Minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 26th April, 2016 at 11.00 A.M. in the Office of the Medical Council of India, Pocket-14, Sector-8, Dwarka, New Delhi.

The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence was received from Prof. (Dr.) Dhruba Jyoti Borah, Member; Dr. Deelip Govindrao Mhaisekar and Dr. Raja Babu Panwar, Member.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 13th April, 2016.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

The representatives of SMS Medical College, Jaipur appeared in person before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee and explained their position for consideration of Postgraduate Committee. The Committee directed the representative of the college to submit an Undertaking to admit 2 students for MD(IHBT) and 4 students for DIHBT from the next academic year in which is commensurate with available faculty.

3. Starting of DM (Paediatric Nephrology) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (6th April 2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore for Starting of DM (Paediatric Nephrology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (6th April 2016) and noted the following:

1. There is no Asso. Prof. & no Asst. Prof. in the unit; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit.
2. Average OPD is 75-80/month, implying daily average of 2.5 – 3 which is grossly inadequate.
3. Dr. Smriti Menon, Senior Resident has experience of 3 years as Resident in Paediatrics & not in this department; hence not eligible to hold the post.
4. There are no separate beds for Paediatric Nephrology. Beds are shared with Adult Nephrology.
5. There are no separate equipment for Paediatric Nephrology.
6. There are no Print journals available. No details are given of books purchased within last 3 years.
7. All ancillary facilities & non-teaching staff are common with Adult Nephrology. This implies that separate department of Paediatric Nephrology does not exist.
8. There was only 1 Paediatric patient in the ward.
9. No Haemodialysis on any Paediatric patient in last one year.
10. Dr. Anil Mathew appeared for adult nephrology assessment in July, 2015 for recognition of DM (Nephrology), which means he was working in the department of Nephrology. However, in the present report, he has been shown to be working in Paediatric Nephrology from 01/08/2007 in different ranks, which is not feasible. Moreover, prior to August, 2015, there was no department of Paediatric Nephrology. Even with this profile, he is not eligible because he had no 2 years special training in Paediatrics Nephrology. An Institute and department, which has not been given even LoP for start of DM Course cannot be entitled to give special training in that subject. He has been promoted Professor on 01/08/2015 after cut-off date without any publications.

The Committee decided to seek explanation from Dean and Dr. Anil Mathew that why wrong, erroneous and misleading information has been supplied to the Council. The reply should come within a period of one week.

11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Paediatric Nephrology) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

4. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 24.03.2015) and compliance dated 28/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 01 seat at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 24.03.2015) and compliance dated 28/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 01 seat granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. GirishVasand, Unit "A" has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cutoff date; however in the column of "Benefit of Publications", it is mentioned as "NIL". Details of such publications are not given. Hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered as faculty.
2. Resultantly, faculty complement in Unit A is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Dr. S.R. Katti, Unit "B", has been promoted as Professor after cutoff date; however in the column of "Benefit of Publications", it is mentioned as "NIL". Details of research publications are not given; it is only mentioned that he has 1 research publication in indexed journals. Hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered as faculty.
4. Dr. Ravi Patil, Unit B has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cutoff date; however in the column of "Benefit of Publications", it is mentioned as "NIL". Details of such publications are not given. Hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered as faculty.
5. Resultantly, faculty complement in Unit B is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
6. Major Surgeries have jumped three times (from 587 in 2013 to 1630 in 2014), which does not appear genuine. There is no proportionate increase in Minor Surgeries, which were 520 in 2015, which means less than 2 per day.
7. Stipend paid at the rate of 25000/ month from 01/04/2015. It is not clarified whether paid to earlier Admissions or not.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the

concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

5. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 03 seats and DA qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at GSL Medical College & GSL General Hospital, Lakshmipuram, Rajahmundry.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 20/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 03 seats and DA qualification for 02 seats at GSL Medical College & GSL General Hospital, Lakshmipuram, Rajahmundry granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 20/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 03 seats and DA qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at GSL Medical College & GSL General Hospital, Lakshmipuram, Rajahmundry because of the following facts:-

