**1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee - confirmation of.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the minutes of Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 24<sup>th</sup> May, 2016; 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2016; 17<sup>th</sup> June, 2016; 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2016 and 12<sup>th</sup> July, 2016 are sent to Central Government Oversight Committee.

**2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee - action taken thereon.**

Action will be taken on receipt of the Minutes from the Oversight Committee.

**3. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of Medical Sciences, Maduranthagam.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (26th April, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats at Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of Medical Sciences, Maduranthagam granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (26th April, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of Medical Sciences, Maduranthagam be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**4. Sikkim Manipal Univ. of Health, Medical & Tech. Scs - Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, Gangtok.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (2nd May, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification for 03 seats at Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, Gangtok granted by Sikkim Manipal Univ. of Health, Medical & Tech. Scs.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (2nd May, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Physiology) qualification for 03 seats granted by Sikkim Manipal Univ. of Health, Medical & Tech. Scs in respect of students being trained at Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, Gangtok because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Dilip K. Jha, Professor & HOD, is shown as having worked as Asst. Prof. from 01/05/2002 to 31/05/2006 - i.e. for a period of 4 years 1 month against requirement of 5 years; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations. Further, he was appointed straightaway as Asso. Prof. in 1994 without any experience as Asst. Prof. which cannot be considered. His experience at Bharatpur Medical College, Nepal cannot be considered either. Resultantly, his total eligible teaching experience is only 8 years 1 month before appointment as Professor.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**5. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni - Renewal of recognition of D.Ortho qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (12th May, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of D.Ortho qualification for 2 seats at Rural Medical College, Loni granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (12th May, 2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of D.Ortho qualification for 2 seats granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Associate Professor, Unit-I, Dr. S.V. Yadkikar is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 4 years and promoted on 10.07.2015 after the cut off date. One out of the 2 publications is an online journal, which cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Dabhade M.N., Senior Resident in Unit I does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
3. Dr. V.A. Kanawade, Senior Resident in Unit I does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
4. Dr. Girme A.S., Senior Resident in Unit II does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
5. Resultantly, there is no eligible Senior Resident in Units I & II.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

6. **B.N. Mandal University, Bihar - Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Kathiar Medical College, Kathiar.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (20.05.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 1 seat at Kathiar Medical College, Kathiar granted by B.N. Mandal University, Bihar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (20.05.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 1 seat granted by B.N. Mandal University, Bihar in respect of students being trained at Kathiar Medical College, Kathiar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

7. **D.Y. Patil Education Society (Deemed University), Kolhapur - Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (9th May, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 3 seats at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society (Deemed University), Kolhapur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (9th May, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 3 seats granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society (Deemed University), Kolhapur in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

8. **Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences - Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19.05.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification

for 2 seats at Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati granted by Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19.05.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences in respect of students being trained at Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati because of the following facts:-

1. Senior faculty, Professor and Assoc. Professors have been appointed as faculty of Emergency Medicine straightaway on the same designation as in the parent department without any experience in Emergency Medicine.
2. Both the Senior Residents do not have 3 years experience as Resident in the subject before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
3. Out of 4 publications cited in the list, 3 are not related with Emergency Medicine; resultantly there is only 1 research publication from the department in indexed journal in last 3 years; even this publication relates with health workers engaged in Emergency Care & not with the contents of the subject itself.
4. Total number of Major operations has decreased from 1,763 in 2013 to 1,677 in 2015.
5. Total number of Histopathology samples sent has decreased from 5,158 in 2013 to 4,618 in 2015.
6. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 08 on day of assessment.
7. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 32,368 in 2013 to 31,191 in 2015.
8. Services like Echocardiography, Endoscopy, Bronchoscopy are not available in the department.
9. Departmental library has only 56 books which is inadequate.
10. Academic parameters like Journal Clubs (08 in no.), Case Presentations (21/year) Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**9. Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University) - Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (04.05.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (04.05.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Preeti P. passed DNB from non-teaching institution. She does not have 3 yrs. experience as Junior Resident in a medical college, hence not eligible. Resultantly, there is no Senior Resident in the department.
2. Workload of Tracheo/Laryngoplasty, Rhinoplasty, Angiofibroma is NIL during last 3 years.
3. Total workload of Laryngectomy is 05 & of Maxillectomy is only 03 during last 3 years.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**10. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Renewal of recognition of DGO qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DGO qualification for 3 seats at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of DGO qualification for 3 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical

University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore because of the following facts:-

1. Total number of Major operations has decreased from 1,612 in 2013 to 1,595 in 2015.
2. Total number of Minor operations has decreased from 842 in 2013 to 800 in 2015.
3. Number of Minor operations at 800 implies daily average of 2.67 which is inadequate.
4. Number of Histopathology specimens sent has decreased from 2,153 in 2013 to 1,937 in 2015.
5. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 06 on day of assessment.
6. There was NIL Major Obstetric operation on day of assessment.
7. Number of Operative Vaginal Deliveries has decreased from 432 in 2013 to 399 in 2015.
8. Specialty clinic like Gynaec Endocrinology clinic is not run.
9. Services like Artificial Reproductive Technology are not available.
10. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (06 in no.), Journal Clubs (10 in no.), Case Presentations (21/year), Group Discussions (20/year) are inadequate.
11. Total death in the institution last year was 01 out of 6796 admissions which indicates that no serious patients are virtually admitted.
12. There is discrepancy in the data of Major Operations given in the tables on page 3 and page 32 (Reproduced below):

This is a data mismatch and indicates that data is non-genuine.

13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."*

**11. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore because of the following facts:-

1. There are only 4 static X-ray machines against requirement of 6 as per Regulations.
2. Workload of MRI for the whole hospital is only 05 on day of assessment.
3. Workload of DSA is NIL on day of assessment.
4. Workload of CT guided FNAC/Biopsy is only 95 in 2015 implying daily average of only 0.32.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.



