5. **Starting of MD(Pathology) course courses at ESI - PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Joka, Kolkata under West Bengal University of Health Sciecnses, u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI - PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Joka, Kolkata under West Bengal University of Health Sciences for starting of MD(Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Pathology) course at ESI - PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Joka, Kolkata under West Bengal University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean and teaching faculty.
2. Cytology investigations are 12 per month. CSF investigations are 90 per year. Frozen section, pathological autopsy, etc. are not available. Clinical material is inadequate.
3. Library facilities are inadequate.
4. Departmental museum is not available.
5. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

6. **Starting of MD(General Medicine) course at ESI - PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI - PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University for starting of MD(General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(General Medicine) course at ESI - PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean or teaching faculty.
2. There are 120 beds in 2 Units which is not as per norms.
3. Paramedical staff is inadequate.
4. Endoscopy services are not available.
5. There is no departmental library. Infrastructure like lecture theatres, office space, teaching facilities, etc. is not available.
6. The Institution is running DNB courses.
7. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

7. **Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at ESI - PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Sanathnagar, Hyderabad under NTR University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The Council Inspector's report (Jan., 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI - PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Sanathnagar, Hyderabad under NTR University of Health Sciences for starting of MS (General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Jan.,2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.S.(General Surgery) course at ESI - PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Sanathnagar, Hyderabad under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean or teaching faculty.
2. There is no central or departmental library.
3. There is no surgical ICU or proper postoperative ward.
4. There is no departmental teaching area or teaching aids. Space and facilities in OPD are inadequate.
5. There is no hostel for Residents.
6. The Institution is running DNB courses.
7. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

8. **Starting of MS (ENT) course at K.V.G. Medical College, Sullia under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at K.V.G. Medical College, Sullia under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore for starting of MS (ENT) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Nov.,2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.S. (ENT) course at K.V.G. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 from 4(four) to 6(six) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

11. Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Govt. Medical College, Kottayam under Mahatma Gandhi University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

1. There is no Associate Professor in Unit-I.
2. Dr. Tigy T.J. & Dr. A.S. Kutty, Asstt. Professors in Unit-II do not possess prescribed academic qualifications.
3. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

12. Increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) course at Govt. Medical College, Kottayam under Mahatma Gandhi University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Medical College, Kottayam under Mahatma Gandhi University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Associate Professor in Unit-I.
2. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

13. Increase of seats in MS(General Surgery) course at Govt. Medical College, Kottayam under Mahatma Gandhi University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (October, 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at KAP Vishwanathan Medical College, Tiruchirapalli for starting of MD (Anaesthesia) course under Tamilnadu Dr. M.G. R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

1. Col. V.K. Sinha, Professor & Head possesses M.S.(General Surgery) qualification which is not prescribed academic qualification for the post.
2. Major R. Prabhakar, Asstt. Prof. In Unit-I does not possess prescribed academic qualification.
3. Resultantly, teaching faculty complement is incomplete.
4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

16. Starting of MD(Psychiatry) course at Prathima Instt. of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under NTR University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Prathima Instt. of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for starting of MD(Psychiatry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec.,2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course at Prathima Instt. of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. Dr.P.Kishen, Prof. & HOD and Dr.S.Gopinath, Asstt. Prof. possess MD(Psychiatry) from Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad which is not yet recognized by the General Body of the Council.
2. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

17. Starting of MD (General Medicine) course at NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nashik under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read : The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nashik under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for starting of MD (General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and noted that the promotion of Dr. J.P. Walghude, Associate Prof. In Unit-II is not as per Regulations as he has been promoted as Associate Professor with experience of only 4 years & 5 months as Asstt. Prof.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(General Medicine) course at NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nashik under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admissions to 3 (three) students per year till the first

batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

18. Starting of MD (Psychiatry) & DPM courses at NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nashik under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

1. No records of tissue blocks and slides of histopathological relevant cytological and haematological slides are maintained, recorded and stored.
2. Surgical specimens are predominantly small biopsies and mainly from the dermatology department. No wet specimens are stored or records kept of relevant larger surgical specimens.
3. Safe methods for specimen/chemical handling and disposal must be in place and followed.
4. Facilities for immunohistochemistry and electron Microscopy are not available.
5. There is shortage of 2 tutors.
6. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
7. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

23. Starting of MS(General Surgery) course at NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nashik under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

3. RHTC, Tikota belongs to State Govt. of Karnataka and the college is allowed to utilize its facilities which is not as per Regulations. No Lecturer-cum-Medical Officer having M.D. (PSM) qualification is available at RHTC, Tikota or at UHC.
4. Only 12 quarters are available within the campus for teaching faculty against the requirement of 58 as per Regulations.
5. CT Scan is non-functional.
6. There is no CSSD.
7. Number of books in the departmental libraries of Skin & V.D. and ENT are inadequate.
8. Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

The members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council observed that the periodical inspection to assess the teaching and training facilities available at the institute for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree was carried out on 15 and 16 November, 2006 and 26/27th October, 2007 wherein similar deficiencies of teaching faculty, inadequacy of clinical material, non-availability of functional unit of TB & Chest and other deficiencies of infrastructure have been observed.

