2. Dr. Rajshree Bhati, Assistant Professor, does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
3. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is inadequate.
4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 from 1(One) to 2(Two) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

**11. Increase of seats in MD(General Medicine) course at M.N.R. Medical College & Hospital, Sangareddy, Andhra Pradesh u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.**

2. Number of minor surgeries are very less 5 to 7/month.
3. On the day of inspection there was 50% bed occupancy.
4. In Gynaec. Ward, there were patients of General Medicine.
5. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD(Obst. & Gynae.) course from the academic session 2010-2011.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teachers mentioned above is adequate and complete; and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MS(ENT) course at Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram under University of Kerala u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 from 2(Two) to 4(Four) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to restrict the number of admissions to 2(Two) students in DLO course per year prospectively from the academic session 2010-2011 as per Section 12(1) of Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000, which states that "*in no circumstances more than one student for diploma shall be registered in a unit in one academic year*".

**49. Amendments in the earlier Notification against the entry of D.M.(Neurology) of Medical College, Kottayam. regarding change of date.**

Read: the letter dt.3.11.2009 from the Principal Medical College, Kottayam with regard to amendments in Notification for recognition of DM(Neurology) course at Medical College Kottayam.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dt.3.11.2009 from the Principal Medical College, Kottayam with regard to amendments in Notification for recognition of DM(Neurology) course at Medical College Kottayam and decided to ask the institution authorities to explain how the 1<sup>st</sup> candidate admitted on 06.05.1996 had appeared for the examination in November, 1997 while as per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, the duration of the course is 2 years.

**50 Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Approval of Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad for the award of M.D.(Biochemistry) qualification in respect of increased intake.**

Read: the Council Inspector's report (November, 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Biochemistry) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of increased intake.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (November, 2009) and noted that Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad already stands approved for the award of M.D.(Biochemistry) qualification with 2(Two) seats and now the matter is under consideration for approval of the qualification against the increased intake from 2(Two) to 4(Four) seats; and decided to recommend that Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad be approved for the award of M.D.(Biochemistry) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of increased intake restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) to 4(Four) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21<sup>st</sup> July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

".....

6.4 *The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.*

6.6 *Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course.*

**51. University of Mumbai & Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik - Recognition of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) qualification in respect of students being trained at Bombay Hospital Institute of Medical Sciences, Mumbai.**

Read: the Compliance Report alongwith the Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Bombay Hospital Institute of Medical Sciences, Mumbai for purpose of recognition of MD(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification earlier granted by University of Mumbai and now by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Compliance Report alongwith the Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification earlier granted by University of Mumbai and now by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik in respect of students being trained at Bombay Hospital Institute of Medical Sciences, Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21<sup>st</sup> July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

“ .....

6.4 The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

6.6 Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course.

Read: the Compliance Verification Inspection Report (Dec. 2009) together with Council Inspector's Report ( May, 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Surat Municipal Institute of Medical Education & Research, Surat for purpose of recognition of M.S. (Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Veer Narmed South Gujarat University, Surat.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Compliance Verification Inspection Report (Dec. 2009) together with Council Inspector's Report ( May, 2009) and decided to recommend that M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Veer Narmed South Gujarat University, Surat in respect of students being trained at Surat Municipal Institute of Medical Education & Research, Surat be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21<sup>st</sup> July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

“ .....

6.4 The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

6.6 Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course.

**53. Allahabad University - Recognition of M.D. (TB & Chest Dise.) qualification in respect of students being trained at M.L.N. Medical College, Allahabad.**

Read: the Compliance Report alongwith Council Inspection's Report (April, 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at M.L.N. Medical College, Allahabad and Council inspector report (30<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup> Oct. 2009) carried out for MBBS course for purpose of recognition of M.D. (TB & Chest Dise) qualification granted by Allahabad University & Chhatarpati Sahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Compliance Report alongwith Council Inspection's Report (April, 2009) and decided not to recognize M.D.(TB & Chest Dise) qualification granted by Allahabad University & Chhatarpati Sahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow in respect of students being trained at M.L.N. Medical College, Allahabad because of the followings:-

- (i) There is no Associate Professor in the department.
- (ii) Resultantly, teaching faculty component is inadequate.
- (iii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee also decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 12.06.2009 to direct the institution authorities to stop admission in M.D.(TB & Chest Dise.) course for the existing intake from the academic session 2009-2010.

