Medical College, Mumbai for purpose of approval of the college for the award of DCH qualification earlier granted by Bombay/Mumbai University & now by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance submitted by the college authorities together with council inspector report (December, 2009) and observed that the members of the Executive Committee of the Council, while considering the compliance verification inspection report (29th & 30th December 2009) for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai had decided as under:-

2. *Wards:- Most of the wards are overcrowded. The space between two cots is not adequate. Designated teaching area is still not available in some of the wards.*

3. *RHTC, Khardi is under the control of State Government of Maharashtra and the college utilizes its facilities for teaching purposes which is not as per Council norms. Students are not posted at RHTC. Mess facilities are not available.*

4. *The Director has given a letter which states the following*

-"PHC, Khardi is under direct control of the State government through the Directorate of Health Services. The PSM department of the institute is administratively under the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai, which is a constitutional affiliate of the State Government.

-the undergraduate students visit the PHC and are imparted training there. However, they are not residentially posted at Khardi. "

The Director of the college has requested the Govt. of Maharashtra to hand over the PHC Khardi to Municipal Corporation. The reply from the Government is awaited.

5. *Some of the hostel rooms provide dormitory type of accommodation for 7-8 students in one room which is not as per norms. At present, Anand Niketan hostel is having 5 dormitory type rooms, where 7 students per room are accommodated. Total accommodation is for 35 students. The Director informed that new hostel building having 21 storeys is under construction and expected date of completion is Dec 2010.*
6. *Outdoor and Indoor registration section are not computerized. ICD IX classification of diseases is followed instead of ICD X for indexing. Follow up services are not available. Outdoor and indoor registration sections are NOT computerized. ICD IX classification of diseases is followed instead of ICD X for indexing of diseases. Book for ICD X classification is not available. Follow up service is not available. Institution is a very old one and running several postgraduate courses. Hence, there is an immediate need of computerization of all the records. MRD needs to be upgraded and computerized.*
7. *Labor room is under renovation. At present, make shift arrangement has been made for labor room. There are 6 labor tables. No separate arrangement for septic and eclampsia patients is available. Deficiency persists.*
8. *Blood bank license for whole blood and cell components is valid upto Dec 2006 and steps are being taken for getting the license renewed.*
9. *Operation theatre: Post op recovery beds are not available in OT area. Patients are transferred either to surgical ICU or wards depending upon their conditions. There is no post op ward outside the OT area. CCTV is not available.*
10. *Renovation work is in progress in many departments. All departments should have 2 demonstration rooms, each having capacity for 75-100 students.*
11. *Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.*

The members of the Executive Committee of the Council further observed that the members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council at its meeting held on 02.02.2008 while considering the inspection report of the institute (23rd & 24th January,2008) had decided to give two months time to the authorities of Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai to rectify the deficiencies and submit the compliance within the stipulated period. The aforesaid decision of the Executive Committee was communicated to the college authorities on 21.02.2008.

In reference to the above, the Principal of the college submitted the compliance vide letter dated 19.04.2008 & 01.11.2008 which was verified by the Council by way of an inspection on 29th & 30th Dec., 2009.

In view of above and as the gross deficiencies of teaching faculty, residents, non-teaching staff & infrastructure are still persisting, the members of the Executive Committee of the

Council decided to issue a show cause notice to the authorities of Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai as to why the recognition for the award of MBBS degree should not be withdrawn u/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the institute be asked to submit its compliance within a period of 2 months. Copy of the letter be also marked to Secretary (Medical Education), DME of the concerned State Govt., Registrar of the University to which the college is affiliated and also to the member of MCI representing the State where the college is located."

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to defer consideration of the matter for approval of Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai for the award of DCH qualifications granted by Bombay/Mumbai University & Maharashtra University of Health Sciences till the matter of continuance of recognition of MBBS degree is resolved satisfactorily.

22: Regarding the completion of MD(Pathology) course.

Read: the letter dated 29.10.2009 from the Principal, GSVM medical College, Kanpur regarding the completion of MD(Pathology) course by Dr. Preeti Sonkar.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that :-

"the Principal, GSVM medical College, Kanpur vide his letter dated 29.10.2009 has stated that in the Medical College Dr. Preeti Sonkar had taken the admission in MD(Pathology) on 24.08.1999 and during the three year course from 24.08.1999 to 12.01.2002, Dr. Sonkar was availed 30 days Medical Leave and 68 days Earned Leave. Thereafter she was already absent from her duty since 23.01.2002. She was not remaining any leave to her credit. As per the prescribed course, her tenure is already completed on 23.08.2002. So training of 214 days is remaining and she has already submitted the thesis.

