**1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.**

The minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 11/12/2015 were read out and confirmed in the meeting itself.

**2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

**3. Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**4. Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

1. Prescribed SAF has not been used.
2. Although 15 publications are mentioned in indexed journals not a single one of it is in Zonal/ National or International Psychiatry Journals.
3. On random checking, most cases of female psychiatry ward were admissions done in last few days only.
4. On random checking of indoor case sheet of a female patient, she was recorded to be admitted on 17/06/2015 and was prescribed antidep and antiase medicines, there was no note on 18/06/2015 and on 19/06/2015 day of inspection she was prescribed completely different medicines without any rational explanation noted for the change.
5. Similarly on random checking of a male patient, his case file showed him to be a chronic bipola mood disorder patient but on clinical examination, it could not be corroborated.
6. No record was available of interdepartmental psychiatric references.
7. All the above deficiencies indicate that clinical material is not-genuine.

8. Disability certification is not done at this institute so students (PGs) exposure to medico-legal psychiatry or Forensic Psychiatry is lacking.
9. There is no community psychiatry help line.
10. No participation in National Mental Health Programme.
11. No faculty table in SAF - left blank.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**5. Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur - Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

1. Prescribed SAF has not been used.
2. Workload of operations like Laryngectomy, Laryngo/Tracheoplasty, Rhinoplasty is NIL during last 3 years & that of Angiofibroma, Maxillectomy is only 1 during the same period.
3. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (13/year) is inadequate.
4. Total IPD: 2393, Total major operations 1924, minor 4205. Some of the minor operations also need admissions. It means no other patients (non-surgical) are admitted, which is not feasible.
5. Promotion of Dr. Navneet Gangwar, Associate Professor is not as per regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years. Out of his 3 publications cited, one is a case report, one review article in 2014 and 3rd publication is in 2014. (Both outside his promotion period)
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. **6. Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 1 seat at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 1 seat granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

1. There is only one medical faculty and four non-medical, which is not permissible. (More than 50% non-medical)
2. Academic Parameters – Group Discussions: 5 only, which is inadequate.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely,

**7. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Thrissur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 4 seats at Government Medical College, Thrissur granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 4 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Thrissur because of the following facts:-

1. Research Laboratory / PG Laboratory is not well developed.
2. Equipment like HPLC is not available independently in the department. HPLC is shared with Biochemistry.
3. Clerical staff is not available.
4. There are NIL publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
5. Details of Academic parameters are not given.
6. There are no details about examination and part-III of SAF is left blank.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. **8. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Latur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 2

seats at Govt. Medical College, Latur granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 2 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Latur because of the following facts:-

1. Prescribed SAF has not been used.
2. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.
3. The date of joining of PGs was delayed beyond 31/05 in the respective year of admission; however M.S. examination is held before completion of the requisite time period.
4. Unit I has no Asso. Prof.; Also, it has only 2 faculty; hence faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
5. Experience details of Dr. S.K. Gawali, DNB, Asso. Prof. in Unit II have not been provided; hence it cannot be verified whether he is eligible to hold the post or not.
6. Specialty clinics like CTEV clinic, Hand clinic are not run.
7. Knee Replacement services are not available.
8. Major operations are more than IPD in the year 2012-13, which is not feasible.
9. No Senior Resident is eligible. None had 3 years experience at the time of appointment as Senior Resident.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

**9. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at North Bengal Medical College, Darjeeling.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at North Bengal Medical College, Darjeeling granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Physiology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at North Bengal Medical College, Darjeeling because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Tutor: 3.
2. Clerical staff is not available.
3. In Central Library, there is NIL Indian & only 1 foreign journal of Physiology.
4. Central Research Laboratory is not available.
5. Yoga Laboratory is not available.
6. Animal House is not available.
7. No Museum.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

**10. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of DGO qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DGO qualification for 2 seats at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize DGO qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur because of the following facts:-

1. OPD on day of assessment is 98 which is inadequate.
2. There were only 2 Major Gynaecological operations and one normal delivery on day of assessment.
3. There were only 166 Minor operations in 2014 implying daily average of < 0.5 which is inadequate.
4. Gynaecological OPD is only 28/day.

