1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 11th August, 2015.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Matter relating to recognition of various Postgraduate courses in respect of Govt. Medical Colleges of Madhya Pradesh.

The matter with regard to recognition of various Postgraduate courses in respect of various Government Medical Colleges of Madhya Pradesh was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee after granting personal hearing to the representatives of the following Medical Colleges along with their DME:

1. NSCB Medical College, Jabalpur
2. S.S. Medical College, Rewa
3. Government Medical College, Bhopal
4. MGM Medical College, Indore
5. G.R. Medical College, Gwalior
6. Director of Medical Education, Madhya Pradesh

After detailed discussions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee observed/ noted that the courses were started with the permission of State Govt. prior to 10(A) came into existence in 1992. However, Section 11(2) has been in existence ever since the IMC Act, 1956 came into existence and the college authorities were expected to apply for recognition when the first batch of students appeared in the examination. However, none of them did so. Now all these courses have been discontinued long back and it is not possible to conduct recognition inspection u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 because the same is done at the time of examination and there is no examination possible. As per the existing MCI Regulations, there is no provision under which Postgraduate Medical Education Committee/ MCI can recommend recognition without following the prescribed procedure.

Under the peculiar circumstances as explained above and keeping in view the fact that a large number of students have passed out and their diplomas remain unrecognized, the Central Govt., Ministry of Health & F.W. may take an appropriate view as it may deem fit in the matter.

3. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at AI-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats at AI-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at AI-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Tutor: 4.
2. OPD attendance is shown as 1, 246 appears to be inflated and does not match actual patients in OPD.
3. No unit of blood was collected on day of assessment.
4. Histopathological workload was only 7 on day of assessment (including previous day). Operative workload not provided for the Assessment day.
5. Central Research Lab inadequate.
6. No specialized research work is going on in the departmental research laboratory.
7. Books & Journals in Central & Departmental Libraries are inadequate.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

4. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 02 seats at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

5. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 1; (b) Epidemiologist: 1
2. Audiovisual equipment like OHP are non-functional.
3. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (18/year) is inadequate.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 5 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted in the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

6. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Belgaum Institute of Medical Sciences, Belgaum.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats at Belgaum Institute of Medical Sciences, Belgaum granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Belgaum Institute of Medical Sciences, Belgaum be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

7. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Bhaskar Medical College, Yenkapally.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats at Bhaskar Medical College, Yenkapally granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Bhaskar Medical College, Yenkapally be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

8. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 02 seats at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize

MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar because of the following facts:-

1. There is no adequate space for faculty.
2. PG students appearing in the examination have not done any poster or publication or read any paper at a conference as per MCI norms.
3. There are only 2 publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years. No full reference or reprint of any publication supplied.
4. Dr. V. Raghu, Professor & HoD was promoted on 01/04/2015 without any publications. Hence, not as per Regulations.
5. Dr. Sindhu Sulekha, Assoc. Professor promoted on 01/10/2014 without any publications. Hence, not as per Regulations.
6. Consequently, there is a deficiency of Professor: 1 and Assoc. Professor: 1.
7. Dr. B. Anil Kumar, Assoc. Professor does not satisfy MCI criteria for promotion of Assoc. Professor as publication are not in national index/specialty index journal.
8. There is no functioning Eye Bank and no documents are produced regarding Registration of college and department under Organ Transplantation Act.
9. PG students taking Practical Exams have not done any poster or publication or read the paper at conference as per MCI norms.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted in the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Community Medicine) qualification for 04 seats granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Christian

Medical College, Ludhiana be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

10. Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot - Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Christian Medical College, Ludhiana.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 03 seats at Christian Medical College, Ludhiana granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Microbiology) qualification for 03 seats granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Christian Medical College, Ludhiana be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

11. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) for 01 seat at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Microbiology) for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad because of the following facts:-

1. No stipend has been paid to Residents till date. As per SAF, it will be paid from Academic Year 2015-2016; however it is not clear whether it would be paid to Residents working in the department and admitted in earlier years or not.
2. Water supply is not available in Serology laboratory.
3. Electric points are not provided in Virology laboratory.
4. Resultantly, above 2 service laboratories are not functional.
5. No details of submission of data to national or State Authorities of HIV, Tuberculosis, etc. are provided.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(DVL) and DDVL qualifications for 01 seat each granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad because of the following facts:-

