The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence were received from Dr. Raja Babu Panwar, Dr. (Mrs.) Rani Bhaskaran, Dr. Deelip Govindrao Mhaisekar Member(s), Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

No objection/observation made by any member of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee. The minutes of the last meeting confirmed.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

Action has been taken on the minutes of the last meetings dated 24.05.2016, 03.06.2016, 17.06.2016, 01.07.2016, 12.07.2016, 26.07.2016 & 09.08.2016. Minutes of the remaining meetings dated 30.08.2016, 07.09.2016, 16.09.2016 22.09.2016 and 29.09.2016 still not received from the Oversight Committee.

Action will be taken on receipt of the Minutes from the Oversight Committee.

3. Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bhatinda.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23/06/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 02 seats at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bhatinda granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23/06/2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification for 02 seats granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bhatinda because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Prem Kumar, Professor, Unit III has been promoted after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left blank implying there are NIL research publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations and he cannot be considered.
2. Resultantly, there are only 2 faculty in the Unit and it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit.
3. Total number of patients admitted as IPD has decreased from 6,060 in 2013 to 5,924 in 2015.
4. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic, Urology clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology clinic, Neutosurgery clinic, Paediatric Surgery clinic are not run.
5. Total IPD in 2015 – 5924; Total Major Operations – 5649, which means only 306 patients admitted who did not have Major Surgery, which is not feasible. There were also 10150 Minor Operations (excluding 772 Day Care Operations), which means they were also admitted.
6. Publications only 1. One is a Case Report, one (Dengue Fever) unrelated to Surgery. No reference of 2 of them have been given.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

4. Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot - Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bhatinda.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23/06/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 02 seats at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bhatinda granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23/06/2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Microbiology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bhatinda because of the following facts:-

1. Molecular laboratory is under development.
2. Dr. Narinder Kaur, Dr. Surinder Singh, Dr. Sabjeet Singh Sohi have been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however details of their research publications are not given in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether their promotion is as per Regulations or not.
3. Institute is paying stipend to Residents @ Rs. 4,000 p.m. which is much less than paid by the State Govt. to Residents.
4. Faculty Table not signed by any faculty member.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

5. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (20/06/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 03 seats at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (20/06/2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government

that the recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 03 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

6. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (20/06/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (20/06/2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Rahi K.B., Senior Resident in Unit II does not have experience of 3 years as Resident in medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident and hence not eligible to hold the post; there is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
2. ECG machines are not available in many wards.
3. Haematology, Histopathology, FNAC & Cytology statistics were not available in the Central laboratory.
4. Total deaths last year – 523. From other reports, subject wise deaths last year are as follows:
 - a. OBG – 9
 - b. Surgery – 20
 - c. Orthopaedics – 8
 - d. Paediatrics – 24
 - e. Medicine – 130
5. Total – 191, in which other departments the remaining 332 deaths have occurred. The data is non-genuine and fictitious.
6. In Casualty OT and Dressing Room are in the same room.
7. Library not fully Air-conditioned.
8. On the day of assessment no blood was used in entire hospital and there was no delivery or Caesarean Section.
9. Dean refused to sign the report.
10. Faculty Table is not signed by any member & list of publications not mentioned in Faculty Table.
11. Promotion of Dr. M. Phani, Assoc. Professor, Unit-I is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years 2 months against the requirement of 5 years. Unit-I has no other Assoc. Professor.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake 4 to 6 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

Note: The Dean may be summoned along with record of Deaths & Births (certified by the Registrar of Deaths & Births) of the whole hospital for the last year.

7. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Bhaskar Medical College, Yenkapally.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18/06/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 01 seat at Bhaskar Medical College, Yenkapally granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18/06/2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Bhaskar Medical College, Yenkapally because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. K. Jyotsna and Dr. C. Deepalatha, Assoc. Professors is not as per Regulations. They were Asst. Professor for 4 years and 4 years 1 month, respectively without any publication. Resultantly, there is a deficiency of Assoc. Professor: 1. (All publications of Dr. C. Deeplatha are outside her period of Asst. Professorship)
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18/06/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat at Bhaskar Medical College, Yenkapally granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18/06/2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Bhaskar Medical College, Yenkapally be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

9. Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot - Recognition of DM(Nephrology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Christian Medical College, Ludhiana.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (14/06/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Nephrology) qualification for 01 seat at Christian Medical College, Ludhiana granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14/06/2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Nephrology) qualification for 01 seat granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Christian Medical College, Ludhiana because of the following facts:-

1. Unit is headed by Dr. Timothy Rajamanickam who is Asso. Prof. which is not permissible.
2. Dr. Timothy Rajamanickam has joined only 7 days back. He was on leave for one month. How he has been shown as on Duty in Faculty Table. This amounts to supplying misleading information. Both Faculty and Dean be asked to explain.

