing courses in Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Microbiology, Pharmacology & General Pathology wherein the following courses will be provided:

- *Two year BSc degree in any of the above subjects*
- *Two year additional course in each of the above leading to MSC degree,*
- *Doctorate degree in any of the above subjects.*

Recommendation: The above mentioned plan was accepted in principle.

- d. *Involve selected willing practicing specialists and super-specialists for teaching in the teaching hospital at a suitable honorarium.*

Recommendation: This cannot be done at the cost of substituting Minimum Standard Requirements for teachers.

The members authorized the Chairman, Academic Committee to formulate the Report for further consideration in the matter.

The Executive Committee of the Council approved except 2(c) above. The existing M.Sc. courses in Medical faculty in Preclinical & Paraclinical subjects adequately serve the purpose.

The Committee decided to place the above before the General Body of the Council.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

7. Meeting of Expert group to examine letter from Chairman, Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB) regarding inclusion of Radiation safety syllabus in concerned medical specialties was held on 21stFebruary, 2018.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the minutes of the meeting of Expert group to examine letter from Chairman, Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB) regarding inclusion of Radiation safety syllabus in concerned medical specialties, held on 21st February, 2018 as under:-

1. Minimum prescribed radiation safety syllabus for postgraduate (PG) degree/diploma courses in Radiation Oncology/Radiotherapy.

The Chairman, Academic Committee informed the members that the postgraduate degree/diploma syllabus in Radiodiagnosis and Radiotherapy has included the required information on radiation safety. The Guidelines including syllabus in the above subjects have been restructured by the Reconciliation Board of the Council and have been/are being uploaded on MCI website.

2. Minimum prescribed radiation safety syllabus for postgraduate (PG) degree/diploma/super-specialty courses of Radiology, Cardiology, Urology, Neurology, Orthopedics and other super-specialties associated with use of medical diagnostic X-ray equipment.

The Chairman informed the members that competency-based guidelines for Diploma and MS in Orthopedics have been restructured by the Reconciliation Board of the Council and have been uploaded on MCI website. However, the members of the Reconciliation Board would be requested to examine these curricula regarding inclusion of prescribed radiation safety component in these guidelines.

The Guidelines for super-specialty courses in Cardiology, Urology, Neurology, in vogue are to be updated when AERB recommendations would be considered for appropriate inclusion, as may be warranted.

3. Minimum prescribed radiation safety syllabus for postgraduate (PG) degree/diploma courses in Nuclear Medicine.

The Chairman informed the members that competency-based guidelines in Nuclear Medicine have been restructured by the Reconciliation Board of the Council and have been uploaded on MCI website. Radiation safety requirements have been incorporated in these guidelines. However, the Academic Cell would send a copy of the AERB guidelines to the convener of the Expert group on Nuclear Medicine to ensure that adequate emphasis has been given to radiation safety.

4. Basic Syllabus of Radiation safety (MBBS Level)

The Chairman, informed the members that the competency based undergraduate curriculum on Radiodiagnosis/Radiotherapy has included radiation safety component appropriately.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to place the matter with regard to serial numbers 1,2 & 3 before the Postgraduate Committee of the Council and Sl.No.4 before the General Body of the Council.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

8. Minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 05thFebruary, 2018.

The Executive Committee decided to place the matter before the Postgraduate Committee of the Council.

(b) Note from U.G. Section on Teaching of UG Classes (MBBS) by teachers of super-speciality departments

The Executive Committee observed that undergraduate curriculum does not include Superspecialties; only Broad specialities are included in the curriculum for which the faculty is prescribed who is supposed to teach UG students. This be communicated to the Institute.

The Executive Committee did not approve the recommendations of the Academic Committee and stated that existing Regulations are clear in this regard and no change is required.

9. **Consideration of Compliance Verification assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University in respect of students being trained at Vardhman Mahavir Medical College & Safdarjung Hospital, Delhi.**

Read: the matter with regard to compliance verification assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University in respect of students being trained at Vardhman Mahavir Medical College & Safdarjung Hospital, Delhi.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (07th February, 2018) along with previous assessment report (18th & 19th July, 2017) and decided to recommend that recognition of MBBS degree granted by Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University in respect of students being trained at Vardhman Mahavir Medical College & Safdarjung Hospital, Delhi be continued restricting the number of admission to 150 (One Hundred Fifty) students.

