The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee - confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the minutes of Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 24th May, 2016; 3rd June, 2016; 17th June, 2016; 1st July, 2016; 12th July, 2016 and 26th July, 2016 are sent to Oversight Committee.

The line "*Recognition of MS (OBG) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats*" in the subject, Read matter and Ist Paragraph of the decision of Item No. 93 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 03/06/2016 be read corrected as "*Recognition of MS (OBG) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats*".

Further, in the Item No. 100 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 03/06/2016, "*letter dated 16/05/2015 received from the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi*" be read corrected as "*letter dated*

16/03/2015 received from the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi”

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee - action taken thereon.

Action will be taken on receipt of the Minutes from the Oversight Committee.

Hearing granted to Darbhanga Medical College, Darbhanga

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee recalled that the Hon'ble Central Information Commission vide its order dated 23/12/2015 in file No. CIC/YA/A/2015/001886 has decided as under:

“After hearing both parties and on perusal of record, the Commission notes with serious concern that in the instant case MCI is absolving itself of its responsibility. The appellant's query is very clear which has not been attended to adequately by the MCI. The issue raised is of public interest since a number of students are undergoing the diploma course in Obstetrics and Gynaecology but the course is not recognised by the MCI. The respondent stated that because the deficiencies pointed out during the inspection have not been rectified, hence the course is not recognised. However, the MCI did not direct the College to stop admissions till the deficiencies were rectified and the courses were going on. In such a situation, the future career of the students after passing out diploma/degree are being impacted adversely. The information sought by the appellant is as to what action has been taken by the MCI after their decision denying recognition to the DGO course at Darbhanga Medical College and Hospital, Bihar. The Commission directs the MCI to state in clear unambiguous terms their action plan with respect to the DGO course in DMCH which is being conducted without their recognition. The Commission rejects the earlier evasive reply given by the CPIO in response to the RTI query. The decision of the MCI will be communicated to the appellant within 4 weeks of the receipt of this order under intimation to the Commission.

The appeal is disposed of accordingly.”

Following the receipt of this decision, communication dated 03/02/2016 seeking compliance of the deficiencies found out in the assessment conducted on 15/05/2014 as communicated to the college vide Council letter bearing No. MCI-74(22)/2014-Med./132290 dated 20/09/2014 was sought.

Meanwhile, the college authorities vide their letter dated 25/01/2016 received in Council office on 05/02/2016 had furnished their compliance. This compliance along with the order of the Hon'ble CIC was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 23/03/2016 and the deficiencies were pointed out.

Further, the Committee had also decided to direct the Dean to come and discuss the number of students to be admitted from next academic year (i.e. 2016-17).

In response, the Dean vide his letter dated 23/06/2016 requested for a date to appear before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee. Hence, vide Council letter dated 28/07/2016, he was requested to appear before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee at its meeting held on 09/08/2016.

Accordingly, the Dean, Darbhanga Medical College appeared before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee on 09/08/2016. He submitted that in pursuance of the order of the Hon'ble High Court, the admissions to all unrecognized

courses in state of Bihar has been stopped w.e.f. academic year 2016-17. Hence, their college has not admitted any student in the DGO course for the present academic year. However, he requested the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee that recognition be accorded to batches that have already passed out.

In this regard, he also submitted a written compliance dated 06/08/2016 before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee. This has been taken on record. The Committee decided to place the matter before the Sub-Committee.

Hearing granted to Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College, Pune

Pursuant to the Council letter No. MCI-46(2)/2016-Med./122734 and 122775 01.08.16, Dr. R.S. Bangal, Dean Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Dr. P.S. Chandhok Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Dr. N. Joshi, Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College Pune appeared before the Post Graduate Medical Education Committee. The Dean in his oral submission stated that the College had out of ignorance of MCI norms stated in Declaration Forms the experience of Faculty from their date of appointment in the Hospital of the College. On receipt of aforesaid Council letter seeking explanation they will recast the teaching experience of the Faculty from the date of first letter of Permission granted to the Medical College, i.e. 28.09.07 when the college was started.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee informed the Dean and other that in respect of counting of teaching experience, the norm laid down by the Council that the experience of faculty would be considered from the date of grant of letter of permission was well known. It is in public domain and is accessible from MCI website. Medical Colleges are expected to follow such norms and by pleading ignorance to laid down norms, the College cannot escape from its responsibility. The Dean was advised to be more careful in future and to follow MCI norms strictly.