3. There is no Senior Resident in the Unit.
4. Amongst senior faculty, Dr. Basant Pawar, Professor & Dr. RajanIsaccs, Asso. Prof. have joined just 1 month before.
5. Details of Junior Residents are not provided in the faculty table.
6. Workload of Peritoneal Dialysis (Implant) has decreased from 30 in 2013-2014 to 24 in 2015-2016.
7. There is only 1 research publication form the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
8. Details of Examiners not provided.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

10. Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot - Renewal of recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (16/06/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification for 01 seat at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (16/06/2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification for 01 seat granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

11. Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot - Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (13/06/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 01 seat at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (13/06/2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 01 seat granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana because of the following facts:-

1. There was only 1 Major & 2 Minor operations on day of assessment.
2. Average daily OPD attendance is 58, which is bare minimum (50) even to start PG course.
3. NIL new books have been purchased in last 3 years in the Departmental Library.
4. Equipment like Capsulotomy machine, VCR are not in working order on day of assessment.
5. Promotion of Dr. Sumit Chopra, Professor is not as per Regulations. He was promoted on 01/10/2014 after the cut-off date without any publications. There is no other Professor/ Assoc. Professor in the department.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (13/06/2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Nephrology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. VikasMakkar has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however details of research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
2. None of the Senior Residents has any experience as Resident in the department before appointment as Senior Resident in nephrology; hence not eligible to hold the post.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (12/06/2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 10 to 12 seats granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana because of the following facts:-

1. Assessment was on Sunday; hence data of clinical material on assessment day could not be verified.

2. Date of first LoP when MBBS course was first started has been given different in reports of Ophthalmology, Medicine and OBG, which is not feasible.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 10 to 12 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. Number of Major Operations has decreased from 559 in 2013 to 521 in 2015.
3. Number of Minor Operations has decreased from 1,370 in 2013 to 1,206 in 2015.
4. BERA workload as well as Impedance Audiometry workload was NIL on day of assessment.
5. There were only 2 Major operations on day of assessment. Total number 521 Major operations in 2015 implies daily average of 1.7 which is inadequate.
6. Total workload of BERA was only 48 in 2015.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1 seats each for degree and diploma after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 5. IUI services are not available.
6. Only 5 recent books have been purchased in Departmental Library in last 3 years.
7. DGO & MD examination held simultaneously on same day by same examiners, which is not as per Regulations.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Bed occupancy on day of assessment is 70%.
3. Workload of the following procedures was very less in 2015:
 - (a) Skin Grafting procedures: 2;
 - (b) Nail Surgeries: 1;
 - (c) LASER for Scar revision: NIL.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Promotion of following faculty is not as per Regulations:
 - a. Dr. Vijay Mohan, Professor, Unit-II. Promoted on 21/03/2015 without any publications. Unit left with 2 Faculty only.
 - b. Dr. S. Mohammed Ali, Professor, Unit-III. Promoted on 09/03/2015 without any publications.
2. Details of stipend paid by State Govt. of Telangana to Residents are not provided. Institute is paying stipend of Rs. 18,000 p.m.; Rs. 19,000 p.m. & Rs. 20,000 p.m. to I/II/III year Residents respectively which is less than that paid by State Govt.
3. Details of beds occupied in ICCU & ICUs are not provided.
4. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular clinic, Nephrology clinic, Medical Gastroenterology clinic, Neurology clinic are not run by the department of General medicine.
5. Dr. A.A. Pasha, Asso. Prof. has been promoted after cut-off date; however, column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank implying there are NIL publications; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered; resultantly faculty complement in Unit I is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
6. Dr. DilipGude, Senior Resident in Unit 4 does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27/06/2016 (for Degree) and 28/06/2016 (for Diploma)) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification for 01 seat and not to recognize DPM qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Dr. Pinnammaneni Siddhartha Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Foundation, Chinnaoutpalli because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. P. Krishna Mohan, Professor is not as per Regulations. He was promoted on 12/04/2016 after the cut-off date without any publications.
2. Promotion of Dr. K. Madhuri, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. She was promoted on 26/05/2016 after the cut-off date without any publications.
3. Dr. Sripathi S. Goud has only 2 years experience before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
4. There is no participation in National Mental Health Programme.
5. Academic parameters like Journal Clubs (13/year), Case Presentations (20/year), Group Discussions (22/year) are inadequate.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 17/03/2016 received from the Under Secretary, to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith a copy of letter No.Acad/6571/MC dated 05-3-2016 of Principal/Dean, Government Medical College, Srinagar regarding the submission of revised application form along with Essentiality Certificate/consent of affiliation of University of Kashmir, and Rs 2 lacs as recognition fee for recognition/restoration of MS Anatomy for appropriate necessary action by the Medical Council of India u/s 11(2) & 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and regulation framed thereunder and noted that the application cannot be both under section 10A and 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 as has been stated in the request. If it was under section 11(2) for recognition (as stated by Dean) then inspection has to be on examination day. But here SAF Part-III pertaining to Examination is left blank, which means no examination was held and inspected on that day. The office may write to Dean that if they want an inspection u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 they should apply through University to the Central Government apprising the date of examination so that assessment can be done on the date of examination (A copy of section 11(2) of IMC Act, 1956 be sent).