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April, 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ...

- (2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.
- (3) The procedure for 'Renewal' of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.
- (4) Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute.

10. **Consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Terna Medical College, Navi Mumbai.**

Read: the matter with regard to compliance verification assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Terna Medical College, Navi Mumbai.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (07th February, 2018) along with previous reports (31st July, 2017, 27th February, 2017, 17.06.2016, 22.02.2016, 10.03.2015 & 11th & 12th September, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 5.66 % as detailed in the report.
2. 3 Mobile & 3 Static X-ray machines are purchased but not yet installed.
3. There was NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment in both hospitals.
4. Radiological investigation workload is inadequate. CT Scan workload was only 5 on day of assessment.
5. Histopathology workload was only 2 on day of assessment.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Terna

Medical College, Navi Mumbai and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance after rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

11. Consideration of Compliance verification assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Vinobha Bhave University in respect of students being trained at Patliputra Medical College, Dhanbad.

Read: the matter with regard to compliance verification assessment report with regard to Continuance of Recognition of MBBS degree granted by Vinobha Bhave University in respect of students being trained at Patliputra Medical College, Dhanbad.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (06th February, 2018) along with the previous assessment reports (27th July, 2017, 11th April, 2017, 17th October, 2016, 11th March 2016, 1st July 2015 & 21st & 22nd March, 2014) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 38.09 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 16.33 % as detailed in the report.
3. ICUs: Ventilators & Defibrillators are not available in PICU.
4. Nurses' Hostel: Available accommodation is for 10 Nurses against requirement of 41.
5. O.T.: Central O₂ and Central Suction are not available.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Vinobha Bhave University in respect of students being trained at Patliputra Medical College, Dhanbad and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance after rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

12. Consideration of compliance verification assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai.

Read: the matter with regard to compliance verification assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (06th February, 2018) along with previous assessment reports (26th July, 2017, 8th March, 2017 and 22nd & 23rd Feb., 2016) and decided to recommend that recognition of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai be continued restricting the number of admissions to 180 (One Hundred Eighty) students.

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April, 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ...

- (2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.
- (3) The procedure for 'Renewal' of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.

(4) Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute.

13. Consideration of compliance verification assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kannur University in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Kannur.

Read: the matter with regard to compliance verification assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kannur University in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Kannur.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (07th February, 2018) alongwith previous assessment report (14th September, 2017, 9th May, 2017 and 27th& 28th July, 2016) and noted the following:-

1. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 60.35 %.
2. There was 1 Normal Delivery & NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kannur University in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Kannur and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance of rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

The Committee further decided to continue the application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part-I) dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016.

14. Pre-PG Assessment – Compliance verification assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Chhattisgarh Institute of Medical Sciences, Bilaspur under Ayush and Health Sciences University, Raipur (Previously under Guru Ghasidas University).

Read: the matter with regard to Pre-PG Assessment – Compliance verification assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Chhattisgarh Institute of Medical Sciences, Bilaspur under Ayush and Health Sciences University, Raipur (Previously under Guru Ghasidas University).

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment (8th February, 2018) along with previous report (4th May, 2017, 16th December, 2016 and 8th & 9th June, 2016) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 31.53 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 40 % as detailed in the report.
3. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 60.61 %.
4. There were only 4 Major Operations for the whole hospital on day of assessment.
5. CT Scan is single slice against requirement of minimum 16 slice. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
7. OPD: Registration counters are partially computerized. Deficiency remains as it is.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to grant 01(One) month time to the institute to submit the compliance on rectification of deficiencies to the Council.

15. Pre-PG Assessment – assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Rama Medical College & Hospital, Kanpur under Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra, UP.

