The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee - confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 30th March, 2016.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

3. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MD(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 5 seats in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 28/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 5 seats at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 28/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 5 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at SVS Medical College, Mahabubnagar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

4. Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai - Recognition of M.Ch.(Paediatrics Surgery) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 03/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch.(Paediatrics Surgery) qualification for 01 seat at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai granted by Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 03/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch.(Paediatrics Surgery) qualification for 01 seat granted by Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Vivek Patil, Senior Resident does not have 3 years experience as Resident in the department of Paediatric Surgery; hence not qualified to hold the post.
2. Resultantly there is shortage of Senior Resident: 1.

3. Dr. Vivek Patil has been shown as "Senior Resident" in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table; however in the column of experience, it is shown as "Asst. Prof." from 14/12/2015 till date. This is not feasible.
4. There are no Junior Residents shown.
5. Professor & HoD, Dr. Hemant Lahoti promoted on 01/12/2014 without any publications. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
6. There is no list of publications attached.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

5. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P - Recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 10/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 10/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P in respect of students being trained at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Epidemiologist cum Asst. Prof.: 1; (b) Statistician cum Lecturer: 1.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As

per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 17/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats at MNR Medical College, Sangareddy granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 17/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at MNR Medical College, Sangareddy be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

7. Ch. Charan Singh University - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 28/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar granted by Ch. Charan Singh University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 28/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and

decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Ch. Charan Singh University in respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of following faculty members is not as per Regulations for reasons mentioned against their names and resultantly, they cannot be considered:
 - a. Dr. K.K. Pahwa, Professor & HoD – He was Asst. Professor for 4 years 9 months and Assoc. Professor for 3 years 7 months. There are no publications.
 - b. Dr. Ila Pahwa, Professor – She was Asst. Professor for 4 years 3 months and Assoc. Professor for 3 years 8 months. There are no 4 publications required.
 - c. Dr. Hemant Sharma, Assoc. Professor – He was Asst. Professor for 4 years without any publications.
 - d. Dr. Y.B. Aggarwal, Assoc. Professor – He was Asst. Professor for 3 years as per original report, which has now been changed to 4 years in the compliance, which is not permissible. Even with this, his promotion is not as per Regulations because he has no publications.
 - e. Dr. Subodh Prakash, Assoc. Professor – He was Asst. Professor for 4 years 10 months without any publications.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 08/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Hospital Administration) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal granted by Manipal University, Manipal.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report

(April, 2015) and compliance dated 08/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Hospital Administration) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by Manipal University, Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of promotion of Dr. Dayanada not being as per Regulations remains as it is. He has been appointed straightaway as Professor without any experience of Asst. Prof. & Asso. Prof. shown. There is no Certificate of experience from Competent Authority of the Office of Director General Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) specifying the subject, period and places of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialist and advisor without which, his equated teaching designations cannot be calculated. No other certificate signed by any other authority will be entertained.
2. There is no Senior Resident in the department.
3. Promotion of Dr. Somu O, Professor is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years and Assoc. Professor for 3 years. Out of 4 publications cited, he is not 1st or 2nd Author in first 2 and out of the remaining 2, one is a review article and no year of publication of any of the publications is given.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (21.05.2013 & 09.07.2015) and compliance dated 03/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats at Dr Vaishampayan Memorial Medical College, Solapur granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (21.05.2013 & 09.07.2015) and compliance dated 03/11/2015 submitted by the college

authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD (Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr Vaishampayan Memorial Medical College, Solapur because of the following facts:-

1. Blood component separation facility is not available.
2. Dr. S.G. Verma promoted on 29/06/2015 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
3. Dr. V.M. Haridas, Assoc. Professor promoted on 27/06/2015 after the cut-off date without any publications.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and compliance dated 21/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition.

Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

11. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr BR Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 24/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Dr BR Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 24/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(Ophthalmology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Dr BR Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

12. The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai - Renewal of recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Institute of Ophthalmology Joseph Eye Hospital, Tiruchirapalli.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 12/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats at Institute of Ophthalmology Joseph Eye Hospital, Tiruchirapalli granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 12/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Institute of Ophthalmology Joseph Eye Hospital, Tiruchirapalli be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition.

Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

13. King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University) - Recognition of MD(PMR) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 30/09/2015\01/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(PMR) qualification for 02 seats at King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow granted by King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 30/09/2015\01/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(PMR) qualification for 02 seats granted by King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Anil Kumar Gupta was shown Asst. Professor from 01/07/2010 to 22/05/2015 (total period is not 5 years 10 months as given in table). He is shown Assoc. Professor w.e.f. 23/05/2014. He cannot be Asst. Professor and Assoc. Professor both during the same period. There are no publications to his credit. Hence, he cannot be considered.
2. No other Assoc. Professor in the department.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

1. Dr. Mehooba Beigh, Asso. Prof. has experience of only 3 years 3 months as Asst. Prof.; hence she cannot be considered as Asso. Prof. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Dr. Anjum Malik, Asso. Prof. did not specify date of joining as Asst. Prof. / Lecturer; hence her experience could not be verified. She does not have any publications.
3. Some of data provided in SAF do not tally with physical verification. Labour room facilities are inadequate. Eclampsia room & HDU are lacking.
4. Specialty Clinics: Only High Risk clinic is functioning. Other clinics like Gynaec Endocrine clinic, Infertility clinic, Cancer clinic, Postnatal clinic, Menopausal clinic, Family Planning clinic do not exist.
5. In faculty table, exact date of joining in a particular post are not provided; hence it is difficult to verify experience and thereby eligibility.
6. Except USG, no other special services are provided.
7. Major O.T. in Gynaecology runs 4 days a week. Minor O.T. & Septic O.T. are not available.
8. Neonatal resuscitation is done in a store room adjacent to labour room.
9. Central O2 is not available.
10. Deficiency of inadequate number of publications remains as it is.
11. OPD space is inadequate.
12. There are no separate wards. Post-operative patients, antenatal patients, postnatal patients, Gynaec cases, septic cases are all kept together.

13. Faculty table is incomplete. Details of faculty at Bemina campus are not provided.
14. On the day of assessment, Major operations were Nil and Day Care operations were nil.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. No Senior Resident is shown in the faculty table.
2. Incomplete experience of the faculty is shown in the faculty table; hence their eligibility cannot be verified.
3. Details of clinical material of the department are not provided.
4. Deficiency of NIL original publications remains as it is.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 3. Senior Resident in Unit-C is not eligible. He has no 3 years experience at the time of appointment.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Dr. Reshma Ashwani, Asst. Prof. in Unit I was absent on day of assessment; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete in Unit I.
2. Both Senior Residents in Unit I do not possess 3 years experience as Resident in medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. STD clinic was housed in 1 room. There was only 1 examination table. There was no examination equipment (Speculum, Microscope for seniors, etc.) and separate cubicles for males/females. No patients were seen in the clinic.
4. Medical history taking needs both improvement as well as supervision by seniors.
5. On the day of Assessment, Bed occupancy was 28.3%.
6. No examination equipment in STD Clinic and no patients were seen in the Clinic.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these increased number of seats i.e. 1 to 2 degree seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Both Senior Residents in the only Unit do not have 3 years experience as Resident in medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post.
2. New equipment for Impedance Audiometry is yet to be procured. As stated by the institute, it is being done at All India Institute of Speech & Hearing at Mysuru through MOU which is not permissible.
3. O.T. has 2 tables which is not as per norms.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 12.06.2016) and compliance dated 07/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr. Panjabrao Alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. D.S. Jane, Professor was absent on day of assessment.
2. Dr. Chetna is stated to be having DNB qualification. However in the faculty table enclosed with assessment on 25/03/2016 still shows her academic qualification as M.B.B.S. only.
3. Workload of Frozen Section continues to remain low.
4. Histopathological workload from the hospital is grossly inadequate – only 3 tissues removed after Surgery & only 2 biopsies on day of assessment. Rest of the work is from outside the hospital.
5. Workload of CT guided FNAC was NIL & of USG guided FNAC only 1 on day of assessment.
6. Workload investigations like Sputum Examination, Bone Marrow Biopsy, TT is NIL in last 3 years.

7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. In compliance verification table, at item # 8 on P. 4, it is stated that Dr. R.V. Ranjan has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after completing 5 years experience on 01/10/2014. However, in the faculty table on P. 8, he is shown as Asst. Prof. from 01/10/2008 to 30/09/2013 and as Asso. Prof. from 01/10/2013. This dichotomy needs to be clarified.
2. Further, if Dr. R.V. Ranjan is promoted on 01/10/2014 as shown in compliance verification table, that is after cutoff date; however, details of publications are not provided; hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion as per Regulations or not.
3. Dr. John Abraham, Professor & Dr. R.V. Ranjan, Asso. Prof. were absent on day of assessment; Resultantly there is deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.
4. Out of 4 Senior Residents shown, Dr. Kiran Dontha was absent on day of assessment; resultantly, there is shortage of (a) Senior Resident: 1.
5. Even projected Major Operations for 2015 are shown as 4700, which is less than 2013 (4715).

