1. Dr. Jitendra Kain, Prof. & HOD, Dr. Mahima Shrivastava, Associate Professor, Dr. Pratima Jaiswal, Assistant Professor & Dr. William, Assistant Professor, do not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
2. There is deficiency of 1 Tutor.
3. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is inadequate.
4. Books & Journals of the discipline is inadequate in Central Library.
5. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

08. Increase of seats in MD(Anatomy) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan, u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

Item is withdrawn by the office.

09. Starting of MD(Obst. & Gynae.) course at Nalanda Medical College, Patna, Bihar u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (December, 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at the Nalanda Medical College, Patna, Bihar for Starting of MD(Obst. & Gynae.) course under Magadh University, Bodh Gaya u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (December, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Obst. & Gynae.) course at Nalanda Medical College, Patna, Bihar under Magadh University, Bodh Gaya because of the followings:-

1. The department is deficient of 2 Assistant Professors.
2. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is inadequate.
3. Hostels for PG students are under construction.
4. Journals in O & G should be purchased.
5. Operative laparoscopic instruments, Hysteroscope, Colposcope not present.

6. Septic O.T. is not functioning.
7. Septic labour room not functioning.
8. Oncology clinic, infertility clinic, Menopause clinic not functioning.
9. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

10. Starting of MD(General Medicine) course at Nalanda Medical College, Patna, Bihar u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (November, 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at the Nalanda Medical College, Patna, Bihar for starting of MD(General Medicine) course under Magadh University, Bodh Gaya u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(General Medicine) course at Nalanda Medical College, Patna, Bihar under Magadh University, Bodh Gaya because of the followings:-

1. Units & beds are not as per MCI norms. (3 Units, 152 beds).
2. The department is deficient by 1 Assistant Professor.
3. Average daily bed occupancy is 75%, which is inadequate.
4. Holter, EMG, EEG, Evoke Potentials & Bronchoscopy are not available.
5. Neurology, Nephrology, Haematology, Endoscopy & Endocrinology clinics are not functioning.
6. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

11. Starting of MD(Forensic Medicine) course at Sardar Patel Medical College, Bikaner u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (November, 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at the Sardar Patel Medical College, Bikaner for starting of MD(Forensic Medicine) course under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (November, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Forensic Medicine) course at Sardar Patel Medical College, Bikaner under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, because of the followings:-

1. Promotion of Dr. P.N. Mathur, Professor & HOD, is not as per MCI norms as he has been promoted to the post of Professor after 3 years 10 months and 20 days service as Associate Professor.
2. Dr. Anis Ahmed, Assistant Professor, does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
3. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is inadequate.
4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

12. KLE University, Belgaum - Recognition of D.M.(Cardiology) qualification in respect of students being trained at J.L.N.Medical College, Belgaum.

Read: the Council Inspector Report (July, 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at J.L.N. Medical College, Belgaum for purpose of recognition of D.M.(Cardiology) qualification granted by KLE University, Belgaum.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector Report (July, 2009) and decided not to recognize D.M.(Cardiology) qualification granted by KLE University, Belgaum in respect of students being trained at J.L.N. Medical College, Belgaum because of the followings:-

1. Dr. S.T. Yavagal, Professor & HOD, does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
2. Dr. Sanjay C Porwal, Assistant Professor, does not possess prescribed academic qualification.
3. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is inadequate.
4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in D.M.(Cardiology) course from the academic session 2010-2011.

13. Increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) at Dr. S. N. Medical College, Jodhpur u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 consideration of compliance regarding

Read: the Compliance Report alongwith the Council Inspector's report (November, 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Dr. S. N. Medical College, Jodhpur for Increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) course under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Compliance Report alongwith the Council Inspector's report (November, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) course at Dr. S. N. Medical College, Jodhpur under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 from 7(Seven) to 10(Ten) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

14. Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) at Rural Medical College, Loni u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 consideration of compliance regarding

Read: the Compliance Report alongwith the Council Inspector's report (September, 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Rural Medical College, Loni for increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) course under Parvara Institute of Medical Sciences, Loni (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Compliance Report alongwith the Council Inspector's report (September, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) course at Rural Medical College, Loni under Parvara Institute of Medical Sciences, Loni (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 from 2(Two) to 4(Four) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional

increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to restrict the number of admissions to 3(Three) students in Diploma in Paediatrics course per year prospectively from the academic session 2010-2011 as per Section 12(1) of Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000, which states that *"in no circumstances more than one student for diploma shall be registered in a unit in one academic year"*.

