The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence was received from Prof. (Dr.) Dhruba Jyoti Borah, Member, Dr. Deelip Govindrao Mhaisekar, Member and Dr. Rani Bhaskaran, Member.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 23/10/2015 were read out and confirmed in the meeting itself.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

On perusal of the Action Taken Report and minutes, it was noted that the following deficiencies were missed inadvertently/ by oversight in the Items mentioned

below. They may be added and communicated to the concerned institutions as deficiencies. The last date for receipt of compliance be treated as one month from the date of issue of these deficiencies:

Item No. 194

1. The college got first Letter of Permission on 10.7.2009. Dr. B.B. Yadav, Assoc. Professor has been given teaching experience from 20.05.2009. Consequently, his promotion from Asstt. Prof. to Assoc. Prof. is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 4 years 10 months against the requirement of 5 years.
2. 04 Senior Residents i.e. Dr. A.P. Dubey, Dr. K.N. Malhotra, Dr. Lalit Kumar Saxena and Dr. Manju Nath Reddy are not eligible. They have no 03 years teaching experience at the time of appointment as Senior Resident.

Item No. 196

1. Dr. M. Ashraf, Assoc. Prof. in the only unit has been promoted after the cut off date on 1.8.2015 on the basis of research publications. However, one out of two publications is not a research publication. No full reference of the 02 publications cited has been given. Hence, they cannot be considered. Consequently, his promotion is not as per Regulations and he cannot be considered as Assoc. Professor.

Item No. 199

1. Dr. Abhey Kumar promoted Professor on 1.7.2015 after the cut-off date. Out of 06 publications cited, 01 pertains to the department of Ophthalmology. No full reference or reprint of the remaining 05 publications has been provided. They are all in internet journals. Hence, they cannot be considered. Consequently, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
2. Promotion of Dr. G.K. Tripathy, Assoc. Prof. Unit II is not as per Regulations. He has been Asstt.Prof. for 04 years 01 month against the requirement of 05 years. Out of 05 publications cited, 02 are in 2015 out of promotion period, one is unrelated to Medicine. No full reference of one publication has been given. Hence, there is only one publication left to his credit. Resultantly, his promotion is not as per Regulations and teaching complement in Unit II is incomplete.

Item No. 200

1. Total IPD for the year 2014 is 6153. However, total major and minor operations (excluding day care) are 10718 which is not feasible. Obviously, data is non-genuine and cannot be relied upon.

Item No. 201

1. Promotion of Prof. & HOD Dr. A.D. Dwivedi is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt.Prof. for 04 year against the requirement of 05 years. His 02 publications cited are outside his promotion period. Moreover, in 1991 the benefit of publications was not permitted.

2. Promotion of Dr. Sonia Luthra, Assoc. Prof. in Unit I is not as per Regulations. She was Asstt. Prof. for 4 years against the requirement of 5 year. Out of 03 publications cited, one is a case report and for one no reference (year of publication) has been provided. So only one publication is left to her credit and all 03 are in journals unrelated to Obst. & Gynae.
3. Promotion of Dr. Anjana Aggarwal, Professor is not as per Regulations. She was Assoc. Professor for 02 years 08 months against the requirement of 04 years. Consequently, Unit II is left with 02 faculty and it cannot be considered a PG Unit.
4. On inspection day, bed occupancy in Obstetrics ICU was 50% and bed occupancy in NICU was 40% which is inadequate.
5. Total IPD last year was 3638. However, total major operations + minor operations (excluding day care), total deliveries and Caesarian Sections were 7077 which is almost double the total IPD. Hence, not feasible. The data is non-genuine and cannot be accepted.

