The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 19th March, 2015.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

The Principal, Narayana Medical College, Nellore, Andhra Pradesh appeared in person and explained that their first candidate admitted to DLO course left without completing the course. When 2nd candidate appeared next year, the college did not apply for inspection. The 3rd candidate also left midway and that was the reason for delay in getting recognition inspection done for DLO. The Committee decided to consider their report on merits.

The Dean, Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad along with the Heads of the departments of Anaesthesia, Pathology and Forensic Medicine appeared in person and explained that their college got first LOP in 1992 and not in 2005 which date was inadvertently mentioned by them by mistake. They produced the first LOP in original. Consequently, the experience given by them prior to 2005 is in order. The Post Graduate Medical Education Committee decided to consider their report on merits.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (18/02/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad (Gujarat) under Sardar Patel University, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Subir Ghosh, Assoc. Professor has been given teaching experience from 08/08/2007 to 05/12/2009 and from 05/12/2009 to 03/02/2010 at S.B.K.S. Medical College, Wagodia, when this college is not having any permission for DM (Cardiology) during this period.
2. Dr. Mahima A. Chhajer, Asst. Professor has passed DNB from Non-Teaching Hospital in 2010. She has no post DNB teaching experience at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor. Hence, she is not eligible for appointment as Asst. Professor.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Starting of DM (Neurology) course at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad (Gujarat) under Sardar Patel University, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (13/02/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad (Gujarat) under Sardar Patel University, Gujarat for Starting of DM (Neurology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (13/02/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of DM (Neurology) course at Pramukhswami Medical College,

Karamsad (Gujarat) under Sardar Patel University, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Associate Professor, Dr. A.G. Vaishnav does not have any teaching experience in a medical college/institute in India. His experience is in American colleges not recognized by MCI.
2. Assistant Professor, Dr. Mukesh Sharma was not available for verification as he was absent on Inspection Day.
3. Resultantly, Faculty complement is incomplete.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. **Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23/02/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (23/02/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2015-2016 from 1(One) to 2(Two) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

6. **Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23/02/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (23/02/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Gokul Nath, Professor & HoD passed DM in 1994. His experience as Asst. Professor from 1982 to 1984 and Assoc. Professor from 1990 to 1992 cannot be counted. Command Hospital, Air Force, Bangalore does not have independent department of Nephrology with permission for DM

- (Nephrology). He has been shown as Advisor in Medicine and Nephrology, both, which is not permissible.
2. The department of Nephrology was started in October, 2014. Dr. Harsh Babu, Assoc. Professor has been given experience from 2007 to 2010 as Asst. Professor and from 2010 to till date as Assoc. Professor which is not permissible. Hence, his experience cannot be counted and he is not eligible.
 3. Dr. Girish Varkani, Asst. Professor passed DNB from Non-Teaching Institution. He has no 3 years teaching experience at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor. Hence, he is not eligible.
 4. Clinical material is inadequate.
 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. Starting of M.Ch. (Surgical Gastroenterology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23/02/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of M.Ch. (Surgical Gastroenterology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (23/02/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of M.Ch. (Surgical Gastroenterology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. On random checking to verify regularity of faculty, it was observed that Dr. Ramchandra Naidu was found to be not regular. His name was not found in the operation register. There is no local address proof. He stays in Kurnool which is 350 kms. away. Hence he cannot be considered as a faculty.
2. Dr. A.K. Pujahari, Professor & HOD, is shown to have acquired M.D. & then training in Surgical Gastroenterology, which is not permissible.
3. Dr. A.K. Pujahari, Professor & HoD has no M.Ch. qualification and no certificate of special training. Command Hospital, Bangalore does not have independent department of Surgical Gastroenterology and permission for M.Ch. Hence, not recognized for special training.
4. No Certificate of experience has been attached that Dr. Ashwini Kumar worked in Surgical Gastroenterology in Command Hospital, Bangalore and AFMC, Pune. His experience as Asst. Professor is prior to his period of training, which cannot be counted.
5. There is only one faculty with M.Ch. qualification which is not as per requirements.
6. Dr. Kottapalli Dilip Chakravarty, Asst. Prof., is M.D. He has acquired fellowship in HPB Surgery Liver Transplantation from Taiwan which is not recognized qualification.
7. Resultantly, faculty complement is inadequate.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

8. Starting of DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (02/03/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (02/03/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. No information has been provided about the open Heart Surgeries done after start of independent department of Cardiac Anaesthesia.
2. None of the Faculty Members have the Super Speciality Qualification.
3. All Faculty Members have been given special training in their own Institution, which does not have any permission for DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia). Hence, their training cannot be considered.
4. Major Surgeries have been shown as 751, 1626 and 3360 in the year 2012, 2013 and 2014, respectively on page 19 of the SAF but on page 75 of the SAF they have been shown as 71, 168 and 76 in the year 2012, 2013 and 2014 respectively. This is a data Mismatch.
5. There are no research publications from the department in last 3 years in indexed journals.
6. There is no thromboelastography facility available.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

9. Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Urology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (20/02/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Urology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (20/02/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Urology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There are no research publications from the department in last 3 years in indexed journals.
2. As per Nephrology Report, Clinical Material, specially, Renal Transplant is grossly inadequate.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

10. Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (20/02/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (20/02/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Present clinical material i.e. OPD & IPD is sufficient to train to existing students. It has to be increased so that all candidates get sufficient clinical material for hands on training.
2. There is low exposure to management of Acute MI cases (primary Angioplasty).
3. List of 3 papers was given to assessor but further details of publications were not provided. It cannot be verified how many research publications in indexed journals have been published.
4. Dr. Vijay Sai Chowdekar is DNB from Non-Teaching Institution. He has no 3 years Teaching Experience at the time of his appointment as Asst. Professor.
5. Dr. Avanthi Anurag, Asst. Professor is DNB from Non-Teaching Institution. She has no 3 years Teaching Experience at the time of her appointment as Asst. Professor.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

11. Starting of DM (Clinical Haematology) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (25/02/2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar for Starting of DM (Clinical Haematology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (25/02/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of DM (Clinical Haematology) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. None of the Faculty members have Super Speciality Qualification or Certificate of Special Training for 2 years from a Recognized Institution. Their Training Certificate, issued at the Local Level have already been rejected by the Council at the time of last Assessment.
2. Dr. Upendra Nayak, has already crossed the age of 70 years. Hence, he cannot be considered.

3. Appointment Orders of all these Faculty Members from the Government in the subject of Clinical Haematology have not been provided.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. RICU is not available.

4. The department is left with only 2 Faculty.

2. Retrospective change in designation and promotion dates is not allowed. As per Faculty Table signed by Assessor and Dean, Professor K.P. Balraj is Asst. Professor from May, 1994 to June, 1997 and with those dates, his promotion was irregular.
3. As per Faculty Table signed by Assessor and Dean, Dr. Yogita C. was Senior Resident from April, 2005 to January, 2007 at St. John's Hospital and accordingly, her promotion is not as per Regulations.
4. As per the list supplied, there are 17 Faculty Members against the requirement of 18 for 6 Units.
5. Unit-VI has only 2 Faculty. Hence, it cannot be considered as a Teaching Unit.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned seats. 1. Laboratories are still under renovation. Separate UG, PG & Research laboratories are not available.
2. RHTC Palghar is 100 km. away which is not as per Regulations.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The seats were permitted in 2009 and still not recognized.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee is of the considered opinion that the failure on the part of your Institution to timely rectify the deficiencies show that the standard of Postgraduate medical education is not maintained in your Institute and therefore, you are called upon to submit the reply as to why directions for stoppage of admissions in Postgraduate Courses (Social & Preventive Medicine/Community Medicine) be not issued from academic year 2015-2016.

The reply to this Show-Cause must reach to the office of the Council within a period of 15 days from the issue of the Notice failing which the Council may decide the matter on the basis of available material.

5. Central Library: Librarian is not available.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08.01.2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May.2014) and Compliance dated 05.10.2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS (Orthopeadices) qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Santhiram Medical College, Nandyal because of the following facts:-

1. Instruments are procured on case to case basis from implant manufacturers. Available total knee instrumentation is outdated.
2. Departmental library: It consists of a single cupboard with multiple copies of a few books. Some of them are not relevant.
3. Surgical ICU: It has no proper sterility protocol, gown, drape & mask in place. It does not look like or function as ICU. None of patients looked like requiring ICU care.
4. On day of assessment, at 2:30 p.m., MRD gave attendance of 129 but male OPD register had only 12 entries & female had only 34 patients & about 10 cases were waiting. Total tally cannot exceed 60 -70 which is inadequate. Bulk of OPD patients were of joint pain & shoulder pain which is not good teaching material. Hip cases were not seen much while scanning OPD registers.
5. Preoperative cases in wards were few - < 10. Two wards were full of patients having complaints of cervical spondylosis, osteoarthritis knee, low back pain, frozen shoulder, all being admitted during 5th - 7th January 2015 (i.e. 1-3 days before assessment). Few patients were admitted recently almost 2 months after surgery for physiotherapy.
6. On day of assessment, no Minor cases were posted. Major cases posted were inconsequential debridements which cannot be classified as major. There were 2 Minor cases which were not verifiable.
7. Office space: The rooms were recently painted. There are 2 rooms for 5 Asst. Prof. with only a chair & table and no view boxes, no stationery, no cupboards suggesting rooms are occupied. HOD room had unkempt toilet doubting it was used.
8. All publications are in inhouse journal. There are no publications from the department in outside indexed journals.

