The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence was received from Dr. Deelip Govindrao Mhaisekar, Dr. Dhruva Jyoti Borah and Dr. (Mrs.) Rani Bhaskaran, Member(s), Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The minutes of the meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee held on 30.11.2016 confirmed.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

Minutes of the meetings dated 03/11/2016, 15/11/2016 and 30/11/2016 are still not received from the Oversight Committee. Action will be taken on receipt of the Minutes from the Oversight Committee.

3. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal..

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (December, 2013) and compliance dated 07/07/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 01 seat at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (December, 2013) and compliance dated 07/07/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Pathology) qualification for 01 seat granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. N.D. Lodha, Assoc.Prof. – experience details are at variance from the date mentioned in assessment dated 26.12.2013 & 21.11.2016. He has been shown Asst.Prof. from 15.07.1991 till date i.e. 26.12.2013. At the same time he has been shown Assoc.Prof. from 2004 to 17.01.2011, which is not feasible. In the report dated 26.11.2016 he is shown Asst.Prof. at SVNGMC, YTL from 15.07.1991 to 31.08.1997, 01.09.1997 to 04.03.2004 and 18.01.2011 to 05.06.2015. He is also shown Assoc.Prof. at SVNGMC YTL from 05.03.2004 to 17.01.2011 and 06.05.2015 till date. Similarly, experience details of Dr. S.L. Khandekar, Assoc.Prof. and Dr. J.W. Mahadani, Assoc.Prof. are at variance in the report dated 26.12.2013 & 21.11.2016, which is not feasible.
2. Promotion of Dr. K.S. Bharti, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations, She was promoted on 06.11.2015 after the cut-off date without any publications.
3. Promotion of Dr. K.B. Pagrut, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 29.08.2016 after the cut-off date. In his 3 publications quoted, he is 4th Author in one and 7th author in second, which is a case report and cannot be considered.
4. Frozen Section is not yet available. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally

decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

4. Himachal Pradesh University - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at in Dira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 25/07/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats at in Dira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla granted by Himachal Pradesh University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 25/07/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats granted by Himachal Pradesh University in respect of students being trained at in Dira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla because of the following facts:-

1. Dr .ShyamKaushik is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications "in the faculty table, it is stated "No " and it is also stated "Publications attached ."These publications be verified to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not)) .i.e .4 eligible research publications
2. Dr .LaxmanChoudhary is promoted as Assoc.Prof .after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications "in the faculty table, it is stated "No "and it is also stated "Publications attached ."These publications be verified to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not)i.e.2 eligible research publications.
3. Faculty table gives no experience details in different ranks without which eligibility of Prof. &Assoc.Prof. cannot be decided.
4. MRD computerization is in process, yet not completed.
5. Order has been placed for supply of foreign and national journals which have not yet arrived.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2(Two) to 5(Five) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally

decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

5. Santosh University, Ghaziabad - Recognition of MD(Pathology) & DCP qualifications for 02 seats each in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011, 27.11.2014) and compliance dated 18/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) & DCP qualifications for 02 seats each at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad granted by Santosh University, Ghaziabad.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011, 27.11.2014) and compliance dated 18/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Pathology) & DCP qualifications for 02 seats each granted by Santosh University, Ghaziabad in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

6. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences, Deemed University - Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013 & 26.02.2016) and compliance dated 13/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats at Rural Medical College, Loni granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences, Deemed University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013 & 26.02.2016) and compliance dated 13/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences, Deemed University in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

7. **Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 5 Seats and renewal of recognition of Diploma in Anaesthesia qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Era's Lucknow Medical College, Lucknow.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (26/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and compliance dated 13/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 5 Seats and renewal of recognition of Diploma in Anaesthesia qualification for 2 seats at Era's Lucknow Medical College, Lucknow granted by Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (26/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and compliance dated 13/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Anaesthesia) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 5 Seats granted by Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad in respect of students being trained at Era's Lucknow Medical College, Lucknow be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of Diploma in Anaesthesia for 2 seats granted by Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad in respect of students being trained at Era's Lucknow Medical College, Lucknow be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

8. **Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University - Recognition of DM(Nephrology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (14/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2013, 22.08.2015 & 21.03.2016) and compliance dated 25/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Nephrology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (14/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2013, 22.08.2015 & 21.03.2016) and compliance dated 25/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Nephrology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala because of the following facts:-

1. With regard to Dr .M .Sreelatha, Professor & HOD, the details of experience provided during assessments dt .22/08/2015 & dt .14/10/2016 are at variance as shown under :

Such retrospective changes made by the Principal pursuant to remark "Incomplete experience of faculty". pointed out in earlier assessment to make the faculty appear as eligible are not permissible .Hence she cannot be considered. Principal is not authorized in Govt. Medical College to change the promotion date of faculty.