3. H. N. B Garhwal University, Uttarakhand - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (02.06.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 2 seats at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun granted by H. N. B Garhwal University, Uttarakhand.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (02.06.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by H. N. B Garhwal University, Uttarakhand in respect of students being trained at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

4. Ch. Charan Singh University - Recognition of MD(Skin & VD) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (14.06.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Skin & VD) qualification for 1 seat at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar granted by Ch. Charan Singh University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14.06.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Skin & VD) qualification for 1 seat granted by Ch. Charan Singh University in respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Tarang Goyal, Professor & HOD has been promoted from Asst. prof. to Asso. Prof. on basis of publications; however 1 out of 2 publications cited in the list is a case report which cannot be considered; resultantly there is only 1 research publication to his credit against requirement of 2 & his promotion is not as per Regulations; hence he cannot be considered as faculty.
2. Dr. Yogita Singh, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
3. One of the Resident spent vacation period outside India as is evident from her passport; however she has signed institute attendance register on some occasions during the same period.
4. No details of examiners in SAF Part-III have been provided.
5. History taking by PG Residents is below par as multiple patients shared the identical vital signs irrespective of age & disease condition.
6. Irrespective of the condition, majority of patients are receiving I.V. antibiotics & for some patients number of medications reach a dozen without any rationality or evidence based practice.
7. Both the male & female wards were littered with sharp needles & syringes while the designated container was found to be sharp & clean.
8. It was observed that indoor patient management is not at all supervised & there is lack of evidence based treatment protocols. PGs are almost autonomous in their patient management.
9. Total workload of all LASER procedures was only 109 in 2015 implying daily average of 0.36.
10. On the day of inspection total MRI in the entire hospital were only 5 and CT Scan 10 which are inadequate and indicate inadequate clinical material.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

5. **Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 10 to 12 seats in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (6th June 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 10 to 12 seats at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai granted by Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (6th June 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 10 to 12 seats granted by Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

6. **H. N. B Garhwal University, Uttarakhand - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (20.06.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun granted by H. N. B Garhwal University, Uttarakhand.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (20.06.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats granted by H. N. B Garhwal University, Uttarakhand in respect of students being trained at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Rakesh Rawat has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however, in the column of benefit of publications", it is stated "No" against requirement of 2 publications. Hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Persons designated as in charge of Specialty clinic like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic - viz., Dr. Ashok Jayant & Dr. Arvind Makker - are not on faculty strength of Department of General Surgery in any Unit.
3. Promotion of Dr. Nil Kamal Kumar is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 3 years 10 months against the requirement of 5 yrs. His

period at SGPGI, Lucknow where he was M.Ch. student cannot be counted as Asstt. Prof.

4. Promotion of Dr. A.V. Mathur is not as per Regulations. He was promoted Professor on 03.06.2015 after the cut-off date. His first article is a review article (and not research article) in an internet journal which cannot be counted.
5. Promotion of Dr. Rakesh Rawat, Assoc. Prof. is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 20.10.2014 after the cut-off date without any publications which is not as per Regulations.
6. Promotion of Dr. Sanjay Sadhu is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 15.01.2016 after the cut-off date without any publications which is not as per Regulations.
7. Promotion of Dr. Madhukar Maletha, Assoc. Prof. is not as per Regulations. He was promoted Assoc. Prof. on 13.10.2014. However, one of his 2 publications is a case report which cannot be considered. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
8. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (20/year) is inadequate.
9. There is no separate SICU.
10. Even though total 8 O.T.s are shown for department of General Surgery, No. of O.T. tables shown are only 3; it needs to be clarified whether remaining 5 O.T.s are functional or not.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

7. Srimanta Sankaradeva University of Health Sciences, Assam - Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Jorhat Medical College & Hospital, Jorhat.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (04.05.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat at Jorhat Medical College & Hospital, Jorhat granted by Srimanta Sankaradeva University of Health Sciences, Assam.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (04.05.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat granted by Srimanta Sankaradeva University of Health Sciences, Assam in respect of students being trained at Jorhat

Medical College & Hospital, Jorhat be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

8. D.Y. Patil Education Society (Deemed University), Kolhapur - Recognition of MD(IHBT) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24th May, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(IHBT) qualification for 1 seat at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society (Deemed University), Kolhapur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (24th May, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(IHBT) qualification for 1 seat granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society (Deemed University), Kolhapur in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Mahadeo A. Mane, Professor & HoD shifted from Pathology to IHBT at the level of Professor, his remaining experience is in Pathology. Dr. Mrs. Sheetal Desai, Assoc. Professor shifted at the level of Associate Professor, his remaining experience is in Pathology. Resultantly, no faculty has MD(IHBT) or 2 yrs. special training in IHBT. Hence, not eligible.
2. One of External examiner is from same State of Maharashtra which is contrary to Regulations.
3. Another External examiner is from the subject of Pathology & not from the subject of IHBT.
4. Total number of Blood units supplied is only 732 in 2015 implying daily average of 2 which is grossly inadequate.
5. Daily average of total blood units & component units supplied is only 6.7.
6. Workload of Bone Marrow Biopsy is only 1 & TT is NIL in 2015.
7. The data given in table at serial No. 7 page 2 cannot be of the department of IHBT.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no

compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

9. **Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth (Deemed University) Pimpri, Pune - Renewal of recognition of DCH qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Padmashree Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18.05.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DCH qualification for 3 seats at Padmashree Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune granted by Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth (Deemed University) Pimpri, Pune.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18.05.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of DCH qualification for 3 seats granted by Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth (Deemed University) Pimpri, Pune in respect of students being trained at Padmashree Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune because of the following facts:-

1. 1st LOP date cannot be 27.06.2012 as has been stated in the SAF. This information has been wrongly provided by the college authorities in all their reports.
2. Many admitted patients were non genuine cases like LRI, Headache, One day fever, etc.
3. All special clinics are run in a single room with 2 Specialty clinics in the same room.
4. Record maintenance of Immunization clinic, PICU, NICU was poor with no signature of Asst. Prof. anywhere.
5. No registers are maintained for Death audit, Journal clubs, Seminars, etc.
6. Pantry is not available in any of 5 wards.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

