4. Starting of M.D(Biochemistry) course at Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Bihar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance verification report (May, 2006) together with the compliance and Council Inspector's report (November, 2005) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Bihar for consideration of starting of M.D(Biochemistry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (May,2006) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (Nov.,2005) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD(Biochemistry) course at Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura, Bihar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2007-2008 restricting the number of admission to 2 (two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956.

Mandal University, Madhepura, Bihar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

1. Equipments available in the department are inadequate.
2. Clinical material is inadequate.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

6. Starting of MD(Radio-Diag.) course at K.S.Hegde Medical Academy, Mangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance verification report (May, 2006) together with the compliance and Council Inspector's report (April, 2005) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at K.S.Hegde Medical Academy, Mangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore for consideration of starting of MD(Radio-Diag.) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (May,2006) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (April,2005) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Radio-Diag.) course at K.S.Hegde Medical Academy, Mangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2007-2008 restricting the number of admission to 1 (one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956.

7. Starting of MD(Physiology) course at Sree Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector report (May, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sree Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore for consideration of starting of M.D.(Physiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May,2006) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Physiology) course at Sree Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2007-2008 restricting the number of admission to 3 (three) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956.

8. Starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course at Sri Guru Ram Das Instt. of Medical Sciences, Amritsar under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

9. Starting of MS(General Surgery) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector report (July, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University for consideration of starting of M.S.(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July,2006) and decided to advise the institution to reorganize the units in terms of bed strength of the department of General Surgery as per MCI norms.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration till the information is received.

10. Starting of MD(Microbiology) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University for consideration of starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July,2006) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

1. There is no research lab.
2. Space is inadequate in one of the two demonstration rooms.
3. Instrumentation is inadequate.
4. Museum needs improvement.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

11. Starting of MS(Obst. & Gynae.) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University for consideration of starting of M.S.(Obst. & Gynae.) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July,2006) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.S.(Obst. & Gynae.) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

1. Incharge of Unit-II does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
2. Teaching complement is incomplete in Unit-III as it is headed by an Asstt. Prof.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

12. Starting of MD(Pathology) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspectors report (July, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University for consideration of starting of M.D.(Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July,2006) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Pathology) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

1. Coagulation profile is not done regularly.

2. Facilities for Cytogenetics and Molecular Diagnostics are not available.
3. Clinical autopsy number needs improvement.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

13. Starting of MD(Psychiatry) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspectors report (July, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University for consideration of starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July,2006) and noted that there is no Associate Professor in the department of Psychiatry; decided to advise the institution to reorganize the Unit in terms of teaching faculty as per MCI norms.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration till the information is received.

14. Starting of MD(Paediatrics) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University for consideration of starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July,2006) and noted that Unit-I of the department of Paediatric does not have Associate Professor; decided to advise the institution to reorganize the Units in terms of teaching faculty as per MCI norms.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration till the information is received.

15. Starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University for consideration of starting of M.S.(Orthopaedics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July,2006) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.S.(Orthopaedics) course at Govt. Medical College, Thrissur under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

1. Clinical material is inadequate.
2. CT Scan machine is not working.
3. Physiotherapy facilities are highly inadequate with virtually no machines.
4. Departmental research laboratory needs expansion and there is no facility for Central research laboratory.
5. Publication from the department is lacking.
6. Central library needs regular supply of reputed Orthopaedics journal.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

16. Starting of D.Ortho. course at Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Bihar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance verification report (June, 2006) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (November, 2005) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Bihar for consideration of starting of D. Ortho. course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (June, 2006) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (Nov.,2005) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of D. Ortho. course at Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura, Bihar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2007-2008 restricting the

number of admission to 2 (two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

17. Starting of MD(Community Medicine) course at Patliputra Medical College, Dhanbad under Vinoba Bhave University, Hazaribagh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Patliputra Medical College, Dhanbad under Vinoba Bhave University, Hazaribagh for consideration of starting of M.D.(Community Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Community Medicine) course at Patliputra Medical College, Dhanbad under Vinoba Bhave University, Hazaribagh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