1. Senior Residents are staying in the campus only on the day of emergency duty which is not permissible.
2. On the day of Assessment Bed Occupancy in Surgical ICU was 14.2%. Bed Occupancy in Post Operative Ward 40%.
3. Dr. P.V. Chakravarthy has been promoted Assoc. Professor after 4 years 1 month as Asst. Professor without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 Degree and 02 Diploma seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

6. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Thrissur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 15.06.2015) and compliance dated 09/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Thrissur granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 15.06.2015) and compliance dated 09/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University in respect of students being trained at Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Thrissur because of the following facts:-

1. Demotion Order, Fresh Joining Report and Declaration Form of Dr. Alvin T. George, who has been demoted to Asst. Professor from Assoc. Professor have not been enclosed.
2. Dr. K. Jairaj was promoted Assoc. Professor after the cut-off date. 2 publications cited are in online journal, which cannot be considered and one is a case report. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
3. On the day of Assessment, OPD was 1584 and admissions 120, which is not feasible. It is clearly given on the top of column that clinical material of the department concerned should be given.
4. Faculty table is not signed by the Faculty members.
5. Dr. Pavanan K., Senior Resident is not eligible. He has no 3 years experience in Medicine in a medical college at the time of appointment as Senior Resident. Previously, he worked as Junior Resident in the departments of Surgery and Biochemistry, which cannot be counted.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely,

prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

7. Barkatullah University - Continuance of Recognition of M.Ch.(Paediatrics Surgery) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (Feb, 2007, June, 2013 & 02.01.2015) and compliance dated 23/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Continuance of Recognition of M.Ch.(Paediatrics Surgery) qualification for 01 seat at Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal granted by Barkatullah University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (29/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (Feb, 2007, June, 2013 & 02.01.2015) and compliance dated 23/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch.(Paediatrics Surgery) qualification for 01 seat granted by Barkatullah University in respect of students being trained at Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal because of the following facts:-

1. Daily average OPD is 30.
2. There is no Asso. Prof. in the Unit. Asst. prof. is on leave in USA since August 2015; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Dr. Vivek Sharma, Senior Resident is appointed in General Surgery. Though he is working in Paediatric Surgery, his attendance is marked in General Surgery, implying thereby there is no Senior Resident in Paediatric Surgery. Even otherwise, he does not have 3 years experience as Resident in the department and therefore not eligible to hold the post. Resultantly there is shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

8. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of MD(Radio-diagnosis) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvanthapuram.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and compliance dated 27/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio-diagnosis) qualification for 2 seats at Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvanthapuram granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and compliance dated 27/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radio-diagnosis) qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Regional Cancer Centre, Thiruvanthapuram because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Subie Raj, Senior Resident does not have experience of 3 years as Resident in medical college as per faculty table; hence not eligible to hold the post.
2. There is no other Senior Resident; resultantly there is shortage of Senior Residents: 3.
3. On day of assessment, only 1 P.G. who was 1 year Resident was present; rest of Residents were posted to Govt. Medical College for additional training which is not permissible.
4. AERB approval is available for only 2 machines out of 5.
5. DSA is not yet available.
6. Space for faculty & departmental office is inadequate.
7. Academic calendar provided lacks seminars, group discussions, etc.
8. Joining date of Senior Residents not given in the faculty table..
9. Professor K. Ramachandran was not present on the day of Assessment.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

9. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 11 seats in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Mysore.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013 & 19.06.2015) and compliance dated 02/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 11 seats at Government Medical College, Mysore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013 & 19.06.2015) and compliance dated 02/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 11 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Mysore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

10. Chhatrapati Shahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow - Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Lucknow.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 & 24.07.2015) and compliance dated 29/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification 01 seat at Command Hospital, Lucknow granted by Chhatrapati Shahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 & 24.07.2015) and compliance dated 29/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(ENT) qualification 01 seat granted by Chhatrapati Shahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Lucknow be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