10. Sharda University, Greater Noida - Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (8th June, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 2 seats at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida granted by Sharda University, Greater Noida.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (8th June, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Microbiology) qualification for 2 seats granted by Sharda University, Greater Noida in respect of students being trained at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Vichal Rastogi is not as per Regulations. He was Assoc.Prof. for 3 yrs. 4 months against the requirement of 4 yrs. None of his publications quoted is in Microbiology journal.
2. Promotion of Dr. Harmesh Manocha is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 1 yr. 11 months against the requirement of 5 yrs when he was promoted Assoc. Prof. Resultantly, there is deficiency of Assoc. Prof. - 1.
3. Details of only 2 Examiners are provided against requirement of 4 examiners.
4. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (14/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
5. Workload related with Molecular Microbiology is NIL.
6. Mycology workload has decreased from 1,849 in 2013 to 1,616 in 2015.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

11. Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Bharati Vidyapeeth Medical College & Hospital, Sangli.

Resultantly there are only 3 research publications against requirement of 4, her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Anjoo Agarwal has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years as per Regulations. Her experience as Pool Officer, Honorary Lecturer, Part Time Lecturer cannot be considered. Resultantly she cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Amita Pandey has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years as per Regulations. Her experience as SRA cannot be considered. Resultantly she cannot be considered.

1. Dr. Naseem Jamal has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however details of research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
2. Dr. Anit Parihar has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years as per Regulations. Resultantly he cannot be considered. Also, although he has been

- promoted as Professor after cut-off date, details of research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
3. Dr. Manoj Kumar has been promoted as Professor with experience of only 9 months as Asso. Prof. against requirement of 3 years as per Regulations. Resultantly he cannot be considered. Also, although he has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date, details of research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.

 7. Total number of Contrast Radiology has decreased from 3,200 in 2013 to 3,100 in 2015.
 8. Data given in table 5 on page 2 cannot be of the department of Radio-Diagnosis.
 9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. One of the external examiners was from the same State – i.e. Maharashtra.
2. Although number of OPD patients has increased by 64% during the period 2013 – 2015 from 27,278 to 44,925, number of Major & Minor operations has remained static during the same period.
3. Bed occupancy on day of assessment is 215% which is neither feasible nor desirable. Although total beds in the only Unit are shown at 30, beds occupied on day of assessment are shown as 63. It is not clarified where these extra 33 patients were kept and who was looking after them.
4. Workload of BERA was only 58 in 2015. This does not tally with daily average of 2 as shown in Item § 9 in Part II.
5. The department does not participate in National Programme for Prevention & Control of Deafness.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (13.06.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. T.V. Ramakrishnan, Professor & HOD has been appointed as Professor of Emergency Medicine straightaway from the post of Professor of Anaesthesiology. No evidence of any training or experience in Emergency Medicine is shown in the faculty table.
2. Dr. M. Ramesh, Professor has been appointed as Professor of Emergency Medicine straightaway from the post of Professor of General Medicine. No evidence of any training or experience in Emergency Medicine is shown in the faculty table.
3. Dr. A. Faruk & Dr. P. Tamil Ambu, both Asst. Prof. do not have any qualification or experience or training in Emergency Medicine.
4. Dr. S. Jagdeesan, Senior Resident does not have any experience in Emergency Medicine before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
5. Out of research publications cited in the list, 1 is a Case Report, 3 are Review Articles which cannot be considered, 1 is in a subject not related with Emergency Medicine. One publication with the same title and citation has been shown separately at 2 places to inflate the number of publications.
6. OPD on day of assessment is only 40.
7. 30 beds for the department include 5 beds in ICU which is not permissible. Thus full complement of 30 beds for Emergency Medicine department is not available.
8. At item § 6 of Summary on P. 2, OPD attendance on day of assessment is shown as 40 while at item § 9 in Part II on P. 25, it is shown as 70. This discrepancy needs to be clarified.
9. There were only 2 Major Operations on day of assessment.
10. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (16/year) is inadequate.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Prof. with experience of only 4 years 6 months as Asst. prof. against requirement of 5 years; he has been further promoted as Professor with experience of only 3 years 5 months against requirement 4 years and the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank implying there are NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence his both promotions are not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.

1. Dr. Banani Poddar cannot be both senior Lecturer and Reader at the same time and in Paediatric and Critical Care Medicine departments both, simultaneously.
2. Dr. Mohan Gurjar cannot be Asstt. Prof. in Anaesthesia and Critical Care Medicine simultaneously.
3. No faculty member has DM (Critical Care) or 2 years special training in Critical Care Medicine at the time of their shifting to Critical Care Medicine department. Hence, not eligible.
4. There is no Senior Resident.
5. Details of Internal examiners are not provided.
6. The only Unit has 57 beds which is not as per Regulations.
7. All 57 beds are ICU beds of other departments leaving NIL beds for those departments.
8. There are other 131 outreach ICU beds. It is not clear who is providing services to these outreach ICU beds.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Details of Internal & External examiners are not provided.
4. PG students of 1st & 2nd year were not present during final examination either in the field or in the department.
5. Departmental Library & Seminar room in the same room which should be separate.
6. NIL Deliveries are conducted at RHTC.
7. Lease agreement for rented premises of RHTC & UHC is only 10 years.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Dr. Ravikiran Thote & Dr. Amruta Pathak, both Senior Residents, do not have 3 years experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. The following Senior Residents are not eligible since they do not have 3 yrs. experience as Junior Resident in a medical college:-

