The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Jan. 09) together with the Council Inspector's report (October, 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MS(General Surgery) course at Yenepoya Medical College, Mangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 from 4 (four) to 6 (six) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Jan. 09) together with the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Paediatrics) & DCH courses at M.M. Instt. of Medical Sciences & Research, Mullana Ambala under Maharishi Markandeshwar University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admissions to 3(three) students for degree & 2 (two) for diploma per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the compliance verification report (Jan. 09) together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Prathima Instt. of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for starting of MS (General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the compliance verification report (Jan.09) together with the Council Inspector's report (October, 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at B.K Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara for starting of MD (Skin & VD) & DVD courses under Sumandeep Vidyapeeth University, Vadodara, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Jan.09) together with the Council Inspector's report (October, 2008) and noted that the promotion of Dr. K.M. Acharya, Assoc. Professor is not as per MCI norms.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D (Skin & VD) & DVD courses at B.K Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara under Sumandeep Vidyapeeth University, Vadodara, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student for degree & 1(one) for diploma per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

15 Increase of seats in MS (Ortho.) & D.Ortho. courses at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College, Pondicherry under Vinayaka Missions University (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (Jan., 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College, Pondicherry for increase of seats in MS (Ortho.) & D.Ortho. courses under Vinayaka Missions University (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Jan., 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MS (Ortho.) & D.Ortho. courses at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College, Pondicherry under Vinayaka Missions University (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010

from 1(one) to 2(two) students for degree & 1 (one) to 2(two) for diploma per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

16 Starting of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) & DMRD courses at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad under Ch. Charan Singh University.

Read: the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad under Ch.Charan Singh University for consideration of starting of MD(Radio-Diagnosis) & DMRD courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2006) and observed that the request for starting of MD(Radio-Diagnosis) & DMRD courses was received from the Central Govt. in the year 2003 & 2006 respectively. In view of the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report, the Postgraduate Committee at its meeting held on 20.11.2006 had decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of above PG courses at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad under Ch.Charan Singh University.

The Committee noted that a letter dated 8.2.2007 was received from the Principal, Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad for postponement of inspection for starting of above PG courses for the academic year 2007-08 and it at its meeting held on 27.2.2007 in view of the Govt. of India letter dated 15.3.2005 issued after the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in case of Mridul Dhar V/s UOI & Ors. requesting the Council to strictly adhere to the time schedule prescribed under the Regulations for sending the recommendations of the Council to the Central Govt. for grant of LOP being 28th February decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for starting of MD(Radio-Diag.) & DMRD courses at Santosh Medical College & Hospital, Ghaziabad.

The above decision of the Postgraduate Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide letter dated 27.2.2007

The Committee further considered the Central Govt. letter dated 29.01.2009 forwarding therewith compliance received from the college authorities which is after the last date prescribed under the Regulations i.e. 15th November.

The following directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Mridul Dhar's case dated 12.1.2005 were also noted:

14. *Time schedule for establishment of new college or to increase intake in existing college, shall be adhered to strictly by all concerned.*
15. *Time schedule provided in Regulations shall be strictly adhered to by all concerned failing which defaulting party would be liable to be personally proceeded with.*

In view of above and in view of the directives and pronouncements of the Hon'ble Supreme Court from time to time in various judgements wherein it is stated that the Regulations of the Council being statutory Regulations are mandatory and binding in character and are required to be adhered to by all the authorities, hence, it is neither possible nor permissible for the Council or for any other authority to relax the time schedule prescribed in the opening of a New or Higher course of study or training (including Postgraduate course of study or training) and increase of admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a Postgraduate course of study or training), Regulations, 2000, the Postgraduate Committee decided that the application in original be sent back to the Govt. of India.