1. Dr. Yadlapally Ajay Kumar promoted Assoc. Professor on 16/03/2015 after the cut-off date. 3 out of 4 publications are Case Reports, one review article, which cannot be accepted. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations. Resultantly unit left with 2 Faculty only.
2. Workload of Laryngo\Tracheoplasty is only 2 during the period of preceding 3 years.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. One of the examiners Dr. Sadhana Sharma was non-medical and refused to provide details of her degree. Hence, she cannot be accepted.
2. Data in Table – 5, page 2 cannot be of Biochemistry Department.
3. No record of Indian Journals in Library.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Unit I is headed by Asso. Prof. Unit II which is headed by Professor does not have any Asso. Prof.; hence faculty complement is incomplete in both Units.
2. Resultantly, deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.
3. Department is headed by Dr. Gurinder Singh who is only Asso. Prof. which is not permissible.
4. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 09 on day of assessment.
5. Details of beds occupied in ICU on day of assessment are not provided.
6. There are 2 O.T.s which have 3 tables implying 1 O.T. has 2 tables which is not as per norms.
7. Dr. Jagdeep Singh, Asst. Professor, Unit-II was not available on inspection day. Unit-2 left with 2 Faculty and it cannot be considered P.G. Unit.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Ortho qualification for 02 seats (01 & 01 to 02 seats) granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

Prof. and it cannot be considered as teaching Unit.
8. Dr. Vincent Thomas Abraham has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years 10 months as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years as per Regulations; however out of 3 publications cited in the list of publications, 2 are case reports & 1 appears to be a review article; hence he does not have 2 research publications to his credit as required as per Regulations; resultantly his promotion is not as per Regulations and he

cannot be considered & Unit 5 is headed by Asst. Prof. & it cannot be considered as teaching Unit.

9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2 seats each for degree and diploma till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 4. Resultantly there is no eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
5. Details of participation in National Mental Health programme are not provided.

2. Dr. P. Venkateswar has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying there are NIL research publications to his credit against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered; resultantly the Unit is headed by Asst. Prof. and left with 2 faculty & it cannot be considered as teaching Unit.

1. There are 5 Units with 30 beds – i.e. total 150 beds. However in Item § 6 of Summary on P. 2, Bed occupancy is shown as 171 & 95% which is not feasible.
2. MRI is not available.
3. Dr. Vijay Narasimha Reddy, Asso. Prof. in Unit I has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however the column of “Benefit of publications” in the faculty table has been left blank implying there are NIL publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. Investigative facilities like Nerve conduction, EMG are not available.
5. OPD/ IPD data of inspection day is of some other departments (Page 2)