1. As of now there is no residential accommodation for medical officers and UG students/interns in RHTC.
2. The medical education unit, statistical unit and audiovisual units are yet to be made operational.
3. The departmental laboratory is also to be made functional.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

18. Starting of M.Ch.(Urology) course at Vijaynagar Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bellary under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Vijaynagar Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bellary under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore for consideration of starting of M.Ch.(Urology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.Ch. (Urology) course at Vijaynagar Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bellary under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

1. There is no Nephrology department.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

Arising out of the discussion, the Committee authorized the Chairman to constitute a Committee for reviewing the prescribed basic requirements for starting of super-speciality courses and their recognition so as to be commensurate with the changing times.

19. Starting of MD(Psychiatry) course at J.L.N. Medical College, Aligarh under Aligarh Muslim University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at J.L.N. Medical College, Aligarh under Aligarh Muslim University for consideration of starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course at J.L.N. Medical College, Aligarh under Aligarh Muslim University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2007-2008 restricting the number of admission to 01 (one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

20. Starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course at Annasaheb Chaudaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Dhule affiliated to North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956- consideration of compliance regarding.

Read: The compliance verification report (July, 2006) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Annasaheb Chavdaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Dhule for consideration of starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (July, 2006) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course at Annasaheb Chavdaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Dhule under North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2007-2008 restricting the number of admission to 2 (two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956.

21. Starting of M.S.(General Surgery) course at Annasaheb Chaudaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Dhule affiliated to North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956- consideration of compliance regarding.

Read: The compliance verification report (July, 2006) together with compliance and Council Inspectors report (April, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Annasaheb Chavdaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Dhule for consideration of starting of M.S.(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (July, 2006) together with the compliance and Council Inspectors report (April, 2004) and decided to reiterate its earlier decisions taken at its meetings held on 23.12.2004 & 18.02.2006 recommending to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.S.(General Surgery) course at Annasaheb Chavdaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Dhule affiliated to North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because the following deficiencies are still persisting:-

- (i) Histopathology workload is inadequate.
- (ii) Investigative workload is inconsistent with the records of OPD, IPD and bed occupancy.
- (iii) Clinical and Surgical workload is grossly inadequate.
- (iv) All beds in post-anaesthesia room were unoccupied.
- (v) Teaching complement is incomplete in all units.
- (vi) Laundry is manual.
- (vii) Blood Bank located in Dental College, away from the medical college.
- (viii) Facilities for thyroid profile and other hormone estimations are not available.
- (ix) Incinerator is not in use.
- (x) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above, the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of M.S.(General Surgery) course. However, the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies in accordance with the Council's Regulation on Postgraduate Medical Education,2000.

22. Starting of M.D. (Paediatrics) course at Annasaheb Chaudaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Dhule affiliated to North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956- consideration of compliance regarding.

Read: The compliance verification report (July, 2006) together with the compliance and Council Inspectors report (May, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Annasaheb Chaudaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Dhule for consideration of starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (July, 2006) together with the compliance and Council Inspectors report (May, 2004) and

decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course at Annasaheb Chavdaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Dhule under North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2007-2008 restricting the number of admission to 2 (two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956.

23. Increase of seats in M.D.(Radio-Therapy) course at Kidwai Memorial Instt. of Oncology under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kidwai Memorial Instt. of Oncology under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(Radio-Therapy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July,2006) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (Radio-therapy) course at Kidwai Memorial Instt. of Oncology under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act,1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2007-2008 from 1 (one) to 3 (three) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course.

24. Increase of seats in M.S.(Ophthalmology) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad for increase of seats in M.S.(Ophthalmology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (July,2006) along with compliance and Council Inspector's report (Nov.,2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in M.S. (Ophthalmology) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act,1956 because the institution does not have the teaching faculty and other infrastructure for increase of seats.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to restrict the number of admissions prospectively to 4(four) students per year in each course i.e. M.S.(Ophthalmology) and D.O. in consonance with the Regulations of the Council on Postgraduate Medical Education,2000.