2. Dr. Ritu Priya, Dr. Manu Yadav & Dr. S.S. Surong have been shown as Senior Residents in Unit 3; however, no details of their academic qualification & experience have been provided in the faculty table.
3. Dr. Shakal Narayan Singh has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. There are total 21 seats - 9 Degree & 12 Diploma while there are only 6 Professors as PG teachers; hence maximum 12 students can be admitted against these 6 Professors; however the institute is admitting 21 students contrary to Regulations.
5. Dr. Arpita, Lecturer was absent on inspection day.
6. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (19/year), Journal Clubs (03 in no.) are inadequate.
7. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 43,000 in 2013 to 39,765 in 2015.
8. Specialty clinics like Paediatric Cardiology clinic, Paediatric Nephrology clinic, Paediatric Endocrine clinic, Thalassaemia clinic are not run.
9. Days on which Paediatric Gastroenterology clinic is run is not provided in the table of Specialty clinics run by the institute.
10. Thalassaemia Day care center is not available.
11. Paediatric Endoscopy, Paediatric Bronchoscopy, Paediatric Dialysis machine are not available.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Out of 6 publications quoted 3 are case reports and 2 review articles and only 1 research article.
2. Minor operations were 54, 88 and 110 in 2013, 2014 and 2015 respectively which are grossly inadequate.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. There is no other Assoc. Prof. in Unit-1.
3. Prof. Radhamani K.V. was promoted Prof. on 01.10.2015 after the cut-off date without any publications which is not as per Regulations.
4. OPD on day of assessment is only 72 which is inadequate. Average OPD of 3 days was 95.
5. In Summary, at item § 6 on P. 2, OPD attendance on day of assessment is shown as 120; however in Part II at item § 9 on P. 17, it is shown as 72.
6. Specialty clinics like Paediatric Cardiology clinic, Paediatric Nephrology clinic, Paediatric Gastroenterology clinic, Paediatric Neurology clinic, Neonatology clinic are not run.
7. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (12/year) is inadequate.
8. Histopathology workload for the whole hospital is only 07 on day of assessment.
9. HIV services are not provided.
10. MRI is not in working order.
11. CPC is not held.
12. Endoscopy & Dialysis are not available with the department.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

He was Asstt. Prof. for 2 yrs. and Assoc. Prof. for 2 yrs. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
2. Promotion of Dr. Shalini Srivastava, Assoc. Prof. is not as per Regulations. She was Asstt. Prof. for 2 yrs 4 months against the requirement of 5 yrs.
3. Promotion of Dr. Harsh Mahajan, Assoc. Prof. is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 4 yrs. 1 month against the requirement of 5 yrs. and he has no publications to his credit. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
4. Academic parameters like Group Discussions (16/year) is inadequate.
5. Total number of patients attending RHTC & UHC has decreased from 11,605 to 8,591 during 3 year period.
6. Number of deliveries at RHTC has decreased from 24 to 17 during the same period.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (13.06.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 5 to 6 seats granted by Bharath University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. V. Padma, Prof. Unit-VI is not as per Regulations. She was Assoc.Prof. for 3 yrs. 6 months against the requirement of 4 years and she has no publications to her credit.
2. Promotion of Dr. N. Anuradha, Assoc. Prof. Unit-I is not as per Regulations. She was Asstt. Prof. for 4 yrs. and promoted Assoc. Prof. on 01.11.2014 after the cut-off date. She has no publications to her credit.
3. Dr. T. Jerold Rubancross, Senior Resident is M.D.(Physiology). Hence, not eligible.
4. Promotion of Dr. N.N. Anand, Professor, Unit-IV is not as per Regulations. He was Assoc. Prof. for 3 years 4 months against the requirement of 4 years and there are no publications to his credit.
5. The institute is permitted for 250 seats for which 8 Units are required with 24 faculty @ 3 faculty/Unit; however total 20 faculty are available; resultantly there is deficit of faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 4.
6. Shortage of Senior Residents: 1.
7. Units VII, VIII have only 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as PG Units.
8. Publications during the last 3 yrs. are Nil.
9. Details of candidates appearing at examination who have presented/sent for publication poster/paper are not provided.
10. Details of recent books purchased in last 3 years in Departmental Library are not given.
11. Academic parameter like Clinical Seminars (12/year) is inadequate.
12. OPD attendance is shown at 300 in item § 6 in Summary on P. 2; however, at item § 9 in Part II on P. 18, it is shown as 631, which indicate non-genuine data.
13. Many indoor patients did not require admission.
14. There was no indoor case of many patients, viz. Fathima Devi, Ramdass, et al., when verified. There was no registration number available. There was no mention of such patients in Sisters' order book also.
15. Equipment like Upper GI Endoscope, Dialysis machines, Bronchoscope, Echo Colour Doppler are not available with this department.
16. Speciality clinics held on all working days from 8.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m., which is General OPD time.
17. Occupancy in ICCU was NIL on day of assessment.
18. Casualty beds are 16 against the requirement of 30.
19. Workload of MRI for the whole hospital is NIL on day of assessment. There was no Ba/ IVP on inspection day.
20. Emergency Tray & Defibrillator are not available in TMT room.
21. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 5 to 6 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/

illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th June, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radio-diagnosis) qualification for 1 seat granted by Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune in respect of students being trained at Bharati

