1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Committee – confirmation of.

The minutes of the Postgraduate Committee meeting held on 9.10.2003 were confirmed.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Committee – action taken thereon.

Action taken on the minutes of the last meeting of Postgraduate Committee was noted & approved with modifications in items No 15 & 20 as under:-

The decisions taken in item No. 15 & 20 be read corrected as under:-

15. Increase of seats in M.D.(T.B. & Respiratory Diseases) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

“The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector’s report (July, 2003) and noted that promotion of Incharge of Unit-IV is not as per MCI norms and decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise Unit-IV as per MCI norms.”

20. Increase of seats in M.D. (Anaesthesia) & D.A. courses at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore afiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

“The Postgraduate Committee decided to correct the minutes pertaining to its decision taken at its meeting held on 29.7.2003 in respect of the concerned college whereby the words “& D.A.” is deleted and the decision be read as under:-

“The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector’s report (June, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (Anaesthesia) course at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 5 (five) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examinations of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examinations as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the Act, 1956.”

Resultantly the annual intake for DA shall continue be 6 per year.

3. Work output report of the requests received u/s 10A for the year 2003.

The Postgraduate Committee noted the work out put report of the requests u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the year 2002-2003 which was placed on table.

4. Increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam for increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August,2003) and noted that the information regarding the places where the teaching faculty worked in respective designations was not provided by the institution. Therefore, the Committee decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

5. Increase of seats in M.S.(E.N.T.) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read : the compliance verification report (August, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (February, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam for consideration of increase of seats in M.S.(E.N.T.) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (August, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (February, 2003) and noted that the promotion of the Head of the 2nd unit of the department of ENT is not as per MCI norms. The institution is advised to reorganise the Units in terms of teaching faculty. Therefore the Committee decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

6. Increase of seats in M.D.(General Medicine) course at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) and noted that the good number of faculty members have joined the institution just before the inspection. Therefore, the Committee decided to obtain the latest faculty position along with their declaration forms of the department of General Medicine.

7. Increase of seats in M.D.(Psychiatry) course at S.V. Medical College, Tirupati affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at S. V. Medical College, Tirupati for increase of seats in M.D.(Psychiatry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.D.(Psychiatry) course at S.V. Medical College, Tirupati u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 in view of (i) the bed strength of units is not according to MCI norms, (ii) the postgraduate

qualification possessed by the Associate Professor is not recognised, (iii) there is no Associate Professor and (iv) none of the Assistant Professors are eligible to become postgraduate teacher.

8. Starting of M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for consideration of starting of M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August,2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) course Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 as the qualification possessed by the Head of the Department is not recognised by the Council and instrumentation is inadequate.

9. Increase of seats in M.D.(Dermatology) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad for increase of seats in M.D.(Dermatology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) and decided to advise the institution to reorganise the unit in terms of bed strength and deferred the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

10. Increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification regarding..

Read : the compliance verification report (September, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (August, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad for increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (September, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (August, 2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 as the deficiencies pointed out in the earlier inspection report are still persisting.

11. Starting of M.Ch.(Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) course at Guntur Medical College, Guntur affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Guntur Medical College, Guntur for consideration of starting of M.Ch.(Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September,2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.Ch. (Cardio-thoracic Surgery) course at Guntur Medical College, Guntur u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 as there is no Cath lab available and other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

12. Increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – Consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read : the compliance verification report (October, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (November, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal for increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the compliance verification report (October, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector report (April, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mamata Medical College, Khammam for consideration of starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) & D.C.H. courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (October, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector report (April, 2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) & D.C.H. courses at Mamata Medical College, Khammam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two)students for degree and 2 (two) students for diploma courses per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examinations of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11 (2) of the Act, 1956.

14. Starting of D.M.(Rheumatology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for consideration of starting of D.M.(Rheumatology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October,2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of D.M.(Rheumatology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 as none of the teachers are eligible in terms of requisite qualification and the experience/required training in a recognised institution.