Read: the matter with regard to Pre-PG Assessment – assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Rama Medical College & Hospital, Kanpur under Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra, UP.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment (9th February, 2018) along with previous assessment report (2nd & 3rd December, 2016) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 13.2 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 14.75 % as detailed in the report.
3. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 42.97 % as verified by Assessors.
4. Data of Clinical material provided by Institute are inflated.
5. In O.G. ward, some Obstetrics patients were admitted since 05/02/2018 only with complaints of pain in Abdomen. They were on iron & Calcium tablets & nothing else. Neither any other treatment was given nor any USG done.
6. Hospital Lecture Theater is not of Gallery type.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to grant 01(One) month time to the institute to submit the compliance on rectification of deficiencies to the Council.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016, which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

- (c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

If it is observed during any inspection/assessment of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <70%, compliance of rectification of deficiency from such an institute will not be considered for issue of renewal of permission in that Academic year and further such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in that Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 along with direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses."

In view of above, it was decided not to consider the Institute for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the current Academic year (2019-20) and to issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 along with direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.

7. Paramedical & Non-teaching staff: Only 78 Paramedical & Non-teaching staff are available against requirement of 179.
8. There were only 3 Major & 2 Minor Operations on day of assessment.
9. Cytopathology workload is NIL.
10. Radiological & Laboratory Investigations workload is inadequate.
11. OPD: Registration counters are not separate for males/females. Waiting area is inadequate. Injection rooms for males/females are not available. Child Welfare clinic, Child Rehabilitation clinic are not available in Paediatrics OPD. Cancer Detection clinic is not available in OG OPD.
12. Wards: Ancillary facilities are not available in several wards as detailed in the report.
13. Casualty: Separate Casualty for O.G. is not available.
14. ICUs: There was NIL patient in MICU, SICU & only 1 patient in ICCU on day of assessment.
15. There was NIL woman in Labour Room at time of visit.
16. CSSD: Receiving & Distribution points are not separate. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
17. Lecture Theaters: Out of 4 Lecture Theaters available, 1 has capacity of 104 against requirement of 120 and is of flat type.
18. Central Library: Only Internet area is air-conditioned; rest of Central Library is not air-conditioned. Capacity of Students' reading room (Outside) is 36 against requirement of 100. 17 Internet Nodes are available against requirement of 25.
19. Central Photography section is not available.
20. Anatomy department: Cold storage is not functional.
21. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Calicut University in respect of students being trained at Karuna Medical College, Palakkad, Kerala and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance of rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to give an opportunity to the college authorities for submission of compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

9. Central Library: it is partially air-conditioned.
10. Lecture Theaters: Capacity of all 4 Lecture Theaters is 100 against requirement of 120. Audiovisual aids are available in only 1 Lecture Theater.
11. Interns' Hostel: There are 30 5-seater rooms which is not permissible.
12. RHTC: There is no RHTC. Sub District Hospital, Kaij was shown as RHTC; however it is not affiliated to the Institute. It is not under the control of Dean. It cannot be considered as RHTC.
13. UHC: UHC Chanai is under the control of Public Health department.
14. Website: Information uploaded is sketchy as detailed in the report.

30. Recognition/Approval of ESIC Medical College, Gulbarga for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered letter of the assessors dated 07.02.2018 informing as under:-

"As per your directions, we visited Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar, Tamilnadu on 07.02.2018 at 9.00am. we met the Principal and Dean Dr. Rajkumar and handed over our MCI order copy for assessment and gave him the same. He signed the same order copy and gave it to us.

He then told us that since they were not prepared for the Continuation of recognition assessment, they did not want us to carry out the assessment. We request him to give it (the refusal) to us in writing.

They have given us in writing their refusal and the reasons for the same. Please find enclosed the letter and necessary enclosures for your perusal and necessary actions."

The Executive Committee also took cognizance of the letter dated 07.02.2018 received from the Dean, Faculty of Medicine, Annamalai Univeristy, Annamalai Nagar stating as under:-

"With reference to the letter (ref.No. 6), the following Assessors arrived at our college on 07.02.2017 at 09.15 am for assessment of physical and other teaching facilities available for continuance of recognition of M.B.B.S. degree (150 seats) granted by Annamalai University in respect of students being trained at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar.

