3. **Starting of M.D.(Anaesthesia) course at S.V. Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati affiliated to S.V. Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati (Deemed University) under u/s 10 of the IMC Act 1956**

Read: the Council Inspector's report (June, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at S.V. Institutes of Medical Sciences, Tirupati for consideration of increase of seats in M.D. (Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D. (Anaesthesia) course at S.V. Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following –

- (i) Teaching staff is insufficient for undergraduate intake.
- (ii) Library facilities are inadequate.
- (iii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

4. **Starting of M.S.(E.N.T.) & D.L.O. courses at J.L.N. Medical College, Swangi, Wardha affiliated to Nagpur University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at J.L.N. Medical College, Swangi, Wardha for consideration of starting of M.S.(E.N.T.) & D.L.O. courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.S. (ENT) & D.L.O. courses at J.L.N. Medical College, Swangi, Wardha affiliated to Nagpur University u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year in each course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

**5. Starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) & D.P.M. courses at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha affiliated to Nagpur University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha for consideration of starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) & D.P.M. courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D. (Psychiatry) & DPM courses at Mahtma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following –

- (i) Teaching complement is incomplete, as there is no Associate Professor.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**6. Starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for consideration of starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D. (Microbiology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following –

- (i) Promotion of Prof. & HOD and Assoc. Professor is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**7. Starting of M.D.(Physiology) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan affiliated to Burdwan University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the physical and other teaching jfacilities available at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan for consideration of starting of M.D.(Physiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D. (Physiology) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following –

- (i) Teaching staff is insufficient even for undergraduate intake.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**8. Starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) & D.P.M. courses at Mamata Medical College, Khammam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance verification for issuance of LOP regarding.**

Read : the compliance verification report (September, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mamata Medical College, Khammam for consideration of starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) & D.P.M. courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (September, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D. (Psychiatry) & D.P.M. courses at Mamata Medical College, Khammam affiliated to N.T.R.University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year in each course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956.

**9. Starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course at N.B. Medical College, Darjeeling affiliated to University of North Bengal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (May, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at N.B. Medical College, Darjeeling togetherwith compliance for consideration of starting of M.D. (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May, 2003) and noted that Professor and HOD does not possess recognised postgraduate qualification. The Committee further noted that the certificate of additional qualification from West Bengal Medical Council in respect of Dr. Sutapa Ganguly although includes MD (Paed.) possessed by her as additional qualification. However, on scrutiny, it is revealed that the same is not included in the Schedules to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

The Committee decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 1st & 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 2003 recommending to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD (Paed.) course at N.B. Medical College, Darjeeling affiliated to University of North Bengal u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 because the deficiencies pointed out earlier are still existing.

**10. Starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course at Sri Devraj Urs Medical College, Kolar affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification regarding.**

Read : the compliance verification report (September, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (August, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sri Devraj Urs Medical College, Kolar for starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (September, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (August, 2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D. (Microbiology) course at Sri Devraj Urs Medical College, Kolar affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11 (2) of the Act, 1956.

**11. Starting of M.Ch.(Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the I.M.C.Act, 1956- consideration of compliance verification regarding.**

Read: the compliance verification report (July, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam for starting of M.Ch.(Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (July,2003) together with compliance and Council's Inspector's report (May 2002) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 26.9.2002 recommending to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MCh.(Cardio-Thoracic Surgery) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because the deficiencies pointed out earlier are still existing.

**12. Increase of seats in M.S.(Orthopaedics) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for consideration of increase of seats in M.S.(Orthopaedics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.D.(Orthopaedics) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because the following deficiencies:-

- (i) Teaching complement is incomplete in all the three units.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions in M.D. (Orthopaedics) course from the ensuing academic session.

**13. Increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) considered the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal affiliated to NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because the following deficiencies:-

- (i) Operation theatres lights and tables are very shabby with poor sterile control.
- (ii) Operating rooms look very fancy but not equipped yet.
- (iii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**14. Increase of seats in M.D.(Microbiology) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.D.(Microbiology) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because the following deficiencies:-

- (i) Facilities available in terms of equipment, faculties are not adequate for enhancement of seat.
- (ii) There is no fluorescent Microscope and ELISA reader in the department. ELISA reader of deptt. of Community Medicine is used by Microbiology PGs.
- (iii) Round the clock laboratory in the hospital does not carry out any microbiology investigations.
- (iv) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**15. Increase of seats in M.D.(T.B. & Respiratory Diseases) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(T.B. & Respiratory Diseases) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) and noted that the units are not as per MCI norms in terms of bed distribution and Incharge of Unit-IV is also not as per MCI norms and decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the teaching faculty as per MCI norms.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration till the information is received from the institution authorities.