11. D.D.U. Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 3 seats and DA qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and compliance dated 10/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 3 seats and DA qualification for 1 seat at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur granted by D.D.U. Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and compliance dated 10/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 3 seats and DA qualification for 1 seat granted by D.D.U. Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh in respect of students being trained at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 1; (b) Assoc. Professor - 2.
2. There are NIL publications from the department. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Promotion of Dr. Raka Rani, Professor is not as per Regulations. She has been promoted after the cut-off date on 01/08/2014 without any publications.
4. Promotion of Dr. Dinesh Kumar Sahu, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He has been promoted after the cut-off date on 16/03/2016 without any publications.
5. How designation of Santosh Kumar Sharma has been changing from Lecturer to Asst. Professor and Vice-versa in the same college.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 Degree and 01 Diploma seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Girija, Professor in Unit IV has been promoted as Professor on basis of publications; however out of 5 publications cited, 3 are case reports & 2 review articles, which cannot be accepted; hence she has only 1 research publication against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
2. Dr. T. Ashida, Asst. Prof. in Unit IV is not accepted as she has been appointed in Cardiology.
3. Resultantly, faculty complement is incomplete in Unit IV & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Dr. A.V. Ramya, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post.
5. Promotion of Dr. Raghunathan, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years. Out of 2 publications cited, one is in online journal, which cannot be considered. Resultantly, Unit-IV left with 2 faculty and headed by Asst. Professor.
6. Dr. N. Sudar, Professor was not available on inspection day.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. On the day of assessment, 2 small & 2 slightly bigger autoclaves were present. Procurement & Installation reports of the autoclaves were not shown.
4. Record of media was found to be much higher than actual number of plates prepared when it was correlated with the procurement records.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Dr. Haritha, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post.
4. Dr. S. Rajkumari has been promoted as Professor after cutoff date; however, details of publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether her promotion is as per Regulations or not.
5. Dr. U. VijayaLaxmi has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cutoff date; however, details of publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether her promotion is as per Regulations or not.
6. Only 2 publications in Internet Journal during last 3 years.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. HDU is available but no records of admission at HDU was available. There was NIL patient in HDU. It seems it is not being used.
4. Operative Laparoscope & Resectoscope are not available.
5. Unitwise distribution of faculty & Residents is not provided.
6. Deficiency 2 stays as such.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Sharma was shown Asst. Professor at RPGMC, Tanda from 31/01/2007 to 04/09/2009 (2 years 7 months). Now the same has been changed in the compliance as 31/01/2007 to 01/02/2012, which is not permissible. The Dean may be asked to explain and submit certified copies of Govt. Orders (appointment and promotions) pertaining to Dr. P.K. Sharma, till then the Item is deferred.

25. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Renewal of recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at AI-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 30/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 04 seats at AI-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 30/01/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 04 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at AI-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. S.Y. Hanjagi has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cutoff date; however both the publications are case reports which cannot be accepted; resultantly there are NIL research publications & his promotion is not as per Regulations.
2. Resultantly, faculty complement is incomplete in Unit E & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Dr. V.U. Mujawar, Senior resident does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in the department in Medical College; hence not eligible to hold the post.
4. MRI workload on day of assessment was only 10.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

1. Dr. Sanjeev B.B. has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cutoff date; however details of his research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
2. There are only 2 publications in indexed journals from the department. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Dr. Manjiri D. Deshpande, Assoc. Professor is not eligible. She was promoted on 01/03/2016 after the cut-off date without any publications. There is no other Assoc. Professor in Unit-I.
4. Only 3 Senior Residents eligible. Others have no 3 years experience as Junior Residents in a medical college in Anaesthesia.
5. Faculty deficiency: (a) Assoc. Professor - 2; (b) Senior Resident – 1.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. MRI is not yet available. The Institution should apply when MRI is installed.
2. All Senior Residents are MBBS. No Proof of payment of salary as Junior Resident attached. The college authorities should provide proof of payment of salary as Junior Resident (only bank transfer) and experience certificate signed by the Dean and HoD as Junior Resident in General Medicine in case of all Senior Residents.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. None of the faculty possesses D.M. qualification or 2 years special training in the subject. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Certified copies of experience certificate from competent authority of place of work (Kozhikode and Alleppy) be provided pertaining to Dr. P.T. James, Professor & HoD clarifying that the department where he worked has been permitted for DM (Pulmonary Medicine).
3. There is no Dr. Deepak Talwar in Faculty Table, as has been stated in the compliance.
4. Dr. Somaya V.K., Asst. Professor is MD without any 2 years special training in Pulmonary Medicine. Hence, not eligible.
5. Dr. Arun Ramachandran Nayar, Asst. Professor is not eligible. No certificate of 2 years special training in Pulmonary Medicine in a teaching institution has been attached.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Equipment for Peak flow meter, EEG, EMG, Nerve Conduction Study are yet not available in the department. Deficiency remains as it is.

