1. Minutes of the last meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 10th October, 2014.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the action is yet to be taken on the minutes of the meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee held on 09/09/2014, 23/09/2014 and 30/09/2014.

Note: The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee resolved that the Office should obtain information from all DRMEs/ Deans of Government Institutions about the rate of stipend being paid to Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality Students in their State/ College. This information has to be obtained urgently (through telephone/ E-mail) and placed before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee at the time of next meeting.

3. Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Assessment Report (06/09/2014) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (06/09/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There is no proof of payment of stipend (Form-16) to the Postgraduate students. As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality course students will be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Institution is located. However, your Institution has not submitted any proof of payment at Government rates.
2. 5 Senior Residents are with MBBS qualification only. There is no Experience Certificate from concerned Head of the Department of having worked as Junior Resident in Surgery Department for a period of 3 years and there is no proof of payment of Salary during the period of JR ship.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Assessment Report (05/09/2014) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (05/09/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There is discrepancy in the salaries of Professors & Asso. Prof. Dr. G. Sajjan as Professor is drawing Rs. 50, 000 p.m., which is less than Dr. G. Deshpande, Asso. Prof. who is drawing Rs. 61, 000 p.m.
2. Dr. R.G. Yariwal, Asso. Prof. & Dr. B.A. Sasnur, Asso. Prof. were absent on the day of Assessment.
3. All patients attending O.B.G. & Paediatrics OPD are enrolled in a single register. There is also a register maintained by O.B.G. Doctors & one by ANM. There is substantial mismatch between the 3 registers. It appears that the total number of patients attending O.B.G. OPD may vary from 50 – 150, which is a wide variation.
4. Anaesthesia records of major cases do not tally with records of specimens received in Pathology department. E.g., Anaesthesia record shows 10

Gynaec major cases from 22/01/ 2014 to 25/01/2014 but total Gynaecological specimens received in Pathology for the whole month of January are 8. There is gross variance with OT records. 1400 major cases in a year are incompatible with existing records.

5. Bed occupancy is 50%. On the day of Assessment, there were 29 patients out of 60 Obstetric beds in 2 wards. Over that last 1 week, the average of 28 patients were available.
6. Only 2 bottles of whole blood were issued for the whole hospital.
7. No new books were purchased in preceding 3 years. No foreign journal was subscribed in preceding 3 years. There a few sporadic copies of foreign journals in the departmental library without any back issues.
8. As the information about the stipend paid by Govt. is not given, it cannot be ascertained whether the stipend given to Residents by the Teaching Institution is at par.
9. Dr. G. Deshpande has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with benefit of 2 publications; however, one is a case report, which cannot be considered and the another is in unspecified internet journal, which seems to be non-indexed. Hence his promotion is not as per the Regulations.
10. Recording of births leaves a lot to be desired. Upto April 2014, they are serially numbered but after that, there is no serialling. No proof of sending birth intimation to Registrar of Births & Deaths was provided.
11. Senior Residents were with MBBS qualification only. There is no Experience Certificate from concerned Head of the Department of having worked as Junior Resident in OBG Department for a period of 3 years and there is no proof of payment of Salary (Form-16) during the period of JR ship.
12. Full references of publications have not been provided. All 4 publications are in house journal – i.e. Al Ameen Journal of Medical Sciences.
13. Dr. B.A. Sasnur, Asso. Prof. & HoU of Unit II was absent on the day of Assessment; resultantly, Faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
14. There is no proof of payment of stipend (Form-16) to the Postgraduate students. As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality course students will be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Institution is located. However, your Institution has not submitted any proof of payment at Government rates.
15. Promotion of Dr. Gururaj R. Deshpande, Assoc. Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years without any publications in Indexed Journals.
16. Dr. Rajeshree Yaliwal, Assoc. Professor, Unit-C was absent on the day of Assessment. Consequently, there is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-A.
17. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. **Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (06/09/2014) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (06/09/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There is no proof of payment of stipend (Form-16) to the Postgraduate students. As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality course students will be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Institution is located. However, your Institution has not submitted any proof of payment at Government rates.
 2. There are no publications from the department in the Indexed Journals in preceding 3 years.
 3. Blood Consumption suddenly increased from 3 to 15 units per day in 2013, when OPD & IPD has remained almost unchanged.
 4. All Senior Residents (Except 1) are with MBBS or DCH qualification without the required teaching experience. No Experience Certificate from concerned Head of the Department of having worked as Junior Resident in Paediatrics Department for a period of 3 years and there is no proof of payment of Salary (Form-16) during the period of JR ship.
 5. The column on Daily OPD, IPD, Admissions, Bed Occupancy is left blank, despite specifically writing in the SAF that no Annexures were to be used.
 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.
- 6. Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (15/09/2014) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (15/09/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. No information is provided for the stipend paid to Residents by State Government. However, institute is paying only Rs. 5, 000 p.m. as stipend to Residents, which is grossly less. As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality course students will be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Institution is located. However, your Teaching Institution has not submitted any proof of payment at Government rates