**16. Increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for consideration of increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because the following deficiencies:-

- (i) There is as such no well equipped casualty department.
- (ii) Both emergency and cold operation theater registers are not maintained by OT sisters-in-charge. Statistics provided in the enclosure, therefore, may be imaginary. On enquiry it has been noted that only 2-3 operations (average) per day are performed in emergency OT which is grossly inadequate for PG training.

- (iii) 30 teaching beds per unit are adequate for PG training but during inspection, a good number of beds were not found vacant. OTs are as such underutilized which is directly related with PG training.
- (iv) Surgical OPD closes at about 12.30 p.m. though officially it should be at 2 p.m.
- (v) Radiology department is good but Interventional Radiology is not at all practised.
- (vi) Departmental library is neglected, does not have new edition text books, journals etc.
- (vii) There is a lack of teaching atmosphere. During the inspection, the inspection team did not find any undergraduate student either in the ward or in OPD. There were no undergraduate or postgraduate clinics taken by any teacher.
- (viii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions in M.S.(General Surgery) course from the ensuing academic session.

**17. Increase of seats in M.D.(Microbiology) course at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.D.(Microbiology) course at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada affiliated to NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because the following deficiencies:-

- (i) Instrumentation is inadequate
- (ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**18. Increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification regarding.**

Read : the compliance verification report (June, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (June, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (October, 2002) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 20.1.2003 recommending to Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because the deficiencies pointed out earlier are still existing.

**19. Increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification regarding.**

Read : the compliance verification report (August, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (September, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam for increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (August, 2003) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (September, 2002) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.S. (General

Surgery) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 from 5 (five) to 6 (six) students per year.

The attention of the authorities be drawn towards the implementation of the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

**20. Increase of seats in M.D. (Anaesthesia) & D.A. courses at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (June, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore for increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) & D.A. courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee decided to correct the minutes pertaining to its decision taken at its meeting held on 29.7.2003 in respect of the concerned college whereby the words "& D.A." is deleted and the decision be read as under:-

*"The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (Anaesthesia) course at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 5 (five) students per year in each course till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examinations of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examinations as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the Act, 1956."*

**21. Increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003 & September, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore for increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003 & September, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.S. (General Surgery) course at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 from 6 (six) to 8 (eight) students per year prospectively till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examinations of the said course commensurate with the available clinical material.

**22. Rajasthan University – Recognition of DM(Cardiology) qualification in respect of students being trained at S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (April, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur for purpose of recognition of DM(Cardiology) qualification granted by Rajasthan University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (April, 2003) and decided to recommend that DM (Cardiology) qualification granted by Rajasthan University in respect of students being trained at S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur be recognised and included in the first schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

**23. University of Rajasthan – Approval of S.P. Medical College, Bikaner for the award of MD (Tuberculosis and Resp./Chest Diseases) qualification .**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at S.P. Medical College, Bikaner for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Tuberculosis and Resp./Chest Diseases) qualification granted by University of Rajasthan.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the required information is available.

**24. Marathwada University/Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University – Approval of SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai for the award of MD (Physiology) qualification.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Physiology) qualification earlier granted by Marathwada University and now by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) and decided to recommend that SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai be approved for the award of MD (Physiology) qualification earlier granted by Marathwada University and now by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

Read : the Council Inspector's report (Feb, 2000) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Medical Sciences, Varanasi togetherwith compliance for purpose of recognition of M.Ch.(Neurosurgery) qualification granted by Banaras Hindu University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (February, 2000) togetherwith compliance and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

**55. Marathwada University/Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University – Approval of S.R.T.R. Medical College, Ambajogai for the award of M.S. (Ophthalmology) & D.O./D.O.M.S. qualifications.**

Read : the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at S.R.T.R. Medical College, Ambajogai for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology) & D.O./D.O.M.S. qualifications earlier granted by Marathwada University and now by Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University .

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) and decided not to approve S.R.T.R.Medical College, Ambajogai for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology) & D.O./D.O.M.S. qualifications granted by Marathwada University/Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University because teaching complement is not complete as there is no Associate Professor in the department.