15. Starting of MD(General Medicine) course at Mediciti Instt. of Medical Sciences, Ghanpur under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Diseases) course under the Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (December, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(TB & Res. Diseases) course at ESI-PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi because of the followings:-

1. Teaching faculty comprises of only 1 Assistant Professor.
2. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is inadequate.
3. There is no departmental library.
4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

Read: the compliance verification report(November, 2009) togetherwith the Council inspector report (June, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar for purpose of recognition of MD(SPM/Community Medicine) qualification granted by Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Srinagar.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (November, 2009) together with the Council inspector report (June, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD (SPM/Community Medicine) qualification granted by Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Srinagar in respect of students being trained at Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (Two) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

".....

6.4 *The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.*

6.6 *Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-clause-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course.*

....."

29. **Increase of seats in MD (Nuclear Medicine) course at Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow consideration of compliance regarding**

Read: the letter dated 03/11/2009 received from the Dean, Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Medical College, Jabalpur with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Medical College, Jabalpur.

The Postgraduate Committee decided to defer the consideration of the matter for the next meeting.

32. Admission made in MD(Psychiatry) for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council-National Institute of Mental Health & Neuro Sciences, Bangalore.

Read: the letter dated 27/10/2009 with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at National Institute of Mental Health & Neuro Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 27/10/2009 received from the Registrar, National Institute of Mental Health & Neuro Sciences, Bangalore with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at National Institute of Mental Health & Neuro Sciences, Bangalore and noted as under:-

“The Ministry of Health & F.W. had vide its official memo.no.c18018/6/2006-ME-IV dt.12.6.09 issued instructions to implement the reservation for OBC from the academic year 2009-10.

As such, a detailed application to enhance the seats (as per MCI) was sent to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India for enhancement of student intake for PG courses including MD in Psychiatry course.

Accordingly, the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India after due consideration accorded approval for the enhancement of seats in MD in Psychiatry course from 14 - 22 from implementation from the Academic year 2009.

For the Academic year 2009-10, the Institute has admitted 18 candidates as against 22 approved by the Ministry. As the Institute has all the requisite infrastructure, the remaining number of seats will be made operative in a phased manner.

In view of the above, the 18 candidates thus admitted to MD in Psychiatry courses are not in excess, but as per the approval of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India and within the guidelines laid down by the Medical Council of India.”

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to accept the clarification submitted by the Registrar, National Institute of Mental Health & Neuro Sciences, Bangalore.

33. Admission made in PG courses for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council- Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati

Read: the letter dated 03/11/2009 with regard to admissions made in various PG courses for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 03/11/2009 received from the Principal, Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati and noted as under:-

“They have not made any excess admission in PG courses in the subject of Anatomy and Forensic Medicine in the session 2009-10. In this regard, the Principal he

has enclosed a copy of MCI site list 2001 where the MCI recognised seats has been shown as :-

The number of seats shown in present MCI website 2009 does not show the correct seat position so far the department of Anatomy and Forensic Medicine of Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati"

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to accept the clarification submitted by the Principal, Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati.

34. Admission made in PG courses for the Academic year 2009-10 in excess of the admission capacity fixed b the Council- Govt. Medical College, Patiala.

Read: the letter dated 28/10/2009 with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Govt. Medical College, Patiala.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 28.10.2009 received from the Principal, Govt. Medical College, Patiala with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Govt. Medical College, Patiala and noted as under:-

"No such information is available in this office record vide which MCI has fixed the intake seats in the department of Psychiatry and Forensic Medicine for admission to PG courses in this institution. However, it is mentioned that the admission during the year 2009-10 has been made in these two departments of this institution as per MCI norms fixed by MCI regulations 2000, The para 12(1) of these regulations is reproduced as under:-

12 Number of postgraduate students to be admitted.

The ratio of recognised postgraduate teacher to number of students to be admitted for the degree and diploma courses shall be 1:1 each of degree and diploma courses, in each unit per year to the extent that in no circumstances more than 2 students for degree and one for diploma shall be registered in a unit in one academic year.