In view of above, the members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council decided to issue a show cause notice to the authorities of Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur as to why the recognition for the award of MBBS degree should not be withdrawn u/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the institute be asked to submit its compliance within a period of 1 month as the institute has failed to rectify the deficiencies of teaching faculty, clinical material, non-availability of TB & Chest unit and other deficiencies of infrastructure, inspite of repeated opportunities have been given to the institute over a period of more than two years. - 3. Bed occupancy on the day of Inspection is 35.49%.
- 4. Total OPD attendance on the day of Inspection is 345.
- 3. No normal delivery and LSCS is on the day of Inspection.
- 3. RHTC, Tikota belongs to State Govt. of Karnataka and the college is allowed to utilize its facilities which is not as per Regulations. No Lecturer-cum-Medical Officer having M.D. (PSM) qualification is available at RHTC, Tikota or at UHC.
- 4. Only 12 quarters are available within the campus for teaching faculty against the requirement of 58 as per Regulations.
- 5. CT Scan is non-functional.
- 6. There is no CSSD.
- 7. Number of books in the departmental libraries of Skin & V.D. and ENT are inadequate.
- 8. Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

The members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council observed that the peridocal inspection to assess the teaching and training facilities available at the institute for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree was carried out on 15 and 16 November, 2006 and 26/27th October, 2007 wherein similar deficiencies of teaching faculty, inadequacy of clinical material, non-availability of functional unit of TB & Chest and other deficiencies of infrastructure have been observed.

In view of above, the members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council decided to issue a show cause notice to the authorities of Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur as to why the recognition for the award of MBBS degree should not be withdrawn u/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the institute be asked to submit its compliance within a period of 1 month as the institute has failed to rectify the deficiencies of teaching faculty, clinical material, non-availability of TB & Chest unit and other deficiencies of infrastructure, inspite of repeated opportunities have been given to the institute over a period of more than two years . Copy of the letter be also marked to Secretary (Medical Education), DME of the concerned State Govt., Registrar of the

University to which the college is affiliated and also to the member of the MCI representing the State where the college is located”.

4. There is no departmental or central library. Office accommodation for teaching faculty is not available.
5. Special clinics are not run.
6. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 19/01/2009 received from the Director of Medical Education, Chennai requesting to consider the inspection for compliance verification for issue of LOP for starting of MD(General Medicine) course may be taken up during September 2009 and decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Thoothukudi Medical College, Thoothukudi received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office.

86. RTM University, Nagpur and Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD (General Medicine) qualification in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur.

Read: the Council inspector's report (December, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur for purpose of recognition of MD (General Medicine) qualification granted by RTM University and Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector's report (December, 2008) and decided not to recommend that MD (General Medicine) qualification granted by RTM University and Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur because of the following reasons:-

- (i) Unit II has only 2 faculty members.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions in M.D (General Medicine) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

87. Dr. Baba Saheb Ambedkar Marathwada University & Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD (General Medicine) qualification in respect of students being trained at SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai.

Read: the compliance verification report (January, 2009) togetherwith the compliance and the Council inspector's report (July, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai

for purpose of recognition of MD (General Medicine) qualification granted by Dr. Baba Saheb Ambedkar Marathwada University & Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (January, 2009) togetherwith the compliance and the Council inspector's report (July, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD (General Medicine) qualification granted by Dr. Baba Saheb Ambedkar Marathwada University & Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 3(three) students per year.

88. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Approval of Sri Devraj Urs Medical College, Tamaka, Kolar for the award of M.S. (Ophthalmology) qualification in respect of increased intake.

Read: the compliance verification report (January, 2009) togetherwith the compliance and the Council Inspector report (May, 2006) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Sri Devraj Urs Medical College, Tamaka, Kolar for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S. (Ophthalmology) qualifications in respect of increased intake granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (January, 2009) togetherwith the compliance and the Council Inspector report (May, 2006) and decided to recommend that Sri Devraj Urs Medical College, Tamaka, Kolar be approved for the award of M.S. (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of increased intake restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

89. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Approval of Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for the award of MD (General Medicine) qualification in respect of increased intake.

Read: the compliance verification report (January, 2009) togetherwith the compliance and the Council inspector report (July, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (General Medicine) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of increased intake.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (January, 2009) togetherwith the compliance and the Council inspector report (July, 2008) and noted that Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool already stands approved for the award of MD (General Medicine) qualification with 5 (five) seats and now the matter is under consideration for approval of the college against the increased intake of 5 to 8 seats; and decided to recommend that Kurnool Medical College, be approved for the award of MD (Gen.Medicine) qualification granted by Dr.N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of increased intake restricting the number of admission to 8 (eight) students per year.

90. **Sardar Patel University - Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification in respect of students being trained at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad.**

Read: the compliance verification report (January, 2009) together with the compliance and the Council Inspector's report (December, 2004) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad for purposes of recognition of MD(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification granted by Saurashtra University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (January, 2009) together with the compliance and the Council Inspector's report (December, 2004) and decided to recommend that MD(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification granted by Saurashtra University in respect of students being trained at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

91. **Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at Dr.D.Y. Patil Medical College Hospital & Research Center, Pimpri, Pune, under Dr.D.Y. Patil Medical University (Deemed University), Pune u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Dr.D.Y. Patil Medical College Hospital & Research Center, Pimpri, Pune under Dr.D.Y. Patil Medical University (Deemed University), Pune for increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at Dr.D.Y. Patil Medical College Hospital & Research Center, Pimpri, Pune under Dr.D.Y. Patil Medical University (Deemed University), Pune u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. Retinal surgeries are less.
2. Eye Bank and Oculoplasty unit are not available.
3. Space for special clinics in the OPD are inadequate.
4. Number of new books purchased in the library is less.