**12. Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth's Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Puducherry - Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Shri Satya Sai Medical College and Research Institute, Kancheepuram, Tamilnadu.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24th May, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 3 seats at Shri Satya Sai Medical College and Research Institute, Kancheepuram, Tamilnadu granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth's Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (24th May, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Pathology) qualification for 3 seats granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth's Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Shri Satya Sai Medical College and Research Institute, Kancheepuram, Tamilnadu because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Naseema Noorunnisa has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No" implying there are NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations and she cannot be considered.
2. As the institute is recognized for 150 MBBS seats, total 6 Tutors are required. As per summary, there are only 2 Tutors available; rest 4 are shown as PG students only; it is not clear whether appoint orders as Tutors have been issued to such 4 PG students which needs to be clarified.
3. Total autopsies for adults & Paediatric are shown as 3 on P. 17 in Part II; bifurcation into adult & Paediatric age groups is not provided; hence it is not possible to verify whether Pathological post-mortems are performed or not; however at item § 19 on P. 20 in Part II, total number of adult & child autopsies is shown as NIL while that in Neonates is shown as 02 - i.e. total 02. This discrepancy needs to be clarified.
4. Workload of Bone Marrow Biopsy, TT is NIL in 2015.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (29.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(TB & Respiratory Diseases) qualification for 2 seats at Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (29.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(TB & Respiratory Diseases) qualification for 2 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. K. Krishnamoorthy has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, no list of research publications is provided in the faculty table; hence, not eligible.
2. Dr. G. Sangamithra has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however, no list of research publications is provided in the faculty table; hence, not eligible.
3. Dr. O.M.R.S. Hameed, Senior Resident, does not have 3 years experience as Resident in medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
4. DLCO is not available.
5. Separate RICU is not available.
6. Faculty & staff accommodation is not available.
7. Number of Textbooks available on the subject in Central Library is only 20.
8. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (10 in no.), Clinical seminars (12/year), Journal Clubs (12/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (02.05.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Paediatics) qualification for 2 seats granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. J. Antony Jennifer, Assoc. Professor, Unit-3 is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 2 years 10 months and promoted Assoc. Professor on 01.08.2014 without any publications, hence not eligible. Resultantly, Unit-3 is having only 2 faculty.
2. Bed occupancy is 42% on day of assessment as there were only 38 genuine patients on 90 beds. Many of the admitted patients were fake/dummy patients with no/insignificant complaints, routine OPD problems (viz., UTI, cold, cough, mild Anaemia, etc.) not requiring admission. Many of them were healthy school children just occupying beds with no attendants, medicines or personal belongings.
3. There are only 2 deaths in the department in 2015 indicating poor availability of seriously sick children / emergencies.
4. IPD figures for 2015 shows nearly 50% jump in 2015 over 2014; the staff was not able to give any tangible explanation for the same.
5. OPD & IPD statistics provided by department seem to be inflated.
6. Endoscopy & Dialysis services are available with Medical Gastroenterology & Nephrology departments & not with Paediatics department.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

**15. D.Y. Patil Education Society (Deemed University), Kolhapur - Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (4th May, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 2 seats at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society (Deemed University), Kolhapur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (4th May, 2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 2 seats granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society (Deemed University), Kolhapur in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. K.A. Mulla, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
2. There is no exposure to Neurosurgery & Cardiothoracic Surgery in the own hospital; PG Residents are sent to a private non-teaching hospital which cannot be accepted.
3. Total number of Caesarean Sections in 2015 is shown as 2026 implying daily average of 5.55. This does not tally with average of 2-3 observed on randomly selected days.
4. MRI workload for the whole hospital is 8-10/day.
5. From 3 years data (page-27) average daily major operations were 14 only, which indicates inadequate clinical material.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (04.05.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at MGM Mission's Medical College, Navi Mumbai because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. S. Ashok Kumar has been appointed straightaway as Professor of Emergency Medicine from the post of Professor of Neuro Surgery without any teaching experience in Emergency Medicine.
2. Dr. Bhusare Dattatreya has been appointed straightaway as Asso. Prof. of Emergency Medicine from the post of Asso. Prof. of General Surgery without any teaching experience in Emergency Medicine. Further, he has been appointed as Asso. Prof. in Emergency Medicine after cut-off date without any research publications which is contrary to Regulations.
3. No faculty has postgraduate degree in Emergency Medicine or 2 years special training in Emergency Medicine. Hence, are not eligible for the posts they are holding.
4. Dr. Jyoti Sharma, Senior Residents does not possess experience of 3 years as Resident in Emergency Medicine before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
5. There is only 1 research publication from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
6. It is shown that ICCU, MICU, SICU, NICU, PICU, RICU as intensive care facilities for the department. It is not clear whether these are in addition to regular ICCU/ICUs managed by the parent departments or not. It is also not clear whether these intensive care areas shown to be available with Emergency Medicine are managed by faculty of Emergency Medicine or not.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**18. The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of MD(Anatomy) qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Chennai Medical College Hospital and research centre,Irungalur,Trichy.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28th April, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anatomy) qualification for 3 seats at Chennai Medical College Hospital and research centre,Irungalur,Trichy granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28th April, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Anatomy) qualification for 3 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Chennai Medical College Hospital and research centre,Irungalur,Trichy be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**19. Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences - Recognition of MD(T.B. & Respiratory Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (14.05.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(T.B. & Respiratory Medicine) qualification for 2 seats at Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati granted by Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14.05.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(T.B. & Respiratory Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by Srimanta Shankardeva

University of Health Sciences in respect of students being trained at Gauhati Medical College, Guwahati because of the following facts:-