2. With regard to Dr .T.P .Noushad, Associate Professor, the details of experience provided during assessments dt .22/08/2015 & dt .14/10/2016 are at variance as shown under :

Such retrospective changes made by the Principal pursuant to remark "Incomplete experience of faculty." pointed out in earlier assessment to make the faculty appear as eligible are not permissible.

3. Dr. Pradeep V.R. & Dr. Sarfraz Aslam, both Sr.Resident are shown as DM Nephrology but there is no certificate of DM Degree attached with their Declaration Form and they have not mentioned this in their Declaration Form (which have also not been verified by the assessor). The Dean and faculty may be asked to explain this discrepancy. There is no other eligible Sr.Resident who has 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in Nephrology.
4. Total IPD is shown as 52 and 100% bed occupancy which means there are 52 beds in one unit which is not as per regulations.
5. There was no OPD on the day of assessment due to which clinical material could not be verified on the assessment day.
6. Details of Major Operations are not provided .
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1(One) to 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1(One) seat & recognition of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 01 (One) to 02 (Two) seats D.Ortho qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report ((May, 2014) , (January, 2015) ,(June, 2015) & 05.04.2016) and compliance dated 11/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1(One) seat & recognition of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 01 (One) to 02 (Two) seats D.Ortho qualification for 02 seats at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report ((May, 2014), (January, 2015),(June, 2015) & (05.04.2016) and compliance dated 11/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1(One) seat and not to recognize MS (Orthopaedics) qualification against increased intake from 01 (One) to 02 (Two) seats and D.Ortho qualification for 02 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty: Asst. Prof.: 1.
2. Unit II has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Bed Occupancy was 50 % on day of assessment. Even out of these, 1/3rd patients seemed to be fake like neck pain, leg pain, knee pain.
4. NIL patient was admitted through Casualty on day of admission.
5. Data of clinical material as provided by the institute are fictitious.
6. Although number of OPD patients in the register was 109, actual patients were only 10 which is seen in submitted clinical material.
7. There was only 1 Major Operation on day of assessment. Rest all 3 procedures mentioned in the O.T. list were Minor procedures.
8. There are only 2 Examination rooms in OPD against requirement of 4.
9. MRI was not working on day of assessment.
10. Anaesthesia Trolley of Septic O.T. was not in working order.
11. Sterilization methods are not followed properly.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1 Degree seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the

Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted U/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

Admissions done (if any) against these increased number of seats i.e. 1 to 2 seats in Degree & 1 seat in Diploma after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

10. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 07 seats in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Nagpur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May,2013) and compliance dated 15/07/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 07 seats at Government Medical College, Nagpur granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May,2013) and compliance dated 15/07/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 07 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Nagpur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr .N.G .Tirpude, Professor & HOD was not present during assessment . No leave application or approval of leave was shown to assessor .
2. Promotion of Dr .Vaishali RameshAnkalwar, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. She was promoted Assoc.Prof. after the cut-off date without

- any publications. Out of 3 publications quoted; in one her name is not there; in the second she is 3rd author and in third she is a 3rd author.
3. Promotion of Dr. .Ranjeeta M .Tambey, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. She was promoted after the cut-off date. She has one publication against the requirement of 2.
 4. Dr .Neha R .Goenka, Senior Resident does not have any experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post .Further, she is shown as "Senior Resident "in the column of "Designation "in the faculty table; however in the column of "Experience", it is shown as "Assistant Professor "w.e.f .02/07/2016 till date; this discrepancy needs to be clarified .
 5. Dr .Karuna A .Gaikwad, Senior Resident does not have any experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post .
 6. Dr .Shilpa M .Autkar, Senior Resident has experience of only 2 year 10 m as Resident against requirement of 3 year as per Regulations before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post .
 7. Resultantly, there is shortage of Senior Residents :1.
 8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 6(Six) to 7(Seven) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

11. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition ofDM(Endocrinology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Nilratan Sircar Medical College, Kolkata.