25. Calcutta University – Recognition of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification in respect of students being trained at R.G. Kar Medical College, Calcutta.

Read: The inspection report (April 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at R.G. Kar Medical College, Calcutta for purpose of recognition M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Calcutta University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (April,2006) and decided to recommend that M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Calcutta University in respect of students being trained at R.G. Kar Medical College, Calcutta be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

26. i) Nagpur University – Approval of Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sewagarm, Wardha for the award of M.D.(Anaesthesia) & D.A. qualifications.

ii) **Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik – Approval of the college for the award of D.A. qualification.**

Read: The compliance verification report (May, 2006) together with the compliance and Council Inspector's report (November, 2001) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sewagram, Wardha for i) approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Anaesthesia) & D.A. qualifications granted by Nagpur University and ii) also for approval of the college for the award of D.A. qualification granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (May,2006) together with the compliance and Council Inspector's report (Nov.,2001) and decided to recommend that :-

1. Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Wardha be approved for the award of M.D.(Anaesthesia) & D.A. qualifications granted by Nagpur University restricting the number of admissions to 2 students per year in M.D.(Anaesthesia).
2. Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Wardha be approved for the award of D.A. qualification granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to restrict the number of admission to 1(one) student per year prospectively for D.A. course.

27. **Guwahati University – Approval of Silchar Medical College, Silchar for the award of MD(Obst. & Gynae.) & DGO qualification.**
&
Assam University – Recognition of MD(Obst. & Gynae.) & DGO qualification in respect of students being trained at Silchar Medical College, Silchar.

1. Space available in the department for faculty is inadequate.
2. Separate chambers as offices are not available except for HOD.

3. Central and departmental libraries need to be upgraded further with the latest edition of books. Another standard and indexed foreign Orthopaedic journal needs to be added up.
4. Proper incinerator not existing in-House. Biodegradable waste is disposed by digging and for bio-non-degradable waste (plastic) – it is shredded in the institution and then handed over to a private firm for further degradation.

42. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Father Muller Medical College, Mangalore for the award of M.S. (General Surgery) qualification in respect of increased intake.

Read: The inspection report (May 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Father Muller Medical College, Mangalore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S. (General Surgery) qualifications granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore for the increased intake.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May,2006) and noted that Father Muller Medical College, Mangalore already stands approved for the award of M.S.(General Surgery) qualification with 2 (two) seats and now the matter is under consideration for approval of the college against the increased intake; decided to recommend that Father Muller Medical College, Mangalore be approved for the award of M.S.(General Surgery) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore against the increased intake restricting the number of admission to 4 (four) students per year.

43. A.P./NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada – Recognition of M.Ch. (Paediatrics Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad.

Read: The inspection report (June 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad for purpose of

1. The clinical workload, number of patients seen in outpatient department and number of major surgeries performed annually are grossly inadequate.
2. The M.Ch. students are not getting enough exposure to any of the special areas of Paediatric Surgery.
3. The departmental and central library doesn't have adequate books and journals. Not even a single international journal has arrived in last 2 ½ years.
4. There is no publication from the department in last three years.
5. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

New accommodation for which civil work has been completed is available in the proposed out patient block on 3rd floor. They should be furnished and made functional.

Read: The compliance verification report (June, 2006) together with the compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2001) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Paediatrics) & D.C.H. qualifications granted by Osmania University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (June, 2006) together with the compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2001) and decided to advise the institution to reorganize the Unit in terms of bed strength as per MCI norms in the department of Paediatrics.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration till the information is received.

49. Osmania University, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada – Recognition of M.Ch.(Urology/Genito-Urinary Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad.

Read: The compliance verification report (August, 2006) together with the compliance and Council Inspector's report (June, 2001) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad for purpose of recognition of M.Ch.(Urology/Genito-Urinary Surgery) qualification granted by Osmania University, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

2. There is no Assoc. Professor in the department.
3. The OPD space is not adequate at present.

4. The turn over in the operation theatre as regards open operations and other endourology operations is not satisfactory for PG training. The postgraduates are not adequately exposed to state of art endourology techniques. Renal transplantations are not done at present.
5. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

50. A.P./NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada – Recognition of DM(Endocrinology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad.