As per recommendation of the Medical Council of India in 1992, amended April, 1993 as per the "NOTE" mentioned on page no. 13 "A candidate Registered for MD/MS/DM/M.Ch. and diploma must clear the final examination within five year of the date of admission."

She has completed 9 years as she had taken admission on 24.08.1999 and in the year 2000, recommendations of the Medical Council of India there is not any clarifications in this regard.

He has therefore, requested the Council to give the clear guidelines for the completion of MD(Pathology) course of this students."

Which was found in the previous Regulations is deleted from the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000. In complying that no time limit has been prescribed under Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; for completion of PG course.

In view of above, the members of the Postgraduate Committee decided that as the maximum time limit has not been prescribed in the existing Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 she may be allowed to attend the PG examination provided that she fulfills the attendance and other eligibility criteria as prescribed in the Regulations of the Council and the University concerned.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (January,2010) together with Council Inspector's report (May, 2001) and decided not to recognize/approve M.D.(Radiology/Radio-Diagnosis) & D.M.R.D. qualifications granted by Sri Venkateswara University in respect of students being trained at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool because of the following:

- (i) Dr. T.Munikumar, Associate Professor, does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
- (ii) Dr. A. Ranachandrai, shown as Asst.Prof. in the standard inspection form submitted by the institute at the time of inspection. However, he has shown in the Declaration Form he has shown Tutor in Radio-diagnosis. However, he possessed experience of 1 year 3 months in the department.
- (iii) Dr. M.Rajanikant - no experience has been shown in the Declaration Form.
- (iv) Dr.B.Srikanth, shown as Tutor - experience only 2 years in the department of Radio-diagnosis in a medical institute.
- (v) Dr. G.David D - Tutor in Radio-diagnosis has shown the experience 2 years 6 months in his Declaration Form.
- (vi) Dr. S. Sunitha - Tutor has not shown any experience in his Declaration Form as Resident.
- (vii) Dr. C.H. Nagabhushan - shown experience only 1 year 4 months as Resident. Therefore could not be considered as Tutor in Radio-diagnosis department.
- (viii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

- 24: **Shivaji University Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of M.S. (ENT) & DLO qualification in respect of students being trained at Sanjeevan Medical Foundation ENT P.G. Training Institute, Miraj.**

Read: the compliance verification report (March,2010) together with Council Inspector's report (July, 2009) on the inspection of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Sanjeevan Medical Foundation ENT P.G. training Institute, Miraj for purpose of recognition of M.S.(ENT) & DLO qualifications earlier granted by Shivaji University & now by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (March,2010) together with Council Inspector's report (July, 2009) and decided to

recommend that M.S.(ENT) & DLO qualifications earlier granted by Shivaji University & now by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Sanjeevan Medical Foundation ENT P.G. training Institute, Miraj be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) students per year in each course prospectively.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

Medical College, Bijapur to rectify the deficiencies and submit the compliance within the stipulated period. The aforesaid decision of the Executive Committee was communicated to the college authorities on 03.12.2008.

In reference to the above, the Principal of the college had submitted the point-wise compliance vide letter dated 07.02.2009 which was also verified by the Council by way of an inspection on 24.07.2009 and the same was also considered by the Committee at its meeting held on 25.09.2009 wherein it was decided to give last and final two months time to the authorities of Shri B.M. Medical College, Bijapur to rectify the deficiencies and submit the compliance within the stipulated period. The aforesaid decision of the Executive Committee was communicated to the college authorities on 01.10.2009. The compliance submitted by the college authorities on 24.10.2009 was verified by the Council Inspectors on 29th & 30th Dec.,2009.

Manjunath, Director Jayadeva Institute of Cardiology Bangalore Karnataka.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee and decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the issue of show cause notice given to the institute for withdrawal of MBBS degree u/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956, is resolved.