2. As telephone bill has no user charges, its validity as proof of residence is doubtful. Office order copy for allotment of quarters does not have diary or dispatch numbers.
3. Functioning of ventilators in ICCU was in doubt, when working was observed.
4. PG Residents are not maintaining log books.
5. Blood Bank apparently has all the entries in one handwriting. When asked, how many Units have been cross matched for O.T. for elective surgery on the day of Assessment, no cross match list was shown; rather it was mentioned in the register that blood was issued to OPDs.
6. In ward, although occupancy was > 80%, IPD register showed only one hand writing of all entries, in all months / days and even backwards also.
7. One PG Resident when asked about diagnosis of one patient, she told "Hypertensive Emergency." When asked, which emergency the patient has, she failed to answer about that.
8. Ultrasound register: All entries were in one handwriting. One patient who was entered as "24 years female" was from Paediatrics OPD!
9. In library, only few books had Hospital name, stamp and catalogue numbers; while others were without any serial numbers.
10. Hematology & Gastroenterology services are not available.
11. All Senior Residents (Except 2) are with MBBS qualification without the required experience. No Experience Certificate from concerned Head of the Department of having worked as Junior Resident in Medicine Department for a period of 3 years was made available as well as there was no proof of payment of Salary (Form-16) during the period of JR ship.
12. Promotion of Dr. S.M. Goornavar, Assoc. Professor, Unit-I is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 1 months against the requirement of 5 years without any publications in Indexed Journals. Consequently, there is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-I.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. Starting of MD (DVL) course at AI-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Assessment Report (04/09/2014) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at AI-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of MD (DVL) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (04/09/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (DVL) course at AI-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. The only Unit has no Asso. Prof.; resultantly Faculty complement is incomplete as there are only 2 Faculty and hence, this fact cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Speciality Clinics like Autoimmune Diseases Clinic & Vesticulobullous Diseases Clinic are not available.
3. Equipment like PUVA, NBUV Chamber & LASERS are not available.
4. There is no proof of payment of stipend (Form-16) to the Postgraduate students. As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality course students will be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State

Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Institution is located. However, your Institution has not submitted any proof of payment at Government rates.

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

8. Increase of seats in MD (Anatomy) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Assessment Report (27/08/2014) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar for Increase of seats in MD (Anatomy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (27/08/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD (Anatomy) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2015-2016 from 5 (Five) to 7 (Seven) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears at the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the said qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination, as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

9. Increase of seats in MD (Physiology) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Assessment Report (27/08/2014) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar for Increase of seats in MD (Physiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (27/08/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD (Physiology) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2015-2016 from 5 (Five) to 7 (Seven) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears at the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the said qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination, as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

10. Increase of seats in MD (Biochemistry) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (27-28/08/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Community Medicine) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of Faculty: (a) Epidemiologist cum Lecturer: 1; (b) Statistician cum Lecturer: 1; (c) Tutors: 2.
2. Paramedical staff like Medical Social Worker are not available.
3. RHTC is located at District Hospital, Jagatsinghpur, which is at a distance of 45 kms. and more than one hour's commuting time, which is not as per the Regulations. It is not under the control of the Dean. There are no specialist visits from the Medical College. Paramedical staff like Medical Social Worker, Health Educator are not available. Fixed population is not assigned to the hospital.
4. UHC: There is no LMO. There are neither Medical Social Worker nor Health Educator.
5. There is no vehicle for transport of Faculty.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

15. Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Online data system showed 76 patients having attended Emergency department at 10:50 a.m. on the day of Assessment, while there were only 4 patients to be seen there.
5. Non-Teaching Office staff is not provided by the College.
6. OPD attendance on the day of Assessment was only 80, which is inadequate.
7. Total Major Operations during the year 2011, 2012 and 2013 are more than total IPD of the hospital, which is not feasible.
8. Total number of deaths is different in different reports. In the present report it is 489 but in ENT report it is 477. All this indicates that clinical data is non-genuine.
9. There are 5 Senior Residents with MBBS qualifications without the required experience. No Experience Certificate from concerned Head of the Department of having worked as Junior Resident in Orthopaedics Department for a period of 3 years and there is no proof of payment of Salary (Form-16) during the period of JR ship.
10. Radiological investigations are very low indicating inadequate clinical material.