2. Dr. UmeshPatkar, Dr. MahadevZalke & Dr. AbhayNaik have been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cutoff date; however no details of their research publications are provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether their promotion is as per Regulations or not.
3. No details of any Tutor is provided in the faculty table.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Dr. Purnima Baliga, Professor is not eligible. She has all her experience in Pathology and transferred at the level of Professor. She has no 2 years special training in the department of Immuno Haematology & Blood Transfusion.
2. Dr. Brij Mohan is not eligible. All his experience is in the department of Pathology. He has no 2 years special training in the department of Immuno Haematology & Blood Transfusion.
3. There is no Senior Resident.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Act, 1956.

Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 06/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 04 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Maharajah Instt. Of Med Sciences, Nellimarella because of the following facts:-

1. On 30/03/2016, total Casualty patients' admission was 5 out of whom major Orthopaedic trauma was only 1. Rest 4 were Minor Orthopaedic Trauma which does not require admission. Verification of registers showed that there are very few Orthopaedic Trauma admissions in Casualty.
2. There was NIL Major & only 1 Minor operation on day of assessment.
3. Out of 74 patients admitted in wards, there were only 7 patients of fresh fracture; most of the remaining patients had nonsignificant Orthopaedic disease.
4. OPD attendance was 24-26 on day of assessment at 10:30 a.m.; there was NIL patient of fresh fracture & NIL patient for plaster removal. Most of the patients had insignificant Orthopaedic disease.
5. 3 Deaths in Orthopaedics in last year. No proof (Municipal Corporation information) provided. This indicate no serious trauma patients are treated without which training of PG students is not adequate.
6. Promotion of Dr. P. Sankar Rao, Assoc. Professor, Unit-II is not as per Regulations. He was promoted on 08/01/2016 after the cut-off date without any publications. No title of Article or Author names given. Hence, not considered. Resultantly, Unit-II left with 2 faculty.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in

accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.
2. Dr. Anand S., Professor promoted on 05/03/2015 without publications.
3. Dr. Balamurugan, Professor promoted on 24/02/2015 without publications.
4. Dr. Ashok Kula Shekhar promoted on 25/04/2015 without any publications.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at N.R.I. Medical College and Hospital, Guntur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. M. Sobha Mohan, Professor of Unit I was on leave on day of assessment.
2. Dr. Y. Sowjanya, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in Medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. Bed occupancy is 70% on day of assessment which is inadequate. Bed Occupancy in PICU was 55% and in NICU 14%, which is grossly inadequate.
4. Out of admitted patients, 26 did not require admission as they had minor complaints like URI, Acute Gastroenteritis without dehydration, follow up cases, etc. and did not fulfill criteria for PG teaching.
5. There was no high risk pregnancy undergoing delivery on day of assessment. Only 3 cases of Birth Asphyxia requiring Resuscitation were there in the month of March 2016. Out of newborns admitted in NICU, 5 were such who did not require NICU care.
6. There was NIL patient being treated in ORT corner. It does not have hand wash facility or toilet nearby.
7. There are no research publications in indexed journals from the department in last 3 years. All 3 are case reports which cannot be accepted. Deficiency remains as it is.
8. Dr. G. Pratap Kumar, Professor promoted on 01/11/2014 without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
9. Professor, Dr. H.S. Subaraya Sastry was absent on the day of Assessment. Resultantly, Unit-II left with 2 Asst. Professor.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

