1. Minutes of the Executive Committee Meeting held on 5th March, 2018 – Confirmation of.

The Executive Committee of the Council while confirming the minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 5th March, 2018 noted as under:-

Kerala for the Academic Year 2017-18 – Regarding**, the decision in the 2nd line i.e. "...recommendation and further directed the Institute to admit 10 students less in Management"... **may be read as** "...recommendation and further directed the Institute to admit 01 students less in Management"..

2. **Minutes of the last meeting of the Executive Committee – Action taken thereon.**

The Executive Committee of the Council noted the action taken on the minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 5th March, 2018.

3. **Pending items arising out of the decisions taken by the Executive Committee.**

The Executive Committee of the Council noted the pending items arising out of the decisions taken by the Executive Committee.

4. **Relocation of regional Centre at the Institute of medical Education Technology & teachers Training, MUHS.**

Read: the matter with regard to relocation of regional centre at the Institute of medical Education Technology & teachers Training, MUHS.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted the letter of the Registrar, MUHS, Nashik dated 26-02-2018 informing that the Institute of Medical Education Technology & Teachers Training has shifted from Pune to Nashik, Main Campus and is fully functional. The Executive Committee directed that the Academic Committee be informed accordingly.

5. **Transfer of Indian citizens who are pursuing medicine course at Kazan State Medical University (KSMU), Russian Federation due to their expulsion from the University.**

Read: the matter with regard to transfer of Indian citizens who are pursuing medicine course at Kazan State Medical University (KSMU), Russian Federation due to their expulsion from the University.

The Executive Committee of the Council noted that at its meeting dt. 06/02/2018 had decided as under:

"... After due deliberations, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to accept recommendation of the Embassy of India, Moscow and to remove the name of Kazan State Medical University (KSMU), Russian Federation, from the list of foreign medical universities being maintained by the Medical Council of India for the purposes of issuance of Eligibility Certificate for the prospective admission seekers of foreign medical education and

directed that the Embassy of India be informed accordingly. The Executive Committee further decided that with regard to transfer of students, it be informed of Statutory provisions requesting the Embassy to ascertain if any of these conditions are fulfilled.”

The Executive Committee observed that the Council had preferred SLP against the order dated 27.09.2013 of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in WP (C) No. 1655/2013 and connected matters. The Hon'ble High Court had quashed clause (3) of Regulation 4 of the Screening Test Regulations, 2002. The said provision was notified in the official Gazette of India on 16.04.2010 and provided that:

4 (3) He/She has studied for the medical course at the same institute located abroad for the entire duration of the course from where he/she has obtained the degree.”

The case was subsequently listed for hearing from time to time and finally the Hon'ble Supreme Court disposed off the SLP on 30.01.18 with the following orders:-

“Heard learned counsel for the parties.

Leave granted.

Application for intervention stands allowed.

No case for interference with the impugned judgment and order passed by the High Court is made out. We do not find any error in the decision rendered by the High Court in declaring regulation 4(3) of the Screening Test Regulations, 2002 as ultra vires. As we have upheld the judgment of the High Court, the writ petition filed questioning the same stands allowed. The appeals filed by the Medical Council of India are dismissed.”

The Committee further observed that the appeal filed by the Council has been dismissed and the judgment of the Hon'ble High Court declaring Regulation 4 (3) as ultra vires and quashed has attained finality. . Therefore, Regulation 4(3) does not survive in the Screening Test Regulations, 2002. As far as removal of the name of Kazan State Medical University from the list of foreign medical universities is concerned, the name of the said university has already been removed from the list of foreign medical universities available on the MCI website.

After due deliberations, the Executive Committee of the Council decided that as Regulation 4(3) is presently struck off, transfer of students from Kazan State Medical University (KSMU), Russian Federation to other Institutes be permitted provided other conditions of Eligibility are fulfilled. The Committee directed that the Embassy of India be informed accordingly.

6. Representations received from the students/parents/ Associations/ MPs regarding requirement of NEET.

Read: the matter with regard to representations received from the students/parents/Associations/MPs regarding requirement of NEET.

The Executive Committee of the Council deliberated the matter at length and decided to obtain the opinion of Law officer in the matter and resubmit the same at the next meeting.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

7. Consideration of compliance verification assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kumaon University, Nainital in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College (Prev.Uttarakhand Forest Hospital Trust Med.Col.), Haldwani.

Read: the matter with regard to consideration of compliance verification assessment report with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kumaon University, Nainital in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College (Prev.Uttarakhand Forest Hospital Trust Med.Col.), Haldwani.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (26th February, 2018) along with previous reports (7th September, 2017, 8th March, 2017, 18th May, 2016, 18th Dec.,2015 & 6th and 7th July, 2015) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 16 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 14.49 % as detailed in the report.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Kumaon University, Nainital in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College (Prev.Uttarakhand Forest Hospital Trust Med.Col.), Haldwani and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance after rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

8. Continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Santosh University, Ghaziabad in respect of students being trained Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad.

Read: the matter with regard to continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Santosh University, Ghaziabad in respect of students being trained Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (07th March, 2018), previous reports (10th & 11th May, 2016) Photographs/Videography alongwith representation/letter dated 08.03.2018 from the Dean, Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 55.82 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 35.82 % as detailed in the report.
3. Bed Occupancy 5.27 % at 10 a.m. on day of assessment as verified by the assessors.
4. There were 11 patients, both male & female, in a ward labelled as "Male Medical Ward.
5. There were only 3 Major & 2 Minor Operations for the whole hospital on the day of assessment.
6. There was NIL Normal Delivery on day of assessment.
7. There was NIL patient in ICCU & all ICUs on day of assessment.
8. Histopathology workload is only 1 on day of assessment.
9. CT Scan is not available.
10. MRD: It is partly manual & partly rectified.
11. RHTC: Administrative control is not with the Dean.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Santosh

University, Ghaziabad in respect of students being trained Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance after rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

The Committee further decided to continue the application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part-I) dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016.

9. Recognition/Approval of ESIC Medical College, Chennai, Tamilnadu for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M G R Medical University Chennai u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of ESIC Medical College, Chennai, Tamilnadu for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M G R Medical University Chennai u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment reports (19.02.2018 and 05th& 06th March, 2018) and noted the following:-

1. Radiodiagnosis department: CT Scan is not available. 2 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5.
2. Nursing staff: 182 Nursing staff are available against requirement of 247.
3. ICUs: PICU has only 4 beds against requirement of 5; its occupancy was only 1 on day of assessment.
4. Central Library: Available books are 4,815 against requirement of 7,000.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve ESIC Medical College, Chennai, Tamilnadu for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M G R Medical University Chennai u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

10. Recognition/Approval of Government Medical College, Nizamabad, Telangana for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Government Medical College, Nizamabad, Telangana for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment reports (20/21.02.2018 and 06th March, 2018) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 10.37 % as detailed in the report.
2. Dr. L. Ramulu, Medical Superintendent has only 5 year 4 months of Administrative experience against requirement of 10 years; hence not eligible to hold the post.
3. OPD: Minor O.T. in Casualty is not in working condition. Plaster room & Plaster Cutting room are not available. Female Dressing room is not available. In Ophthalmology OPD, Dressing room is not available.
4. Audiometry & Speech Therapy are not available.

5. Central Clinical Laboratory: Microbiology section is not functional; hence Microbiology workload is NIL.
6. Histopathology workload is only 3 on day of assessment.
7. ICUs: There was NIL patient in ICCU & SICU on day of assessment.
8. Radiodiagnosis department: 4 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5. AERB approval is not
9. ETO Sterilizer is not available.
10. Central Library: it is partially air-conditioned.
11. Pathology department: Only 1 Service Laboratory is available against requirement of 4.
12. Microbiology department: Only 1 Service Laboratory is available against requirement of 7. Catalogues are not available in the Museum.
13. RHTC: Family Welfare Registers are not available.
14. UHC: Family Welfare Registers are not available. Specialists' visits are not organized.
15. Website: it is not updated as detailed in the report.
16. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve Government Medical College, Nizamabad, Telangana for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by Kaloji Narayana Rao, University of Health Sciences, Warangal, Telanganau/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

11. Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for 60 MBBS seats (Show Cause) at Mata Gujri Memorial Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura, Bihar.

Read: the matter with regard to Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for 60 MBBS seats (Show Cause) at Mata Gujri Memorial Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura, Bihar.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (06.03.2018), previous assessment reports (12th & 13th October, 2017) alongwith a letter/representation dated 7.3.2018 from the Principal of the college and decided to revoke the decision of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to process the application for renewal of permission for increase of seats and office was directed to act accordingly.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

12. Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for 120 MBBS seats (Show Cause) at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

Read: the matter with regard to Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for 120 MBBS seats (Show Cause) at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (06.03.2018) along with previous assessment reports (11.10.2017 & 12.10.2017, 21.04.2017 & 16th & 17th March, 2017) and decided to revoke the decision of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to process the application for recognition against increase of seats and office was directed to act accordingly.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

13. Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for 50 MBBS seats (Show Cause) Maharaja Agrasen Medical College, Hisar, Agroha under Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak.

Read: the matter with regard to Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for 50 MBBS seats (Show Cause) Maharaja Agrasen Medical College, Hisar, Agroha under Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (06.03.2018) along with previous assessment reports (25th & 26th September, 2017) and decided to revoke the decision of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to process the application for renewal of permission for increase of seats and office was directed to act accordingly.

