The Chairman, PG Committee called the meeting to order to consider the remainder agenda items

69. Starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (September, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September,2002) and decided to recommend to Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 because – i) infrastructural facilities in terms of space in OPD, office and staff rooms are inadequate, ii) available clinical material is inadequate, iii) library facilities are inadequate, iv) clinical Psychologist is not available and v) other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

70. Starting of D.M.(Nephrology) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the I.M.C.Act, 1956 – Consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam for starting of D.M.(Nephrology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of D.M.(Nephrology) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R.University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provisions of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

71. Increase of seats in M.S.(Ophthalmology) course at Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad for increase of seats in M.S.(Ophthalmology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.S.(Ophthalmology) course at Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because – i) the composition of units in the department of Ophthalmology in terms of bed-strength is not as per MCI norms i.e. each unit having bed strength between 30-50, ii) DNB candidates are being registered in the speciality who would share the same infrastructural facilities as required for MD students, iii) most of the facilities, like operation theatres and equipments are jointly shared by the two institutions i.e. Osmania Medical College and Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad.

72. Increase of seats in M.S.(Orthopaedics) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for increase of seats in M.S.(Orthopaedics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.S.(Orthopaedics) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because – i) the Professor & HOD neither possesses requisite recognised postgraduate qualification nor his promotion to the post of Professor has been as per MCI norms, ii) the composition of units in the department of Orthopaedics in terms of teaching faculty is not as per MCI norms i.e. each unit having a minimum of 3 faculty members, iii) clinical material, in term of OPD patients strength and operative figures, is inadequate to permit any increase in the intake capacity and iv) other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

73. Increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because - i) the available teaching staff is just sufficient only for the present annual intake of 2(two) seats, ii) essential equipments are not available in the department, iii) availability of autopsies, so essential in the subject of Pathology, is not adequate and iv) other observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

74. Increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (Anaesthesia) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) from 2 (two) to 4(four) per year prospectively u/s. 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

75. Increase of seats in D.M.(Cardiology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for increase of seats in D.M.(Cardiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) and noted that the department of Cardiology has two units with total of 151 beds which is not as per MCI norms; and therefore decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units as per MCI norms i.e bed-strength of 20-50 and a teaching faculty of minimum of three members in each unit.

76. Increase of seats in D.M.(Neurology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences(Deemed University), Hyderabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for increase of seats in D.M.(Neurology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in D.M.(Neurology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) from 2 (two) to 4(four) per year prospectively u/s. 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

The Committee further decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the department in term of bed strength as per MCI norms i.e. maximum of 50 beds in a unit.

77. Increase of seats in M.Ch.(Cardio-thoracic-Surgery) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for increase of seats in M.Ch.(Cardio-thoracic-Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.Ch.(Cardio-thoracic-Surgery) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) from 2 (two) to 3(three) per year prospectively u/s. 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

78. Increase of seats in M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for increase of seats in M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) and decided to defer the consideration of the matter pending receipt of the clarification from the institution authorities with regard to total number of bed -strength available in the department of Neuro-Surgery and their unit-wise distribution.

79. Starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course at Medical College, Kottayam affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (June, 2001) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Medical College, Kottayam for starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (June, 2001) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course at Medical College, Kottayam affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 4(four) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provisions of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

80. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore for the award of D.C.H. qualification in respect of increased intake of seats.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of D.C.H. qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of increased intake capacity.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October,2002) and noted that institution already stand approved for the award of D.C.H. qualification with the annual intake of 2(two) students and the matter under consideration is for approval of institution for increased intake permitted by Govt. vide letter dated 14.1.2000 and decided to reiterate its earlier decision to approve J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore for the award of D.C.H.. qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore. However the authorities of the institution are directed that in consonance with the Council's regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education 2000, the annual intake capacity in D.C.H. course be restricted prospectively to 3(three) students per year.

81. Andhra University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Approval of Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for the award of M.S.(E.N.T.) & D.L.O. qualifications.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (September, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for approval of the college for the award of M.S.(E.N.T.) & D.L.O. qualifications granted by Andhra University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2002) and decided not to recommend approval of Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for the award of M.S.(E.N.T.) & D.L.O. qualifications earlier granted by Andhra University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and now by N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada because – (i) there is no qualified audiologist and the only portable audiometer is not functioning, ii) operation theatres, OPD and the seminar rooms need improvement, iii) the posts of Principal & Vice-principal are presently vacant and iv) other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report..

