1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 6th May, 2016.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the adjourned Item Nos. 68 to 128 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 6th May, 2016.

68. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at N.R.I. Medical College and Hospital, Guntur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 08/02/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at N.R.I. Medical College and Hospital, Guntur granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 08/02/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at N.R.I. Medical College and Hospital, Guntur because of the following facts:-

1. Total number of deliveries at 3,136 in 2015 is lower than that of 3,308 in 2012. Deficiency of number of deliveries decreasing over the years remains as it is. Explanation of the institute that it is because of change in Government policy or proliferation of private Nursing Homes is neither tenable nor acceptable.
2. Specialty clinic like Gynaec Endocrinology clinic is not run by the department. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Dr. V. Nirupama & Dr. T. Uma have been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cutoff date; however details of publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether their promotion is as per Regulations or not.
4. Senior Resident, Unit-I, Dr. K. Ramanna is not eligible. He is DNB from non-teaching Hospital. No 3 years experience as Junior Resident in Medical College. Unit-I has no other Junior Resident.
5. Dr. T. Uma, Assoc. Professor, Unit-II was promoted on 31/08/2015 without any publications. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
6. Dr. M. Anuradha, Asst. Professor, Unit-I was absent on the day of Assessment.
7. Dr. V. Nirupama, Assoc. Professor, Unit-I was promoted on 31/08/2015 without any publications. Hence, her promotion is not as per Regulations.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of

Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

69. Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 08 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2012 & April, 2014 for 4 to 5 seats and July, 2015 for 5 to 8 seats & 02/07/2015 for 4 to 5 seats) and compliance dated 14/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 08 seats at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2012 & April, 2014 for 4 to 5 seats and July, 2015 for 5 to 8 seats & 02/07/2015 for 4 to 5 seats) and compliance dated 14/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 08 seats granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. Bed occupancy is 71% on day of assessment.
2. Dr. K. Sekar, Dr. K. Sivakumar have been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cutoff date; however details of publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether their promotion is as per Regulations or not.
3. Dr. M. Narayanan, Dr. Mohammad Hanifa have been promoted as Professor after cutoff date; however details of publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether their promotion is as per Regulations or not.
4. Dr. Siva Ranganathan Green, Asst. Professor, Unit-I was absent on the day of Assessment.
5. Dr. M. Narayan, Professor, Unit-III promoted after cut-off date of 03/03/2014 without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
6. Dr. Sarvan Shankar, Assoc. Professor, Unit-III was absent on the day of Assessment. Hence, Unit-III left with only 2 Asst. Professor and it cannot be considered PG Unit.
7. Dr. M. Hanifah, Professor, Unit-IV was promoted on 01/08/2013 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.

8. Dr. Vijay Anand Raj, Asst. Professor was absent on the day of Assessment. Unit-4 left with 2 Asst. Professor. Hence, it cannot be considered PG Unit.
9. Dr. K. Siva Kumar, Assoc. Professor, Unit-VIII promoted on 28/08/2014 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
10. All Senior Residents are with MBBS qualification. No Certificate of 3 years as Junior Residency attached.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 4 to 8 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

70. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Dr. Panjabrao Alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 18/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 1 seat at Dr. Panjabrao Alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 18/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification for 1 seat granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr. Panjabrao Alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati because of the following facts:-

1. MRI is not available.
2. Deficiency of decreasing OPD over the years remains as it is.
3. No Senior Resident is available.
4. Unit IV has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
5. There is only 1 Junior Resident in all the 4 Units against requirement of 2 in each Unit.
6. Faculty Table not signed by any Faculty Member.