1. Two Asso. Prof. reported after 4 p.m. on day of assessment; hence they cannot be considered as faculty; resultantly there is deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 2.
2. Further, although both Asso. Prof. have been promoted after cutoff date, details of research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether their promotion is as per Regulations or not.
3. MRI workload on day of assessment is only 08 which is inadequate.
4. There are no publications from the department during the last 3 years.
5. Static Machines are very old models and placed at different places.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats each for Degree and Diploma after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. granted by Santosh University, Ghaziabad in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Neeraj Sharma & Dr. Rajeev Kumar Tyagi, Senior Residents, do not possess 3 years experience as Resident in medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post.
2. Resultantly, net shortage of Senior Resident: 3.
3. On the day of Assessment, Major Operations were 10, which is inadequate.
4. Dr. Ragi Jain shown as Professor in the column of Designation and Assoc. Professor in the column of experience, which is not feasible. She is not eligible to be Professor since, shown promoted on 10/06/2015 without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.
5. Dr. Sudesh Prakash, Assoc. Professor promoted on 07/01/2016 without any publications during the period of Asst. Professorship. Hence, not as per Regulations.
6. Dr. Manoj Kumar Yadav shown Asst. Professor in the column of Designation and Senior Resident in the column of Experience, which is not feasible.
7. P.G. Degree of Dr. Urvashi Verma, Asst. Professor is not Recognized.
8. Faculty Deficiency: (a) Assoc. Professor – 2; (b) Asst. Professor – 1 and (c) Senior Resident – 3.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. qualification for 02 seats at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (31/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June,2011, Feb.,2014 & November, 2014 & 28.07.2015) and compliance dated 21/10/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 02 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at A.C.P.M.Medical College, Dhule because of the following facts:-

1. Major operations, including Caesarean Section & Day Care Surgeries, listed on day of assessment were only 12 which is inadequate.
2. Bed occupancy of the hospital on day of assessment was 23.14% which is grossly inadequate.
3. Total number of operations, including Minor operations on day of assessment was only 16; however the number of Histopathological samples was 19 which is not feasible. There is data mismatch.
4. Equipment like BIS Monitor is not available.
5. There are only 2 research publications from the department in indexed journals. Rest are case reports and hence cannot be considered. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. There is no Super-Speciality Anaesthesia training.
7. The Assessor has said that there are 7 faculty but neither their names in faculty table nor their experience details are given.
8. Bed occupancy in ICU on the day of Assessment was 40%.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (31/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 26.06.2015) and compliance dated 21/09/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at K V G Medical College, Kurunjibag, Sullia be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

45. S.V. Medical College, Tirupati – Admission of PG students 2015-2016 – Assessment regarding renewal of recognition of MD (DVL) and DDVL Courses.

Read: the matter with regard to admission of PG students for the year 2015-16 and assessment regarding renewal of recognition of MD (DVL) and DDVL Courses at S.V. Medical College, Tirupati.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to admission of PG students for the year 2015-16 and assessment regarding renewal of recognition of MD (DVL) and DDVL Courses at S.V. Medical College, Tirupati and decided that fresh assessment be carried out.

46. Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai - Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/03/2015) along with Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 28/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai granted by Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/03/2015) along with Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 28/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats granted by Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. No proof like bank account statements have been submitted for payment of stipend to Residents. The amount of stipend paid is also not mentioned; hence it cannot be verified whether the stipend is being paid @ the rates of Govt. of Maharashtra.
2. Arrears of stipend cannot be adjusted against payment of future fees. This practice is highly irregular. Deficiency of non-payment of arrears remains as it is.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. One remark was that "None of the faculty has received any 2 years special training in Emergency Medicine." LOP for the department was issued on 29/03/2012. The Dean has given a letter dated 03/07/2013 saying Faculties have undergone 2 years special training in the same department from July, 2011 to June, 2013. Even prior to the starting of the department, which is not permissible.
2. Both Professors have been transferred to the department of Emergency Medicine straight away as Professor from the parent department and were shown as undergoing training in Emergency Medicine department. It is not understood that under whom they were undergoing training.
3. Students admitted after the LoP were taught by whom, if the faculty members themselves were undergoing training.
4. No compliance is submitted with regard to remark "Both Professors have been transferred to Department of Emergency Medicine straightaway as Professors from the parent department."
5. Compliance submitted is not in prescribed SAF.
6. Even MRI workload of 11 per day as stated in compliance is inadequate.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. MRI is not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. DSA is not available. Workload of DSA is NIL. Deficiency remains as it is. Contention of College Authorities that it is not mandatory is not correct.
3. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1 remains as it is.
4. Compliance is not in prescribed SAF.
5. Deficiency 8 remains as such. There are no research publications in the department during last 3 years.
6. Deficiency 10 remains as such. Group Discussions not yet increased. The college authorities have stated that they are likely to be increased.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Kuppam because of the following facts:-