Item No. 202

1. Promotion of Dr. B.S. Khanka is not as per Regulations. He has been Asstt.Prof. for 04 years 05 months against the requirement of 05 years. His period at AIJHBL Hospital, Libia cannot be counted. Similarly, his experience at HIMS, Barabanki prior to first Letter of Permission cannot be counted and his 02 publications cited are in 2015 after his period of promotion.
2. As per faculty table signed by the Dean and Assessor, experience of Dr. P.K. Vashisht is in GOR. There is no teaching institution by this name in the country. Resultantly, he cannot be considered as a Professor.

Item No. 203

1. Daily average OPD (from 03 years data) is 36 which is also grossly inadequate.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee resolved to constitute a Scrutiny Committee, which will scrutinize the compliance received (in cases u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956) and select out those which require verification by assessment. These reports may be sent to Assessment Cell by the Chairman without waiting for being placed before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee. However, they will be brought before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee along with Compliance Verification Assessment Report for final disposal. 3. Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at Command Hospital Air Force, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (21/08/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Command Hospital Air Force, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21/08/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at Command Hospital Air Force, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17, because of the following facts:-

1. There are 180 beds in 3 Units which is not as per Regulations.
2. Nursing staff is inadequate & not as per norms in ICCU, ICU & wards.
3. There is no Central O2 in ICU.
4. Documentation of OPD cases is not proper. No diagnosis written.
5. Preclinical departments of Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry are not available. MOU with Bangalore Medical College is not yet set up.
6. Central Research Laboratory is not available.
7. OPD on day of assessment is 117, which is bare minimum to start of course.
8. Only 2 beds were occupied in ICCU on day of assessment.
9. Academic parameter like Theory Classes (12/year) is inadequate.
10. Daily Blood units consumed- entire hospital 12 and in Medicine department alone 9-10, which is not realistic.
11. The Institute admits in-service candidates, who got their full salary. How it is stated that they give Rs. 25000 per month as stipend.
12. Equipment in the department is inadequate.
13. Departmental Library is inadequate.
14. Promotion of Dr. Bhaskar Nandi is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 2 years against the requirement of 5 years. Period spent at AIIMS for doing DM cannot be counted as Asst. Professor.
15. Promotion of Dr. Salil Gupta, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 2 years. Period spent at AIIMS cannot be counted. He was a PG student there. 7AF Hospital is not in the list of recognized teaching hospitals of Defence services.
16. Dr. Ashish Choudhary is shown as Asst. Professor as well as Assoc. Professor, which is not feasible.
17. All Junior Residents – not shown to have joined in the column of experience.
18. Promotion of Dr. Ajay Handa, Professor is not as per Regulations. He was Assoc. Professor for 3 years and Asst. Professor for 4 years. Period spent at PGIMER, Chandigarh cannot be counted since, he was a Resident there doing super-speciality training.
19. Promotion of Dr. TVSVGK Tilak is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 2 years 6 months. Period spent at AIIMS cannot be counted. There he was a Resident doing super-speciality training.
20. Dr. Vishal Singh is shown as Asst. Professor as well as Assoc. Professor, which is not feasible.
21. Promotion of Dr. Shankar Subramanian, Professor is not as per Regulations. He has never been Asst. Professor. Period spent at AIIMS cannot be counted. He was doing super-speciality training there and working as Resident. BHDC Hospital is not in the list of recognized teaching hospitals of Defense Services. Hence, this period cannot be counted.
22. Promotion of Dr. Kiran Inder Singh Brar is not as per Regulations. She was Asst. Professor for 3 years. Period spent at AIIMS cannot be counted. She was trainee in super-speciality working as Resident.
23. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Starting of MD (Community Medicine) course at Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal under Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University, Jabalpur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (31st August & 1st September, 2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal under Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University, Jabalpur for Starting of MD (Community Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (31st August & 1st September, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (Community Medicine) course at Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal under Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University, Jabalpur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17, because of the following facts:-

1. UHTC & RHTC are running in Private heart care Nursing Home and Private health care centre, which is not permissible. They have no cold chain equipment to carry out immunization.
2. Promotion of Dr. Vinod Narkhede is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years. He has only one publication between 2007 to 2011.
3. SAF has been altered. Column – whether RHTC & UHTC are owned & managed by the Institution (Dean) has been deleted. This is not permissible.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the college authorities wish to submit any compliance, the same should reach this Office, directly within one month along with supporting documentary evidence. Incomplete/ without proper documents, the compliance would not be entertained/ considered.

5. Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bathinda under Adesh University, Bathinda u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (01/09/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bathinda under Adesh University, Bathinda for Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (01/09/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bathinda under Adesh University, Bathinda u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17, because of the following facts:-

1. Principal was not available as she had gone abroad on personal work.
2. Data of faculty & Residents are not submitted.
3. Data of Units & teaching beds are not submitted.
4. OPD attendance on day of assessment was only 26.
5. Bed occupancy on day of assessment was 15% only.

6. Data of clinical material & laboratory & Radiological investigations are not submitted.
7. SAF & D.F of faculty & Residents were not provided.
8. On physical verification it was observed that Orthopaedics wards were not available as the beds shown were in the department of Surgery.
9. No Orthopaedics patient was found on beds.
10. No earmarked Orthopaedic O.T. is available.
11. Patients claimed to have been operated on previous day were not available in wards.
12. On verification it was found that 2 units of blood were given to those patients who were not available at all.
13. Physical verification of faculty was not done as they have not submitted the declaration forms.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

6. Starting of MD (Anaesthesia) course at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bathinda under Adesh University, Bathinda u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (01/09/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bathinda under Adesh University, Bathinda for Starting of MD (Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (01/09/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (Anaesthesia) course at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bathinda under Adesh University, Bathinda u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17, because of the following facts:-

1. Around 10:30 A.M., the Assessor was informed about arrival of Medical Superintendent and Principal. The Assessor reached the office of Principal and was informed that regular Principal was on leave and met officiating Principal. No attendance Register was provided by the staff of the college.
2. The OT list of the day from Acting Head of Anaesthesia Department was not made available. The OT list of Surgery, Ortho, ENT of previous day was given. On cross checking **No patient** as per OT list was available in respective wards. No admission or discharge paper was available in ward. All names in the OT list seemed to be bogus and fraudulent documents were made.
3. The Acting Head or other official did not provided the list of faculties or Declaration forms or the list of staff members of department of Anaesthesiology, so it was not possible to check about physical presence. The Assessor could meet only 2 faculty and one senior resident.
4. Pathology Department –It was informed that they have received and processed 23 samples for Histopathology on 31st August, 2015. On cross checking all were found to be bogus as no specimen was available, no such patients were in the ward or OPD. All the listed patients were shown as operated cases of major surgery so they should be in the ward on next day but no one was found. Only fake forms were available in the section.
5. Blood Bank – 7 units of blood was shown as issued to patients in surgery and GYN wards. On cross checking this was also found to be false claim as no such patients were admitted in the ward. The reason for blood transfusion was the major surgery so the patients should have been in the wards. This also seems to be false claims.
6. At 1:30 P.M., the Assessor was given a letter by acting Principal addressed to Secretary, MCI, informing that they are unable to provide the Declaration forms and other required documents in such short period.
7. Verification was not possible in absence of documents to be supplied by college.
8. During OPD rounds, the Assessor was not able to meet any faculties of Obstetrics and Gynaecology Department. Only one faculty of Orthopaedics was in OPD areas. He was unable to meet faculties from other operating departments.
9. Patient availability is very poor. ENT department had all fake patient; all of them were labourers of building construction in the campus.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. **Starting of MS (ENT) course at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bathinda under Adesh University, Bathinda u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (01/09/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bathinda under Adesh University, Bathinda for Starting of MS (ENT) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (01/09/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MS (ENT) course at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bathinda under Adesh University, Bathinda u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17, because of the following facts:-