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.
2. Dr. C. Kavya has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however she does not have requisite publications as stated in the faculty table against requirement of 2; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
3. Dr. N. Konaiah; Dr. J. Venkata Siva, both Senior Residents do not have 3 years experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post; resultantly there is Shortage of Senior Residents: 2.
4. MRI is not available.
5. The column of stipend by institute to Residents has been left blank in item § 24 of Summary. It means no stipend is being paid, which is not as per Regulations.
6. Details of beds occupied in ICUs on day of assessment are not provided.
7. Details of beds occupied in Post-operative care area on day of assessment are not provided.
8. Promotion of Dr. C. Sunil, Professor is not as per Regulations. He was Assoc. Professor for 3 years and promoted Professor on 28/01/2016 after the cut-off date without any publications.
9. Promotion of Dr. D. Balaji, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He was promoted on 16/04/2015 after the cut-off date without any publications.
10. Promotion of Dr. N. Srinivas Rao, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He was promoted on 24/04/2016 after the cut-off date without any publications.
11. There are 2 Senior Residents available and one of them is not eligible. Resultantly, deficiencies of Senior Resident: 2.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Dr. M. RiyazBaig, Senior Resident does not have experience of 3 years as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
2. Details of books purchased in last 3 years in the Departmental Library are not provided.
3. Facilities for Retinal Surgery are not available.
4. No MRI in the Institute.
5. Prescribed SAF has not been used.
6. Promotion of Dr. ATTI Sri Hari, Professor & HoD is not as per Regulations. He was Assoc. Professor for 3 years 8 months and promoted Professor on 27/11/2015 after the cut-off date without any publication.
7. Promotion of Dr. V. Vijayalaxmi, Professor is not as per Regulations. She was promoted on 28/01/2016 after the cut-off date without any publications.
8. Dr. M. Riyaz Beg, Senior Resident with DOMS qualification is not eligible. No 3 years experience as Junior Resident in a Medical College.
9. As per Table 7 Page 9, there are 20-30 Major Operations daily in 8 OT (Entire Hospital). But as per Sr. No. 9 Page 14, there were 24 Major Operations of Eye Department alone, which is not feasible. From yearly

data – average daily Major Operations are six only (1863/300). This is data mismatch.

1. Dr. R. Prabhakar Rao, Professor & HoD was Assoc. Professor for 3 years 11 months 16 days. Hence his promotion from Assoc. Professor to Professor is not as per Regulations. He has no publication.
2. Name of Dr. P. Rajashekhar is not mentioned in the Faculty Table. Hence, he was not verified.
3. Promotion of Dr. Vijay Kumar is not as per Regulations. He was promoted Assoc. Professor on 01/03/2015 after the cut-off date without any publication.
4. MRI workload of the whole hospital is only 10 on day of assessment.
5. Academic parameters like Journal Clubs (20/year), Group Discussions (10 in no.) are inadequate.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

6. Total number of patients admitted last year (IPD) 6121. Major Operations + Deliveries + Caesarean Sections = 6166, which is not feasible. Data is non-genuine.
7. Stipend paid by State Govt. to Residents is Rs. 30,000; Rs. 35,000 and Rs. 40,000 p.m. to the I, II, III year students respectively, while that paid by the institute to Residents is Rs. 25,000 p.m., which is less and contrary to Regulations.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. There was Nil major or minor operation on day of assessment.
3. Total major operations are 624 in 2015 implying daily average of 2.1 which is inadequate.
4. Equipment like High Definition camera with Recording is not available.
5. Surgical workload is of poor quality. Operations like Tracheoplasty, Maxillectomy, Angiofibroma and other Head & Neck Surgeries are not done.
6. Average attendance at Cancer related Specialty clinic is 0-1 which is less.
7. All publications are in online journals, none of which are indexed.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

There is no other Assoc.Prof. in the only Unit.
2. Facility for care of Acute cases is not available.
3. It is not clear whether department is participating in National Mental Health Programme or not. No details of such participation are provided.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23/06/2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize DA qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church Medical College, Kolenchery because of the following facts:-

1. Faculty deficiency : Assoc.Prof. -1, Asst.Prof.-1.
2. Dr. SM Philip has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, only 2 publications are cited against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations and she cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Sunitha K Zacharia has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in the column of Benefit of publications in the faculty table, only 2 publications are cited against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered. Out of 2 publications quoted one is a case report and other review article, which cannot be considered.
4. Dr. Sara Korula has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, in the column of Benefit of publications in the faculty table, only 2 publications are cited against requirement of 4; hence here promotion is not as per Regulations &

she cannot be considered. One of the two publications is in Saudi journal, which is not indexed.

5. MRI workload on day of assessment was only 01, which indicates inadequate clinical material.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