17 Starting of MD(Skin & V.D.) & D.V.D. courses at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad under Santosh University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (February, 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad under Santosh University for starting of MD(Skin & V.D.) & D.V.D. courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (Feb., 2008) and observed that the request for starting of MD(Skin & V.D.) & D.V.D. courses was received from the Central Govt. in the year 2007. The Postgraduate Committee at its meeting held on 27.2.2008 noting the deficiencies pointed out in the Inspection Report and in view of the Govt. of India letter dated 15.3.2005 issued after the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in case of Mridul Dhar V/s UOI & Ors. requesting

the Council to strictly adhere to the time schedule prescribed under the Regulations for sending the recommendations of the Council to the Central Govt. for grant of LOP being 28th February decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for starting of MD(Skin & VD) & DVD courses at Santosh Medical College & Hospital, Ghaziabad.

The above decision of the Postgraduate Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide letter dated 28.02.2008.

The Committee further considered the Central Govt. letter dated 29.01.2009 forwarding therewith compliance received from the college authorities which is after the last date prescribed under the Regulations i.e. 15th November.

The following directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Mridul Dhar's case dated 12.1.2005 were also noted:

14. *Time schedule for establishment of new college or to increase intake in existing college, shall be adhered to strictly by all concerned.*
15. *Time schedule provided in Regulations shall be strictly adhered to by all concerned failing which defaulting party would be liable to be personally proceeded with.*

Read: the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2006) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad under Ch.Charan Singh University for consideration of starting of MS(Anatomy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification Inspection report (Oct.,2005) and observed that the request for starting of MS(Anatomy) course was received from the Central Govt. in the year 2003. The Postgraduate Committee at its meeting held on 26.2.2007 in view of the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report decided to return the application to the Central Govt. for starting of MS (Anatomy) course at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad under Ch.Charan Singh University.

The Committee also noted that a letter dated 23.2.2008 was received from the Dean, Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad requesting to postpone the inspection for starting of MD(Anatomy) course and it at its meeting held on 27.2.2008 in view of the Govt. of India letter dated 15.3.2005 issued after the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in case of Mridul Dhar V/s UOI & Ors. requesting the Council to strictly adhere to the time schedule prescribed under the Regulations for sending the recommendations of the Council to the Central Govt. for grant of LOP being 28th February decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the scheme.

The above decision of the Postgraduate Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide letter dated 27.02.2008.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (October, 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.S.(General Surgery) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi under Amrita Vishwavidyapeetham (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admissions for 4(four) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

20 Increase of seats in M.D.(Radio-Diagnosis) course at Sri Devraj Urs Medical College, Kolar affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

59. Nagpur University/RTM Nagpur University - Recognition of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Nagpur.

Read: the compliance verification report (January, 2009) togetherwith the compliance and the Council Inspector's report (May, 2007) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Govt. The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (January, 2009) togetherwith the compliance and the Council inspector report (May, 2007) and decided to recommend that MS (Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Nagpur University/RTM Nagpur University in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Nagpur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year.

60. Consideration of teachers who possess qualification prescribed as per Regulations prevailing before 1985.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that while scrutinizing the inspection reports for many disciplines, instances have been noticed wherein the teachers who were possessing the academic qualifications prescribed in the Regulations on or before 1985 and were continued in Govt. service till the retirement have been absorbed by other institutes upon the retirement. In such cases, his appointment by other institutes is being considered as fresh recruitment. The Teachers Eligibility Qualifications Regulations, 1998 are applied in such cases and if such a teacher is not in possession of academic qualification prescribed in 1998 Regulations, he is not considered as a teacher by the Postgraduate Committee in view of the mandatory nature of the existing Regulations.

After due deliberations, the members expressed a view that abruptly discontinuing a teacher who has served in a Govt. Institute for decades and not considering him as a teacher because he has retired and joined another institute, though technically correct, may not be appropriate in totality, particularly because there is shortage of teaching faculty in pre and para clinical departments through out the country.

In view of the above, the members of the Postgraduate Committee decided that this matter may be placed before the TEQ Sub-Committee for further necessary action in the matter.