9. THR & TKR facilities are available in the form of elementary basic Indian hip instrumentation without acetabular reamers & outdated knee system instrumentation. Power system is corded electrical & may not be suitable.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. There is only 1 research publication from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years. Rest are case reports.
6. No journal is available after 2013.
7. Central research laboratory is not available.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (24.05.2014) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Pediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Sri Siddhartha University, Tumkur in respect of students being trained at Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur because of the following facts:-

1. Bed occupancy on day of assessment was 50 %.
2. On day of assessment, there were only 10 children waiting in OPD between 10:30 – 11:00 a.m.
3. Waste segregation on site and knowledge & use of aseptic precautions are highly inadequate.
4. In PICU, Ventilator was not used even once in the last year indicating quality of patients admitted in PICU. There is only 1 working Monitor.
5. Dialysis facility is not available.
6. In Labour room, Resuscitation kit & Monitor were not available at site.
7. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned seats. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 17/12/2014 received from the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the representation of the Registrar, Mangalore University, Mangalore with regard to recognition of PG Medical Degree/ Diploma of Father Muller Medical College, Mangalore under Mangalore University by the Medical Council of India in the 1st Schedule of the IMC Act, 1956 along with the report of the Sub-Committee and decided that the report of the Sub-Committee be accepted. 4. Dr. Shyam Iqbal, Asst. Professor passed DNB Urology in 2003 from Non-Teaching Institute. He has no Teaching Experience prior to appointment as Asst. Professor. Hence, he cannot be considered as Asst. Professor. Consequently, there is only 1 Faculty in the department.
5. No Urodynamics, no Lithotripsy
6. No Renal Transplant.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

131. Increase of seats in DM(Cardiology) course at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow under Chhatrapati Shahu ji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Assessment Report (26th March 2015) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow under Chhatrapati Shahu ji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow for Increase of seats in DM(Cardiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

In that College there is no department of Cardiology and no DM Course. Hence, his experience cannot be considered. Consequently, he is not eligible to hold the post of Professor.
2. There is no Stress Thelium equipment.
3. The Statistician is honorary, which cannot be considered.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Dr. Ajay Kumar Singh has his experience as A.P. at Rama Medical College, Kanpur and Mamata Medical College, Khammam, where there is no separate department of Neurology and no DM Neurology course. Hence, their experience cannot be counted.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

133. Starting of M.Ch.(Paediatric Sugery) course at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Aligarh under Aligarh Muslim University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

134. Starting of DM(Endocrinology) course at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Aligarh under Aligarh Muslim University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (24/03/2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. The outpatient volume of new cases is less than adequate. There are only 5-8 new patients seen in OPD, rest being old follow up cases.
2. There is progressive decline in the volume of procedures from 2010-2011 onwards with only increase in coronary intervention and reduction in most of other procedures.
3. Present case mix does not give adequate exposure to PG students to all varieties of Cardiac disorders. For example, Treadmill tests are done only as a part of executive health check up. Hence students are unlikely to get to evaluate and prognosticate other cardiac disorders. Number of Holter recording & transoesophageal echocardiography is low. Some procedures like pacemaker implants are performed only 1-2/month which would not give enough exposure to students.
4. Maintenance of equipment is inadequate.
5. There are only 2 research publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Average daily OPD is only 23.
2. There is no professor.
3. The only Unit is headed by Dr. V. Srilatha, Asso. Prof. which is not permissible.
4. Dr. A. Siva Nagendra Reddy, Asst. Prof. is currently working in Guntur Medical College and therefore cannot be considered as a faculty in this institute.
5. Resultantly, faculty complement is incomplete in the only Unit.
6. There is no space for Residents in the OPD.
7. Clerical staff is not available.
8. Immunofluorescent & Electron Microscopy examination are outsourced.
9. There is only 1 publication from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
10. There is no Senior Resident.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Committee decided to issue notice to Dr. A. Shiva Nagendra Reddy that how he appeared for Assessment in this College, when he is currently working in the Medical College, Guntur.

139. Starting of DM (Neonatology) course at JJM Medical College, Davangere under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

1. The service certificates of 2 Professors show their experience in the department of General Surgery & not in Neurosurgery; hence they do not possess adequate teaching experience in Neurosurgery to hold the post.
2. Resultantly, there is no Professor or Asso. Prof. in the only Unit. Faculty complement is incomplete.
3. Principal was on leave on day of assessment.
4. There is no Senior Resident.
5. Average daily OPD is only 20.
6. Average bed occupancy is 60 %.
7. Number of average daily Major operations is only 1 & Minor operations is NIL.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2015-2016 restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.
