Apology for absence was received from Prof. A. Rajasekaran, member, Postgraduate Committee.

At the outset, the Postgraduate Committee noted the letters dated 2nd January and 5th January, 2009 of Prof. A. Rajasekaran, Member, Postgraduate Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Committee meeting held on 29/12/2008 with following modification/correction:-

The decision taken in item No. 19 be read corrected as under:-

I. Item No. 19. Starting of MD(Biochemistry) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University for starting of MD(Biochemistry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Biochemistry) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean.
2. There is no teaching faculty.
3. Space for office & staff rooms are non-existent.
4. There is no departmental research library.
5. There is no departmental library.
6. Central Library – inadequate.
7. Resultantly, infrastructure is inadequate.
8. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The decision taken in item No. 52 be read corrected as under:-

II. Item No. 52. Starting of 9 PG degree courses at Mediciti Institute of Medical Sciences, Rangareddy – Permission of Central Govt. – regarding.

Read: The letter dated 11.11.2008 received from the Central Govt. Ministry of Health & F.W., New Delhi requesting to consider the applications for starting of various PG courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 at Mediciti Institute of Medical Sciences, Rangareddy.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 11.11.2008 received from the Central Govt. Ministry of Health & F.W., New Delhi requesting to consider the applications for starting of various PG courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 at Mediciti Institute of Medical Sciences, Rangareddy and observed that as per time Schedule prescribed in the Opening of a new or higher course of study or training (including Postgraduate course of study or training) and increase of admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a postgraduate course of study or training) Regulations, 2000, the last date for submission of application for starting of various postgraduate courses is 31st July as under:-

It was noted that various applications for starting of postgraduate courses at Mediciti Institute of Medical Sciences, Rangareddy, A.P. was received from the Central Govt. on 8th August, 2008 which is after the last date prescribed for forwarding of application to the Council by the Central Govt. i.e. 31st July, 2008, for the academic year 2009-10.

It was further observed that the Regulations being statutory Regulations are mandatory and binding in character and therefore required to be adhered to by all the authorities including MCI. It was further observed that the Hon'ble Supreme Court also

passed various pronouncements and directed all the authorities to strictly adhere to the time schedule prescribed in the Regulations.

In view of above, it was decided to reiterate the decision taken by the Council to return the applications for starting of various postgraduate courses at Mediciti Institute of Medical Sciences, Rangareddy, A.P., to the Central Govt.

Nothing transacted.

5. Starting of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) & D.G.O. courses at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara under Sumandeep Vidyapeeth University, Vadodara, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance verification report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara for starting of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) & D.G.O. courses under Sumandeep Vidyapeeth University, Vadodara, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) & D.G.O. courses at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara under Sumandeep Vidyapeeth University, Vadodara, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 4(Four) students per year in each course till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

6. Starting of MD (Pathology) course at M.M. Instt. of Medical Sciences & Research, Mullana Ambala under Maharishi Markandeshwar University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at M.M. Instt. Of Medical Sciences & Research, Mullana Ambala for starting of MD (Pathology) course under Maharishi Markandeshwar University at u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) and noted that promotion of Dr. Parmeet Kaur, Assoc. Professor, is not as per MCI norms.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Pathology) course at M.M. Instt. of Medical Sciences & Research, Mullana Ambala under Maharishi Markandeshwar University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 5(Five) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

7. Increase of seats in MD (Pharmacology) course at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Wardha, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (October, 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Wardha, Maharashtra for increase of seats in MD (Pharmacology) course under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (October, 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD (Pharmacology) course at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Wardha, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 from 2(Two) to 4(Four) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

8. Starting of MD (Radio-Diag.) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi under Amrita Vishwavidyapeetham u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Nov, 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi for starting of MD (Radio-Diag.) course under Amrita Vishwavidyapeetham (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Nov, 2008) and decided to seek a clarification from the institute about the status of DNB courses.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the above clarification is received from the institute concerned.

9. Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi under Amrita Vishwavidyapeetham (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (October, 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi for starting of MD (Pathology) course under Amrita Vishwavidyapeetham (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (October, 2008) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 28.11.2008 recommending to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD (Pathology) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi under Amrita Vishwavidyapeetham (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

1. The teaching complement is still incomplete as there is shortage of 2(two) Assoc. Professors.
2. The institute is conducting DNB courses.
3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

10. Starting of M.Ch.(Urology) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Patna affiliated to Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Patna (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance verification report (Dec, 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Patna for consideration of starting of M.Ch.(Urology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Dec, 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.Ch.(Urology) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Patna under Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Patna (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. Beds are not as per MCI norms.
2. Dr. Vijay Kumar, shown as Addl. Professor, does not possess prescribed academic qualification.
3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

11. Starting of MD(TB & Chest Diseases) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Parel, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Parel, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for starting of MD (TB & Chest Diseases) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD (TB & Chest Diseases) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Parel, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean.
2. There is no teaching faculty.
3. Clinical material is inadequate.
4. Central and departmental library – inadequate.
5. There is no Central Research laboratory.
6. Space for indoor wards and OPD – inadequate.
7. Biochemistry, Pathology and Microbiology facilities are inadequate.
8. Resultantly, infrastructure is inadequate.
9. Instrumentation is inadequate.
10. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

12. Increase of seats in MS(General Surgery) course at Govt. Medical College, Bhavnagar under Bhavnagar University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance verification report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Bhavnagar for increase of seats in MS(General Surgery) course under Bhavnagar University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MS(General Surgery) course at Govt. Medical College, Bhavnagar under Bhavnagar University u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 from 2(Two) to 4(Four) students per year till the first batch admitted

against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

13. Starting of MD(Pathology) course at Meenakshi Medical Hospital & Research Instt., Kanchipuram under Meenakshi University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Meenakshi Medical College Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram under Meenakshi University for starting of MD(Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Pathology) course at Meenakshi Medical College Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram under Meenakshi University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. Promotion of Dr. M. Prema, Assoc. Prof. is not as per MCI norms.
2. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
3. Facilities for preparation of blood components are not available.
4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

14. Starting of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) & D.G.O. courses at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem under Vinayaka Missions University (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem for starting of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) & D.G.O. courses under Vinayaka Mission's University (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

15. Starting of MD (Forensic Medicine) courses at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara under Sumandeep Vidyapeeth University, Vadodara, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(TB & Chest Diseases) & DTCD courses at Govt. Medical College, Surat under Veer Narmad South Gujarat University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. AFB staining, AFB Culture, AFB C/S and PCR for M. Tuberculosis are not available.
2. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

17. Starting of MD(Microbiology) course courses at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Andheri (E), Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Andheri (E), Mumbai for starting of MD(Microbiology) course under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

1. There is no Dean.
2. There is no teaching faculty.
3. There is no Microbiology department.
4. There are no labs like Bacteriology, Serology, Immunology, Virology, TB, Mycology & Parasitology.
5. There is no media room or discarding room, departmental library and demonstration room.
6. There are no media, standard sera, standard cultures etc.
7. Many investigations are outsourced from outside labs or hospitals.
8. Central library is inadequate.
9. Biochemistry, Radiology, Pathology & Blood Bank facilities are inadequate.
10. There is no departmental museum.
11. Space for teaching faculty and departmental office is not available.
12. There is no Animal House.
13. Resultantly, infrastructure is inadequate.
14. Clinical material is inadequate.
15. Instrumentation is inadequate.
16. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

18. Starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course courses at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University for starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

3. Central and Departmental library – inadequate.
4. Space for departmental office and teaching faculty is not available.
5. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

19. Starting of MD (Physiology) course at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara under Sumandeep Vidyapeeth University, Vadodara, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara under Sumandeep Vidyapeeth University, Vadodara, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956:-

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2008) and noted that Dr. S.K. Thakur, Assoc. Professor, does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Physiology) course at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara under Sumandeep Vidyapeeth University, Vadodara, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 3(Three) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (November, 2008) togetherwith the compliance and the inspection report (July 2006) and observed the following:-

1. Bed occupancy is 70-75%.
2. Radiological, Pathological and Biochemical investigations are less.
3. Resultantly, clinical material is inadequate.
4. Halter and evokepotentials are not available.
5. Resultantly, instrumentation is inadequate.
6. Unit-II,III and IV – all these three units have (2) two teachers only.
7. Promotion of Dr. B.N. Sawant, Professor & Head of Unit-II is not as per MCI norms.
8. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 27.02.2008 not to recommend recognition of M.D. (General Medicine) qualification granted by Mumbai University in respect of students being trained at K.J. Somaiya Medical College & Research Centre, Mumbai and further decided to reiterate its decision directing the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions in M.D.(General Medicine) course.