1. None of three Senior Residents possesses 3 years experience as Resident in the subject of Tb & Chest before appointment as Senior Resident. All of them are M.D. (Medicine).
2. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 10,174 in 2013 to 10,012 in 2015.
3. DLCO is not available.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**21. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of MS (General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Government Vellore Medical College, Vellore.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS (General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats at Government Vellore Medical College, Vellore granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

1. Dr. K. Shantha Kumar has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however details of research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence, not eligible.
2. Promotion of Dr. R. Rajavelu, Associate Professor, Unit-3 is not as per Regulations. He was promoted Associate Professor on 27.03.2015 after the cut-off date without any publications. His publications quoted are all case reports which cannot be considered.
3. Dr. D. Loganathan, Unit IV, is shown as Asso. Prof. in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table; however, in the column of teaching experience, it is shown as Asst. Prof. from 01/08/2006 till date in various institutions. This is not feasible.
4. Details of research publications from the department in last 3 years are not provided.
5. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic, Plastic Surgery clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology clinic, Surgical Oncology clinic are not run.
6. Colonoscopy is not available.
7. Casualty: There are only 10 beds available against requirement of 20 required.
8. Total number of Minor operations has decreased from 1,213 in 2013 to 1,003 in 2015.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Senior Resident Unit-2 Dr. S. Eunice was absent on the date of assessment.
2. There is NIL research publication from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
3. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 2,43,667 in 2013 to 2,05,685 in 2015.
4. Workload of MRI for the whole hospital on day of assessment is only 01.
5. License for Blood Component Separation facility is not available. The college has given wrong information that they have blood component facility.
6. Equipment like Holter is not available.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Dr. C. Shanmugasekar has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of Publications", it is stated "No" implying there are no research publications against requirement of total 4 research publications; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. M. Kumaresan has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of Publications", it is stated "No" implying there are no research publications against requirement of total 4 research publications; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Dr. L. Sornakumar has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of Publications", it is stated "No" implying there are no research publications against requirement of total 4 research publications; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. Dr. S. Karthik Prabhu, Senior Resident, does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in the subject in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
5. No reference of any of the publications have been given which means no publications during last 3 years.
6. Faculty is not sufficient for 5 seats in one unit.
7. Total number of IPD patients has decreased from 3,689 in 2013 to 3,466 in 2015.
8. Workload of Skin Grafting procedures is only 15 & of Nail Surgeries only 14 in 2015.
9. On the day of inspection total MRI's in the entire hospital was 6 which indicate inadequate clinical material in the hospital.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. 1. Unit-2 and Unit-3 has only 2 faculty each. Hence, they cannot be considered as postgraduate units.
2. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 1,28,804 in 2013 to 1,15,173 in 2015.
3. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 9,250 in 2013 to 9,075 in 2015.
4. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (12/year), Clinical Seminars (10 in no.), Journal Clubs (12/year), Group Discussions (10 in no.) are inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. M.S. Abul Kasim & Dr. R. Sundarpandian, Senior Residents in Unit I do not possess 3 years experience as Resident in the subject before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
2. Dr. V. Chandrasekaran, Senior Resident in Unit II does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in the subject before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
3. Dr. A.J. Jesudoss, Senior Resident in Unit III does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in the subject before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
4. There is a deficiency of Senior Residents - 3.
5. There are only 5 specimens in the departmental museum.
6. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 37,840 in 2013 to 35,986 in 2015.
7. Total number of Histopathology samples sent is only 27 in 2015 which is grossly inadequate.
8. All publications cited in the list are case reports; resultantly there is NIL research publication from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
9. Teaching programme registers & Specialty clinic registers need to be maintained separately.
10. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (06 in no.), Journal Clubs (12/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated

21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28th April 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Kilpauk Medical College, Chennai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**28. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Renewal of recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification for 5 seats and DMRD qualification for 8 seats in respect of students being trained at Madras Medical College, Chennai.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (26.04.2016 & 27.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification for 5 seats and DMRD qualification for 8 seats at Madras Medical College, Chennai granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (26.04.2016 & 27.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification for 5 seats and DMRD qualification

for 8 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Madras Medical College, Chennai because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. S. Babupeter, Dr. D. Ramesh & Dr. S. Kalpana have been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however details of their research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether their promotions are as per Regulations or not. Checking from list of publications Dr. D. Ramesh. Prof. has only one article and Dr. S. Kalpana, Prof. has only 2 articles.
2. Dr. K. Geetha has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however details of her research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether her promotion is as per Regulations or not.
3. Promotion of Dr. G. Vijayalaxmi, Professor is not as per Regulations. She was promoted Professor on 01.04.2015 without any publications. All her publications quoted are review article and not research articles.
4. Dr. N. Mohanram, Dr. B. Natarajan, Dr. J. Dharmender, Dr. M.P. Balan, all Senior Residents, do not possess 3 years experience as Resident in the department before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 5 degree and 8 diploma seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**30. Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences - Recognition of MD(Radio-Therapy) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr. B. Borooah Cancer Institute(Regional Cancer Centre), Guwahati.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (12.05.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio-Therapy) qualification for 2 seats at Dr. B. Borooah Cancer Institute(Regional Cancer Centre), Guwahati granted by Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (12.05.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radio-Therapy) qualification for 2 seats granted by Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences in respect of students being trained at Dr. B. Borooah Cancer Institute(Regional Cancer Centre), Guwahati be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**31. The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai - Recognition of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Sree Mookambika Institute of Medical Sciences, Kanyakumari.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat at Sree Mookambika Institute of Medical Sciences, Kanyakumari granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS (Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sree Mookambika Institute of Medical Sciences, Kanyakumari because of the following facts:-