The Postgraduate Committee also noted that the Executive Committee of the Council, while considering the inspectors report (30<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2009) had decided as under:-

*"The members of the Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification inspection report (30<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2009) along with the Council Inspectors report (7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> August,2008) and observed that the deficiencies are still persisting as under:-*

1. (a) The shortage of teaching faculty is 31.9% (i.e. 54 out of 169) as under:-

- (i) Professor : 04 (Physiology -1, Microbiology -1, Orthopaedics -1, Radio-diagnosis -1)
- (ii) Associate Professor : 21 (Anatomy -3, Physiology -3, Biochemistry -1, Pharmacology -2, Pathology -1, Forensic Medicine -2, Community Medicine -1, Medicine -1, TB & Chest -1, Paediatrics -1, Psychiatry -1, ENT -1, Ophthalmology -1, Radiology -2)
- (iii) Assistant Professor : 23 (Anatomy -4, Pharmacology -2, Pathology -2, Community Medicine -4, Paediatrics -2, Psychiatry -1, Ophthalmology -3, Obst. & Gynae. -2, Anaesthesia -1, Radiology -1, Dentistry -1)
- (iv) Tutor : 04 4 (Biochemistry -2, Forensic Medicine -1 & Dentistry -1)
- (v) Lecturer Biophysics : 01
- (vi) Pharma Chemist : 01

(b) The shortage of Residents is 36.9% as under:-

- (i) Sr. Resident : 25 (Medicine -3, Paediatrics -1, TB & Chest -1, Skin -1, Surgery -4, Orthopaedics -2, Ophthalmology -2, Obst. & Gynae. -1, Anaesthesia -6 & Radiology -4)

3. There are 10 operation theatres having total 20 tables which is not as per norms.

4. Para medical staff is inadequate as under:-

5. Nursing staff is inadequate as under:-

- Nursing Superintendent : Nil

6. *The Medical Record Section is not cross linked with any other computer and most of the MRD work is done manually. The ICD X classification of the diseases is not followed.*
7. *The new CSSD is under construction. Sterilization is done in respective OTs. Bowl sterilizer, Glove inspection machine, Ultrasound Instrument Cleaning Machine and E.T.O. are not available.*
8. *The telephones have been provided to various units in the hospital and are yet to be made functional.*
9. *Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.*

*The members of the Executive Committee of the Council further observed that the members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council at its meeting held on 25.08.2008 while considering the inspection report of the institute (7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> August,2008) had decided to issue a show cause notice to the authorities of M.L.N. Medical College, Allahabad in view of gross deficiencies of teaching faculty, residents, nonteaching staff and infrastructure as to why the recognition for the award of MBBS degree should not be withdrawn u/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956. The aforesaid decision of the Executive Committee was communicated on 09.09.2008.*

*In reference to the above, the Principal of the college submitted the compliance vide letter dated 18.10.2008. As it was not satisfactory, the institute was requested vide Council letter dated 26.11.2008 to submit the detailed point wise compliance. Another compliance was submitted by the institute vide letter dated 19.01.2009 which was also not found satisfactory. The institute was once again requested vide Council letter dated 30.03.2009 for submission of detailed point wise compliance. 3<sup>rd</sup> compliance was submitted by the institute vide letter dated 08.04.2009 which was also not found satisfactory. The institute was also requested vide Council letter dated 26.05.2009 and the compliance was submitted by the institute on 31.07.2009 which was also found unsatisfactory. The institute was again requested vide Council letter dated 25.08.2009 and the compliance was submitted by the institute on 25.09.2009.*

*In view of above and as the gross deficiencies of teaching faculty, residents, clinical material & infrastructure are still persisting in spite of repeated opportunities being given to the institute to rectify the same over a period of time, the members of the Executive Committee of the Council decided to issue a final show cause notice to the authorities of M.L.N. Medical College, Allahabad as to why the recognition for the award of MBBS degree should not be withdrawn u/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the institute be asked to submit its compliance within a period of 2 months. Copy of the letter be also marked to Secretary (Medical Education), DME of the concerned State Govt., Registrar of the University to which the college is affiliated and also to the member of MCI representing the State where the college is located."*

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in M.D.(TB & Chest Dise.) course from the academic session 2010-2011.