15. Starting of M.Ch.(Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) course at Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal affiliated to Barkatullah University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

ii) Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot – Approval of Christian Medical College, Ludhiana for the award of MD(Biochemistry) qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Christian Medical College, Ludhiana for purpose of i) recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification granted by Punjab University in respect of Christian Medical College, Ludhiana and also ii) approval of the college for the award of MD (Biochemistry) qualification granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July,2003) and decided to recommend that-

included in the first schedule to the IMC Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 3(Three) students per year.

54. The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Approval of P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for the award of D.G.O. qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of D.G.O. qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October,2003) and decided not to approve P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for the award of D.G.O. qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai because –

- i) The promotion of Prof. & HOD and other Prof. is not as per MCI norms.
- ii) Other observations/deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

55. The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Approval of P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for the award of D.C.H. qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (October, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of D.C.H. qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October,2003) and decided not to approve P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for the award of D.C.H. qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai because 0

- i) Teaching complement is not complete in Unit II.
- ii) The Promotion of HOD is not as per MCI norms.
- iii) Clinical material inadequate.
- iv) Other observations/deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

56. Calcutta University – Approval of Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciences, Calcutta for the award of M.D. (Paediatrics) & D.C.H. qualifications – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (April, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciences, Calcutta togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D. (Paediatrics) & D.C.H. qualifications granted by Calcutta University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (April,2003) and decided not to approve Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciences, Calcutta for the award of M.D. (Paediatrics) & D.C.H. qualifications granted by Calcutta University because –

- i) Teaching complement is not complete in all the three units.
- ii) Other observations/deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

57. Calcutta University – Approval of Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciences, Calcutta for the award of M.D.(Obst. & Gvane.) & D.G.O. qualifications – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (April, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciences, Calcutta

togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Obst. & Gyane.) & D.G.O. qualifications granted by Calcutta University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (April,2003) and decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in terms of bed strength as per MCI norms.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration till the information is received from the institution authorities.

58. Non-teaching Hospital – Continuance of recognition of Jeewan Nursing Home & Charitable Hospital, Jeewan Nagar, New Delhi for housemanship.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) on the physical facilities available at Jeewan Nursing Home & Charitable Hospital, Jeewan Nagar, New Delhi for purpose of continuance of recognition of the hospital for housemanship.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September,2003) and decided to recommend that the housemanship in the following subjects at Jeewan Nursing Home & Charitable Hospital, Jeewan Nagar, New Delhi be continued with the house posts mentioned against each:-

- i) General Medicine - 4 (Four)
- ii) General Surgery - 2(two)
- iii) Obst. & Gynae. - 4(Four)

59. i) Karnatak University – Recognition of M.D.(Biochemistry) qualification in respect of students being trained at J.N.Medical College, Belgaum.

- ii) Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of J.N.Medical College, Belgaum for the award of M.D.(Biochemistry) qualification.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (October,2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum, Karnatak for purpose of i)recognition of M.D.(Biochemistry) qualification granted by Karnatak University in respect of students being trained at J.N.Medical College, Belgaum and also ii) approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Biochemistry) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October,2003) and decided to recommend that –

- i) MD(Biochemistry) qualification granted by Karnatak University in respect of students being trained at J.N.Medical College, Belgaum be recognised and included in the 1st schedule to the IMC Act,1956.
- ii) J.N.Medical College, Belgaum be approved for the award of MD(Biochemistry) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

60. Increase of seats in M.D.(Microbiology) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report(Nov.,2003) and decided to recommend to Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in MD(Microbiology) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following deficiencies:-

- i) The Promotion of HOD is not as per MCI norms.
- ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

61. Increase of seats in M.D.(Dermatology) course at S.V. Medical College, Tirupati affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956–consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (June, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at S.V. Medical College, Tirupati togetherwith compliance for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(Dermatology) course u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June,2003) and decided to recommend to Central Govt.to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D.(Dermatology) course at S.V. Medical College, Tirupati affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada from 1(one) to 2(two) students per year.