As per above said norms the admission for Postgraduate courses in these two departments have made against available eligible teachers as detailed below:-

Read: the letter dated 26/11/2009 with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Armed Force Medical College, Pune.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 26.11.2009 received from the Brig I/C Trg for commandant, AFMC, Pune with regard to admissions made in DPM course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at , AFMC, Pune and noted as under:-

“ The college has admitted 109 Post Graduates & registered them with MUHS. This is below the total capacity (142) of PG admission. During the admission process one seat extra in Diploma in Psychological Medicine has been inadvertently been allotted.

The college has more than the requisite number of qualified teachers registered with MUHS to guide an additional student.

As the admission has been inadvertently been carried out it is requested that keeping in view the career of the admitted student, as a one time measure, the college be permitted to retain the individual.

It is also suggested that in case the MCI considers it fit it could direct the college to take one candidate less in Diploma in Psychological Medicine in the year 2010-2011.”

In view of above, the members of the postgraduate Committee decided to initiate action by issuing the discharge notice in respect of the student who has been admitted in excess of the permissible intake in the DPM course.

36. Starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course at ESI-PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Joka, Kolkata u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (December, 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI-PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Joka, Kolkata for starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course under the West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (December, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent. for starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course at ESI-PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Joka, Kolkata under the West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata because of the followings:-

- (i) There is no Dean.
- (ii) There is only 1 Professor & 1 Assistant Professor in the department.
- (iii) Resultantly, teaching faculty is inadequate.
- (iv) No office space for HOD Anaesthesia or other faculty members.
- (v) No office staff in Anaesthesia Department.
- (vi) Central & Departmental Library - inadequate.
- (vii) There is no Central Research Lab.
- (viii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

37. Starting of MD(Pathology) course at ESI-PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Andheri (East), Mumbai u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (December, 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI-PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Andheri(East), Mumbai for starting of MD(Pathology) course under the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (December, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Pathology) course at ESI-PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Andheri(East), Mumbai under the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the followings:-

- (i) There is only 1 Professor & 1 Assistant Professor in the department.
- (ii) Resultantly, the teaching faculty is inadequate.
- (iii) Central library - inadequate.
- (iv) There is no departmental library.
- (v) There is no seminar room & museum in the department.
- (vi) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

38. Increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) course at Father Muller's Institute of Medical Education and Research, Mangalore u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (October, 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Father Muller's Institute of Medical Education and Research, Mangalore for Increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) course under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) course at Father Muller's Institute of Medical Education and Research, Mangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 from 1(One) to 2(Two) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

39. Starting of DM(Neonatology) at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 - return of application regarding.

Read: the communication dated 12/11/2009 received from the college authorities to keep their application pending for the next year and the reply sent by the Council returning the application to the Central Govt.

The Postgraduate Committee noted the communication dated 12/11/2009 received from Principal, Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi to keep their application pending for the next academic year. The Postgraduate Committee also noted that the Council vide its letter dated 15.12.2009 has communicated to the Govt. of India that as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office, application for starting of DM(Neonatology) at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi is returned to the Central Govt.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. disapproval of the Scheme for starting of DM(Neonatology) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act,1956, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office.

40. University of Calicut - Recognition of M.Ch. (Neuro-Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Calicut Medical College, Calicut.

Read: the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (April, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Calicut Medical College, Calicut and compliance verification reports (November, 2006, July, 2008 & October, 2009) for purpose of recognition of M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) qualification granted by University of Calicut.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (April, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Calicut Medical College, Calicut and compliance verification reports (November, 2006, July, 2008 & October, 2009) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 13.11.2009 recommending not to recognize M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) qualification granted by University of Calicut in respect of students being trained at Calicut Medical College, Calicut, as the compliance is unsatisfactory because of the following:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Jacob P Alapatt, Professor & Head, is not as per MCI norms.
2. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is inadequate.