2. *Dr. P. Narashimhaswamy, Professor & Head of General Surgery, Mandya Institute of Medical Sciences, mandya.*

We have already sent a communication (under reference 2) to the Secretary, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India on 16.10.2017 requesting adequate time to satisfy the requirements of the Medical Council of India citing the following reasons with justification:

1. Annamalai University Act 1928, has been repealed and replaced with Annamalai University Act 2013 (Act 20 of 2013) and subsequently the status of Rajah Muthiah Medical College under the control of Annamalai university has changed from erstwhile classification of "Trust" to "Government" by the Medical Council of India (Enclosure 1)

2. A communication from Principal Secretary to Government, Higher Education Department, Government of Tamil Nadu to the Secretary, Ministry of Health and FW, Government of India, New Delhi dated 24.05.2017 has endorsed Rajah Muthiah Medical College as Government Medical College (under Self-financing mode) (Enclosure 2)

3. As per the mandate of the Ministry of Health and FW, Government of India, we are surrendering 15% of the MBBS for the academic year 2017-18 and 50% of Postgraduate seats (from the academic year 2018-19) to the All India Quota. The rest of the 85% of MBBS seats and 50% of Postgraduate seats are being filled through common counseling by the Selection Committee, directorate of Medical Education, Government of Tamil Nadu (Enclosure 3)

4. As per the MCI norms, we had applied for renewal of recognition for 150 annual intake of MBBS seats on 03.07.2017. Unfortunately, the University has been undergoing severe financial setback and hence recruitment of fresh additional Teaching staff as well as promotion of the existing and eligible Teaching staff to fulfill the requirements of 150 annual intake (as per MCI norms) has not been possible, in spite of the Institution's best and earnest efforts. In view of the prevailing financial crisis, the University is struggling to financially support the annual deficit in the budget of Rajah Muthiah Medical College.

5. On our request, the Department of Health & FW Government of Tamilnadu has consented to fill up the shortage of staff on regular basis to Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalai University (Enclosure – 4). Based on this, a few teaching staff from Department of Health & FW, Govt. of Tamilnadu have given consent to be transferred to Rajah Muthiah Medical College and their request is under process.

6. Besides, the Postgraduate and undergraduate students of Rajah Muthiah Medical College have been on strike from 30.08.2017 to 09.10.2017 demanding reduction of annual tuition fees (on par with other Government Medical Colleges in Tamilnadu), although they have been admitted to Rajah Muthiah Medical College under the self-financing mode. This subject is in the Honble Supreme Courts (S.L.P.(C) No. 31078-31080/2016) purview and the next hearing is due on 15.02.2018.

7. Philips 1.5 Telsa MRI Machine at RMMCH was purchased during 2006 has reached its end of life, and recommended to purchase a new machine. Due to present financial situation of our University we are not in a position to make the outright purchase of a new MRI machine. However, the Government in its letter under reference 5, has communicated that a new MRI machine will be installed very soon.

The University Authorities, in association with the Government of Tamilnadu are taking measures to improve the financial situation of the University/College.

Because of the above reasons, we politely refused the Assessment for continuation of recognition referred to above. Hence, the assessors could not carry out the Assessment. We also deeply regret the inconvenience caused to the MCI and the Assessors in this regard.

We assure that we will satisfy the requirements of the Medical Council of India for renewal of recognition for 150 annual intake very shortly and be ready for assessment before the ensuing admission process of academic year (2018-2019).

Hence, we request you to kindly take a lenient view and permit the College to arrange to notify the admission process for 150 annual intake of MBBS seats (by Selection Committee, Directorate of Medical Education, Govt. of Tamilnadu) for the academic year 2018-2019 (by surrendering 15% of MBBS seats to All India Quota and 85% of MBBS seats to the state Quota)."

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to conduct another assessment of Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar, Tamilnadu.

32. Recognition/approval of Patna Medical College, Patna for the award of MBBS degree granted by Aryabhatta Knowledge University, Patna against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

11. Pathology department: Audiovisual aids are not available in the Demonstration room. Catalogues are not available in the Museum.
12. Pharmacology department: Catalogues are not available in the Museum.
13. Forensic Medicine department: Catalogues are not available in the Museum.
14. Community Medicine department: Audiovisual aids are not available in the Demonstration room.
15. RHTC: Specialists' visits are not organized.
16. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve Patna Medical College, Patna for the award of MBBS degree granted by Aryabhatta Knowledge University, Patna against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

33. Recognition/approval of RajashreeChhatrapatiShahu Maharaj Govt. Medical College, Kolhapur for the award of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956-reg.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (20.02.2018) along with previous assessment report (6th and 7th September, 2017, 16.03.2017 & 17.03.2017, 03.08.2016 & 02.03.2016) and noted the following-:

1. OPD attendance upto 2 p.m. as verified by assessors from registers was 705 against requirement of 800. There was no crowd in OPD at 12:30 p.m. & also at 2 p.m. Data provided by Institute are inflated.
2. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 31.92 %.
3. In Paediatrics ward, out of 60 patients, only 20 were genuine; rest were healthy children found playing in the ward or had minor complaints.
4. In Orthopaedics ward, 42 patients were admitted who required only Physiotherapy and did not merit admission. Other 6 patients were of knee joint who can be managed on OPD basis.
5. In General medicine wards, 86 patients had minor ailments like polyarthragia, anaemia, generalized weakness, etc. which can be managed on OPD basis.

6. Histopathology workload on day of assessment was only 7 & Cytopathology only 3.
7. Workload of Laboratory investigations was inadequate. Data provided by the Institute are highly inflated.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to continue the application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016 and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance after rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

36. Transfer of University Affiliation of VSS Institute of Medical Sciences & Research from Sambalpur University to Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research.

Read: the matter with regard to transfer of University affiliation of VSS Institute of Medical Sciences & Research from Sambalpur University to Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 17.01.2018 received from the Dean & Principal, VIMSAR, Burla requesting the Council for necessary approval for the transfer of affiliation from Sambalpur University to Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research w.e.f. July 2018.

The Committee observed that the Executive Committee at its meeting held on June 1988 had decided as under:-

“No inspection is required where there is change of name and change of affiliation of the University or the college whose medical qualifications are already recognized and included in the I schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 unless the Executive Committee decided otherwise”.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided that the university be asked to submit the certificate/approval from University Grants Commission with regard to formation of Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research for further consideration of the matter. It was further decided that it may be advised to the institution to apply to the Central Government when the first batch admitted under Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research appears for the III MBBS Part II examination for recognition u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 22.01.2018 received from the Principal, Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun informing therein that Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun was affiliated to HNB Garhwal University for the undergraduate & postgraduate courses run by the Institute since its inception in the year 2006. Now parent body Shri Guru Ram Rai Education Mission of Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun has established their own University “Shri Guru Ram Rai University” vide Shri Guru Ram Rai University

Act No. 03 of 2017 and their college is the constituent college of the university and shall be affiliated with Shri Guru Ram Rai University from the academic session 2017-18 onwards.

The Executive Committee observed that the Principal, Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun has requested to kindly change the affiliating university from HNB Garhwal University, Srinagar to Shri Guru Ram Rai University, Dehradun from the academic session 2017-18 for running UG course.

The Committee observed that the Executive Committee at its meeting held on June 1988 had decided as under:-

“No inspection is required where there is change of name and change of affiliation of the University or the college whose medical qualifications are already recognized and included in the I schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 unless the Executive Committee decided otherwise”.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided that the university be asked to submit the certificate/approval from University Grants Commission with regard to formation of Shri Guru Ram Rai University, Dehradun for further consideration of the matter. It was further decided that it may be advised to the institution to apply to the Central Government when the first batch admitted under Shri Guru Ram Rai University, Dehradun appears for the III MBBS Part II examination for recognition u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

38. Prabhat Kumar Singh V/S Army College of Medical Sciences &Ors. – LPA No. 66 of Year 2017 in the Hon’ble Delhi High Court at New Delhi (MCI File No. 14983).

By virtue of the fact that the Regulation does not prescribe any limitation of age and time for procurement of the MBBS degree, the lapse of time does not come in the way of continuation of the course further from the point where it was left for whatever reason, hence there is no statutory bar which restricts the appellant to pursue the MBBS course at the concerned Medical College from the point where he had left upon his rustication on disciplinary grounds by the concerned college.
2. The appellant will be duty bound to ensure that all the prescribed academic requirements including acquiring required prescribed percentage of attendance and duration of the two “Academic terms” of six months each are fulfilled by him for being eligible to take the final MBBS (Clinical Part II) examination of the examining university.
3. Upon clearing the final MBBS examination of the concerned examining university, the appellant shall be duty bound to satisfactorily complete one year rotating internship and procure certification thereto which would then entitle him for conferment of MBBS by the examining university.