2. There is no Assoc. Professor in the department.
3. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

51. A.P./NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada – Recognition of MD(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad.

Read: The inspection report (July 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for purpose of recognition of MD(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification granted by A.P./NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June,2006) and decided not to recommend recognition of M.D.(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification granted by A.P./NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad because of the following:-

1. Instrumentation is inadequate in terms of MRI & Mammography machines.
2. Library facilities are inadequate in terms of journals.
3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to restrict the number of admission to 1 (One) student each per year prospectively in M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) & D.G.O. qualifications.

62. Marathwada University/Dr.Baba Saheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad – recognition of MS(ENT) & DLO Qualification in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Aurangabad

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the inspection report (Feb., 2005) and decided to recommend that MS(ENT) qualification earlier granted by Marathwada University and now by Dr.Baba Saheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Aurangabad be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to restrict the number of admission to 1 (One) student per year prospectively in MS (ENT) Course.

The Committee further decided to direct the authorities of the institution to stop admissions for DLO qualification because there is only one postgraduate teacher against whom the degree seat is recognized.

63. Dr. Baba Saheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad – Recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification in respect of students being trained at M.G.M. Medical College, Aurangabad.

64. University of Bombay/Mumbai– Recognition of M.D.(Physiology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Seth G.S, Medical College, Mumbai.

Read: The compliance verification report (July, 2006) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (March, 2001) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai for purpose of recognition of M.D.(Physiology) qualification granted by University of Bombay/Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (July, 2006) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (March, 2001) and decided to recommend that M.D.(Physiology) qualification granted by University of Bombay/Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 7 (Seven) students per year.

65. Mumbai University – Recognition of M.D.(General Medicine) qualifications in respect of students being trained at K.J. Somaiya Medical College & Research Centre, Mumbai.

Read: The inspection report (July 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at K.J. Somaiya Medical College & Research Centre, Mumbai for purpose of recognition of M.D. (General Medicine) qualification granted by Mumbai University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) and noted that appointment letters are not enclosed in some of the declaration forms or have been issued blank by the authorities or are not specifically clear and decided to seek the clarification from the college authorities in this regard.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to defer the consideration till the information is received.

66. Mumbai University – Recognition of M.D.(Paediatrics) qualification in respect of students being trained at K.J. Somaiya Medical College & Research Centre, Mumbai.

Read: The inspection report (July 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at K.J. Somaiya Medical College & Research Centre, Mumbai for purpose of recognition of M.D. (Paediatrics) qualification granted by Mumbai University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) and decided to recommend that M.D. (Paediatrics) qualification granted by Mumbai University in respect of students being trained at K.J. Somaiya Medical College & Research Centre, Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 1 (One) student per year.

67. The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai- Approval of Stanley Medical College, Chennai for the award of MD(Psychiatry) qualification.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (August, 2005) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Stanley Medical College, Chennai for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Psychiatry) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (August, 2005) and decided to recommend that Stanley Medical College, Chennai be approved for the award of MD (Psychiatry) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

68. Madras University & The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai – Recognition of M.Ch.(Neurosurgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Stanley Medical College, Chennai.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Stanley Medical College, Chennai for purpose of recognition of M.Ch.(Neurosurgery) qualification granted by Madras University & The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector Report (August, 2006) and decided not to recommend recognition of M.Ch.(Neurosurgery) qualification granted by Madras University & The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Stanley Medical College, Chennai because of the following deficiencies:-

- i) Instrumentation is inadequate in terms of MRI.
- ii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

69. Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gorakhpur University/ Gorakhpur University – Recognition of M.D. (Pathology) qualification in respect students being trained at B.R.D. Medical College, Gorakhpur.

