The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence, was received from Dr. (Mrs.) Rani Bhaskaran, Member.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 30th & 31st January, 2015 were confirmed in the meeting itself.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee resolved that a letter should be sent to all those colleges whose assessment for Recognition of seats in different department u/s 11(2) have not been found satisfactory but the College Authorities have not yet submitted compliance. The College Authorities should be asked to submit compliance within 6 weeks. As per provisions, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

3. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MS(Anatomy) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Bidar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bidar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Anatomy) qualification for 02 seats at Bidar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bidar granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Anatomy) qualification for 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Bidar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bidar because of the following facts:-

1. Two Tutors have been appointed in Physiology & Pharmacology but have been deputed in Anatomy on 12/11/2014 – i.e. day of assessment. Resultantly, there is deficiency of Faculty: (a) Tutors: 1.
2. Special laboratories like Embryology, Genetics are not available.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned seats. As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

4. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification for 03 seats at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Physiology) qualification for 03(Three) seats granted by Dr. NTR

University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon, which the Teaching Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

5. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of DCP qualifications for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DCP qualifications for 03 seats at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DCP qualifications for 03(Three) seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon, which the Teaching Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

6. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital Air Force, Bangalore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 3 seats at Command Hospital Air Force, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 1(One) to 3(Three) seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital Air Force, Bangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon, which the Teaching Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

7. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Renewal of recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification & DPM qualification for 01 seat each in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification & DPM qualification for 01 seat each at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification & DPM qualification for 01 seat each granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad because of the following facts:-

1. No stipend is paid to Residents. The plea of the Teaching Institute that it is not paid as per the prospectus of Dr. NTR Health University cannot be accepted because instructions in a prospectus cannot prevail over Statutory Regulations Notified in the Gazette of India.
2. Average daily OPD of randomly selected days is only 56.
3. Speciality clinics like Senile Disorders clinic, Psychomotor clinic are not existent.
4. Community Psychiatry Helpline is not available.
5. Facilities for Acute care & Chronic care are not available.
6. Academic parameters like Theory classes (12 in number) are inadequate.
7. Promotion of Dr. Arifuddin Ahmed, is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years without any publications.
8. The Recognition Assessment was for MD as well as DPM but no candidate appeared for DPM examination. Hence, it cannot be recognized.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

8. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being

trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad because of the following facts:-

1. No stipend is paid to Residents. The plea of the Teaching Institute that it is not paid as per the prospectus of Dr. NTR Health University cannot be accepted because instructions in a prospectus cannot prevail over Statutory Regulations Notified in the Gazette of India.
2. OPD on the day of Assessment was only 108.
3. Bed occupancy on the day of Assessment was 69%. Daily average is 70%, which is inadequate.
4. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic clinic, Urology clinic, etc. are looked after by respective departments. Participation of Faculty & Residents of General Surgery in these clinics is not clear.
5. Academic parameters like Seminars (11 in number), Journal Club (12 in number), Case Presentation (14 in number) are inadequate.
6. No publications from the department.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

9. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad because of the following facts:-

1. There were only 2 major operations on the day of Assessment, which is inadequate.
2. No stipend is paid to Residents. The plea of the Teaching Institute that it is not paid as per the prospectus of Dr. NTR Health University cannot be accepted because instructions in a prospectus cannot prevail over Statutory Regulations Notified in the Gazette of India.
3. Academic performance is average.
4. There is a decline in IPD, Caesarean Section from 2012 to 2013.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek

timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

10. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Renewal of recognition of DCH qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DCH qualification for 02 seats at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of DCH qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad because of the following facts:-

1. No stipend is paid to Residents. The plea of the Teaching Institute that it is not paid as per the prospectus of Dr. NTR Health University cannot be accepted because instructions in a prospectus cannot prevail over Statutory Regulations Notified in the Gazette of India.
2. Speciality clinics like Paediatric Haematology, Paediatric Endocrinology, Thalassemia are not available.
3. HIV related services are not available.
4. Equipment like Upper GI Endoscope, Dialysis machine are not available.
5. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (13 in number), Group Discussions (14 in number) are inadequate.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

11. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at GSL Medical College, Rajahmundry.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats at GSL Medical College, Rajahmundry granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(General Surgery) qualification for 04(Four) seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at GSL Medical College, Rajahmundry be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of

Notification upon, which the Teaching Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

12. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats and D. Ortho qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at GSL Medical College, Rajahmundry.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats and D. Ortho qualification for 02 seats at GSL Medical College, Rajahmundry granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats and D. Ortho qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at GSL Medical College, Rajahmundry because of the following facts:-

1. Four Professors, Dr. Satya Prasad, Dr. M.V. Ramana Rao, Dr. Lanka Raman Rao, Dr. K.V.S. Subba Rao, 1 Asso. Prof. Dr. N.V. Narsimha Rao & 1 Asst. Prof. Dr. G. Aravindam could not be verified, working full time from hospital record (although they claimed so).
2. Whether Faculty was teaching UG & PG students could not be verified from hospital record.
3. Bed occupancy on the day of Assessment is 70%, which is inadequate.
4. Speciality clinics like Spine Clinic, Arthroplasty clinic, Hand clinic are not existent.
5. Dr. Gandhi Arivandam, Asst. Professor was absent on the day of Assessment. Consequently, there are only 2 Faculty in Unit-II, which cannot be considered as a PG Unit.
6. Dr. A.B. Rajendra, Asst. Professor, DNB, Ortho is not eligible because he has no 3 years teaching experience, prior to appointment as Asst. Professor. Consequently, Unit-III is left with 2 Faculty. Hence, it cannot be considered as a PG Unit.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

13. Guru Nanak Dev University - Recognition of MD(Sports Medicine) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Sports Medicine) qualification for 01 seat at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar granted by Guru Nanak Dev University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2014) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Sports Medicine) qualification for 01 seat granted by Guru Nanak Dev University in respect of students being trained at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar because of the following facts:-

1. Designated Professor Dr. J.S. Sindhu is away on deputation to Govt. of India; resultantly the department is headed by Dr. Shweta Shenoy, Asso. Prof., which is not as per the Regulations.
2. There are no Senior Residents.
3. Both Asso. Prof. are non-medical teachers having Ph.D. qualification; resultantly there is no medical teacher in the department.
4. One of the hospital with, which attachment is claimed is Fortis Escorts Hospital, Amritsar, which is a non-teaching hospital.
5. There were only 3 Examiners against the requirement of 4 and all from Amritsar, which is not permissible.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

14. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 6 seats in respect of students being trained at Katuri Medical College, Guntur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 6 seats at Katuri Medical College, Guntur granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 6 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Katuri Medical College, Guntur because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Rajaramesh, Professor, Unit-II is not as per the Regulations. He has not been Assoc. Professor for 4 years as per the requirement of Regulations.
2. Promotion of Dr. N. Ravindranath Tagore, Professor, Unit-III is not as per the Regulations. He has not been Asst. Professor for 5 years and Assoc. Professor for 4 years as required in the Regulations without any publications.
3. There is a decline in IPD during the preceding 3 years.
4. No reference, to any of the publications (except one) have been provided, without which, they cannot be accepted as publications.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage

of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

15. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Katuri Medical College, Guntur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats at Katuri Medical College, Guntur granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Katuri Medical College, Guntur because of the following facts:-

1. LASER for scar revision is not available.
2. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (20 in number), Group Discussions (20 in number) are inadequate.
3. No full reference to any publication have been given. Hence, they cannot be accepted as Publications.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

16. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 08 to 12 seats in respect of students being trained at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 08 to 12 seats at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. There is no attendance Register maintained in the department for any staff. Assessor was told that there is a common Register in Principal's office, which was not shown to him even on repeated requests.
2. Pathology staff list for posting to different sections is not maintained.
3. Museum has only 131 specimens, which are haphazardly arranged with lot of dust. Many specimens did not have label. They are not arranged systemwise. E.g. specimen of Spleen is kept in male genital system,

Hydatid cyst in soft tissue tumour, Thyroid in female genital system, Hydronephrosis in female genital system, etc. There are no catalogues. No Faculty is given charge of museum.

4. Histopathology: For 2014, 3969 specimens are recorded; but on checking Registers, it was observed that many in between numbers were missing throughout. E.g. the order of request is 2494 -> 2505, 2506, 2507, 2508->2518 -> 2520 ->2542-> 2544, 2545 -> 2554 -> 2556 -> 2558 -> 2560, 2561 -> 2566 -> 2568 -> 2590, 2591, 2592, 2593 - > 2601. Many of these requests had similar handwriting. When slides and blocks were checked randomly for reports, many were missing.
5. Cytology: Cytology Register had entries but no clinicians' requests were found. All PAP reports entered in a single line without any description. When asked for slides, very few were available.
6. Haematology: Workload is not what is shown. There are no requests from clinicians, even for Haemograms, No reports maintained in the department except for a common Register where there is no detailed report, only abbreviations are written like N/N. Almost all the reports were N/N.
7. No Pathological Autopsy, including Perinatal, are performed. No Register is maintained.
8. Blood bank is not under Pathology. 93 blood Units are discarded, which is a big number. Only 580 Units – i.e. 1.5/day – were issued in a year.
9. PG Teaching programme: No PG posting list was shown. No separate Register for different teaching programmes is maintained. Most of the entries are freshly done without signature of HoD. Most of the entries are done by a single person at a stretch. Most of teaching programmes were attended by 1-2 Faculty; however, when Xerox copy was asked for, many staff signatures were added on the pages. List of discussion slides was not shown. There is no Seminar Register.
10. Facilities for Frozen Section & Immunohistochemistry are not available.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. 3. Total Hip & Knee replacement instrument sets are not present but provided by the company on the day of operation.
4. There is no EMG machine in the department. Investigation facilities like nerve conduction, etc. are not available.
5. Hand Clinic is not existent.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

6. Dr. A. Ravindra (Professor), Dr. P. Rajarami Reddy (Asst. Prof.) & Dr. G. Bindu Madhavi cannot be considered as teachers due to reasons mentioned in the report.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Bed Occupancy was 49%.
4. Dr. Prasanna Kumari C., Assoc. Professor, Unit-I has been shown as Lecturer prior to obtaining Postgraduate Degree, which is not permissible. Her promotion is not as per Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 6 months against the requirement of 5 years. Consequently, there is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-I.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (12 in number), Journal Clubs (11 in number), Group Discussions (12 in number) are inadequate.
5. There is only 1 publication from the department in Indexed Journals in preceding 3 years.
6. Cryostat is not available.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

2. One of the external examiners is from the same State – Col (Dr) S.K. Malani from AFMC, Pune.
3. There is wide variation in salary structure of the Faculty within the cadre as well as between cadres. Dr. R. Rathod, Professor & HoD is drawing salary Rs. 49, 000 – Rs. 71, 613 p.m. while Dr. V.D. Chavan, Professor is drawing Rs. 1, 00, 000 p.m. Dr. V.K. Verma, Asso. Prof. is drawing Rs. 49, 000 p.m. while Dr. S.R. Kalekar, Asst. Prof. is drawing Rs. 50, 000 p.m.
4. Nothing is mentioned in the report about stipend being paid to Residents.
5. Faculty Table has not been provided.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. The Teaching Institute is paying stipend of Rs. 25, 000; Rs. 27.000 & Rs. 30, 000 p.m. to I/II/III year Residents, which is less than that paid by Govt. of Maharashtra to I/II/III year Residents.
2. Academic parameters like Journal Club (15 in number), Theory Classes (22 in number) are inadequate.
3. 2 Senior Residents, Dr. Jinay Gala and Dr. Dattaray More are not eligible. They have no 3 years teaching experience before their appointment.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or

1. PG students are going to Govt. Mortuary, Dehradun for witnessing and assisting post-mortem examination.
2. There is no Forensic related work output like examination for sexual offence,s, age estimation, pregnancy certification, etc. from the department. No medico-legal case has been brought to the department.
3. Institute is paying stipend of Rs. 10, 000; Rs. 11, 000 & Rs. 12, 000 p.m. to I/II/III year Residents respectively while Govt. of Uttarakhand is paying stipend of Rs. 34, 000; Rs. 38, 000 & Rs. 42, 000 p.m. to I/II/III year Residents respectively. This is contrary to provisions of Regulation 13.3 of PG medical Regulations, 2000 as amended.
4. No post-mortem has been carried out by the Faculty.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. 1. There is no Asso. Professor in the only Unit; resultantly Faculty complement is incomplete in the only Unit.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

56. SRM University, Chennai - Recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at SRM Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Kancheepuram.

Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon, which the Teaching Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

57. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 07 seats in respect of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (December, 2014) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 07 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai because of the following facts:-

1. Assessment for Recognition of 4 to 7 seats was done on 16/12/2014, since, the College had intimated this as the Examination date. However, in the

SAF, it has been stated that conduct and Standard of examination not applicable. Part-III of SAF pertaining to the conduct of examination has been crossed, which mean there was no examination. This highly objectionable.

2. Unit 2 has only 2 Faculty; resultantly it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Shortage of Senior resident: 1.
4. Dr. Reena Wani, shown as Asso. Prof. on establishment of this college has been transferred to Cooper Hospital Medical College on 15/11/2014; hence, she cannot be considered as Faculty of this college.
5. There are no publications from the department in Indexed Journals in preceding 3 years.
6. There is no place for museum in the department. Space is allocated in Ward 5; however, specimens are borrowed from Anatomy/Pathology as and when required.
7. Instruments like USG machine, Colposcope & Hysteroscope are not in working order.
8. Services like Prenatal diagnosis are not available.
9. Academic parameters like Clinical seminar (only 4), Journal Club (only 6), Case presentation (only 8), Group Discussions (10 in number) are grossly inadequate.
10. On the day of Assessment OPD 63, Major Operations 2, Minor Operations 2, Caesarean Section 2, which is grossly inadequate.
11. There is a decline in OPD, IPD, Major Operations & Minor Operations and deliveries from 2012 to 2013.
12. No experience, details of many staff members has been given in Faculty Table (Page 2).
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

1. Deficiency of Faculty: (a) Tutor: 1.

2. Departmental Research Laboratory is not available.
3. Capacity of practical laboratories for UG students is less.
4. Equipment like Spirometry, PFTs, Peak Flow Meter, Autonomic Function Tests, EEG, EMG, Nerve Conduction are not available. Yoga laboratory is not available.
5. Academic parameters like Journal Club (only 9), Group Discussions (only 11) are inadequate.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

2. Resultantly, out of 6 Units, there is only 1 Unit, which has Faculty complement complete for a PG Unit.
3. No details of Senior residents are given in the Faculty table.
4. Both the external Examiners – Dr. S.T. Nabar & Dr. T.V. Kamble are from the same State of Maharashtra, which is not as per the Regulations.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided to write to the Assessor for giving Report contrary to the facts.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 01(One) seat granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, salem in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 01(One) to 02(Two) seats granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, salem in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon, which the Teaching Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

1. The Teaching Institute is paying stipend of Rs. 6, 900 p.m.; Rs. 7, 300 p.m. & Rs. 7, 750 p.m. to I/II/III year Residents respectively, which is less than that paid by Govt. of Gujarat to I/II/III year Residents and is contrary to Section 13.3 of PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

77. C.S.J.M. University, Kanpur - Recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine/Community Medicine) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at U.P. Rural Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Etawah.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (3rd & 4th December, 2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (27-28/05/2014) and compliance dated 26/08/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine/Community Medicine) qualification for 01 seat at U.P. Rural Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Etawah granted by C.S.J.M. University, Kanpur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (3rd & 4th December, 2014) along with the Council

Assessor's Report (27-28/05/2014) and compliance dated 26/08/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Social & Preventive Medicine/Community Medicine) qualification for 01 seat granted by C.S.J.M. University, Kanpur in respect of students being trained at U.P. Rural Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Etawah because of the following facts:-

1. The contract of Dr. D.A. Dev, Professor & HoD, was going to expire on 06/12/2014 – i.e. only 2 days after assessment but no Professor was designated in the department to succeed him. He reported on day of assessment at 03:30 p.m. and therefore cannot be considered as Faculty.
2. Dr. N.P. Singh, Asst. Prof., Dr. Kuldeep Gupta, Demonstrator & Dr. Ruchi Yadav, 1 year PG reported only on second day of assessment and therefore cannot be considered as teachers / Resident.
3. Dr. Priyanka Rai, presented as LMO at UHC is actually a Senior Resident in O.B.G. but was presented as LMO in the department with no evidence, of any signature or her activity in the department.
4. Dr. Mamta Singh, presented as LMO is actually on strength of Saifai Hospital.
5. Resultantly, there is no LMO in the department. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
6. Dr. Aarati Yadav & Dr. Avanti Verma were 2 Residents who were signing in the Register but were transferred on 10/10/2014. Since then only 2 Residents were available. Two others, Dr. Saurabh Tiwari & Dr. Varun Agarwal joined the department as Demonstrator on 03/12/2014 (i.e. on the day of Assessment) at 3 p.m.; hence, they cannot be considered as teachers.
7. Resultantly, there is deficiency of Faculty: (a) Tutor: 3.
8. Public Health Nurse, Health Educator & Health Inspector are not available.
9. Hardly any Resident stays at RHTC.
10. No data or statistics pertaining to RHTC/UHC are available in the department. There is no record of posting of Residents to these centers.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

78. The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 08 seats in respect of students being trained at Madras Medical College, Chennai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (Council Assessor's Report (24/11/2014)) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2013) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 08 seats at Madras Medical College, Chennai granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (Council Assessor's Report (24/11/2014)) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2013) and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 08 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai in respect of

students being trained at Madras Medical College, Chennai because of the following facts:-

1. There are 2 Units but Faculty complement is incomplete.
2. There are no publications from the department in preceding 3 years.
3. Column of experience, has not been filled in SAF; hence, it is not possible to verify it and determine the eligibility of the Faculty.
4. No Resident was presented before assessor. Their D.F. were also not submitted.
5. Biomedical waste management system in the department as well as in the Hospital was in disarray. Yellow coloured bags were not available in the hospital. Staff was ignorant of the procedure of waste management.
6. Resuscitation equipment or crash cart were not available either in the wards or at Nursing station on any floor.
7. Bed occupancy was 50% on the day of Assessment.
8. Laboratory investigation workload is inadequate.
9. Dr. K. Gopalkrishnan, Professor in Unit 2 retired on 30/10/2014, i.e. before day of assessment – i.e. 24/11/2014. No replacement was presented to the Assessor.; resultantly Unit 2 has only 2 Faculty and is headed by Asst. Prof. and therefore cannot be considered as a teaching Unit at all.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

79. Bharath University, Chennai - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08/01/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (17/04/2014) and compliance dated 01/09/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 06 seats at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai granted by Bharath University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08/01/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (17/04/2014) and compliance dated 01/09/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 06 seats granted by Bharath University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai because of the following facts:-

1. No compliance is shown regarding deficiencies pertaining to certain important aspects of Paediatric training (Intensive care, Clinical Genetics, Emergencies) pointed out in earlier assessment.
2. Unitwise distribution of Faculty is not provided.
3. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (300 in number) & Case Presentation (260 in number) appear to be unrealistic and grossly inflated.
4. Bed Occupancy in NICU 60% and PICU 60%.

5. There are a total of 10 Faculty against the requirement of 12 for 3 Units. Hence, there is a deficiency of 2 Faculty.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12/11/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) and compliance dated 09/04/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 06(Six) to 11(Eleven) seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P in respect of students being trained at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon, which the Teaching Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

recognition of D.Ortho qualification at A.C.P.M. Medical College, Dhule granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/01/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (27/05/2014) and compliance dated 23/09/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1(One) seat & not to recognize against increased intake from 01 (One) to 02 (Two) seats and D.Ortho qualification granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at A.C.P.M. Medical College, Dhule because of the following facts:-

1. A list of patients & procedures of Arthroscopy & Joint Replacement was provided but corresponding entries in Anaesthesia Register, etc. are not available to substantiate it. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
2. 1 Asso. Prof. and 2 Senior Residents were absent on the day of Assessment.
3. Resultantly, there is shortage of Senior Residents: 2.
4. There is only 1 publication from the department in Indexed Journals in preceding 3 years.
5. Clinical material continues to remain inadequate. Average OPD is 45-50/day. Bed occupancy is 55-60%. Although a list of 50 patients was provided, only 30 patients were found in the wards.
6. EMG is available in Physiology department, but average number of cases is only 1 / month, which is inadequate.
7. Daily average of Major operations is only 2-3 & Minor surgeries is only 1-2, which is inadequate.
8. Casualty statistics is not given separately. It is included in OPD, which itself is inadequate.
9. Equipment available in the department is not adequate.
10. Specialty clinic scheduled on the day of Assessment – i.e. 09/01/2015, Friday, Hand Clinic) was non-functional.
11. Arthroscopy & Arthroplasty facilities are not functional.
12. There is no separate septic O.T.
13. There is no preanaesthesia room. Recovery room is congested.
14. Demonstration room is common for OPD & IPD.
15. Schedule of clinics given and that in Registers are different for some days. Records of Fracture Clinic are not provided.
16. A list of patients is shown as OT record. The corresponding Register showing Anaesthesia notes from Anaesthesia Register was not provided for correlation.
17. 5 entries in Major O.T. list on 01/01/2015 are duplicated on 02/01/2015.
18. Academic parameters like Journal Club (17 in number), Group Discussions (9 in number) are inadequate. There is no correlation between entries in both the lists – college & department- for the period of last 3 months. There are no signatures of of the Faculty or students.
19. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

82. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of M.Ch.(Paediatric Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/10/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 16/04/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch.(Paediatric Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/10/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 16/04/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that M.Ch.(Paediatric Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 01(One) to 03(Three) seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

1. There is only 1 functional Unit with 30 teaching beds against the requirement of 2 Units. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
2. Clerical staff like Steno was not present at time of assessment.
3. CT & MRI are outsourced.
4. Waiting area for patients is inadequate. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
5. There is no separate O.T. for O.B.G. department. It operates only twice a week.
6. There is no separate Obstetric ICU. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
7. Dedicated counselling center for antenatal women is not available in OPD. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
8. IVF services are outsourced. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
9. OPD on the day of Assessment is only 80, which is not adequate.

10. Speciality clinic like Gynaec Endocrinology clinic is not functional.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Promotion of Dr. Prakash A. Sansoor, Assoc. Professor, Unit-A is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 8 months against the requirement of 5 years without any publications. Hence, he cannot be considered as Assoc. Professor. Consequently, there is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-A.
3. The following Senior Resident are not eligible. They have no 3 years experience, prior to appointment as Senior Resident:
 - a. Dr. S.S. Jagirdar
 - b. Dr. Shailesh G. Deshpande
 - c. Dr. Mohd. Ali Hussain
4. Consequently, there is a deficiency of 3 Senior Residents.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Shortage of Senior residents: 1.
3. One Professor, one Associate Professor & one Assistant Professor were absent on the day of Assessment.
4. Hand clinic is not existent.

5. The remark that "Why some of Asso. Prof. & Asst. Prof. are not entitled to certain allowances has not been clarified." Is yet not clarified in this report.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

4. No experience, details of the Faculty have been provided.
5. The deficiency was about conduct of examination and present assessment has not been done at the time of examination.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. The stipend paid by the Teaching Institute to residents is Rs. 12, 000 p.m., which is much less than that paid by JIPMER, a Central Govt. Institute in the State and hence, is contrary to Section 13(3) PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 as amended.
2. Promotion of Dr. Prachi Saban, Assoc. Professor is not as per the Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years.
3. Promotion of Dr. Salem M., Assoc. Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years.
4. Consequently, deficiency of 02 Assoc. Professors.
5. In all Publications cited, none of the Authors is working in the department except Dr. Prachi, who is third Author in 3 Publications. Consequently, no Publications from the department.
6. PG Degree of Dr. R. Gopal, Professor is not recognized.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or

2. While verifying Histopathology Register of 22/11/2014, while tracing randomly selected samples, neither paraffin blocks nor samples were found in a few cases, indicating data provided is not genuine.
3. Requisition forms of such samples do not contain adequate relevant clinical information, which is not as per the norms.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. OPD: There are only 2 examination cubicles for doctors and one room for Head of Unit. This leads to overcrowding. There is no teaching area. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
4. Distance between 2 beds is < 1.5 m as required. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
5. There are no Senior Residents.
6. Unitwise distribution of Faculty is not provided.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. 2. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
3. No information provided about the available Faculty, its distribution in to various Units and clinical material.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. 6. Resultantly, out of 6 Units, only 2 Units can be designated as PG Units.
7. Details of Senior Residents are not provided.

2. There is no Senior Resident in the Department.
3. Experience, details of Dr. Vijay Kumar Gupta has not been provided in the Faculty Table.
4. Designations of Dr. Vijay Grover shown in Faculty Table is not as per MCI Regulations. He has been Sr. Research Associate, Surgeon, Senior Surgeon, which are not teaching designations as per MCI norms.

6. Dr. Vijay Grover is designated as Sr. CTV Surgeon, which is not a teaching designation as per MCI Regulations.
7. Dr. Anubhav Gupta is shown as Asso. Prof. but in the column of experience, he is shown as "Asst. Prof." from March 2010 till date.
8. IPD is appointment based.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/12/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 31/07/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University in respect of students

being trained at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi because of the following facts:-

1. RICU has only 4 beds.
2. Average daily OPD is 50 – 60.
3. None of the Faculty possesses D.M. qualification.
4. No details are given regarding stipend paid to Residents.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course. The seats were permitted in 2010 and still not recognized.

102. Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of M.Ch.(Paediatrics Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 10 seats in respect of students being trained at SMS Medical College, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/12/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2013) and compliance dated 12/05/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch.(Paediatrics Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 10 seats at SMS Medical College, Jaipur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/12/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2013) and compliance dated 12/05/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and noted that the main deficiency pointed out was about the conduct of examination and the present assessment should have been done at the time of examination. However, it has not been conducted at the time of Examination. The Committee decided to conduct re-assessment at the time of examination. However, no assessment fee will be charged from the College.

103. Santosh University - Recognition of DA qualification in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (Re-Assessment Report (29/12/2014)) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2012) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DA qualification at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad granted by Santosh University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (Re-Assessment Report (29/12/2014)) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2012) and decided to recommend not to recognize DA qualification granted by Santosh University in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad because of the following facts:-

1. Shortage of Senior Residents: 5.
2. Stipend paid by the Teaching Institute to I/II/III year Residents is Rs. 14, 000; Rs. 15, 000 & Rs. 16, 000 p.m., which is less than that paid by Govt. of

U.P. and is contrary to Section 13(3) of PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

3. Academic parameter like Theory Classes (only 8) is inadequate.
4. Both the External examiners are from the same State where the college is located – i.e. U.P.
5. The College got first LOP on 15.07.2005. Prof. Rashmi Sharma has been given teaching experience from 1997 which is not permissible and she cannot be considered as faculty.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The seats were permitted in 2010 and still not recognized.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee is of the considered opinion that the failure on the part of your Institution to timely rectify the deficiencies show that the standard of Postgraduate medical education is not maintained in your Institute and therefore, you are called upon to submit the reply as to why directions for stoppage of admissions in Postgraduate Courses (DA) be not issued from academic year 2015-2016.

The reply to this Show-Cause must reach to the office of the Council within a period of 15 days from the issue of the Notice failing which the Council may decide the matter on the basis of available material.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (25/11/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2012) and compliance dated 31/05/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DM(Gastroenterology) qualification against increased intake from 01(One) to 03(Three) seats granted by Dr. N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada in respect of students being trained at Gandhi Medical College, Secundrabad be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon, which the Teaching Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

105. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) qualification in respect of increased intake from 01 to 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (01/12/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2013) and compliance dated 06/08/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) qualification in respect of increased intake from 01 to 03 seats at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (01/12/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2013) and compliance dated 06/08/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch.(Plastic Surgery) qualification in respect of increased intake from 01 to 03 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune because of the following facts:-

1. Average bed occupancy is 64%.
2. Details of Senior Residents are not given.
3. There is only 1 Unit with 64 beds, which is not as per the norms.
4. Promotion of Brig. Brijesh Chakraborty, Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 1 year 11 months and Assoc. Professor for 3 years 6 months, which is not as per the Regulations.
5. Promotion of Col. Alok Sharma, Professor & HoD is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 11 months 13 days and Assoc. Professor for 2 years against the requirement of 2 years and 4 years respectively, which is not as per the Regulations. Hence, he cannot be considered as Professor.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course. The seats were increased from 1 to 3 in 2010 and still not recognized.

106. PT. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak - Recognition of MS (General Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Chandimandir.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/01/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) and compliance dated 26/04/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS (General Surgery) qualification at Command Hospital, Chandimandir granted by PT. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/01/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) and compliance dated 26/04/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS (General Surgery) qualification for 03(Three) seats granted by PT. B.D. Sharma University of Health

Sciences, Rohtak in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Chandimandir be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon, which the Teaching Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

107. Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 01(One) to 02(Two) seats in respect of students being trained at R N T Medical College, Udaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (4th & 5th December, 2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 23/05/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 01(One) to 02(Two) seats at R N T Medical College, Udaipur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (4th & 5th December, 2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 23/05/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 01(One) to 02(Two) seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at R N T Medical College, Udaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon, which the Teaching Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Courses.

108. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Shadan Institute of Medical Sciences, Research Centre and Teaching Hospital, Peerancheru, Hyderabad.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03/01/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (17/05/2014) and compliance dated 10/10/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification at Shadan Institute of Medical Sciences, Research Centre and Teaching Hospital, Peerancheru, Hyderabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03/01/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (17/05/2014) and compliance dated 10/10/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of

students being trained at Shadan Institute of Medical Sciences, Research Centre and Teaching Hospital, Peerancheru, Hyderabad because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of Faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.
2. Shortage of Senior Residents: 9. Excess of Asst. Prof. cannot be considered against Senior Residents.
3. No stipend is paid to Residents. The plea of the Teaching Institute that it is as per G.O. of Andhra Pradesh cannot be accepted because no executive order of State Govt. can prevail over a statutory Regulation Notified in the Gazette of India by a Regulatory body created by an Act of Parliament.
4. Unit 5 & 6 have only 2 Faculty each; hence, they cannot be considered as PG Units.
5. Speciality clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic clinic & Surgical Oncology clinic are not existent.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

109. Santosh University - Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27/11/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011) and compliance dated 10/10/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad granted by Santosh University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27/11/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011) and compliance dated 10/10/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification granted by Santosh University in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad because of the following facts:-

1. Medico legal work is not under the control of Professor & HoD.
2. New Mortuary building is under construction and yet to be made functional.
3. Stipend paid by the Teaching Institute to I/II/III year Residents is Rs. 14, 000 p.m.; Rs. 15, 000 p.m. & Rs. 16, 000 p.m. respectively, which is less than that paid by Govt. of U.P. to Residents and contrary to Section 1393) of PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000, as amended.
4. Workload of various medico legal activities like examination for sexual offence,s, age estimation is NIL.
5. It is not clear where the postmortems are conducted and by whom they are conducted.
6. Academic parameters like Journal Club (12 in number), Group Discussions (12 in number) are inadequate.
7. College got LoP on 15/07/2005. However, Dr. V.K. Chokar, Professor has been given experience, from March, 2004, which is not permissible. After deducting period of experience, prior to first LoP, his promotion from Asst. Professor to Assoc. Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has

been Asst. Professor for 3 years 10 months as against the requirement of 5 years. His promotion from Assoc. Professor to Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been Assoc. Professor for 3 years 10 months against the requirement of 4 years.

8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The seats were permitted in the year 2007 and still not recognized. However, admission has been continued beyond the permitted period of 3 years.

The reply to this Show-Cause must reach to the office of the Council within a period of 15 days from the issue of the Notice failing which the Council may decide the matter on the basis of available material.