14. Recognition/approval of Dr. S. N. Medical College & Associated Group of Hospital, Jodhpur for the award of MBBS degree granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 250 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Dr. S. N. Medical College & Associated Group of Hospital, Jodhpur for the award of MBBS degree granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 250 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment reports (08.02.2018 and 26th & 27th February, 2018) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 15.45 % as detailed in the report.
2. Non-medical faculty in Biochemistry is > 50 % which is contrary to Regulations.
3. Wards: Pantry is not available in some wards.
4. 2 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6.
5. Central Library: Staff Reading room is not available.
6. Microbiology department: 4 Service Laboratories are available against requirement of 7.
7. UHC: Specialists visits are not organized.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve Dr. S. N. Medical College & Associated Group of Hospital, Jodhpur for the award of MBBS degree granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to

250 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

15. Recognition/approval of Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Ajmer for the award of MBBS degree granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956-req.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Ajmer for the award of MBBS degree granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment reports (15.02.2018 and 26th& 27th February, 2018) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 11.18 % as detailed in the report.
2. Dr. Anil Jain, Medical Superintendent possesses 9 y 10 m Administrative Experience against requirement of 10 y; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. Teaching Beds: There is deficit of 9 beds in Skin & VD as 21 beds are available against requirement of 30 beds as PG course is run in the department.
4. Wards: Capacity of Demonstration rooms is smaller than required.
5. Casualty: Disaster Trolley is not available.
6. Examination Hall: Capacity of 2 Examination halls available is 150 each – i.e. total capacity of 300 against requirement of 2 Examination halls of 250 each – i.e. total capacity of 500.
7. Lecture Theaters: 2 Lecture Theaters are available against requirement of 4. Capacity of Hospital Lecture Theater is 120 against requirement of 200.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Ajmer for the award of MBBS degree granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

16. Recognition/approval of Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore for the award of MBBS degree granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 250 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore for the award of MBBS degree granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 250 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment reports (04.01.2018 and 05th&6thMarch, 2018) alongwith photographs/videography and representation/letter dated 06.03.2018& 08.03.2018 from the Principal, Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore and noted the following:-

1. OPD : Patient number & details in a particular OPD did not match with the figures at Registration Counter. Various OPDs had less number of patients and there was no registration of several patients in the respective departments.

2. In Tb & Chest OPD, Central Register showed 164 registered by the time of visit to OPD; however on enquiry with staff it was told that they had seen only about 30 patients.
3. Bed Occupancy of genuine patients as verified by assessors is 63.54 % at 10 a.m. on day of assessment.
4. Out of 955 patients seen in wards at time of visit, as many as 256 are not genuine patients or good teaching material due to reasons cited below.
5. Patients
 - a) General Medicine – As many as 88 patients are not be counted as either they do not require hospitalization and manageable on outdoor basis or they are cases of other speciality admitted to medicine or vague patients i.e. Patients with diagnosis of headache, fever, giddiness, weakness, abdominal pain, gastritis, minor urticaria, radiculopathy, DVT 6 months ago with no relevant investigative evidence of the disease mentioned in the diagnosis, Pott's spine, cervical spondylitis, etc. In one ward out of 22 patients, 18 were admitted on 2.03.18 and in another out of 18, 10 were admitted on 3.3.18 and sister in charge did not know. In one ward out of 10 patients, 7 were admitted on 3rd & 4th March without relevant diagnosis. Medicine ward is flooded with large number of cases of diabetes and hypertension patients. The department is running PG course and the variety of cases is limited.
 - b) Paediatrics – Any many as 27 patients are not to be counted because they did not merit hospitalization in Paediatric medicine i.e. staghorn calculus, hemangioma neck, gallstone, UTI without clinic investigative evidence, tonsillitis, Cervical lymphadenopathy meriting no hospitalization, urge incontinence in a small child, cleft lip etc. Similarly patients of weakness, UTI, pain abdomen without investigations, dental carries, URI patients, myopia, hypospadias patient gone for surgery, worm infestation, ureterocele patient etc. were admitted.
 - c) TB & Respiratory Medicine – 1 patient did not utter a single word on asking name etc but started weeping. It is doubtful how a detailed history of such a patient is recorded on the case sheet. 3 more patients were such where the diagnosis written did not match with the investigative findings and the drugs administered were neither seen with the patient nor in the ward.
 - d) Psychiatry – 2 patients of headache and 2 patients of erectile dysfunction are not to be counted for obvious reasons.
 - e) Dermatology – 30 patients do not need to be considered for a department running PG course like 9 patients of tenia, 14 patients of urticaria, 1 patient of facial palsy, 1 resolved herpes zoster to the extent that nothing is seen and one resolved psoriasis and 3 out of 5 patients of L.planus.
 - f) General Surgery – Various wards are spread here and there. 9 patients are not be counted which are postoperative patients being retained in the wards for no valid reasons like lap.Chole. for more than 10 days, Hemithyroidectomy for more than 20 days, Fibro adenoma for more than 25 days, periampullary carcinoma without any clinoco-investigative evidence. Another 4 patients did not merit admission like sebaceous cyst, divarication of rectus etc.
 - g) Orthopaedics – 19 patients had either low backache without clinic investigative evidence, 5 patients had pain knee without any clinic-investigative evidence and 2 with cervical spondylitis not requiring hospitalization.
 - h) Ophthalmology – 38 patients are not to be counted as they are admitted for more than 15 – 20 days without any valid reason for being in ward. Patients of watering and refraction are hospitalized. There are at least 5 patients of glaucoma with suspicion and no work up despite being in hospital for long time. Cataract patients are lying and waiting for very long time.
 - i) Obst. & Gynae. – As many as 30 patients were admitted recently in a ward having 50 patients out of 60 beds and o not exhibit a convincing diagnosis.

6. Data of Major Operations include those of Superspecialities also which are not to be counted for UG course.
7. Data of Minor Operations, USG as provided by Institute are inflated.
8. None of the wards had Admission Discharge Register.
9. 5 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6.
10. Central Library: Only Digital Library is air-conditioned. Rest is not air-conditioned.
11. Anatomy department: MRI films are not available in the Museum.
12. Museum is central. There is no specific separate Museum for individual department.
13. UHC: Specialists' visits are not organized.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

4. The Institute has two blocks for the hospital. The block in front of main college building is the main hospital. The second block is Cancer Research Institute (CRI), which has all oncology and radiotherapy units. The oncology specialties are like – Surgical Oncology, Medical Oncology, Hemato-oncology, Radiotherapy, Padiatric Oncology. It also has other superspecialities like Plastic Surgery, Urology, Neurosurgery. This institute has separate OPD. The website also mentions about it. Many faculty of the medical college including the Dean are also shown holding administrative position or doctors working in CRI. The Oncology OPD, Wards, Patients & Investigations are shown as infrastructure/clinical material for medical college for the purpose of increasing fulfilling norms or bed occupancy, whereas the bed occupancy in the main disciplines of MBBS (Broad specialities) is less than required (75%) as per Council's norms.

None of the wards are as per MSR, Beds are kept in small cubicles or rooms with bed capacity varying from 1 to 6 to 10. Nursing station cannot have overview all the patients. In some wards nursing station is common for 2-3 wards. Demonstration room is not available in many wards. Some situation is present in the wards of the main hospital.

5. There were only 12 Major Operations for the whole hospital on the day of assessment. Data of Major Operations provided by Institute are inflated.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

14. Residential Quarters: Quarters for Non-teaching staff are not available in the campus.
15. Hygiene of Hostels is not satisfactory.

Dean in his representation has also stated that " Dr. G.Sruthi and Dr. M.Divya have been paid salary in cash for the month of January, 2018 as they did not have the bank particulars. The assessor has not accepted the pay slips. The salaries of the two Junior Residents from the date of joining have been deposited in following bank accounts. The individual bank account statement attached.

 - ENT patient admitted for endoscopy and with diagnosis of CSOM and Sinusitis
4. There were very few patients at 10 a.m. at OPD & IPD counters.
 5. There was NIL Minor Operation on day of assessment.
 6. There was NIL Normal Delivery on day of assessment.
 7. Data of Laboratory & Radiological Investigations as provided by the Institute are inflated.
 8. There was NIL patient in PICU.
 9. There was no patient in O.G. Casualty.
 10. No blood is issued from Blood Bank after 28/02/2018.
 11. Examination Hall: Seating capacity is < 250 as required & is congested.
 12. RHTC: It is not developed.
 13. UHC: It is not under full control of Dean.
 14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report

 - The following patients of surgery wards registration No.201802260485 name Vijendar admitted on 26th February 2018 for PCNL diagnosis is right renal stone, IP No.201802090472 name Kishan admitted for haematuria on 1st March 2018. On examination he was all right without any complaints. Rg No.201802100022 Nurmohmd Admitted for right renal stone for PICNL. SR (Dr. Jitendra) does not know about the patients. IP No.2018030200022 name Lalban diagnosis urethral stricture admitted for MCU investigation. IP No. 201802220426 name Kamal Malhotra is operated for laproscopic appendectomy post operative day 10 with healthy stitch line. IP No.2021801030463 Ravi Shankar admitted for AKT toxicity. 201803040020 names Ramdhan admitted for Right cheek sebaceous cyst. IP No.201803030162 name Amir admitted for Enteric fever without any investigation since past five days. In Medicine ward IP 201803030159 name Vinod diagnosis is scabies with upper respiratory tract infection who is clinically alright.

Female Dermatology ward all four patients were treated with liq.parafine, tab. Antihistaminic and vit. C tab. Only, which indicates these patients need not to be admitted.
5. OPD – In the morning when assessors entered in the institute at 9.30 a.m. no patients, were found in OPD/Registration counter. At 2 p.m. when OPD statistics were checked all statistics was mismatched between computer data and manual data available in the respective OPDs. In dermatology computer shows 91 cases registered where as manual register shows 68 cases. Surgery diagnosis is not specific. Mostly symptoms have been

mentioned in the manual register. OPD data is higher than the average daily data as reported in ENT, Ophthalmology, Dentistry Departments.