Read: The inspection report (May 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at B.R.D. Medical College, Gorakhpur for purpose of recognition of M.D. (Pathology) qualification granted by Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gorakhpur University/ Gorakhpur University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May, 2006) and decided to recommend that M.D. (Pathology) qualification granted by Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gorakhpur University/ Gorakhpur University in respect of students being trained at B.R.D. Medical College, Gorakhpur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (Two) students per year.

70. Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gorakhpur University/ Gorakhpur University – Recognition of M.S. (Ophthalmology) qualification in respect students being trained at B.R.D. Medical College, Gorakhpur.

Read: The inspection report (May, 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at B.R.D. Medical College, Gorakhpur for purpose of recognition of M.S. (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gorakhpur University/ Gorakhpur University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (May, 2006) and decided not to recommend recognition of B.R.D. Medical College, Gorakhpur for the award of M.S. (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gorakhpur University/ Gorakhpur University because of the following deficiencies:

- i) Bed strength is not as per MCI norms.
- ii) Teaching complement is incomplete in both the Units.
- iii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to direct the college authorities to stop the admissions with immediate effect for M.S. (Ophthalmology) course.

71. Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University – Recognition of M.D.(Radio-Therapy) qualifications in respect of students being trained at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur.

Read: The inspection report (May 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur for purpose of recognition of M.D. (Radio-Therapy) qualification granted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May, 2006) and decided to recommend that M.D. (Radio-Therapy) qualification granted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University in respect of students being trained at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 1 (One) student per year.

72. Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University – Recognition of M.D.(Anaesthesia) & DA qualifications in respect of students being trained at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur.

Read: The inspection report (July 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur for purpose of recognition of M.D. (Anaesthesia) & DA qualification granted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the inspection report (July., 2006) and decided to recommend that M.D. (Anaesthesia) & DA qualifications granted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University in respect of students being trained at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to restrict the number of admissions to 3 (three) student for M.D. (Anaesthesia) and 1(One) student for D.A. course per year prospectively.

73. Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University – Recognition of DCP qualifications in respect of students being trained at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (July, 2006) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur for purpose of recognition of DCP qualification granted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (July, 2006) and decided to recommend that DCP qualification granted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University in respect of students being trained at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to restrict the number of admission to 1 (One) student per year prospectively.

74. Punjab University – Approval of Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh for the award of MD (Paediatrics) qualification.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (February, 2005) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Paediatrics) qualification granted by Punjab University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (February, 2005) and decided not to approve Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh for the award of MD (Paediatrics) qualification granted by Punjab University as the compliance is unsatisfactory.

75. Punjabi University – Recognition of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) qualification in respect of student trained at Govt. Medical College, Patiala.

Read: The Central Govt. letter dated 19/4/2006 regarding recognition of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) course under Punjabi University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 19.4.2006 received from the Central Government and noted that M.Ch. (Plastic Surgery) qualification in respect of Govt. Medical College, Patiala earlier granted by Punjabi University from 1987 to 1995 and no candidate is being admitted as the course has been discontinued since 1993 under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, decided to recommend to Central Government that M.Ch. (Plastic Surgery) qualification earlier granted by Punjabi University in respect of students trained at Govt. Medical College, Patiala be recognized and included in the Ist Schedule to the Indian Medical Council Act,1956 with the following proviso –

“This medical qualification shall be a recognized medical qualification granted between 1987 to 1995.”

76. Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College (Deemed University), Pune – Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) & DA qualification in respect of students being trained at Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College, Pune.

Read: The inspection report (August 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College, Pune for purpose of recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) & DA qualification granted by Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College (Deemed University), Pune.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) and decided to recommend that MD(Anaesthesia) & DA qualification granted by Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College (Deemed University), Pune in respect of students being trained at Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College, Pune be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (Two) students each per year for MD (Anaesthesia) & DA qualification.

77. **Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College (Deemed University), Pune – Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College, Pune.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College, Pune for purpose of recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification granted by Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College (Deemed University), Pune.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) and decided to recommend that MD(Physiology) qualification granted by Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College (Deemed University), Pune in respect of students being trained at Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College, Pune be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (Two) students per year.