1. There are only 2 faculty in Unit II as shown in the faculty table; hence faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek

timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28th April, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 2 seats granted by North-Eastern Hill University in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. C. Daniala, Professor & HOD has been appointed as Asso. Prof. straightaway from the post of Senior Resident without any experience as Asst. Prof. which is contrary to Regulations.
2. Dr. Pranjal Phukan has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 2 years as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 4 years; further although he has been promoted after cut-off date; in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No". Details of research publications are not provided in the faculty table. Hence he cannot be considered as his promotion is contrary to Regulations.
3. In the list of publications at item § 7 in summary, publications of individual faculty have been listed; however it is not clear how many publications are there from the department of the institute which is the information which needs to be provided.
4. Shortage of Senior Residents: 2.
5. Workload of CT guided FNAC is only 76 in 2015 implying daily average of 0.25.
6. Total number of X-rays has decreased from 53,618 in 2013 to 48,107 in 2015.
7. DSA is not available.
8. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (07 in no.) is inadequate.
9. 2 seats were permitted in 2010 why recognition has not been got done till date.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central



Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (20th & 21st May, 2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(ENT) and DLO qualifications for 1 seat each granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. A.C. Poday, Senior Resident, does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in medical college affiliated hospital; hence not eligible to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the only Unit.
2. Number of Major Operations in 2015 is 602 implying daily average of 2.00 which is inadequate.
3. Total workload of Laryngectomy is only 03 in last 3 years & of Laryngo/Tracheoplasty is 07 during the same period.
4. From 3 years data average daily minor operations less than 1, which is inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat each for degree and diploma till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19.05.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 4 seats granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society (Deemed University), Kolhapur in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**35. Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth (Deemed University) Pimpri, Pune - Renewal of recognition of DGO qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Padmashree Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23.05.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DGO qualification for 3 seats at Padmashree Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune granted by Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth (Deemed University) Pimpri, Pune.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23.05.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of DGO qualification for 3 seats granted by Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth (Deemed University) Pimpri, Pune in respect of students being trained at Padmashree Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. S. Kavalagi & Dr. A. Gosavi, both Senior Residents, Unit IV do not have 3 years experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
2. There was only 01 death out of 10631 admissions which means no serious patients or complicated delivery patients were admitted without which the training of postgraduate students will be inadequate.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical

Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Charan Singh University in respect of students being trained at Saraswati Institute of Medical Sciences, Hapur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**37. H. N. B Garhwal University, Uttarakhand - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun.**

1. Promotion of Associate Prof. Unit-I Dr. M. Sujatha is not as per Regulations. She was Asstt. Prof. for 3 years and has no publications. Hence, not eligible. There is no other Associate Prof. in Unit-I.
2. Dr. Sheba, Unit III has been shown as "Asso. Prof." in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table; however, in the column of "Teaching experience", her experience is shown as "Asst. Prof." from 25/03/1999 till date. This discrepancy needs to be clarified.
3. Gynaecological workload has decreased gradually as is evident by reduction in number of Histopathological specimens sent from the department.
4. There is NIL Laparoscopic Surgery after 17/06/2015 - i.e. for 11 months. From 30/08/2014 till date only 2 Laparoscopic Surgeries have been performed.

5. Specialty clinic like Gynaec Endocrine clinic, Menopausal clinic, Postnatal clinic are not run.
6. Prenatal Diagnosis services, IUI & ART facilities are not available.
7. Out of 15 publications cited in the list, 9 are case reports. All the remaining 6 have been published in non O.G. journals.
8. There was NIL Major & NIL Minor Obstetric operation on day of assessment.
9. LEEP is not available. Endoscope is not in working order presently.
10. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (12/year) is inadequate.
11. Faculty table is not signed by any faculty member.
12. Only two Major cases and one minor case was done on the day of inspection. On random checking there was no major cases and 6 minor cases on 05.03.2016. On 16.12.2015 there were only one major gynaecology case and two minor cases.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Prof. after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "-" implying there are NIL publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.

2. CT Scan is 4 slice against requirement of 16 slice.
3. DSA is not yet installed.
4. There are no publications from the department during last 3 years. No full reference of any of the 6 publications quoted has been given (no author's name, no year, no volume and page of the journal).
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Dr. Tushar Prabha, Dr. Jai Choudhary, both Senior Residents with DNB qualifications do not possess 3 years experience as Resident in medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
2. Resultantly, shortage of Senior Residents: 2.
3. 600 mA X-ray machine with IITV was under installation.
4. Workload of CT guided procedures like FNAC is only 1/month & of DSA is only 1/month which is grossly inadequate.
5. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (12/year), Case Presentations (16/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Prof.: 1 & the Unit cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 1,327 in 2013 to 1,021 in 2015.
3. Chronic Psychiatric care facility is not available.
4. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (12/year), Journal Clubs (14/year), Case Presentations (06 in no.), Group Discussions (04 in no.) are inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Dr. Madhav Kamath K. has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table it is stated "No" implying there are NIL publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations. His earlier promotion at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore is also not as per Regulations as he was promoted with experience of only 4 years 9

months as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 y. Hence he cannot be considered.

2. Resultantly there is no Asso. Prof. in Unit I; faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. The institution is paying stipend to the postgraduate students @ Rs. 25,000/- per month and they have also stated that same is the rate in Govt. Medical Colleges which is not correct. The stipend paid to postgraduate students in Govt. Medical Colleges is Rs.30,000/-; Rs. 35,000/- and Rs.40,000/- per month to 1<sup>st</sup> year, 2<sup>nd</sup> year and 3<sup>rd</sup> year students respectively. This amount to providing misleading information by the institution and matter be referred to Ethics Committee.
4. PICU has only 04 beds against requirement of 5.
5. Specialty clinics like Paediatric Cardiology clinic, Paediatric Gastroenterology clinic are not run. Details of Paediatric Haematology clinic like Timings & average number of cases attending it are not provided.
6. HIV related services are not provided.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 3 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Promotion of Prof. Girish B.S. is not as per Regulations. She was promoted as Prof. on 27.01.2014 after the cut-off date without any publications which is not as per Regulations.