2. The ratio of recognized postgraduate teacher to the number of students to be admitted for the degree course in broad specialities where diploma is prescribed shall be 1:2 for a Professor and 1:1 for other cadres in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats including diploma per unit per academic year provided a complement of 10 teaching beds is added to the prescribed bed strength of 30 for the unit.
3. The requirement of units and beds shall not apply in the case of Postgraduate degree or diploma courses in Basic and para-clinical departments.
Provided that against the very same units, teaching personnel and infrastructure, no other postgraduate courses under any other streams like National Board of Examinations, College of Physicians & Surgeons etc. are permitted.
4. The ratio of PG teacher to the number of students to be admitted for super specialities course shall be 1:2 for Professor/Assoc. Professor and 1:1 for remaining cadre in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats for the course per unit per academic year provided the complement of 10 teaching beds per seat is added to the prescribed bed strength of 20 for the unit."

Provided that against the very same units, teaching personnel and infrastructure, no other postgraduate courses under any other streams like National Board of Examinations, College of Physicians & Surgeons etc. are permitted.

1. The information provided by the institute with reference to Dr. Pravin N. Salunkhe, Prof. & HOD does not appear to be correct. Dr. M.K. Panda, Assoc. Prof. is part time faculty. Resultantly, teaching faculty complement is inadequate.
2. Polypectomy, oesophageal dilation endoscopy are not available.
3. Emergency endoscopy procedures are not carried out.
4. Specialized investigative facilities like Urine, D-xylose, foecal fat, etc. are not available.
5. Average daily OPD is 26, Bed occupancy is 50%. Resultantly, Clinical material is inadequate.
6. Ward does not have facilities like wall mounted oxygen & suction facilities.
7. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

sent the list of admitted candidates whenever query from Medical Council of India was received vide 350/FM dated 02.02.2002; 1181/FM dated 27.08.2003; 2638/FM dated 07/06/2006; 2466/FM dated 06.06.2007; 3056/FM 02.07.2009. Only once did we receive an objection from Medical Council of India vide MCI-23(1)/2007-Med./28005 dated 17.01.2008, regarding M.D. (Physiology). They complied with MCI objection but later on found out that that objection itself was contradictory after perusing the records of Medical Council of India & informed you about the contradiction vide 3225/FM dated 11.02.2009.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to accept the clarification given by the Dean, J.L.N. Medical College, Aligarh.

Read: the matter with regard to Excess admission made in Dr. S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur in the Postgraduate courses alongwith the clarification received from the College authorities.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the clarification submitted by the Principal, Dr.S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur vide letter dated 24.12.2009 as under:-

1. M.D. (Medicine)

MCI inspection was held in November, 1981 wherein inspector mentioned that 10 students are admitted every year. MCI vide letter dated 9.5.1984 recognized the M.D. Medicine course without restricting / mentioning the number of admission per year. 9 students are being admitted per year since then as permitted.

2. M.S. (General Surgery)

The MCI inspection was conducted in December 1976. The MCI vide letter No. MCI - 88(24)/76-Med./803 dated. 7.4.1978 recognized the Degree of M.S. (Surgery) in this institution without mentioning the number of admission per year.

The number of Postgraduate students intake is as per MCI norms i.e. teacher - students ratio and other facilities available in the department.

3. MD (Paediatrics)

MCI inspection was held in Oct, 1994 and MCI vide letter No. MCI - 88(22)94-Med./3367 dated. 14.6.1995 mentioned as follows:-

“The Postgraduate Committee recommends that Dr. S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur be approved for the award of MD (Paediatrics) qualification granted by Rajasthan University restricting the number of admission to seven (7) students per year”.

Presently, the annual intake of 07 is displaying on the MCI Website.

4. MS (Obst. & Gyn.)

When MCI inspection for recognition of Postgraduate degree was conducted in August, 1981, the annual intake was 08. The letter of recognition was not received that time. On our request the MCI has sent a letter of recognition of the Degree of M.S. (Obst. & Gynae.) course at this institution vide letter No. MCI-88(22)2001-Med/16435 dated 13.8.2001 without mentioning the number of admission per year.

The number of Postgraduate students intake is as per MCI norms i.e. teacher students ratio and other facilities available in the department since then.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to accept the clarification given by the college authorities.

56: Starting of various super specialty courses at NRI Medical College & General Hospital, Guntur- Withdrawal of application regarding.