The Executive Committee further perused the proceedings of the Ethics Committee meetings held on 24th& 25thJanuary, 2018 and 15th& 16th February, 2018 and observed as under:-

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The Executive Committee approved the proceedings of the Ethics Committee in respect of Dean, faculty & Residents at # 2 – 12. (Dr. Ravi Kumar, Dr. Ravi Prakash Agarwal, Dr. Rajnish JR in Radiology, Dr. Vijay Shankar Sharma, JR Anaesthesia, Dr. Shiven Singh, JR in Surgery, Dr. Sarvendra, JR in Surgery, Dr. Brijendra Saxena, SR in Ortho, Dr. Mohd. Isaq, SR in Surgery, Dr. Siddharth Rastogi, Sr.in Ortho, Dr. M.L. Gupta, JR in Ortho and Dean Mrs. Madhu Singhal.

With regard to # 1, Dr. Anup Agrawal, the Executive Committee observed that no decision is recorded in the summary. It is incomprehensible that a Resident would appear for verification in a particular department without verifying the details filled in the Declaration Form. Further it is also recorded that no orders of his being posted in the department of General Surgery and reverting him to General Medicine have been attached. Such movements without proper orders only raises doubt with regard to actual department in

which he is working. In view of above, the Executive Committee decided that his name be removed from IMR for a period of one year.

4.	The matter with regard to irregularities in stipend paid by M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore, to the residents pertaining to various PG Degree Courses	15th & 16th February, 2018
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The Executive Committee did not approve the proceedings of the Ethics Committee and observed that both Accounts Section & Ethics Committee have completely missed the issue which is described in decision of PG Committee as under:

“.....In the column of “Stipend paid by State Govt. to Residents”, it is shown @ Rs 25,000 p.m. to I/II/III year Residents which is incorrect. In the column of Stipend paid by the Institute to Residents” also the same amount is stated which is an attempt to mislead the Council as if the stipend paid by the Institute is equal to that paid by the State Govt. to Residents & is contrary to PG Regulations.....”

These aspects – i.e. (1) In the column of “Stipend paid by State Govt, to Residents”, it is shown @ Rs 25,000 p.m. to I/II/III year Residents which is incorrect; (2) In the column of Stipend paid by the Institute to Residents” also the same amount is stated so as to make it appear that stipend paid by the Institute is same as that paid by State Govt. which is an attempt to mislead the Council as if the stipend paid by the Institute is equal to that paid by the State Govt. to Residents - have not been examined by both Accounts Section & Ethics Committee.

In view of above, the Executive Committee referred back the matter to Ethics Committee for re-examination and take appropriate decision. Further, if it is found that stipend paid by the Institute is less than that paid by State Govt. at relevant point of time, it also should be verified whether arrears of difference of stipend between that paid by the Institute and that paid by the State Govt. and if paid, at what rates, for what period and to whom and when these arrears have been credited to the respective bank accounts.

6.	Letter/e-mail dated 12.08.2016 received from National Accreditation Board for Testing & Calibration Laboratories	15th & 16th February, 2018
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The Executive Committee observed that although its decision dt. 11/01/2015 was that “All lab reports to be signed/countersigned by persons registered with MCI/State Medical Council”, Hon’ble Supreme Court in its order has stated that “Laboratory Report can be counter signed only by a registered medical practitioner with a post graduate qualification in Pathology”. Further this order of Hon’ble Supreme Court only includes Pathology & not other disciplines.

In view of above, the Executive Committee decided that opinion of Council Advocate be taken in the matter and resubmit the same in the next meeting of Executive Committee.

11. Pathology department: Details of Service Laboratories are not provided.
12. RHTC: Details of residential accommodation available at RHTC are not provided.
13. Website: Information uploaded is sketchy as detailed in the report.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for the award of MBBS degree granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 200 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

44. Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for 100 MBBS seats at Basaveswara Medical College & Hospital, Chitradurga under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

7. There was only 1 Normal Delivery & NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment.
8. Workload of Microbiology, Cytopathology investigations was NIL.
9. Wards: Demonstration rooms are smaller than required & are inadequately furnished. Doctors' Duty rooms are inadequately furnished in some wards. In 1 Male Orthopaedic ward, register was not available.
10. RHTC: It is under the control of DMHO. Cold Chain equipment are not available.
11. UHC: It is under the control of Corporation.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve Malla Reddy Medical College for Women, Hyderabad for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

After due deliberations, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to approve the report of the Enquiry Committee. As warning has been already issued to the concerned officials along with the advisory to be more careful in future and to follow office protocol diligently, the Executive Committee decided that no further action is required in the matter.

The Committee directed that the matter be resubmitted alongwith the opinion at the next meeting.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

60. Recognition/Approval of DM Wayanad Institute of Medical Sciences, Wayanad, Kerala for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of DM Wayanad Institute of Medical Sciences, Wayanad, Kerala for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment reports (27.02.2018 and 14th& 15th March, 2018) alongwith photographs/vodeography and letter/representation dated 15.03.2018 from the Dean of the institute and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 18.93 % as detailed in the report.
2. OPD: On both days, at 09:40 a.m., most of the faculty & residents were not available.
3. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 61.69 %; however about 15 % of the patients were not genuine, reducing Bed Occupancy to 46 %. Out of these, most of the patients were admitted on a day prior to assessment.
4. Patients:-On verification of the patients on the beds (from among the 401), the following patients were notified in most of the wards, indicating the non-genuine patients. For example-

1. Mini C.K. WIMS No. 258951, Gen. Med-3, was admitted on 14.3.2018 at 9.40 pm when the institution was inspecting at 9.30 am on 14.3.2018. Nurses clinical chart was entered even for 13th doctors notes too, thereby indicating that case sheets with non genuine patients are prepared in advance.
2. Raimanath-WIMS No. 310182, OBG Ward, was admitted twice on 13.3.2018 and 14.3.2018. No case notes of the patient in the case sheet and no treatment.
3. Mr. Sivan WIMS No. 212033-Gen. Medicine-Only admission request form – Entire in patient case records including names blank.
4. Prabhashini WIMS No. 39575, OBG Ward 2-admitted with complains of excessive bleeding PV, on enquiry, she gives a history of no bleeding at all, but only pain abdomen. The same was endorsed by the Resident in the ward on the case sheet. No investigations and treatment given. Taking this into account in the wards, around 15% of the patients were non-genuine, taking the effective bed occupancy to around 46%.

Also apart from this, in the wards more than 50% of the patients were admitted on 13.3.2018, the day before the assessment.

5. Data of Radiological & Laboratory investigations given by the Institute include data of private patients &Superspecialities patients which is not permissible.
6. Wards: There is no signage of Unitwise bed distribution. No faculty & Residents were available in wards during the round.
7. ICUs: There was only 1 patient in PICU on day of assessment.
8. 4 Mobile X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6.
9. Microbiology department: 6 Service laboratories are available against requirement of 7.
10. Pharmacology department: There are NIL Specimen & NIL Model in the Museum.
11. Forensic Medicine department: Cold Storage is not available.
12. RHTC: Cold Chain equipment are not available.

13. Residents' Hostel: On verification, about 15-20 % of Residents are found to be not staying in the campus. Rooms allotted to them were closed on inspection by the assessors.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve DM Wayanad Institute of Medical Sciences, Wayanad, Kerala for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

Further the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of fresh batch of 150 MBBS students at DM Wayanad Institute of Medical Sciences, Wayanad, Kerala granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

61. Recognition/approval of MGM Medical College, Jamshedpur, Jharkhand for the award of MBBS degree granted by Kolhan University, Chaibasa against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of MGM Medical College, Jamshedpur, Jharkhand for the award of MBBS degree granted by Kolhan University, Chaibasa against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Child Welfare clinic, Child Rehabilitation clinic are not available in Paediatrics OPD. Family Welfare clinic is not available in OG OPD.
9. Wards: Teaching areas & Nursing stations are not available in some wards.
10. There were only 2 Major Operations for the whole hospital on day of assessment.
11. Casualty: Resuscitation equipment are not adequate.
12. ICUs: ABG Analyzer is not available.

13. Radiodiagnosis department: 3 Mobile X-ray machines are available against requirement of 4. 2 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5. 1 USG machine is available against 3 required.
14. CT Scan available is 4 slice against minimum 16 slice.
15. CSSD: ETO Sterilizer is not available. Receiving & Distribution points are not separate.
16. MRD: It is partly computerized. ICD X classification of Diseases is not done for indexing.
17. Canteen facility is not available.
18. Examination Hall: Total capacity of available 3 halls is 150 against requirement of 250.
19. Lecture Theaters: Capacity of 2 Lecture Theaters is 100 each against requirement of 120 each. Capacity of Hospital Lecture Theaters is 125 each against requirement of 150 each. It is not of Gallery type. Audiovisual aids are not available.
20. Central Library: 31 Journals are available against requirement of 100. NIL Internet Node is available.
21. Anatomy department: NIL cadaver is available. Histology laboratory is smaller than required.
22. Physiology department: Haematology laboratory is smaller than required.
23. Microbiology department: 4 Service Laboratories are available against requirement of 7.
24. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls do not have attached toilets.
25. RHTC: Activities under National Programmes are not carried out. Cold Chain equipment are not available. Specialists' visits are not organized. MCH/Immunization/FW registers are not available.
26. UHC: MCH/Survey/FW registers are not available. Specialists' visits are not organized.
27. No workshop was held in MEU.
28. General hygiene is poor.
29. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve MGM Medical College, Jamshedpur, Jharkhand for the award of MBBS degree granted by Kolhan University, Chaibasa against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

62. Recognition/approval of Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad for the award of MBBS degree granted by Dr. N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 200 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Medical College, Jagdapur for the award of MBBS degree granted by Pandit DeenDayal Upadhyay Health Sciences & Ayush University, Raipur against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 100 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

64. Increase of seats in MBBS course from 150 to 200 at NRI Medical College, Chinakakani, Guntur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the matter with regard to increase of seats in MBBS course from 150 to 200 at NRI Medical College, Chinakakani, Guntur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (12.03.2018) along with previous assessment reports (7th & 8th December, 2017) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant Letter of Permission for increase of seats from 150 to 200 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of NRI Medical College, Chinakakani, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for the academic year 2018-2019.