Vidyapeeth Medical College & Hospital, Sangli be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

47. Ch. Charan Singh University - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (14.06.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 2 seats at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar granted by Ch. Charan Singh University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14.06.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 2 seats granted by Ch. Charan Singh University in respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Manju Agarwal, Senior Resident in Unit I does not possess any experience as Resident in a medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
2. Dr. Gaurav Jain, Senior Resident in Unit II does not possess any experience as Resident in a medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
3. Dr. Harpreet Kaur, Senior Resident in Unit III does not possess any experience as Resident in a medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
4. Promotion of Dr. Satish C. Agrawal, Assoc. Prof. Unit-I is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt.Prof. for 4 yrs and he has no publications to his credit. His first publication is a review article and other 2 are not related to Paediatrics. They are about computers.
5. Promotion of Dr. Yogesh Goel, Prof. Unit-3 is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 2 yrs. Both the publications are outside his period of Assistant Professorship. He was promoted Professor on 01.08.2015 after working as Assoc. Prof. for 3 yrs. No reference of the 4th publication has been given. It is stated that it is in Delhi Instt. of Medico-legal publications which is not an indexed journal.
6. Promotion of Dr. Manish Agarwal, Assoc. Prof. Unit-3 is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 4 yrs 7 months and promoted Assoc. Prof. on 21.11.2015. Both his publications are in 2016, Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
7. Academic parameters like Journal Clubs (20/year), Group Discussions (08 in no.) are inadequate.
8. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 05 on day of assessment.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in

accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (16.05.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by HIHT University, Dehradun in respect of students being trained at Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Veena Asthana has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of Publications", only 3 research publications have been cited against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Yashwant Singh Payal has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of Publications", only 2 research publications have been cited against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
3. Prescribed SAF has not been used.
4. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (21/year), Journal Clubs (12/year), Group Discussions (14/year) are inadequate.
5. CPC is not held.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification for 4 seats at Govt. Medical College, Theni granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD/MS(OBG) qualification for 4 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Theni because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. M. Vaishnavi, Senior Resident in Unit 2 has experience of only 2 years as Resident against requirement of 3 years as per Regulations; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
2. 3 publications have been quoted during the last 3 yrs. However, no reference of any of them has been given without which they cannot be considered.
3. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (12/year), Journal Clubs (12/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
4. Total OPD attendance on day of assessment is only 90 which is not adequate even to start PG course. Average daily OPD attendance is even lower at 80.
5. Total number of Major operations has decreased from 609 in 2013 to 560 in 2015.
6. Number of Major operations in 2015 is only 560 implying daily average of 1.87 which is inadequate.
7. Number of Minor operations in 2015 is only 167 implying daily average of 0.56 which is grossly inadequate.
8. MRI is not available.
9. Details of beds occupied in HDU on day of assessment are not provided.
10. There are only 2 Units but there are 159 beds in the department implying 79 beds/Unit which is not as per Regulations.
11. Specialty clinic like Gynaec Endocrinology clinic is not run.
12. Equipment like LEEP is not available.
13. IUI & ART are not available.
14. The column of stipend paid by institute to Residents at item § 25 in Summary has been left blank; hence it is not clear whether stipend is paid by the institution to Residents or not which needs to be clarified.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in

accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (21.04.2016 & 22.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats and D.Ortho qualification for 1 seat at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21.04.2016 & 22.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats and D.Ortho qualification for 1 seat granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad because of the following facts:-

1. Unit II headed by Professor & HOD Dr. R.N. Shewale does not have any Asso. Prof.; hence faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Dr. A.P. Surave, Senior Resident in Unit III does not have 3 years experience as Resident in a medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. Dr. Vibhute Dinesh Prabhakar, Senior Resident Unit-3 is DNB from non-teaching hospital and has no 3 yrs. experience as Junior Resident in a medical college. Hence, he is not eligible.
4. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (21/year), Group Discussions (22/year) are inadequate.
5. Total patients admitted IPD in 2015 was 29091, which means 97 admissions per day against 90 beds, which is not feasible. The data is not genuine.
6. Total deaths in Orthopaedics last year were 9 out of 29091 admissions giving a death rate of 0.03% in a department which deals with trauma. This simply indicates that no serious trauma cases are admitted without which, training of PG students will be inadequate.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 degree seats and 1 diploma seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23.06.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification for 03 seats at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bhatinda granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23.06.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification for 03 seats granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Adesh Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Bhatinda because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. G.I. Singh, shown as Professor is also full time Vice Chancellor of Adesh University; hence cannot be considered as faculty.
2. Dr. S.K. Nagra has produced 3 certificates of experience with discrepancy in dates of joining those institutions. Hence she cannot be considered as faculty.
3. Dr. R.K. Sharma, Asso. Prof. could not produce a single original document for verification. He produced FIR for lost MBBS & PG Degree certificates but not for other documents. Hence he cannot be considered as faculty.
4. Dr. Avtar Singh Bansal is not eligible. He has no certificate of experience from Competent Authority of the Office of Director General Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) specifying the subject, period and place of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialist and advisor without which his equated teaching designations cannot be calculated. No other certificate signed by any other authority can be entertained.
5. Promotion of Dr. Tanvir Kaur Sidhu is not as per Regulations. She was Asstt. Prof. for 4 yrs, Assoc. Prof. for 3 yrs and promoted Prof. on 01.07.2015. She has only 2 publications in non-indexed journal.