82. i) Andhra University – Recognition of M.D.(Venereology) & D.V. qualifications in respect of students being trained at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada.

ii) Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada – Recognition of M.D.(Venereology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada and also Approval of the college for the award of D.V. qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for purpose of i) recognition of MD (Venereology) & D.V. qualifications granted by Andhra University ii) recognition of M.D.(Venereology) qualification granted by Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and also approval of the college for the award of D.V. qualification..

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision not to recommend recognition of M.D.(Venereology) & D.V. qualifications because – (i) the present HOD is stated to be working at Medical College, Vishakapatnam and there is no evidence of his working in this institution, ii) the posts of Principal & Vice-principal are presently vacant, iii) no research work has been conducted in the department, iv) available clinical material is inadequate and v) other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to direct the authorities to continue stop admission in M.D.(Venereology) and D.V. courses as has been communicated vide Council letter dated 20.8.2001 and in consonance with the Council regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education 2000.

83. i) **Andhra University - Recognition of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications in respect of students being trained at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada.**
- ii) **Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Approval of Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for the award of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for purpose of i) recognition of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications granted by Andhra University and ii) approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualification granted by Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) and noting that the inspection required to assess the standard of examination & other facilities has not been carried out at the time of examination; decided to arrange for the Council inspection during the examination as and when the candidates would be available to appear in the examination of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. courses.

84. **Andhra University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Approval of Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for the award of M.D.(Paed.) & DCH qualifications- Consideration of compliance verification regarding.**

Read : the compliance verification report (October, 2002) on the compliance submitted in reference to deficiencies as reported in the Council's Inspector report (May, 2001) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Paed.) & DCH qualifications granted by Andhra University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (October, 2002) on the compliance submitted in reference to deficiencies as reported in the Council's Inspector report (May, 2001) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 2nd & 3rd August, 2001 since the earlier reported deficiencies have not been found corrected; and the institution needs to rectify the deficiencies reported in the Inspector's report.

85. i) **Sri Venkateswara University- Recognition of M.D.(Anaesthesia) qualification in respect of students being trained at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool.**
- ii) **Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Approval of Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for the award of M.D. (Anaesthesia) qualification.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for i) recognition of M.D.(Anaesthesia) qualification granted by Sri Venkateswara University and also ii) approval of the college for the award of M.D. (Anaesthesia) qualification granted by Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) and decided to recommend that :-

- i) M.D. (Anaesthesia) qualification granted by Sri Venkateswara University in respect of students trained at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool be recognised & included in the first schedule to the I.M.C.Act,1956.

- ii) Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool be also approved for the award of M.D.(Anaesthesia) qualification earlier granted by Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & now by N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada restricting the number of annual admissions to 3(three) students per year.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

86. i) **Bharathidasan University – Recognition of M.D.(Paediatrics) & D.C.H. qualifications in respect of students being trained at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur.**
- ii) **Madras University and The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Approval of Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur for the award of M.D.(Paediatrics) & D.C.H. qualifications.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur for purpose of recognition of M.D.(Paediatrics) & D.C.H. qualification granted by Bharathidasan University and also ii) approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Paediatrics) & D.C.H. qualifications earlier granted by Madras University and now The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) and decided to recommend that :-

- (i) M.D.(Paediatrics) & D.C.H qualifications granted by Bharathidasan University in respect of students trained at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur be recognised and included in the first schedule to the IMC Act,1956.
- (ii) Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur be approved for the award of M.D.(Paediatrics) and D.C.H qualifications earlier granted by Madras University and now by The Tamilnadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai. However, the authorities of the institution are directed to prospectively restrict the number of annual admissions to 2(two) students, each for M.D. (Paediatrics) and D.C.H. courses, in consonance with the Council's regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

87. i) **Bharathidasan University – Recognition of D.L.O. qualification in respect of students being trained at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur.**
- ii) **Madras University and The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Approval of Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur for the award of D.L.O. qualification.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur for purpose of i) recognition of D.L.O. qualification granted by Bharathidasan University and also ii) approval of the college for the award of D.L.O. qualification earlier granted by Madras University and now The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) and decided to recommend that :-

- (i) D.L.O. qualification granted by Bharathidasan University in respect of students trained at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur be recognised and included in the first schedule to the IMC Act,1956.