The Committee further decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 02.09.2008 to direct the institution authorities to stop admission in M.Ch(Neuro-Surgery) course for the existing intake from the academic session 2009-10.

The Committee, in addition, decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in M.Ch. (Neuro-Surgery) course from the academic session 2010-2011 also.

41. Osmania University, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Recognition of M.Ch.(Urology/Genito-Urinary Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad.

Item is withdrawn by the office.

42. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Approval of Narayana Medical College, Nellore for the award of MD (Anatomy) qualification.

Read: the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (June, 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Narayana Medical College, Nellore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD(Anatomy) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith the Council Inspector's report (June, 2009) and decided to recommend that Narayana Medical College, Nellore be approved for the award of MD (Anatomy) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada restricting the number of admissions to 3(Three) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

2. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD(Foresnic Medicine) course from the academic session 2010-2011.

47. Starting of MD(Community Medicine) course at Katuri Medical College & Hospital, Guntur u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

The deptt. of DVL is involved with two national health programme of Leprosy control as well STD, AIDS control besides its ever increasing importance in Cosmetology & catering more than one lac patients every year, they have received State Govt. sanction vide letter no. F6@MEGr.12008 dt. 7.6.08 to increase the number of seats from 2 to 4 and MCI deputed the inspector, who has done the inspection on 28.9.2009 and has already sent the report of the Council in the speciality of Derm. Looking at the dearth of specialist initially in the 1st batch of MD (Dermatology) - 1982 3 candidate were permitted to get registered followed by 2 candidates have selected for the course.

In the subject of Psy. The State requires more experts which is emphasized by the Govt. of India also to Start National Mental Health programme creating a need of more experts. In fact Govt. of Raj. Vide its letter no. F 6(2)MEGr.I 2008 dt. 7.6.08 has given an administrative sanction to increase the number of seats from 3 to 6 and the MCI has already been requested to hold a fresh inspection which is due an any time.

The deptt. of PSM has adequate staff and other infrastructure facilities to register two candidate and similarly a fresh inspection by the MCI for increase in no. seats has been requested which is due at anytime.

The above said specialities after going through the inspection reports, the MCI will take a judicious decision to increase the seats and there after the need for expulsion of any candidate who has been duly selected by the govt. will not arise and till that may be kept in abeyance."

The Postgraduate Committee also noted that as per the provisions of Section 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956, no medical college shall increase its admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a postgraduate course of study or training) except with the previous permission of the Central Govt., obtained in accordance with the provisions of this Section.

The members of the Postgraduate Committee also observed that Regulation 9 of Medical Council of India (criteria for identification of students admitted in excess of admission capacity of medical colleges) Regulations 1997, pertaining to the excess admission reads as under:-

*"9 Identification of excess admission & non-recognition of medical qualifications:-
The Council shall find out the excess admissions in a medical college and no medical qualification granted to any identified student of the medical college which comes under the excess admission shall be recognized medical qualification for the purpose of Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956). The names and other particulars of students so identified shall be intimated by the Council to all concerned for taking action under the provisions of the Act. Any dispute in the matter of identification of excess admission of students(s) in a medical institution shall be referred to the Central Govt., for decision."*

In view of above, the members of the postgraduate Committee decided to initiate action by issuing the discharge notice in respect of the students who have been admitted in excess of the permissible intake in the following courses:-

Read: the letter dated 06/11/2009 received from the Dean, Grant Medical College, Bombay with regard to admissions made in various PG courses after the last date i.e. 20th June 2009 fixed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India for the academic session 2009-10.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 06/11/2009 received from the Dean, Grant Medical College, Bombay with regard to admissions made in various PG courses after the last date i.e. 20th June 2009 fixed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India for the academic session 2009-10 and noted as under:-

“The Dean, Grant Medical College vide his letter dated 14.9.2009 has informed that date of actual attending the duties (Joining) in department of postgraduate students. But they were taken admission and paid the admission fees and other fees in mentioned dates only i.e. upto 20.06.2009.

Read: the letter dated 19/11/2009 received from the Dean, G.R.Medical College Gwalior with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at G.R.Medical College Gwalior.