92. Bundelkhand University - Recognition of MD(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 6 seats and Renewal of recognition for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at M.L.B. Medical College, Jhansi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (29th June, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 6 seats and not to renew the recognition for 4 seats granted by Bundelkhand University in respect of students being trained at M.L.B. Medical College, Jhansi because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Asutosh Mishra of Unit-I has been appointed straightaway as Assoc.Prof. after cut-off date without any experience as Asstt.Prof. Further, the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank implying there are Nil publications against requirement of 2; hence his appointment is not as per Regulations and he cannot be considered.
2. Resultantly, there are only 2 faculty in Unit I & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Dr. Sudhir Kumar, Professor in Unit-II has been promoted as Assoc.Prof. with experience of only 2 years against requirement of 5 years; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations and he cannot be considered.
4. Dr. Manish Jain, Assoc.Prof. in Unit-III has been promoted as Assoc.Prof. with experience of only 2 years 4 month as Asstt.Prof. against requirement of 5 years; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations and he cannot be considered; resultantly Unit III is headed by Asstt.Prof. and cannot be considered as teaching unit.
5. Speciality clinics like Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology Clinic, Paediatric Surgery clinic, Surgical Oncology clinic are not run.
6. Total number of admitted patients has decreased from 8,698 in 2013 to 7,893 in 2015.
7. Total number of Minor operations has decreased from 1,346 in 2013 to 1,139 in 2015.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 4 to 6 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Medical College, Jhansi because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. N.S. Sengar, HOD is designated as Professor of Nephrology in Medicine; which is not feasible. Further, he has been promoted as Professor with experience of 3 years as Assoc.Prof; however, column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank implying there are Nil publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations and he cannot be considered. The appointment of Dr. N.S. Sengar, Prof.&HOD, as Asst.Prof. & Assoc.Prof. was in the Department of Nephrology. Hence, cannot be considered in Medicine.
2. Dr. Nutan Kumar Agarwal, Professor has been promoted as Assoc.Prof. with experience of only 4 years as Asstt.Prof.; however, column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank implying there are Nil publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations and he cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Rambabu Singh, Unit IV has been shown as "Associate Professor" in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table; however, in the column of

experience, it is shown as "Assistant Professor" w.e.f. 29/09/2013 till date, which is not feasible.

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. against increased intake from 4 to 7 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Promotion of Dr. Sunil Patil, is not as per regulations, he was promoted on 15.07.2014 after the cut-off date without any publications.
2. Promotion of Dr. Vikrant Magdum, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. 4 years and 5 months against the requirement of 5 years and promoted on 27.11.2015 after the cut-off date without any publications.
3. Dr. Vilayam A Issapure, Assoc. Prof., Unit-III, is not as per regulations. She was promoted Assoc. Prof. on 1.8.2015. Out of 3 publications, 2 are case reports which cannot be considered. Resultantly, there is no Assoc. Prof. in Unit-III.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Promotion of Divya Soin, Assoc.Prof., Unit-III, is not as per regulation, She was Asst.Prof. 4 years and 2 months. Out of 3 publications, 2 are care report, which cannot be considered. Resultantly, there is no Assoc.Prof. in Unit-III.
2. Promotion of Dr. Shaminder Kaur, Assoc.Prof., Unit-I, is not as per regulations. She was Asst.Prof. 4 years and 5 months against the requirement of 5 years. She was promoted on 5.04.2016 after the cut of date without any publications.
3. Shortage of Senior Residents-2.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Bed occupancy is 56% on day of assessment.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/06/2016 (for 1 to 2 degree seats)) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015 & 16/03/2016 (for 1 to 2 degree seats) and 21/06/2016 (for 1 diploma seat)) and compliance dated 28/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of DDVL qualification for 1 seat granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

102. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 5 seats in respect of students being trained at Rajarajeswari Medical College & Hospital, Bangalore.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (13/07/2016 (for 3 to 5 seats)) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014; 26/05/2015 (for 2 seats), May, 2015 for 2 to 3 seats and 13/07/2016 (for 3 to 5 seats)) and compliance dated 04/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 5 seats at Rajarajeswari Medical College & Hospital, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (13/07/2016 (for 3 to 5 seats)) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014; 26/05/2015 (for 2 seats), May, 2015 for 2 to 3 seats and 13/07/2016 (for 3 to 5 seats)) and compliance dated 04/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 05 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Rajarajeswari Medical College & Hospital, Bangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

103. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats and renewal of recognition for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016 (for 2 seats)) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015 (for 2 seats) and 05/04/2016 (for 2 to 4 seats)) and compliance dated 11/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats and renewal of recognition for 02 seats at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016 (for 2 seats)) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015 (for 2 seats) and 05/04/2016 (for 2 to 4 seats)) and compliance dated 11/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

104. Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification in respect of students being trained at R N T Medical College, Udaipur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (17th & 18th August, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification at R N T Medical College, Udaipur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the request of the institute pertaining to starting of course in 1982 and affiliation of institute earlier to University of Rajasthan and making necessary correction in date of recognition. The Postgraduate Committee decided to refer the matter to Government with following information. :

- (i) Date when the course was started – 18.3.1982.
- (ii) Date when 1st batch appeared in examination - 1992.
- (iii) Date of assessment/inspection on the basis of which recognition was recommended – 17.08.2015.

105. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats and recognition against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Aswini.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (14/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 11/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats and recognition against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Aswini granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (14/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 11/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities alongwith the legal opinion of the Law Officer.