62. Starting of D.M.(Clinical Pharmacology) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad for consideration of starting of D.M.(Clinical Pharmacology) course u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Oct.,2003) and decided to recommend to Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in D.M.(Clinical Pharmacology) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 to 1(one) student per year.

63. Starting of MD (General Medicine) Course at Govt. Medical College, Trissur affiliated to Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Trissur togetherwith compliance for consideration of starting of M.D.(General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

64 Starting of M.S.(Ortho.) course at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur affiliated to The Tamilnadu Dr.MGR Medical University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read : the compliance verification report (Nov., 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector report (June, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur for consideration of increase of seats M.S.(Ortho.) course u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Nov.2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector report (June, 2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.S. (Ortho.) course at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur affiliated to the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University

u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the Act, 1956.

65. Inspection of physical and other teaching facilities available at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad for starting of Postgraduate courses under Ch. Charan Singh University u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956.

Read : the letter dated 7.10.2003 and 18.11.2003 from the Dean of Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad with regard to inspections of physical and other teaching facilities available at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad for starting of Postgraduate courses under Ch. Charan Singh University u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956.

The Postgraduate Committee decided that the request made by the Dean, Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad in its communication dated 7.10.2003 requesting for furnishing to him a copy of the 6 (six) inspection reports cannot be granted as the inspections caused by the Council have been cancelled and re-inspections have been ordered by the Postgraduate Committee.

Further, the Committee decided that request made by the Dean in his letter dated 18.11.2003 seeking postponement of inspections for starting of postgraduate courses in MD (General Medicine), MS (General Surgery), MS (ENT), MD (Anaesthesiology), MD (Radiology), MS (Orthopaedics) and MD (Anatomy) to February, 2004 since the renovation work is going on cannot be granted because the recommendations of the Council in respect of the applications preferred u/s 10A are to be made in a time bound manner.

66. Observations for the consideration of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – Letter regarding.

Read : the letter dated 7.10.2003 from Dr. Ved Prakash Mishra, Chairman, P.G. Committee suggesting some observations for the consideration of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

The Postgraduate Committee decided that the said letter be considered alongwith the letters from Dr. S.B. Siwach and Dr. S.K. Sinha, members of the Postgraduate Committee.

67. Dibrugarh University – Recognition of MS (Ortho.) in respect of students being trained at Assam Medical College, Dibrugarh – Consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read : the Compliance verification report(Nov., 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report(June, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Assam Medical College, Dibrugarh for purpose of recognition of M.S.(Ortho.) qualification granted by Dibrugarh University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Nov.2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (June, 2003) and decided to recommend that MS (Ortho.) qualification granted by Dibrugarh University in respect of students being trained at Assam Medical College, Dibrugarh be recognised and included in the first schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

68. University of Delhi - Approval of Army Hospital Delhi Cantt., Delhi for the award of M.D. (Pathology) qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Army Hospital Delhi Cantt., Delhi for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Pathology) qualification granted by University of Delhi.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Oct.2003) and decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the faculty experience in the prescribed performa is received.

69 University of Delhi - Approval of Army Hospital Delhi Cantt., Delhi for the award of M.S. (General Surgery) qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Army Hospital Delhi Cantt., Delhi for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(General Surgery) qualification granted by University of Delhi.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Oct.2003) and decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the receipt of the information regarding reorganizing the details of teaching faculty in the department of General Surgery in Unit I and Unit IV is received.

70. To consider the inspection reports carried out to assess the teaching & training facilities available in the Medical Colleges in the State of Madhya Pradesh.

Read : the Council Inspectors reports carried out for purposes of undergraduate courses at Medical Colleges in Madhya Pradesh togetherwith list of students admitted in postgraduate courses.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the Executive Committee and members of the Adhoc Committee considered the Council Inspectors report 11th and 12th July, 2003 pertaining to G.R. Medical College, Gwalior at its meeting held on 28.7.2003 and observed that there is gross evidence of irregularities in registering the patients in the main register of the hospital. Some of the entries are followed by the blank spaces and not by the entries of the patients. The Dean of the college could not give any explanation. Similar manipulation was also observed in the register of the operation theatre. The Committee also observed gross deficiencies in the clinical material, teaching and non-teaching staff etc.