1. No stipend has been paid to Residents till date. As per SAF, it will be paid from Academic Year 2015-2016; however it is not clear whether it would be paid to which Residents admitted in earlier years.
2. Workload of the following procedures is inadequate:
 - (a) Skin Biopsies: 92/year;
 - (b) Cryo Surgical Procedures: 61/year;
 - (c) Skin Grafting Procedures: 12/year;
 - (d) Nail Surgeries: 04/year;
 - (e) LASER for Hair Reduction: NIL;
 - (f) LASER for Pigment Removal: NIL.
3. LASER for Pigment Removal is not available.
4. Academic parameter like Theory Classes (20/year) is inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat each till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required

shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Pharmacology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Father Muller Medical College, Mangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

14. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Renewal of recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Mysore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 01 seat at Government Medical College, Mysore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 01 seat granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Mysore be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of

Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

15. Veer Narmad South Gujarat University - Renewal of recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Surat.

5. The Institution has stated that there 71 publications during the last 3 years but no full reference or reprints have been provided.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. Total number of Contrast Radiology has decreased from 511 in 2012 to 295 in 2014.
8. Total number of CT scan has decreased from 4, 170 in 2012 to 3, 948 in 2014.
9. Details of Academic Parameter like Theory Classes are not provided.

10. Academic Parameters like Journal Clubs (13/year), Case Presentation (21/year), Group Discussions (13/year) are inadequate.
11. Daily MRI in the entire Hospital is 9, which is inadequate.
12. There are no publications. All those cited are case reports, which cannot be considered.
13. Dr. Shivanand S. Melkundi, Professor has been promoted on 18/05/2015 without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
14. Dr. Shri Shail S. Patil, Professor has been promoted on 12/05/2015 without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
15. Consequently, there is a deficiency of Assoc. Professor: 1
16. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. From the table below, it is clear that out of 130 OPD, daily 90 patients are admitted on 90 beds, which is not feasible. The data is non-genuine.

5. Out of 27740 patients admitted in a year, there are only 6 deaths, which simply means, no serious trauma patients are admitted without which, PG training is grossly inadequate.

7. As per Faculty Table signed by the Dean and Assessor, there is no Senior Resident in Unit-I & II.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. The SAF was not properly filled up and information provided was sketchy.
2. Teachers who did not have required teaching experience were shown in higher rank. E.g. 2 faculty – Dr. Mehbooba & Dr. Anjum Malik have been shown as Asso. Prof. without any experience as Asst. Prof.
3. Out of 2 Units, 1 Unit is functioning at the institute at Soura, Srinagar while another is functioning at Bemina campus which is 6-7 km. away.
4. O.T. for O.G. department is utilized by department of Surgical Oncology also.
5. Labour room facilities are inadequate. There is no provision for septic labour room & septic O.T.
6. There is discrepancy in data provided for blood consumption. At item 10 in part I on P. 3, it is shown as 50 for the whole hospital while at Item 9 in Part II on P. 20, it is shown as 370 for the department of O.G.
7. There are only 2 publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
8. No experience details of Faculty has been given in the Faculty Table.
9. Senior Residents are part time. Their qualifications has not been mentioned. Hence, their eligibilty cannot be decided.
10. Caesarean Section, in one table they are shown as 3000 per year and in the second table they are shown as 300 per year. This is data mismatch.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. Dr. Deepthi Nandan, Assoc. Professor has been promoted on 20/01/2015 without any publications, which is not as per Regulations. Hence, cannot be considered.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 6 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 5. There is no Senior Resident in Unit-II.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. OPD on the day of assessment is only 45, which is grossly inadequate. Daily average is only 62, which is grossly inadequate.
2. Shortage of Senior Residents: 1.
3. Unit 1 does not have Assoc. Prof. There are only 2 faculty. Resultantly, faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Unit II, III, IV have only 2 faculty each hence, they cannot be considered as PG Unit
5. Resultantly, there is no Unit which can be considered as PG Unit.
6. Specialty clinic like Surgical Oncology is not run.
7. There are NIL publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years
8. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (NIL) is inadequate.
9. All Senior Residents are MBBS without any 3 year experience. Hence, they cannot be considered.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Total number of major operations has decreased from 4, 309 in 2012 to 4, 285 in 2014