6. Projected Minor Operations 5000, which is less than 2013 (5765).
7. Promotion of Dr. T. Ramachandra is not as per Regulations. He was Assoc. Professor for 3 years 6 months against the requirement of 4 years without any publications. There is no Certificate of experience from Competent Authority of the Office of Director General Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) specifying the subject, period and place of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialist and advisor without which their equated teaching designations cannot be calculated. No other certificate signed by any other authority will be entertained.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. II year Residents are posted to other centers like private hospitals which is not permissible.
3. Total Hip Replacement & Total Knee Replacement operations are only 2-3/month which is inadequate.
4. Promotion of Dr. B. Venkat Ramman is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years 8 months against the requirement of 5 years without any publications. Resultantly, Unit-III left with 2 Faculty.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Dr. Pratima Jaiswal, Professor & HOD has been promoted as Professor after cutoff date on 06/10/2015; however as she does not fulfil criteria of 4 research publications required for appointment as Professor; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations; resultantly, faculty complement is incomplete.
2. Dr. Aarushi Jain, Asst. Prof. has been transferred to this institute from SMS Medical College, Jaipur on 14/05/2015; but she continues to receive her salary from earlier institute (i.e. SMS Medical College, Jaipur) implying thereby that her name is not struck off from the rolls of SMS Medical college, Jaipur. This is not permissible.
3. Central Library: Librarian is still not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

47. Manipal University, Manipal - Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 09 seats in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 26/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 09 seats at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal granted by Manipal University, Manipal.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 26/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 09 seats granted by Manipal University, Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

48. Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of DIHBT qualification for 6 seats in respect of students being trained at SMS Medical College, Jaipur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2014) and compliance dated 30/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DIHBT qualification for 6 seats at SMS Medical College, Jaipur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2014) and compliance dated 30/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DIHBT qualification for 6 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in

respect of students being trained at SMS Medical College, Jaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

Note: The Dean should be asked to come with a proposal that how many degree and diploma seats they want to continue in accordance with available faculty.

49. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of recognition of DCH qualification in respect of students being trained at Grant Medical College, Mumbai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (10th & 11th December, 2015) and compliance dated 14/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DCH qualification at Grant Medical College, Mumbai granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (10th & 11th December, 2015) and compliance dated 14/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to defer the matter. As per request dated 04/03/2016 from college authorities, a date may be given as per their request.

50. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Renewal of recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Dr ALM PG Institution of Basic Medical Sciences, Chennai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 01/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 1 seat at Dr ALM PG Institution of Basic Medical Sciences, Chennai granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 01/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 1 seat granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Dr ALM PG Institution of Basic Medical Sciences, Chennai because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1; (b) Asst. Prof.: 2 remains as it is.
2. The request of the institute that the availability of facilities as required for 50 UG intake may not be insisted upon is not acceptable in view of PG Regulations which being Statutory Regulations are mandatory & binding in character.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations

(notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

The Committee further decided to recommend to the Central Government to stop admissions in MD (Pharmacology) qualification at Dr. ALM PG Institution of Basic Medical Sciences, Chennai with immediate effect.

51. NIMS University (Deemed University), Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 02/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 04 seats at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University (Deemed University), Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 02/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 04 seats granted by NIMS University (Deemed University), Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. With respect to Dr. Vijender Sharma, the deficiency pointed out was " ~ is shown as Professor as full time since 2004. However in his Form 16, salary of only 4th quarter is shown. He worked as Asso. Prof. at this institute from 01/12/2003 to 04/04/2004. His appointment letter dt. 01/12/2003 does not bear any official stamp of the institute."

Compliance submitted by the institute does not mention anything about these two issues – salary of only 4th quarter being shown in Form 16 & his appointment letter dt. 01/12/2003 not bearing any official stamp of the institute.

2. With respect to Dr. R.S. Chaudhary, the deficiency pointed out was "His appointment letter does not bear any official stamp of the institute. No salary slip is attached with the D.F. When asked, it was stated that he is

paid Rs. 60,000 p.m. which is too low for a Professor of Anaesthesiology; hence his status as a full time faculty is doubtful."

Compliance submitted by the institute does not mention anything about these two issues – salary of only Rs. 60,000 p.m. being too low & his appointment letter not bearing any official stamp of the institute. Contention of the institute that Appointment letter is on official letterhead of University which does not require seal/stamp is not acceptable.