5. Shortage of Senior Residents :1 .
6. Dr .Jayanti Ray, Senior Resident in Unit 1; Dr .Provas Mukherjee, Senior Resident in Unit 4; Dr .Jnanendranath Kabiraj do not possess any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post .

7. Faculty table has not been signed by any of the faculty members.

4. Dr .S.V .Arya is equated as "Professor "in the column of "Designations "in the faculty table; the equation is during transitional period whereby to claim the benefit of promotion as per reduced period, publication of 4 research publications was required as per Regulations; however the column of "Benefit of publications "in the faculty table is left blank implying NIL publications to his credit against requirement of 4 as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered .
5. Promotion of Dr .Ashwani Gupta, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 08.09.2014 as Professor. He has only 3 publications against the requirement of 4. 2 of the 4 quoted publications are case report which cannot be considered.
6. Unit-1&4 has only 1 faculty; other 2 were absent on the assessment day.
7. Details of qualification & experience of Senior Residents& Jr. Residents are not provided in the faculty table.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015, 04.04.2016) and compliance dated 14/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities and 20/06/2016 (received through the Central Government vide letters dated 22/06/2016 and 30/06/2016) submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University in respect of students being trained at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Jampala Beena Devi, Asst.Prof. is DNB from non-teaching hospital. She has no 3 year experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college, hence not eligible to be appointed as Sr. Resident in Emergency Medicine.
2. Bed Occupancy as such was 27 beds; however, 8 patients belonged to other specialties; resultantly net Bed Occupancy was 19 out of 30 =63 % on day of assessment at 10 a.m .
3. One remark pertained to Dr .Ganapathi Rao, Professor that "he has no special training in Emergency Medicine ."Presently it is shown that he has 2 years 'training in Emergency Medicine from 01/02/2014 to 29/02/2016.However in the faculty table on P .10, in the column of "Experience", it is shown as "Professor General Medicine/Emergency Medicine" from 01/01/2014 to 29/02/2016 implying that during the period shown as on training in Emergency Medicine, he was also Professor of General Medicine which is not permissible .Further, even while considering the period claimed by Institute as training period, his experience as faculty in Emergency Medicine can only commence only after training period is over –i.e .after 29/02/2016; hence he would not be eligible to hold the post of Professor of Emergency Medicine on the day of assessment .Further, in assessment report dt. 04/04/2016, he is shown as Professor from 01/01/2014 till date while in assessment report dt .06/05/2015 he has not been shown as faculty in this department at all .This sequence implies that his experience details have been changed retrospectively to make it appear as if the deficiency pointed out has been rectified which is not permissible .
4. Dr. K.P .Gireesh Kumar, present HOD, was appointed straightaway as Asso .Prof .in Emergency Medicine from the post of Asst .Prof .of General Medicine without any qualification or training in Emergency Medicine .Deficiency remains as it is .
5. Beds of Casualty are counted in Emergency Medicine department . Contention of the Institute that "Department of Emergency Medicine & Casualty are same with 30 beds)as per MCI Regulation and no separate /additional beds required for casualty "is not correct & cannot be accepted .Deficiency remains as it is .
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated (21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to

seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013, December, 2014 & 01.04.2016) and compliance dated 01/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities and 20/06/2016 (received through the Central Government vide letters dated 22/06/2016 and 30/06/2016) submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University in respect of students being trained at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Arun Ramachandran Nair, Asst.Prof. was absent on the assessment day.
2. Dr. HariLaxmanan, Assoc.Prof. is not eligible, he has no certificate of 2 years special training in Pulmonary Medicine before appointment as Asst.Prof.
3. Dr. ArvindPerathur, shown to have done Diploma in Pulmonary Medicine from 2006-2015 (9 years). It is not feasible that a person can be doing Diploma in Pulmonary Medicine for so many years. No certificate of 2 years special training or 2 year diploma in Pulmonary Medicine has been attached.
4. Dr. VinodBabu E, Asst.Prof.; has no 2 years special training in Pulmonary Medicine before appointment as Asst.Prof.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission

to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (23/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2014, 03.08.2015) and compliance dated 05/08/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Cardiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai because of the following facts:-

