The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the minutes of Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 24th May, 2016; 3rd June, 2016; 17th June, 2016; 1st July, 2016; 12th July, 2016, 26th July, 2016; 9th August, 2016 and 30th August, 2016 are sent to Oversight Committee.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

Action will be taken on receipt of the Minutes from the Oversight Committee.

3. Starting of MD (Physiology) course at BGS Global Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: The Council Assessor's Report (08/08/2016) for Starting of MD (Physiology) course at BGS Global Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (08/08/2016) and noted the following:-

1. It is not clearly stated whether stipend at the rates prescribed by the State Govt. will be paid to Residents or not.
2. Registration of Animal House with CPCSEA is still under process.
3. Equipment like Treadmill is not available in the department.
4. Promotion of Dr. Kanavi Roopa Shekarappa, Assoc. Prof. is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 4 yrs against the requirement of 5 yrs. There are no publications to his credit.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue letter of permission for starting of MD (Physiology) course at BGS Global Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

4. Increase of seats in MD (Skin & VD) course at C.U. Shah Medical College, Surendranagar, Gujarat under Saurashtra University, Rajkot U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the opinion of the Law Officer of the Council in similar matter with regard to nomenclature as detailed below:-

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"Thus, as on date, there is no course in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 by the name MD (Pulmonary Medicine). Thus, the Consent of Affiliation that has been submitted is for a course that does not survive since 21st July, 2009 i.e. for nearly 7 years now in the Schedule to the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000. Accordingly, the Consent of Affiliation that has been submitted is for a course that does not exist in Regulations. Thus the necessary requirement of submitting valid Consent of Affiliation by the affiliating University with the application is not fulfilled. In this regard, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgment dated 20.08.15 in Royal Medical Trust & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. Reported in (2015) 10 SCC 19 has in paragraph 27 of the judgment laid down the mode and manner in which the application for establishment of new medical college, renewal of permission of existing and increase in intake capacity has to be processed, at all stages. It reads as under:-

27...

The Schedule giving various stages and time limits must accommodate very possible eventuality and at the same time must comply with the requirements of observance of natural justice at various levels. In our view the Schedule must ideally take care of:

“(A) Initial assessment of the application at the first level should comprise of checking necessary requirements such as essentiality certificate, consent of affiliation and physical features like land and hospital requirement. If an applicant fails to fulfill these requirements, the application on the face of it, would be incomplete and be rejected. Those who fulfill the basic requirements would be considered at the next stage”

Therefore, it would be appropriate to recommend to the Central Government to disapprove the application for starting/increase of seats in Pulmonary Medicine course as there is no such course existing in the regulations as on date”

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to approve the opinion of the Law Officer and to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for increase of seats in MD (Skin & VD) course at C.U. Shah Medical College, Surendranagar, Gujarat under Saurashtra University, Rajkot u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18 as the nomenclature is not in conformity with the Regulations of the Council on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

5. Increase of seats in MD (Microbiology) course at Dr. Rajendra Prasad Government Medical College, Tanda, H.P under Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor’s Report (12/08/2016) and noted the following:-

1. Dr. S.C. Jaryal has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date, however, in the column of “Benefit of publications” in the faculty table, it is stated “No” implying there are NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Anuradha Sood has been promoted as Assoc.Prof. after cut-off date; however, in the column of “Benefit of publications” in the faculty table, it is stated “No” implying there are NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
3. Workload of the following investigations has decreased during 3 year period from 2013 to 2015:

4. Dr. Madhu Chauhan was not available on the day of inspection.
5. Dr. Savita Mahajan passed M.Sc. from non-medical faculty of Punjab Technical University. Hence, she cannot be considered.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue letter of permission for increase of seats in MD (Microbiology) course at Dr. Rajendra Prasad Government Medical College, Tanda, H.P under Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

6. Increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior under MP Medical Science University, Jabalpur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: The Council Assessor's Report (11/08/2016) for Increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior under MP Medical Science University, Jabalpur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (11/08/2016) and noted the following:-

1. Bed occupancy on the day of assessment is 43%. Average Occupancy on randomly selected days is 50%.
2. There was NIL major & only 2 Minor operations on day of assessment.
3. MRI is not available.
4. Total number of patients has decreased from 37,453 in 2014 to 28,453 in 2015.
5. There is no separate O.T. for ENT department. It is shared with General Surgery.
6. Speech Therapist is not available.
7. Equipment like BERA & OAE are not available.
8. Only 1 functional Microscope without Beam Splitter is available in O.T. Flexible Nasopharyngoscope, Bronchoscope, Nerve Stimulator & HD Digital Camera with recording system are not available.
9. There is no functional Microscope in Temporal Bone Dissection Laboratory.
10. Operative workload in 2015 of Major Operation at 312 & of Minor operations at 598 implies daily average of 1.04 & 1.99 respectively which is inadequate even to start PG course.
11. Operations like Stapedectomy, Laryngectomy, Laryngo/Tracheoplasty, Rhinoplasty have not been performed in last 3 years.
12. Total workload of 3 year period of 2013-2015 of Angiofibroma was only 2 & Maxillectomy was only 1.
13. Neonatal Screening programme is not available.
14. Speech & Voice Analysis services are not available.
15. Investigative facilities like Nerve Conduction, EMG are not available.
16. Departmental Library has only 51 books. Only 3 new books have been purchased for Departmental Library in last 3 years.
17. Experience details of faculty not given in faculty table without which their eligibility cannot be decided.
18. MRD not computerized.
19. ICD X classification not being used.
20. In the Central Library there are only 1 international and 2 national journals of ENT.
21. Professor & HOD Dr. A.K. Jain and Associate Prof. Dr. V.P. Narvey were not available on the day of inspection. There is no letter from the University where the institution/university claimed that they had gone as examiners.
22. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue letter of permission for increase of seats in