The Members of Postgraduate Committee referred the matter back to the Law Officer to review. The opinion given is not on the issue for which the matter was referred for legal opinion.

106. Approval of the Minutes of the Monitoring Sub-Committee meeting held on 29.03.2016-reg.

Read: the Minutes of the Monitoring Sub-Committee meeting held on 29.03.2016.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Minutes of the Monitoring Sub-Committee meeting held on 29.03.2016 and decided item-wise as under:-

1. Decision of the Monitoring Sub-Committee approved, Law Officer be asked to apprise the latest status of the stay order.
2. No reply has been given about the date of joining of the PG students, which was the main observations in the earlier decision of the Postgraduate Committee. Whether the admission were made within the stipulated time frame or after that. This information be obtained and if any other development in the matter, the same should be included in the agenda and brought before the Postgraduate Committee later on.
3. The letter from the Dean clearly states that admission has been done without permission from the Central Govt.(Ministry of Health & F.W.)/Medical Council of India, which is not permissible as per regulations.

The Monitoring Sub-Committee has not made any comments about this, but they have only said about the DM(Cardiology). The matter is referred back for recommendations of the Monitoring Sub-Committee in accordance with the regulations, about all subjects. It is not clear from minutes whether a formal request under Section 11(2) has been received through university for recognition inspection when first batch **next** appears in exam.

The institution be asked to apply for recognition assessment Under Section 11(2) through the affiliating university and Central Government so that recognition assessment can be done at the time of next coming examination and number of seats can be fixed in accordance with available faculty and infrastructure.
5. Legal opinion be obtained whether in service candidates can be admitted without entrance examination or not.
6. Explanation given by the college be accepted.
7. Approved.
8. Approved. From minutes it is not clear whether these admissions are done on vacant seats or not. This clarification be obtained. In the meantime legal opinion be obtained whether in service candidates can be admitted without appearing in entrance examination or not.
9. Approved. Institute be asked to submit compliance within two weeks. Copy of discharge notice be sent to Secretary(ME) Assam, DME and State Medical Council and representative of Assam State on MCI.

Excess admissions made in various PG course (as tabulated below) are not approved since they have been made without any letter of Permission from Ministry of Health & Family Welfare. HRD Ministry while granting 27% reservation to OBC category had nowhere stated that normal prescribed procedure in regulations for such increase should not be followed.

The explanation given by college authorities to the following four observations of the Postgraduate Committee made on 22.12.2015 is not tenable and cannot be accepted:

1. *The increase has been given to the tune of 53%, whereas, the recommendation from Government of India was for 27% increase (existing seats 88 increased 46). In some subjects, the increase is 100%, whereas, in other there is no increase.*
2. *The Institute has not attached Letter of Permission from Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, which they were supposed to obtain.*
3. *In the letter it is said that increase will be in MBBS as well as in PG seats but the Institution has not increased the MBBS seats.*
4. *One of the conditions in HRD Ministry's letter was phasing of expansion capacity in order to ensure that seats available in the unreserved category are not reduced. Have the institution expanded their capacity to accommodate the increased seats (whether necessary increase in faculty and infrastructure has been done) by now since, seven years have passed.*

However, the Postgraduate Committee decided that the matter may be referred to the Ministry of Health & FW and the Govt. may like to grant ex-post-facto Letter of Permission as was done in the case of M.Ch. Surgical Oncology of this institute (Govt. of India, MoH&FW vide letter No.U.18018/57/2013-ME)P-II)(FTS67644) Dated 11.08.2015).

44. The college authorities be directed to apply renewal of recognition at the next coming examination and number of seats be fixed in accordance with the available faculty and infrastructure.
IP University is not an authority prescribed under statute to fix annual intake.

107. Deferred for want of time.

108. Earlier decision is reiterated since PG seats cannot be allowed to go unfilled.

However, if the Monitoring Committee feels in any case that admissions have been manipulated by any private college and the Govt. has not been informed to fill-up Govt. quota seats well in time, punitive action should be taken against the

college, However, If the Govt. representative gives in writing that no more candidates are available in Govt. quota, the institution cannot be blamed. The Monitoring Committee may send a circular (well in time) to all DME's that they should fill up Govt. quota seats well in time and also inform the Dean's of private medical colleges that govt. quota seats if filled by management quota (till govt. representative gives in writing that no more candidates are available/will be allotted by Govt. or last date of filling Govt. quota seats is already over) proportionate number of seats will be deducted from management quota next year. However, vice versa shall also be true. If the college management feels (and have documentary evidence) that their quota seats have been wrongly given to the Govt. (On the recommendations of MCI/Monitoring Committee/or otherwise) they should also be free to claim proportionate number of seats from Govt. quota next year.