7. Available 10 (Professor: 1; Assoc. Professor: 3; Asst. Professor: 6). Required for 4 Units: 12. Hence, deficiency of 2 Assoc. Professor.
8. Assoc. Professor, Dr. P.B. Kadu was not available on the day of Assessment. Resultantly, Unit-III left with only 1 Asst. Professor.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

71. Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur - Recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and compliance dated 31/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and compliance dated 31/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

72. Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Bharati Vidyapeeth Medical College & Hospital, Sangli.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 and 25.03.2015) and compliance dated 05/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at Bharati Vidyapeeth Medical College & Hospital, Sangli granted by Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 and 25.03.2015) and compliance dated 05/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune in respect of students being trained at Bharati Vidyapeeth Medical College & Hospital, Sangli be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

73. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 08 seats in respect of students being trained at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 and 14.07.2015) and compliance dated 21/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 08 seats at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 and 14.07.2015) and compliance dated 21/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 08 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

74. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahadevappa Rampure Medical College, Gulbarga.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 22.07.2015) and compliance dated 10/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at Mahadevappa Rampure Medical College, Gulbarga granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 22.07.2015) and compliance dated 10/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Mahadevappa Rampure Medical College, Gulbarga be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

75. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1(One) seat and recognition of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 01 (One) to 02 (Two) seats & D.Ortho qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014, Jan., 2015 and 26.06.2015) and compliance dated 06/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1(One) seat and recognition of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 01 (One) to 02 (Two) seats & D.Ortho qualification for 02 seats at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014, Jan., 2015 and 26.06.2015) and compliance dated 06/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1(One) seat and not to recognize MS (Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 01 (One) to 02 (Two) seats & D.Ortho qualification for 02 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule because of the following facts:-

1. Although O.T. list contained 6 names, no patient was shifted to O.T. till 12:45 p.m. None of the patients in O.T. list underwent Pre Anaesthetic checkup.
2. OPD attendance on day of assessment was 83 which is inadequate. However OPD register showed only 54 patients.

3. Bed occupancy was 26% on day of assessment. There were only 21 genuine patients. All other admissions were admitted in a hurry on day of assessment.
4. NIL patient was admitted through Casualty on day of assessment. No Orthopaedic patient was seen in Casualty during assessment.
5. Data of clinical material provided by institute are fictitious.
6. There are only 2 Examination rooms in OPD against requirement of 4.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1 seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course"

Admissions done (if any) against these increased number of seats i.e. 1 to 2 degree seats and 02 diploma seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

76. Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghi Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2013, July, 2014 and 03.07.2015) and compliance dated 04/02/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar granted by Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghi Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2013, July, 2014 and 03.07.2015) and compliance dated 04/02/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats granted by Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghji Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar because of the following facts:-

1. No Senior Resident in Unit-IV.
2. Unit-V has only 2 Faculty.
3. Deficiency of one Unit and one Senior Resident.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 4 to 6 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

77. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahadevappa Rampure Medical College, Gulbarga.

6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Senior Residents are not staying in the campus.
2. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 2.
3. Shortage of Junior Resident: 1.
4. AERB approval is still not available for CT Scan, Mammography & other Radiological equipment.
5. MRI is not available.
6. There were only 08 Major operations for the whole hospital which is inadequate.
7. There was NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Deficiency of Thoracic Surgeon remains as it is.
2. Deficiency of Dr. S.N. Gaur having neither special training of 2 years nor D.M. qualification remains as it is.
3. Dr. S.N. Gaur, Dr. Raj Kumar and Dr. Balakrishnan Menon submitted Declaration Form of Faculty for Department of Pulmonary Medicine for DM course cannot be accepted because they have no appointment letter issued by appropriate appointing authority for the Department of Pulmonary Medicine as they are employee of Government funded university. They have appointment letter for the department of Respiratory Allergy & Applied Immunology. There is no established department of Pulmonary Medicine but DM (Pulmonary Medicine) course started as per decision of Governing Body of Institute for starting the DM (Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine) course not of the appropriate authority i.e. Delhi University.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. MRI & some other investigations are done outside the hospital on MOU basis. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. CT Scan was non-functional on day of assessment.
3. ICCU is under renovation. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic, Urology clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology clinic, Paediatric Surgery clinic, Surgical Oncology clinic are still not run.
5. Prescribed SAF for Compliance Verification not used.
6. On the day of Assessment, Bed Occupancy was 72%.
7. Dr. P. Nancharaiyah, Professor, Unit-III promoted on 11/12/2014 without any publications, which is not as per Regulations. Resultantly, Unit left with only 2 Asst. Professor.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Bed occupancy was only 47% on day of assessment.
2. Faculty table not attached with compliance without which, it cannot be decided whether faculty is as per requirement and eligible or not.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 5 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013, December, 2013 & 12.06.2015) and compliance dated 17/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 03(Three) to 06(Six) seats granted by Sri Devraj Urs Academy of Higher Education & Research (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at Sri Devaraj Urs Medical College, Kolar because of the following facts:-

1. II & III year Residents are not being paid stipend.
2. Dr. J.S. Nagakumar has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years 4 months against requirement of 5y; however in the column of Benefit of publications, it is stated "No" implying thereby that it is not given; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered as faculty.
3. Resultantly, there is no Asso. Prof. in Unit I & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. There are only 2 faculty in Unit II; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
5. Dr. K.S. Badrinath, Senior Resident does not have experience of 3 years as Resident in medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post; resultantly there is no Senior Resident in Unit II.
6. Dr. Shaikh Nazeer, Unit III has been shown as "Asso. Prof." in the column of Designation; however, in the column of experience, it is shown as Professor from 01/01/2009 till date. This dichotomy needs to be resolved.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 6 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

1. Unit P 1 which is also the Unit of HOD does not have Asso. Prof. Dr. Hariprasad B.G. is shown as having the experience of "Asso. & Addl." w.e.f. 17/06/2008 till date but in the column of "Designation", he is shown "Asst. Prof.". Hence, faculty complement is incomplete; resultantly it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. There is no Senior Resident in Units P 1, P 2, P 3, P 4, P 5.
3. In the faculty table, several faculty members are shown as "Asst. Prof." in the column of "Designation" but in the column of "Experience", it is shown as Asso. Prof. / Addl. Prof. This dichotomy needs to be resolved.
4. Unit "NB" has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
5. Dr. Shahnaz Ahmed M., Asst. Professor, Unit-P4 has not signed faculty table.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 6 to 9 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of

Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Dr. K.V. Chalapathira, Professor, Unit-III promoted Professor on 01/09/2015 without any publications, which is not as per Regulations. Resultantly, Unit-III left with 2 Asst. Professor.
2. Dr. G. Rama Krishna, Assoc. Professor, Unit-VI promoted on 01/02/2015 without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

123. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 08/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 02 seats at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 08/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 02 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule because of the following facts:-

1. Unit I which is also Unit of HOD does not have Asso. Prof.; hence faculty complement is incomplete; resultantly it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Unit II has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Dr. Abhinay Darwade, Senior Resident in Unit II, does not have experience of 3 years as Resident in medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post.
4. Resultantly, there is no Unit which can be accepted as PG Unit.
5. OPD attendance on day of assessment was only 49 which is grossly inadequate.
6. Bed occupancy was 20% on day of assessment. Average bed occupancy was 18% on day of assessment.
7. Number of Major & Minor operations on day of assessment is shown as NIL; however total Histopathology specimens are shown to be 13 which is not feasible.

8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 for 1 to 2 seats and May, 2015 for 2 to 3 seats) and compliance dated 08/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at M.V.J. Medical College, Bangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014 & 20.07.2015) and compliance dated 03/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification against increased

intake from 06 to 07 seats at Narayana Medical College, Nellore granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014 & 20.07.2015) and compliance dated 03/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 07 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Narayana Medical College, Nellore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

126. Datta Meghe Instt. of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Nagpur - Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Sawangi (Meghe), Wardha.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 21/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification for 4 seats at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Sawangi (Meghe), Wardha granted by Datta Meghe Instt. of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Nagpur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 21/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Physiology) qualification for 4 seats granted by Datta Meghe Instt. of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Nagpur in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Sawangi (Meghe), Wardha because of the following facts:-

1. The institute has stated that payable stipend is linked with chargeable fees, which cannot be accepted. It is obvious that the Institution is not paying stipend at par with that paid in Government colleges in the state. This is not as per Regulations.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 & 05.10.2015) and compliance dated 10/08/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

128. Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, New Delhi - Recognition of M.Ch.(CTVS) qualification against increased intake from 02(Two) to 04(Four) seats in respect of students being trained at Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research, Dr. R. M. L. Hospital, New Delhi.

Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

4. Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Surgical Gastroenterology) course at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/05/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (16/11/2015) and compliance dated 20/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Surgical Gastroenterology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/05/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (16/11/2015) and compliance dated 20/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. There are 2 Units but only 30 beds are available in the department against requirement of 40. Bed under PMSSY cannot be considered as it is not clarified whether it is a teaching hospital & which Unit is located where. Beds in HDU & ICU cannot be considered as teaching beds.
2. Dr. Nagesh has been promoted as Professor with experience of 3 years as Asso. Prof. after the cut-off date in June, 2014. He has no publications to his credit and hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
3. Dr. Sathish & Dr. Sumanth, both Senior Residents, do not have 3 years experience in the subject as Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
4. The college got permission for M.Ch. course in 2009. However, they have shown that they had imparted fellowship/special training to their faculty members including HOD starting from 2005 which is not permissible.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Surgical Gastroenterology) course at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

5. Starting of M.Ch. (Gynaec Oncology) course at The Gujarat Cancer & Research Institute, Ahmedabad under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/05/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (18/02/2016) and compliance dated 29/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at The Gujarat Cancer & Research Institute, Ahmedabad under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad for Starting of M.Ch. Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/05/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (18th November 2015) and compliance dated 30/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under King Georges Medical University, Lucknow for Starting of M.Ch. 1. There is no Professor in the department.
2. Dr. V.K. Chand, Dr. R.K. Bharti, Dr. A.K. Suman, Dr. Amit Kumar, all Senior Residents, do not possess 3 years experience as Resident in the department in medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. Operative workload is inadequate as detailed in the report.
4. Deficiency 3 stays as such i.e. operative workload is inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of M.Ch. (Neuro Surgery) course at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under King Georges Medical University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

8. Starting of M.Ch. (Paediatric Surgery) course at Era Lucknow Medical College, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 – withdrawal – reg.

Read: the letter dated 27/04/2016 received from the Principal, Dean & CMS, Era Lucknow Medical College & Hospital, Lucknow for withdrawal of compliance for starting of M.Ch. In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of DM (Endocrinology) course at Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

10. Starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Chalmeda Anand Rao Institute Of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

1. Equipment is inadequate. EPS / RFA is not available.

3. There is no joining report of Dr.Shridhar Kasturi, who has been appointed Professor & HOD on 23.4.16. All his previous experience from 2006 onwards has been in this college only which does not have promotion till date for DM (Cardiology), hence his experience cannot be recognized.

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/05/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (18/01/2016) and compliance dated 29/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at B J Medical College, Ahmedabad (attached with U.N. Mehta Institute of Cardiology & Research Centre) under Gujarat University for Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/05/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (18/01/2016) and compliance dated 29/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. 3 Senior Residents have experience of 3 years in Cardiology as PGDCC resident / Trained Cardiac Medical Officer.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course at B J Medical College, Ahmedabad (attached with U.N. Mehta Institute of Cardiology & Research Centre) under Gujarat University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

28. Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Paediatric Surgery) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/05/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (18/02/2016) and compliance dated 06/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Paediatric Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/05/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (18/02/2016) and compliance dated 06/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Paediatric Surgery) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 from 2(Two) to 4(Four) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

29. Starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth

Deemed University, Pune u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/05/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (08/02/2016) and compliance dated 26/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune for Starting of DM (Cardiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/05/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (08/02/2016) and compliance dated 26/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. OPD attendance is only 10 on day of assessment.
2. With regard to quality of teaching material, there was hardly any patient of Chronic Rheumatic Heart Disease.
3. There is wide fluctuation in OPD attendance from 1-2/day to 25-30/day.
4. A doctor with BAMS qualification was found managing patients in male cardiac ward.
5. Case sheets are not properly written.
6. Specialty clinics are non-functional since November 2015.
7. There is hardly any patient of Chronic Rheumatic heart disease; congenital heart disease or Heart failure admitted in any of the Cardiology wards. Almost all the patients are of Coronary Artery disease.
8. There is a wide fluctuation in OPD patients ranging from 1 – 2 per day to 25-30 per day in some other days.
9. Similarly, there is a wide fluctuation in the number of cath. Procedures ranging from 1-2 per day to 8-9 per day. On the day of inspection @ 10:00 A.M. the patient list posted for cardiac cath. was only 3, but by 3 PM the Medical Superintendent has given a signed paper showing that by 3 PM, 7 procedures has been performed.
10. A BAMS doctor was found managing the patients in Male Cardiac Ward.
11. Case sheets are hardly written. A cursory note of presenting complaints and vitals are being made in case sheet. Vitals are being checked and entered in case sheet daily.
12. Many patients are having more than one case sheet.
13. Speciality clinics have been stopped from November, 2015.
14. There is no CT Surgery department.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

30. Application for Starting of/ Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the applications for starting of/ increase of seats in various postgraduate courses u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18 along with the opinion of Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the applications for starting of/ increase of seats in various postgraduate courses u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act,

1956 for the academic year 2017-18 along with the opinion of Law Officer and perused opinion of Law Officer, which reads as under:

"...

5. *It is to be noted that the consent of affiliation submitted by the applicant is deficient on the grounds mentioned in the pre-page note. Consequently, these applications are without a valid consent of affiliation that makes the application incomplete. The law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court as referred above is loud and clear to the effect that incomplete applications are liable to be rejected. Therefore, it would be appropriate to recommend to the Central Government to disapprove the applications in respect of the colleges mentioned on the pre-page note."*

In view of above, it was decided to return the applications to the Central Government recommending disapproval of scheme, however, if Consent of Affiliation is in format but academic year not mentioned and has been issued in the current year be treated valid for that academic year.

The Committee further decided that in future any such application shall be decided by the office directly.

31. **Starting of M.Ch. (Hepato Pancreato Biliary Surgery) course at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (21st March, 2016) and compliance dated 29/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai for Starting of M.Ch. (Hepato Pancreato Biliary Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21st March, 2016) and compliance dated 29/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. The deficiency of Sr. Residents stays as such. It is not for the MCI to consider anybody in a particular rank. It is for the college which has to appoint him in that rank and MCI only considers after that whether he is eligible or not as per regulations. Deficiency persists as it is.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of M.Ch. (Hepato Pancreato Biliary Surgery) course at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamil Nadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

32. **Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla under Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (30/03/2016) and compliance dated 06/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla under Himachal Pradesh

University, Shimla for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (30/03/2016) and compliance dated 06/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. The deficiency of Assoc. Professor stays as such. Promotion of Dr.Sanjay, Professor is not as per Regulations. He was Assoc. Professor only for two years 7 months against the requirement of four years.
2. Facilities for Renal Transplant still not available. There is no Sr.Resident in the department.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla under Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

33. Starting of M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) course at Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, Kolkata, West Bengal under West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (22/02/2016) and compliance dated 05/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, Kolkata, West Bengal under West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata for Starting of M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (22/02/2016) and compliance dated 05/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Deficiency 1 stays as such. None of the Senior Resident have 3 years experience as Junior Resident in Surgical Gastroenterology in a Medical College.
2. Dr. Somak Das is DNB from non-teaching hospital. He has no 3 years experience as Junior Resident from Medical College.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) course at Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, Kolkata, West Bengal under West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

34. Revision/ preparation of Standard Assessment Form for various Postgraduate courses for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the matter with regard to revision/ preparation of Standard Assessment Form for various Postgraduate courses for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to revision/ preparation of Standard Assessment Form for various Postgraduate courses and the Committee approved all Standard Assessment Forms (revised).

The Committee further decided that the revised Standard Assessment Forms may be placed on the MCI website and all previous SAFs should be withdrawn. All future assessments should be done according to these SAFs.