The Executive Committee and members of the Adhoc Committee considered the Inspectors report pertaining to M.G.M. Medical College, Indore dated 11th and 12th July, 2003 at its meeting held on 28th July, 2003 and found gross deficiencies in terms of teaching staff.

The Executive Committee and members of the Adhoc Committee considered the Inspectors report of S.S. Medical College, Rewa dated 14 and 15th July, 2003 at its meeting held on 28th July, 2003 and found gross deficiencies including teaching staff.

The Executive Committee and members of the Adhoc Committee considered the Inspectors report of Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal dated 11 and 12th July, 2003 at its meeting held on 28th July, 2003 and found gross deficiencies including teaching staff.

The Executive Committee and members of the Adhoc Committee considered the Inspectors report of N.S.C.B. Medical College, Jabalpur dated 11 and 12th July, 2003 at its meeting held on 28th July, 2003 and found gross deficiencies including teaching staff.

In view of the gross deficiencies that were observed in the inspection reports, the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the Executive Committee were clearly of the view that it would be against the interest of innocent students who, if not stopped, will be admitted in these colleges for the academic year 2003-04. Accordingly, it was decided that the State Government be advised not to make admissions in the first year of the MBBS course for the academic year 2003-04 at these three colleges. It was also decided that if the deficiencies are not removed necessary action u/s 19 be considered for recommending to the Central Government for de-recognition.

The Committee also decided to refer the inspection reports to the Postgraduate Committee of the Council for consideration regarding the postgraduate courses.

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee considered the said reports and taking note of the deficiencies including therein and the decision of the Executive Committee alongwith the members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and decided that the college authorities be directed forthwith to stop the admissions to all the postgraduate degree/diploma courses that are currently being run by the said colleges under intimation to the Registrar of the concerned universities and Secretary (Health) of the State of Madhya Pradesh.

71. Gulbarga University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for the award of M.D.(Pharmacology) qualification .

Read : the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Pharmacology) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Octo.2003) and decided not to approve Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for the award of MD (Pharmacology) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore because of the following:-

- i) Promotion of Prof. & HOD and Associate Professor is not as per MCI norms.
- ii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

72. Gulbarga University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for the award of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications .

Read : the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Nov.2003) and decided not to approve Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for the award of MD (Pathology) & DCP qualifications granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore because of the following:-

- (i) Teaching faculty is insufficient even for undergraduate intake.
- (ii) Workload and services available at CCL are not satisfactory.
- (iii) No side labs. are hospital wards.
- (iv) The library facility is not satisfactory.

The Committee in view of above, decided to direct the authorities of the institution to henceforth stop admissions in MD (Pathology) & DCP courses with prospective effect.

73. Bangalore University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore for the award of M.D.(Pharmacology) qualification – Consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read : the compliance verification report (Nov., 2003) togetherwith the compliance and Council Inspector's report(April,. 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Pharmacology) qualification granted by Bangalore University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Nov.2003) togetherwith the compliance and Council Inspector's report (April,2002) and decided to

recommend that Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore be approved for the award of MD (Pharmacology) qualification earlier granted by Bangalore University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year.

74. The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Recognition of D.D.V.L. qualification in respect of students being trained at P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for purpose of recognition of D.D.V.L. qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Oct.2003) and decided to recommend that D.D.V.L. qualification granted by the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore be recognised and included in the first schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year.