Read: the letter dated 07/04/2010 received from the Secretary, NRI Academy of Sciences, Guntur for withdrawal of application received for starting of various super specialty courses at the college.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 07/04/2010 received from the Secretary, NRI Academy of Sciences, Guntur for withdrawal of application received for starting of various super specialty courses at the college and decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for starting of various super specialty courses at NRI Academy of Sciences, Guntur u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act,1956, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office.

57: The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai- Approval of KAP Viswanathan Govt. Medical College, Trichy for the award of MD (Obst.& Gynae.) qualification.

Read: the council inspector report (March/April, 2010) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at KAPV Govt. Medical College, Trichy for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the council inspector report (March/April, 2010) and decided not to approve the KAPV Govt. Medical College, Trichy for the award of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai because of the following:-

1. There are 2 units & 102 beds which is not as per norms.
2. Dr.Premavathi, Prof. & Head has been promoted as Professor with experience of only 4 years as Asstt.Prof. which is not as per Regulations. Dr.Thunghai is

shown as Asstt.Prof. but her order is as Tutor. No order appointing her as Asstt.Prof. has been produced.

3. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is incomplete.
4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

58: Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar - Recognition of M.D.(T.B.& Chest /Resp. Dise.) & DTCD qualifications in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Bhavnagar .

The Postgraduate Committee considered the council inspector report (March, 2010) and noted that Dr.M.R.Vairamuthu Raju, Professor Unit V, has been promoted as Assoc. Prof. with experience of only 4 years 5½ months as Asstt. Prof..

However, rest of the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend that Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli be approved for the award of MD(General Medicine) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai restricting the number of admissions to 7 (seven) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

6.4 *The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.*

The Postgraduate Committee considered the council inspector report (March, 2010) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD (DVL) qualification granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Research Institute, Puducherry because of the followings:-

- (i) Ancillary staff in the department were not present and could not be verified.
- (ii) Total number of 60 beds in 2 Units could not be elicited.
- (iii) Bed occupancy records were found to be low and inadequate.
- (iv) Dr.S.N. Mothilal, Dean could not be verified physically in person.
- (v) On checking with the declaration forms of each of the teacher submitted by the authorities were found to be largely incomplete and discrepant.
- (vi) Dr.S.Ambujam, Professor - appointment order to the present post as a Professor is not numbered and joining report to the present post is not provided.
- (vii) Dr.S.Srikanth, Assoc. Prof. - appointment order to the present post as Assoc. Prof. is not numbered and joining report is not provided.
- (viii) Dr.G.V. Seethalakshmi, Asstt.Prof. has not provided adequate (government) approved proof of residence.
- (ix) Dr.R.Baskaran, appointed as Professor is qualified postgraduate MD & diploma in Dermatology only. There is no adequate (government approved) proof of residence.
- (x) Dr.M.Devaki, appointed as senior resident - present appointment order is not numbered.
- (xi) Dr.B.Mithra, appointed as senior resident - promotion order is not numbered and there is no proof of residence.
- (xii) Conduct of examination was not satisfactory.
- (xiii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD (DVL) & DVD course from the academic session 2010-2011.

61: Barkatullah University - Permitting intake in M.D. (Pathology) & D.C.P qualifications at Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal.

Read: the Council inspector report (April, 2010) together with earlier inspection report (February 2007) for purpose of permitting intake in MD.(Pathology) & D.C.P qualifications at Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector report (April, 2010) together with earlier inspection report (February 2007) and decided to recommend to the General Body of the Council to revoke its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 10.03.2007 to withdraw the recognition of MD(Pathology) & DCP degrees granted by the Barkatullah University in respect of students trained at Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal and directing the institution not to make any further admissions in MD(Pathology) & DCP courses.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the recognition of MD(Pathology) & DCP degrees granted by Barkatullah University in respect of students trained at Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal be continued restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students per year in each course.

62: i) Osmania University & Kakatiya University - Recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification in respect of Kakatiya Medical College,Warangal.

(ii) Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Approval of Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal for the award of MS (Ophthalmology) qualification.

Read: the compliance verification report (Jan, 2010) together with the Council Inspector's report (May, 2001) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal for purpose of i) recognition of MS (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Osmania University & Kakatiya University and also ii) approval of the college for the award of MS (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Jan, 2010) and noted that Dr.C.Ramprakash Reddy, Professor has been promoted as Professor with experience of only 5 months as Assoc. Prof. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is inadequate in Unit II. However, teaching complement is complete in rest of the units hence the Committee decided to recommend that :-

1. MS(Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of students being trained at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.
2. Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal be approved for the award of MS (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada restricting the number of admissions to 4 (four) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment)

Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

However, rest of the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend that M.D.(Microbiology) qualification granted by Bhavnagar University in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Bhavnagar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

College, Bhopal and directing the institution not to make any further admissions in MD(Pharmacology) course.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the recognition of MD(Pharmacology) degree granted by Barkatullah University in respect of students trained at Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal be continued restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year in course.

67: Rani Durgawati Vishwavidhalaya - Recognition of MD (Radio-Therapy) qualification in respect of NSCB Medical College, Jabalpur.

Read: the compliance verification report (April,2010) together with the Council Inspector's (August, 2003) on the standard of examination and other facilities available at NSCB Medical College, Jabalpur for purpose of recognition of MD(Radio-Therapy) qualification granted by Rani Durgawati Vishwavidhalaya.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (April,2010) together with the Council Inspector's (August, 2003) and decided not to recognise MD(Radio-Therapy) qualification granted by Rani Durgawati Vishwavidhalaya in respect of students being trained at NSCB Medical College, Jabalpur as the equipment for Radio Surgery is not available.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that the members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council upon consideration of the compliance verification inspection report on 27th & 28th November, 2006 carried out for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree had observed the following deficiencies:-

5. There is no practical lab in the department. It is being shared with the Microbiology Department.
6. There is no department library cum seminar room.

Com. Medicine:

1. One demonstration room is located in the museum.
2. There is no research laboratory

5. The number of beds in the Deptt. of Pead. is 80 in three units against the requirement of 90 beds in three units.

6. The Audiometry room is not sound proof and not air conditioned.

7. There are only five operation theatres having 10 tables against the requirement of 10 operation theatres. The arrangement for more than one table in OT is also not as per the MCI norms.

8. Septic labour room and eclamsia room are not available.

9. There is no separate surgical & medical ICU. There is no Gynae. ICU and Neonatal ICU.

10. CT Scan is not available.

11. Number of para-medical staff is grossly inadequate is as under:-

Laboratory Assistants: 01

Laboratory Attendants: 04 (1 post vacant)

15. *Separate hostel for interns is not available.*
16. *In the central library – no current journals are available for the year 2005. Only journals for the year 2006 are available upto the month of July. Total number of journals subscribed are 86 which is inadequate.*
17. *No training courses were held for teachers by the Medical Education Unit during the year.*
18. *Guinea pig, mice and large animals are not available in the animal house. The veterinary officer visits are as per MCI norms.*
19. *RHTC-Natwara is under the control of the State Health Govt. Department and not under the control of Dean.*
20. *No Lecturer-cum-Medical Officer with MD(PSM) is available. Audio-visual aids have not been provided.*
21. *The college does not have any Urban Health Centre at present.*
22. *There is no Medical Record Department and there is no staff appointed for the same. ICD X classification of diseases is not followed for indexing.*
23. *Instrumentation is grossly inadequate. Only one Ambu Bag and BP instrument is available. There is no minor operation theatre and there is no emergency operation theatre.*
24. *Doctors for pre-clinical are posted on rotation in the casualty which is not as per MCI norms. There is no emergency treatment in the casualty.*
25. *The CSSD Hall is not as per MCI norms. Distribution and receiving points are not separate.*
26. *The following deficiencies have been observed in the infrastructure of three MBBS departments:-*

27. *There are no departmental library for TB & Chest, Dermatology and Psychiatry department.*
28. *Number of books in Radio-diagnosis and Anatomy department are inadequate.*
29. *The following deficiencies are observed in the para-clinical departments of Pharmacology, Microbiology and Forensic Medicine:-*
 - Pharmacology – photographs and medicinal plants are not available in the museum.*
 - Pathology – 1. One demonstration room is located inside the museum; 2. There is no research laboratory; 3. Catalogues are not available in the museum.*

- Microbiology – 1. There is no research laboratory; 2. There is no museum; 3. There is no provision for artificial light in the practical lab.; 4. Practical lab. Is shared with the Forensic Medicine department.
- Forensic Med. Deptt 1. There are no catalogue are kept in the museum. 2. There is no research laboratory. 3. The demonstration room is located inside the museum. 4. There is no practical lab. in the department. It is being shared with the Microbiology Lab. 5. There is no departmental library cum seminar room.
- Comm. Med.deptt. –One demonstration room is located in the museum.
There is no Research lab.