3. In view of above, deficiency of faculty remains as it is.
4. With regard to remark "The institute has shown progressive increase in Surgeries from 2013 to 2015. However data could not be verified.:", the institute has stated that "The assessors of Surgery & ENT have verified data of Surgery & ENT. Therefore in this situation of contradiction, the observation of assessor of Anaesthesia stands null and unjustified in eyes of law" is not acceptable.
5. No compliance is submitted regarding the remark "Daily operative lists cannot be commented upon or be verified as O.T. lists & registers are not properly maintained. Department-wise or Unitwise distribution is not shown."
6. No compliance is submitted regarding the remark "The patients who were mentioned in O.T. lists of 04/01/2016, majority of them were not available in either O.T. or respective Surgical ward, meaning thereby that O.T. list was too much inflated/fabricated." It is only stated that this was verified by Surgery assessor which is not acceptable.
7. No compliance is submitted with regard to number of beds occupied in Orthopaedics. The contention of the institute that the observation of assessor of Anaesthesia is nullified by observation of assessor of General Surgery is not acceptable.
8. Deficiency of no register being available in PAC remains as it is. Computerized printout is not a substitute for registers.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

52. NIMS University (Deemed University), Jaipur - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 06 seats in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (9th April, 2016) as per the Judgment dated 04/03/2016 of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 02/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 06 seats at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University (Deemed University), Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (9th April, 2016) as per the Judgment dated 04/03/2016 of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 02/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification for 06 seats granted by NIMS University (Deemed University), Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Vineet Chaudhary, Professor, Unit-IV has been promoted after the cut-off date on 03/02/2015. Out of the 9 publications enclosed, he is 3rd Author in one of them, one outside his period of promotion and others are Case Reports or Review Articles, which cannot be considered. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
2. Dr. Nitesh Langoria, Senior Resident, Unit-VI was not available on the day of Assessment. Resultantly, there is no Senior Resident in Unit-VI.
3. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
4. Dr. S.K. Kala, Unit-I has been shown as "Assoc. Professor" in the column of "Designation". However, in the column of Experience, he is shown as "Asst. Professor" at this institute w.e.f. 17/02/2016 till date. Further, his experience at Mahatma Gandhi Institute from 06/03/2010 to 30/04/2013 is shown as "Senior Resident" & "Assistant Professor", which is not permissible. This period has to be bifurcated into Senior Resident & Asst. Professor. Although he has been given benefit of publications, details of research publications are not given in the faculty table & hence, cannot be verified.
5. Resultantly, there is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-I and hence, faculty complement is incomplete and it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
6. Dr. S.B. Sharma, Unit-III has been shown as "Professor" in the column of "Designation". However, in the column of Experience, he is shown as "Asst. Professor" at this institute w.e.f. 02/05/2012 till date. His earlier experience at SMS Medical College is in Paediatrics Surgery and therefore, cannot be considered for promotion in General Surgery.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 06 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (9th April, 2016) as per the Judgment dated 04/03/2016 of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 02/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification 02 seats at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University (Deemed University), Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (9th April, 2016) as per the Judgment dated 04/03/2016 of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 02/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(ENT) qualification 02 seats granted by NIMS University (Deemed University), Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Department does not participate in National Programme for Control of Deafness. Contention of the institute that this programme is not opted by Govt. of Rajasthan is not acceptable.
2. Experience of Dr. Gaurav Sharma, Senior Resident at Government Medical College, Nagpur as Junior Resident is only 2 years against the requirement of 3 years. His experience of Nanavati Hospital (non-teaching) cannot be counted. He is not eligible to be appointed Senior Resident and there is no other Senior Resident in the department.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 29/02/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

55. Delhi University, Delhi - Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 29/02/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi granted by Delhi University, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 29/02/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

56. Delhi University, Delhi - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 5 seats in respect of students being trained at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 14/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 5 seats at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi granted by Delhi University, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 14/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

57. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at S S Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Davangere.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 03/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and

other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat at S S Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Davangere granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 03/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at S S Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Davangere because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Dr. H.H. Kulkarni is not eligible to be Professor with the experience is shown in the compliance. His promotion as Asso. Prof. is not as per Regulations as he has been promoted with experience of only 3 years 8 months as Asst. Prof. Hence the deficiency remains as it is.
2. Deficiency of 2 publications stays. There is only one publications in 2015 in a non-indexed Journal.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015) and compliance dated 21/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch(Surgical Oncology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health

Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Vydehi Institute Of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. With regard to promotion of Dr. M. Vijay Kumar not being as per Regulations, it is stated by the institute that "He may be considered as Asst. Prof." This is not correct. It is for the institute to downgrade him to the post of Asst. Prof. and submit fresh D.F. with relevant orders of posting as Asst. Prof. and his fresh joining report.
2. Explanation provided by the institute for considering experience of faculty the department of Surgical Oncology was established is not correct. Such experience cannot be considered.
3. Relieving orders of Dr. Ganesh M.S., Professor & HoD still not provided. Deficiency stays as such.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Sc., Patna (Deemed Univ.).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015) and compliance dated 14/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

60. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 12(Twelve) to 15(Fifteen) seats in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013) and compliance dated 11/03/2016 submitted

by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 12(Twelve) to 15(Fifteen) seats at Govt. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013) and compliance dated 11/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 12(Twelve) to 15(Fifteen) seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Unit VIII has only 2 faculty & cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 1.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 12 to 15 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

Medical College, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 14/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

62. Starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Chalmeda Anand Rao Institute Of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (29/03/2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Chalmeda Anand Rao Institute Of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Starting of DM (Cardiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (29/03/2016) and noted the following:

1. Dr. Prabeen Kumar Rath, Professor & HoD was not available on the day of Assessment. Resultantly, there is no Professor in the department.
2. Dr. M. Vinod Kumar – There is no certificate of experience from Eluru and Khammam as Asst. Professor. Resultantly, his appointment as Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations.
3. There is no Holter, no EPS/ RFA equipment, no Intra-aortic balloon pump.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Chalmeda Anand Rao Institute Of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

63. Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla under Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (30/03/2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla under Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (30/03/2016) and noted the following:

1. The only Unit has 14 beds against requirement of 20. Even these 14 beds are on loan basis from Medical ward which is not permissible. This implies that there is no independent ward or beds of Nephrology department.
2. There is no Asso. Prof. in the only Unit; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Both Senior Residents do not have 3 years experience as Resident in the department; hence not eligible to hold the post.
4. Departmental Library does not exist. Central Library has only 10 books on the subject.
5. Departmental office is not available.
6. There are no orders of competent authority creating separate department of Nephrology and no appointment/ promotion order.
7. Dr. Sanjay Vikrant is shown as Professor in the column of designation but Assoc. Professor in the column of experience. He is not eligible to be Professor from 04/04/2011 because he has been Assoc. Professor for 2 years 7 months against the requirement of 4 years.

8. There are no promotion orders of Dr. Sanjay Vikrant even as Assoc. Professor.
9. Dr. P.S. Thakur, Senior Resident is only MBBS. No 3 years experience in Nephrology as Junior Resident. Hence, not eligible.
10. Dr. Ranvijay Singh, Senior Resident is MD (Medicine). No 3 years experience in Nephrology. Hence, not eligible.
11. There is no Transplant facility.
12. No list of equipment available in the department has been provided.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla under Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

64. Starting of DM (Hepatology) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17-consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23rd February 2016) and compliance dated 30th March 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore for Starting of DM (Hepatology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23rd February 2016) and compliance dated 30th March 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. The institute has stated that separate department of Haepatology was established in 2011. Hence the experience of Prem K. Nair prior to that date cannot be considered for department of Haepatology. His appointment straightaway as Asso. Prof. of Hepatology is not as per Regulations.
2. Dr. Jeffrey George possesses D.M. (Medical Gastroenterology) from this institute. As the institute has stated that separate division of Haepatology existed since 2002, his experience in Medical Gastroenterology cannot be considered for posting in Haepatology. Deficiency of his appointment as Asst. Prof. in Haepatology remains as it is.
3. Dr. H.K. Nandeesh does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in the department; hence not qualified to hold the post.
4. As per Assessment Report, Dr. G. Rajesh was Senior Resident in Gastroenterology from 04/07/2003 to 31/12/2009. However, in the compliance, he has been shown to be working in Hepatology from July, 2007 to December, 2009.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Hepatology) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

65. Starting of DM (Organ Transplant Anaesthesia & Critical Care) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (25th February 2016) and compliance dated 30th March 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore for Starting of DM (Organ Transplant Anaesthesia & Critical Care) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (25th February 2016) and compliance dated 30th March 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Senior Resident, Dr. Vyshali Dharampal has no 3 years experience in Organ Transplant Anaesthesia & Critical Care. Hence, not eligible.
2. Dr. Zubair Umar Mohammad, Asst. Professor has no 2 years special training in Organ Transplant Anaesthesia & Critical Care. The Certificate enclosed does not say any such training. The Certificate enclosed is only a membership certificate.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Organ Transplant Anaesthesia & Critical Care) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

66. Starting of DM (Rheumatology) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (26th February 2016) and compliance dated 30th March 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore for Starting of DM (Rheumatology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (26th February 2016) and compliance dated 30th March 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. No explanation is given for promoting Dr. Jyothi V.S. after cutoff date without research publications required as per Regulations. Further, she has acquired MRCP from Royal College of Physicians of U.K. in 2008 & also DNB (General medicine) from this institute in 2008 which is not feasible. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Dr. Hasim Ahmed does not possess 3 years experience in the department as Resident; hence not qualified to be appointed as Senior Resident. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Dr. Suman Balan was Asst. Professor from 06/07/2009 to 05/07/2014 and Assoc. Professor from 06/07/2014 till date in the Assessment Report.