After due deliberations, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to approve the report of Sub-committee and directed the office to inform the Institution accordingly.

39. Change of name of Jagadguru Sri Shivarathreeshwara University (JSSU) Mysuru, Karnataka to JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research, Mysuru.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 07.02.2018 received from Registrar, Jagadguru Sri Shivarathreeshwara University, Mysuru informing therein that in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the UGC Act 1956, the Central Government vide its Notification No. F. 9-9/2003-U-3 dated 28.05.2008 on the advice of UGC had declared Jagadguru Sri Shivarathreeshwara University (JSSU), Mysore-Karnataka, as a 'Deemed to be University' consisting of:

1. JSS Medical College, Mysore.
2. JSS Dental College, Mysore.
3. JSS Pharmacy College, Mysore, and
4. JSS Pharmacy College, Ooty (Tamilnadu) (off campus).

The Executive Committee also took note of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, vide its judgement order dated 03.11.2017 in civil appeal Nos. 17869-17870/2017 (arising out of SLP (C) Nos. 19807-19808/2012) and Civil Appeal Nos. 17902-17905/2017 (arising out of SLP C Nos. 35793-96 (2012) and on the advice of UGC in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 3 of the UGC Act 1956, the Central Government has changed the name of Jagadguru Sri Shivarathreeshwara University (JSSU), Mysore – Karnataka to JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research continuing to be a Deemed to be University with the powers conferred under Section 3 of the UGC Act 1956." The Registrar, Jagadguru Sri Shivarathreeshwara University, Mysuru has requested to kindly make a note of the same and make necessary changes in all records, website and other resources the change in the name of the Deemed to be University.

43. Harassment by my Father in Law, Dr. B.S. Tomar.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the letter received from the Office of Minister of Women & Child Development with regard to complaint of Dr. Swati Tomar against her father in law Dr. B.S. Tomar. The complaint of Dr. Swati Tomar reads as under:

"I am writing this mail under tremendous Mental Stress, Despair and Hopelessness.

I am Dr. Swati Tomar, MBBS, MS (Ophthalmology), Corneal Surgeon (Prestigious LV Prasad Eye Institute of Hyderabad) and practicing Eye Surgeon in Jaipur and Medical Director, Eye Bank Society of Rajasthan. I am undergoing extreme harassment from my Father in Law, Dr. B.S. Tomar who is also the Chairman of Indian Medical Trust, Jaipur, Rajasthan at all levels (Mental, Physical and Emotional) and making my life miserable. Dr. B.S. Tomar has filed numerous false FIR against me and my husband to end my Professional career as well as to pose a threat to my life. Along with being a well-known and only female corneal surgeon of Rajasthan. I am also mother of two. His harassment has reached to such an extent that, living with my kids in jaipur is risk for my life.

Dr. B.S. Tomar is harassing me for last 2 years through various means. I have pleaded my case with concerned authorities in Government like Police, Women Commission, etc. And till date no relief as well as justice has come my way. It has been portrayed as if Government machinery is at the mercy of Dr. B.S. Tomar. Dr. B.S. Tomar's conduct as well as character as a doctor as well as Chairman of Indian Medical Trust is questionable as there are many complaints and FIR's lodged against him with many Government Authorities. Still no action is being carried out."

The project has been made Go-Live on 31.10.2017. Though certain deficiencies pertaining to certain milestones were existing for which the payment was retained for want of completion and rectification as per details given below: -

It is stated that the DMMP-I project was made 'Go-live' on 31.10.2017 and as per the 'Go-live' milestone, all 28 modules must have been implemented and functional but still there are some module which are yet to be implemented and functional. Out of the 28 DMMP modules, 3 modules are related to IMR which is under the scope of revision and referred to the sub Committee for the examination & its report. The latest status of remaining 25 DMMP modules is stated as under: -

7. Faculty Development – Requirement gathering done and module is now under development.

4 i.e. Data Entry & Data Migration

There are 14 DMMP modules where old data is to be migrated into the new modules. For some of the modules data migration has been done by SI but it is yet to be verified from the concerned Section Heads. SI to provide the Data migration sign off documents after verification of the old data report in new DMMP modules. Data Entry of service book, personal files and other records of MCI staff, for which the total 14000 entries is to be made, are still verified and confirmed by the Admin section. Payment can be considered after the needful.