109. Any Other matter.

Subject: Consideration of Order dated 22.04.2016 of the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay in WP No. 1001 of 2014 and WP No. 1234 of 2014 -Reg.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that pursuant to the hearing granted to Dr. Rajiv R Satoskar, Prof. & HoD, Deptt. Of Surgery, LTM Medical College and LTM Gen. Hosp., Sion, Mumbai, the Dean of the college has vide his letter dated 28.09.2016 forwarded the requisite documents sought for by the Committee in the hearing held on 22.09.2016.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the Hon'ble High Court had in its order dated 01.09.2016 in WP No.1001 of 2014 – Felice Faizal Mohammed Ebrahim Kutty Vs. State of Maharashtra and Ors. And WP No.1234 of 2014 – Prateek Chandrashekhar Patil Vs. State of Maharashtra has held as under:-

- "1) *After this writ petition was first heard and the Medical Council of India (MCI) was directed to consider the issue raised and pass a speaking order, an order, an order was passed purported to be dated 26th July, 2016.*
- 2) *The writ petition was thereafter permitted to be amended.*
- 3) *Presently, before us the only contention that was raised is that the MCI was directed by this court's order and direction to examine and consider the issue. The decision is taken by one monitoring sub-committee. That is not a decision of the MCI. In that regard our attention was invited to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 and the regulations made thereunder.*
Mr.Khandeparkar appearing for the petitioners contended that section 9 requires that the council shall firstly constitute from amongst its members an executive committee and such other committees for general or other purposes as the council deems necessary to carry out the purposes of the Act. He would submit that this monitoring sub-committee has no legal status, it is not recognised for it is not clarified that it is constituted by the council. It is not enough that such other committees constituted by the council then constitute monitoring sub-committee.
- 4) *On the other hand, Mr. Gole learned counsel appearing for the MCI, relied upon some provisions and some of the regulations to urge that it is permissible for the executive committee to constitute or establish sub-committee, much less monitoring subcommittee and in that regard our attention was invited to Regulation 45 of the Medical Council of India Regulations, 2000.*
- 5) *When this court was considering the above contentions yesterday, it was suggested to Mr. Gole that the council may have to then invite the court's verdict on the jurisdiction/power and authority of the monitoring sub-committee and whether its composition and constitution is traceable to Regulation 45 and whether the power of the executive committee could be said to be in conflict with that of the council. Mr. Gole sought time to take instructions. It was also deemed fit and necessary by this court in the*

given facts and circumstances that the decision, which has far reaching consequences on the career of the petitioner, ought to be taken by the council or such other authorised entity as the law permits. In the light of this view and suggestion of the court, Mr.Gole sought time to take instructions.

- 6) Today he has produced written instructions from the Secretary in-charge of the MCI and comprised in a letter addressed to him dated 1st September, 2016. We take this communication addressed on record and mark it as 'X' for identification. We do not examine any larger issue or legal question raised at this stage. In the light of para 6 of this written communication and once the MCI has agreed to take back and withdraw its decision dated 26th July, 2016 and have a fresh look at the issue raised in the petition, we deem it fit and proper to direct the MCI to act in terms of para 6 of this communication. It is stated that the Post-graduate Medical Education Committee of the council, constituted under section 20 of the Act for assisting the council in matters relating post-graduate medical education is holding its meeting on 7th September, 2016. The matter, as directed by this court, would be placed for consideration of this committee on 7th September, 2016. Thereafter, at a full meeting of the council, likely to be convened in October, 2016, the MCI will apply its mind to the said recommendations and convey its final opinion and decision on the issues raised in this petition. We expect the council not to delay the matter further and place its final decision or opinion on the record of this petition and proceedings by 15th November, 2016.
- 7) We place this matter for "directions" on 18th November, 2016.
- 8) The original documents and placed before us by Mr. Gole be returned to him provided Mr. Gole replaces them with certified true copies.
- 9) We hope and trust that the council will take a decision in the best interest of post-graduate medical education and career of the students given the fact that they are urging throughout that it is they who are not responsible for any fault of the medical colleges.

Subsequently, he had joined the PG course on the basis of the said letter on 18.06.2012. However, the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences has sought for cancellation of his admission vide their letter dated 15.01.2014, as his admission was over and above sanctioned capacity. By this time they had completed more than a half of their studies training. This had happened due to oversight of authorities of LTM Medical College who have sought from the MCI regularization of their seat. He had inter-alia prayed before the Hon'ble High Court that the MCI and MUHS should include his name in the roll of registered students and provide him all facilities, rights and privileges imparity with other students granted admission in MD(Pathology) course for the academic year 2012-15. Further, the Dr. Felice Faizal Mohammed Ebrahim Kutty had also sought directions from the Hon'ble Court for the MUHS to issue degree completion certificate to petitioner in MD(Pathology) degree course for the academic year 2012-15 and from Council directions to issue registration certificate and recognition of his degree of MD(Pathology).