75. Gulbarga University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) & D.Ortho. qualifications .

Read : the Council Inspector's report(Nov., 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) & D.Ortho. qualifications granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Nov.2003) and decided not to approve Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for the award of MS (Orthopaedics) & D.Ortho. qualifications granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore because of the following:-

- (i) Teaching complement incomplete in both the units.
- (ii) Promotion of Professor & HOD is not as per MCI norms.
- (iii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

76. Banaras Hindu University – Recognition of D.M.(Gastroenterology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Instt. of Medical Sciences, Varanasi – Consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read : the compliance verification report (Nov., 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report(July, 99) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Medical Sciences, Varanasi for purpose of recognition of D.M.(Gastroenterology) qualification granted by Banaras Hindu University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Nov.2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (July,99) and decided to recommend that D.M. (Gastroenterology) qualification granted by Banaras Hindu University in respect of students being trained at Institute of Medical Sciences, Varanasi be recognised and included in the first schedule to the IMC Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

77. Recognition of Postgraduate degree “Arzt fur Nuklear-medizin” Germany u/s 13(3) of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 – Dr.B.K.Das.

Read : the letter dated 26.7.2001 from Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow forwarded by Central Govt. vide letter dated 21.8.2001 regarding

recognition of postgraduate degree "Arzt fur Nuklear-medizin" Germany u/s 13(3) of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 26.7.2001 from Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 6.11.1996 which reads as under:-

"The Postgraduate Committee review the earlier Committee's decision taken at its meeting held on 18.09.1995 permitting Dr. B.K. Das to be a postgraduate teacher with "Arzt fur Nuclear Medicine", Germany as a special case.

The Postgraduate Committee feels that a person having unrecognized qualification should not be considered as a recognised postgraduate teacher.

In view of the fact that Committee decided to review the earlier decision because of the fact that the degree possessed by Dr. B.K. Das cannot be equated with postgraduate degree of Indian Universities as there is no examination for the award of said degree."

78. To consider the letter dated 5.11.2003 from DME regarding admission in postgraduate courses at I) M.R.Medical College, Gulbarga (ii) Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore and (iii) Adichunchanagiri Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bellur.

Read : the letter dated 5.11.2003 from DME regarding admission in postgraduate courses at I) M.R.Medical College, Gulbarga (ii) Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore and (iii) Adichunchanagiri Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bellur.

The Postgraduate Committee noted the letter from the Director Medical Education, Karnataka dated 5.11.2003. It further decided that Registrar, Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore be informed that the Casual Vacancy Round to fill the vacant postgraduate seats shall not be applicable to Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore and M.R. Medical College, Gulbarga wherein the admissions to postgraduate courses have been stopped by the Council. The communication from the Dean, M.R. Medical College, Gulbarga dated 6.11.2003 was noted.

79. Starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read : the compliance verification report (November, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health, Bangalore for starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Nov.2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (May,2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D. (Pediatrics) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10 A of the IMC Act,1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the Act, 1956.

80. Starting of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) course at Guntur Medical College, Guntur affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (June, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Guntur Medical College, Guntur for consideration of starting of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 29th July, 2003 recommending to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) course at Guntur Medical College, Guntur affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 because the deficiencies pointed out earlier by the Postgraduate Committee are still existing.

81. Increase of seats in M.D.(General Medicine) course at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 –consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore togetherwith compliance for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

82. Starting of M.S.(Ophthalmology) course at Father Muller's Medical College, Mangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July,2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Father Muller's Medical College, Mangalore togetherwith compliance for consideration of starting of M.S.(Ophthalmology) u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

83. Starting of various postgraduate courses at Command Hospital (WC), Chandimandir, Haryana affiliated to Kurukshetra University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspectors' reports alongwith compliance for consideration of starting of various postgraduate courses at Command Hospital, Chandimandir u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The PG Committee considered the various inspection reports alongwith the details of the teaching faculty as provided by the institution on request and decided to recommend to the Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting the following PG courses at Command Hospital, Chandi Mandir due to the reasons as mentioned against each subject:-

MS (ENT):-

1. HOD does not have requisite experience (5 years as Advisor) to be eligible as Professor
2. One of the Associate Professors Dr. Ravinder Kumar Verma has no experience as Classified Specialist to be eligible as Associate Professor.
3. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

MD (OB & Gynae):-

1. Clinical material is grossly insufficient Doctors on call.
2. Affiliate faculty posted at Jalandhar is included in teaching faculty.
3. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