2. Total number of Minor operations has decreased from 2, 716 in 2012 to 2, 300 in 2014
3. There is only 1 publications from the department in indexed journal in last 3 years
4. Deficiency of faculty (a) Assoc. Professor: 2 (b) Asst. Professor: 1
5. Shortage of Senior Residents: 4
6. Daily average of Major & Minor operations is 19 & 12, respectively.
7. It is not clear whether any ICU is with department of Anesthesiology as it is only mentioned that this department is providing services to various ICUs
8. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (10 in no.) is inadequate
9. Candidates appearing in the examination have not presented a research paper
10. On the day of Assessment, there were 3 MRI in the entire Hospital, 3 Ultrasound and no Berium or IVP study, which indicates grossly inadequate clinical material.
11. Dr. Molly Jose, Dr. A.M. Geetha, Dr. Rahul Anand and Dr. A.N. Ahmed all are with DA qualification, hence, cannot be considered as Lecturer.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Clinical material is inadequate. Bed occupancy was 30-35%
4. There were no Surgeries on day of assessment. There was no evidence of Oculoplastic Surgeries being performed at all. Daily average of Major & Minor operations is only 2 & 1, respectively, which is inadequate.
5. Shortage of Senior Residents: 2.
6. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 438 in 2012 to 391 in 2014
7. There is only 1 publication from the department in indexed journal in last 3 years and that too is a case report, resultantly there is NIL research publications.
8. Facilities for Retinal Surgery are not available
9. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (05 in no). Clinic Seminars (15/year). Journals Clubs (04 in no.) are inadequate
10. There is no functioning Eye Bank.
11. No Surgery on the day of Assessment.
12. There is no operating Microscope in septic O.T.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 6. Department does not participate in National Mental Health Programme.
7. Chronic Psychiatric Care facility is not available.
8. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (14/year). Journals Club's (05 in no.) Group Discussions (03 in no.) are inadequate.
9. No details are given regarding whether candidates appearing in the examination have presented a poster, read a paper at National/ State conference or presented a research paper or not.
10. There is only 1 publication during last 3 years.
11. Only 2 Speciality Clinics are held, which is inadequate.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Pathological post-mortems are not performed.
4. Workload of Bone Marrow biopsy is only 8-10/year.
5. Workload of routine semen examination is only 260/year & that of special semen investigations is only 20/year.
6. As per table (reproduced below), total yearly major surgeries and daily major surgeries do not tally. It is data mismatch.

4. IPD Diagnosis Statistics are not tallying with number on day of assessment.
5. Standard of examination is not satisfactory as it looks more of teaching the candidates rather than assessing their clinical skills.
6. Details of beds occupied in ICUs on the day assessment are not provided.
7. Specialty clinics like Endocrinology clinic, Haematology clinic are not run. Daily visits cannot be a substitute for clinics.
8. Academic parameters like Journal Clubs (21/year), Case Presentations (21/year) are inadequate.
9. Promotion of Dr. Dandapani G., Professor is not as per Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor 3 years 8 months against the requirement of 5 years. Consequently, Unit-III is left with 2 Faculty.
10. Promotion of Dr. J. Vigneshwaran, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 1 year 8 months against the requirement of 5 years. Consequently, Unit-VI is left with only 2 Faculty.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. Assistant Professor, Shri G. Vijaya Kumar possesses M.Sc. in Environmental Toxicology, which is not a permissible academic qualification.
8. Nil journals are available in the departmental library.
9. Candidates appearing in the examination have not presented a poster, read a paper at National/ State conference or presented a research paper.
10. Deficiency of Faculty for U.G. 50 seats (as required per Regulations):
 - a. Assoc. Professor: 1
 - b. Tutor: 2
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 12 to 16 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty (a) Asst. Professor: 5
2. Shortage of Senior Residents: 14
3. Central Research Laboratory is not available.
4. Unit 4 has only 1 faculty, hence, it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit at all
5. Unit 6, 7, 8 have only 2 faculty each, hence, they cannot be considered as PG units.
6. Specialty clinics like Surgical Oncology clinic is not run.
7. Equipment like Upper GI Endoscope, Colonoscope are not available.
8. There are NIL publications from the department in indexed journal in last 3 years.
9. Academic parameters like Case Presentations (12/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
10. There is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-I.
11. Promotion of Dr. Mohd. Bashir, Assoc. Professor, Unit-II, is not as per Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 3 years 1 month against the requirement of 5 years. Hence, he cannot be considered as Assoc. Professor. Consequently, there are only 2 Faculty in Unit-II.
12. Promotion of Dr. Priya Radha Krishnan is not as per Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 5 months against the requirement of 5 years without any publications. Hence, she cannot be considered as P.G. Teacher.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 12 to 16 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of

The Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained

at Institute of Navel Medicine, INHS, Aswini be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. N. Medical College, Swangi, Wardha because of the following facts:-

1. There are Nil Major Obstetric Operations on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days.
2. Details of separate ICU for Obstetrics are not provided.
3. Details of beds occupied in ICUs are not provided.
4. USG is functional only in Gynecology.
5. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (21/year), Journal Clubs (13/year) are inadequate.
6. Toilet facility is not available in Doctor's duty room attached to Labor room.
7. There is only 1 Newborn Resuscitation table in the labor room for 5 delivery tables.
8. Stipend is proposed to be increased at par with Government rates from this year admission. It is not clarified, it will be paid at the same rate to the PG students already admitted or not.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 06 to 09 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

1. There is only 1 publication from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years and that also a case report, which cannot be considered.
2. There are NIL Senior Residents/ Tutors.
3. Total numbers of Blood units supplied has decreased from 907 in 2012 to 220 in 2014.
4. Haematology investigative workload is 200/year implying daily average of 0.6, which is inadequate.
5. Bone Marrow Biopsy workload is NIL during the whole year.
6. Academic parameters like Journal Clubs (12/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
7. Faculty Table does not specify that the Faculty has PG qualification and experience at different ranks in which subject. Their experience certificate from college, where they have worked previously is not attached.
8. No certificate of 2 years special training in IHBT to any faculty member has been attached.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. There are NIL publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
2. Total Hip Replacement & Total Knee Replacement instruments sets are not present but they are provided by the respective company on the day of operation.
3. Number of Major cases weekly is 7 implying daily average of 1, which is inadequate.
4. Number of Minor cases weekly is 4 cases implying daily average of 0.6, which is inadequate.
5. Specialty clinics like Hand Clinic, Arthroplasty clinic are not run.
6. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (19/year), Journal Clubs (21/year) are inadequate.
7. Promotion of Dr. T.M. Jose, Professor and HoD is not as per Regulations. He has been Assoc. Professor for 1 year only.
8. In the faculty table, there are no dates given about the experience of faculty in different ranks.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 77. MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai - Recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine/Community Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine/Community Medicine) qualification for 2 seats at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Social & Preventive Medicine/Community Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(Ophthalmology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 06 seats granted by B.N. Mandal University in respect of students being trained at Mata Gujri Memorial Medical College, Kishanganj be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

80. Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai - Renewal of recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 1 seat at Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai granted by Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 1 seat granted by Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai because of the following facts:-

1. Workload of DSA is NIL during last 3 years.
2. Workload of the following procedures is inadequate:
 - (a) CT guided Biopsy/FNAC 26/year
 - (b) USG guided Biopsy/FNAC 83/year
 - (c) Mammography 104/year
3. Institute has stated that stipend paid by Govt. of Maharashtra to its Residents is Rs. 20, 000; Rs. 23, 000 & Rs. 26, 000 p.m. to I/II/III year residents, respectively, which is wrong & misleading as the stipend paid by Govt. of Maharashtra is much higher. By showing that the institute is

paying stipend at the same rate the institute & Dean have misled the Council.