Now, in the compliance, she has been shown as Asst. Professor from 06/07/2009 to 06/07/2011; Assoc. Professor from 07/07/2011 to 06/07/2015 and she has been shown as Professor. She was shown Assoc. Professor during assessment. Dr. Suman Balan has been promoted as Professor after cutoff date; however details of her publications are not provided; hence it cannot be verified whether her promotion is as per Regulations or not.

4. Dr. Mithun C.B., Asst. Professor possesses DM (Clinical Immunology) and not DM (Rheumatology).
5. Books not yet purchased. Deficiency of books in departmental library stays as such.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Rheumatology) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

67. Starting of DM (Infectious Disease) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (26th February 2016) and compliance dated 30th March 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore for Starting of DM (Infectious Disease) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (26th February 2016) and compliance dated 30th March 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Dr. Sobha Subramaniam has been promoted as Professor after cutoff date; however details of her publications are not provided. He has no 2 years special training in Infectious Diseases. All his experience is in General Medicine and shifted to Infectious Diseases only at the level of Professor. Hence, not eligible.
2. Dr. P.P. Binny, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience in the department as Resident; hence not qualified to be appointed as Senior Resident. Deficiency remains as it is. There is no designation of Provisional Lecturer/ Asst. Professor, which Dr. P.P. Binny was holding prior to his appointment.
3. Dr. Vidya P. Menon:
 - a. She has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cutoff date; however details of her publications are not provided; hence it cannot be verified whether her promotion is as per Regulations or not.
 - b. In the assessment report, she has been shown Asst. Professor from 08/02/2013 to 30/08/2014 and Assoc. Professor from 01/09/2014 till date. However, in the compliance she has been shown Asst. Professor from 08/02/2013 to 31/07/2015 and Assoc. Professor from 01/08/2015 till date.
 - c. No Certificate of 2 years training in DM (Infectious Diseases) at the time of appointment. Hence, not eligible.

4. In the Assessment Report signed by the Dean and Assessor, Dr. Dipu T.S. was Asst. Professor in General Medicine from 07/10/2013 to 03/05/2015, which is now been changed to Senior Resident in Infectious Diseases, which is not permissible.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

 3. Dr. B. Rajammal:
 - a. In the old report, he worked at Amrita Institute from 09/09/1988 to 2001. In the compliance he is shown to have worked at Alleppy during this period.
 - b. In old Assessment Report, he was shown as Professor at Amrita Institute from 01/06/2002 to 31/07/2015. In the compliance he is shown as Asst. Professor from 2002 to 2007, Assoc. Professor from 2007 to 2011 and Professor from 2011 till date.
 4. Dr. Vivek Krishnan:
 - a. In compliance, he is shown to have done fellowship in Fatal Medicine w.e.f. 2012 to 2013 and 2013 to 2014. No such fellowship shown in old report. He was only shown as Asst. Professor from 21/04/2014 till date.
 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Reproductive Medicine) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

2. Dr. Parvathi Verma, Asst. Prof. possesses qualification of M.Sc. (Medical Laboratory technology), Ph.D. which is not an acceptable academic qualification for the post. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. In the Assessment Report signed by the Dean and Assessor, Dr. Parvathi Verma was shown Asst. Professor from 15/10/2012 till date. In

compliance, she has been shown Resident in Virology from 15/10/2012 to 14/10/2015 and Asst. Professor w.e.f. 15/10/2015.