1. The only Unit has 39 beds, which is not as per Regulations .
2. Details of Senior Residents are not provided in the faculty table.
3. Equipment like Holter is not available .Holter monitoring is being done on outsource basis which is not permissible .
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2(Two) to 3(Three) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh in respect of students being trained at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr .RachanaBhatnagar is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications "in the faculty table is left blank implying NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered .She was never Asst.Prof. due to which also her promotion is not as per regulations.
2. Dr .Bhoopender A .Sharma is promoted as Asso .Prof .after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications "in the faculty table is left blank implying NIL publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered .
3. Bed occupancy in PICU and NICU is not given on the day of assessment.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted U/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (24/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013, 06.10.2015) and compliance dated 05/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD (General Medicine) qualification for 04 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Latur because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr .Neelima Deshpande is not as per regulations. She was promoted Professor on 07.09.2016 after the cut off date. Only title of the publications have been given. No author and journals name given.
2. Promotion of Dr. Sanjay Popatlal Gandhi, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 23.12.2015 after the cut of date without any publications. Resultantly, Unit-I, left with Nil Assoc.Prof.
3. Dr. Manisha Shantaram Bolke, Asst.Prof. was absent on the day of assessment. Resultantly, Unit-III left with only 2 faculty.
4. Dr. Sham P. Toshniwal, Assoc.Prof. was absent on the day of assessment. Resultantly, Unit-4, left with only 2 faculty.
5. Dr .D.G .Padwal, Senior Resident in Unit 1, who was absent on inspection day has no experience as Resident in General Medicine as shown in the faculty table; hence not qualified to hold the post .There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit .
6. Dr .MadhaviKabra, Senior Resident in Unit 4 has no experience as Resident in General Medicine as shown in the faculty table; hence not qualified to hold the post .There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit .
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 4(Four) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

Patil Education Society Deemed University, Kolhapur in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

29. Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences University(Deemed), Karad - Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences, Karad.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (24th November, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats granted by Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences University(Deemed),karad in respect of students being trained at Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences, Karad because of the following facts:-

1. With regard to payment of stipend to Residents, Institute has stated as under:

This is not correct as the State Govt .is paying much higher stipend that shown by the Institute .Not only the Institute is paying stipend which is less

than that paid by State Govt .to Residents, by showing the lower amount as stipend paid by State Govt .to Residents, an attempt is made to show as if the Institute is paying stipend at the rates prescribed by State Govt.

2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18.11.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 01 seat granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Vijaynagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

31. Recognition of DLO course at Narayana Medical College, Nellore under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada – Request w.e.f. 2009 instead of 2011.

Read: the letter dated 05/10/2016 received from the Principal, Narayana Medical College, Nellore with regard to recognition of DLO course at Narayana

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 05/10/2016 received from the Principal, Narayana Medical College, Nellore and decided to recommend that DLO qualification for 1(one) seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of student being trained at Narayana Medical College, Nellore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 on or after 2009.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

32. Regularization of DGO qualification of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College from 1993 till date – representation – reg.

Read: the letter dated 30/06/2016 received from the Dean, T.N. Medical College, Mumbai with regard to regularization of DGO qualification of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College from 1993 till date along with the Legal Opinion dated 12/10/2016 of the Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 30/06/2016 received from the Dean, T.N. Medical College, Mumbai with regard to regularization of DGO qualification of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College from 1993 till date along with the Legal Opinion dated 12/10/2016 of the Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Committee noted the opinion of Council Advocate dt. 30/12/2004. He has stated it is not open to Council to consider any such request as acceptance would amount to violation of provisions of Section 10A.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted the opinion of Law officer of MCI dt. 12/10/2016 noted. He has stated that *“the Council should invite attention of Central Govt. to Section 10 C. It is also an admitted position that the course was started in 1993 without permission of Central Govt. Thus, at this juncture it is not permissible for the Council to make any recommendation regarding recognition of a course that has been started without prior permission of Central Government in 1993. The Central Government may therefore take decision as it may deem appropriate.”*

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee after due deliberations decided to approve opinion of Law Officer and convey the decision to Central Government, accordingly.

33. Starting of MD (Bio-Chemistry) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 22nd November 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MD (Bio-Chemistry) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 22nd November 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of all 3 Professors & the only 1 Assoc. Prof. being non-medical remains as it is.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MD (Bio-Chemistry) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

34. **Starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 22nd November 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 22nd November 2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify the compliance by way of assessment.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 28th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MS (ENT) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 28th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. Swati Baichwal & Dr. Jyoti Lonkar, both Senior Residents do not possess any experience as Resident in ENT before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
2. Workload of Major Operations still remains at 2-3 which is inadequate.
3. MRI is still not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MS (ENT) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

38. Starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 28th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 28th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Promotion of Dr. Irfan M. Sohel as Asso. Prof. is not as per Regulations. The contention of the Institute that cut-off date for publications is 03/09/2015 is not correct; as per Gazette Notification it is 21/07/2014 in case of promotion to Asso. Prof. As his promotion is on 12/05/2015, it is after cut-off date & without research publications. There is no other Asso. Prof. in the Unit.
2. OCT & Optical Biometer are not yet available.
3. Eye Bank is not yet registered.
4. MRI is not available.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

39. Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of compliance.

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Assoc. Prof.: 1; (b) Asst. Prof.: 1 remains as it is. Only a proposal is sent to the Government; none has been appointed or joined.
2. As there is no Assoc. Prof. in Unit 1, faculty complement continues to remain incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Unit 2 has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Resultantly, none of the Units qualifies as PG Unit. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. MRI is not yet available. Deficiency remains as it is.

6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

40. Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 28th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 28th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Unit I does not have Assoc. Prof.; Faculty complement continues to remain incomplete in the Unit & it cannot be considered as PG Unit. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Units II & III have only 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as PG Units. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Units IV & V have only 1 faculty each; they cannot be considered as teaching Units. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Resultantly there is no Unit which qualifies as PG Unit.
5. Dr. Avinash Telgote is promoted as Assoc. Prof. after cut-off date; however both the publications cited in the list are Case reports which cannot be considered as research publications; resultantly there is NIL research publication to his credit against requirement of 2 as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1 remains as it is.
7. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic is not run. Deficiency remains as it is.
8. MRI is not available.
9. Non-teaching staff is inadequate.
10. Nursing & Paramedical staff are inadequate in O.T.s.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

41. Starting of MD (Anaesthesia) course at Government Vellore Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (12th August 2016) and compliance dated Nil submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MD (Anaesthesia) course at Government Vellore Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (12th August 2016) and compliance dated Nil submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Starting of MD (Anaesthesia) course at Government Vellore Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai U/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2017-2018 restricting the number of admissions to 4 (Four) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

42. Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) together with the order dated 13/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and compliance dated 08/09/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) together with the order dated 13/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and compliance dated 08/09/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. Nakul Shah, has been demoted from Professor to Assoc. Prof. and his experience dates in different ranks have been changed. However, no demotion order, and fresh joining report has been attached with compliance verification report.
With regard to Dr. Madhav Khadikar, Dr. Yogesh Gaikwad, & Dr. Atul Patil, teaching experience dates have been changed retrospectively after deleting period prior to first letter of permission when college was started which is not permissible. At the same time neither any revised appointment order or fresh joining report has been attached with compliance verification report.
2. Dr. Rohit Chakor, Senior Resident was not eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident as he did not have 3 year Residency in the subject in a medical college hospital. The reference cited by Institute of Notification dt. 11/06/2012 is not relevant to issue as the said Notification pertains to requirement of experience of 1 year as Senior Resident in respect of those candidates who have undergone DNB training in specified hospitals and it

does not pertain to appointment of a candidate as Senior Resident without any experience as Junior Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital. Hence deficiency remains as such. Further, he has been presently promoted as Asst. Prof. after completion of 1 year of Senior Residency which is not as per Regulations as he was not eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident and therefore any subsequent appointment or promotion based upon such appointment which is *void ab-initio* is contrary to Regulations. Deficiency remains as such.

3. Dr. Siddhartha Shah, Senior Resident has experience of only 2 year 6 month as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident against requirement of 3 year; hence not qualified to hold the post.
4. Dr. GunjanDhundele, Senior Resident has experience of only 2 year as Resident in a medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident against requirement of 3 year; hence not qualified to hold the post.
5. Dr. NitinGhule, Senior Resident has experience of only 2 year as Resident in a medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident against requirement of 3 year; hence not qualified to hold the post.
6. Casualty attendance for Orthopaedics on random checking was found to be 5/day, which is very inadequate.
7. Deficiency number 10 that there is decrease in IPD from year 2 to year 3(last year) (2659 to 2650) remain as such.
8. Deficiency number 11 that there is decrease in major operations from year 2 to year 3 (1346 to 1241) remain as such.
9. Deficiency number 12 that there is decrease in minor operations from year 2 to year 3 (last year) (2666) to 2257) remains as such.
With decreasing clinical material (major operations, minor operations & IPD) there is no justification for increasing PG seats.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MS(Orthopaedics) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee, in view of the observation regarding Dr. Madhav R. Ghate, Professor and Dr. Deepak V. Metkar, Senior Resident, Department of Psychiatry presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council Authorities. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College

Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

43. Increase of seats in MD(Psychiatry) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) together with the order dated 13/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and compliance dated 08/09/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MD(Psychiatry) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) together with the order dated 13/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and compliance dated 08/09/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. MadhavR.Ghate, Prof. – has been shown as Asst.Prof. of Psychiatry, at Krishna Instt. Of Medical Sciences, Karad from 30.06.1984 to 31.08.1987 and from 01.08.1988 to 30.04.1991 and Assoc.Prof. in the same institute from 01.05.1991 to 10.06.1994. However, as per certificate issued by the Principal, Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences, Karad dated 19.03.2008, he was Consultant in Psychiatry from 30.06.1984 to 02.12.1985, As Lecturer in Psychiatry from 03.12.1985 to 31.08.1987, as Hon. Part Time Lecturer from 01.08.1988 to 30.04.1991 and As Hon. Part Time Assoc.Professor from 01.05.1991 to 10.06.1994.
All this period except 03.12.1985 to 31.08.1987 is not countable. The college has given false and misleading information.
2. Dr. Deepak V. Metkar, Senior Resident, has only 2 year 2 month experience as Resident against requirement of 3 year as per Regulations. His experience as Assistant Lecturer at Bhausahab Hire Medical College, Dhule cannot be considered as experience as Resident. Hence he is not qualified to hold the post of Senior Resident. Deficiency remains as such. Further his experience shown in Assessment Report dated 02.12.2016, compliance submitted by the institute and Assessment Report dt. 15.07.2016 are at variance as under:-

This period from 11.02.2003 to 24.02.2004 is shown as Assistant Lecturer in the compliance submitted by college dt. 08.09.2016.

Such retrospective changes made by the Principal to make the Sr. Resident appear as eligible are not permissible. Hence he cannot be considered.

3. Dr. Gaurav Wadgaonkar, Senior Resident was not eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident as he had 2 year Residency in the subject in a medical college hospital. The reference cited by Institute of Notification dt. 11/06/2012 is not relevant to issue as the said Notification pertains to requirement of experience of 1 year as Senior Resident in respect of those candidates who have undergone DNB training in specified hospitals and it does not pertain to appointment of a candidate as Senior Resident without any experience as Junior Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital. Hence deficiency remains as such.
4. Resultantly, there is no eligible Senior Resident in the only Unit.
5. Chronic Psychiatric care is not available. Assessor has remarked that *"It has been reported that the institute has already taken up measures to compensate for this and have shown documents making arrangements for exposure training for PG students in chronic care of patients"* which is not same as making facility of Chronic Psychiatric care available in the institute.
6. There is no participation in National Mental Health Programme. Contention of Institute that *"being in the private sector, it is not a direct stakeholder in the NMHP"* is not acceptable.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for increase of seats in MD(Psychiatry) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. MadhavR.Ghate, Prof. and Dr. Deepak V. Metkar-Sr.Resident, as noted above brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in postgraduate course in MD(Psychiatry) course at Smt. KashibaiNavale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for increase of seats in MD(Psychiatry) course at Smt. KashibaiNavale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016 that the above misdemeanor on part of the college has been viewed seriously by the Committee and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council Authorities. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

Dr. DilipKadam has experience as Resident of only 10 months in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Sr. Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post of Sr.Resident; further he has appointed as Asst.Prof. but does not have 3 years experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital; hence not qualified to hold the presently held post of Asst.Prof. either.
3. Dr. ShwetaDeshmukh, Senior Resident was not eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident as he had experience of 9 months Residency in the subject in a medical college hospital. The reference cited by Institute of Notification dt. 11/06/2012 is not relevant to issue as the said Notification pertains to requirement of experience of 1 year as Senior Resident in respect of those candidates who have undergone DNB training in specified hospitals and it does not pertain to appointment of a candidate as Senior Resident without any experience as Junior Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital. Hence deficiency remains as such.

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. DSA not available (equipment list page-19).
4. Dr. NagendraPatil, Prof. was absent on the day of assessment.
5. Faculty table has not been signed by any of the faculty members.
6. In the column of "Stipend paid to Residents by the Institute", it is stated "NA"; hence it is not clear whether any stipend is being paid to Residents or not. This needs to be clarified.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Promotion of Dr. B.M. Patil as Asso. Prof. is not as per Regulations. He was promoted after cut-off date without any publications against requirement of 2 research publications in in Dexed journals. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. IUI & ART services are not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Specialty clinic like "Gynaec Endocrine clinic" is not run. Providing facilities as and when necessary cannot be substantiated as running a regular specialty clinic.
4. Promotion of Dr. S.A. Deshpande, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01.07.2015 after the cut-off date without any publications.
5. Promotion of Dr. Vidya M. Jadav, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 16.05.2014 after the cut-off date without any publications.
6. On assessment day, there was only 1 delivery, 1 caesarian Section, which does not justify any increase in a PG seat.

7. On enquiry with Residents it was found that they are getting stipend of Rs. 40,000 p.m., which is much less than that paid by State Govt. to Residents and is contrary to PG Regulations. (remark's of Assessor in Pathology report). This is not as per regulations.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (08/08/2016) and compliance dated 28/11/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MD (Community Medicine) course at Dayanand Medical College & Hospital, Ludhiana under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2017-2018 from 6(Six) to 8(Eight) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

66. Starting of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at Karnataka Institute of Medical Sciences, Hubli under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (05/12/2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Karnataka Institute of Medical Sciences, Hubli under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (05/12/2016) and noted the following:

1. Dr. G.C. Patil, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. for 3 years and 11 months against the requirement of 5 years.
2. Dr. RupaliWadiyar, Sr.Resident, is not eligible, she has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college at the time of appointment as Sr.Resident.
3. Dr. AnilkumarBiradar, Sr.Resident, is not eligible, he has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college at the time of appointment as Sr.Resident.
4. Dr. Megharanjini, Sr.Resident is DNB from non-teaching hospital, she has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college. Hence, not eligible as Sr.Resident.
5. Dr. Puneet N. Sr.Resident, is DNB from non-teaching hospital. He has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college at the time of appointment as Sr.Resident.
6. There is no DSA on the day of assessment.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at Karnataka Institute of Medical Sciences, Hubli under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

67. Increase of seats in DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) course at B J Medical College, Ahmedabad (attached with U.N. Mehta Institute of Cardiology & Research Centre) under Gujarat University U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (22/01/2016 and 02/05/2016) and letter of

permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 13/06/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee on the physical and other teaching facilities available at B J Medical College, Ahmedabad (attached with U.N. Mehta Institute of Cardiology & Research Centre) under Gujarat University for Increase of seats in DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) course U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the B J Medical College, Ahmedabad (attached with U.N. Mehta Institute of Cardiology & Research Centre) under Gujarat University granted Letter of Permission for increase of seats in DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) course from 3(Three) to 6(Six)seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

- i. An affidavit from the Dean/ Principal and Chairman of the Trust/ Society/ University/ Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.*
- ii. A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application.*
- iii. Government Colleges would submit an undertaking on the same lines, which are signed by Chief Secretary/ Health Secretary of the respective State to MHFW.*

2. The OC has also stipulated as follows:

- (a) OC may direct inspection to verify the compliance submitted by the college and considered by OC, anytime after 30 September 2016.*
- (b) In default of the conditions (i) (ii) and (iii) in para 1 above as applicable, and if the compliances are found incomplete in the inspection to be conducted after 30 September 2016, such college (including Government College) will be debarred from fresh intake of students for 2 years commencing 2017-18.*

Thereafter in pursuance of the directives of the Oversight Committee dated 24/09/2016, the assessment of the B J Medical College, Ahmedabad (attached with U.N. Mehta Institute of Cardiology & Research Centre) under Gujarat University has been carried out by the Council Assessor on 05/12/2016. The assessment report was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 15/12/2016, wherein the Committee observed as under:-

1. Prof. & HoD, Dr. VarshaUpendrasinhSarvalya is not eligible to hold the post of Professor in Cardiac Anaesthesia since she has neither 2 years Special Training in Cardiac Anaesthesia before appointment as Professor in Cardiac Anaesthesia nor she has worked as Asst.Prof. and Assoc.Prof. in Cardiac Anaesthesia. In service period cannot be counted towards 2 years Special Training.
2. Dr. RiteshBabulal Shah is not eligible. He had no 2 years Special Training in Cardiac Anaesthesia when appointed Asst.Prof. in 2002. In service experience cannot be counted as Special Training.

3. No faculty has 2 years Special Training. In service period cannot be counted as Special Training.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 15.03.2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

1. Director of the Cardiology Institute is not a Cardiologist and he has been honorary Asst., Assoc. and Professor of Medicine, which is not as per Regulations.
2. Salary of Professors is 1/3 of Assoc. Professors, which indicate that the Professor is not full time working.
3. Dr. Varsha Sarvaiya, Professor & HOD does not possess 2 years training in Cardiac Anaesthesia. It is also not clear whether she was holding faculty position in Cardiac Anaesthesia or not in the previous institute.
4. Dr. Jigar M. Surti has been designated as Consultant Cardiac Anaesthetist (Paediatric) & Paediatric Intensivist & Assistant Professor of Cardiac Anaesthesiology which is not an acceptable designation as per MCI nomenclature.
5. Faculty table shows hybrid of faculty, some of them holding posts in Cardiac Anaesthesiology & some of them holding posts in Anaesthesiology. This needs to be segregated and only faculty holding posts in Cardiac Anaesthesiology need to be included in the faculty table and shown in assessment.
6. Director of the Cardiology Institute is not a Cardiologist and he is honorary Asst., Assoc. and Professor of Medicine, which is not as per Regulations.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college has failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that as per the directions passed by Oversight Committee in para 2(b) vide communication dated 20/08/2016 the college should be debarred from admitting students in the above course for a period of two academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19 as even after giving an undertaking that they have fulfilled the entire infrastructure for increase of seats in the super-speciality course in the speciality of DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) the college was found to be grossly deficient. It has also been decided by the Post Graduate Committee that the Bank Guarantee furnished by the college in pursuance of the directives passed by the Oversight Committee as well as GOI letter dated 20/08/2016 is liable to be encashed.

Mehta Institute of Cardiology & Research Centre) under Gujarat University for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (CTVS) course U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (05/02/2016 and 02/05/2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 13/06/2016 of the Supreme Court madated Oversight Committee and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in M.Ch.(CTVS) course at B J Medical College, Ahmedabad (attached with U.N. Mehta Institute of Cardiology & Research Centre) under Gujarat University U/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 from 3(Three) to 6(Six) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) together with the order dated 13/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and compliance dated 08/09/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:-

Such retrospective changes made by the Principal to make the faculty appear as eligible are not permissible. Hence she cannot be considered.

- Total number of patients admitted has decreased from 1680 in 2013 to 1496 in 2014 and 1588 in 2015. With the decreasing clinical material, there is no justification for increase in PG seats.
- Workload of Laryngo-Tracheoplasty is Nil during last 3 years. Deficiency remains as such.
- Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 15/12/2016 that the above misdemeanor on part of the college has been viewed seriously by the Committee and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council Authorities. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

"...
8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also."

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 15 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Committee also decided to refer the matter to the Ethics Committee.

70. Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (18th August 2016) and compliance dated 29/11/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (18th August 2016) and compliance dated 29/11/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:-

1. Total number of minor operations has decreased from 333 in 2013 to 204 in 2014 and 309 in 2015.
2. Faculty table is not attached with compliance report without which the report is incomplete.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

71. Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (05/12/2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (05/12/2016) and noted the following:-

1. Stipend paid Rs.30,000/- Rs.35,000/- & Rs.40,000/- per month. It is also claimed the Govt. rate is the same is incorrect.
The State Govt. is paying much higher stipend. This amounts to furnishing wrong information and misleading the Council.
2. Dr. Harish G.M. Sr. Resident is DNB from non teaching. He has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college. Hence not eligible to hold the post of Sr. Resident.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission

for Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

72. Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Raja Rajeswari Medical College & Hospital, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (10/08/2016) and compliance dated 30/11/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at RajaRajeswari Medical College & Hospital, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (10/08/2016) and compliance dated 30/11/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in M.S.(Orthopaedics) course at RajaRajeswari Medical College & Hospital, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2017-2018 from 3(Three) to 6(Six) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.