1. Neither Professor nor Asso. Prof. are available; resultantly Unit is headed by Asst. Prof. & it cannot be considered as a teaching unit at all.
2. Bed occupancy on day of assessment is 10% only.
3. Data of clinical material of last 3 years were not provided.
4. With regard to 2 Asst. Prof., neither D.F. nor authentic joining report were provided. They do not know who is the Professor in the department.
5. There was NIL Senior & NIL Junior Resident.
6. Attendance register is not maintained properly.
7. The ward shown as ENT ward has 15 beds with fake patients; none of case sheets were shown.
8. BERA & OAE are not available.
9. No specialty clinics are run.
10. Monitors & Camera are shared by General Surgery & ENT departments.
11. On the day of assessment, bed occupancy was 10% and OPD was 50 only.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

8. Increase of seats in MD (Psychiatry) course at Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal under People's University, Bhanpur, Bhopal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (14/09/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal under People's University, Bhanpur, Bhopal for Increase of seats in MD (Psychiatry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14/09/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Psychiatry) course at Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal under People's University, Bhanpur, Bhopal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17, because of the following facts:-

1. On the day of Assessment, OPD was 70 and Bed occupancy was 70% only.
2. Three years investigative workload and blood consumption of department has been asked for but the authorities have provided that of entire hospital. This amounts to altering the SAF, which is not permissible.
3. Dr. (Brig.) MSK Raju will be retiring in February, 2016, before start of session. He has army service. No certificate from competent authority of the office of the Director General Armed Forces Medical Services giving details of his places of posting and designations as Graded, Classified Specialist and Advisor has been provided without which, his equated academic designations cannot be calculated. In his experience details, he has just stated Army Hospitals from which, it cannot be presumed that it was recognized hospital or not.
4. There is no Senior Resident in the department (as per faculty table).

5. There are only 2 research publications from the department in last 3 years. Remaining two appear to be review articles.
6. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 944 in 2012 to 864 in 2014.
7. Chronic Psychiatric care facility is not available.
8. In Departmental Library, total books are shown as 106 while the number of books purchased in last 3 years is shown as 165 which is not feasible. There is Data mismatch.
9. EEG machine is installed in Physiology & not in this department.
10. Academic parameters like Journal Club (16/year), Group Discussions (15/year) are inadequate.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

9. Re-Starting of MS (Anatomy) course at Government Medical College, Srinagar under University of Kashmir u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (05/10/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Government Medical College, Srinagar under University of Kashmir for Re-Starting of MS (Anatomy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

7. Total IPD of 2014 were 2419 and total Major + Minor operations (excluding day care) were 2425. It is not feasible. There must be some patients admitted, who did not require surgeries. Data is non-genuine.

Gupta cannot be given teaching experience of these hospitals. Resultantly, whole edifice on which his subsequent appointments are built collapses and he cannot be considered as Professor & HoD.
3. Designation of Dr. Vijay Grover is not in accordance with MCI Regulations. He could not be given teaching experience of period for which he worked as Senior Research Associate (from 1998 to 2005 as shown in faculty table).
4. In view of above, there is no Professor in the department.
5. There are no Senior Residents. Explanation of the institute that non-academic Senior Residents are not recruited in Super specialty departments cannot be accepted.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 29/09/2015 from the Under Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, new Delhi forwarding therewith the request of the Registrar, People's University, Bhopal with regard to change of University from Barkatullah University to People's University, Bhopal and decided that the College authorities be advised to apply u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 through Central Govt. when the first batch admitted under Peoples' University appears in respective PG University examination under Peoples' University. Transfer only those degrees, which are already recognized under Barkatullah University. Specify the number of seats and year of recognition.

70. No Uniformity in the duration of Practical Exams amongst the college for the disciplines.

Read: the matter with regard to uniformity in the duration of practical exams amongst the colleges for various disciplines.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to uniformity in the duration of practical exams amongst the colleges for various disciplines and noted the following:

- (1) Microbiology practical examination be kept for 3 days as interpretation of culture growth would require minimum 48 hours.
- (2) Pathology practical examination be kept for 2 days in view of preparation of slides, specimens, etc.
- (3) Community Medicine practical examination be kept for 2 days as examination of long case involves family visit to home which consumes a lot of time on 1st day of examination.