6. There are several discrepancies in passbook salary entries of Dr. P.R. Bhadu, Asst. Prof. Hence it is doubtful whether he is really a full time employee of the institute.
7. There is no epidemiologist in the department.
8. No journals in the departmental library.
9. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (13/year), Group Discussions (08 in no.) are inadequate.
10. OPD attendance on day of assessment at both RHTC & UHC is grossly inadequate - at UHC only 04 & at RHTC only 06 patients. Daily average attendance is 05 & 10-12 respectively.
11. Total number of OPD patients has decreased from 11,703 in 2013 to 11,607 in 2015.
12. Bed occupancy at RHTC was NIL on day of assessment.
13. There were only 2 Deliveries at RHTC in 2015.
14. Overall workload of college hospital is less. There was some discrepancy in some of record as computer generated record showed much less workload.
15. There is no attendance record of Interns & Residents posted at RHTC. Indoor beds & O.T. do not seem to be utilized. Paramedical staff present there could not produce ID proof or proof of working there. Hospital Waste Management Protocol is not followed.
16. PG Research Laboratory is in a very small room with inadequate equipment.
17. There is no record of any activity under any National Health programme, Immunization, Family Welfare activity.
18. Stipend paid by institute to I/II year Residents is only Rs. 4,000 p.m. which is very less than that paid by Govt. of Punjab to its Residents. Stipend paid to III year Resident is NIL. These are contrary to Regulations.
19. No stipend to 2 persons shown as Demonstrators.
20. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 7. Workload of the following procedures was less in 2015:

 - (b) Nail Surgeries: 17;
 - (c) LASER pigment removal: 12.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

She has no publications to her credit. She is shown Senior Resident/ Lecturer from 16/08/2010 to 27/02/2011, which is not feasible. She cannot be working as Senior Resident as well as Lecturer.
2. Dr. C.N. Anushree has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however, the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank against requirement 2 publications; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
3. Workload of CT guided FNAC is only 04 & that of USG guided FNAC is only 18 in 2015 which is grossly inadequate.
4. Workload of Direct FNAC in 2015 is only 261 in 2015 implying daily average of 0.87 which is grossly inadequate.
5. Workload of MRI for the whole hospital is only 04 on day of assessment.
6. Workload of TT investigation is NIL in 2015.

4. Total number of Major Operations in 2015 is 601 implying daily average of 2.00 which is inadequate.
5. Total number of Minor Operations in 2015 is 420 implying daily average of 1.40 which is inadequate.
6. Workload of Laryngectomy, Maxillectomy, Angiofibroma, Laryngo/Tracheoplasty is NIL during preceding 3 years.
7. Specialty clinics are inadequate. Rhinology related clinic & Cancer related clinic are not run.

8. There is no MRI.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Dr. Surekha Biradar, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. Dr. N.S. Vishal, Senior Resident does not possess any experience as Resident in a medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
4. Workload of Colour Doppler was only 550 in 2015 implying daily average of 1.83 which is inadequate.
5. Workload of CT guided FNAC was only 96 in 2015 implying daily average of 0.32.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Resultantly, there are only 2 faculty in Unit VI & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. NIL Journals are available in Departmental Library.
4. Academic activities like Journal Clubs & Group Discussions do not exist.

2. Dr. K. Shailaja has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years 4 months against requirement of 5 years as per Regulations; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
3. Promotion of Dr. Chopay Soren, Professor, Unit-I is not as per Regulations. He was Assoc. Professor for 3 years 6 months and promoted Professor on 01/02/2016 without any publication, which is not permissible.

4. Dr. K. Venkataramana Reddy, Senior Resident is DNB from non-teaching institute. No 3 years experience as Junior Resident in a Medical College. Hence, not eligible. Resultantly, Unit-I has no eligible Senior Resident.
5. Dr. V. Sekahar, Assoc. Professor, Unit-I was absent on the day of assessment.
6. Assessment was conducted on Sunday and resultantly, the clinical material on the day of assessment could not be verified. The college authorities should not have fixed the examination date on Sunday.
7. Bed occupancy data in wards seems to be inflated. It is around 65%.
8. Thalassemia Day Care Center is not available.
9. Endoscopy services are not provided.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21.06.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of DLO qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

94. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of DA qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (21.06.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DA qualification for 02 seats at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21.06.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of DA qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

95. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of DTCD qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (17.06.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DTCD qualification for 01 seat at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (17.06.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of DTCD qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Surendra Reddy Katta has been shown as “Assistant Professor” in the column of “Designation” in the faculty table; however, in the column of “Experience”, it is shown as “Associate Professor” w.e.f. 01/06/2016 till date. He has no publications. Hence, his promotion as Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations.
2. Dr. A.N.V. Koteswara Rao, Assoc. Professor was Asst. Professor from 01/12/2008 to 30/11/2011, which makes 3 years. But it has been totaled as 5 years, which is incorrect. Resultantly, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
3. Faculty deficiency: Assoc. Professor - 1.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

96. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar.