2. Dr. H. Sripathi, Professor has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of Publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No". The details of publications are not given in the faculty table. Hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
3. The institution is paying stipend to the postgraduate students @ Rs. 25,000/- per month and they have also stated that same is the rate in Govt. Medical Colleges which is not correct. The stipend paid to postgraduate students in Govt. Medical Colleges is Rs.30,000/-; Rs. 35,000/- and Rs.40,000/- per month to 1<sup>st</sup> year, 2<sup>nd</sup> year and 3<sup>rd</sup> year students respectively. This amount to providing misleading information by the institution and matter be referred to Ethics Committee.
4. Total number of IPD patients has decreased from 2,395 in 2013 to 2,336 in 2015.
5. Workload of Skin Grafting procedures is only 34 & of Nail Surgeries only 37 in 2015.
6. Total workload of all LASER procedures is 132 in 2015 implying daily average of 0.44.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. The institution is paying stipend to the postgraduate students @ Rs. 25,000/- per month and they have also stated that same is the rate in Govt.

Medical Colleges which is not correct. The stipend paid to postgraduate students in Govt. Medical Colleges is Rs.30,000/-; Rs. 35,000/- and Rs.40,000/- per month to 1<sup>st</sup> year, 2<sup>nd</sup> year and 3<sup>rd</sup> year students respectively. This amount to providing misleading information by the institution and matter be referred to Ethics Committee.

2. Workload of BERA is only 39 in 2015.
3. There is data mismatch in number of procedures as shown for different years & total of these years in item § 11 in Part II as under:

4. Frequency of Specialty clinic like Cancer related clinic is only once a month which is inadequate.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (04.05.2016 for Degree and 05.05.2016 for Diploma) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 05 seats and DCH qualification for 03 seats granted by Manipal University, Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore because of the following facts:-

1. Case taking & clinical examination of patients is poor.
2. Overall standard of M.D examination was observed to be sub-standard.
3. Assessor was denied access to log books of PGs initially; on insistence, when given to him, these log books showed repeated & umpteen instances of caution & warning by HOD to improve clinical skills, unsatisfactory clinical work.
4. Departmental Library is obsolete with outdated textbooks & NIL journals.
5. Demonstration Rooms were being used for other purposes than PG teaching.
6. There was no co-operation from college or hospital authorities.
7. Separate data of clinical material in 2 hospitals - i.e. own & Govt. - are not given.
8. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (19/year) is inadequate.
9. Log book of postgraduate students had unsatisfactory remarks from the HOD.
10. Bed occupancy on the day of assessment in PICU was 73.7% and in NICU was 70.8% which is less than the required.
11. There is no dialysis facility in the department.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 5 degree and 3 diploma seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Promotion of Dr. Shraddha Shetty K, Assoc. Prof. Unit-C is not as per Regulations. She was Asstt. Prof. for 3 years 11 month against the requirement of 5 years.
2. Promotion of Dr. Supriya K., Assoc. Prof. Unit-I is not as per Regulations. She was promoted on 01.02.2015 after the cut-off date without any publications. In the 2 publications quoted author's names are not given.
3. Dr. Anupama Suresh Y, Assoc.Prof. Unit-II is DNB. No information is provided whether she passed from teaching or non-teaching institution without which her eligibility cannot be decided.
4. Dr. Sharan J. Pal has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of Publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No". Details of his research publications are not given in the faculty table. Hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
5. There is no Senior Resident in Unit II.
6. Separate data of clinical material in 2 hospitals - i.e. own & Govt. - are not given.
7. There were NIL Major & Minor Gynaecological operations on day of assessment. The column of Major & Minor Gynaecological operations on 3 randomly selected days has been left blank.
8. ART services are not available.
9. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (20/year), Journal Clubs (09 in no.) are inadequate.
10. On the day of assessment there were 11 MRIs in the entire hospital in a college of 250 undergraduate seats which is grossly inadequate.
11. Average bed occupancy in NICU was 70.8% which is less than the required.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 10 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Promotion of Dr. Shibumon M.M., Assoc.Prof. Unit-I is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 4 years and promoted Associate Prof. on 04.09.2014. In the 2 publications quoted no author's names have been given.
2. Promotion of Dr. Poornachandra Thejeswi, Assoc.Prof. Unit-2 is not as per Regulations. She was Asstt. Prof. for 4 years 10 months. In the 2 publications quoted there are no author's names given.
3. Promotion of Dr. Rahul R. Bhat, Assoc. Prof. Unit-2 is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 4 years. In the 2 publications no author's names have been given.
4. Promotion of Dr. Sunil Kumar Shetty, Assoc. Prof. Unit-F is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 4 years. No full reference of 2 publications quoted has been given.
5. Dr. Anand Kini U has been shown as Prof. from 07.11.1987 to 01.06.2008 and then he has been shown Asstt. Prof. from 2008 to 2012 in the same college which does not seem to be plausible.
6. MRI workload for the whole hospital on day of assessment till 2 p.m. is shown as 226 which is not feasible.
7. As the institute has 8 Units, total faculty required is 24 (@ 3/Unit for PG Unit); however total 21 faculty are available (10 Professors, 8 Asso. Prof., 3 Asst. Prof.). Resultantly, Deficiency of faculty for UG + PG: (a) Asst. Prof.: 3.
8. Units D, E, F have only 2 faculty each; hence faculty complement is incomplete for PG & they cannot be considered as PG Units.
9. Separate data of clinical material in 2 hospitals - i.e. own & Govt. - are not given.
10. Specialty clinics like Surgical Gastroenterology clinic, Surgical Oncology clinic not run.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 08 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Promotion of Dr. Atmananda S. Hegde is not as per Regulations. He was promoted Associate Prof. on 19.02.2015 without any publications which is not as per Regulations. There is no other Assoc. Prof. in Unit-2.
2. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 09 on day of assessment in a college of 250 UG seats.
3. There is no proper signage of Unitwise distribution of beds.
4. Separate data of clinical material in 2 hospitals - i.e. own & Govt. - are not given.
5. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (09 in no.), Clinical Seminars (16/year), Journal Clubs (08 in no.), Group Discussions (09 in no.) are inadequate.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 06 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23.06.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Paediatics) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Konaseema Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Foundation, Amalapuram because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. G. Ramesh is not as per Regulations. He was promoted Assoc. Prof. on 04.02.2016 after the cut-off date without any publications. 2 publications quoted are in internet journals which cannot be considered.
2. Promotion of Dr. Garuda Rama is not as per Regulations. She was promoted Professor on 01.06.2015 without any publications which is not as per Regulations.
3. Dr. Ch. Vishnu Murthi and SAVM Subha Raju, Senior Residents are not eligible since they do not have 3 years experience as Junior Residents in a Medical College at the time of appointment as Senior Residents.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Dr. Kiran Aggarwal, Professor has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 1 year 10 months as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Sharda Patra, Professor has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years 3 months as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Pikee Saxena, Professor has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 1 year as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.