30. Other deficiencies/remarks are in the main report.

The members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council also observed that the deficiencies in terms of teaching faculty and infrastructure have worsened and the quantum of the deficiencies is much higher than that observed in 2003 inspection.

In view of above, the members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council decided to reiterate its decision taken at its meeting held on 28th July, 2003 to recommend to the Central Govt. to withdraw the recognition of MBBS Degree in respect of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Medical College, Jabalpur granted by Rani Durgawati Vishwavidyalaya, Jabalpur as approved by the General Body of the Council at its meeting held on 20/10/2003 and recommended to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, (Department of Health), Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi vide letter dated 12.01.2004 for further necessary action u/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956 and request the Central Government to direct the institute not to make any further admissions in the MBBS course w.e.f. academic year 2007-08.

68: Curricula of the two discipline MD(Health Administration) and MD (General Medicine) which has converted to the competency format.

Read: the drafted Curricula of the two discipline MD(Health Administration) and MD (General Medicine) which has converted to the competency format

The Postgraduate Committee decided to accept the competency based curricula of M.D.(Hospital Administration & M.D. (General Medicine).

69. Compliance of order dated 7/5/2009 passed by Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana in Civil Writ Petition No.1490 of 2008 titled as Dr. Indu Verma V/s Union of India and other and confirmed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, vide order dated 31/08/2009 passed in SLP No.20880-20886 of 2009 titled as Medical Council of India v/s Union of India and others.

Read: the representation received from Dr. Indu Verma & Dr. Renuka sood - compliance of the order dated 7/5/2009 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab & Haryana in Civil Writ Petition No. 1490 of 2008 and 1840 of 2008 v/s Union of India of India & others and confirmed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide order dated 31/08/2009.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the recognition of Dr.Indu Verma as PG teacher pursuant to the order of the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court in Civil Writ Petition No. 1490 of 2008 and 1840 of 2008 v/s Union of India of India & others and confirmed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide order dated 31/08/2009.

S. K. Hospital, New Delhi for the academic year 2010-11 as per the revised teacher student ratio.

The Postgraduate Committee accepted the explanation given by the Principal, Govt. Medical College, Kottayam vide his letter dt.17.03.2010 stating that at the time of joining of Dr.N. Mahanan at Govt. Medical College, Kottayam, the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations allowed transfer from one University to another University. The candidate had completed full period of DM course (two years from 07.03.1995 to 06.03.1997). Dr.N.Mohanan had jointed on Medical College, Calicut on 07.03.1995 and later transferred to Medical College, Kottayam on 09.05.1996 and completed the course on 06.03.1996 and appeared in the examination held in November, 1997.

74. To consider the reports of the Academic Sub-Committee of the PG committee meeting held on 05th April 2010.

Read: the reports of the Academic Sub-Committee of the PG committee meeting held on 05th April 2010.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the reports of the Academic Sub-Committee on the following matters and approved the following as under:-

- “1:- Separate Register for super speciality in Gastroenterology - to consider the letter dated 06.08.2009 received from Dr. P.Kar, President, Indian Society of Gastoenterology.**

The members of the Academic Sub-Committee of the PG Committee considered the matter and noted that the Council is not maintaining any separate Register for any super-speciality. Moreover, the qualification as per Minimum Qualifications for Teachers in Medical Institutions Regulations, 1998 is MD(Medical Gastroenterology)/D.M.(Gastoenterology)/ MD(Medicine) or M.D.(Paediatrics) with 2 years is eligible for becoming teacher.

- 2:- Inclusion of D.M.(Pulmonary & Critical Care Medicine) in the Postgraduate medical education regulation 200 for consideration of the request for starting of said course at Caliicut Medical College, Kozhikode under Calicut University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

The members of the Academic Sub-Committee of the PG Committee considered the matter and to ask the office for some more information and decided to defer the matter till the information received.