Read: the Council Assessor’s Report (23.06.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 03 seats at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor’s Report (23.06.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 03 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

97. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23.06.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 03 seats at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23.06.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 03 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

98. RMC Kakinada - Recognition of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) and DMRD courses.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (20/05/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for recognition of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) and DMRD courses at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (20/05/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for recognition of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) and DMRD courses at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada and decided to recommend not to recognize MD (Radio-Diagnosis) and DMRD courses in respect of students being trained at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada because of the following facts:-

1. As per Faculty Table, Dr. Radha Rani K. is shown as Professor & HoD in column of Designation but shown Assoc. Professor in column of Experience, which is not feasible.
2. As per Faculty Table, there are no Senior Residents.
3. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.
4. NIL Journals are available after 2014.
5. NIL recent books have been purchased for Departmental Library in last 3 years.
6. Workload of CT guided FNAC is only 64 & that of USG guided FNAC only 165 in 2015.
7. CT Scan is not in working order. Even that is dual slice against minimum 16 slice required.
8. DSA are not available.
9. There is no separate room for Museum.
10. Total number of Colour Doppler examination has decreased from 5,400 in 2013 to 4,500 in 2015.
11. Static X-Ray Machine 5, required 6.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as

required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

99. S.V. Medical College, Tirupati - Admission of PG students 2015-2016 - Assessment regarding renewal of recognition of MD (DVL) and DDVL courses.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (16/05/2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD (DVL) and DDVL courses at S.V. Medical College, Tirupati.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (16/05/2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD (DVL) and DDVL qualifications for 1(One) seat each granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at S V Medical College, Tirupati be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

100. Dr. Gayatri Nagori V/S Dr. (Mrs.) Jayshree Pranshankar Mehta - Contempt Case No. 183 of Year 2016 in the Hon'ble Madhya Pradesh High Court at Gwalior.

Read: the letter dated 04/07/2016 received from the Dean, G.R. Medical College, Gwalior along with the legal opinion of Law Officer and the order dated 07/07/2015 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh at Gwalior with regard to Contempt Case No. 183 of Year 2016 in the Hon'ble Madhya Pradesh High Court at Gwalior in Dr. Gayatri Nagori V/S Dr. (Mrs.) Jayshree Pranshankar Mehta.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 04/07/2016 received from the Dean, G.R. Medical College, Gwalior along with the legal opinion of Law Officer and the order dated 07/07/2015 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh at Gwalior with regard to Contempt Case No. 183 of Year 2016 in the Hon'ble Madhya Pradesh High Court at Gwalior in Dr. Gayatri Nagori V/S Dr. (Mrs.) Jayshree Pranshankar Mehta and noted that the matter pertains to recognition for DGO course from 1965 instead of 1997. Although first admission was made in 1965, BOG in 2012 had decided to recognize the qualification from 1997 (& not from 1965). No reason is given for the same. Aggrieved by this decision, petitioner filed W.P. before M.P. High Court and Hon'ble Court in July 2015 directed petitioner to make fresh representation and MCI to dispose off the matter in 4 weeks. When the representation was received, PG Committee advised candidate to request Dean to make a formal request u/s 11(2) through University & Central Govt. As no progress was

made in granting retrospective recognition, she has filed contempt petition against President.

Members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee perused opinion of Law Officer which reads as under:

“Matter may be placed before PG Committee for retrospective recognition w.e.f. date of first admission made in the year 1965 to get the pending contempt case disposed off.”

In view of above, it was decided to recommend to Central Govt. to change the date of recognition of qualification as 1965 instead of 1997.

Matter be placed before General Body.

101. Increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 13/05/2016, application dated 04/04/2016 for increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) from 2 to 3 seats for the year 2017-18 received through the Central Government letter dated 12/04/2016 and Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 13/05/2016, application dated 04/04/2016 for increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) from 2 to 3 seats for the year 2017-18 received through the Central Government letter dated 12/04/2016 and the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2017-2018 from 2(Two) to 3(Three) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

102. Increase of seats in MS(ENT) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 13/05/2016, application dated 04/04/2016 for increase of seats in MS (ENT) from 4 to 9 seats for the year 2017-18 received through the Central Government letter dated 12/04/2016 and the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 13/05/2016, application dated 04/04/2016 for increase of seats in MS (ENT) from 4 to 9 seats for the year 2017-18 received through the Central Government letter dated 12/04/2016 and the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) and noted the following:

1. Promotion of Dr. Vidya Rokade, Professor is not as per Regulations. She was Assoc. Professor for 3 years 7 months. Out of 4 publications quoted: 2 are short communications in 1998 and 1999, which are outside her period of Assoc. Professorship, one is a case report, one a review article and only one original research article.
2. Promotion of Dr. Netra Pathak, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 5 months. Both publications quoted are case reports published in State Journal.
3. College got first LoP on 28/09/2007. Professor Sanjana Nemade has been given teaching experience from 01/12/2006 when the college was not in existence and it is not permissible.
4. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 1,680 in 2013 to 1,538 in 2015. With decreasing clinical material, there is no justification for increase in PG seats.
5. Workload of BERA is only 63 in 2015 implying daily average of 0.21, which is grossly inadequate.
6. Workload of Laryngo/Tracheoplasty & Angiofibroma is NIL during last 3 years.
7. Total workload of Laryngectomy is only 01, of Nasal Papillectomy only 07 & of Maxillectomy only 07 during last 3 years.
8. Casualty Attendance: Total 29; ENT - Nil on the day of assessment, which indicates inadequate clinical material.
9. On inspection day blood units used in entire hospital - 7, which again indicate inadequate clinical material.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in MS(ENT) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

103. Increase of seats in MD(Psychiatry) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 13/05/2016, application dated 04/04/2016 for increase of seats in MD (Psychiatry) from 1 to 3 seats for the year 2017-18 received through the Central Government letter dated 12/04/2016 and the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 13/05/2016, application dated 04/04/2016 for increase of seats in MD (Psychiatry) from 1 to 3 seats for the year 2017-18 received through the Central Government letter dated 12/04/2016 and the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) and noted the following:

1. Consent of affiliation of MUHS is for Academic year 2016-2017 while application is to be considered for Academic year 2017-2018 as per orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court.
2. Dr. Deepak V. Metkar, Senior Resident has only 2 years 2 months experience as Resident against requirement of 3 years before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.

3. Dr. Gaurav Adgaonkar, Senior Resident has only 2 years experience as Resident in medical college affiliated teaching hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
4. Resultantly, there is no eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
5. Dr. Madhu R. Ghate, Professor has been given teaching experience prior to first LoP when college was not in existence and it is not allowed.
6. Ch. Psych Care not available.
7. Academic parameters like Journal Club (05 in no.), Group Discussions (20/year) are inadequate.
8. There is no participation in National Mental Health Programme.
9. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 705 in 2013 to 654 in 2015.
10. Casualty Attendance in entire Hospital-29 and Psychiatry-Nil on the day of inspection, which indicate inadequate clinical material.
11. Inspection day blood used only 7 Units in entire hospital.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in MD(Psychiatry) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

104. Increase of seats in MS(Orthopaedics) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 13/05/2016, application dated 04/04/2016 for increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) from 3 to 5 seats for the year 2017-18 received through the Central Government letter dated 12/04/2016 and the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 13/05/2016, application dated 04/04/2016 for increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) from 3 to 5 seats for the year 2017-18 received through the Central Government letter dated 12/04/2016 and the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) and noted the following:

1. Consent of affiliation of MUHS is for Academic year 2016-2017 while application is to be considered for Academic year 2017-2018 as per orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court.
2. College got LoP on 28/09/2007. Dr. Nakul Shah, Professor has been given teaching experience from 15/03/2007 when the college was not in existence and it is not feasible. Resultantly, he was Asst. Professor for 4 years 7 months and he has no publications during this period. He was promoted Professor on 03/12/2014 after the cut-off date. Out of two publications quoted (against the required 4) one is a case report in Internet Journal and for 2nd - no name of Journal given.
3. Dr. Atul Patil, Assoc. Professor given teaching experience prior to first LoP w.e.f. 23/04/2007 when the college was not in existence and it is not permissible. Resultantly, he was Asst. Professor for 4 years 4 months against the requirement of 5 years and he has no publications. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations and the Unit left with 3 Asst. Professors only and it cannot be considered a PG Unit.

4. Dr. Madhav Khadikar, Professor given teaching experience prior to first LoP w.e.f. 02/04/2007, which is not permissible since the college was not in existence at that time.
5. Dr. Yogesh Gaikwad, Assoc. Professor given teaching experience prior to first LoP w.e.f. 06/08/2007, which is not permissible.
6. Dr. Rohit Chaker, Senior Resident is DNB from non-teaching hospital. Hence, not eligible. No 3 years experience as Junior Resident in a Medical College.
7. Total number of Major Operations has remained static over period of last 3 years - 1,237 in 2013 & 1,241 in 2015.
8. CPC is shown to be held on 5th Saturday every month; however in a year there would not be more than 6 months having 5 Saturdays indicating frequency of CPC to be once in 2 months at the most which is inadequate.
9. Casualty Attendance: Orthopaedics-1; Total - 29 on the day of inspection, which indicate inadequate clinical material.
10. There is decrease in IPD from years 2 to years 3 (last year) i.e. 2659 to 2650.
11. Decrease in Major Operation from year 2 to year 3 i.e. 1346 to 1241.
12. Decrease in Minor Operations: 2666 to 2257.
13. Blood Units used seven units in entire hospital on inspection day.
14. Investigative facility like Nerve conduction EMG not available.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in MS(Orthopaedics) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The minutes are sent to Central Govt./ Oversight Committee.