4. Data provided do not match e.g. at item #6 of summary on Page 2, it is shown that there are 104 Mammography in 2014, while at item 9 in Part II Departmental information, it is shown as 157.
5. Details of Senior Residents are not provided in SAF.
6. The Publications quoted are 36 but no reference or reprints have been provided.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Pharmacology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats granted by Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai because of the following facts:-

1. Institute has stated that stipend paid by Govt. of Maharashtra to its Residents is Rs. 20, 000; Rs. 23, 000 & Rs. 26, 000 p.m. to I/II/III year residents, respectively, which is wrong & misleading as the stipend paid by Govt. of Maharashtra is much higher. By showing that the institute is paying stipend at the same rate, the institute & Dean have misled the Council.
2. There is no designation like Asst. Professor/ Lecturer/ Tutor, which the College Authorities have said about 12 Doctors. It can't be understood that the College Authorities want to show them in which rank.

3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 5 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

83. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Pushpagiri Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Centre, Tiruvalla.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 2 seats at Pushpagiri Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Centre, Tiruvalla granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government

that MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Pushpagiri Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Centre, Tiruvalla be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

84. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Pushpagiri Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Centre, Tiruvalla.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification for 2 seats at Pushpagiri Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Centre, Tiruvalla granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Pushpagiri Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Centre, Tiruvalla because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. G. Vijaylakshmi, Professor is not as per Regulations as she has been promoted after cut-off date in June 2015 with only 3 publications in indexed journals against requirement of 4 as per Regulations.
2. Resultantly, there is deficiency of faculty (a) Asso. Professor: 1
3. Academic parameters like Journal Club (14/year), Group Discussions (14/year) are inadequate.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted in the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. 85. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences, Deemed University - Recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 06 seats at Rural Medical College, Loni granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences, Deemed University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Ophthalmology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 06 seats granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences, Deemed University in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni because of the following facts:-

1. Allotment of cases in the examination is not as per MCI guidelines. Six short cases were given for each candidate against 1 long case & 2 short cases as per norms by MCI.
2. Department personnel expressed their inability to provide their invoices or record of possession when asked for.
3. Handwritten statistics given by department of Anesthesiology do not match with those given by department of Ophthalmology.
4. Details of pediatric cases operated are not provided.
5. Only basic Retinal Surgeries are performed.
6. The College got first LoP on 07/12/1995, the following faculty members have been given experience from the dates mentioned against their names (before first LoP), which is not permissible:
 - a. Dr. Surekha V. Baugal, Professor & HoD: 11/02/1992
 - b. Dr. Soman Mish, Professor: 02/08/1993
 - c. Dr. Kishore Bunde: 08/07/1984
7. Promotion of Dr. Subhangi Nigwekar, is not as per Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 3 months against the requirement of 5 years. Hence, she cannot be considered.
8. 4 Junior Residents, namely Dr. Patil Bhushan Kashinath, Dr. Siddiqui F. Zakir, Dr. Mohammed Samsamuddin and Dr. Gupte Pravin, who have joined as post graduate students on 2nd May, 2012 have been given orders to the effect that from 2nd May, 2015, they are working as Senior Residents, all of whom are taking examination on 07/05/2015. According to MCI, they have completed 3 years experience in the department. If these students are considered as Junior Residents as still they are taking exams, there will be only one Senior Resident in the department.
9. Instruments and equipments were available but department people expressed inability to provide their invoice or record of possession when asked for.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 6 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted in the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

87. MJP Rohilkhand University - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 2 to 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Shri Ram Murti Smarak Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bareilly.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualification for 2 to 4 seats granted by MJP Rohilkhand University in respect of students being trained at Shri Ram Murti Smarak Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bareilly be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

88. MJP Rohilkhand University - Recognition of MD(Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Shri Ram Murti Smarak Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bareilly.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

89. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of Diploma in Clinical Pathology(DCP) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

90. Kerala University of Health Sciences - Recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Sri Gokulam Medical College Trust & Research Foundation, Trivandrum.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

1. Clinical Pharmacology laboratory is grossly inadequate.
2. There are only 2 publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
3. Academic parameters like Journal Club (20/year), Group Discussions (20/year) are inadequate.
4. Details of activities of Pharmaco-Vigilance Committee are not submitted.
5. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. Messlani Sunitha, Asst. Professor is not recognized.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course.