- (ii) Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur be approved for the award of D.L.O. qualification earlier granted by Madras University and now by The Tamilnadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai restricting the number of annual admissions to 4(four) students per year.

88. Madras University and The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Approval of Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur for the award of D.P.M. qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur for purpose of approval of the college for the award of D.P.M. qualification earlier granted by Madras University and now The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) and decided to recommend that Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur be approved for the award of D.P.M. qualification earlier granted by Madras University and now by The Tamilnadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

89. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur for the award of D.M.R.D. qualification .

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur for purpose of approval of the college for the award of D.M.R.D. qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) and decided to recommend that Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur be approved for the award of D.M.R.D. qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore with the initial permitted intake of 1(one) student per year.

90. Non-teaching Hospital – Recognition of Malar Hospitals Limited, Adyar, Chennai for housemanship.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) on the physical facilities available at Malar Hospitals Limited, Adyar, Chennai for purpose of recognition of the hospital for purpose of housemanship.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) decided that Malar Hospital Limited, Adyar, Chennai be recognised for housemanship in the following subjects with the number of intake mentioned against each:-

91. Request for permission of starting of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) course at C.M.C., Vellore – Central Govt. letter reg.

Read : the letter dated 26.8.2002 from the Principal, C.M.C., Vellore regarding permission for now starting of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) course at C.M.C., Vellore as the LOP had earlier being issued by the Central Govt.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 26.8.2002 from the Principal, C.M.C., Vellore and noted the earlier communication of the Council to the Govt. in this regard vide letter dated 5.5.2000 wherein it was conveyed that “there seems to be no provision/procedure in this regard. The institution can be advised to seek fresh permission in future u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for starting the course if they are not in position to start the same now, after having been issued Letter of Permission by the Govt.”

The Committee decided to reiterate this decision.

92. Recognition of M.D.(Microbiology) qualification in respect of JIPMER, Pondicherry - affiliation with Madras University and Pondicherry University – letter regarding.

Read : the letter dated 16.10.2002 from the Registrar, Pondicherry University regarding necessary amendments in the dates of recognition of M.D.(Microbiology) qualification granted by Madras University and Pondicherry University in respect of J.I.P.M.E.R., Pondicherry.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 16.10.2002 from the Registrar, Pondicherry University and noted that the Madras University had been granting M.D.(Microbiology) to the students trained at JIPMER till 1988 and the same should be recognised under Madras University; whereas the one notified recognised by Govt. is till 1985.

The Committee, in view of above, decided to recommend that the necessary amendments be made regarding date of recognition with Madras University i.e. the qualification of M.D.(Microbiology) in respect of JIPMER, Pondicherry be recognised under Madras University when granted upto 1988.

93. Request for change of nomenclature of recognised M.S.(Anaesthesia) qualification earlier granted by Punjabi University, Patiala and now by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Patiala to M.D.(Anaesthesia) - regarding.

Read : the letter dated 8.11.2002 from the Principal, Govt. Medical College, Patiala regarding change of nomenclature of recognised M.S.(Anaesthesia) to M.D.(Anaesthesia) qualification earlier granted by Punjabi University, Patiala and now by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Patiala.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 8.11.2002 from the Principal, Govt. Medical College, Patiala and noted that the qualification in the subject granted earlier by Punjab University and now by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, same is recognised by nomenclature of M.S.(Anaesthesia) whereas the qualification is being granted by nomenclature of M.D.(Anaesthesia); and the Principal has requested for necessary amendments in this regard.

The Committee, in view of above, decided to recommend that the qualification in the subject in respect of Govt. Medical College, Patiala be recognised and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 with the nomenclature of M.D.(Anaesthesia); with the university affiliation as under :-

- i) under Punjab University – from 1981 – 1999
- ii) under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences – from December, 1999.

94. Work out put report of the requests received u/s 10A for the year 2002.

Read : the work out put report of the requests u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the year - 2002.

The Postgraduate Committee noted the work out put report as submitted and recorded its appreciation for the same.

The Committee further suggested that some more information be arranged for incorporation in future computerised records, facilitating effective monitoring and timely decisions.

95. Starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course at Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar affiliated to Sher-I-Kashmir Instt. of Medical Sciences, Srinagar (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar for starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course at Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provisions of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

96. Starting of Postgraduate degree and diploma courses at L.T.M.Medical College, Mumbai affiliated to University of Mumbai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspectors' reports on the physical and other teaching facilities available at L.T.M.Medical College, Mumbai for starting of various postgraduate degree & diploma courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that consideration of the matter of starting of the courses had been deferred in the meeting held on 16th & 17th September, 2002 till the time (i) year-wise list of the candidates already admitted in the courses is received and (ii) an undertaking to the effect that DNB candidates would not be admitted in future.

The Committee further noted that (i) the list of students already admitted till date in the said courses, which had been started without prior approval of the Govt., has been received for initiation of action u/s 10B of IMC Act, 1956 and ii) the institution authorities have given an undertaking that L.T.M.Medical College, Mumbai would not be admitting/registering candidates for DNB courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's reports and decided, subject- wise, as under :-

D.L.O.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2001) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of D.L.O. course at L.T.M.Medical College, Mumbai affiliated to Mumbai University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provisions of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

D.O.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2001) and decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the time the status of Dr.S.A.Motwana as Head of department of Ophthalmology, as has already been asked for, is received since he has reached the age of superannuation in January, 2002.

M.D.(T.B. & Chest Diseases)

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2001) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(T.B. & Chest Diseases) course at L.T.M.Medical College, Mumbai affiliated to Mumbai University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provisions of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

D.C.H.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2001) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of D.C.H. course at L.T.M.Medical College, Mumbai affiliated to Mumbai University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 3(three) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provisions of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

97. Starting of D.M.(Neonatology) course at L.T.M.Medical College, Mumbai affiliated to University of Mumbai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (August, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at L.T.M.Medical College, Mumbai for starting of D.M.(Neonatology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (August, 2002) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision recommending to Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of D.M.(Neonatology) course at L.T.M.Medical College, Mumbai affiliated to Mumbai University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because none of faculty possesses superspeciality postgraduate qualification i.e.D.M.(Neonatology) and other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to initiate action u/s 10B in respect of the candidates who have till date been admitted in D.M.(Neonatology) which has been started without the prior permission of the Central Govt./MCI.

98. Increase of seats in M.D.(Forensic Medicine) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (August, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad for increase of seats in M.D.(Forensic Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (August, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (Forensic Medicine) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada from 2 (two) to 5(five) per year prospectively u/s. 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

99. Nagpur University – Approval of Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha for the award of M.D.(Physiology) qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha for approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Physiology) qualification granted by Nagpur University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) and decided to recommend that Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha be approved for the award of M.D.(Physiology) qualification granted by Nagpur University restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

100. Rajasthan University – Approval of Dr. S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur for the award of M.S.(E.N.T.) qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Dr. S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur for approval of the college for the award of M.S.(E.N.T.) qualification granted by Rajasthan University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) and decided to recommend that S.N.Medical College, Jodhpur be approved for the award of M.S.(E.N.T.) qualification granted by Rajasthan University restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report specially with regard to evaluation of the thesis which should be in consonance with the regulations of the Council on Postgraduate Medical Education 2000.

101. Shivaji University – Recognition of M.S.(Orthopaedics) & D.Ortho. qualifications in respect of students being trained at Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences, Karad- Compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (July, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences, Karad for purpose of recognition of M.S.(Orthopaedics) & D.Ortho. qualifications granted by Shivaji University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (July, 2002) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

102. Starting of M.S.(General Surgery) course at Siddhartha Medical College, Vijayawada affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Siddhartha Medical College, Vijayawada for starting of M.S.(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.S. (General Surgery) course at Siddhartha Medical College, Vijayawada affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 because – i) hostel and library facilities are not adequate, (ii) instruments/equipments in the department are inadequate and (iii) other observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

103. Starting of M.D.(Physiology) course at Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh affiliated to Punjab University u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (April, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh for starting of M.D.(Physiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (April, 2002) and noted the following :-

- (i) Dr.(Mrs.) Nageshwari after obtaining MD(Physiology) qualification in 1980 has the experience of only seven months as Lecturer and four years as Reader before being promoted as Professor in 1998 since her experience as Research Officer, Sr.Sci. Officer and Sci.(E) etc., total of nine years, can not be counted towards teaching experience and thus her promotion to Reader's post with only seven months experience as Lecturer is not as per MCI norms and neither she has a total of 15 years experience in a teaching institution to make her eligible for the post of Professor.
- (ii) Only one faculty member Dr.Nandini Kapoor has requisite recognised qualification and requisite experience to be eligible PG teacher.
- (iii) The other two faculty members are not eligible PG teachers because one is possessing M.Sc./Ph.D. qualification from non medical faculty, and other is having non-recognised PG qualification.

