1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 19/01/2016 were read out and confirmed in the meeting itself.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

3. Starting of MD(Anatomy) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18th January 2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra

under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for Starting of MD(Anatomy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th January 2016) and noted the following:-

1. Appointment orders of Tutors are either as Medical Officers or as Junior Residents but not as Tutors; hence they cannot be considered as Tutors.
2. There is no Special Laboratory for Immunology & Embryology. In the laboratory designated as Genetics Laboratory, there is only a room with no equipment.
3. Equipment like Microscope with camera, Digital Image Analyzer are not available.
4. There are no foreign journals of Anatomy.
5. Dr.Anant Dattatray Dhanwate was promoted Assoc. Professor on 4.9.2015 after the cut-off date without any publication, which is not as per Regulations. Hence he cannot be considered.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for starting of MD(Anatomy) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

4. Starting of MD(Biochemistry) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18th January 2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for Starting of MD(Biochemistry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th January 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Starting of MD(Biochemistry) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

5. Starting of MS(ENT) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18th January 2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for Starting of MS(ENT) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th January 2016) and noted the following :-

1. PG degree of Dr. R.M. Chaurpagar is not recognized.
2. Three years' experience as Resident in a medical college is not shown for both the Senior Residents.
3. MRI is not available.

4. Audiometrist is also working as Speech therapist & BERA Technician.
5. Daily average of Major operations is only 2.
6. Bed occupancy is 73 % on day of assessment.
7. Speech & Voice Analysis services are not provided.
8. Microdebrider, Nerve Stimulator / Monitor are not available.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for starting of MS(ENT) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

6. Starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course at Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of Medical Sciences, Maduranthagam, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 - consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (04th November 2015) and compliance dated 31/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of Medical Sciences, Maduranthagam, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai for Starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (04th November 2015) and compliance dated 31/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:-

1. Data mismatch – same IP number patients has undergone multiple times minor procedure which was counted by computer. Major and minor surgeries are added together, hence deficiency pointed out stays as such.
3. Prof. R. Annamalai was promoted on 11.4.2015 after the cut off date without any publication which is not as per Regulations, hence he cannot be considered.
4. Prof. S.Ambalagan was promoted on 30.10.2015 after the cut-off date without any publications which is not as per Regulations. Resultantly, Unit-2 is left with 2 Asstt. Profs. only. Hence it cannot be considered as PG teaching unit.
5. Dr.P.A. Kathiravan is shown as Sr. Resident as well as Jr.Resident both which is not feasible.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course at Karpaga Vinayaga Institute of Medical Sciences, Maduranthagam, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

7. Starting of MS (OBG) course at Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar under Siksha "O" Anusandhan University Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 - consideration of fresh assessment report.

Read: the Fresh Assessment Report (11/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (10/09/2015 and 05/12/2015) and compliance dated 13/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar under Siksha "O" Anusandhan University Bhubaneswar for Starting of MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Fresh Assessment Report (11/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (10/09/2015 and 05/12/2015) and compliance dated 13/11/2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:-