**54. Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University – Recognition of D.L.O. qualification in respect of students being trained at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur.**

Read: the communications dt. 06.05.2009 received from the college authorities and the Council Inspector respectively alongwith Compliance Verification Inspection Report (May, 2007) and earlier inspection report (May, 2006) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur for recognition of D.L.O qualification granted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the communications dt. 06.05.2009 received from the college authorities and the Council Inspector respectively alongwith Compliance Verification Inspection Report (May, 2007) and earlier Inspection Report (May, 2006) and decided to recommend that D.L.O qualification granted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University in respect of students being trained at Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to advise the institution authorities to restrict the number of admission to 1(One) student per year prospectively from the academic year 2010-11.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21<sup>st</sup> July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

“.....

6.4 *The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.*

6.6 *Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course.*

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 13/10/2009 received from the Registrar cum OSD, Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Jaipur wherein he has submitted that as per the para 9 of Post Graduate Regulation – 2000 issued by Medical Council of India (MCI), New Delhi admission on 50% approved seats is to be done by the State Govt. Accordingly Govt. of Rajasthan conducted the 2<sup>nd</sup> counseling on 14<sup>th</sup> June, 2009 and provided the PG candidates to the Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Sitapura, Jaipur to be admitted by 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2009. In this connection, they have enclosed Central Govt. letter No. C-18018/21/2009-MEC, dated 26<sup>th</sup> May, 2009 along with a copy of order of Hon’ble Supreme Court of India.

It was further observed that the admissions were done by the State Govt. in Government quota seats is within the extended period and the admission is not been done in the Private quota of the said college, violating the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

In view of above, the members of the Postgraduate Committee after due deliberations decided to accept the explanation submitted by the Registrar cum OSD, Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Jaipur and decided to revoke the decision taken by the Postgraduate Committee to discharge the following students admitted after the last date i.e. 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2009.

**59. Admission made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Lady Hardinge Medical College, Delhi**

Read: the letter dt.13.11.2009 with regard Admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Lady Hardinge Medical College, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dt.13.11.2009 with regard Admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Lady Hardinge Medical College, Delhi and noted as under:-

*“The Director, vide letter dt.13.11.09 has informed that this college which is a Central Govt. institution, increased 20 MD/MS and 2 PG diplomas seats from the academic session 2009-10 towards stepwise implementation of 27% reservation for OBC in accordance with the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in admission) Act, 2006 after taking due permission from the Central Govt. Ministry of Health & F. W. vide their reference NoA.12034/13/2008-ME-III dt.11.12.2008. This is a absolutely in*

*accordance with clause 10A of the IMC Act, 1956. The institution will get the inspection of the concerned deptt. by the Medical Council of India in due course of time, definitely before the candidates admitted against the increased admission capacity appear for the final examination for their respective course."*

The Postgraduate Committee noted that as per the provisions of Section 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956, no medical college shall increase its admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a postgraduate course of study or training) except with the previous permission of the Central Govt., obtained in accordance with the provisions of this Section.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to accept the clarification submitted by the Director.

**60. Admission made in D.C.H. course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Institute of Child Health, Kolkata.**

Read: the letter dt.13.11.2009 with regard Admissions made in D.C.H. course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Institute of Child Health, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 16/11/2009 received from the Director, Institute of Child Health, Kolkata regarding admission made in D.C.H. course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of the admission capacity fixed by the Council and observed that the Director, Institute of Child Health, Kolkata vide their letter dt.16.11.2009, wherein he has submitted as under:-

*"The number of seats in this course has been fixed at 15 and ever since then they had been admitted up to 15 students in each batch. This number was fixed after inspection of 26, 27 December 1962. After the All India Postgraduate Medical Entrance Examinations were started, 50% of these seats were set aside for candidates qualifying in the All India examination and the rest 50% kept for those candidates qualifying in the West Bengal Seat Medical Postgraduate Entrance Examinations. Accordingly, out of 15 seats allotted to this Institute, 50% i.e. 7 seats were set aside for candidates from the All India Examination and 8 seats were kept for candidates from the State Medical Postgraduate Entrance Examination, the total number adding up to 15. Therefore 7 students have been admitted from the All India quota and the rest from the State quota.*

*It is further submit that the admitting authorities in these course are the Directorate General of Health Sciences, Medical Examination cell, Govt. of India and the West Bengal University of Health Sciences respectively. The Institute merely admits the students allotted to it."*

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to accept the clarification submitted by the Dean.