5. Workload of Brachytherapy is only 15/year.
6. Academic parameter like Clinical Seminars (19/year) is inadequate.
7. There is not Senior Resident in the Department.
8. On inspection day total MRI in entire Hospital were only 8, which is inadequate.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Details of Dr. Kalpesh Makwana, Senior Resident in Unit I like Educational Qualification, previous experience, etc. are not provided in the faculty table.
2. Details of Dr. Namrata Parmar, Asst. Prof. in Unit II like Educational Qualification, previous experience, etc. are not provided in the faculty table. She is not shown to have joined.
3. Dr. Manish Patel, Senior Resident, Unit III does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in the subject before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
4. Qualification of Senior Resident in Unit-I is not given the Faculty Table.
5. Faculty Table not signed by the any faculty member.
6. One External Examiner is from the same State.
7. Academic parameters like Journal Clubs (20/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
8. Inspection day MRI: 8 in entire hospital, which indicate inadequate clinical material.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Professor: 1.

Dr. Rajiv G.K., Senior Resident has been shown working as Tutor / JR from 23/04/2014 to 23/04/2015 in the faculty table; however he is also shown working as Senior Resident from 24/04/2014 till date which is not feasible and needs to be investigated; as he does not have 3 years experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident, he is not eligible to hold the post.

6. Dr. Mala Punjani, Senior Residents in Unit III does not possess any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident against requirement of 3 years; hence not qualified to hold the post.
7. Dr. B.J. Parmar has been shown as Assoc. Professor in column of Designation and Asst. Professor in column of Experience, which is not feasible. No other Assoc. Professor in Unit-III.
8. Equipment like Upper GI Endoscope, Dialysis machines, Bronchoscope are not available in the department.
9. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 06 & CT Scan workload is only 04 on day of assessment.
10. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (20/year) is inadequate.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Workload of Skin grafting procedures, LASER procedures & Nail surgeries is NIL in 2015.
6. Equipment for LASER procedures are not available.
7. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (03 in no.), Case Presentations (08 in no.), Group Discussions (07 in no.) are inadequate.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Workload of Laryngectomy, Laryngo/Tracheoplasty, Maxillectomy is NIL during last 3 years.
4. From average of 3 years Data average daily Major Operations are less than 2, which are inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Promotion of Dr. Vivek Rawal, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years 2 months. For one of the two publications acceptance letter attached. However, it is stated in the acceptance letter that the article will be published in November, 2015, which has not yet been published. Hence, it cannot be considered.
3. Only one External Examiner is from Outside State.

4. Cases pertaining to clinical Forensic Medicine like age estimation, examination of victims/accused of sexual offences, etc. are not being done in the department.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

He was promoted Professor on 29/08/2013 after cut-off date without any publications.
2. Dr. Vivek K. Dey has been promoted as Professor on 22/02/2016 after cut-off date; however, the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank. No details of research publications have been provided in the faculty table; hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
3. Workload of the following procedures is inadequate :

6. OPD attendance is only 98 on day of assessment which is less than minimum required even to start PG course.
7. MRI is not available.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12/12/2014) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 03/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch.(CTVS) qualification against increased intake from 02(Two) to 04(Four) seats granted by Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, New Delhi in respect of students being trained at Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research, Dr. R. M. L. Hospital, New Delhi because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency about promotion of Dr. V.K. Gupta, Professor & HoD stays as such. Experience details of Dr. V.K. Gupta are reproduced (Photocopy enclosed) (Report 12/12/2014) below:

Primarily it is observed that from 1991 to 1995 he is shown to have worked at two places Govt. Medical College, Miraj and Shivaji University, Kolhapur, which is not feasible. Moreover, Shivaji University, Kolhapur is only an affiliating university and not a hospital.

His designation at Miraj is shown as Reader/ Professor, which is not feasible. He cannot be holding two designations, simultaneously.