5. Details of beds occupied in HDU on day of assessment are not provided.
6. Details of Specialty clinic like High Risk Pregnancy clinic are not provided.
7. Prenatal diagnostic services are not available.
8. Equipment like Hysteroscope, Laparoscope, Infusion Pumps are not available.
9. Academic parameter like Journal Club (12/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are not available.
10. Total IPD (2014) – 3944; Major operations+Deliveries – 4342. This is not feasible. Data is non genuine.
11. Publications nil. 9 publications quoted are all case reports, which cannot be considered.
12. Death nil out of 4121 admissions, which indicate no complicated deliveries are handled.
13. No senior resident in unit I. Senior resident in unit II is not eligible. He has no 3 years experience. Senior resident in unit 3 with DGO qualification is not eligible.
14. SAF part III left blank. No details of exam provided.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of Diploma in Ophthalmology qualification against the increased intake from 3 to 4 seats at Institute of Ophthalmology Joseph Eye Hospital, Tiruchirapalli granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that recognition of Diploma in Ophthalmology qualification against the increased intake from 3 to 4 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Institute of Ophthalmology Joseph Eye Hospital, Tiruchirapalli be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**13. Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur.**

1. Prescribed SAF has not been used.
2. Out of 5 Senior Residents, 3 are with MBBS qualification only and they do not possess 3 years experience in the department of medical college. Dr. Jeevan Jadhav is DMRD but does not possess additional 1 year experience as Resident. Dr. Sachin Pore is DMRE from CPS, Mumbai which is not a recognized qualification and therefore can be considered as MBBS only but does not have 3 years experience in the department in a medical college.
3. Resultantly, none of the Senior Residents is eligible to hold the post.
4. Out of 3 publications given in the list, 2 are case reports; hence there is only 1 publication from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
5. Investigative workload of inspection day not given.
6. Static X-ray machine – 5, required 6
7. Deficiency of Faculty: Assoc. Professor-1 and Senior Resident – 4
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats each for Degree and Diploma after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior

How she can be Demonstrator & Asstt. Professor during the same period. She was examiner also. How can she be Demonstrator after she was Assoc. Professor.
4. There are no tutors.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Dr. Neha Mehra, Senior Resident has been appointed straightaway as Senior Resident after DNB without showing any experience of 3 years as Resident in Medical College.
2. Dr. Puneet Banga, Senior Resident has been appointed straightaway as Senior Resident after DA without showing any additional experience of 1 year as Resident in Medical College.
3. Dr. N.K. Kothiyal, Senior Resident has been appointed straightaway as Senior Resident after DA without showing any additional experience of 1 year as Resident in Medical College.
4. Dr. Jyoti Shukla, Senior Resident has been appointed straightaway as Senior Resident after DA without showing any additional experience of 1 year as Resident in Medical College.
5. Dr. A.S. Negi, Senior Resident has been appointed straightaway as Senior Resident after DA without showing any additional experience of 1 year as Resident in Medical College.
6. Details of beds occupied in ICUs on day of assessment are not provided.

10. Dr. Dhananjay Kumar was Asstt. Professor for 02 months only.
11. Experience details of Brig. Vinay Rai have not been provided. There is no certificate from the Competent Authority of the office of DGAFMS about his places of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialists and Advisor without which his equated academic rank cannot be calculated.
12. Experience details of Dr. Gurdeep Singh have not been provided. There is no certificate from the Competent Authority of the office of DGAFMS about his places of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialists and Advisor without which his equated academic rank cannot be calculated.
13. Faculty deficiency: Associate Professor - 2.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Average daily workload of Pathology has decreased from 96 in 2012-2013 to 40 in 2014-2015.
2. Total OPD attendance has decreased from 58,500 in 2012-2013 to 56,654 in 2014-2015.
3. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 13 on day of assessment.
4. CSSD is not available.
5. No experience as Resident in Medical College is shown in respect of Dr. A.D. Mangaldass shown as Senior Resident who possesses MBBS qualification.
6. Dr. E.J. Dev shown in Unit IV is Asso. Prof. of Neurosurgery and hence cannot be considered as faculty of General Surgery; Resultantly, there are only 2 faculty in Unit IV and it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
7. Dr. A.D. Ashok, MBBS, Senior Resident possesses only 2 years experience as Resident in Medical College; hence not eligible to hold the post.
8. Details of beds occupied in SICU on day of assessment are not provided.
9. There are only 2 publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
10. Academic parameter like Clinical Seminar (12/year) is inadequate.
11. IPD last year (2014) = 34992, which means 117 Admissions per day on 120 Beds which is not feasible.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 1; (2) Tutor: 2.
2. Details of investigations done on day of assessment are not provided in the workload of Central laboratory at § 6 of Part I.
3. Although Annual specimens processed for Surgical Pathology has increased from 4,011 in 2012-2013 to 4,506 in 2014-2015, daily average of Histopathological workload has remained constant at 14 during the same period. There is data mismatch.
4. Pathological post-mortems are not performed.
5. Workload of investigation like TT, Serum Folate, Vit B 12 is not shown. That of Bone Marrow Biopsy is only 07/year which is inadequate.
6. In Blood bank, the number of units collected is only 1,252 while the number of units issued is 1,764. It is not shown how such a wide gap has been met with.
7. Academic parameters like Clinical seminars (10 in no.), Journal Clubs (13/year) are inadequate.
8. Candidates appearing at M.D. examination have not sent any paper for publication.
9. Only one publication during last 3 years. Out of 3 quoted, one is ophthalmology publication, which is not related to Pathology.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. At item 6 of Departmentwise bed strength in Part I on P. 4, department of Cardiology is shown to be having 36 beds + 9 ICU beds; In Part II on P. 11, it is shown as having 45 beds in ward & 18 in ICU. No explanation is given for this dichotomy.
3. Dr. Shaji Alex, Senior Resident does not have 3 years experience as Resident in a medical college; hence he cannot be considered as Senior resident; resultantly there is shortage of (a) Senior Resident: 1.
4. Subair Kunju is only MBBS. He cannot be appointed lecturer.
5. Details of only two examiners provided.
6. Following not available:
  - a. Laundry
  - b. Incinerator
  - c. Medical record section not computerized.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 3. Departmental Statistics are not properly maintained.
4. Academic schedule is not prepared.
5. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (11/year), Journal Clubs (07 in no.), Case Presentations (16/year), Group Discussions (11/year) are inadequate.
6. No details are given for any Senior Resident.
7. No details are given regarding payment of stipend to Residents at rates prescribed by Govt. of Maharashtra.
8. Dr. A.J. Khakhani was absent on the day of Assessment.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of

Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Publications quoted: 61 (SAF page 3) and 33 on page 18 Sl. No. 20. This is data mismatch. No full reference/ reprints of any of them provided.
2. No mention about stipend.
3. Promotion of Mahesh Gauri Rupali, Associate Professor is not as per regulations. She was Asst. Professor for 4 years 2 months against the requirement of 5 years. She has no publications. Resultantly, no Associate in Unit I
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Prof. in recognized medical colleges in India. His experience at Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, Pokhara, Nepal cannot be considered.
2. Resultantly there is deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.
3. Workload of investigation like TT is NIL.
4. Workload of CT guided FNAC is only 21 in a year.
5. Pathological post-mortems are not performed.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. MRI workload is only 09 on day of assessment.
2. Workload of DSA is only 51 in 2014.
3. 5 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 degree seats and 1 diploma seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. Dr. Jijoe John, DMRD has been appointed straightaway after DMRD without any additional experience of 1 year as Resident in a medical college.
3. Dr. T.P. Lekshmi, DMRD has been appointed straightaway after DMRD without any additional experience of 1 year as Resident in a medical college.
4. Dr. M. Subramaniam, DNB has been appointed as Senior Resident straightaway after DNB.
5. Dr. P.S. Prashanth, MBBS has experience of only 1 year 7 months as Resident but he has been shown as Senior Resident in the faculty table which is contrary to Regulations.
6. Only 6 books have been purchased during last 3 years. (P. 20)
7. Publications – except one all others are case reports, which cannot be considered.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Audiovisual aids are inadequate.
6. Preparation room is not available for Experimental Pharmacology laboratory.
7. Museum has no specimens of drugs.
8. Academic parameters- Seminars- Nil, J. Club- Nil, Group discussion- Nil, which means no academic activity in the department.
9. SAF Part III – Left blank, which means no exam was held.
10. Library has no recent books and journals.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. IPD of year 3 – 16805 which means 56 admissions per day against 61 bed which is not feasible, Data is non-genuine.
5. Out of 13 publications cited, 10 are in their own institution journals, which are not indexed.
6. On the day of assessment, total MRI in Hospital were 12, which indicate inadequate clinical material.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. There is no Faculty Table in the SAF. No Annexure – 12 is attached (which has been stated by the college authorities). Without this Faculty requirement cannot be decided.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. MRI workload on day of assessment is only 06.
3. Out of 6 publications from the department in the list, as many as 5 are case reports; resultantly there is only 1 research publication from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
4. Appointment orders have been issued without any dispatch numbers and joining letters have not been signed by HOD or Principal.
5. There is discrepancy in the quantum of stipend. In the appointment orders, it is shown as Rs. 24,000; Rs. 25,000 etc. but in the pay slips, it is shown as Rs. 32,000; Rs. 33,000 & Rs. 34,000. However, Form 16 & Bank statements have not been provided by the institute.
6. Both PG examinations of Degree & Diploma were conducted with the same set of Internal & External examiners which is not as per Regulations.
7. Transport Incubator is not available.
8. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (12/year) is inadequate.
9. Promotion of Dr. Menon N.K. Sunil Kumar, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years without any publication. However, faculty complement is complete without him.
10. Promotion of Dr. Thomas John, Professor is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 3 years (as per experience certification from Amala Institute of Medical Sciences dated 02/07/2015) against the requirement of 5 years. However, faculty component is complete without him.
11. Out of 6 publications cited, 5 are case reports and cannot be considered.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Promotion of Dr. Rachna Bhatnagar, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. She never worked as Asstt. Professor. Resultantly, Unit-C has only 2 faculty and it cannot be considered P.G. Unit.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. One of the External Examiners was from the same State – i.e. U.P.
5. MRI workload on day of assessment for the whole hospital is only 08.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Obstetric OPD on day of assessment is only 29 which is inadequate.
4. There were only 1 Obstetric & 2 Gynaecological major operations on day of assessment.
5. Specialty clinic like Gynaecological Endocrine clinic is not run.
6. Prenatal diagnosis services are not available.
7. Out of 5 USG machines, as many as 4 are non-functional.
8. Infusion Pumps are not available.
9. MRI workload on day of assessment for the whole hospital is only 01. There was not mammography on inspection day.
10. Academic parameters like Journal Clubs (12/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
11. Total IPD – 5756; Total Major operation + deliveries + Caesarean Sections - 5612. No scope for patients not requiring surgery or delivery. Some minor surgery patients also need admission. The data is non-genuine.
12. Dr. Nazma Malik – Date of joining in Deptt. not mentioned.
13. On inspection day OPD – 111. Average 3 days-350. This is a data mismatch.
14. There is no infusion pumps in the deptt.
15. One External Examiner from same state, which is not permissible.
16. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Only 1 bed was occupied in RICU on day of assessment. (Bed occupancy 20%)
6. Academic parameter like Journal Club (10 in no.) is inadequate.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

6. No details of examiners (Except names) given. Their eligibility cannot be checked.

6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (09 in no.) is inadequate.
8. Dr. S.T. Padmanabha, Professor in Unit II has been appointed straightaway as Asso. prof. without any experience as Asst. Prof. as shown in faculty table; hence he cannot be considered. Resultantly, there are only 2 faculty in Unit II & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
9. Unit III has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit. Place of posting of Dr. Vishnu N.H., Professor after 2010 not given.
10. No details of examiners provided.
11. Whether the students appearing in examination have written/presented paper/poster- No information provided.
12. Promotion of Dr. K.N. Ramesh, Professor, Unit-I is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Professor for 4 years 2 months, Assoc. Professor for 3 years.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Workload of CT guided FNAC/Biopsy is only 15 in 2014 which is inadequate.
5. Workload of DSA is only 74 in 2014 implying daily average of 0.25 which is inadequate.
6. Out of 14 publications in the list, none is related with subject of Radiodiagnosis; hence there are NIL publications from the department in indexed journals during last 3 years.
7. Daily investigative workload of 08 Special investigations, 03 USG guided procedures, 02 CT guided procedures does not match with figures of 602, 14 & 15 in 2014. There is data mismatch.
8. Academic parameter like Theory Classes (10 in no.) is inadequate.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 5 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Out of 10 publications in the list, 9 are case reports; hence there is only 1 research publication from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
2. Super specialists Urologists, Neuro-surgeon, Plastic surgeon perform operations under cover of general surgery which is not permissible.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increase intake from 4 to 6 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

1. Data of operations (2014) provided by HoD from O.T. Register (1063) did not match with that given by college authorities (3831). There was NIL Major & 1 Minor operation on day of assessment.
2. Total number of IPD patients has decreased from 5,208 in 2012 to 4,239 in 2014.
3. Total number of deliveries has decreased from 3,038 in 2012 to 2,450 in 2014. Total number of Caesarean Sections has decreased from 1,298 in 2012 to 1,117 in 2014.
4. Space in OPD & O.T. is inadequate. There are only 3 Examination rooms.
5. Specialty clinic like Gynaec Endocrine clinic is not functional.
6. Overall clinical material appears to be less.
7. There is no dedicated Obstetric ICU.
8. Prenatal diagnosis services are not available.
9. Names of Laboratory technicians were not provided to assessor.
10. Out of 4 publications in the list, 3 are case reports; hence there is only 1 research publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
11. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (17/year), Journal Clubs (11/year) are inadequate.
12. Stipend paid in cash. No register entries or bank transfer could be obtained.
13. Deductions for mess, telephone internal, electricity bill and maintenance fee are made from stipend. No adjustments out of stipend can be made.
14. Histopathology specimens data does not match with the data submitted by Department.
15. Bed occupancy 65% on inspection day. Many of the patients were admitted only same day after 9.30 a.m. for frivolous reasons.
16. Form-16 issued by college, it's authenticity could not be verified from traces.
17. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. Workload of MRI is only 10 & of CT Scan is only 11 on day of assessment.
3. Stipend paid in cash. No register entries of bank transfer could be obtained.
4. Deductions for mess, telephone internal, electricity bill and maintenance fee are made from stipend. No adjustments out of stipend can be made.
5. All the 4 publications in the list are case reports; hence there is NIL publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
6. Space for Departmental Museum is inadequate.
7. Standard of examination was not good.
8. Academic outcome parameters could not be verified.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Medical College and Hospital, Guntur because of the following facts:-

1. Bed occupancy is 65 – 72% which is inadequate.
2. MRI workload on day of assessment is only 11.
3. Stipend paid in cash. No register entries of bank transfer could be obtained.
4. Deductions for mess, telephone internal, electricity bill and maintenance fee are made from stipend. No adjustments out of stipend can be made.
5. MICU is run by Critical Care Physician. Posting of General Medicine PGs in MICU is doubtful.
6. Admissions through Casualty is very less (Average 2-3 only).
7. Academic parameter like Journal Club (12/year) is inadequate.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 8 to 10 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Payment of stipend to Residents is made in cash. No evidence of payment was shown. Students denied that they were paid any stipend.
2. On enquiry, it was found that no stipend is being paid to PG students who are also shown as Tutors.
3. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Tutors: 4.
4. UHC is run in a Rotary club building. Cold Chain equipment is not available. Infrastructure is inadequate. No other National programme except immunization & Antenatal checkup is carried out. Paramedical staff is inadequate. Public Health Nurse & Health educator are not available. A GNM was shown as Health Educator & when detected, it was changed.
5. RHTC: Even Normal Delivery is not conducted. No other National programme except immunization & Antenatal checkup is carried out. Specialists' visits are not organized. Infrastructure is inadequate. Paramedical staff is inadequate. Public Health Nurse & Health educator are not available. A GNM was shown as Health Educator & when detected, it was changed. Interns, PGs do not stay there. Except for M.O., no other staff quarter is available.
6. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (14/year) is inadequate.

7. No specialists from college visit RHTC/UHTC.
8. Hostel inadequate- No girl interns stay there.
9. No residential accommodation except for one Medical Officer.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 06 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Space for wards is inadequate.
2. Offices for faculty & ancillary facilities are inadequate. Office of HOD is only 9.5 sq.m. which is inadequate.
3. Male & Female wards are not as per MSR Regulations.
4. Bed occupancy is 50% on day of assessment.
5. Patients have been admitted since 4-5 days which is not correct.
6. Xeroxcopies of cases were not provided to the assessor.
7. All Laboratory & Radiological investigations data are inflated.
8. OPD on day of assessment was only 34. Average OPD is only 37.
9. Total number of OPD patients has decreased from 11,116 to 10,569 during 3 year period.
10. Total number of IPD patients has decreased from 2,712 to 1,908 during 3 year period.
11. There are NIL publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
12. It is not clear from the faculty table when the faculty has been transferred to Emergency Medicine department from the parent department and whether they have received any special training in Emergency Medicine.
13. Academic parameter like Theory Classes (20/year), Case Presentations (12/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
14. It is not mentioned in faculty table that when these faculty members joined deptt. of Emergency Medicine and prior to that they were working in which department.
15. Casualty beds and Casualty OPD cannot be counted as Emergency Medicine Beds and its OPD.
16. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 07 on day of assessment.



2. Out of 6 publications in the list, 3 are case reports & 1 is a review article; resultantly, there are only 2 research publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
3. Stipend paid by institute to its Residents is only Rs. 12,000 p.m. which is much less than that paid by Central / State Govt. to Residents in the State.
4. ICU/RICU is not under control of Anaesthesiology department. What is under its control is Post Anaesthesia Care Unit (8 beds) which is not same as ICU/RICU.
5. There are NIL Group Discussions during last year.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. In earlier SAF, number of Major operations has been shown as 815 in 2014. In the compliance it is shown as 1,059 in 2014 which includes day care surgeries which cannot be considered as Major surgeries. Hence deficiency remains as such.
2. Explanation given by institute regarding operations like Laryngectomy, etc. is not tenable. The excuse that that these operations are covered under Rajeev Arogyasree scheme and therefore patients are going elsewhere cannot be accepted for a teaching institute imparting tertiary care. Further, posting of PGs to non-teaching institutes is not permissible. There are too many typographical errors as stated by the institute in compliance. Even after corrections made by institute, workload of these operations remains low.
3. The explanation of institute that there was only 1 Major operation & NIL BERA because it was Saturday cannot be considered as clinical material would spread uniformly over all working days, including Saturday.
4. Already 1 seat commensurate with available clinical material.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

**104. Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course at Medicity Institute of Medical Sciences, Ghanpur, Telangana under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17-consideration of compliance.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (12/09/2015) and compliance dated 25/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Medicity Institute of Medical Sciences, Ghanpur, Telangana under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

1. Mismatch between specimens received (5227) and reports issued/ nature of disease report (3992) stays. Explanation given by college authorities is not tenable because cytology also reports nature of disease and is included in the data supplied by college authorities. Even after adding 1135 FNAC reports, it does not tally with the number of specimens received.
2. Deficiency of inadequate workload of CT guided & USG guided FNAC/Biopsy remains as such.
3. Workload of Histopathology remains low.
4. Pathological post-mortems are not performed.
5. Mismatch between specimen received (5227) and reports issued/ nature of diseases reported including normal tissue were 3992, stays as such. Explanation given by college authorities cannot be relied because Psytology also reports nature of disease and is included in the data supplied by college authorities. Even after adding 1135 FNAC reports, it does not tally with the number of specimens received.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

**105. Starting of MS (OBG) course at Mandya Institute of Medical Sciences, Mandya, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (21/08/2015) and compliance dated 05/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mandya Institute of Medical Sciences, Mandya, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21/08/2015) and compliance dated 05/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MS (OBG) course at Mandya Institute of Medical Sciences, Mandya, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17, because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Operation days remain twice a week. Institute has only stated that "It will increase to 3 per week" implying it has not been done so far. Deficiency remains as such.
2. MRI is not available.
3. Compliance is signed by Associate Professor who is i/c HOD which is not permissible. HOD has to be of rank of professor.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

**106. Increase of seats in MD (Psychiatry) course at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Pondicherry under Pondicherry University, Puducherry u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.**