1. Bed occupancy is 60 % on day of assessment.
2. There are only 2 Minor operations on day of assessment.
3. Deficiency of Residents: (a) Junior Residents: 2.
4. There were many admissions with trivial complaints.
5. In Obstetrics ward, there was no Ante-natal patient. A few admissions were done for "Postpartum Weakness". There 6 cases of Infertility who had undergone IVF & Embryo transfer. 5 of them were being kept unnecessarily – embryo transfer was done in December 2015.
6. There is only 1 Maternal death implying serious Obstetrics cases are less.
7. Obstetric OPD is only 37 on day of assessment.
8. Prenatal diagnosis services are not available.
9. Monitoring equipment are inadequate.
10. Dr. Suba Nanda Nayak promoted on 13.11.2015 after the cut-off date without any publication which is not permissible.
11. Dr. Babita Panda, Professor promoted after 3 years period as Assoc. Prof. against the requirement of 4 years. She has only one publication.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Dr.Arpit M.Patel and Dr.Imran Vaza, Sr.Residents are not eligible to be appointed because they have no three years experience as junior resident at the time of appointment. Resultantly, Unit-2 & 3 has no Sr.Residents.
4. Total number of patients admitted (IPD) is almost equal to total number of major operation last year which is not feasible.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. Dr. B.S. Dhaliwal, Senior Resident in Unit I has not signed faculty table on day of assessment.
8. Unit 3 has only 2 faculty; hence cannot be considered as PG Unit.
9. Resultantly, there is no Unit which can qualify as a PG Unit.
10. Promotion of Nitin Bansal, Assoc. Prof. is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for four years against the requirement of five years. No full reference (no author name) of two publications cited has been given.
11. College got LOP in July, 2006. Dr. Rajender Kumar, Assoc. Prof. has been given experience from 11th July, 2005 which is not permissible. Resultantly, his promotion is not as per Regulations (He was Asstt. Prof. for four years seven months against the requirement of five years).
12. Promotion of Dr. Parminder Singh Kolar, Assoc. Prof. Unit-3 is not as per Regulations, He was Asstt. Prof. for four years four months against the requirement of five years and promoted on 7.12.2015 after the cut-off date. One out of two publications cited was published in 2016 outside his promotion period. Resultantly, Unit – 3 is left with one faculty.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. There is no sanctioned post of Tutor in the department.
5. RHTC is not under control of Dean. It is at a distance of 32.2 km. It is not residential. Paramedical staff as per Regulations is not available. Building is very old & in dangerous stage.
6. UHC is not under control of Dean. It is not residential. Paramedical staff as per Regulations is not available. Building is very old & in dangerous stage.
7. There is no vehicle for RHTC/UHC.
8. PG Research laboratory is ill equipped.
9. Emergency OT & Dressing room are non-functional and seem to be never used.
10. Central Research Laboratory has no special equipment.
11. CSSD is in most unsterilized area, in highly pathetic state with trolley, empty buckets, useless equipment dumped here and there. NO SOPs are followed.
12. Central O₂ and Central Suction are not functional in Casualty.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

6. Unit 4 is actually ICCU & Kidney Unit; it is not a regular Unit. It is headed by Asst. Prof. & has only 1 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit at all.
7. Resultantly, there is no Unit which qualifies as PG Unit.
8. MRI is not available.
9. Specialized Services & Equipment are not adequate. No Monitors or Defibrillators are available.
10. Specialty clinic like Gastroenterology clinic is not run.
11. Endoscopy is shared with General Surgery department. Bronchoscopy is shared with Tb & Chest department..

12. Equipment like Upper GI Endoscope, Colonoscope are not available.
13. Bed separation in the ward is inadequate & not uniform.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for starting of MD(General Medicine) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

31. Starting of various postgraduate courses at Jorhat Medical College & Hospital, Jorhat, Assam for the Academic year 2016-17 u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956

Read: the request dated 21/01/2016 for extension of time period for 15 days to submit the compliance report received from the Principal I/c cum Chief Superintendent, Jorhat Medical College for Starting of various postgraduate courses at Jorhat Medical College & Hospital, Jorhat, Assam for the Academic year 2016-17 u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the request dated 21/01/2016 for extension of time period for 15 days to submit the compliance report received from the Principal I/c cum Chief Superintendent, Jorhat Medical College for Starting of various postgraduate courses at Jorhat Medical College & Hospital, Jorhat, Assam for the Academic year 2016-17 u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956 and members of PG Committee observed that period of extension requested by institute for submission of compliance falls beyond 31/01/2016 which is the last date prescribed under the Regulations for sending recommendations to the Central Govt. It was also observed that time schedule, being Statutory, is mandatory & binding in character and is required to be followed by all authorities.

1. Mridul Dhar & Anr. vs. Union of India (2005) 2 SCC 65

The Hon'ble Supreme Court through its judgment in Mridul Dhar & Anr. vs. Union of India (2005) 2 SCC 65 case had also issued directions for strict compliance with the time schedule fixed for establishing a new medical / dental college and/or for starting new or higher medical / dental courses in it, right from the process of receiving of applications u/s 10A by the Central Govt. for opening of a new medical college to that of various stages of establishment thereof including annual renewals. The relevant portion of the directions of the Hon'ble Apex Court are given hereunder:

“.....35. Having regard to the professional courses into consideration, it deserves to be emphasized that all concerned including Governments, State and Central both, MCI/DCI, colleges, new or old, students, Boards, universities, examining authorities etc. are required to strictly adhere to time schedule wherever provided for; there should not be mid-stream admission; admission should not be in excess of sanctioned intake capacity or in excess of quota of any one, whether State or Management. The carrying forward of any unfilled seats of one academic year to next academic year is also not permissible.....”

.....Having regard to the aforesaid, we issue the following directions:-

1-11.....

12. The time schedule for grant of admission to postgraduate courses shall also be adhered to.

13. For granting admission, the merit determined by competitive examination shall not be tinkered with by making a provision like grant of marks by mode by interview or any other mode.