4. In the Assessment Report signed by the Dean and Assessor, Dr. Jampala Srinivas, has been shown Asst. Professor from 01/11/2012 to 31/04/2016 (6 months) and Assoc. Professor from 01/05/2013 till date. In the compliance, he is shown Asst. Professor from 01/11/2012 to 31/12/2014 (2 years) and Assoc. Professor from 01/01/2015 till date.
5. Ms. Awasthy N., Senior Resident possesses qualification of M.Sc. (Medical Microbiology) which is not an acceptable academic qualification; hence not eligible to hold the post. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In the compliance, he is shown as Senior Resident from 01/08/2007 to 31/07/2009. He was shown Assoc. Professor from 02/08/2010 to till date in the original report in the compliance, he is shown Assoc. Professor from 01/08/2013 till date. The dates and designations have been changed, which is not permissible.
4. The Dean may be asked to explain the change of dates and designations.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Deficiency 2 stays as such. Dr. Ibrahim Kothawala has only 1 year 10 months experience instead of required 3 years at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor. His experience at Ruby Hall cannot be counted.
3. There is no Certificate of experience from Competent Authority of the Office of Director General Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) specifying the subject, period and place of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialist and advisor without which their equated teaching designations cannot be calculated. No other certificate signed by any other authority will be entertained.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. OPD runs only twice a week. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Total number of major operations are 560-620/year implying daily average of 1.85-2.07 which is inadequate. OT runs twice a week which is inadequate.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2015) and compliance dated 17/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided that college should come for fresh assessment at the time of next examination, since, it is not as per Regulations that practical/ clinical examination can be conducted prior to Theory examination.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2015) and compliance dated 17/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification for 2 seats at Kathiar Medical College, Kathiar granted by B.N. Mandal University, Bihar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2015) and compliance dated 17/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided that college should come for fresh assessment at the

time of next examination, since, it is not as per Regulations that practical/ clinical examination can be conducted prior to Theory examination.

Mandal University, Bihar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2015) and compliance dated 17/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided that college should come for fresh assessment at the time of next examination, since, it is not as per Regulations that practical/ clinical examination can be conducted prior to Theory examination.

115. B.N. Mandal University, Bihar - Renewal of recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Kathiar Medical College, Kathiar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2015) and compliance dated 17/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 3 seats at Kathiar Medical College, Kathiar granted by B.N. Mandal University, Bihar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2015) and compliance dated 17/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided that college should come for fresh assessment at the time of next examination, since, it is not as per Regulations that practical/ clinical examination can be conducted prior to Theory examination.

116. B.N. Mandal University, Bihar - Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 1 seats and Diploma in Clinical Pathology qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Kathiar Medical College, Kathiar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (September, 2015) and compliance dated 17/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 1 seats and Diploma in Clinical Pathology qualification for 1 seat at Kathiar Medical College, Kathiar granted by B.N. Mandal University, Bihar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (September, 2015) and compliance dated 17/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided that college should come for fresh assessment at the time of next examination, since, it is not as per Regulations that practical/ clinical examination can be conducted prior to Theory examination.

117. Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai - Recognition of DM(Critical Care) qualification for 2 seat in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and compliance dated 21/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Critical Care) qualification for 2 seat at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai granted by Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and compliance dated 21/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Critical Care) qualification for 2 seat granted by Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai because of the following facts:-

1. There are no separate beds for this department. All 25 beds shown in ICU are also shown as beds of this department. Resultantly, there are no beds for ICU. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

118. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of DM(Oncology) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Regional centre for Cancer Research and treatment, Adyar, Chennai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and compliance dated 16/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Oncology) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats at Regional centre for Cancer Research and treatment, Adyar, Chennai granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and compliance dated 16/03/2016 submitted by the

college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Oncology) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Regional centre for Cancer Research and treatment, Adyar, Chennai because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Although it is stated that there are 2 Units, in the faculty table there is only 1 Unit shown under the subject of Medical Oncology. Dr. T. Rajkumar has been shown as Professor & Head of Department of Molecular Oncology & also as faculty in Medical Oncology which is not permissible.
2. There is no Senior Resident.
3. There is no ICCU. Deficiency remains as it is. Patients are sent to nearby multispecialty hospital which is not permissible.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 4 to 6 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

119. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of DM(Endocrinology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Nilratan Sircar Medical College, Kolkata.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (30th & 31st July, 2015) and compliance dated 18/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and Assessor's remarks dated 28/02/2016 on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Endocrinology) qualification for 2 seats at Nilratan Sircar Medical College, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (30th & 31st July, 2015) and compliance dated 18/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and Assessor's remarks dated 28/02/2016 and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Endocrinology) qualification for 2 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Nilratan Sircar Medical College, Kolkata because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. There is no information in SAF about the department & faculty. Even in the SAF sent with compliance, the same deficiency persists. No

information is given in Parts II & III. Only information pertaining to institute in Part I is given. Deficiency remains as it is.