In view of above, the Committee decided to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Physiology) course at Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh affiliated to Punjab University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above; the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of M.D.(Physiology) course. However, the institution may apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies, in accordance with the Council's Regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education,2000.

104. Starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course at Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh affiliated to Punjab University u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (April, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh for starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The P.G. Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (April,2002) and noted that though deficiencies in term of bed-strength etc. seem to have been rectified; the Professor & HOD, Dr.B.S.Chavan, has neither been promoted as per MCI norms nor possesses minimum of total teaching experience of 15 years in two or three cadres taken together to be eligible as postgraduate teacher as per the decision of the General Body; and therefore decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course at Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh affiliated to Punjab University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above; the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course. However, the institution may apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies, in accordance with the Council's Regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education,2000.

105. Starting of M.D.(Biochemistry) course at Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun affiliated to H.N.B. Garhwal University u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (April, 2001) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun for starting of M.D.(Biochemistry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (April, 2001) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D. (Biochemistry) course at Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun affiliated to H.N.B. Garhwal University u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11 (2) of the Act, 1956.

106. Starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) & D.G.O. courses at Mohan Kumarmangalam Medical College, Salem affiliated to The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mohan Kumarmangalam Medical College, Salem for starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) & D.G.O. courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 26.9.2002 to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D. (Obst. & Gynae) & D.G.O. courses at Mohan Kumarmangalam Medical College, Salem affiliated to the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai University u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 because (i) the breakup of experience of Professor & HOD as submitted vide compliance is not acceptable since the same is in sharp contrast to details earlier submitted by the institution wherein the breakup of experience was shown differently and further that the now supplied details do not have the approval of the State Govt as per submitted records.

107. Starting of D.M.(Neurology) course at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati affiliated to Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati for starting of D.M.(Neurology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Intent for starting of D.M. (Neurology) course at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati affiliated to Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University) u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year.

The Committee further decided that the institution authorities should be advised for installation of MRI machine and rectification of other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

108. Starting of M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) course at Sri Venkateshwara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati affiliated to Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sri Venkateshwara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati for starting of M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.Ch. (Neuro-Surgery) course at Sri Venkateshwara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati affiliated to Sri Venkateshwara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati (Deemed University) u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11 (2) of the Act, 1956.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

109. Starting of M.D.(Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation) course at Medical College, Kozhikode affiliated to Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (July, 2001) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Medical College, Kozhikode for starting of M.D.(Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (July, 2001) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D. (Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation) course at Medical College, Kozhikode affiliated to Calicut University u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11 (2) of the Act, 1956.

110. Increase of seats in M.D.(Paediatrics) course at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar affiliated to Annamalai University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (April, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar for increase of seats in M.D.(Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (April, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (Paediatrics) course at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar affiliated to Annamalai University from 3 (three) to 6(six) in M.D.(Paediatrics) per year prospectively u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

111. Increase of seats in M.D.(General Medicine) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam for increase of seats in M.D.(General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (General Medicine) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada from 6(six) to 12 (twelve) in M.D.(General Medicine) per year prospectively u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

112. Increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam for increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 because (i) both the Professor & HOD as also the other Professor in the department do not possess requisite recognised postgraduate qualification and (ii) other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

113. Rajasthan University – Recognition of M.Ch.(Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur for purpose of recognition of M.Ch.(Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) qualification granted by Rajasthan University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) and noted that the composition of both the units in the department of Cardio-Thoracic Surgery in term of teaching faculty and bed strength, is not as per MCI norms; and therefore decided to advise the authorities of the institution to arrange for re-organisation of the units as per MCI norms i.e. each unit having a teaching faculty of minimum of three members and bed strength between 20-50.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

114. Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai(Deemed University) - Recognition of M.Ch.(Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai (Deemed University) for purpose of recognition of M.Ch.(Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) qualification granted by the Institute.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) and decided to recommend that M.Ch. (Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) qualification granted by Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai be recognised and included in the first schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) and decided to recommend that Sree Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur be approved for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year.