78. **Kerala University – Recognition of DM(Nephrology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Medical College, Thiruvanthapuram.**

Read: The inspection report (May 2004) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Medical College, Thiruvanthapuram for purpose of recognition of D.M.(Nephrology) qualification granted by Kerala University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (May, 2004) and decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in terms of teaching faculty as per MCI norms in the department of DM (Nephrology) qualification.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the compliance is received from the institution authorities.

79. **Kerala University – Recognition of M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Medical College, Thiruvanthapuram.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2005) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Medical College, Thiruvanthapuram for purpose of recognition of M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) qualification granted by Kerala University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2005) and decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in terms of teaching faculty as per MCI norms in the department of M.Ch. (Surgical Gastroenterology) qualification.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the compliance is received from the institution authorities.

80. **Saurashtra University, Rajkot – Recognition of M.D(Forensic Medicine) qualification in respect of students being trained at Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhayay Medical College, Rajkot.**

Read: The inspection report (August, 2006) carried out to assess the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhayay Medical College, Rajkot for purpose of recognition of M.D. (Forensic Medicine) qualification granted by Saurashtra University, Rajkot.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) and decided to recommend that MD (Forensic Medicine) qualification granted by Saurashtra University, Rajkot in respect of students being trained at Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhayay Medical College, Rajkot be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (Two) students per year.

81. **Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla – Recognition of M.D(Dermatology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla.**

Read: The inspection report (June 2006) carried out to assess the inspection of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla for purpose of recognition of M.D. (Dermatology/Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) qualification granted by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.

Medical Kolkatta under Calcutta University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2007-2008 restricting the number of admissions to 4 (four) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

105. **Increase of seats in M.S.(Orthopaedics) course at Dr. S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur under Rajasthan University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (September, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Dr. S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur under University of Rajasthan for consideration of increase of seats in M.S.(Orthopaedics) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2006) and decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in terms of teaching beds as per MCI norms.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received from the institution authorities.

106. **Permission of starting of postgraduate courses in Mahatma Gandhi National Instt. of Medical Sciences, Jaipur – request received from the college authorities to withhold the process of approvals/inspections for the year 2007-2008.**

Read: The letter dated 24/8/2006 received from the Chairman, India Education Trust requesting to withhold the process of inspections for starting of postgraduate courses for the year 2007-2008.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 24/8/2006 received from the Chairman, India Education Trust and accepted the request of the Chairman to withhold the process of approvals/inspections for starting of postgraduate courses for the year 2007-2008.

107. **The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai – Recognition of M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroentrolgy) qualification in respect of students being trained at Stanley Medical College, Chennai.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Stanley Medical College, Chennai for purpose of recognition of M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroentrolgy) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) and decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in terms of teaching beds as per MCI norms.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received from the institution authorities.

108. Rajasthan University, Jaipur – Recognition of M.D(General Medicine) qualification in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kota.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Kota for purpose of recognition of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification granted by Rajasthan University, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) and decided to recommend that MD(General Medicine) qualification granted by Rajasthan University, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kota be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 3 (three) students per year.

109. Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College (Deemed University), Pune – Recognition of DDVL/DVD qualification in respect of students being trained at Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College, Pune.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College, Pune for purpose of recognition of DDVL/DVD qualification granted by Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College (Deemed University), Pune .

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) and decided to recommend that DDVL/DVD qualification granted by Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College (Deemed University), Pune in respect of students being trained at Bharthi Vidyapeeth Medical College, Pune be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 1 (one) student per year.

110. Recognition of various postgraduate medical qualifications in respect of B.P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences, Dharan, Nepal.