1. 2 Publications quoted during the last 3 years. However, no reference of any of them provided. The deficiency stay as such.
2. 2 years experience of working in Emergency Medicine cannot be counted as Special Training because Special Training has to be before their appointment in the department.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Faculty table with signature of faculty is not attached with compliance.
2. No data of clinical material on date have been submitted with compliance.
3. Reply to deficiency 1 is very vague, which says that 85%-90% bed occupancy may be observed at compliance verification. It does not say how much is bed occupancy as on date at 10:00 A.M.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central

Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. No data of clinical material on date have been submitted with compliance.
2. Faculty table with signature of faculty is not attached with compliance.
3. College Authorities have admitted that Bed Occupancy was 50% at 10:00 A.M., which is grossly inadequate and deficiency stays as such.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and compliance dated 04/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Sri Guru Ram Das Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Sri Amritsar granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2015) and compliance dated 04/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

66. Starting of DM (Endocrinology) course at Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (09th March 2016) and compliance dated 06/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur for Starting of DM (Endocrinology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (09th March 2016) and compliance dated 06/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Deficiency of appointment of Dr. P.K. Jabbar as Professor & HOD not being as per Regulations remains as it is. He has been appointed as Professor of Endocrinology straightaway from the post of Professor of General Medicine.
2. Deficiency of appointment of Dr. Jayakumari remains as it is.
3. Deficiency of Senior Resident remains as such.
4. Deficiency of General Endocrinology OPD running once a week remains as it is. On other days Special clinics focusing on a particular segment are run which cannot be equated with General Endocrinology OPD.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Endocrinology) course at Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

67. Starting of M.Ch. (Hepato Pancreato Biliary Surgery) course at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (21st March 2016) and compliance dated 09/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai for Starting of M.Ch. (Hepato Pancreato Biliary Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21st March 2016) and compliance dated 09/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Deficiency of Senior Resident remains as such.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of M.Ch. (Hepato Pancreato Biliary Surgery) course at Christian Medical College, Vellore,

Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

68. Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (21st March 2016) and compliance dated 22/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21st March 2016) and compliance dated 22/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 from 1(One) to 2(Two) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (30/03/2016) and compliance dated 21/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla under Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (30/03/2016) and compliance dated 21/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. There is no Asso. Prof. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Both Senior Residents – Dr. P.S. Thakur & Dr. Ranvijay Singh - do not have 3 years experience in the department as required under the Regulations. Contention of the institute that they have 3 years experience as Resident in General Medicine and therefore eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident is not correct as the experience in General Medicine cannot be equated with that in Nephrology. Hence deficiency remains as it is.
3. Promotion of Dr. Sanjay Vikrant as Professor is not as per Regulations as he has been promoted with experience of only 2 years 7 months as Asso. Prof. against 3 years required as per Regulations. Contention of the institute that he has been promoted as per HP R & P Rules is not acceptable as TEQ Regulations being Statutory Central Regulations notified in the Gazette of India are mandatory & binding in character and

are required to be followed by all authorities. Hence deficiency remains as it is.