118. Bangalore University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore for the award of M.S.(Anatomy) qualification .

119. Annamalai University – Recognition of M.D.(Radio-Diagnosis) & D.M.R.D. qualifications in respect of students being trained at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) and noted that institution already stand recognised for the award of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) qualification with the annual intake of 7(seven) students and the matter under consideration is for approval of institution for increased intake permitted by Govt. vide letter dated 24.9.1999; and decided that Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai (Deemed University) be approved for the award of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) qualification restricting the number of admissions to 12(twelve) students per year.

123. Bangalore University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore for the award of M.D.(Microbiology) qualification .

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (December, 2002) and decided to recommend that Dr.B.R.Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore be approved for the award of M.D.(Microbiology) qualification earlier granted by Bangalore University and now by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

124. Bangalore University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bangalore for the award of M.D.(Radio-therapy) qualification – Consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read : the compliance verification report (November, 2002) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report(Feb., 98) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology for recognition of M.D.(Radio-therapy) qualification earlier granted by Bangalore University and now by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore..

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) and decided to recommend that Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bangalore be approved for the award of M.D.(Radio-Therapy) qualification earlier granted by Bangalore University and now by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year.

125. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Approval of the Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, Mandya Distt for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification – Consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read : the compliance verification report (November, 2002) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (March, 2000) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, Mandya Distt. for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (November, 2002) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (March, 2002) and decided to recommend that Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, Mandya Distt. be approved for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore restricting the number of admissions to 7(seven) students per year.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (May, 2001) and decided to recommend that :-

128. **Gujarat University –Approval of Smt. N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad for the award of various postgraduate qualifications – Consideration of the deferred items regarding.**

Read : the Council Inspectors' reports on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Smt. N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad for recognition of various postgraduate qualifications granted by Gujarat University.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the matter of approval of Smt.N.H.L.Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad in respect of various PG degree/diploma courses had been considered in the meeting of the Postgraduate Committee held on 26.9.2002 and the same was deferred pending receipt of clarification from the authorities of institution as regards (i) the status of the teaching faculty i.e. whether the teachers are working full time or only part time in the department and thereafter practising outside the hospital and (ii) the relationship of Smt. N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad with Seth K.M. School of PG Medicine & Research, Ahmedabad i.e. whether it is attached and is part of Smt. NHL Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad.

The Committee further noted that the required clarification has been received wherein it is conveyed that (i) all the teachers in Smt. N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad are working full time and (ii) Seth KM School of Postgraduate Medicine and Research is part of Smt.N.H.L. Municipal Medical College.

The Postgraduate Committee, in view of above, considered the Council Inspectors' reports and decided to recommend, subject-wise, as under :-

M.D.(Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) & D.V.D.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) and decided to recommend that Smt.N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad be approved for the award of M.D.(Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) & D.V.D. qualifications granted by Gujarat University. However, the authorities of the institution are directed to prospectively restrict the annual intake to 6(six) students for MD and 3(three) students for diploma course in consonance with Council's regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

M.S.(Ophthalmology)

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) and decided to recommend that Smt.N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad be approved for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Gujarat University restricting the number of admissions to 5(five) students per year.

M.D.(Radio-Diagnosis)

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) and decided to recommend that Smt.N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad be approved for the award of M.D.(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification granted by Gujarat University restricting the number of admissions to 6(six) students per year.

M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) and decided to recommend that Smt.N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad be approved for the award of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications granted by Gujarat University restricting the number of admissions to 5(five) for MD & 6(six) for diploma students per year.

M.D.(Psychiatry) & D.P.M.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) and decided to recommend that Smt.N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad be approved for the award of M.D.(Psychiatry) & D.P.M. qualifications granted by Gujarat University. However, the authorities of the institution are directed to prospectively restrict the annual intake to 2(two) students for MD and 1(one) student for diploma course in consonance with Council's regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

M.D.(Microbiology)

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) and decided to recommend that Smt.N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad be approved for the award of M.D.(Microbiology) qualification granted by Gujarat University restricting the number of admissions to 3(three) students per year.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

129. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Sree Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification .

Read : the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Sree Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) and decided to recommend that Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur be approved for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.