On perusal of the records of the court case, the Committee noted that Dr. Prateek Chandrashekhar Patil has stated in his writ petition (1234 of 2014) that he was granted admission on the basis of his rank in the All India Open Merit List of AIPGMEE conducted by AIIMS in 2012, he was allotted the seat of MS(Orthopaedics) by the Medical Counselling Committee, Directorate General of Health Services in LTM Medical College, Sion, Mumbai vide their allotment letter dt. 12.06.2012 under the All India Quota. Subsequently, he had joined the PG course on the basis of the said letter on 18.06.2012. However, the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences has sought for cancellation of his admission vide their letter dated 15.01.2014, as his admission was over and above sanctioned capacity. By this time they had completed more than a half

of their studies training. This had happened due to oversight of authorities of LTM Medical College who have sought from the MCI regularization of their seat. He had inter-alia prayed before the Hon'ble High Court that the MCI and MUHS should include his name in the roll of registered students and provide him all facilities, rights and privileges imparity with other students granted admission in MS(Orthopaedics) course for the academic year 2012-15. Further, the Dr. Prateek Chandrashekhar Patil had also sought directions from the Hon'ble Court for the MUHS to issue degree completion certificate to petitioner in MS(Orthopaedics) degree course for the academic year 2012-15 and from Council directions to issue registration certificate and recognition of his degree of MS(Orthopaedics).

The Committee noted that in their amended writ petition, the petitioners have prayed as under:-

"We are running PG courses MS in Orthopaedics and MD in Pathology at LTM Medical College. We are permitted 7 seats in MS Orthopaedics and 8 seats in MD Pathology. For A.Y. 2012-13 one excess seat was admitted in each of the subject (i.e. one in MS Orthopedics and one in MD Pathology). This happened inadvertently due to oversight of the administrative staff. For A.Y. 2012-2013 we have admitted 8 seats in MS Orthopaedics and 9 seats in MD Pathology.

In compensation of this excess admitted seats, we have admitted one each less seat in both subjects (i.e. one in MS Orthopaedics and one in MD Pathology in the next A.Y. 2013-2014. We have admitted only 6 seats in MS Orthopedic and only 7 seats in MD Pathology for A.Y. 2013-2014.

We had adequate teachers in year 2012-2013 in both the subjects to accommodate one each excess admitted PG students. The teacher student ratio was maintained properly. The training was conducted on par, as per MCI norms.

L.T.M.G, Hospital attached to L.T.M. Medical College has an extremely large patient workload catering to over 19 lakh patients over year with a proportionately huge workload in Orthopaedics and Pathology too. Hence, this ensured adequate workload for all students. The admitted PG students were trained adequately with a vast amount of clinical experience.

I, therefore request you to kindly permit the excess PG student admitted one each in Orthopaedics and Pathology during A.Y.2012-2013.
Thanking you in anticipation."

The college has also provided the list of admissions made in PG courses in 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 & 2015-16, the communication made to the MUHS for these academic year is also placed on records. The college has also provided the list of student admitted in the academic year 2013-14, 2014-015 & 2015-16 for MD(Pathology) and MS(Orthopaedics). It is evident from the perusal of these lists that for the academic year 2013-14 the college has admitted one candidate less in the subject of MD(Pathology) and MS(Orthopaedics). However, for the subsequent academic year, the college has admitted students in both these subjects in accordance with the sanction intake capacity which is 8(Eight) seats in MD(Pathology) and 7(Seven) seats in MS(Orthopaedics). Keeping in view the peculiar facts and circumstances wherein both these students have completed their PG course and have successfully passed the examination conducted by the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and the order dated 01.09.2016 of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court in the above mentioned writ petition, the Postgraduate Graduate Medical Education Committee decides that the admissions of both these candidates namely Dr. Prateek Chandrashekhar Patil and Dr. Felice Faizal Mohammed Ebrahim Kutty be regularized. Therefore, the Committee decided that

recommendations be made to the Central Govt. to approve the excess admissions made of Dr. Felice Faizal Mohammed Ebrahim Kutty & Dr. Prateek Chandrashekhar Patil in MD(Pathology) MS(Orthopedics) in the academic year 2012-13 at LTM Medical College, Sion, Mumbai.