The Postgraduate Committee decided to defer the consideration of the matter for the next meeting.

66. Admission made in various PG courses for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Madras Medical College, Chennai.

Read: the letter dated 09th November 2009 from the Dean, Madras Medical College, Chennai with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Madras Medical College, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 9th November 2009 from the Dean, Madras Medical College, Chennai with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Madras Medical College, Chennai and noted as under:-

“The list of seat matrix pertaining to Madras Medical College. This is the correct seat Matrix which was submitted to Medical Council of India and Directorate General of Health Services. In spite of our intimation, the website was not corrected, which was no fault of their institution. All the Post Graduate seats shown are recognized by Medical Council of India. Being a 175 year old institution, most of the Post Graduate seats are recognized by the Medical Council of India. Students are being regularly admitted as per the seat Matrix provided, there is no excess admission.

The Dean has also stated that seat Matrix Medical Council of India have now sent shows only State Quota numbers of seat, prior to 50% all others i.e. 25%. All India Quota and 75% State Quota. 25% number, which have been allotted through All India Quota had been omitted in the website."

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee after due deliberations decided to accept the explanation submitted by the Dean, Madras Medical College, Chennai.

67. Admission made in various PG courses for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Madurai Medical College

Read: the letter dated 04th November 2009 with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Madurai Medical College.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 04th November 2009 received from Dean, Madurai Medical College, Madurai with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Madurai Medical College and noted as under:-

"Dean, Madurai Medical College, Madurai vide letter dt. 4.11.2009 has informed that letter of permission has been issued vide Ref. no. U.12012/55/2002-ME.P.II dated. 25.3.2006 of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi for the intake of two MD (DVL) students per year. A copy of the Letter of Permission is enclosed.

Regarding DCH and DLO courses, 12 students were being admitted for each courses per year for the past twenty years on perusal of the available records.

The HOD's of the respective departments have given confirmation letters for the intake of students.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee after due deliberations decided to accept the explanation submitted by the Dean, Madras Medical College, Chennai with regard to excess admissions made in DCH & DLO courses.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted the decision of the Postgraduate Committee taken at its meeting held on 06.06.2007 duly approved by the General Body of the Council at its meeting held on 16.11.2007 that the intake capacity MD(DVL) was fixed 1(One) seat prospectively while recommending recognition of the said degree. Hence, the admissions made in the aforesaid course is in excess i.e. number of admissions 2(Two) students.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to initiate action by issuing the discharge notice in respect of the students who have been admitted in excess of the permissible intake of MD(DVL) course.

68. **Admission made in Tata Memorial Hospital Parel, Mumbai in various postgraduate medical courses after the last date i.e. (20/06/2009) for the academic session 2009-10.**

Read: the letter dated 21/10/2009 & 03/12/2009 received from the Dean, Tata Memorial Hospital, Parel, Mumbai with regard to admissions made in various PG courses after the last date i.e. 20th June 2009 fixed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India for the academic session 2009-10.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 21/10/2009 & 03/12/2009 received from the Dean, Tata Memorial Hospital, Parel, Mumbai with regard to admissions made in various PG courses after the last date i.e. 20th June 2009 fixed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India for the academic session 2009-10 and noted as under:-

"The date of admission of the students shown in their previous letter was wrongly entered, the College regular staff was on leave at the time of preparation of letter and the leave substitute made inaccurate entries of the dates. The correct date of the students are enclosed (Xerox copies of the fees collected receipt of each of these students and copies of their appointment letter issued by or HRD office which indicate the correct dates). They have not admitted any students after 20.06.2009 and requested to revoke the penalty imposed on the students for no fault of theirs and inform the Maharashtra Medical Council.

As directed letter has been sent to the Dean, Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai vide MCI letter dated 10/11/2009 with the request to submit affidavit with supporting evidence.

In response to above, the Dean Tata Memorial Hospital vide letter dated 03/12/2009 has enclosed the Affidavit with supporting copies of evidence."