65. Compliance Verification Assessment of the other physical and the other teaching facilities available for 100 MBBS seats at MNR Medical College & Hospital, Sangareddy, Telengana under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (12.03.2018) along with previous assessment report (27th & 28th, November, 2017) and photographs/videography and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 10.31 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 16.17 % as detailed in the report.
3. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 60.7 %.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to continue the application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016 and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance after rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

The Executive Committee further decided to return the application for increase of seats in MBBS course from 100-150 at MNR Medical College & Hospital, Sangareddy under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic session 2018-19

recommending disapproval of the scheme as the college does not even fulfill the requirement of 100 admissions.

66. KMCT Medical College, Kozhikode – Renewal of Permission for admission of 3rd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2018-19.

Read: the matter with regard to KMCT Medical College, Kozhikode – Renewal of Permission for admission of 3rd Batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100-150 for the academic session 2018-19.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (14.03.2018) along with previous assessment report(18th& 19th September, 2017)and photographs/vodeography and noted the following-:

1. Deficiency of faculty is 7.75 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 16.12 % as detailed in the report.
3. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 53.11 %.
4. Patients:Many patients in different wards were admitted since two to three months. In one male medicine ward 22 patients out of 34 were admitted since 29th January/some from 30th January some from 31st January till date. There was only one patient in Dermatology ward rest of the patients as per the HOD Dermatology were shifted from Ortrhopaedics Ward. Also 49 patients admitted in different wards did not require admission were admitted for minor complaints like low backache/osteoarthritis/vertigo etc. One patient Mr. Raju with amputated leg with prosthesis explained himself that he doesn't have any health problem. Wards are not as per MCI norms.
5. There is no separate record of OPD & IPD patients in the laboratory.
6. Number of Haematology tests in the register/in the system could not be shown to the assessors during visit.
7. Cytopathology workload on day of assessment was only 3.
8. Examination Hall: Capacity of 1 Examination Hall is 227 against requirement of 250.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt .not to renew the permission for admission of 3rd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e .from 100-150 in respect of KMCT Medical College, Kozhikode under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic session 2018-19.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment),2010(Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016, which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

- (c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of MBBS degree and/or running postgraduate courses

If it is observed during any inspection/assessment of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <70%, compliance of rectification of deficiency from such an institute will not be considered for issue of renewal of permission in that Academic year and further such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in that Academic year and will be issued show cause notices as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s

11(2) of the IMC Act,1956 along with direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.”

In view of above, it was decided not to consider the Institute for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the current Academic year (2019-20) and to issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to intimate the Postgraduate Section of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) for this Institute for information and further necessary action.

6. 4 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6.
7. Examination Hall: Only 1 Examination Hall is available in the Medical College against requirement of 2. Another one is in Nursing College which is not permissible.
8. Central Library: Available area is 1,200 sq.m. against requirement of 2,400 sq.m.
9. Students' Hostel: A.C. Study room is not available.
10. Forensic Medicine department: Autopsy block is not under the control of Forensic Medicine department.
11. Canteen is not available.
12. Website: Uploaded information is sketchy as detailed in the report.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve Lala Lajpat Rai Memorial Medical College, Meerut for the award of MBBS degree granted by Ch. Charan Singh University, Meerut against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

68. Renewal of permission for admission of 3rd batch of 150 MBBS students of Mahavir Institute of Medical Sciences, Vikarabad, Telangana under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Telangana u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for admission of 3rd batch of 150 MBBS students of Mahavir Institute of Medical Sciences, Vikarabad,

Telangana under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Telangana u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (13.03.2018), previous assessment report (8th & 9th November, 2017) alongwith photographs/vodeography and representation dated 14.03.2018 from the Dean, Mahavir Institute of Medical Sciences, Vikarabad, Telangana and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 22 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents was 42.85 % as detailed in the report.
3. Patients in PICU :-PICU has three patients. Two patients Swathi and Aravin have admitted with history of Chronic pain abdomen for more than 10 days. Patients with minor problems admitted without even as IV line in the ICCU. No coronary ailment patient is admitted in the ICCU. SICU has only routine post operative patients including tubectomy, with no complications. Nursing station not available in the SICU.
4. Wards:-In Surgery ward 2 male and 4 female post operative patients are admitted for more than 10 days with no fresh complaints. Four patients who are admitted as inpatient have no personal belongings nor any attendant with them. They are admitted for complaints like Gastritis, vague abdominal pain and are on oral drugs. Out of 60 patients, 10 patients do not merit as teaching bed patients. Hence, teaching beds are counted as 50.
Obstetrics wards has 6 post natal patients. Hence out of 28 patients in Obstetrics & Gynaecology ward, only 22 are counted as teaching beds. Last date of delivery is 9.3.2018.
Ortho ward out of 21 patients, 4 are purely admitted for physiotherapy and one patient is continuing to have native treatment slab for alleged fracture even after 10 days of admission. Hence, only 16 patients are taken as teaching beds.
Dermatology, psychiatry and TB Chest patients are put together in a single open ward and no separate wards available.
5. There was NIL Normal Delivery on day of assessment as well as on preceding 3 days.
6. Data of Histopathology does not correlate with number of Major & Minor Operations.
7. Request slips for issue of blood are not available prior to 09/03/2018.
8. Casualty: There were only 4 patients at the time of visit. Crash Cart is not maintained. Disaster Trolley is not available. Emergency O.T. attached to Casualty shows last procedure on 02/03/2018 – i.e. 11 days before assessment.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report

The Executive Committee noted that Regulation 8(3)(1)(a) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016 provides as under:-

“8(3)(1).....

(a) Colleges in the stage of Letter of Permission upto II renewal (i.e. Admission of third batch)

If it is observed during any inspection/assessment of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 30% and/or bed occupancy is <50%(45% in North East, Hilly terrain etc), compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for issue of Letter of Permission (LOP)/renewal of permission in that Academic Year.”

In view of the deficiencies as noted above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to invoke Regulation 8 (3)(1)(a) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulation, 1999 and disapprove the application of Mahavir Institute of Medical Sciences, Vikarabad, Telangana under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Telanganau/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for renewal of permission of MBBS course 3rdbatch(150 seats) for the academic year 2018-2019.

69. Provision to pursue UG and PG courses by nominated candidates of friendly foreign countries at AFMS Institutes without provisional registration with MCI.

Read: the matter with regard to provision to pursue UG and PG courses by nominated candidates of friendly foreign countries at AFMS Institutes without provisional registration with MCI.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the letter dated 01.03.2018 received from Ministry of Defence, New Delhi stating therein that candidates nominated by the Friendly Foreign Countries have been undergoing undergraduate & postgraduate training at Armed Forces Medical Services institutions every year and is as part of the geopolitical and strategic partnership with these countries and the opinion of the Law Officer be obtained and matter be resubmitted at the next meeting.

70. Recognition/Approval of Mayo Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Awadh University, Faizabad, U.P. u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Mayo Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Awadh University, Faizabad, U.P. u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council perused the letter from Assessors which reads as under:

“This is to inform you that after submitting the report to the Dean, he took the help of Dr. Rahul Singh, Asstt.Prof. of Orthopedics to help him write. Till then we were not informed that Dr. Rahul Singh would be the authority to write the findings in the report.

Dr. Rahul Singh wrote all the remarks by himself on the report, without the help of the Dean, which is in gross violations of the rules.

On assessment report Dean has remarked that he has authorized Dr. Rahul Singh, Asst. prof. of Orthopaedics as the representative of the college to write remarks on the assessment report on his behalf which is not permissible.”

Further, the Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (19.03.2018) along with previous assessment report (18th& 19th December, 2017) alongwith photographs/vodeography and legal opinion dated 21.03.2018 received from the Ld. Additional Solicitor General and noted the following:-

1. Shortage of Residents was 15 % as detailed in the report.
2. Many of Residents' rooms were empty. Room no. G 08 was shown to be occupied by 4 Residents; on verification it was found to be occupied by family of Dr. Jhansi, Asst. prof. of Biochemistry. Considering all factors, > 30 % Residents are not staying in the campus, taking effective shortage to 41.12 %.
3. Authorities have not submitted bank account statements of faculty & Residents.

4. OFAMOS was not functional on day of assessment.
5. OPD attendance upto 2 p.m. on day of assessment was 1,097 against requirement of 1,200.
6. There was gross mismatch in OPD attendance of 4 Major departments – i.e. General Medicine, General Surgery, Orthopaedics & O.G. between computerized data & actually verified by assessors.
7. No injection was given in OPD till 2:30 p.m. There was NIL needle in needle cutter at time of visit.
8. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 52 %.
9. Many non-genuine cases were admitted as detailed in the report.
10. Patients:- On physical verification of the patients in the wards, non-genuine cases had been admitted. For example,

- (a) Surgery: Most of the patients who were shown as being operated in the wards (with operative notes) have admitted that no surgery was done. On verification the same was confirmed.

Surgery (Female) : Patient by name Susham d/o Veerender IP No. 180309060 admitted for Cholecystitis. In the case sheets, operative notes for Cholecystectomy operation done on 15.3.2018 is mentioned. On clinical examination of the patients, no signs of any operation done- open or laproscopic.

Surgery (Male): Patient by name Pyarelal with IP No. 180317019 admitted on 17.2.18 with Cholelithiasis. There is no investigation specific to the diagnosis like USG done. No notes for the patient on 18.3.18 and 19.3.18 as well as treatment. Patient name Ramsingh son of Guruprasad admitted on 14.3.2018 with IP number 180314040 with benign Prostatic hyperplasia. In his case sheet TURP (Transurethral Resection of Prostrate) operation was done on 15.3.2018. On enquiring from the patient, he mentioned that no surgery was performed and the case papers 16.3.2018 and 17.3.2018 show no post operative notes. No daily notes too in the casxe sheets.

Kishan Lal son of Shivram IP No. 180314036 admitted with right sided hydrocele on 14.3.2018. Operative notes how that operative intervention was done 15.3.2017. On questioning and examining the patient, there was no evidence of any operative intervention been done.

- (b) (1) Patient by name Divya Trivdi with IP No. 180314039 having a final diagnosis of Colle's fracture on right side in the case sheet due to fall one day back. Operative notes show reduction and immbolization. But no splint and plaster case was present on the upper limb of the patient.
 (2) Tarimeen Banu with IP No. 180314086 admitted on 14.3.2018 having 1 cm diameter ganglion cyst on the lefvt wrist, with no operative intervention for the past 5 days after admission. This is usually done as a day care surgery. Patients were admitted with vague complaints like low back ache and doubtful OA knee conditions.
- (c) Medicine Ward: Patients with vague symptoms like general weakness etc who do not merit admission are admitted in the ward. (1) Patient by name Gopi, with IP No. 180309070 admitted on 9.3.2018 with general weakness. No investigations were done for this patient. Daily only vital signs were recorded. (2) Patient by name Kunj Bihai, IP No. 180313083 admitted with Enteric fever on 13.3.2018 but till date on 19.3.2018 no wital test was done.
- (d) Paediatric Ward: Only 4 children had parents as attenders. Rest had no parents or any attenders and even no evidence of any medicine been given to them. One ward had examination going on, in the ward, the 4 patients with parents were present. The remaining two wards outside the examination ward had no examination in process and none of the children had any parent with them.
- (e) Obstetric Ward: Babita Singh IP No. 180314051 admitted on 14.3.2018 and in the case sheet it has been recorded as full term pregnancy and

delivered the same day. No delivery notes in the case sheet. No obstetric history in the case sheet and no notes of neonate. The patient had no neonate with her. The patient admits that she goes and comes everyday and the same was endorsed by the Medical Superintendent in the case sheet. Taking into consideration 30% of the admitted patients did not merit admission, taking the effective bed occupancy to 37%.

11. There was only 1 Normal Delivery & NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment. There was no woman in labour room.
12. OPD: There are no Specialty clinics in Paediatrics OPD. Infertility clinic is not available in OG OPD. Colposcope is not functional. No records of Family Welfare clinic were available.
13. Wards: O₂ pipelines are not connected to beds.
14. Casualty: There were 9 patients on 25 beds; all the patients did not warrant admission in Casualty. Some patients were there for > 24 hours.
15. ICUs: There was NIL patient in PICU, only 1 patient in NICU & 2 patients in ICCU without symptoms meriting admission in ICCU & 2 patients in SICU with minor complaints, not related to Surgery & did not merit admission in SICU. MICU had 3 patients who had no finding of any significance on case paper as well as clinically. None of ICUs had any doctors.
16. Blood Bank: Only 1 Unit was issued till 3 p.m.
17. MRD: ICD X classification of diseases was not functional.
18. RHTC: No vaccines are available.
19. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

The Executive Committee also perused the legal opinion dated 21.03.18 from the Ld. Additional Solicitor General. The operative part of the Legal opinion reads as under:-

"...In light of the above mentioned factual matrix, I am of the considered view that the medical colleges cannot obstruct or restrict or resist the Physical Assessment from being carried out by the querist's Assessor and in case they do, then the said action shall be considered to be in violation of the scheme of the IMC Act, 1956 and the Regulations made thereunder. Therefore, in order to ensure the safety of the Assessors the querist should make sure that a medical college does not resort to such practice of ill-treating, threatening, pressuring, manhandling etc. the Assessors or in any way harassing them. In such cases, the querist is required to recommend to the Central Govt. to not consider the case of such medical college for permission/renewal of permission/ recognition for that particular academic year. Hence, in the case of the applicant medical college, it will be appropriate for the querist to reject their application for grant of renewal of permission /recognition for the present academic year i.e. 2018-19, as such behavior cannot be accepted. To avoid such incidences in the future, the querist may issue a circular in this regard and inform all the medical colleges/institutions, regarding the proposed actions to be taken by the querist, in case of any harassment or ill-treatment or obstruction to the querist's Assessors."

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve Mayo Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Awadh University, Faizabad, U.P. u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

Further the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of fresh batch of 150 MBBS students at Mayo Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh granted by Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Awadh University, Faizabad, U.P. u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

71. Recognition/Approval of ICARE Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Haldia, West Bengal for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by The West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of ICARE Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Haldia, West Bengal for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by The West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (20th March, 2018) along with previous assessment report (8th & 9th November, 2017) along with letter dated 20.03.2018 received from the college authorities and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty was 100 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of residents was 100 % as detailed in the report.
3. Medical College & Hospital were closed; hence data of clinical material and infrastructure could not be verified.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve ICARE Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Haldia, West Bengal for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by The West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

Further the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of fresh batch of 100 MBBS students at ICARE Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Haldia, West Bengal granted by The West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

The Executive Committee of the Council also noted the order dated 21.09.2017 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in WP (C) No. 633/2017 filed by Indian Center for Advancement of Research and Education, Haldia (ICARE) and Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. which reads as under:-

"... 40. Though we have so held, we think it appropriate to direct that the students who have been admitted in the respective courses shall be permitted to continue in the courses and the students who pass out from the institution, the MCI shall see to it that they conferred degrees".....

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant recognition u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 to the degrees awarded by The West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata to the students admitted in ICARE Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Haldia, West Bengal in MBBS course in the Academic Year 2011-12 only.

72. Recognition/Approval of Govt. Medical College, Manjeri, Kerala for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Govt. Medical College, Manjeri, Kerala for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment reports (27th February and 19th & 20th March, 2018) and noted the following:-

1. Nursing staff: 234 Nursing staff are available against 247 required.
2. OPD: Rooms are small & overcrowded. Dressing rooms for males/females are not available. Minor O.T. is smaller than required. Dark room in Ophthalmology is used for dining by Technicians.
3. Wards: Pantry is not available in any ward. Demonstration rooms are not attached to each ward. Total 3 Demonstration rooms are available amongst all wards. Distance between 2 beds is < 1.5 m.
4. Casualty: It is not as per norms. Separate Casualty for O.G. is not available.
5. O.T.: 6 Major O.T.s are available against requirement of 7. 2 tables are present in 2 O.T.s which is not as per norms.
6. ICUs: Only 2 patients were admitted in SICU.
7. 3 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5.
8. CT Scan is dual slice against minimum 16 slice required.
9. MRD: it is partially computerized.
10. Central Library: Capacity of Students' Reading room (Inside) is 75 against requirement of 100.
11. Students' Hostels: 38 boys are accommodated in dormitory which is not permissible.
12. Residents' Hostels: 10 rooms are 4 seater which is not permissible. Even so, available accommodation is 55 against requirement of 62.
13. Nurses' Hostel: All rooms are 4 seater which is not permissible.
14. Residential quarters: Only 12 quarters are available for Non-teaching staff against requirement of 36. There is NIL occupancy of both faculty & Non-teaching staff quarters.
15. RHTC: Dormitory is under renovation. Specialists' visits are not organized.
16. UHC: Specialists' visits are not organized.
17. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve Govt. Medical College, Manjeri, Kerala for the award of MBBS degree (100 seats) granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

73. Compliance Verification Assessment of the other physical and the other teaching facilities available for 150 MBBS seats (Show Cause) at Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences, Karad under Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences, (Deemed University) Karad.

Read: the matter with regard to compliance verification assessment of the other physical and the other teaching facilities available for 150 MBBS seats (Show Cause) at Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences, Karad under Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences, (Deemed University) Karad.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (21.03.2018) along with previous assessment reports (11th & 12th December, 2017 and 2nd & 3rd January, 2018) and decided to revoke the decision of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to process the application for recognition against increase of seats and office was directed to act accordingly.

74. Compliance Verification Assessment of the other physical and the other teaching facilities available for 150 MBBS seats at Meenakshi Medical College Hospital & Research Institute, Enathur, Kanchipuram under Meenakshi Academy of Higher Education and Research (Meenkashi University), Chennai.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (16.03.2018) along with previous assessment reports (11th& 12th December, 2017) and decided to revoke the decision of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010.

75. Recognition/approval of Maharajah's Institute of Medical Sciences, Nellimarla under Dr. N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Maharajah's Institute of Medical Sciences, Nellimarla under Dr. N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (22.03.2018) along with previous assessment reports (19th& 20th December, 2017) and decided to recommend to the Central Government for recognition/approval of Maharajah's Institute of Medical Sciences, Nellimarla for the award of MBBS degree granted by Dr. N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ...

(2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of MBBS degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

(3) The procedure for 'Renewal' of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.

(4) Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute.

76. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 2nd batch (150 seats) of East Point College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (7th February, 2018), previous assessment report (25th& 26th September, 2017) alongwith a letter dated 08.02.2018 received from the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch (150 seats) of East Point College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic session 2018-19.

77. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 4th batch (150 seats) of K D Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course for 4th batch (150 seats) of K D Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

The Executive Committee of the Council observed that at its meeting dt. 25/10/2017, it was decided as under:

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of 150 MBBS students at K D Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(b) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(b) Colleges in the stage from III & IV renewal (i.e. Admission of fourth & fifth batch)

If it is observed during any inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 20% and/or bed occupancy is <65%, compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic year.”

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 21.12.2017 received from the Central Govt., Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the representation/compliance dated 19.12.2017 submitted by the, KD Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh.

The Executive Committee noted that the Ministry under its Committee had given personal hearing to the authorized representatives of the medical colleges/applicants on 15/18/19.12.2017 and forwarded observations/recommendations of the Committee constituted by the Ministry in the matter, which is as under:-

“In view of the compliance submitted by the college recommended for review by MCI.”

The Executive Committee noted that the said compliance as submitted by the college authorities was considered by the Sub-Committee at its meeting held

on 12.01.2018. The recommendations/observations of the Sub-Committee is as under:-

"It is observed that, with regard to Notice 8(3)(1)(b). It is submitted that "Shortage of Resident 21.2% (14 out of 66) is not correct. Dr. Surendra Nath Tiwari, Junior Resident in Dermatology was not considered for salary proof which was not demanded by assessors. Salary proof was submitted within 48 hours. After the assessment as per MCI assessors guide. Therefore shortage of residents should be considered as 19.69% (13 out of 66) instead of 21.2. Dr. Surendra Nath Tiwari is working at present".

In view of above, opinion of Law Officer be taken as to whether compliance can be considered for verification by assessment or not and thereafter, as in similar cases, matter may be referred to the Oversight Committee."

The Executive Committee of the Council also perused the legal opinion of the Law Officer as under:-

"The file of Undergraduate Section of K.D. Medical College, Mathura has been referred for my opinion.

2. *In this regard, on perusal of pre-page noting it is observed that Regulation 8 (3) (1) (b) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 has been invoked by the Executive Committee on 25.10.17. This decision was approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee on 16.11.2017. Thereafter vide Council letter dated 21.11.17 the decision has been conveyed to the Central Government. The Central Government has vide letter dated 21.12.17, after grant of hearing to the representatives of the College has forwarded compliance/representation dated 19.12.17 of the College Authorities. The Hearing Committee of the Central Government has recommended for review of the scheme by MCI.*

3. *It may be recalled that the Hon'ble Division Bench of the Hon'ble Delhi High Court in WP (C) No. 5041/2015 titled as Shree ChhatrapatiShivaji Education Society &Anr. Vs. Union of India &Anr., vide its judgment dated 28.05.2015, had upheld the validity of Regulation 8(3)(1) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 and no opportunity could be granted to an institution who had failed to fulfil the minimum requirements as provided in the said Regulations. The said judgment had been challenged before the Hon'ble Supreme Court wherein no stay was granted and leave was granted in the matter. It is also necessary to note that the Hon'ble Larger Bench of the Hon'ble Delhi High Court in WP (C) No. 7106/2015 titled as Malla Reddy Institute of Medical Science &Anr. Vs. Union of India &Anr. And WP (C) No. 8541/2015 titled as Lord Buddha SikshaPratisthan&Anr. Vs. Union of India &Anr., vide its judgment dated 29.09.2015 had even though upheld the validity of the aforesaid Regulations however had observed that an opportunity should be given to the medical college to rectify the deficiencies. The Council had approached the Hon'ble Supreme Court by way of SLP (C) No.31535/2015- Medical Council of India Vs. Malla Reddy Institute of Medical Science &Anr. And SLP (C) No.30742/2015- Medical Council of India Vs. Lord Buddha SikshaPratisthan&Anr. against the judgment dated 29.09.2015 passed by the Hon'ble Larger Bench of the Hon'ble Delhi High Court. The Hon'ble Supreme Court vide its judgment dated 27.04.2016 in the aforementioned matters has set-aside the judgment dated 29.09.2015 passed by the Hon'ble Larger Bench of the Hon'ble Delhi High Court and has allowed the appeals filed by the Council. Thus the judgment dated 28.05.2015 passed by the Hon'ble Division Bench of the Hon'ble Delhi High Court in WP (C) No. 5041/2015 titled as Shree ChhatrapatiShivaji Education Society &Anr.*

Vs. Union of India &Anr., stands revived and is the authoritative pronouncement on the validity of Regulation 8(3)(1) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999.

4. *In view of the provision of Regulation 8 (3) (1) (a) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 referred above, wherein it is provided that “compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic Year. “, it is not permissible in law for the Council to consider the compliance/representation submitted by the College.*

5. *It may be recalled that the Central Government had in the cases of Adesh Medical College & Hospital, Shahabad, Haryana and Vishwabharti Medical College, Kurnool, the Executive Committee had recommended for application of Regulation 8 (3) (1) (a) (b) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 and the Central Government had asked the Council to review the scheme. The Council office vide letter dated 20.12.17 had sought the guidance of Oversight Committee stating that “it is not permissible in law for the Council to consider the compliance/representation submitted by the College”.*

6. *The Oversight Committee vide its decision conveyed vide D. NO. OC2/2018/351-52 dated 09.01.2018 accorded approval to the MCI decision of not seeking compliance/representation.*

7. *The present matter is also similarly situated and in view of the binding provisions of the Regulation it is not permissible for the Council to consider the compliance/representation that has been received. Therefore, the earlier decision may be reiterated.”*

The Executive Committee further noted the letter dated 19.02.2018 received from the Secretary, Oversight Committee, New Delhi stating therein as under:-

“Please refer to Medical Council of India letters dated 31.01.2018, on the above mentioned subjects, the Oversight Committee considered the Council’s proposal and documents furnished to it. The Oversight Committee has approved the Council proposal contained in the above mentioned letters...”

In view of the decision of Oversight Committee dt. 19/02/2018, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to reiterate its earlier decision to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 4th batch of 150 MBBS students at K D Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(b) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(b) Colleges in the stage from III & IV renewal (i.e. Admission of fourth & fifth batch)

If it is observed during any inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 20% and/or bed occupancy is <65%, compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic year.”

78. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch (150 seats) of Vishwabharthi Medical College, Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch (150 seats) of Vishwabharthi Medical College, Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

The Executive Committee of the Council observed that at its meeting dt. 26/09/2017, it was decided as under:

“... ”

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch of 150 MBBS students at Vishwabharthi Medical College, Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(b) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(b) Colleges in the stage from III renewal (i.e. Admission of fourth batch) till recognition of the institute for award of MBBS degree

If it is observed during any inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 20% and/or bed occupancy is <65%, compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic year.”

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 4.12.2017 received from the Central Govt., Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the representation/compliance dated 25.11.2017 submitted by the Principal, Vishwabharthi Medical College, Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh .

The Executive Committee noted that the Ministry under its Committee had given personal hearing to the authorized representatives of the medical colleges/applicants on 27/28.11.2017 and forwarded observations/recommendations of the Committee constituted by the Ministry in the matter, which is as under:-

“Submission as made by the college at column 4. The deficiency of faculty and residents is marginal and has been well explained by the college. Other submission is also largely acceptable. Recommended for review by MCI.”

The Executive Committee noted that the said compliance as submitted by the college authorities was considered by the Sub-Committee at its meeting held on 14.12.2017. The recommendations/observations of the Sub-Committee is as under:-

“Decision of issuing Notice u/s 8(3)(1)(b) was conveyed to Central Govt. with the approval of Oversight Committee appointed by Hon’ble Supreme Court. Hence opinion of Oversight Committee be taken in the matter.”

The Executive Committee also noted the letters dated 03.01.2018 and 09.01.2018 received from the Secretary, Oversight Committee, New Delhi stating therein as under:-

“With reference to the above mentioned Council letters dated 20.12.2017, the Oversight Committee considered the subject matter on the basis of the

documents furnished, in its Seventh meeting held on 02.01.2018 and decided as under:-

“As per the provisions of the MCI Regulations, up held by the Hon’ble Supreme Court, the recommendation of the MCI conveyed by the Council vide letters dated 20.12.2017 in all the above mentioned three cases is approved by the Oversight Committee.....”

In view of the above decision of the Oversight Committee, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to reiterate the earlier decision to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch of 150 MBBS students at Vishwabharthi Medical College, Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(b) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(b) Colleges in the stage from III renewal (i.e. Admission of fourth batch) till recognition of the institute for award of MBBS degree

If it is observed during any inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 20% and/or bed occupancy is <65%, compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic year.”

79. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch (150 seats) of P.K. Das Institute of Medical Sciences, Palakkad, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch (150 seats) of P.K. Das Institute of Medical Sciences, Palakkad, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

The Executive Committee of the Council observed that at its meeting dt. 22/11/2017, it was decided as under:

“... ”

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch of 150 MBBS students at P.K. Das Institute of Medical Sciences, Palakkad, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(b) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(b) Colleges in the stage from III & IV renewal (i.e. Admission of fourth & fifth batch)

If it is observed during any inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 20% and/or bed occupancy is <65%, compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic year.”

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 15.1.2018 received from the Central Govt., Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the representation/compliance dated 5.1.2018 submitted by the Principal, P.K Das Institute of Medical Sciences, Palakkad, Kerala.

The Executive Committee noted that the Ministry under its Committee had given personal hearing to the authorized representatives of the medical colleges/applicants on 9.1.2018 and forwarded observations/recommendations of the Committee constituted by the Ministry in the matter, which is as under:-

“Submissions as made by the college at column 4.

The college has been able to explain the deficiency of faculty and OPD attendance which was counted only till 2.00 PM. The submission regarding Bed occupancy is not entirely satisfactory.

In view of the nature of the deficiencies and compliance submitted by the college, the matter may be referred to MCI for review including imposition of clause (8)(3)(1)(b).”

The Executive Committee noted that the said compliance as submitted by the college authorities was considered by the Sub-Committee at its meeting held on 6.2.2018. The recommendations/observations of the Sub-Committee is as under:-

“As notice u/s 8(3)(1)(b) is issued, opinion of Law Officer be obtained regarding whether compliance verification is to be carried out or not and thereafter, as in similar cases, matter may be referred to the Oversight Committee.

The Executive Committee also perused the opinion of the Ld. ASG Smt. Pinky Anand dated 07.02.2018, the operative part is as under:-

“... In light of the above mentioned factual matrix, I am of the considered view that the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, in the above mentioned judgments have categorically held that if a medical college is found to be deficient beyond the limit as prescribed in the Regulation 8(3)(1)(a) or 8(3)(1)(b) or 8(3)(1)(c) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, neither the Central Govt. nor the querist shall grant any further opportunity of rectifying the deficiencies and the application of the concerned medical college can be rejected for the said academic year. Therefore, in the present cases also, once the medical colleges are found to be grossly deficient in the latest physical inspection, due to which they fall within the ambit of Regulation 8(3)(1)(a) or 8(3)(1)(b) or 8(3)(1)(c) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, the querist is not obliged to grant any opportunity to the medical colleges to fulfill the deficiencies. However, in those cases where, the deficiencies are within the permissible limit, as prescribed under Regulation 8(3)(1)(a) or 8(3)(1)(b) or 8(3)(1)(c) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulation, 1999, the querist is bound to grant opportunity of rectification of deficiencies and thereafter, communicated the recommendation to the Govt. of India.”

The Executive Committee also noted the letter 28.02.2018 received from the Secretary, Oversight Committee, New Delhi stating therein as under:-

“In view of the provision of Regulation 8(3)(1)(b) of the Establishment of Medical College regulations, 1999 referred above, wherein it is provided that “compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not

be considered for renewal of permission in that academic year”, it is not permissible in law for the Council to consider the compliance/representation submitted by the College....”

In view of the opinion of Ld. ASG and the decision of the Oversight Committee, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to reiterate the earlier decision to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch of 150 MBBS students at P.K. Das Institute of Medical Sciences, Palakkad, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(b) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(b) Colleges in the stage from III & IV renewal (i.e. Admission of fourth & fifth batch)

If it is observed during any inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 20% and/or bed occupancy is <65%, compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic year.”

80. Renewal of permission for admission of 3rd batch of 150 MBBS students at Raipur Institute of Medical Sciences, Raipur, Chhattisgarh under Chhattisgarh Ayush and Health Sciences University, Raipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for admission of 3rd batch of 150 MBBS students at Raipur Institute of Medical Sciences, Raipur, Chhattisgarh under Chhattisgarh Ayush and Health Sciences University, Raipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Executive Committee of the Council observed that at its meeting dt. 14/12/2017, it was decided as under:

“... ”

In view of the deficiencies as noted above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to invoke Regulation 8 (3)(1)(a) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulation, 1999 and disapprove the application of the Raipur Institute of Medical Sciences, Raipur, Chhattisgarh under Chhattisgarh Ayush and Health Sciences University, Raipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for renewal of permission of MBBS course 3rd batch (150 seats) for the academic year 2018-2019.”

The Committee further decided to refer the matter to the Ethics Committee of the Council.”

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the letter dated 12.2.2018 received from the Central Govt., Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the representation/compliance dated 5.2.2018 submitted by the Chairperson, Lord Buddha Educational Society, Raipur (Raipur Institute of Medical Sciences, Raipur).

The Executive Committee noted that the Ministry under its Committee had given personal hearing to the authorized representatives of the medical colleges/applicants on 5/6.2.2018 and forwarded observations/recommendations of the Committee constituted by the Ministry in the matter, which is as under:-

“Submissions as made by the College at Column 4. In view of the observations made by assessors regarding patients, the functioning of the hospital is in serious doubt. The college has denied these observations but did not submit any case sheet to the committee. The committee also observes that many doctors in the college have been issued appointment orders as residents and then continuation as faculty and vice-versa. However, the college has submitted appointment letters, letter to bank for credit of salary to the faculty/residents.

In view of above, the compliance submitted by the college, recommended for review by MCI.”

The Executive Committee noted that the said compliance as submitted by the college authorities was considered by the Sub-Committee at its meeting held on 21.2.2018. The recommendations/observations of the Sub-Committee is as under:-

“ As Notice u/s 8(3)(1)(a) is issued, opinion of Oversight Committee be taken whether compliance verification assessment is to be carried out or not.”

The Executive Committee also took note of the Order of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi dated 06.03.2018, operative part of which reads as under:-

“.....Ld. Counsel for the respondents, who appear on advance notice, assure the Court that the decision on the review of the petitioner's application will be taken by respondent no. 2 within 5 weeks in accordance with the Regulations as also the contents of letter dated 13.02.2018 written by respondent no. 1 to respondent no. 2.

The present petition is accordingly disposed of binding respondent no. 2 to the statement to decide the petitioner's application within 5 weeks....”

The Executive Committee also noted the letter 08.03.2018 received from the Secretary, Oversight Committee, New Delhi stating therein as under:-

“In view of the provision of Regulation 8(3)(1)(a) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 referred above, wherein it is provided that “compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic year. “, it is not permissible in law for the Council to consider the compliance/representation submitted by the College.”

In view of the above decision of the Oversight Committee, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to reiterate the earlier decision to recommend to the Central Govt. to invoke Regulation 8 (3)(1)(a) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulation, 1999 and disapprove the application of the Raipur Institute of Medical Sciences, Raipur, Chhattisgarh under Chhattisgarh Ayush and Health Sciences University, Raipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for renewal of permission of MBBS course 3rd batch(150 seats) for the academic year 2018-2019. The Committee further decided to refer the matter to the Ethics Committee of the Council.

81. Renewal of permission for admission of 3rd batch of 150 MBBS students at Sambharam Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Kolar, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for admission of 3rd batch of 150 MBBS students at Sambharam Institute of Medical Sciences &

Research, Kolar, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (22.03.2018) along with previous assessment report (09th& 10th November, 2017) and photographs/vodeography and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 46 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 55.10 % as detailed in the report.
3. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 20 %.
4. There was only 1 Major & NIL Minor Operation on day of assessment. Although 7 patients were shown to be on list for Surgery, till 10 a.m. none of 4 O.T.s was functional & only 1 patient was present in Pre-operative area.
5. There was NIL Normal Delivery & NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment.
6. Histopathology workload was NIL & Cytopathology workload was only 2 on day of assessment.
7. There was NIL woman in Labour Room on day of assessment.
8. CT Scan is not available.
9. ICUs: There was NIL patient in SICU & NICU and only 1 patient each in ICCU & PICU.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt .not to renew the permission for admission of 3rdbatch of 150 MBBS students at Sambharam Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Kolar, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(b) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment),2010(Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(b) Colleges in the stage from III & IV renewal (i.e. Admission of fourth & fifth batch)

If it is observed during any inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 20% and/or bed occupancy is <65%, compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic year.

82. Recognition/approval of Shridevi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Hospital, Tumkur, Karnataka for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Shridevi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Hospital, Tumkur, Karnataka for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (22nd March, 2018) along with previous assessment report (17th& 18th November, 2017), photographs/vodeography and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 7.57 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 22.50 % as detailed in the report.

3. Resident Hostel: No separate resident hotels. Girl residents are placed in the ground floor of the hospital and male SRs are in the 3rd floor of the hospital. Jr. Residents (Boys) are occupying the ground floor of the boys (students) hostel. The following was noticed on random verification:
 - (i) In girls resident room, for example in room No.S-04, allotment letter of Dean shows, 2 Obgyn SRs. Dr. Rachana and Dr. Kusuma staying along with Dr. Kavyashree, ENT SR. On verification of the same room, it was found occupied by Dr. Venkatrajamma PR, Associate Professor and Dr. Kavyashree, SR of ENT Department. Signed evidence of the occupant of the room is attached herewith.
 - (ii) Most of the rooms had similar kind of belongings scattered in the room, there is no mess facility and no sign of utilization of the restrooms etc. taking this into consideration, it can be assumed that around 50% of the residents are not staying in campus.
4. OPD attendance upto 2 p.m. on day of assessment was 1,147 against requirement of 1,200.
5. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 42 %. After excluding non-genuine patients, it is 35.69 %.
6. Patient : - In many of the wards, patients with non specific complaints and not requiring admissions were admitted. Or they were admitted but no active treatment or investigations were done. In many of the case records, notes are written in separate case sheets, with no dates, and separate IP admit cards are placed with no time of admission and no signature of any staff, doctor, no diagnosis etc. leading to the conclusion that case sheets have been written before hand and admit cards are placed on the date of assessment.

From among the patients (273 cases who were in the beds, the following similar trend of patients were noticed, to quote, a few, examples are given below:

1. Susheela V, IP No.183160055, was admitted in Orthopaedics ward on 16/03/2018, with fracture both bone Right forearm – on examination, the patient had no fracture and no x-ray was done and the patient was deemed fit for discharge on 22/03/2018.
2. Akkamama IP No.1803170050, in Ophthalmology ward has different IPD numbers in case sheet and in admit card. Case sheet number is 1803170056. Patient admitted on 17/03/2018, but notes of 19/03/2018 and 22/03/2018 are only available.
3. Gangamma, IP No.1803220022, Ophthalmology ward was admitted on 22/03/2018, but had case notes written even for 21/03/2018.
4. In Orthopaedics ward, most of the female patients were admitted for non-specific complaints, knee pain, shoulder pain and shoulder pain.
5. Punneet in Male medical IP No.1803200016 admitted since 20/03/2018, no active treatment started or investigation done.
6. Gangamma IP No.180320061, No active treatment of investigation done
7. In female medical, about 6 patients with names, Rupa, Tara, Ashwini, Padmavathy, Gangamma and Manjura had no IP case sheets and did not merit any admissions.
Patients had no belongings with them. Non-genuine among patients in the beds is more than 15% taking the effective bed occupancy to 35.69%.
7. ICUs: There were only 2 patients in SICU on day of assessment. Non Cardiac patients are admitted in ICCU.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend not to recognize/approve Shridevi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Hospital, Tumkur, Karnataka for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats)

granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

Further the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of fresh batch of 150 MBBS students at Shridevi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Hospital, Tumkur, Karnataka granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

83. Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Ananthapuram, A.P. under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada – Reg.

Read: the matter with regard to Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Ananthapuram, A.P. under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (21st March, 2018) along with the previous assessment reports (11th October, 2017, 21st July, 2017, 4th May, 2017, 11th November, 2016 and 16th & 17th May, 2016) and decided and decided to recommend that recognition of MBBS degree granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Ananthapuram, A.P. be continued restricting the number of admission to 100 students.

The Executive Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Sections 8(3)(2), 8(3)(3) & 8(3)(4) of the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment), 2010 (Part II) dated 16th April, 2010 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

8 (3) ...

- (2) The recognition so granted to an Undergraduate Course for award of degree shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.
- (3) The procedure for 'Renewal' of recognition shall be same as applicable for the award of recognition.
- (4) Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub clause (a) supra shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Undergraduate Course of MBBS at the said institute.

84. Renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch (150 seats) of The Oxford Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Yadavanahalli, Bangalore, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

Read: the matter with regard to renewal of permission for MBBS course for 5th batch (150 seats) of The Oxford Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Yadavanahalli, Bangalore, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (22.03.2018), previous assessment report (25th & 26th September, 2017) along with letter/representation dated 23.03.2018 received from the college authorities, photographs/vodeography and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 20.45 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 41.25 % as detailed in the report.
3. Dr. P. Saraswathi Devi was constantly insisting, arguing & pressurizing for half an hour to accept Dr. Adhiman, Senior Resident even though he had not signed attendance sheet in morning & also when he was not present in O.T. when Assessor had verified & noted faculty/Residents working or present in O.T. along with Medical Superintendent.
4. OPD attendance upto 2 p.m. on day of assessment was 703 against requirement of 1,200.
5. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 37.38 %.
6. Patients-5 patients had the diagnosis of Acid peptic Disease, they had no symptoms and were peacefully sleeping in the ward – not counted. 1 patient with diabetic foot did not have any wound and could walk normally – not counted. One patient claimed to be having rt sided post auricular dermoid could not be traced anywhere in the ward. In Obstetrics ward 2 patients were admitted on 22nd but their OPD cases were blank. Case sheets were also blank. 1 patient of diagnosis hyperemesis Gravidarum on asking complained of Mild Headache and no vomiting at all.
7. There was NIL Normal Delivery & NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment.
8. Histopathology workload was only 1 on day of assessment.
9. O.T.: Only 3 Operations were going when visited. No other patient was in Pre-operative or Post-operative area.
10. ICU: There was NIL Cardiac patient in ICCU. In other ICUs also, several patients did not merit admission as detailed in the report
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt .not to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch of 150 MBBS students at The Oxford Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Yadavanahalli, Bangalore, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019 and further decided to apply clause 8(3)(1)(b) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18th March, 2016 which reads as under:-

8(3)(1).....

(b) Colleges in the stage from III & IV renewal (i.e. Admission of fourth & fifth batch)

If it is observed during any inspection of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 20% and/or bed occupancy is <65%, compliance of rectification of deficiencies from such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission in that Academic year.

85. Recognition/Approval of Annapoorna Medical College & Hospital, Salem, Tamilnadu for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of Annapoorna Medical College & Hospital, Salem, Tamilnadu for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (22nd March, 2018) alongwith photographs/ videography and previous assessment report (20th & 21st December, 2017) and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 29.54 % as detailed in the report.

2. Shortage of Residents is 23.75 % as detailed in the report.
3. Printout of Biometric attendance was not available & was not provided.
4. OPD attendance upto 2 p.m. on day of assessment was 776 against requirement of 1,200. There was disparity between OPD attendance data & number of patients present in the respective OPDs. Most of OPDs were run by Interns only & no senior faculty was present.
5. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 4.76 %.
6. Patients-Patient name Jagannath male ortho ward reg no.45467 was admitted for over a week for Osteo Arthritis for physiotherapy only. Patient Vinod Kumar in Male Surgical Ward is admitted for UIT Another female patient IP No.6092 name Chitraselvi admitted for PID. There may be many other such patients with trivial complaints admitted.
7. There was NIL Normal Delivery on day of assessment.
8. Data of Laboratory Investigations provided by the Institute do not match.
9. Wards: Few wards were opening during the round of Assessors. Ancillary facilities were not available in the wards.
10. Casualty: Duty roster was not available.
11. ICUs: There was NIL patient in SICU, PICU & NICU. Patients admitted in ICCU & MICU did not merit admission in intensive care. Only Interns were on duty. ABG Analyzer was not available.
12. O.T.: Out of 9 O.T.s, only 2 were functional on day of assessment.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to recognize/approve Annapoorna Medical College & Hospital, Salem, Tamilnadu for the award of MBBS degree (150 seats) granted by the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

The Committee further decided to continue the application of clause 8)3)(1)(c (of Establishment of Medical College Regulation)Amendment(, 2010)Part II (dated 16thApril, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016.

Further the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of fresh batch of 150 MBBS students at Annapoorna Medical College & Hospital, Salem, Tamilnadu granted by Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

86. Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for 100 MBBS seats (Show Cause) at Al-Ameen Medical College & Hospital, Bijapur, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

Read: the matter with regard to compliance verification assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for 100 MBBS seats (Show Cause) at Al-Ameen Medical College & Hospital, Bijapur, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (22.03.2018) along with previous assessment report (06.12.2017 & 07.12.2017), photographs/vodeography and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 8.8 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 6.15 % as detailed in the report.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to revoke the decision of application of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016 and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance after rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

Further the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of fresh batch of 100 to 150 MBBS students at Al-Ameen Medical College & Hospital, Bijapur, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

87. Recognition/approval of SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats.

Read: the matter with regard to recognition/approval of SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the assessment reports (16.02.2018– Assessment Form C of General Medicine, General Surgery including Orthopedics, Obst. & Gynaecology and Paediatrics) and assessment report (21st & 22nd March, 2018 - Part-I & Part-II), photographs/vodeography and noted the following:-

1. Deficiency of faculty is 12.70 % as detailed in the report.
2. Shortage of Residents is 24.13 % as detailed in the report.
3. Data of OPD attendance as provided by Institute are inflated. At 1 p.m., it was 681 against requirement of 1,200.
4. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 49 %.
5. Patients-Dermatology, Chest & TB & Psychiatry Male & Female Wards are mixed together sharing demo room nursing station and all other facilities in common. Lock of Duty room in Respiratory Medicine Department have to be broken open so female doctors have no access to toilet. Pantry of Respiratory Medicine Department was locked and keys were never available. Female intern's hostel is 2.5 km away from RHTC. Biomedical Waste disposal not appropriate in Respiratory Medicine ward and there is no disposal of syringe this is reportable offence.
6. Patients-Patient Yellamma 590361 had no drugs with her and when pharmacy records did not match evidence. Many patients had no notes for 4 or 5 days and it was written 'patient not found in bed' on their case papers in one ward there were average of 5 to 10 such patients. In Psychiatry patients from OPD were brought to the ward in front of assessors and bed sheets were being put hurriedly.
7. Casualty: Disaster Trolley is not available.
8. ICUs: There was only 1 patient in ICCU, PICU & SICU and only 2 patients in MICU on day of assessment.
9. Examination Hall: Capacity of 1 Examination Hall is 150 against requirement of 250.
10. Lecture Theaters: 3 Lecture Theaters are available against requirement of 4. Out of these 3, capacity of 1 Lecture Theater is 170 against requirement of 180. Capacity of Hospital Lecture Theater is 180 against requirement of 200.
11. Central library: Reading room for Residents / PG is not available.
12. Central Photography section: No equipment are available.
13. Microbiology department: Service laboratory for Immunology is not available.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Government not to recognize/approve SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the award of MBBS degree against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 seats and further decided that the Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

The Committee further decided to continue the application of clause 83(1)(c) (of Establishment of Medical College Regulation) Amendment, 2010 Part II (dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016).

Further the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of fresh batch of 100 to 150 MBBS students at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-2019.

88. Closure of probation period of Dr. Parul Goel, Deputy Secretary.

Read: the matter with regard to closure of probation period of Dr. Parul Goel, Deputy Secretary.

The Executive Committee of the Council after considering the minutes the Departmental Promotion Committee decided to close the probation period of Dr. Parul Goel, Deputy Secretary.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

Dr. Reena Nayyar recused herself from the meeting.

89. Disciplinary Proceedings against Dr. Davinder Kumar, Joint Secretary (U/S) regarding migration case of Harmanjot Singh.

The Executive Committee of the Council deliberated upon the matter at length and decided that the additional documents as allowed by the Inquiry Officer may be provided to him.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

90. Preliminary Enquiry Report submitted by Sh. A.S. Dagar, Consultant (Admn.) reg. huge payments made to M/s Krishna Prints and M/s Sai Ram Photostat Centre without any approval of the Competent Authority.

Read: the matter with regard to Preliminary Enquiry Report submitted by Sh. A.S. Dagar, Consultant (Admn.) reg. huge payments made to M/s Krishna Prints and M/s Sai Ram Photostat Centre without any approval of the Competent Authority.

The Executive Committee of the Council deliberated upon the matter at length and observed that serious financial irregularities have been committed as no approval from the Competent Authority was taken, no work orders were issued and laid down procedure as per Rules was not followed and decided that Disciplinary Proceedings under Rule 14 of CCS (CCA) Rule 1965 may be initiated against all those officers/officials who were involved in the case of M/s Krishna Prints and M/s Sai Ram Photostat Centre.

Further, the Executive Committee of the Council directed that the draft charge sheets may be put up before the Executive Committee.

The minutes of the above item were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.

91. Request of Ms. Ayushi Singh daughter of Late Mrs. Prem Lata (P.S.) for an appointment on a suitable post on compassionate ground – opinion of Consultant (Admn.)

The Executive Committee of the Council deliberated upon the opinion submitted by Consultant (Admn.) at length and decided that the request of Ms. Ayushi Singh cannot be considered for compassionate appointment as the family is in a sound financial position to sustain itself.