MS (ENT) course at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior under MP Medical Science University, Jabalpur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

7. Starting of MD (Immuno Haematology & Blood Transfusion) course at Government Medical College, Patiala under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (12/08/2016) and noted the following:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Kanchan S. Bharadwaj, Professor & HOD as Assoc. Prof. is not as per Regulations as she has been promoted as Assoc. Prof. with experience of only 2 years 6 months as Asstt. Prof. against requirement of 5 years as per Regulations. Her experience of 7 yrs. 8 months at Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh & Govt. Medical College, Patiala is in the designation of "Registrar/Lecturer/Senior Resident/Resident" and hence it is not clear what period out of this is as Asstt. Prof. Also she has been promoted as Assoc. Prof. in Blood Bank straightaway from Asstt. Prof. of Pathology but there is no evidence of training in IHBT. She is promoted as Professor of Transfusion Medicine straightaway from Assoc. Prof. of Blood Bank.
2. All faculty are having M.D.(Pathology) qualification; there is no evidence of 2 years special training in IHBT.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue letter of permission for starting of MD (Immuno Haematology & Blood Transfusion) course at Government Medical College, Patiala under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

8. Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Guntur Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Assoc. Prof. : 2
2. Dr. M. Bhargavan Naik has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying there are NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Unit IV which is the Unit of Dr. J. Kishore, Professor & HOD does not have any Assoc. Prof.; hence faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Shortage of Senior Residents : 6.
5. MRI is outsourced.

6. Details of research publications from the department in indexed journals are not provided in the prescribed format.
7. SAF is incompletely filled. Part 1 has been left blank. Data of available Hostel Accommodation are not provided. Many items in Part II (Departmental Information) are not filled. Data of clinical material of past 3 years are not provided. Details of ICUs, Special Clinics, Services provided by department, O.Ts., Departmental Library, Academic Parameters, etc. are not provided.
8. Dr. J. Kishore, Professor was not available on the day of inspection. He has not signed the attendance sheet.
9. Promotion of Dr. R. Bahvani Rao is not as per Regulations. He was promoted Professor on 08.09.2015 without 4 publications which is not as per Regulations.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue letter of permission for increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course at Guntur Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

9. Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course at Guntur Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

2. Dr. G.M. Sudhakar has been promoted as Assoc. Prof. after cut-off date; however, details of research publications are not provided; hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.

4. MRI is outsourced.
5. Details of research publications from the department in indexed journals are not provided in the prescribed format.
6. Equipment are inadequate. Centrifuge for Urine Microscopy.
7. Pathological post-mortems are not performed.
8. SAF is incompletely filled. Part II are not filled.
9. Prinatal Autopsies are hardly done. This year only one till now.
10. Coding System not followed in Museum mounted specimens.
11. Fluid cytology very less. On an average hardly one per day.
12. No. of PAP Smears very less. On average hardly one.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

11. Increase of seats in MD (Psychiatry) course at Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar under Siksha "O" Anusandhan University Bhubaneswar U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: The Council Assessor's Report (19/08/2016) for Increase of seats in MD (Psychiatry) course at Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar under Siksha "O" Anusandhan University Bhubaneswar U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The institution has supplied wrong and misleading information that stipend paid in Govt. Medical College in Karnataka is Rs.35,000/- per month. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to refer the matter to Ethics Committee.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue letter of permission for increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

14. Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health

Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

2. There were only 2 Minor & 3 Daycare operations on day of assessment which is less than required for even to start the course.
3. Departmental library has only 65 books. Latest editions of standard books are not available. NIL books have been purchased in last 3 years.
4. Minor and Day Care operations have decreased from 2014 to 2015.
5. Promotion of Dr. Somashekar, Professor is not as per Regulations. He was promoted on 11.11.2014 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
6. Promotion of Dr. Ranganath H.D., Professor is not as per Regulations. He was promoted Professor on 27.01.2015 after the cut-off date without any publications.
7. Promotion of Dr. Vinodkumar A.C., Associate Prof. is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 4 yrs. 5 months and there are no publications to his credit.
8. The stipend paid by the institution is Rs.35,000/- per month which is not at par with stipend paid in Govt. Medical Colleges in the State of Karnataka. The stipend paid in Karnataka is Rs.35,000/-, Rs.40,000/- and Rs.45,000/- for 1st, 2nd and 3rd year Residents respectively. The institution has supplied wrong and misleading information that stipend paid in Govt. Medical College in Karnataka is Rs.35,000/- per month. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to refer the matter to Ethics Committee.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue letter of permission for increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

15. Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at M.K.C.G. Medical College, Brahmapur under Berhampur University, Berhampur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and noted the following:-

1. Shortage of Senior Residents: 1.
2. Dr. Arvind Ade, Professor & HOD has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank implying there are NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Unit I does not have Asso. Prof.; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Units II & III have only 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as PG Units.
5. Dr. Anant Dawange has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank implying there are NIL publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
6. Unit IV has only 1 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit.
7. Unit V has only 1 faculty & it is headed by Asst. Prof.; hence it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit.
8. Promotion of Dr. Avinash Telgote, Assoc. Prof. Unit IV is not as per Regulations. He was promoted on 6.6.2015 after the cut-off date without any publication.
9. Resultantly there is no Unit which qualifies as PG Unit.
10. Specialty clinic like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic is not run.
11. MRI is not available.
12. Non-teaching staff is inadequate.
13. There are 2 tables in both O.T.s which is not as per norms.
14. Nursing & Paramedical staff is inadequate in O.T.s.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue letter of permission for starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.