MD (Skin & V.D):-

1. The HOD and other faculty members do not possess the requisite teaching experience for appointment for their respective posts.
2. Professor of Emeritus who cannot be counted towards teaching faculty is also over the age of 65 years.
3. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

MS (General Surgery):-

1. The HOD has been promoted to the post of Professor with only two and half years' experience as Advisor which is not sufficient whereas the minimum required experience is five years as Advisor.
2. The other Three Professors namely, Dr. M. Ganguli, Dr. V.K. Batis and Dr. Arun Chopra have no experience as Advisors before they were promoted as Professor and therefore are not eligible.
3. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

M.D. (Anesthesia):-

1. HOD has been promoted as Professor only with an experience of one-year and nine months as Advisor as against the required minimum experience of 5 years. The other Professors, Dr. K.P. Manrai also does not possess required experience as Advisor to become Professor.
2. Dr. Rashmi Datta does not possess PG qualification.
3. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

M.D. (General Medicine):-

1. Professor and HOD has been promoted only after one & half years' experience as an Advisor as against the minimum required period of five years. Moreover, the total teaching experience is three & half years.
2. Out of the 4 Associate 2 Professors do not possess required PG qualification and another 2 do not possess any teaching experience at all.
3. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

M.S. (Ophthalmology):-

1. Professor and HOD has no experience as Advisor to be eligible as Professor. His total teaching experience is only 2 years.
2. Dr. Jaivir Singh, Associate Professor has only 8 months experience as Classified Specialist and thus not eligible for the Post.
3. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

M.D. (Radio Diagnosis):-

1. The Department does not possess facilities for MRI and Menography. The Professor and HOD has only two & half years experience as Advisor before he was promoted as Professor.
2. Dr. Salil Singh, Associate Professor has no experience as Classified Specialist.
3. One of the Associate Professors does not possess recognized Postgraduate qualification.
4. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

84. Starting of M.D.(Biochemistry) course at Govt. Medical College, Kolkata affiliated to University of Calcutta u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (June, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Kolkata togetherwith compliance for consideration of starting of M.D.(Biochemistry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2003) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

85. Collaboration between NBE and Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh relating to conduct of combined examination and also award of joint degree – recommendations of sub-committee regarding.

Read : the Central Govt.'s letter dated 21.5.2003 alongwith recommendations of the sub-committee with regard to collaboration between NBE and Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh relating to conduct of combined examination and also award of joint degree.

The Postgraduate Committee accepted the report of the Sub-Committee with regard to collaboration between NBE and Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh relating to conduct of combined examination and also award of joint degree.

86. Maharishi Dayanand University, Rohtak - Recognition of M.D.(Forensic Medicine) qualification in respect of students being trained at Pt. B.D. Sharma Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2002) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pt. B.D. Sharma Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak togetherwith compliance for purpose of recognition of M.D.(Forensic Medicine) qualification granted by Maharishi Dayanand University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2002) and decided not to recommend recognition of M.D. (Forensic Medicine) qualification granted by Maharishi Dayanand University in respect of students being trained at Pt. B.D. Sharma Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak because the postmortem work which is done in the department of Forensic Medicine is only referral in character and as such is insufficient for the postgraduate training. Further, the regular postmortem work is done by the HCM doctors which should be avoided.

87. University of Bombay/Mumbai – Approval of Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai for the award of M.D.(Paediatrics) qualification - consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (January, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Paediatrics) qualification granted by University of Bombay/Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (January, 2003) and decided not to approve institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai for the award of MD (Pediatics) qualification granted by University of Bombay/Mumbai because of the following:-

- (i) Promotion of Associate Professor is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

88. University of Bombay/Mumbai – Approval of Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai for the award of M.D.(Anaesthesia) qualification – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (January, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Navel Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Anaesthesia) qualification earlier granted by University of Bombay and now by University of Mumbai.