From the forgoing, it is evident that major bottleneck for withholding sizable payment of Rs. 4.65 Crores, is related to milestone no. 2 & 3 i.e. UAT & Go-Live and both these milestones are inter linked.

In addition to above, SI has raised three invoices as mentioned below, for payment which were not processed in view of the directions of EC in its meeting dated 22.11.2017.

- i) E-KYC enrollment charges @ Rs. 20 per faculty
- ii) Handholding Staff (2 person @ Rs. 67,000) deployment for DMMP-I project
- iii) Invoice for AMC 1st Qtr. with enhanced amount.

Approval for (i) & (ii) has already been accorded by Executive Committee. The payment can be released. As regards (iii) i.e. AMC payment. This situation arose after deficiency of milestone 2 & 3 are resolved. However, the SI has submitted a proposal for AMC enhancement and the same is being placed in the next A&GC meeting.”

It was observed by the members of the Executive Committee that there are major bottle necks in releasing payment. In several cases, migration of modules/documents is incomplete and is yet to be verified. As many as 7 Go-live Handover documents, 9 UAT documents & 14 Data Migration sign-offs are still pending. Even 3 IMR are under revision. File Tracking System is yet to be put in place.

In view of above, after due deliberations, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to form a Sub-Committee comprising of the following officials:

11. Casualty: No CMO was present at time of visit.
12. ICUs: There was NIL patient in ICCU, SICU & only 1 patient in MICU.
13. Labour room: Septic Labour room & Eclampsia room are not available.
14. Radiodiagnosis department: 2 Mobile X-ray machines are available against requirement of 4. 3 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5.
15. Examination Hall: Capacity of the Examination Hall is 110 against requirement of 250.
16. Lecture Theaters: 3 Lecture Theaters are available against requirement of 4.
17. Central Library: Available books are 4,144 against requirement of 7,000. Available Journals are 66 against requirement of 100. Only 3 Internet Nodes are available.
18. Physiology department: Mammalian Laboratory is not available.
19. Pathology department: Catalogues are not available in the Museum.
20. Forensic Medicine department: Museum facilities are inadequate as detailed in the report.

64. Amendment in the“ Regulations on Graduate Medical Education, 1997 – Time Schedule regarding.

Read: the matter with regard to amendment in the“ Regulations on Graduate Medical Education, 1997.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the agenda note with regard to amendment in Regulations on Graduate Medical Education,1997. The Committee noted that ‘NOTE’ has not been included in the Time Schedule for completion of the admission process for first MBBS course for the academic year 2018-19 and onwards in the Gazette Notification published on 06/02/2018 as had been in earlier notified Time Schedule for Academic Year 2017-18. The Committee approved that the following ‘NOTE’ be included in the revised schedule:-

“NOTE

1. All India Quota seats (15%) remaining vacant after last date for joining i.e. 22nd July of the present admission year will be deemed to be converted into State Quota.
2. Institute/college/courses permitted after 31st May will not be considered for admission/allotment of seats for current academic year.
3. In any circumstances, last date for admission/joining will not be extended after 31st August.
4. For the purpose of ensuring faithful obedience to the above time schedule, Saturday, Sunday or Holidays (except National Holiday on account of Independence Day on Tuesday, 15th August) shall be treated as working days.

The Executive Committee directed the office to place the matter before the General Body of the Council.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

65. Payment of Sitting Fee to the members of the Council.

Read: the matter with regard topayment of Sitting Fee to the members of the Council.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 8th February, 2018 received from the Ministry of Health & F.W. allowing payment of the approved sitting fees to the President, Vice President, Chairman, PG Committee and Members of the Council from the date of reconstitution of MCI in 2013 subject to the condition that no financial assistance will be made available for the purpose and the entire expenditure will be managed by MCI from its own resources.

In view of above letter of the Govt. of India, the Executive Committee decided to approve the sitting fees to the members of the Council from theperiod 21.12.2013 to 28.02.2016.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

The Executive Committee further directed the office to seek an explanation from the Section as to why the item was placed before DPC in the first instance if the ACR for the year 2017-18 was not available as the year 2017-2018 is not yet over and the probation period fell into 2017-18.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.