**56. i) Andhra University - Recognition of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications in respect of students being trained at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada.**

**ii) Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Approval of Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for the award of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications.**

Read: the Council Inspector's report (March, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for purpose of i) recognition of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications granted by Andhra University and also ii) approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications granted by

Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (March, 2003) and decided to recommend that :-

- i) M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualification granted by Andhra University in respect of students trained at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada be recognised and included in the first schedule to the IMC Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year in each course.
- ii) Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada be approved for the award of M.D.(Pathology) & D.C.P. qualifications granted by Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year in each course.

**57. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore for the award of D.V.D. qualification – Consideration of compliance regarding.**

Read: the Council Inspector's report (April, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of D.V.D. qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (April, 2003) togetherwith compliance and noted that the information furnished does not indicate about running of P.G. degree in M.D.(Dermatology) and decided that the details thereof may be sought from authorities of the institution.

**58. Recognition of F.C.P.S. course in Child Health governed by College of Physicians and Surgeons, Bombay –regarding.**

Read: the Central Govt. letter dated 18.8.2003 forwarding therewith a copy of letter dated 30.6.2003 from Smt. Pratibha D.Patil, former MP, Amravati regarding recognition of F.C.P.S. degree course in Child Health.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Central Govt. letter dated 18.8.2003 and decided that the decision of the Postgraduate Committee at its meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> August, 2001 may be brought to the notice of Smt. Pratibha D.Patil, former MP, Amravati.

**59. To consider the inspection report of (I) M.R.Medical College, Gulbarga (ii) Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore and (iii) Adichunchanagiri Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bellur.**

Read: the inspection report of (i) M.R.Medical College, Gulbarga (ii) Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore and (iii) Adichunchanagiri Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bellur.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the Executive Committee and members of the Adhoc Committee considered the Council Inspectors report 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2003 pertaining to M.R. Medical College, Gulbarga at its meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2003 and observed that there is gross evidence of irregularities in registering the patients in the main register of the hospital. Some of the entries are followed by the blank spaces and not by the entries of the patients. The Dean of the college could not give any explanation. Similar manipulation was also observed in the register of the operation theatre. The Committee also observed gross deficiencies in the clinical material, teaching and non-teaching staff etc.

The Executive Committee and members of the Adhoc Committee considered the Inspectors report pertaining to Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellur dated 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2003 at its meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2003 and found gross deficiencies in terms of teaching staff, clinical material etc.

The Executive Committee and members of the Adhoc Committee considered the Inspectors report of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore dated 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2003 at its meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2003 and found gross deficiencies in terms of teaching staff, clinical material etc.

In view of the gross deficiencies that were observed in the inspection reports, the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the Executive Committee were clearly of the view that it would be against the interest of innocent students who, if not stopped, will be admitted in these colleges for the academic year 2003-04. Accordingly, it was decided that the State Government be advised not to make admissions in the first year of the MBBS course for the academic year 2003-04 at these three colleges. It was also decided that if the deficiencies are not removed necessary action u/s 19 be considered for recommending to the Central Government for de-recognition.

The Committee also decided to refer the inspection reports to the Postgraduate Committee of the Council for consideration regarding the postgraduate courses.

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee considered the said reports and taking note of the deficiencies including therein and the decision of the Executive Committee alongwith the members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and decided that the college authorities be directed forthwith to stop the admissions to all the postgraduate degree/diploma courses that are currently being run by the said colleges under intimation to the Registrar of the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore and Secretary (Health) of the State of Karnataka.

15. **Increase of seats in M.D.(T.B. & Respiratory Diseases) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

“The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector’s report (July, 2003) and noted that promotion of Incharge of Unit-IV is not as per MCI norms and decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise Unit-IV as per MCI norms.”

20. **Increase of seats in M.D. (Anaesthesia) & D.A. courses at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

“The Postgraduate Committee decided to correct the minutes pertaining to its decision its decision taken at its meeting held on 29.7.2003 in respect of the concerned college whereby the words “& D.A.” is deleted and the decision be read as under:-

“The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector’s report (June, 2003) and decided to recommend to Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (Anaesthesia) course at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 5 (five) students per year in each course till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examinations of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examinations as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the Act, 1956.”

Resultantly the annual intake for DA shall continue be 6 per year.