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee after due deliberations decided to accept the explanation submitted by the Dean Tata Memorial Hospital, Parel, Mumbai and decided to revoke the decision taken by the Postgraduate Committee to discharge the above students as conveyed vide Council letter dated 14/10/2009.

69. **Admission made in various PG courses for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Patna Medical College, Patna.**

Read: the letter dated 29/10/2009 received from the Principal, Patna Medical College, Patna with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Patna Medical College, Patna.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 29/10/2009 received from the Principal, Patna Medical College, Patna with regard to admissions made in various PG course for the academic session 2009-10 in excess of admission capacity fixed by the Council at Patna Medical College, Patna and noted as under:-

"The Principal, Patna Medical College, Patna vide letter dated 29/10/2009 has stated that the Patna Medical College, Patna has received the letter from the Medical Council of India for excess admission of the students in MS(Anatomy)-3 seats, MD (Ortho) - 6 seats and D.C.H. - 12 seats. This information is supplied to the council every year and 50% seats are reserved for Kendriya Kota. Earlier no objection was raised by the Medical Council of India in the admission for the said courses and no correspondence has been made.

The Medical Council of India, New Delhi has informed for starting/increase of seats. They have executed the same orders. Although in MD (Psychiatry) course admission was made for 3 seats. But, in the year 2008 MCI has given the permission for 2 seats, they have obeyed the same. The 2 seats were admitted for MD (Radio-therapy) course. But from 2009-10 the admission was stopped by the Medical Council of India, they were obeyed the same.

The Principal has requested to intimate the basis on which the seats have been reduced in the above PG courses in the year 2009-10.”

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to accept the clarification submitted by the Principal, Patna Medical College, Patna.

70. Inclusion of D.M.(Pulmonary & Critical Care Medicine) in the postgraduate medical education regulation 2000 for consideration of the request for starting of said course at Calicut Medical College, Kozhikode under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the matter with regard to inclusion of D.M.(Pulmonary & Critical Care Medicine) in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation 2000 for consideration of the request for starting of said course at Calicut Medical College, Kozhikode under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter with regard to inclusion of D.M.(Pulmonary & Critical Care Medicine) in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation 2000 for consideration of the request for starting of the said course at Calicut Medical College, Kozhikode under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 and decided that the matter be referred to the Academic Cell of the Council alongwith all the supportive documents whether there is necessity of a separate D.M.(Pulmonary & Critical Care Medicine) course or not as D.M.(Pulmonary Medicine) speciality already included in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations 2000. Alternatively, the academic cell may consider whether the DM(Pulmonary Medicine) course will be termed as DM(Pulmonary & Critical Care Medicine) course.

- 71. i) Starting of M.S.(Orthopaedics) course at Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.**
- ii) B.N. Mandal University - Recognition of D.Ortho qualification in respect of Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj.**

Read: the compliance verification report (December, 2009) together with the Council Inspector's report (August, 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Mata Gujari Medical College, Kishanganj for starting of MS (Ortho) course and recognition of D.Ortho. qualification under B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (December, 2009) together with the Council Inspector's report (August, 2009) and decided-

- (i) to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.S. (Orthopaedics) course at Mata Gujari Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively

i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 restricting the number of admission to 2(Two) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

- (ii) that D.Ortho. qualification granted by B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura in respect of students being trained at Mata Gujari Medical College, Kishanganj be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students per year.

72. To prescribe the Eligibility Criteria for Teachers in the Broad Speciality and Super-Speciality Courses.

Read: To prescribe the Eligibility Criteria for Teachers in the Broad Speciality and Super-Speciality Courses.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the General Body of the Council at its meeting held on 18.11.2009 considered the matter with regard to prescribe the Eligibility Criteria for Teachers in the Broad Speciality and Super-Speciality Courses alongwith the recommendation of the Postgraduate Committee taken at its meeting held on 13.11.2009 and the Council approved the following recommendation of the Postgraduate Committee:-

“The Postgraduate Committee considered the recommendation of the TEQ Sub-Committee for prescribing the eligibility criteria prescribe the Eligibility Criteria for Teachers in the Broad Speciality and Super-Speciality Courses and noted the Notification dated 21/07/2009 following Postgraduate Medical Qualifications have been added in the Schedule to Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation 2000:-