2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and compliance dated 21/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of Diploma in Forensic Medicine qualification for 6 seats at SMS Medical College, Jaipur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and compliance dated 21/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

121. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of DM(Endocrinology)qualification against increased intake from 02to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, Kolkata.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 18/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Endocrinology)qualification against increased intake from 02to 06 seats at Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 18/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

122. The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai - Recognition of MS (OBG) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Sri Mookambika Instt. of Medical Sciences, Kulasekharan, Tamil Nadu.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 23/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS (OBG) qualification for 2 seats at Sri Mookambika Instt. of Medical Sciences, Kulasekharan, Tamil Nadu granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 23/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS (OBG) qualification for 2 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sri Mookambika Instt. of Medical Sciences, Kulasekharan, Tamil Nadu be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

123. Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (21st March 2016) and compliance dated 07/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21st March 2016) and compliance dated 07/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Dr. Pradeep P. Dalwadi who is working as Superspecialty Medical officer is shown as Senior Resident which is not permissible. The post of Medical Officer cannot be equated with that of Senior Resident who is required to stay in the hospital 24x7. Deficiency of Senior Resident remains as it is.
2. Endocrinology OPD runs twice a week. Not turning away patients referred to Endocrine services cannot be considered as full-fledged Endocrinology OPD. Similarly, running focused clinics for different sections of Endocrinology also cannot be considered as full-fledged Endocrinology OPD. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Faculty table is not attached with compliance.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai

under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

124. Starting of DM (Neonatology) course at Government Medical College, Chandigarh under Punjab University, Chandigarh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (10/03/2016) and compliance dated 09/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Government Medical College, Chandigarh under Punjab University, Chandigarh for Starting of DM (Neonatology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (10/03/2016) and compliance dated 09/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Dr. Suksham Jain passed D.M. (Neonatology) in 2013. Her teaching prior to that cannot be considered. Hence she cannot be considered as Professor. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Dr. Pankaj Kumar, Asst. Prof. has neither D.M. qualification nor 2 years training in the subject. Section 11.1 (b) entitles an institute to have 2 persons with Superspecialty qualification in the Unit, but it does not exempt a person who is not having Superspecialty qualification from having 2 years training for becoming eligible for appointment and is therefore not applicable in the instant case. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. There is no Senior Resident who has 3 years experience as Resident in the department. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Neonatal Unit is still a part of Paediatrics department and not a separate full-fledged department. It has faculty from Paediatrics department working in the Unit. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Neonatology) course at Government Medical College, Chandigarh under Punjab University, Chandigarh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

125. Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Paediatric Surgery) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18/02/2016) and compliance dated 06/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Paediatric Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18/02/2016) and compliance dated 06/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Both the Senior Residents do not possess 3 years experience in the department as Resident as per faculty table attached with compliance; resultantly deficiency remains as it is.
2. In the faculty table, Dr. Gowrishankar, Unit I has been shown as "Asso. Prof." in the column of "Designation". However in the column of experience he is shown as "Asst. Prof." w.e.f. December 2010 till date, which is not feasible.
3. In the faculty table, Dr. Narendra Babu, Unit II has been shown as "Asso. Prof." in the column of "Designation". However in the column of experience he is shown as "Asst. Prof." w.e.f. December 2010 till date, which is not feasible.
4. Except for HOD, offices for any other faculty are still not available.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Paediatric Surgery) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

126. Starting of DM (Neurology) course at Chalmeda Anand Rao Institute Of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (14/03/2016) and compliance dated 05/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Chalmeda Anand Rao Institute Of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Starting of DM (Neurology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14/03/2016) and compliance dated 05/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

127. Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course at Smt. N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad, Gujarat under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (11/02/2016) and compliance dated 21/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Smt. N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad, Gujarat under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad for Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (11/02/2016) and compliance dated 21/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course at Smt. N.H.L. Municipal Medical College, Ahmedabad, Gujarat under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 from 1(One) to 2(Two) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply

for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

128. Starting of M.Ch. (Head & Neck Surgery) course at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (05/04/2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of M.Ch. (Head & Neck Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (05/04/2016) and noted the following:

1. Unit-wise distribution of Faculty not provided.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of M.Ch. (Head & Neck Surgery) course at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

129. Applications for Starting/ Increase of seats in Post Graduate courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the Academic year 2017-18 – consideration regarding.

Read: the matter with regard to consideration of Applications for Starting/ Increase of seats in Post Graduate courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the Academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with applications for Starting/ Increase of seats in Post Graduate courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the Academic year 2017-18 and the Committee decided that regarding anomalies/ deficiencies in the documents along with the applications, if any, will be considered individually case-wise by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.