The P.G. Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (January 2003) alongwith the details of the teaching faculty as subsequently submitted by the authorities; and decided not to recommend approval of the college for the award of M.D. (Anaesthesia) qualification because of the following reasons:-

1. Professor and HOD has three & half years' experience as Advisor as against the required minimum of five years for the purpose of Professorship.
2. Promotion of other faculty members has also been noted to find effected without the requisite experience in the respective cadre (Graded and Classified Specialists).
3. One of the faculty members Dr. R.A.K. Sharma does not possess recognized Postgraduate qualification.
4. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

89. University of Bombay/Mumbai – Approval of Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification – consideration of compliance regarding.

To consider the Council Inspector's report (January, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification granted by University of Bombay/Mumbai.

The P.G. Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (January, 2003) alongwith the details of the teaching faculty as subsequently submitted by the authorities; and decided not to recommend approval of the college for the award of M.S. (Orthopaedics) qualification because of the following reasons:-

1. Professor and HOD for Deptt. possess only DNB qualification obtained in 1994. His total teaching experience as Advisor is nine months as against the required 5 years.
2. Dr. D.K. Sinha has noted to joined as Associate Professor after the inspection carried out by the Council Inspector in September, 2003
3. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

90. University of Bombay/Mumbai – Approval of Institute of Navel Medicine, INHS, , Aswini, Mumbai for the award of M.S.(General Surgery) qualification – consideration of compliance attached.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Navel Medicine, INHS, Aswini, Mumbai togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(General Surgery) qualification earlier granted by University of Bombay and now by University of Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector's report (July, 2003) together with compliance and decided to recommend that Institute of Navel Medicine, INHS, Aswini, Mumbai be approved for the award of MS (General Surgery) qualification earlier granted by University of Bombay and now by University of Mumbai restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students per year.

91. University of Bombay/Mumbai – Approval of Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai for the award of M.D.(Obst. & Gyane.) – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector report's (Jan., 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Obst. & Gyane.) qualification granted by University of Bombay/Mumbai.

The P.G. Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (January, 2003) alongwith the details of the teaching faculty as subsequently submitted by the authorities; and decided not to recommend approval of the college for the award of M.D. (Obst. & Gynae.) qualification because of the following reasons:-

1. It is noted that department is having total 110 beds in one unit.
2. Professor and Head of Deptt. possesses only two and half years experience as Advisor as against the required five years. His total teaching experience is only six years.

3. Dr. Sushil Kumar, Associate Professor is noted to have joined after the Council inspection in January, 2003.
4. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

92. University of Bombay/Mumbai – Approval of Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai for the award of M.D.(Pathology) qualification – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council inspector's report (July, 2003) on standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Navel Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Pathology) qualification earlier granted by University of Bombay and now by University of Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector's report (July, 2003) and decided to recommend that Institute of Navel Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai be approved for the award of MD (Pathology) qualification earlier granted by University of Bombay and now by University of Mumbai restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

93. University of Bombay/Mumbai - Approval Instt. of Navel Medicine, INHS, , Mumbai for the award of MD (General Medicine) qualification – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (January, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Instt. of Navel Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification granted by University of Bombay/Mumbai.

The P.G. Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (January, 2003) alongwith the details of the teaching faculty as subsequently submitted by the authorities; and decided not to recommend approval of the college for the award of M.D. (Medicine) qualification because of the following reasons:-

1. Unit-wise bed strength is 55.
2. 80% staff is of Super-Specialists and the inspection has clarified that they are also training Postgraduates in their Super specialities.
3. Professor and Head only possesses two-years' experience as Advisor against the required five-years.
4. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

94. University of Bombay/Mumbai – Approval of Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (January, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification granted by University of Bombay/Mumbai.

The P.G. Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (January, 2003) alongwith the details of the teaching faculty as subsequently submitted by the authorities; and decided not to recommend approval of the college for the award of M.D. (Ophthalmology) qualifications because of the following reasons:-

1. The Department is not headed by Professor. The other two teachers also do not possess the requisite experience for the post they are holding.
2. Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

95. Madras University and The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Approval of Medical Research Foundation (Sankara Nethralaya), Chennai for the award of D.O. qualification – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (April, 2003) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Medical Research Foundation(Sankara Nethralaya), Chennai togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of D.O. qualification earlier granted by Madras University and now by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (April, 2003) alongwith details of teaching faculty and decided that the Principal/Dean of the institution be given an opportunity of personal hearing with the Secretary of MCI with the details of qualification, the college/institution where the training was undergone and date and name of University granting the same alongwith teaching experience has been obtained.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the required information is available.