Hence, no change.

71. Change of nomenclature from M.D. (Radio-Therapy) to M.D. (Radiation Oncology).

Read: the letter dated 06/02/2015 received from the Secretary General, AROI, Association of Radiation Oncologist of India with regard to change of nomenclature from M.D. (Radio-Therapy) to M.D. (Radiation Oncology).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 06/02/2015 received from the Secretary General, AROI, Association of Radiation Oncologist of India with regard to change of nomenclature from M.D. (Radio-Therapy) to M.D. (Radiation Oncology) and noted that while Medical Oncology & Surgical Oncology are super-speciality courses leading to D.M. & M.Ch. respectively, Radiotherapy is a broad-speciality course leading to M.D. and therefore in this regard cannot be equated with super-speciality courses.

Prepare Minimum Standard requirements, specially Teacher eligibility Qualifications and experience, training details, examination details etc. and a comprehensive proposal can only be considered.

72. Requirement of Electron Microscopy in JSS Medical College, Hospital.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 23/09/2015 received from the Principal, JSS Medical College, Mysore with regard to requirement of Electron Microscopy in JSS Medical College, Mysore and decided to refer the matter to the Academic Committee.

73. Amendment in PG Regulations – regarding.

Read: the letter dated 08/10/2015 received from Mr. B.P. Sharma, Secretary, Government of India, Department of Health & Family Welfare, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to amendment in PG Regulations, 2000, proposed by MCI to effect that no college should be considered for further increase of PG seats unless it is recognized for the existing number of seats.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 08/10/2015 received from Mr. B.P. Sharma, Secretary, Government of India, Department of Health & Family Welfare, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to amendment in PG Regulations, 2000, proposed by MCI to effect that no college should be considered for further increase of PG seats unless it is recognized for the existing number of seats.

The matter was referred to the Academic Committee with the following observations:

1. PG seats are unrelated to the U.G. seats and there is no co-relation between the two. In many Institutions PG seats are more than UG seats and some of the Institutions are running only PG courses.
2. To maintain standard of Postgraduate Medical Education, it will not be in the larger interest of medical education to relax the present teacher : student ratio. If done, in many of the departments, the number of doctors at a given time will be almost equal to the total patients admitted in that department and there will be much overcrowding.

74. Approval of minutes of the Monitoring Sub-Committee meetings held on 29/06/2015 & 20/07/2015- Regarding.

Read: the minutes of the Monitoring Sub-Committee meetings held on 29/06/2015 and 20/07/2015.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee observed that there are discrepancy in the number of seats permitted by MCI and shown in our website and actual number of students being admitted by the college authorities. Most of them are Government colleges and admissions are going on for a very long time. The P.G. Section should prepare a table as given below (after updating our records/ website). If required, the Dean may be summoned to MCI office with all relevant documents to reconcile the number of seats & faculty available at present. Dr. Seema Madan and Mr. Kanhaiya to look after this work and put up in next meeting so that further action can be planned.

In above view of matter, it was decided to approve opinion of Law officer and hence, it was decided to return the applications to Central Govt. recommending disapproval of scheme in clinical subjects. In pre and para clinical subjects, the applications be processed.

83. Request for enhanced seats in various PG courses at Banaras Hindu University, Institute of Medical Sciences, Varanasi – regarding.