4. Renal transplant facility is not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla under Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

(Surgical Gastroenterology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (16/11/2015) and compliance dated 20/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (08/02/2016) and compliance dated 19/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. B.J. Srinivas, Senior Resident passed DNB from non-teaching institution. He has no 3 years experience as Junior Resident in a medical college. Hence, not eligible.
2. Dr. Nalini Kilara, Professor & HoD worked from 1992 to 1995 as Professor of General Medicine at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore. Then, how could she pass DM (Oncology) in 1995 from Kidwai Memorial Hospital, Bangalore. It is not feasible that she worked at two places simultaneously.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of DM (Medical Oncology) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

73. Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Neuro-Surgery) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17-consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (08/02/2016) and compliance dated 19/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Neuro-Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (08/02/2016) and compliance dated 19/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Promotion of Dr. Kiran Khanpure is not as per Regulations. Deficiency remains as it is. It is for the institute to downgrade him and submit fresh Declaration Form along with fresh joining report as Asso. Prof. & relevant appointment order, in absence of which it is not possible for the Council to consider him as Asso. Prof.
2. There is no Senior Resident as per Faculty Table. Deficiency of Senior Resident: 1.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Neuro-Surgery) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

74. Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at JSS Medical College, Mysore under JSS University, Mysore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17-consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (15/02/2016) and compliance dated 20/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at JSS Medical College, Mysore under JSS University, Mysore for

Starting of DM (Nephrology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (15/02/2016) and compliance dated 20/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities as well as the explanation submitted in person by representatives of the college and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Deficiency of ineligibility of Dr. Majunath Shetty, Professor & HOD remains as it is.
2. Dr. C. Manoj does not have 3 years experience as Resident in Nephrology; hence not qualified to hold the post. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at JSS Medical College, Mysore under JSS University, Mysore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

75. Starting of DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) course at G.B. Pant Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, New Delhi under University of Delhi u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17-consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19/02/2016) and compliance dated 21/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at G.B. Pant Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, New Delhi under University of Delhi for Starting of DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19/02/2016) and compliance dated 21/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Starting of DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) course at G.B. Pant Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, New Delhi under University of Delhi u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

76. Starting of M.Ch. (Head & Neck Surgery) course at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17-consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (05/04/2016) and compliance dated 22/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of M.Ch. (Head & Neck Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (05/04/2016) and compliance dated 22/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Unit – I:
 - a. Dr. Ashok M. Shenoy, Professor & HoD is MS (ENT). No 2 years special training.
 - b. Dr. Krishanappa R has passed M.Ch. in 2013. Appointed Asst. Professor in 2004, which is not acceptable.
2. Both Senior Residents in Unit-I are not eligible.
3. Unit-II:
 - a. Professor & HoD passed M.Ch. in 2009. Appointed Asst. Professor in 2000, which cannot be accepted.
 - b. Assoc. Professor is only MS (ENT). No experience at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor and 2 years special training in Head and Neck Surgery.
4. Both Senior Residents in Unit-II are not eligible. No 3 years experience at the time of appointment.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of M.Ch. (Head & Neck Surgery) course at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

77. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of recognition of DCH qualification in respect of students being trained at Grant Medical College, Mumbai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (10th & 11th December, 2015) and compliance dated 14/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DCH qualification at Grant Medical College, Mumbai granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (10th & 11th December, 2015) and compliance dated 14/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities as well as the explanation submitted in person by representatives of the college and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of DCH qualification granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Grant Medical College, Mumbai because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. No compliance or clarification is given regarding status of Dr. Pallavi Saple. She is shown as Asst. Prof.; however in the column of experience, it is shown as Professor w.e.f. 13/08/2010. The dichotomy still remains.
2. Nothing is mentioned about Specialty clinics like Paediatric Cardiology, Nephrology, Paediatric Endocrinology, Paediatric Haematology to be run by Paediatrics department. Compliance only states about services being provided by other departments but not by Paediatrics department.
3. Contention of the institute that the Regulation pertaining to research publications is not applicable to Dr. Shruti Dhule is not correct as it was notified in 2009. The circular issued by MCI in September 2015 was by way of clarification regarding publications which are to be considered.
4. Unit-II has no Assoc. Professor and it is headed by Asst. Professor.
5. Unit-III has only 2 Faculty. Hence, it cannot be considered as a PG Unit.
6. Unit-IV has no Senior Resident
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these diploma seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.