Read: The inspection reports for recognition of postgraduate medical courses in respect of B.P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences, Nepal along with the letter received from the Vice-Chancellor of B. P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences, Dharan, Nepal dated 04.01.2006 and 05.01.2006.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the inspection reports for recognition of postgraduate medical courses granted by B.P. Koirala Instt. of Health Sciences, Dharan, Nepal (Autonomous University) along with the letter received from the Vice-Chancellor of B. P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences, Dharan, Nepal dated 04.01.2006 and 05.01.2006. After due deliberations, the Postgraduate Committee observed that in the Inspection Report of one of the Inspections carried out on 3rd and 4th September 2005 for MD (Biochemistry) course, it was mentioned that the Institute has admitted 100 students during the current year. Even in the letter dated 4th January 2006, the Institute has admitted that the sanctioned intake from Nepal Medical Council for MBBS Course for the year 2005 is 100 and not 50. Therefore, the Institute had admitted 100 students. The Postgraduate Committee further observed that the Institute has been recognized for an annual intake of 50 students by MCI u/s 12(2) of the Indian Medical Council Act,1956. Thereafter, the Institute has never obtained the permission or recognition from the MCI or Central Government for increasing its annual intake to 100 students. The Postgraduate Committee further observed that at the time of inspection carried out during September 2005, the number of admissions made were 100 students.

In view of this deliberation, the Postgraduate Committee, after considering the Inspection Reports for recognition of Postgraduate Medical Courses conducted by B. P. Koirala Instt. of Medical Sciences, Nepal, decided not to recommend recognition of the following qualifications in respect of students being trained at B.P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences, Nepal because of the following deficiencies mentioned against each subject :-

MD (General Medicine)

- (i) There is no Associate Prof. in Unit-I
- (ii) Promotion of HOD is not as per MCI norms.
- (iii) Promotion of Assoc.Prof. in Unit-II is not as per MCI norms.
- (iv) Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete in Unit-I & Unit-II.
- (v) There are only 2 units which are inadequate even for the intake of 50 students as per MCI norms.
- (vi) The bed strength of both the units is 60, which is not as per MCI Norms.
- (vii) The teaching staff is inadequate even for the annual intake of 50 students after considering the Postgraduate component.
- (viii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MD (Community Medicine)

- (i) Promotion of Ist Assoc.Prof. and one Addl.Prof. is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) 2nd Prof. does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
- (iii) There is a deficiency of the teaching faculty of one Asst. Prof. and 2 Tutors.
- (iv) The staff pattern for field training is not as per the norms of the Council.
- (v) The Institute does not have their own Health Centres.
- (vi) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MD (Microbiology)

- (i) Promotion of 3 Assoc.Professors is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) One Assoc.Prof. is non-medical person having no Ph.D. degree; hence cannot be considered as Assoc.Prof.
- (iii) The number of specimens & Charts are grossly inadequate in the Departmental Museum.
- (iv) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MD (Anaesthesiology)

- (i) Promotion of 1 Prof. & 3 Assoc.Professors is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) The number of books in the Departmental Library are inadequate as per the Norms of the MCI.
- (iii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MS (Skin & VD)

- (i) Promotion of Additional Professor is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MD (Physiology)

- (i) There is no Professor in the department.
- (ii) Ist Assoc.Prof. does not possess requisite postgraduate qualification.
- (iii) The teaching faculty is inadequate even for the intake of 50 students for MBBS course.
- (iv) Hematology lab – It is being shared by the pathology and anatomy department.
- (v) Amphibian cum Mammalian lab – No separate laboratories available.
- (vi) Human lab – it is being managed in a small room with inadequate equipment.
- (vii) One Research lab is available with ECG, EEG, EP and NCS Facilities.
- (viii) Laboratory staff is grossly inadequate. One Technician and One Jr. Technical Asst. is available (both without requisite basic technical qualifications) to run the above mentioned four laboratories.
- (ix) Teaching and Technical staff is grossly inadequate even for UG teaching purposes, which has annual intake of about 75 students. (Instead of sanctioned 50 students).
- (x) Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.