Amendment dated 16/03/2016 in MCI Regulations vide which doctors working in RML Hospital and Safdarjung Hospital were given equated teaching designations is reproduced below:

*"(d) Consultants of specialists who have the experience of working for a period of not less than 18 years and 10 years in the teaching and other general departments in the institution or hospitals, not attached to any medical college, where with the affiliation from any university, postgraduate teaching is being imparted as contemplated under sub-regulation (1A) of regulation 8, shall respectively be eligible to be equated as Professor and Associate Professor in the department concerned. The requisite experience for equating a Consultant or Specialist working in the super-speciality department of the said institution or hospitals as Professor and Associate Professor shall respectively be 16 years and 8 years. Consultants or specialists having postgraduate degree qualification, working in such an institution or hospital, who do not have the said period of experience, shall be eligible to be equated as Assistant Professor in the department concerned."*

*The following proviso has been included to clause 11.1(d) in terms of Notification published in the Gazette of India on 17th November, 2009.*

*"Provided that such conferment of the nomenclature of the designation/status of postgraduate medical teachers shall be awarded only to those many number of consultants in the concerned hospital/institution so as to fulfil the minimum*

*requirement for imparting Postgraduate Medical Education to the sanctioned annual intake of the respective Govt. Hospital/Institute”.*

From the amendment it is more than clear that those Doctors who were working in teaching or other general departments in Institutions or Hospital not attached to any Medical College, where with the affiliation from any University Postgraduate teaching is being imparted shall be eligible to be equated as Professor and Assoc. Professor in the department concerned.

It will be pertinent to mention here that this amendment was introduced to provide faculty to VMMC, New Delhi to which Safdarjung Hospital was attached. The two hospitals covered in this amendment were Safdarjung Hospital and RML Hospital, New Delhi, which were not attached to any Medical College but P.G. Teaching was going on with affiliation from Delhi University.

Other Hospitals mentioned by Dr. V.K. Gupta were not covered under this clause. They are covered under normal MCI Regulations and Medical College, Miraj does not have department of CTVS. The letter of the Dean & Principal, Government Medical College, Miraj dated 11/08/2015 has mentioned that there was no teaching or servicing department of CTVS at GMC, Miraj. Hence, the experience claimed by Dr. V.K. Gupta is not as per MCI Regulations. Dr. V.K. Gupta is said to have worked in Wanless Hospital, which is a Private Hospital and MCI does not count experience gained at private hospitals. Dr. V.K. Gupta joined RML Hospital in 1998 and he is entitled to be given equated teaching designation of Professor on completion of 16 years service i.e. in 2014 (as per notification reproduced above) and not in 2005.

This Postgraduate Medical Education Committee has adjudicated the eligibility of Dr. V.K. Gupta strictly on the basis of prevailing Regulations.

**100. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Thrissur.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20/06/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (December, 2015) and compliance dated 03/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 04 seats at Government Medical College, Thrissur granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20/06/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (December, 2015) and compliance dated 03/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(DVL) qualification for 04 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Thrissur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.



**101. The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai - Renewal of recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at K A P Viswanathan Government Medical College, Trichy.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 4 seats at K A P Viswanathan Government Medical College, Trichy granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 4 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at K A P Viswanathan Government Medical College, Trichy because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. K. Nawasivam, Assoc. Professor, Unit-IV promoted on 05/03/2015 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations. Unit-IV left with 2 Asst. Professor.
2. Dr. P.V. Krishnan, Assoc. Professor, Unit-V promoted on 05/01/2016 after the cut-off date without any publication, which is not as per Regulations. Unit left with 2 Asst. Professor.
3. Dr. S. Kadasamy, Assoc. Professor, Unit-VI promoted on 10/09/2014 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per Regulations. Unit left with one Asst. Professor.
4. Dr. M. Raja, Assoc. Professor, Unit-I promoted on 24/03/2016 after the cut-off date without any publication, which is not as per Regulations.
5. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 10 on day of assessment.
6. Specialty clinics like Endocrine clinic, Haematology clinic, Gastroenterology clinic are not run.
7. Only 2 recent books have been purchased in last 3 years in the Departmental Library.
8. Faculty Table not signed by any faculty.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**102. Increase of seats in MD(General Medicine) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.**

Read: the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 13/05/2016, application dated 04/04/2016 for increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) from 4 to 9 seats for the year 2017-18 received through the Central Government letter dated 12/04/2016 and Council Assessor's Report dated 14/07/2016 on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 13/05/2016, application dated 04/04/2016 for increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) from 4 to 9 seats for the year 2017-18 received through the Central Government letter dated 12/04/2016 and Council Assessor's Report dated 14/07/2016 on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune and noted the following:

1. Consent of affiliation of MUHS is for Academic year 2016-2017 while application is to be considered for Academic year 2017-2018 as per orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court.
2. Dr. S.S. Karne has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however out of 5 publications cited in the list of publications, 4 are case reports & cannot be accepted; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
3. Resultantly, there are only 2 faculty in Unit V & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Dr. Dilip Kadam, Senior Resident has only 9 months experience as Resident in medical college affiliated teaching hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
5. Dr. Pankaj Agarwal, Senior Resident has only 11 month experience as Resident in medical college affiliated teaching hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
6. Dr. Aditya Bari, Senior Resident has no experience as Resident in medical college affiliated teaching hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
7. Dr. Shweta Deshmukh, Senior Resident has only 9 months experience as Resident in medical college affiliated teaching hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
8. Dr. Surya Vanshi, Asst. Professor and Dr. Nitin Hiranman, Asst. Professor are DNB from non-teaching Institution. They have no post DNB teaching experience. Hence, not eligible. Unit-III left with only 2 faculty.
9. Promotion of Professor D.D. Munde is not as per Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 6 months and Assoc. Professor for 3 years 1 month. He was promoted on 04/02/2016 after the cut-off date. Out of 5 publications quoted, those at Sr. No. 1, 2, 4 & 5 are review articles (not research articles) and cannot be considered.
10. Dr. Shilpa Shule, Asst. Professor is DNB from non-teaching Institution. Hence, not eligible to be appointed Senior Resident in 2013 and subsequently Asst. Professor in 2015 because she has no teaching experience in a Medical College. Unit-V left with 2 Faculty.
11. There was no central registration for OPD for the hospital.
12. There was no USG done since 27/06/2016 in the hospital as PNDT registration expired on 26/06/2016 & it has not been renewed.
13. There were NIL new admissions during morning round of wards on day of assessment.