86 Starting of MD (DVL) & DDVL courses at NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nashik under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nashik under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for starting of MD (DVL) & DDVL courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and noted that the Dean of the institute has communicated that the final inspection for the Blood Bank License has been carried out by the joint inspection team of Govt. of India and Govt. of Maharashtra. Its decision is expected at any movement, which would be submitted to the Council immediately upon receipt.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the Blood Bank License submitted by the institute is received.

87. Starting of MD (Pathology) & DCP courses at S. Nijalingappa Medical College, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at S.Nijalingappa Medical College, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences for starting of MD (Pathology) & DCP courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD (Pathology) & DCP courses at S.Nijalingappa Medical College, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

1. Facility for immunohisto-chemistry is not available.
2. No facilities available for frozen section.
3. Blood component facilities are not available.
4. No routine cytology work is carried out in the department.
5. Record keeping of histopathology is inadequate.
6. Cytopathology registers are not properly maintained.
7. Tested and untested blood units were kept in the same refrigerator without labeling.
8. Discrepancy was there in number of units collected in the blood bank and number of units tested for communicable diseases.
9. Resultantly, infrastructure is inadequate.
10. Cryostat and electron microscope are not available.
11. Resultantly, instrumentation is inadequate.
12. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MS (General Surgery) course at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

1. Promotion of Dr. S. Srinivas J., Assoc.Professor of Unit-II is not as per MCI norms.
2. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

89. Starting of MD(Obst. & Gynae.) & DGO courses at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) & DGO courses at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 3(three) for degree & 2 (two) for diploma students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

90. Starting of MD(DVL) & DVD courses at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam for starting of MD (DVL) & DVD courses under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (DVL) & DVD courses at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year in each course, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said courses. The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and noted that Dr.Sunil Shyam Sunder, Assoc. Prof. & Dr.Mandapalli Adinarayana, Assoc. Prof. do not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admissions to 4(Four) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

92. Starting of MS(Ophthalmology) course at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai under Bharath University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai for starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course under Bharath University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai under Bharath University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised

to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

93. Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College, Pondicherry under Vinayaka Missions University (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College, Pondicherry for increase of seats in MS(General Surgery) course under Vinayaka Missions University (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course commensurate with available clinical material which is just adequate for 4 (four) students in MS (Gen. Surgery) course at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College, Pondicherry under Vinayaka Missions University (Deemed University).

94. Starting of MD(Microbiology) course at Govt. Medical College, Kota under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Kota under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences for starting of MD (Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teachers mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Govt. Medical College, Kota under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 1(One) student per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

95. Increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi-request received for withdrawal of application.

Read: The letter dated 19/12/2008 received from the Principal, Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi requesting to withdraw their application for increase of seats in the various Postgraduate courses.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that vide letter dated 19.12.2008 of the Principal, Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi has requested the Council to withdraw their application for increase of seats in the various Postgraduate courses namely MD (General Medicine), M.D. (Obst. & Gynae.), M.D. (Anaesthesia), M.D. (Paediatrics) & M.S. (Ophthalmology)

The members of the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the applications to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Schemes for increase of seats in various postgraduate courses namely MD (General Medicine), M.D. (Obst. & Gynae.), M.D. (Anaesthesia), M.D. (Paediatrics) & M.S. (Ophthalmology) at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

96. Increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) & DA courses at Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry – postponement of inspection regarding.

Read: The letter dated 31/10/2008 received from the Principal, Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry intimating that they are not interested to take inspection for increase of seats in MD(Anaesthesia) & D.A. courses & the same may be postponed for the time being.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that vide letter dated 31.10.2008 of the Principal, Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry has requested the Council to postpone the inspection for increase of seats in MD(Anaesthesia) & D.A. courses.

The members of the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for increase of seats in MD(Anaesthesia) & D.A. courses at Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the Regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

97. Increase of seats in D.C.H. course at Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry – postponement of inspection regarding.

Read: The letter dated 31/10/2008 received from the Principal, Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry intimating that they are not interested to take inspection for increase of seats in D.C.H course & the same may be postponed for the time being.

The members of the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for increase of seats in DCH course at Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the Regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

98. Increase of seats in D.G.O. course at Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry – postponement of inspection regarding.

Read: The letter dated 31/10/2008 received from the Principal, Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry intimating that they are not interested to take inspection for increase of seats in D.G.O. course & the same may be postponed for the time being.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that vide letter dated 31.10.2008 of the Principal, Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry has requested the Council to postpone the inspection for increase of seats in DGO course.

The members of the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for increase of seats in DGO course at Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the Regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

99. Increase of seats in D.Ortho. course at Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry – postponement of inspection regarding.