**61. Non- teaching hospital - Peerless Hospital & B.K. Roy Research Centre, Kolkata - recognition of Hospital for housemanship in General Medicine.**

Read: the Council Inspector's report (Nov. 2009) for recognition of Peerless Hospital & B.K. Roy Research Centre, Kolkata for housemanship in General Medicine.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Nov. 2009) for recognition of Peerless Hospital & B.K. The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dt.24.10.2009 received from the Medical Director, Cooperative Medical College, Kochi alongwith the reply sent by the office on 8.12.2009 with regard to return of application for starting of Postgraduate courses and noted the same.

**64. Complaint regarding running of unrecognized MD Course (Forensic Medicine) by CSM Medical University, Lucknow.**

Read: the complaint dt.18.06.2009 from Dr. Amit Kumar, U.P. with regard to running of unrecognized MD Course in (Forensic Medicine) by CSM Medical University, Lucknow.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the complaint dt.18.06.2009 from Dr. Amit Kumar, U.P. with regard to running of unrecognized MD Course in (Forensic Medicine) by CSM Medical University, Lucknow and decided to direct the office of the Council to cause an immediate inspection within 30 days for MD(Forensic Medicine).

**65. Increase of seats in Postgraduate Medical courses in view of increase of allocation of seats as per teachers students ratio.**

Read: the information received from the various Government medical colleges / institutions with regard to number of Professors, No. of Units & bed strength in each Post Graduate Speciality together with the Central Government Gazette notification dated 24/07/2009 regarding amendments in clause 12(1), (2), (3) & (4) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations 2000.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Central Government Gazette notification dated 24/07/2009 regarding amendments in clause 12(1), (2), (3) & (4) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations 2000 and noted the following:-

1. The ratio of recognized postgraduate teacher to the number of students to be admitted for the degree course where diploma is not prescribed shall be 1:2 for a Professor and 1:1 for other cadres in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats for the degree per unit per academic year provided a complement of 10 teaching beds is added to the prescribed bed strength of 30 for the unit for broad specialities.
2. The ratio of recognized postgraduate teacher to the number of students to be admitted for the degree course in broad specialities where diploma is prescribed shall be 1:2 for a Professor and 1:1 for other cadres in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats including diploma per unit per academic year provided a complement of 10 teaching beds is added to the prescribed bed strength of 30 for the unit.
3. The requirement of units and beds shall not apply in the case of Postgraduate degree or diploma courses in Basic and para-clinical departments.

Provided that against the very same units, teaching personnel and infrastructure, no other postgraduate courses under any other streams like National Board of Examinations, College of Physicians & Surgeons etc. are permitted.

4. The ratio of PG teacher to the number of students to be admitted for super specialities course shall be 1:2 for Professor/Assoc. Professor and 1:1 for remaining cadre in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats for the course per unit per academic year provided the complement of 10 teaching beds per seat is added to the prescribed bed strength of 20 for the unit."

Provided that against the very same units, teaching personnel and infrastructure, no other postgraduate courses under any other streams like National Board of Examinations, College of Physicians & Surgeons etc. are permitted.

Accordingly a circular was sent by the Council Office to the Health Secretaries of all the states on 15/09/2009 and 24/09/2009 requesting to direct the Deans/Principals to send the information as regards availability of Professors in the subjects of broad specialties and availability of Professors and Assoc Professors in respect of super specialties and also unit wise number of teaching beds and students.

The Committee taking into consideration the Gazette Notification dated 24.07.2009 and the information furnished by the college / institution authority decided to enhance the number of post graduate seats in various broad specialties as mentioned against each college:
