**1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.**

The minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 06/01/2016 were read out and confirmed in the meeting itself.

**2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

**3. Increase of seats in MD(DVL) course at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (20th August 2015) and compliance dated 03rd November 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai for Increase of seats in MD(DVL) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (20th August 2015) and compliance dated 03rd November 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. OPD counter for new patients opened only at 09:55 a.m.
2. At 10:20 a.m. there were only 3 patients in male ward. There was only 1 patient in female ward – of Herpes Zoster without any facility of isolation. At 11:30 a.m. 5th patient was sent from OPD for admission. Altogether there were total 7 patients giving bed occupancy of 17.5%.
3. Indoor patient management is unsupervised.
4. The side laboratory was claimed by both ENT and Skin & VD departments but none could produce key to open the room which was locked.
5. Departmental Library facilities are inadequate.
6. There are no foreign journals for the year 2013 onwards.
7. There is no Central Research Lab.
8. One Senior Resident, Dr. P. Saraswathi was absent on the day of Assessment.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD(DVL) course at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**4. Increase of seats in MD(Anaesthesia) course at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (17th August 2015) and compliance dated 12th November 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 1. (b) Assoc. Professor: 1

2. There are NIL research publications from the department in indexed journals. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. L. Raghav is not recognized.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD(Anaesthesia) course at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**5. Starting of MD(DVL) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th September 2015) and compliance dated 25/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad for Starting of MD(DVL) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th September 2015) and compliance dated 25/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Bed occupancy was 30% on day of assessment.
2. OPD on day of assessment at 11:00 a.m. was only 09.
3. LASER procedure from 01/01/2015 till date were 900 as per register but institute claimed only 93 in compliance. This shows there is discrepancy. Register seems to be prepared only for assessment purpose.
4. Deficiency of promotion of Dr. Sunil Gupta not being as per Regulations remains as it is. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years 1 month. Out of 2 publications one is a case report, which cannot be accepted. As per Faculty Table signed by the Dean and Assessor in report dated 30/09/2015, Dr. Sunil Gupta was Asst. Professor from 17/08/2009 to 01/09/2013 (4 years 1 month). Now, the same period has been changed to 17/08/2009 to 01/09/2014, which is not permissible.
5. Staff register is marked with "P" in front of name of faculty instead of signature. This raises suspicion about regularity of staff.
6. Cryo Gun & Cryo Can are present but without liquid Nitrogen; however entries were made in the register implying names of patients are entered without they actually receiving the treatment.
7. Acne Specialty clinic is not run.
8. No journals of 2015 are available. Departmental Library facilities are inadequate.
9. Data of Laser procedures seems prepared for assessment.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD(DVL) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**6. Starting of MS(OBG) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th September 2015) and compliance dated 07th December 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad for Starting of MS(OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th September 2015) and compliance dated 07th December 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of Promotion of Dr. Sonia Luthra not being as per Regulations remains as it is. Consequently, there is no Asso. Prof. in Unit I. Out of 3 publications cited one is a case report and one review article, which cannot be accepted.
2. There was NIL Major Gynaecological & NIL Major Obstetric operation on day of assessment. Even if 2 operations which were scheduled but postponed are considered, still the number is inadequate.
3. On day of assessment there total 3 deliveries only.
4. As per report dated 30/09/2015, Dr. Akhilesh Dutta Dwivedi was Asst. Professor in Lucknow from 14/10/1990 to 13/10/1991. Now the dates have been changed to 14/10/1990 to 20/10/1993, which is not permissible. In the present report he is shown as Assoc. Professor at Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur from 01/07/2009 to 09/06/2011. Whereas, in earlier report he was shown Professor during this period. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
5. Dr. Anajana Aggarwal was shown as Assoc. Professor from 10/07/2009 to 31/03/2012 (2 years 8 months). Now, the same period has been changed to 10/07/2009 to 10/07/2013. In earlier report she was shown as Professor from 01/04/2012, which date has now been changed to 11/07/2013, which is not acceptable. No reversion orders, new Declaration Form and Joining Report attached.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS(OBG) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**7. Starting of MD(Psychiatry) course at K A P Viswanathan Government Medical College, Trichy, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

4. No laser required because there are no patients.
5. No Nail surgeries are performed except I/D for paronechia.
6. Workload of these procedures cannot be increased because patients available are too less.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. O.T. list was not provided to assessor in spite of repeated requests.
4. In OPD, there was only 1 faculty. There were only 10 patients by 11:30 a.m.
5. There is no Departmental Library or Seminar Hall.
6. On the day of Assessment, Blood Bank had issued 5 Units of whole blood only and total stock available was 12 units, which indicate inadequate clinical material.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS(General Surgery) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

1. Bed occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was only 53%. As many as 8 patients were admitted on day of assessment to increase bed occupancy.
2. OPD attendance at 4 p.m. was only 80.

3. Specialty clinic scheduled on day of assessment was Cardiology clinic wherein number of patients registered was NIL.
4. Unit I has no Asso. Prof.; resultantly, faculty complement is incomplete in Unit I and it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
5. The experience details of Dr. Krishnan Lalitha are as below:
  - a. Senior Resident/ Lecturer: 01/01/1986 to April, 1988
  - b. Asst. Professor/ Assoc. Professor: 1990 to 1993 and 1993 to 1995.
  - c. Assoc. Professor/ Professor: 1997 to 2000.

There cannot be such designations. Resultantly, promotion of HoD is not as per Regulations.

6. Dr. Peter Prashant, Professor, Unit-II promoted on 01/06/2015 after the cut-off date without any publication, which is not as per Regulations.
7. Dr. Janaki B. Pradhan, Asst. Professor, Unit-II was absent on the day of Assessment. Resultantly, Unit-II is left with 2 faculty.

8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Number of Operative Vaginal Deliveries (131 upto 11/2015) is still lower than that of 2012 which was 198. The explanation of institute that there has been increase in Caesarean Sections in place of Vaginal Deliveries is not tenable.
6. Dr. Lakshmi Selja and Dr. Rita Aggarwal (Senior Residents) have no 3 years experience at the time of appointment. Hence, not eligible. Resultantly, Unit-II has no Senior Resident.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Dr. Kapil Shiva, Senior Resident, Unit-II is not eligible because there is no 3 years experience at the time of appointment. Resultantly, Unit-II has no Senior Resident.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

9. PG degree of Dr. Ravindra Kumar Meena, Asst. Professor is not recognized.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2015) and compliance dated 03rd November 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai for Increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2015) and compliance dated 03rd November 2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) course at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 from 2(Two) to 4(Four) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching

Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

**33. Increase of seats in MD (Anaesthesia) course at Sri Guru Ram Das Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Sri Amritsar under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (16/09/2015) and compliance dated 15/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sri Guru Ram Das Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Sri Amritsar under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot for Increase of seats in MD (Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (16/09/2015) and compliance dated 15/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD (Anaesthesia) course at Sri Guru Ram Das Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Sri Amritsar under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 from 4(Four) to 6(Six) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

**34. Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati under Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Tirupati u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (26/08/2015) and compliance dated 05/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati under Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Tirupati for Starting of MS (General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (26/08/2015) and compliance dated 05/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Average OPD is 50/day, which is inadequate. Inspection day OPD 96, which is also inadequate.
2. Laparoscopic Surgeries are only 6-7/month which are inadequate.
3. Bed occupancy is 60% on day of assessment.
4. Dr. D. Gopi Krishna Reddy, Asso. Prof. has only 1 paper to his credit which actually is a case report and hence cannot be accepted; hence he cannot be promoted as Asso. Prof. on 01/04/2015 after transitory period is

over; resultantly there are only 2 faculty in Unit II & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.

5. Specialty clinics like Plastic Surgery clinic & Paediatric Surgery clinic are not run. Only basic services are offered in these two sub specialties & complicated cases are referred to other centers.
6. Patients admitted in General Surgery wards were in equal proportions from General Surgery, Oncosurgery & Gastrosurgery.
7. Dr. P. Ramachandra Rao, Senior Resident is not eligible. He has no 3 years experience at the time of appointment. Resultantly, Unit-II is left with no Senior Resident.
8. Dr. Ramakrishna B. with DNB qualification is not eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident or Professor.
9. Dr. Sudhakar, Senior Resident, Unit-III is not eligible. No 3 years experience at the time of appointment. Unit-III left with no Senior Resident.
10. U.G. course being run by the institution is yet not recognized. As per regulations, Institute is not eligible to apply for P.G. seats till the recognition of U.G. course.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati under Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Tirupati u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**35. Increase of seats in MD (Anaesthesia) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (05/10/2015) and compliance dated 14/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MD (Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (05/10/2015) and compliance dated 14/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD (Anaesthesia) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 from 2(Two) to 4(Four) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

**36. Starting of MS(General Surgery) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th September 2015) and compliance dated 07th December 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad for Starting of MS(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th September 2015) and compliance dated 07th December 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. OPD attendance on day of assessment is only 45.
2. No blood unit was distributed to the department on day of assessment.
3. With respect to Dr. Rajeev K. Agrawal, he is shown as Asst. Prof. at Meenakshi Academy of Medical Sciences, Kancheepuram from 01/04/2006 to 30/05/2007 in the present assessment; however no such experience is shown in earlier assessment. No clarification is given for this discrepancy.

The clarification obtained from Dean, Meenakshi Academy of Medical Sciences, Kancheepuram is reproduced below:

*"... is not a valid certificate issued by this office. On perusal of our records Dr. Rajeev Kumar Agarwal, M.S., has never worked at Meenakshi Medical College & Research Institute to till date*

1. *The letter head used by this office in 2007 is entirely different and the Reference Number Model is different.*
2. *The phone numbers mentioned in the letter head sent by you are new phone numbers which was not existing in 2007.*
3. *The phone numbers mentioned in the letter head are new numbers which have been obtained approximately two years ago.*

*I wish to state that the above certificate sent by you is not issued by this office."*

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS(General Surgery) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that Dr. Rajeev Kumar Agarwal has submitted experience certificate dated 30/05/2007 of Meenakshi Medical College, Hospital & Research Institute, Kancheepuram. However, in response to Council letter dated 19/01/2016, the Meenakshi Academy has stated that it is not a valid certificate issued by their office and has also informed that Dr. Rajeev Kumar Agarwal, M.S. has never worked at Meenakshi Medical College, Hospital & Research Institute, Kancheepuram, till date. This clearly shows that such certificate has been forged. He has also appeared in pre-pg assessment carried out by the Council on 23<sup>rd</sup> &

24<sup>th</sup> July, 2015 and compliance verification assessment carried out on 31/08/2015 and submitted the same documents during these assessments.

The Council office has vide letter dated 05/01/2016 sought confirmation regarding issuance of certificate dated 05/11/2008 bearing reference no. SMCH/2008/327 regarding the work of Dr. Chandra Prakash Singh on the post of Asst. Professor in the department of Orthopaedics in Santosh Medical College & Hospital, Ghaziabad from 05/06/2006 to 30/09/2008. The College authorities have vide their letter dated 05/01/2016 stated that this certificate has not been issued by their institution and that Dr. Chandra Prakash Singh has worked as Senior Resident in Orthopaedics from 01/08/2006 to 16/11/2007 and as Asst. Professor from 17/11/2007 to 30/09/2008.

The Council office has vide letter dated 05/01/2016 sought confirmation regarding issuance of certificate dated 25/02/2010 bearing reference no. F2) Estt./Gaz/10/331 regarding the experience of Dr. P.K. Vasishtha in the department of Orthopaedics in Government Medical College, Kota as Asst. Professor from 09/07/1980 to 18/04/1986; Assoc. Professor from 19/04/1986 to 27/02/2003 and Professor from 28/02/2003 to 31/12/2009. The College authorities have vide their letter dated 05/01/2016 confirmed the experience of Dr. P.K. Vasistha. However, it has been noted that the Government Medical College, Kota has been established only in 1992. On seeking further confirmation from the Government Medical College, Kota vide letter dated 06/01/2016, the college authorities vide their letter dated 18/01/2016 submitted as under:

*"In continuation of this office letter no. 13 Dated: 05-01-2016 it is certified that on the basis of record available Dr. P.K. Vasistha, Retired Professor in Orthopedic of this college had worked in the following capacity:-*

01.	Assistant Professor - (RNT Medical College Udaipur)	09-07-1980	to	18-04-1986
02.	Associate Professor - (Dr. S.N. Medical College Jodhpur)	19-04-1986	to	27-09-1987
03.	Associate Professor - (RNT Medical College Udaipur)	28-09-1987	to	19-10-1993
04.	Associate Professor - (Medical College Kota)	20-10-1993	to	27-02-2003
05.	Professor - (J.L.N. Medical College Ajmer)	28-02-2003	to	20-02-2004
06.	Professor - (Medical College Kota)"	21-02-2004	to	31-12-2009

The above shows that he never worked as Asst. Professor at Government Medical College, Kota. Further, Dr. P.K. Vasistha also appeared in pre-pg assessment carried out by the Council on 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2015 and submitted the same documents during this assessment.

All the above documents have been produced with the purpose of obtaining recommendation of the Council by submitting fake/ forged documents. The Committee noted that clause 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that reads as under:

**"(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged documents:**

*If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also."*

Further, the Committee also noted that the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in its judgment dated 29/09/2015 in W.P. (C) 7106/2015 has held as under:

"...

50. On a careful reading of Regulation 8(3)(1), it appears to us that what is provided thereunder is grant of permission to establish a medical college initially for a period of one year and the renewal of the same on yearly basis subject to verification of the achievements of annual targets prescribed by MCI under Regulation 8(2). It is no doubt true that Regulation 8(3)(1) also states that "the Central Government may at any stage convey the deficiencies to the applicant and provide him an opportunity and time to rectify the deficiencies". However, the contention of MCI that by virtue of the provisos (a) to (d), an exception has been carved out to the power conferred on the Central Government to provide an opportunity and time to the applicant to rectify the deficiencies, is fallacious. We are afraid that this is not the import of Regulation 8(3)(1). According to us, the provisos (a) to (d) which imposed a bar on grant of renewal in the circumstances specified therein would only work as an exception to the main part of Regulation 8(3)(1) specifying the process of renewal of permission on yearly basis but not to the requirement of providing opportunity to rectify the deficiencies.

51. Therefore, we are of the view that it is not open to MCI and/or Central Government to deny an opportunity to the applicant/institute concerned to rectify the deficiencies specified by MCI even in cases which fall within the ambit of the provisos (a) to (d) of Regulation 8(3)(1) of the Regulations. However, it is essential for both MCI and Central Government to observe the time schedule as held in **Royal Medical Trust (supra)**.

..."

The Committee decided that legal opinion be obtained from Standing Counsel of MCI as to the future course of action to be taken in the matter in view of production of fake & forged documents before the Council and action to be taken in respect of 2 cases where positive recommendations has been conveyed to the Central Government for starting of MS (Ophthalmology) and MD (Radio-Diagnosis) courses. Further action should be taken in the light of legal opinion.

Further, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to refer the matter to the Ethics Committee for taking action against these doctors for submitting fake/ forged documents and to the Executive Committee for taking action as deemed appropriate against the Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh.

**37. Starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th September 2015) and compliance dated 07th December 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad for Starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th September 2015) and compliance dated 07th December 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. There was only 1 Major operation on day of assessment.
2. Histopathology specimens sent from the department on day of assessment is NIL.
3. Dr. P.K. Vasistha, Professor, Unit-I has claimed experience at Medical College, Kota from 1980 onwards. However, Government Medical College, Kota started in 1992. Obviously, the experience at Kota does not appear to be genuine.
4. Dr. Chandra Prakash Singh has produced a certificate that he worked as Asst. Professor at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad from 05/06/2006 to 30/09/2008 in the department of Orthopaedics. The College authorities (Dean) have denied and stated that this certificate has not been issued by that institution. However, he has confirmed that Dr. Chandra Prakash Singh has worked as Senior Resident from 01/08/2006 to 16/11/2007 and as Asst. Professor from 17/11/2007 to 30/09/2008. Dr. Chandra Prakash Singh has thus produced a non-genuine experience certificate. The matter may be referred to Ethics Committee.
5. Dr. Babu Hundekar is Assoc. Professor and not Professor. Dr. Babu Hundekar who is shown as Professor from 21/11/2012 to 31/07/2014 at Index Medical College, Indore in the present report was not shown in the earlier report.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**38. Starting of MS(ENT) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th September 2015) and compliance dated 07th December 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad for Starting of MS(ENT) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th September 2015) and compliance dated 07th December 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Promotion of Dr. M. Ashraf, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. There are no two acceptable publications attached with his declaration form as has been claimed in the compliance. In the year 2006, he worked only for 6 months.
2. Dr. Masood Ahmed Khan was absent on the day of assessment.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS(ENT) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**39. Starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th September 2015) and compliance dated 08th December 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad for Starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th September 2015) and compliance dated 08th December 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
2. Total number of Major operations on day of assessment was only 14 which is inadequate.
3. Teaching equipment like Fiberoptic Laryngoscope, Airway mannequin, etc. are not available.
4. No permanent register is maintained for swab/ASP reports. Colour coded bags are not used for disposal in O.T.
5. A remark was "Senior residents do not seem to be staying in campus". Assessor in the present assessment has only reported that the Senior Residents have attached allotment letters; however the fact that they are staying in the campus has not been shown. Showing allotment letter does not imply that they are staying in campus. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**40. Starting of MD(Paediatrics) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th September 2015) and compliance dated 25th November 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad for Starting of MD(Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th September 2015) and compliance dated 25th November 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Inspection day OPD at 4:00 P.M. was 99, which is inadequate.
2. As per SAF page 4, table at Sl. No. 7, blood used was shown as 2, 2 and 3 units daily in the year 1, 2 & 3 respectively. This data was provided by the



college authorities themselves. How it can be changed to 4-5 units per day, retrospectively for the same period. The change is not acceptable. From the above, it is clear that clinical material is inadequate.

3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD(Paediatrics) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**41. Starting of MD(TB & Respiratory Medicine/ Pulmonary Medicine) course at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29th December 2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th September 2015) and compliance dated 25th November 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad for Starting of MD(TB & Respiratory Medicine/ Pulmonary Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

4. Photograph submitted in compliance with regard to waiting area in OPD is from somewhere else. Space available is for < 30 chairs.
5. Neither Central nor Departmental Libraries have prescribed standard text books or reference books. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. In many wards, pantry facility is inadequate.
7. PFT machine with DLCO facility is not yet installed. Only purchase order has been placed.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

No proof of payment of salary as Junior Resident in Anaesthesia was produced. Deficiency of Senior Residents stay as such.
2. The college authorities had stated in the compliance that 2 papers have been published after the last assessment. However, one of that is in their own institutional journal and second one in non-indexed online journal, which cannot be accepted. Hence, deficiency of publications stays as such.
3. There were only 15 major operations on day of assessment which is just minimum required to start PG course.
4. The number of Caesarean Sections in 2015 till 30th November is 487 – i.e. 1.47/day which is equal to average in 2012 – 537/365 – i.e. 1.47/day; hence there is no increase in number of Caesarean sections in 2015 over 2012.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Anaesthesia) course at Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal under People's University, Bhanpur, Bhopal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of/ Increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses at Basaveshwara Medical College & Hospital, Chitradurga u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 along with the decision of the Executive Committee dated 28/12/2015 and noted the decision of the Executive Committee to return the applications recommending disapproval.

**58. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of DM(Gastroenterology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/11/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2013) and compliance dated 19/04/2014 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Gastroenterology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 04 seats at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/11/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2013) and compliance dated 19/04/2014 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Gastroenterology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 04 seats granted by Kerala University of Health

Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala because of the following facts:-

1. As per college authorities, there are 2 Units. However, as per Assessor, there is only 1 Unit with 30 beds. 4 seats cannot be recognized in one Unit with 30 beds and Faculty complement is incomplete for 2 Units.
2. The Experience Certificate of faculty specifying the subjects in which they have been appointed have not been enclosed.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 01 to 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (07/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013) and compliance dated 17/04/2014 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 03(Three) to 04(Four) seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

1. Explanation given by the Institute for decrease in number of total deliveries is not acceptable. Data of affiliation centers cannot be considered. Withdrawal of scheme by Government cannot be accepted as a ground for decrease in clinical material.
2. Dr. J.N. Modi – in previous report, Dr. J.N. Modi was shown as Assoc. Professor for 3 years (24/05/2008 to 24/05/2011). In the present report (Compliance Verification), he is shown Assoc. Professor for 4 years (24/05/2008 to 31/05/2012). This is not permissible.
3. Dr. Chhaya Bhudhwani – She was shown Assoc. Professor in earlier report from 14/02/2005 to 14/06/2007. However, in the present report, during this period, she is shown as Asst. Professor. She was shown Professor in earlier report from 15/06/2007 onwards but in the present report, she is shown Assoc. Professor during this period. Such change is not permissible.
4. Dr. Anjali – She was shown Assoc. Professor from 14/07/2010 to 20/10/2013 in earlier report but now this period is changed as 14/07/2010 to 14/07/2014, which is not permissible. Resultantly, Unit-III left with 2 faculty.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

4. Academic parameters like Journal Clubs (15/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
5. Central research laboratory is partially functioning.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 & Feb., 2015) and compliance dated 11/08/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD/MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats granted by Chhatrapati Shahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow in

respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Lucknow because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Madhu Chaudhary promoted Assoc. Professor in January, 2015 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
2. Dr. Prasad Lele promoted Assoc. Professor on 21/11/2014 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations. Hence, he cannot be accepted as Assoc. Professor.
3. Promotion of Dr. Anju Nag, Senior Resident is not as per Regulations. She has no 3 years experience in the department as Junior Resident at the time of appointment as Senior Resident.
4. Dr. Meenakshi Gupta is not eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident because she has no 3 years experience in the department at the time of appointment as Senior Resident.
5. Defence services experience will only be counted on production of experience certificate from Competent Authority of the Office of Director General Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) specifying the subject, period and place of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialist and advisor without which their equated teaching designations cannot be calculated. No other certificate signed by any other authority will be entertained.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report

(April, 2013) and compliance dated 10/04/2014 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to restore MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 08(Eight) to 14(Fourteen) seat(s) granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. J. Selvaraj, Asso. Prof. has been promoted on 11/12/2015 without any research publications; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & cannot be considered; resultantly there are only 2 faculty in Unit IV & it is headed by Asst. Prof. and it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit at all.
2. Dr. A. Prabhakar, Asso. Prof. has been promoted on 14/12/2015 without any research publications; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & cannot be considered; resultantly there are only 2 faculty in Unit VI & it is headed by Asst. Prof. and it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit at all.
3. Three Asst. Prof. were absent on day of assessment as they had gone for transfer counseling.
4. MRD is not computerized.
5. Staff quarters are inhabitable because growth of dense bush all around.
6. There are no publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years. Deficiency remains as it is.
7. ERCP is still not done. Deficiency remains as it is.
8. Infact, all Assoc. Professors (Dr. J. Selvaraj, Dr. A. Prabhakar, Dr. V. Kopperundevi and Dr. S. Jeevran) were promoted in 2015 without any publications. Hence, they are not eligible to hold the post of Assoc. Professor. Resultantly, Unit-II, IV, V & VI are left with 2 faculty.
9. Year of passing PG qualification has not been given in the faculty table about all faculty members.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. No clarification is given by institute in respect of remarks pointed out by assessors in the reports of Orthopaedics & Anaesthesia except a bland statement that the remarks are replied in the compliance of respective departments.
4. The assessor while conducting assessment for M.D. (Anaesthesia) on 04/01/2016 has made the following observations regarding clinical material in the institute:
  - (a) Daily operative load cannot be commented upon or be verified as O.T. lists & registers are not properly maintained. Departmentwise or Unitwise distribution is not shown. Timings of start & end of operations are also not recorded. There is only 1 list in which data are grossly inflated.
  - (b) The patients who were mentioned on O.T. lists on day of assessment (i.e. 04/01/2016), majority of them were not available in

either O.T. or respective Surgical ward, meaning thereby that O.T. list was too much inflated / fabricated.

- (c) In MRI computer, cases done on day of assessment were not listed in sequence. Previous dates' MRI investigations were not listed datewise.
  - (d) In Histopathology, when it was asked to provide number of Biopsies done in previous 3 days, no records were available in the department.
  - (e) There was no record of any LSCS available. There was only 1 Normal Delivery shown in the register but the woman was not available in the ward.
  - (f) Casualty / Emergency ward: Out of 11 beds of Surgery, there were only 2 patients who were not real emergencies & did not require admission there. Out of 14 beds of Trauma, there were only 2 cases who were cold cases and did not require admission there. Doctors' duty room was locked. Two O.T.s were not in good condition. O.T. dress & shoes were not available. Scrub station did not have soap.
  - (g) Medical ICU is managed by Physicians primarily. Only 1 Junior Resident from Anaesthesiology is put on duty in MICU.
  - (h) In General Surgery wards, 90 beds were occupied out of 180. In Orthopaedics wards, only 10 beds were occupied out of 60. There were only a few patients in Gynaecology. Majority of patients admitted in Surgery / Orthopaedics wards were not relevant & did not require admission. There was no delivery case in Labour room; only 1 case of Threatened Abortion was present.
  - (i) No Resident was present in Surgery / Orthopaedics wards.
5. From the above observations, it cannot be believed that there were 20 major surgeries on that day.

1. Dr. Vijender Sharma is shown as Professor as full timer since 2004. However, in his Form 16, salary of only 4th quarter is shown. He worked as Asso. Prof. at this institute from 01/12/2003 to 04/04/2004; his appointment letter dated 01/12/2003 does not bear any official stamp of the institute.
2. Dr. R.S. Chaudhary, Professor has joined only before 2 months; his appointment order does not bear any official stamp of the institute. No salary slip is attached with D.F. When asked, it was stated that he is paid Rs. 60, 000 p.m. which is too low for a Professor of Anaesthesiology; hence his status as a full time faculty is doubtful.
3. Resultantly, deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 2; (b) Asst. Prof.: 1.
4. The institute has shown progressive increase in Surgeries from 2013 to 2015; however the data could not be verified.
5. Daily operative load cannot be commented upon or be verified as O.T. lists & registers are not properly maintained. Departmentwise or Unitwise distribution is not shown. Timings of start & end of operations are also not recorded. There is only 1 list in which data are grossly inflated.



6. The patients who were mentioned on O.T. lists on day of assessment (i.e. 04/01/2016), majority of them were not available in either O.T. or respective Surgical ward, meaning thereby that O.T. list was too much inflated / fabricated.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 01 seat granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Dr. S.N Medical College, Jodhpur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**79. Delhi University, Delhi - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 5 to 11 seats in respect of students being trained at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 5 to 11 seats at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi granted by Delhi University, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 5 to 11 seats granted

by Delhi University, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi because of the following facts:-

1. There are 4 Units; each Unit has 90 beds which is not as per Regulations.
2. OPD & IPD patients include those patients from all Super Specialties; hence data for department of General Medicine are not segregated.
3. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (12/year) is inadequate.
4. Candidates appearing at examination have not presented 1 poster / read 1 paper at National or State Conference / published or send for publication 1 paper.
5. All Senior Residents are DNB trainees in super-specialities departments. Hence, they are not eligible. The Institute is running DNB course simultaneously, which is not permissible.
6. Prescribed SAF has not been used.
7. Super-speciality Departments are independent Departments. Their beds, patients, faculty and infrastructure cannot be counted towards General Surgery or General Medicine.
8. Change of designation and their period (dates) are not allowed to be changed from one report to the other without any reasons.
9. Defence services experience will only be counted on production of experience certificate from Competent Authority of the Office of Director General Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) specifying the subject, period and place of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialist and advisor without which their equated teaching designations cannot be calculated. No other certificate signed by any other authority will be entertained.
10. Promotion of following faculty members is not as per Regulations for reasons mentioned against their names and they cannot be considered for the post they are holding. Moreover, they are working in Super-speciality Departments and cannot be considered in General Medicine:
  - a. Brig. A. Banerjee: He is a Cardiologist working in the department of Cardiology. Moreover, his period from January 1994 to Jan. 1997 when he worked as DM student at MHCTC, Pune cannot be counted as Asstt. Prof.
  - b. Col. N. Kotwal – He is Endocrinologist working in the department of Endocrinology. Period spent from June, 1998 to June, 2001 as DM student at PGI, Chandigarh cannot be counted.
  - c. Col. Salil Garg – There is no degree like MD Cardiology which he is stated to have acquired from Army Hospital, R& R, Delhi. Even, if it is typing error and it is DM Cardiology, R& R Delhi does not have permission to run DM course in Cardiology.
  - d. Gp. Cpt. A.J. Swami – He is Cardiologist working in the department of Cardiology. Period spent at PGI, Chandigarh from 2004 to 2006 as DM student cannot be counted as teaching experience in Medicine.
  - e. Lt.Col. Upreti – He is Endocrinologist working in the department of Endocrinology and period spent from 2007 to 2009 as DM student at PGI, Chandigarh cannot be counted as teaching experience in General Medicine.
  - f. Brig. Ajay Sharma – He was Assoc.Prof. only for 01 year 06 months against the requirement of 04 years. Resultantly, his promotion is not as per Regulations and he cannot be considered Assoc. Prof.
  - g. Brig. J.S. Bishnoi – He is Nephrologist working in the department of Nephrology. His period spent from 1998 to 2001 as DM student at PGI, Chandigarh cannot be counted towards experience in General Medicine.

- h. Col. A. Jairam – He is Nephrologist working in the department of Nephrology. His period spent from Jan. 2004 to Dec. 2006 as DM student at PGI, Chandigarh cannot be counted towards experience in General Medicine.
- i. Col. D. Mukherjee - He is Nephrologist working in the department of Nephrology. His period spent from July 2003 to June 2006 as DM student at PGI, Chandigarh cannot be counted towards experience in General Medicine.
- j. Lt.Col. Rajan Kapur – He is Hematologist working in the department of Hematology and he cannot be considered a faculty in the department of Medicine.
- k. Lt.Col. Rajiv Kumar - He is Hematologist working in the department of Hematology and he cannot be considered a faculty in the department of Medicine.
- l. Brig. S.P. Gorthi – He is Neurologist working in the department of Neurology. His period spent from July, 1997 to June, 1999 at AIIMS, Delhi as DM student cannot be counted as experience in General Medicine.
- m. Brig. D. Bhattacharya – He is Pulmonologist working in the department of Pulmonary Medicine and his period spent as MD student in Pulmonary Medicine from 1998 to 2001 cannot be counted as experience towards General Medicine.
- n. Brig. B.N. Kapur – His promotion is not as per Regulations. He is Asstt.Prof. for 03 years 07 months against the requirements of 05 years. Hence, not eligible for the post he is holding.
- o. Col. Y.S. Sirohi – He is Neurologist working in the department of Neurology. His period spent from July, 2003 to July, 2006 at PGI, Chandigarh as DM student cannot be counted towards General Medicine.
- p. Col. Amul Kapur – No certificate of experience as Asstt. Prof. at AIIMS, Delhi from December, 2006 to December, 2007 is enclosed. Resultantly, he was Asstt. Prof. for 03 years 03 months against the requirement of 05 years. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations and cannot be considered as Assoc. Prof.
- q. Lt.Col. Pawan Dhull – He is Neurologist working in the department of Neurology. He is stated to have passed DM Neurology from Army Hospital R& R, Delhi. However, Army Hospital R& R, Delhi has no permission to run DM course in Neurology.
- r. Col. Pankaj Puri – He is a Gastroenterologist working in the department of Gastroenterology. His period spent from 1996 to 1999 at PGI, Chandigarh as DM student cannot be counted towards experience in General Medicine.
- s. Col. K. Shanmuganandan – His promotion is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt.Prof. for 04 years against the requirement of 05 years and Assoc. Prof. for 03 years against the requirement of 04 years. Hence, he cannot be considered eligible for the post he is holding.
- t. Col. Sandeep Theraja - He is a Gastroenterologist working in the department of Gastroenterology. His period spent at AIIMS, Delhi from January, 2003 to January 2006 as DM student cannot be counted towards experience in General Medicine.
- u. Col. Rajat Shukla - He is a Gastroenterologist working in the department of Gastroenterology. His period spent from 2004 to 2007 at PGI, Chandigarh cannot be counted towards experience in General Medicine.
- v. Gp. Cpt. V. Vasudev – His promotion is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 04 years 05 months against the requirement of 05 years. Hence, he is not eligible for the post he is holding.

w. Lt.Col. Gautam Dhar Choudhary – His promotion is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt.Prof. for 02 years against the requirement of 05 years. Hence not eligible for the post he is holding.

11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 5 to 11 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 5 to 11 seats at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi granted by Delhi University, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 5 to 11 seats granted by Delhi University, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi because of the following facts:-

1. There is no General Surgery department in this hospital. SAF mentions department inspected as “Surgical Division” and not as “General Surgery Department”.
2. General Surgery OPD is yet to be started. All OPDs are Super-Specialty OPDs.
3. All Senior Residents are DNB studnets in Super Specialties & none is Senior Resident in General Surgery. Hence, they are not eligible. The Institution is running DNB course simultaneously, which is not allowed.
4. Faculty like Dr. S.S. Sidhu, Dr. P.P. Rao have been shown as Asst./Asso. Prof. which is not permissible. There cannot be a designation like this.
5. Super-speciality Departments are independent Departments. Their beds, patients, faculty and infrastructure cannot be counted towards General Surgery or General Medicine.
6. Change of designation and their period (dates) are not allowed to be changed from one report to the other without any reasons.

7. Defence services experience will only be counted on production of experience certificate from Competent Authority of the Office of Director General Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) specifying the subject, period and place of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialist and advisor without which their equated teaching designations cannot be calculated. No other certificate signed by any other authority will be entertained.
8. Promotion of following faculty members is not as per Regulations for reasons mentioned against their names and they cannot be considered for the post they are holding. Moreover, they are working in Super-speciality Departments and cannot be considered in General Surgery:
  - a. Brig. Dr. Shailesh Chandra Karan is a Urologist working in the department of Urology. His period spent in AIIMS, New Delhi as DNB student in Urology cannot be counted.
  - b. Lt. Col. Dr. Sanat Kumar Khanna is a Paediatric Surgeon working the department of Paediatric Surgery. He cannot be considered in General Surgery.
  - c. Col. Dr. Sanjay Sharma is Surgical Gastroenterologist working in the department of Surgical Gastroenterology. He cannot be considered in General Surgery.
  - d. Col. Dr. Sanjiv Kumar Singh is a Plastic Surgeon working in the department of Plastic Surgery. He cannot be considered in General Surgery.
  - e. Capt. V. Anand is a Vascular Surgeon working in the department of Vascular Surgery and his name is not mentioned in the Faculty Table in the SAF.
  - f. Qualification and Teaching Experience column has not been filled in the declaration form of Col. Dr. Pankaj P. Rao.
  - g. Col. Dr. Vijay Langer is a Plastic Surgeon working in the department of Plastic Surgery. He cannot be considered in the department of General Surgery.
  - h. Brig. Dr. Sandeep Singh Sidhu is a CT Surgeon working in the department of CT Surgery. He cannot be considered in General Surgery.
  - i. Experience of Gp. Capt. Dr. Pradeep Jaiswal cannot be accepted. He is a Surgical Oncologist working in the department of Surgical Oncology.
  - j. Lt. Col. Dr. Chandra Pratap Singh is Vascular Surgeon working in the department of Vascular Surgery. He cannot be considered in the department of General Surgery.
  - k. Promotion of Col. Dr. Arun Kumar Singh (Senior Advisor) is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years 8 months against the requirement of 5 years and Assoc. Professor for 3 years 6 months against the requirement of 4 years.
  - l. Brig. Dr. Rajnish Talwar is an Urologist working in the department of Urology. He cannot be considered in the department of General Surgery.
  - m. Col. Dr. Anand Srivastava is Urologist working in the department of Urology. He cannot be considered in General Surgery.
  - n. Experience of Gp. Capt. Dr. Raghat Talwar cannot be accepted. He is DNB Urology working in the department of Urology.
  - o. Lt. Col. R. Gopi is a Plastic Surgeon working in the department of Plastic Surgery. He cannot be considered in the department of General Surgery.
  - p. Experience of Col. Dr. Arvind Kumar Tyagi cannot be accepted. He is working in the department of Surgical Oncology.

- q. Experience of Dr. Ajay Kumar Dabas cannot be accepted. He is a Vascular Surgeon working in the department of Vascular Surgery.
  - r. Dr. Shanker Raman is a Paediatrics Surgeon working in the department of Paediatric Surgery. He cannot be considered in General Surgery.
  - s. Gp. Cpt. Dr. M.S. Sridhar is Neuro-Surgeon working in the department of Neuro-Surgery. He cannot be considered in General Surgery.
  - t. Brig. Dr. Ramesh Kaushik is a CT Surgeon working in the department of CT Surgery. He cannot be considered in General Surgery.
  - u. Lt. Col. Dr. M. Sharma is Neuro-Surgeon working in the department of Neuro-Surgery. He cannot be considered in General Surgery.
  - v. Names of Lt. Col. Dr. V. Dixit and Col. Dr. G.S. Nagi are mentioned in the Faculty Table. Both are holding M.Ch. qualifications (Subject not mentioned). However, declarations forms of both of them are not attached.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 5 to 11 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 15/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of assessment.

**82. University of Delhi, Delhi - Recognition of DM(Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at VP Chest Institute of Medical Sciences, Delhi.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2014) and compliance dated 20/08/2015, 02/09/2015, 15/09/2015 and 04/01/2016 submitted by the college

authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at VP Chest Institute of Medical Sciences, Delhi granted by University of Delhi, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2014) and compliance dated 20/08/2015, 02/09/2015, 15/09/2015 and 04/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by University of Delhi, Delhi in respect of students being trained at VP Chest Institute of Medical Sciences, Delhi because of the following facts:-

1. Endobronchial Ultrasound yet to be procured. Only tender have been floated.
2. Deficiency of Thoracic Surgeon is not rectified. Appointment of a part time visitor cannot be accepted.
3. Dr. S.N. Goud, Professor & HoD is not eligible. Goa Medical College, Goa does not have DM (Pulmonary Medicine) and hence, his experience there as Senior Resident cannot be counted as Special Training. He does not hold MD or DM qualification. Ph.D. in Medicine cannot be equated to MD/ DM.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 19/08/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.



**84. Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry - Renewal of recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) and D. Ortho qualifications for 01 seat each in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 11/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) and D. Ortho qualifications for 01 seat each at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 11/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) and D. Ortho qualifications for 01 seat each granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. With regard to Dr. S. Ravindran, it is not for the Council to demote a teacher and consider him in the lower cadre. It is for the institute to demote him and submit fresh D.F. alongwith requisite fresh appointment & joining reports.
2. In view of above, deficiency of inadequate faculty in Unit 2 is not rectified.
3. Faculty table is not attached.
4. Dr. Ramalingam was not considered as Senior Resident because he did not have adequate experience. Now, the Institute has shown him Junior Resident in 2012 for one year. However, the same period was shown as Senior Resident in earlier assessment. Such retrospective change is not permissible.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat each for degree and diploma till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 28/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

**86. Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (01/07/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2013) and compliance dated 11/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (01/07/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2013) and compliance dated 11/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

**87. Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry - Recognition of DPM qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/07/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2013 & March, 2014) and compliance dated 27/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DPM qualification for 01 seat at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/07/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2013 & March, 2014) and compliance dated 27/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

**88. Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry - Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/07/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2012) and compliance dated 09/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching

facilities for Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/07/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2012) and compliance dated 09/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. In earlier report, Dr. R. Ramesh was shown as Assoc. Professor from 23/03/2006 to 28/02/2008. As his promotion as Assoc. Professor was not considered as per regulations. Now the same period is changed as Asst. Professor. Such retrospective change is not permissible.
2. One Asst. Professor to whom appointment order has been issued is yet to join. Resultantly, deficiency of Asst. Professor remains as such.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within six weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 11/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

**90. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 12 to 14 seats in respect of students being trained at JJM Medical College, Davangere.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (22/06/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 09/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 12 to 14 seats at JJM Medical College, Davangere granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (22/06/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 09/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

**91. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 07/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 07/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Explanation of institute with regard to promotion of Dr. H.K. Kulkarni, Professor that "faculty should complete 9 years of teaching experience in a medical college to be appointed as Professor" is not correct. Previously, it was 5 years' experience as Asst. Prof. required for promotion to Asso. Prof. and 4 years' experience as Asso. Prof. for promotion to Professor which is not there. Further, even in computing period of 9 years, total period of 5 y 9 m as Tutor / Senior Resident is included which is not permissible. Hence deficiency remains as such.
2. There are NIL publications from the department during last 3 years. Deficiency remains as such.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the

concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 14/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

**93. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 14/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification for 04 seats at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 14/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification for 04 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Workload of CT guided procedures is not shown. Deficiency remains as such.
2. Faculty table is not attached.
3. With regard to DSA, MRI/ CT workload, it is not shown how it has increased.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in

accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18th November 2015) and compliance dated 31st December 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur, Rajasthan under NIMS University, Jaipur for Increase of seats in MD(DVL) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th November 2015) and compliance dated 31st December 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. In respect of Dr. S.K. Karodia, Professor, it is stated that no benefit of publications has been given for promotion. In that eventuality, his promotion as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 y as Asst. Prof. is not as per Regulations; hence he cannot be considered as faculty.
2. With regard to inadequate Bed occupancy, it is only stated that "Currently, bed occupancy of patient is as per MCI norms" but no data have been provided to show how it has increased.
3. No proper explanation has been given for NIL workload of Skin Biopsy or for Skin Tests & Wet Mount, etc. it is only stated "These procedures are done as per requirement of patient and clinical diagnosis." Without providing any data as to how it has increased.
4. Institute has stated in compliance that currently, bed occupancy is as per MCI norms; however assessor for M.S. (ENT), while conduction assessment on 04/01/2016 has observed that "Skin ward next to ENT with no admissions" implying very poor IPD attendance in Skin & VD ward.
5. Institute has stated in compliance that "Assessment was done Post Diwali days; hence affected the inflow of patients." This contention of the institute is not correct. Diwali was on 11th November 2015 this year. Assessment was carried out on 18/11/2015 – i.e. 7 days after Diwali. Regulations prescribe that assessments shall not be carried out 3 days before & 3 days after religious holiday. As Diwali was on 11/11/2015, the outer limit of 3 days would have expired on 14/11/2015 and the assessments on or after 15/11/2015 are in order and as per Regulations.

6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD(DVL) course at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur, Rajasthan under NIMS University, Jaipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**95. Increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) course at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur, Rajasthan under NIMS University, Jaipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18th November 2015) and compliance dated 31st December 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur, Rajasthan under NIMS University, Jaipur for Increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th November 2015) and compliance dated 31st December 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. With regard to inadequate Bed occupancy, it is only stated that "Currently, bed occupancy of patient is as per MCI norms" but no data have been provided to show how it has increased.
2. No proper explanation has been given for data mismatch except stating blandly that "There is no data mismatch."
3. Dr. Raj Kumar Goyal, Senior Resident in Unit IV does not possess 3 y experience as Resident in the department in a medical college required for the post. Hence he is not eligible to hold the post; resultantly, there is no Senior Resident in Unit IV.
4. Institute has stated in compliance that "Assessment was done Post Diwali days; hence affected the inflow of patients." This contention of the institute is not correct. Diwali was on 11th November 2015 this year. Assessment was carried out on 18/11/2015 – i.e. 7 days after Diwali. Regulations prescribe that assessments shall not be carried out 3 days before & 3 days after religious holiday. As Diwali was on 11/11/2015, the outer limit of 3 days would have expired on 14/11/2015 and the assessments on or after 15/11/2015 are in order and as per Regulations.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) course at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur, Rajasthan under NIMS University, Jaipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**96. Increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) course at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur, Rajasthan under NIMS University, Jaipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18th November 2015) and compliance dated 31st December 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at National Institute of Medical Science & Research,

Jaipur, Rajasthan under NIMS University, Jaipur for Increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th November 2015) and compliance dated 31st December 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Contention of institute that bed occupancy was 99% at 4 p.m. on day of assessment cannot be accepted as bed occupancy has to be computed at 10 a.m. on day of assessment. No data have been provided to show how bed occupancy has increased.
2. No proper explanation has been given regarding non-feasibility of 48 admissions on 60 beds with bed occupancy of 50%. It is reiterated that contention of institute that bed occupancy was 99% at 4 p.m. on day of assessment cannot be accepted as bed occupancy has to be computed at 10 a.m. on day of assessment. Deficiency remains as such.
3. Dr. Swati Tomar has been promoted as Professor on 01/02/2014 – i.e. after cutoff date when Regulation regarding research publications came into force; however no details regarding her research publications have been furnished; hence her promotion cannot be considered.
4. Resultantly, faculty complement in Unit I is not complete.
5. On 4th January 2016 Daily operative load cannot be commented upon or be verified as O.T. lists & registers are not properly maintained. Department-wise or Unit-wise distribution is not shown. Timings of start & end of operations are also not recorded. There is only 1 list in which data are grossly inflated.
6. The patients who were mentioned on O.T. lists on day of assessment (i.e. 04/01/2016), majority of them were not available in either O.T. or respective Surgical ward, meaning thereby that O.T. list was too much inflated / fabricated.
7. Institute has stated in compliance that "Assessment was done Post Diwali days; hence affected the inflow of patients." This contention of the institute is not correct. Diwali was on 11th November 2015 this year. Assessment was carried out on 18/11/2015 – i.e. 7 days after Diwali. Out of 14 beds of Trauma, there were only 2 cases who were cold cases and did not require admission there. Doctors' duty room was locked. Two O.T.s were not in good condition. O.T. dress & shoes were not available. Scrub station did not have soap.
  - g. Medical ICU is managed by Physicians primarily. Only 1 Junior Resident from Anaesthesiology is put on duty in MICU.
  - h. In General Surgery wards, 90 beds were occupied out of 180. In Orthopaedics wards, only 10 beds were occupied out of 60. There were only a few patients in Gynaecology. **97. Increase of seats in MS(Orthopaedics) course at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur, Rajasthan under NIMS University, Jaipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18th November 2015) and compliance dated 31st December 2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur, Rajasthan under NIMS University, Jaipur for Increase of seats in MS(Orthopaedics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th November 2015) and compliance dated 31st December 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Contention of institute that bed occupancy was 83% at 4 p.m. on day of assessment cannot be accepted as bed occupancy has to be computed at 10 a.m. on day of assessment. No data have been provided to show how bed occupancy has increased.
2. It is not feasible that when major operations were only 2 till 4 p.m. which would include planned elective Surgeries as well, there would be 9 more emergency operations after 4 p.m. Data appear to be non-genuine.
3. Explanation about NIL Histopathological/FNAC workload is not convincing. Contention of institute that Histopathological investigations are not routine in Orthopaedics cannot be accepted because that would be the case only if majority of work is related with Trauma and workload of other Orthopaedic Pathology is miniscule which cannot be accepted in a teaching institute.

4. No proper explanation has been given for remark pertaining to inflated clinical material & blood utilization.
5. Institute has stated in compliance that "Assessment was done Post Diwali days; hence affected the inflow of patients." This contention of the institute is not correct. Diwali was on 11th November 2015 this year. Assessment was carried out on 18/11/2015 – i.e. 7 days after Diwali. Regulations prescribe that assessments shall not be carried out 3 days before & 3 days after religious holiday. As Diwali was on 11/11/2015, the outer limit of 3 days would have expired on 14/11/2015 and the assessments on or after 15/11/2015 are in order and as per Regulations.
6. The patients who were mentioned on O.T. lists on day of assessment (i.e. 04/01/2016), majority of them were not available in either O.T. or respective Surgical ward, meaning thereby that O.T. list was too much inflated / fabricated.

1. Contention of institute that bed occupancy was 90% at 4 p.m. on day of assessment cannot be accepted as bed occupancy has to be computed at 10 a.m. on day of assessment. No data have been provided to show how bed occupancy has increased.
2. No proper explanation has been given regarding non-feasibility of 56 admissions with bed occupancy of 50%. It is reiterated that contention of institute that bed occupancy was 90% at 4 p.m. on day of assessment cannot be accepted as bed occupancy has to be computed at 10 a.m. on day of assessment. Deficiency remains as such.
3. No proper explanation has been given for remark pertaining to inflated clinical material.
4. No proper explanation has been given for not providing details of Birth Registration to assessor. Evasive statement like "Birth registration records are available and can be verified at any point of time" does not justify why they were not provided to assessor for verification.
5. Institute has stated in compliance that "Assessment was done Post Diwali days; hence affected the inflow of patients." This contention of the institute is not correct. Diwali was on 11th November 2015 this year. Assessment was carried out on 18/11/2015 – i.e. 7 days after Diwali. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th November 2015) and compliance dated 31st December 2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. No proper explanation has been given for disproportionately high number of reported 50-60 Scans & 34-38 MRIs on only 1 machine each which is physically not feasible.
2. With regard to Dr. Reena Gupta, her experience as Resident for 2 y at Okay Diagnostic Center cannot be accepted as it is not a department in a medical college. Hence she cannot be accepted as Senior Resident as she does not have experience of 3 y in a medical college as Resident; resultantly there is shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
3. Institute has stated in compliance that "Assessment was done Post Diwali days; hence affected the inflow of patients." This contention of the institute is not correct. Diwali was on 11th November 2015 this year. Assessment was carried out on 18/11/2015 – i.e. 7 days after Diwali. Regulations prescribe that assessments shall not be carried out 3 days before & 3 days after religious holiday. As Diwali was on 11/11/2015, the outer limit of 3 days would have expired on 14/11/2015 and the assessments on or after 15/11/2015 are in order and as per Regulations.
4. College authorities have stated that majority of CT/ MRI are on Brain, then there is a deficiency of adequate teaching material of other systems.
5. The assessor while conducting assessment for M.D. (Anaesthesia) on 04/01/2016 has made the following observations regarding clinical material in the institute:
  - a. Daily operative load cannot be commented upon or be verified as O.T. lists & registers are not properly maintained. Departmentwise or Unitwise distribution is not shown. Timings of start & end of operations are also not recorded. There is only 1 list in which data are grossly inflated.
  - b. The patients who were mentioned on O.T. lists on day of assessment (i.e. 04/01/2016), majority of them were not available in either O.T. or respective Surgical ward, meaning thereby that O.T. list was too much inflated / fabricated.

1. No proper explanation is given about discrepancy in TAH Surgeries shown in register & specimens in Histopathology department. Contention of institute that as there is a discrepancy in assessment reports of O.G. & Pathology, their observations are null & void cannot be accepted. No proper explanation also has been given regarding discrepancy in number of specimens & number of Surgeries as reported by Pathology assessor. Further it is not feasible that TAH, which is mainly an elective Surgery, there would be 4 operations after 4 p.m. when during the daytime there were only 4 operations.
2. Deficiency of IHC investigations not being done routinely remains as such.

3. No explanation is given about mismatch in samples & reports except a bland statement that "Mismatch between samples and reports is denied as the samples of wrong tissue were handed over by technician to assessor by mistake which was corrected on spot". Even this statement is wrong as no such finding that it was corrected on spot has been reported by assessor; rather it was categorically stated that "such kind of error is not acceptable in a teaching institution." The mismatch in the samples received and diseases reported/ reports issued is from the data provided by the college authorities themselves (page 3, sl. No. 5 of SAF), which was communicated in the deficiencies pointed out. Reply given to this deficiency is unrelated.
4. Institute has stated in compliance that "Assessment was done Post Diwali days; hence affected the inflow of patients." This contention of the institute is not correct. Diwali was on 11th November 2015 this year. Assessment was carried out on 18/11/2015 – i.e. 7 days after Diwali. Defence services experience will only be counted on production of experience certificate from Competent Authority of the Office of Director General Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) specifying the subject, period and place of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialist and advisor without which their equated teaching designations cannot be calculated. No other certificate signed by any other authority will be entertained.

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1; (b) Asst. Prof.: 1.
2. There were only 04 Major & 05 Minor operations on day of assessment. Average of randomly selected days is 7 Major which is grossly inadequate for PG course.
3. MRI workload of the hospital was only 08 on day of assessment.
4. Pain clinic is not run.
5. No ICU is with the department. No specialized Intensive Care services are provided by department.
6. Death review meetings are not held.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Anaesthesia) course at Jorhat Medical College & Hospital, Jorhat, Assam under Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**111. Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course at Jorhat Medical College & Hospital, Jorhat, Assam under Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (08th January 2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Jorhat Medical College & Hospital, Jorhat, Assam under Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences for Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (08th January 2016) and noted the following:

1. OPD attendance is only 57 on day of assessment.
2. Bed occupancy is only 40% on day of assessment.

3. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1; (b) Asst. Prof.: 1.
4. There is no Central O2 in NICU with limited equipment.
5. Unit I headed by Professor has no Asso. Prof.; hence faculty complement is incomplete and it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
6. There are only 2 faculty in Unit II; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
7. Resultantly, there is no Unit which qualifies as PG Unit.
8. Specialty clinics like Paediatric Cardiology, Paediatric Endocrinology, Paediatric Haematology, Diarrhoea clinic, Paediatric Neurology clinic are not run.
9. Services like Parenteral Nutrition, Dialysis, Bronchoscopy, PFT are not available.
10. Equipment like Upper GI Endoscope, Echo Colour Doppler, Bronchoscope are not available.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course at Jorhat Medical College & Hospital, Jorhat, Assam under Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**112. Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (09/09/2015) and compliance dated 25/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/12/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (09/09/2015) and compliance dated 25/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. Arun Kumar, Senior Resident in Unit III was absent.; hence there is no Senior resident in Unit III.
2. Resultantly, there is shortage of Resident: (a) Senior Resident: 1.
3. Promotion of Dr. Sanghi Reddy is not as per Regulations. In the earlier report he was shown as Asst. Professor for 2 years 1 month against the requirement of 5 years. From 22/07/2010 to 17/12/2013, he was shown Assoc. Professor but in the present compliance report, this has been changed to Asst. Professor, which is not permissible.
4. As per Assessor, available faculty on the day of assessment was:
  - a. Professor: 6
  - b. Assoc. Professor: 4
  - c. Asst. Professor: 12

Total – 22. Even if we add Dr. Reddy, who had gone for conference, it makes 23 but for 8 units, the faculty requirement is 24. Resultantly, there is a deficiency of 1 Asst. Professor.

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**113. Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Medciti Institute of Medical Sciences, Ghanpur, Telangana under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (12/09/2015) and compliance dated 25/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Medciti Institute of Medical Sciences, Ghanpur, Telangana under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (12/09/2015) and compliance dated 25/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Bed occupancy was only 30% at 10:00 a.m. on day of assessment.
2. Attendance at Specialty clinics is poor – only 3-4 cases/clinic.
3. Paediatric Endoscope & Paediatric Bronchoscope are not available in the department & these procedures are not carried out by faculty of Paediatrics. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. There were only 24 patients in Paediatric wards in the morning. However this number increased to 65 by 4:00 p.m. implying 41 patients – i.e. more than 1 ½ times of existing patients – being admitted on a single day which is not feasible. Most newly admitted cases appeared to be normal children without any acute medical problem.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Medciti Institute of Medical Sciences, Ghanpur, Telangana under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**114. Starting of/ increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses in respect of various medical colleges for the Academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: the letters dated 27/11/2015, 08/12/2015, 23/12/2015 and 13/01/2016 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to Starting of/ increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses in respect of various medical colleges for the Academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letters dated 27/11/2015, 08/12/2015, 23/12/2015 and 13/01/2016 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to Starting of/ increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses in respect of various medical colleges for the Academic

year 2016-17 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 and decided that the PG section be asked to identify the following:

- (1) If there is any application which does not fall into any of 4 categories mentioned in the item;
- (2) Whether there is any compliance which has been received but not processed by PG Committee;
- (3) Whether in case PG has decided to verify compliance by assessment but assessment is not carried out;
- (4) Whether compliance verification assessment has been carried out but report has not been received;
- (5) Whether compliance verification report has been received but not placed before PG Committee.

In each case appropriate decision be taken in consultation with Chairman, PG Committee.

With regard to 4 categories mentioned in the item,

- (1) Where compliance has been considered by PG Committee, decision of PG Committee be communicated.
- (2) Where applications have been rejected due to Section 8(3)(1)(c), latest status from UG section be obtained and if this notice has not been revoked, reiterate decision of rejecting the application. Where notice u/s 8(3)(1)(c) has been revoked, assessment to be carried out.
- (3) Where any document is deficient, reiterate decision of rejecting application after quoting D.Y. Patil & Royal Trust orders.
- (4) Same as (3) above.

**115. Application for starting of/ increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses in respect of various medical colleges for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: the matter with regard to Application for starting of/ increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses in respect of various medical colleges for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956, which were rejected by the Council office on the basis of consent of affiliation not being in continuation.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Application for starting of/ increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses in respect of various medical colleges for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956, which were rejected on the basis of submission by the PG section that consent of affiliation not being in continuation. Now, while considering the Central Government letter dated 08/12/2015 and clearance of pre-pg assessment of Govt. Medical College, Akola by Executive Committee, the files were reviewed by the PG Section and it was observed that Consent of Affiliation was acceptable as it was mentioned at the bottom that "Consent of Affiliation letter issued by University is extended in the new format of MCI."

In view of above, the Committee decided that all applications should be treated at par. In case there is no deficiency, they all should be processed except the following (for which, reasons are mentioned against them for not processing):

**SI. No. 22 - Institute of Medical Sciences, BHU, Varanasi:**

Even after final reminder, the Consent of Affiliation was received after the cut-off date mentioned in the final reminder.

**SI. Nos. 23 to 28 - Chhatrapati Shahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow:**

The Consent of Affiliation still not received and the University claimed that being the University itself, there is no need for getting Consent of Affiliation.

Hence, the Committee decided to reiterate its earlier decision recommending disapproval of the scheme.

**116. Increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses at Maulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi for the academic year 2016-17.**

Read: the matter with regard to Increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses at Maulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi for the academic year 2016-17 along with the letter dated 08/12/2015 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses at Maulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi for the academic year 2016-17 along with the letter dated 08/12/2015 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi and noted that as per "The Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Post-graduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission Capacity in any Course of Study or Training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000", the fee submitted is non-refundable.

The Committee decided to reiterate its earlier decision that fees are non-refundable and cannot be adjusted and return the applications to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for increase of seats in various Postgraduate courses at Maulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**117. Starting of various postgraduate courses at Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital, New Delhi for the academic year 2016-17.**

Read: the matter with regard to Starting of various postgraduate courses at Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital, New Delhi for the academic year 2016-17 along with the letter dated 13/01/2016 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of various postgraduate courses at Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital, New Delhi for the academic year 2016-17 along with the letter dated 13/01/2016 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi and noted the following:

- (1) After Central Govt. forwarded applications for starting of 8 PG courses on 29/05/2015, the scrutiny by Council office revealed that documents were incomplete as under:
  - (a) Consent of Affiliation was not enclosed for M.S. (Orthopaedics) & M.D. (Paediatrics). COA issued by University on 31/07/2014 is conditional & only for Academic Year 2015-2016.;
  - (b) Exemption letter u/s 8(1)(a) by Central Govt. was not enclosed.;
  - (c) Time Bound Programme was not submitted.
- (2) Council requested the institute to submit the above documents 4 times.



- (3) Finally as the documents were not still submitted then, PG Committee at its meeting dt. 24/09/2015 decided to return the applications to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of scheme.
- (4) Ministry of Health & FW, Govt. of India granted personal hearing to the institute & after the hearing forwarded the compliance to Council recommending review of its decision vide its letter dt. 13.01.2016.
- (5) Documents enclosed with compliance reveal that Exemption letter from Govt. of India was issued on 24/09/2015 – i.e. long after cutoff date for receipt of application by MCI. It was also observed that this exemption order though issued by Central Govt. on 24/09/2015, it was submitted by the institute for the first time only on 01/01/2016 along with its compliance.
- (6) Consent of Affiliation enclosed with compliance letter dt. 09/01/2016 is for M.D. (Anaesthesia) and not for M.S. (Orthopaedics) & M.D. (Paediatrics) which were the subjects for which deficiency was pointed out. Even this Consent of Affiliation dt. 30/09/2015 issued by GGS Indraprastha University, long after cut-off date for receipt of application by MCI, is conditional one and specifically states that “The applicant would not confer any claim for Affiliation upon issuance of Consent of Affiliation. ...subject to condition that the institute would submit a proposal upon issuance of notification for consideration for grant of affiliation for the next Academic Session on prescribed format of University. The application would be considered subject to scrutiny as per guidelines/policies of Govt. of NCT of Delhi -----.
- (7) Proposal envisages MOU with Maulana Azad Medical College for basic Medical Sciences; however Maulana Azad Medical College itself has shown in SAF submitted at time of its assessment for increase to 200/250 intake that it is utilizing the same facilities of infrastructure, faculty, etc. for its own students. Hence the same facilities cannot be permitted for utilization by another institute.

The Members of PG Committee also observed that recently Hon'ble Supreme Court in WP (c) # 705 of 2014 Royal Medical Trust (Regd.) & Anr. v/s Union of India & Anr. and other such matters in its order dt. 20/08/2015 has observed as under:

“....  
27....

*Initial assessment of the application at the first level should comprise of checking necessary requirements such as essentiality certificate, consent for affiliation and physical features like land and hospital requirement. If an applicant fails to fulfill these requirements, the application on the face of it, would be incomplete and be rejected. Those who fulfill the basic requirements would be considered at the next stage.*

...”

It was further observed that in SLP # 15043/2015 Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College v/s MCI & Anr., Hon'ble Supreme Court in its order dt. 31/08/2015 has held as under:

“...  
15.

*In the instant case, the application was admittedly incomplete when it was filed. Though there is a dispute whether it was filed before 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2014. It was submitted on behalf of the MCI that it was filed on 02.09.2014. Be that as it may. Even assuming that it was filed before 31.8.2014, admittedly it was an incomplete application as the essentiality certificate issued by the Government of Maharashtra was not enclosed along with the application form due to which application came to be rejected and delay has taken place for which the petitioner has to blame itself.*

...

20. *On an analysis of the aforesaid decisions, it is crystal clear that the time schedule is required to be strictly observed. ...*

...

23. *Considering the statutory time schedule and that the same is already over and in the facts and circumstances of the case, it would not be appropriate to direct inspection to be made and thereafter a decision to be taken for the current academic session 2015-16 as that would be in breach of the law laid down in various decisions of this Court which is binding. Thus, we direct that the application which has been submitted by the college for the academic session 2015-16 be considered for the next academic session, subject to fulfillment of other requisite formalities, as may be necessary, and thereafter the MCI shall conduct an inspection well-in-time as per the time schedule fixed under the Regulations of 1999. The Special Leave Petition is dismissed with the aforesaid modification. Ordered accordingly."*

In view of above, it was decided to reiterate earlier decision of returning applications recommending disapproval of scheme for starting of various postgraduate courses at Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital, New Delhi for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

**118. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 – consideration of Compliance.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (20th August 2015) and compliance dated nil submitted by the college authorities through Central Government on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (20th August 2015) and compliance dated nil submitted by the college authorities through Central Government and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. No compliance is submitted with regard to inadequacy of major Gynaecological & Obstetric operation or as to how it has increased. It has specifically been mentioned in SAF that LSCS are to be considered as a separate class and not to be included in workload of Major operations; deficiency remains as such.
2. Deficiency of inadequate research publications remains as it is. Only 1 research publication has been published and that too in journal of Community Medicine & not in the journal of Obstetrics & Gynaecology. Even 2 articles sent for publication are in journals other than O.G. specialty.
3. On the day of assessment, major operation -1; minor operation-2 and day care- Nil, which is grossly inadequate.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

**119. Application for starting of / Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: the matter with regard to Application for starting of / Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 along with the communication received from Mr. Ganesh Gole, Council Advocate in Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Application for starting of / Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 along with the communication received from Mr. Ganesh Gole, Council Advocate in Mumbai and decided to wait for the copy of the order of the Hon'ble High Court. The Committee further directed that legal opinion be obtained on the Court order & further action be taken as per legal opinion.

**120. Starting of MS (OBG) course at Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar under Siksha "O" Anusandhan University Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 - consideration of fresh assessment report.**

Read: the Fresh Assessment Report (11/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Reports (10/09/2015 and 05/12/2015) and compliance dated 13/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar under Siksha "O" Anusandhan University Bhubaneswar for Starting of MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Fresh Assessment Report (11/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Reports (10/09/2015 and 05/12/2015) and compliance dated 13/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar under Siksha "O" Anusandhan University Bhubaneswar for Starting of MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 and decided to defer the matter.