96. Change in nomenclature of M.D.(Dermatologv) degree to M.D.(Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) degree in the Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the letter dated 13.11.2003 from the Registrar, PGI, Chandigarh with regard to change the nomenclature from M.D.(Dermatology) to M.D.(Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) degree in the Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956..

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 13.11.2003 from the Registrar PGI, Chandigarh and decided to recommend to include the degree by the changed nomenclature i.e. (M.D.(Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) degree in the Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956.

97. Starting of M.Ch.(Paediatric Surgery) course at Guntur Medical College, Guntur affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Guntur Medical College, Guntur togetherwith compliance for consideration of starting of M.Ch.(Paediatric Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

98. Increase of seats in M.D.(General Medicine) course at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 - compliance verification regarding issuance of LOP.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (September, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (March, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (General Medicine) course at Kakatiya medical college, Warangal affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 from 4 (four) to 6(six) students per year prospectively till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examinations for the said course commensurate with the available clinical material.

99. Starting of M.D.(Anaesthesiology) & D.A. courses at J.L.N.Medical College, Swangi, Wardha affiliated to Nagpur University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read: the matter compliance verification reports (May, 2003 & November, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (September, 2002) on the physical and

other teaching facilities available at J.L.N. Medical College, Swangi, Wardha for starting of M.D.(Anaesthesiology) & D.A. courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification reports (May, 2003 & November, 2003) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (September, 2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D. (Anaesthesiology) & DA courses at J.L.N. Medical College, Swangi, Wardha affiliated to admissions to 2(two students) for MD (Anaesthesiology) and 1(one Student) for DA courses per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said courses. The Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

100. Increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal, Manipur affiliated to Manipur University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (November, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal, Manipur for increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.S. (General Surgery) course at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal, Manipur affiliated to Manipur University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 from 4(four) to 8(eight) students per year prospectively till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examinations of the said course in commensurate with the available clinical material.

101. i) **Gulbarga University - Recognition of D.O. qualification in respect of students being trained at Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary and also approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification.**
- ii) **Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Approval of Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for the award of M.S. (Ophthalmology) & D.O. qualifications.**

103. Nagpur University – Approval of J.L.N. Medical College, Swangi, Wardha for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (November, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at J.L.N. Medical College, Swangi, Wardha for approval of the college for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification granted by Nagpur University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2003) and decided not to recommend approval of J.L.N. Medical college, Swangi, Wardha for the award of M.D. (General Medicine) qualifications granted by Nagpur University because of the following:-

- i) The standard of practical examinations was not upto the mark as noted the clinical material for examination, standard of questions and performance of candidates were not impressive. The evaluation lacked discriminatory capacity as observed in the inspection report.
- ii) Other deficiencies pointed out by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

104. Nagpur University – Approval of J.L.N. Medical College, Swangi, Wardha for the award of M.S.(General Surgery) qualification.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (November, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at J.L.N. Medical College, Swangi, Wardha for approval of the college for the award of M.S.(General Surgery) qualification granted by Nagpur University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2003) and noted that (I) composition of Units I & III is not complete as regards teaching faculty (ii) the Unit-I is mentioned as for General Surgery including Paediatric Surgery and Unit-II as for General Surgery including Urology, Neuro-Surgery and Plastic Surgery.

The Committee decided to advise the institution authorities to reorganize the units as regards teaching faculty and seek clarification in respect of inclusion of super-speciality in Caption of Unit I & II, and defer the consideration till the information is received from the college.

105 Starting of M.D.(General Medicine) course at Siddhartha Medical College, Vijayawada affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance regarding.

Read : the compliance verification report (February, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Siddhartha Medical College, Vijayawada for starting of M.D.(General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (February, 2003) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (June, 2002) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.