To consider the letter dated 31/10/2008 received from the Principal, Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry intimating that they are not interested to take inspection for increase of seats in D.Ortho. course & the same may be postponed for the time being.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that vide letter dated 31.10.2008 of the Principal, Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry has requested the Council to postpone the inspection for increase of seats in D.Ortho. course.

The members of the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for increase of seats in D.Ortho. course at Vinayaka Missions Medical College, Karaikal, Pondicherry received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the Regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office for the next academic year.

100. Request to recognize qualification i.e. MBBS with Ph.D (Medical Pharmacology).

Read: The letter dated 05.12.2008 from Dr. R.K. Gupta, Professor & Head, Deptt. Of Pharmacology, MGIMS, Sewagram requesting to recognize his MBBS with Ph.D.(Medical Pharmacology).

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 05.12.2008 from Dr. R.K. Gupta, Professor & Head, Deptt. of Pharmacology, MGIMS, Sewagram requesting to recognize his MBBS with Ph.D.(Medical Pharmacology) and observed that he possesses the qualification of MBBS with Ph.D. (Medical Pharmacology) which is one of the academic qualification prescribed in the Minimum Qualification for teachers in a Medical College Regulation, 1998 for appointment as Professor in the department of Pharmacology.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided that Dr. R.K. Gupta is eligible to consider as Professor in the department of Pharmacology.

101. Starting of MS(ENT) & DLO courses at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara (Gujarat).

Read: The letter dated 23.12.2008 received from the Central Govt. for consideration of starting of MS(ENT) & D.L.O. courses at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 23.12.2008 from the Central Govt. and decided to accede to the request of the Central Govt. to consider the application for starting of MS (ENT) & DLO courses at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara (Gujarat) for evaluating the proposal for the academic year 2009-10 and place the file before the President (Acting) for further necessary action.

102. Starting of various postgraduate courses at N.R.S. Medical College, Kolkata – Consideration of Central Govt. letter regarding.

Read: The letter dated 19.11.2008 received from the Central Govt. for consideration of starting of various postgraduate courses at N.R.S. Medical College, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 19.11.2008 from the Central Govt. and decided to accede to the request of the Central Govt. to consider the application for starting of M.D. (General Medicine), M.S. (General Surgery), M.D. (Obst. & Gynae.) and M.D. (Paediatric) courses at N.R.S. Medical College, Kolkata for evaluating the proposal for the academic year 2009-10 and place the file before the President (Acting) for further necessary action.

103. Admission made in various Postgraduate Medical Courses after the last date i.e. 10th June, 2008 for the academic session 2008-09.

Read: The letter dated 5.11.2008 received from the Dean, Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune regarding the admission of Dr. Ajay Kumar Jha for MD (Community Medicine) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 5.11.2008 received from the Dean, Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune regarding the admission of Dr. Ajay Kumar Jha for MD (Community Medicine) course and observed that at its meeting held on 22.9.2008 while considering the matter with regard to admissions made in various postgraduate medical courses after the last date i.e. 10th June, 2008 (By the order of the Hon'ble Court) for the academic session 2008-09 had decided that discharge notice be issued in respect of admission to Dr. Ajay Kumar Jha in Community Medicine course on 4.7.2008 which being after the last date prescribed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court i.e. 10th June,2008.

The Postgraduate Committee further observed that the Dean in his letter dated 5.11.2008 has clarified as under:-

“Dr. Ajay kumar Jha was admitted for MD (Community Medicine) course on 07th April, 2008 for the session 2008-09 and not admitted after the last date i.e. 10th June, 2008. The date of his admission is as 07.04.2008 instead of 04.07.2008.”

The members of the Postgraduate Committee also perused the other documents like admission order, fee receipt supplied alongwith the letter of the Dean and observed that admission has been made on 7.4.2008 and not on 4.7.2008 which seems to be a typographical error.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to revoke the discharge notice.

104. Mahatma Gandhi University – Restoration of seats in DGO qualifications in respect of students being trained at Medical College, Kottayam.

Read: The compliance togetherwith the inspection report (December, 2006 and May, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Medical College, Kottayam for purpose of restoration of DGO qualification granted by Mahatma Gandhi University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith the inspection report (December, 2006 and May, 2008) and decided to restore the number of seats from 2(Two) to 4(Four) in DGO course in respect of students being trained at Medical College, Kottayam under Mahatma Gandhi University prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-10 in conformity with the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations,2000.