1. M.D. Emergency Medicine
2. M.D. Infectious Disease
3. D.M. Pulmonary Medicine
4. D.M. Rheumatology
5. D.M. Child Adolescent Psychiatry
6. D.M. (Paediatrics Gastroenterology)
7. D.M. Paediatric Cardiology
8. D.M. (Cardiac Anaesthesia)

The matter was placed before the TEQ Sub-Committee at its meeting held on 05.10.2009 to prescribe the Eligibility Criteria for Teachers in the Broad Speciality and Super-Speciality courses. The Committee decided as under: -

“The Teacher’s Eligibility Qualifications Sub-Committee considered the matter with regard to prescribing the Eligibility Criteria for Teachers in the Broad Speciality and Super-Speciality Courses and decided that a joint meeting of Chairman, Teacher’s Eligibility Qualifications Sub-Committee with Chairman, Post Graduate Committee be held on mutually agreed date to define curriculum, syllabus and Teacher's Eligibility Qualifications for Broad Speciality and Super-Speciality Courses.”

The Postgraduate Committee noted that inadvertently doctoral and postdoctoral teachers of the concerned discipline have not been mentioned in the list of eligible teachers. Hence, the Postgraduate Committee proposed the following amendments to the eligibility criteria for teachers as under:-

This relaxation in academic qualifications in the respective speciality will be applicable for 10 years. After this date doctors with qualification in the concerned super speciality only will be considered as faculty members.

The Postgraduate Committee also proposed consequential changes in the “Minimum Qualifications for Teachers in Medical Institutions Regulations, 1998” may also be done accordingly.

73. Consideration of the information (complete/incomplete/non-receipt) from the Govt. Medical Colleges for the purpose of increase of seats in Postgraduate courses in view of increase of allocation of seats as per teachers /students ratio.

Read: The Central Government vide Gazette notification dated 24/07/2009 has notified amendments in clause 12(1), (2), (3) & (4) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations 2000 which read us under:-

1. The ratio of recognized postgraduate teacher to the number of students to be admitted for the degree course where diploma is not prescribed shall be 1:2 for a Professor and 1:1 for other cadres in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats for the degree per unit per academic year provided a complement of 10 teaching beds is added to the prescribed bed strength of 30 for the unit for broad specialities.

2. The ratio of recognized postgraduate teacher to the number of students to be admitted for the degree course in broad specialities where diploma is prescribed shall be 1:2 for a Professor and 1:1 for other cadres in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats including diploma per unit per academic year provided a complement of 10 teaching beds is added to the prescribed bed strength of 30 for the unit.
3. The requirement of units and beds shall not apply in the case of Postgraduate degree or diploma courses in Basic and para-clinical departments.
Provided that against the very same units, teaching personnel and infrastructure, no other postgraduate courses under any other streams like National Board of Examinations, College of Physicians & Surgeons etc. are permitted.

Clause 12 (4) shall be substituted as under:-

1. The ratio of PG teacher to the number of students to be admitted for super specialities course shall be 1:2 for Professor/Assoc. Professor and 1:1 for remaining cadre in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats for the course per unit per academic year provided the complement of 10 teaching beds per seat is added to the prescribed bed strength of 20 for the unit."

Provided that against the very same units, teaching personnel and infrastructure, no other postgraduate courses under any other streams like National Board of Examinations, College of Physicians & Surgeons etc. are permitted.

Accordingly a circular was sent to the Health Secretaries of all the states on 15/09/2009 and 24/09/2009 requesting to direct the Deans/Principals to send the information as regards availability of Professors in the subjects of broad specialties and availability of Professors and Assoc Professors in respect of super specialties and also unit wise number of teaching beds and students.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the postgraduate degree seats have been enhanced in 47 medical colleges and incomplete information has been received from some medical colleges.

The Committee also noted that no information has been received from various medical colleges and the office of the Council has already sent reminder to them.

The Postgraduate Committee directed the office of the Council to send written as well as telephonic communication to all the medical colleges/institutions, who have sent incomplete information, requesting them to provide the required information to the Council at the earliest.