- (xi) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MD (Pediatrics)

- (i) Promotion of both Professors and 1 Assoc.Prof. are not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
- (iii) In 2003, 2004 & 2005, the Institute has taken 4, 3 & 4 students for MD (Paediatrics) course, while only 2 faculty members had requisite teaching experience for being recognized as a Postgraduate teacher.
- (iv) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MD (Pathology)

- (i) Promotion of Assoc.Prof. is not as per MCI norms..
- (ii) Teaching complement is incomplete.
- (iii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MD (Biochemistry)

- (i) Promotion of 1 Addl. and 1 Assoc. Prof. is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
- (iii) There is no teaching programme for MD (Biochemistry) course.
- (iv) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MS (Ophthalmology)

- (i) Eye Bank is not fully developed in the department.
- (ii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MS (Obst. & Gynae.)

- (i) The course was started without prior permission and inspection by the Council.
- (ii) Dr. Norman Morris does not have requisite experience to become a Professor. He does not have any prior teaching experience before joining the institution.
- (iii) Dr. Norman Morris works in Unit 1 as an Addl. Prof. and has inadequate teaching experience.
- (iv) Dr. Nibedita Basnet has not completed 5 years as an Asstt.Prof. and holds post of Assoc.Prof.
- (v) So far the multiple number of students have been posted under one teacher instead of one student under each recognized teacher.
- (vi) The committee to set the question papers is not headed by an External Examiner.
- (vii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MS (ENT)

- (i) Promotion of 1 Prof. and 1 Assoc.Prof. is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete
- (iii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MD (Anatomy)

- (i) Promotion of 3 Addl. Prof. and 1 Assoc.Prof. is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete
- (iii) The Departmental library does not have any journals.
- (iv) There is no museum available in the Department. It is shelled with the Department of Pathology.
- (v) There are only 50 mounted specimens which are grossly inadequate.

- (vi) There is no articulated skeleton available in the Department.
- (vii) The number of disarticulated bones are also inadequate in number.
- (viii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MS (General Surgery)

- (i) Promotion Assoc.Prof. is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete in Unit-I.
- (iii) There are only 2 units which is inadequate even for the annual intake of 50 students.
- (iv) The number of beds are inadequate even for annual MBBS intake of 50 students.
- (iii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

MD (Radiology)/Radio-Diagnosis

- (i) Teaching complement is incomplete
- (ii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to recommend that MS(Orthopaedics) qualification granted by B.P. Koirala Instt. of Health Sciences, Dharan, Nepal (Autonomous University) in respect of students being trained at B.P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences, Nepal be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 2 (Two) students per year.

111. Recognition of Housemanship– Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Amalanagar, Thrissur.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (April, 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Amalanagar, Thrissur for recognition of the hospital for Housemanship.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (April, 2006) and decided to seek clarification from the concerned authorities of Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Amalanagar, Thrissur regarding the number of seats required in each speciality as the application does not indicate the same.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration till the information is received.

112. M.Ch.Traumatology, a new super-speciality Training programme.

Read: The letter dated 30/4/2006 received from the Honorary Secretary, Centre Zone of Indian Orthopaedic Association requesting to consider starting of the new specialized training programme in M.Ch.(Traumatology).

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 30/4/2006 received from the Honorary Secretary, Centre Zone of Indian Orthopaedic Association and decided to authorize the Chairman to constitute a Sub-Committee to look into the matter and submit its report.

113. Accreditation of the Fellowship Skin course conducted by the Association of Minimal Access Surgeons of India.

Recognition of AMASI as a strategic partner for incorporating training in Mumbai Access Surgery in the Postgraduate Curriculum of General Surgery.

Read: The letter dated 11/8/2006 received from the Founder President, Association of Minimal Access Surgeons of India (AMASI), Coimbatore for Accreditation of the Fellowship Skin course conducted by the Association of Minimal Access Surgeons of India and recognition

of AMASI as a strategic partner for incorporating training in Minimal Access Surgery in the Postgraduate Curriculum of General Surgery.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 11/8/2006 received from the Founder President, Association of Minimal Access Surgeons of India (AMASI), Coimbatore and decided to authorize the Chairman to constitute a Sub-Committee to look into the matter and submit its report.