3:- Inclusion of Geriatric Mental Health as a subject in Post Graduate Medical Education Regulations 2000 of Medical Council of India.

The members of the Academic Sub-Committee of the PG Committee considered the matter and decided that opinion may be sought from all the head of departments of Psychiatry of various National Institute such as PGIMS Changigarh, AIIMS, NIMHNS, Bangalore and from the National Association of Psychiatry and Indian Psychiatry Society and also from the Board of Specialities of Psychiatry the Medical Council of India.

4:- Change of nomenclature of Postgraduate and Diploma course from M.D.(Radio-Therapy to M.D.(Radio-Therapy and Oncology).

The members of the Academic Sub-Committee of the PG Committee discussed the matter and decided to endorse the decision of the Board of Speciality of Radio-therapy constituted by the Medical Council of India i.e. MD(Radiotherapy) is MD(Clinical Oncology).

5:- Stop to conduct MRCS examinations at India.

The members of the Academic Sub-Committee of the PG Committee discussed the matter and decided to recommend to the Postgraduate Committee that the Council should give the specific instructions to all medical colleges not to run MRCS/MRCP or any other parallel courses as well as not to conduct examination of the said courses.

6:- NIMS-EC-Clarification on pattern of examination in conducting DM and M.Ch - to consider the letter dated 28.10.2009 received from the Dean, Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad

The members of the Academic Sub-Committee of the PG Committee considered the matter and come to the conclusion that any PG degree course or super-speciality degree course immediately after the MBBS students should have to submit thesis for said course.

7:- To consider the letter dated 12.02.2010 received from Dr. S.B. Deshpande, Professor & Head, Banaras Hindu University regarding his keenness to participate in the activities of MCI, especially in designing and formulation postgraduate medical course.

The members of the Academic Sub-Committee of the PG Committee considered and decided that this matter may be referred to the Academic Cell of the Council for its consideration and necessary action."

75. Restoration of approved intake in MD(Paediatrics) course at Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciences, Kolkata.

Read: the matter with regard to restoration of approved intake in MD(Paediatrics) course at Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate committee observed that at its meeting held on 26th & 27th February 2010 while considering the matter of increase of seat in MD(Paediatrics) course had decided as under:-

"The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (February 2010) along with previous inspection report (September 2009) and observed the following:-

- (i) *The promotion of Dr. A.K. Gupta, Prof. & Head, is not as per Regulations as he has been promoted as Professor with experience of only 6 month as Associate Professor.*
- (ii) *Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.*

In view of the Govt. of India letter dated 15.3.2005 issued after the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in case of Mridul Dhar V/s UOI & Ors. requesting the Council to strictly adhere to the time schedule prescribed under the Regulations, and as per the Schedule prescribed in the opening of a New or Higher course of study or training (including postgraduate course of study or training and increase of admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a postgraduate course of study or training), Regulations, 2000, the last date for sending the recommendations of the MCI for grant of Letter of Permission to the Central Govt. being 28th February, the Members of the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) course at Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciences, Kolkata under West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD(Paediatrics) course from the academic session 2010-2011."

The above decision of the postgraduate committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide MCI letter dated 27/02/2010.

It was further observed that the Central Govt. vide its letter dated 12.04.2010 has sent a copy of letter dated 10/04/2010 received from the authorities of Swami Satyadevananda of Ramakrishna Mission Seva Pratishthan, West Bengal informing as under:-

"Our institute was recognized by MCI for one MD and two DCH students in Paediatrics in the year 2005. Recently, we had inspection for increasing the number of students in MD(Paediatrics). During second inspection, we have fulfilled all the MCI norms but unfortunately one typing mistake was there regarding the teaching experience of Dr. Atul Gupta which was at the first stage."

Verification of the Declaration Forms submitted by Dr. Atul Kumar Gupta reveals that he has worked as Associate Professor in the institute from 01.06.2000 to 31.12.2004 – i.e. the period of 4 years 6 months and thus he is eligible to be appointed as Professor as per Regulations.

In view of above, the members of the Postgraduate Committee decided to revoke its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 26th & 27th February 2010 to stop admission in MD(Paediatrics) course and decided to permit the institution to admit one student in MD(Paediatrics) course as it is recognized with an annual intake of one seat.