14. There were only 2 patients in Casualty at time of taking round.
15. Patients like Pleural Effusion, Gastroenteritis with no available reports were admitted in isolation ward.
16. Casualty Attendance on inspection day: Medicine-1 and Entire Hospital-11, which is grossly inadequate.
17. On inspection day MRI in entire Hospital-7; CT Scan-9; USG-Nil; USG guided FNAC-Nil; Histopath-Nil and FNAC-Nil. It indicate grossly inadequate clinical material and OPD/ IPD figures are not genuine.
18. Average Blood used in entire Hospital - 12 units per day, which is inadequate.
19. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in MD(General Medicine) course at Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and General Hospital, Pune, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

3. MRI workload from the department was NIL on day of assessment.
4. Total workload of Laryngo/Tracheoplasty is only 04, Maxillectomy only 04, Angiofibroma only 04 & of Laryngectomy only 07 during the period of last 3 years.
5. CPC is not held.
6. Casualty Attendance: Total - 37; ENT - Nil (College has said (NA), which is incorrect. Many patients of ENT like Epistaxis, Quinsy, Maggots come through casualty.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Following Senior Resident are not eligible for reasons given against their names:
  - a. Dr. Gangarade Sharad Kumar - DNB from non-teaching. No 3 years experience as Junior Resident.

- b. Dr. Shobhit Chandra – No 3 years experience as Junior Resident in a Medical College.
  - c. Dr. Pankaj Kama – No DNB Degree available.
  - d. Dr. Murtaza Sambal Raturi – Absent.
2. Deficiency of Senior Resident: 1.
  3. DSA is not available.
  4. Workload of CT guided FNAC is very low – only 47 in 2015 implying daily average of 0.16.
  5. Radiological investigation workload on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days is not provided.
  6. Hospital works as fully paid hospital like any corporate hospital. No free beds.
  7. Academics need strengthening.
  8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (16th July 2016) together with the order dated 02/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (16th July 2016) together with the order dated 02/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and noted the following:

1. Promotion of Dr. Rajeev Acharya, Professor is not as per Regulations. He was classified Specialist for 3 years 3 months against the requirement of 4 years when promoted Assoc. Professor. He was Assoc. Professor for 3 years 11 month against the requirement of 4 years when promoted Professor. There are no publications to his credit.
2. Promotion of Dr. Neeta Bansal is not as per Regulations. She has been promoted Professor on 01/08/2015 after cut-off date. Only 3 publications (against required 4) and out of 3 one is in Internet Journal, which cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Shweta Jain does not have 3 years experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
4. There was only 1 Normal Delivery & 1 Caesarean Section on day of assessment.
5. There was only 1 Obstetric Minor operation on day of assessment.

6. There were only 2 Gynaec Major & only 1 Gynaec Minor operation on day of assessment.
7. Separate Obstetric ICU/HDU is not available.
8. ART services are not available.
9. Total number of patients admitted last year were 5243 and total no. of Major Operations + Minor Operations (excluding Day Care Operations) + Deliveries & Caesarean Section were 7430, which is not feasible. Data is non-genuine.
10. Blood Units used in entire Hospital on inspection day: 8.
11. Following clinics are not held:
  - a. High Risk Pregnancy Clinic.
  - b. Post Natal Clinic
  - c. Cancer Clinic
  - d. Gynaec Endocrine Clinic
  - e. Menopausal Clinic
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

**110. Increase of seats in MS(Orthopaedics) course at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H. N. B Garhwal University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (16th July 2016) together with the order dated 02/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (16th July 2016) together with the order dated 02/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and noted the following:

1. Dr. M.M. Nagar, Asso. Prof. has not produced relieving order from the previous institute at the time of joining this institute; hence he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Mohit Dhingra, Asst. Prof. was not able to provide any appropriate address proof; he cannot be considered.
3. There is no Asso. Prof. in Unit I headed by Dr. Puneet Gupta, HOD; hence faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Dr. K.K. Garg, Senior Resident, has experience of only 2 years as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
5. Dr. Navneet Badoni promoted Professor on 19/03/2016. No Journal Name of the 4 publications quoted have been given. They seem to be in Internet Journal.
6. There were only 3 Minor operations on day of assessment.



7. Inspection day OPD - 111 is just sufficient to start the course.
8. Casualty Attendance: Total Hospital - 12; Orthopaedics - 2, which is grossly inadequate.
9. Blood Units used: Entire Hospital - 12; Orthopaedics - Nil, which indicate that no serious trauma patients are admitted.
10. There is decline in IPD from 2014 to 2015 (2195 to 2187).
11. Decline in Minor Operations from 2014 to 2015 (2495 to 2275).
12. Total number of Day Care Operations: Nil.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) together with the order dated 02/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and noted the following:

1. Promotion of Dr. Girish Gupta, Professor is not as per Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 3 years. His 2 years period at PGI, Chandigarh cannot be counted because he was a P.G. Student in Neonatology during this period. Unit has no other Professor or Assoc. Professor.
2. Dr. Shruti Kumar passed DNB from non-teaching institution. She has no post DNB experience at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor.
3. Inspection day OPD: 112 is just sufficient to start the course.
4. On inspection day only 6 plain X-Rays from department of Paediatrics, which indicate inadequate clinical material.
5. On Inspection day: Blood Units used Nil in Paediatrics department.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee also noted that the applicant has made an application for increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course for the academic year 2017-18. Considering the fact that the Hon'ble Supreme Court has directed that application of 2016-17 be considered for academic year 2017-18 and that the application for 2017-18 has been received, the above Assessment Report was considered in respect of both the applications.