Read: the letter dated 15/07/2015 received from the Director, Banaras Hindu University, Institute of Medical Sciences, Varanasi with regard to enhanced seats in various PG courses at Banaras Hindu University, Institute of Medical Sciences, Varanasi along with the opinion of the Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 15/07/2015 received from the Director, Banaras Hindu University, Institute of Medical

Sciences, Varanasi with regard to enhanced seats in various PG courses at Banaras Hindu University, Institute of Medical Sciences, Varanasi along with the opinion of the Law Officer and made the following observations:

1. The Increase has been given to the tune of 53%, whereas, the recommendation from Government of India was for 27% increase (existing seats 88 increased 46). In some subjects, the increase is 100%, whereas, in other there is no increase.
2. The Institute has not attached Letter of Permission from Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, which they were supposed to obtain.
3. In the letter it is said that increase will be in MBBS as well as in PG seats but the Institution has not increased the MBBS seats.
4. One of the conditions in HRD Ministry's letter was phasing of expansion capacity in order to ensure that seats available in the unreserved category are not reduced. Have the institution expanded their capacity to accommodate the increased seats (whether necessary increase in faculty and infrastructure has been done) by now since, seven years have passed.

In view of above, the Committee decided that the institute be directed to provide clarification on the above issues and provide copy of LoP for increased seats issued by the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi. Till then, the item is deferred.

1. Gynaecological OPD is only 27 on day of assessment. Average of random days is only 26 which is inadequate.
2. There was NIL Major & NIL Minor Gynaecological operation on day of assessment.
3. Bed occupancy of both Obstetrics & Gynaecology divisions is shown as 85%; however total bed occupancy is shown as 88% which is not feasible. There is data mismatch.
4. Services like Prenatal diagnosis, Oncology are not available.
5. CT & MRI are outsourced.
6. Total number of Histopathology samples sent has not been provided.
7. OPD/ IPD, Major Operations, Minor operations data of last 3 years given on page 2 (sl. No. 7) & page 27 (sl. 10) does not tally, which indicate, the data is non-genuine.
8. Last year total births in the hospital were 2427. However, total deliveries + caesarean sections were 1851. This is not feasible and data mismatch.
9. Dr. Nimesh Pandey, Profesor, Unit-II, no details of teaching experience given in faculty table.

10. Dr. Sameer Aghera, Senior Resident, Unit-II with DNB qualification is not eligible. He has no 3 years experience at the time of appointment. Resultantly, there is no Senior Resident in Unit-II
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. At § 9 in Part II on P. 30, OPD on day of assessment is shown as 110 while at § 6 in Summary on P. 3, it is shown as 281. There is data mismatch.
4. CT & MRI are outsourced.
5. Promotion of Dr. Nishant Pujara, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years 7 months against the requirement of 5 years. 3 Articles cited are all review articles and not research publications. Consequently, there is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-I.
6. Dr. Anand Choudhary, Assoc. Professor, Unit-II, promoted on 14/08/2015, after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations. His publications cited are all review articles.
7. College got first LoP on 13/07/2009. Dr. Kashyap Buch has been given experience from 23/02/2009, which is not permissible. Resultantly, he was Asst. Professor for 4 years 6 months against the requirement of 5 years. His promotion is not as per Regulations and he cannot be accepted as Assoc. Professor.
8. Dr. Vinayak Chauhan, Assoc. Professor was promoted on 14/08/2015 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations. His 3 articles cited are all review articles and not research publications and cannot be accepted.
9. Dr. Dinesh Dave, Assoc. Professor was promoted on 09/06/2015 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations. Out of the 2 publications cited, one is a case report, which cannot be considered.
10. Dr. Sachi Thakur with DNB qualification is not eligible. She has no 3 years teaching experience at the time of appointment.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Promotion of Dr. Navubha Soda is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years 11 months against the requirement of 5 years. His period prior to first LoP cannot be counted.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

12. Dr. Satyajit Singh, Senior Resident with DNB qualification is not eligible. He has no 3 years experience at the time of appointment.
13. There was no death during the last one year in the department, which indicate that no serious trauma patients are admitted without which, the training of PG students will be inadequate.
14. No back volumes of foreign journals prior to 2015 are available.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.