14. Time schedule for establishment of new college or to increase intake in existing college, shall be adhered to strictly by all concerned.

15. Time schedule provided in Regulations shall be strictly adhered to by all concerned failing which defaulting party would be liable to be personally proceeded with.....”

2. Priya Gupta vs. State of Chattisgarh (2012) 7 SCC 433

Further, the Hon'ble Apex Court vide its judgment dated 8.05.2012 in Priya Gupta vs. State of Chattisgarh (2012) 7 SCC 433 has held that every person, officer or authority who disobey or fails to strictly comply with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court shall be liable under the provisions of Contempt of Court Act. The relevant portion of the judgment is reproduced here that the:-

“.....46. Now, let us examine the adverse consequences of non-adherence to the prescribed schedules. The schedules prescribed have the force of law, in as much as they form part of the judgments of this Court, which are the declared law of the land in terms of Article 141 of the Constitution of India and form part of the regulations of the Medical Council of India, which also have the force of law and are binding on all concerned. It is difficult to comprehend that any authority can have the discretion to alter these schedules to suit a given situation, whether such authority is the Medical Council of India, the Government of India, State Government, University or the selection bodies constituted at the college level for allotment of seats by way of counseling. We have no hesitation in clearly declaring that none of these authorities are vested with the power of relaxing, varying or disturbing the time schedule, or the procedures of admission, as provided in the judgments of this Court and the Medical Council of India Regulations. Inter alia, the disadvantages are:-

1. Delay and unauthorized extension of schedules defeat the principle of admission on merit, especially in relation to preferential choice of colleges and courses. Magnanimity in this respect, by condoning delayed admission, need not be shown by the Courts as it would clearly be at the cost of more meritorious students. The principle of merit cannot be so blatantly compromised. This was also affirmed by this Court in the case of Muskan Dogra & Ors. v. State of Punjab & Ors. [(2005) 9 SCC 186].
2. Mid-stream admissions are being permitted under the garb of extended counseling or by extension of periods for admission which, again, is impermissible.
3. The delay in adherence to the schedule, delay in the commencement of courses etc., encourage lowering of the standards of education in the Medical/Dental Colleges by shortening the duration of the academic courses and promoting the chances of arbitrary and less meritorious admissions.

4.....

47. All these directions shall be complied with by all concerned, including Union of India, Medical Council of India, Dental Council of India, State Governments, Universities and medical and dental colleges and the management of the respective universities or dental and medical colleges. Any default in compliance with these conditions or attempt to overreach these directions shall, without fail, invite the following consequences and penal actions:-

47.1 Everybody, officer or authority who disobeys or avoids or fails to strictly comply with these directions stricto sensu shall be liable for action under the provisions of the Contempt of Courts Act. Liberty is granted to any interested party to take out the contempt proceedings before the High Court having jurisdiction over such Institution/State, etc.

47.2 The person, member or authority found responsible for any violation shall be departmentally proceeded against and punished in accordance with the Rules. We make it clear that violation of these directions or overreaching them by any process shall tantamount to indiscipline, insubordination, misconduct and being unworthy of becoming a public servant.

47.3. Such defaulting authority, member or body shall also be liable for action by and personal liability to third parties who might have suffered losses as a result of such default.

47.4.....”

In view of above, the committee decided that it would not be possible to accept the request for grant of 15 days time to submit the compliance and hence, the earlier decision of the committee is reiterated to return the applications to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of scheme.

Hence, not considered. There is no other Associate Prof. or Professor in Unit-III. Hence, this cannot be considered a PG Unit.
3. In spite of yearly contract appointment now it is made till further orders which cannot be accepted.
4. 251 samples were sent for Histopathology in 2015 which means less than one sample per day. Deficiencies remains as such.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Resultantly, there are only 2 Professors and no Associate Professor. Hence, there is deficiency of 1(One) Associate Professor for Unit-II.

3. Five Associate Professors shown as full time are paid salary in the range of Rs. 20,000 – Rs. 28,000 p.m. which is too low. They may be only part time which is not permissible.
4. Out of 5 Asst. Prof. shown as full time in the department, only 1 is paid salary of Rs. 1,04,800 p.m.; the rest are paid salary in the range of Rs. 18,000 – Rs. 21,000 p.m. which is too low. They may be only part time which is not permissible.
5. There is no space in OPD for Specialty clinics.
6. Dr. A.V. Nehete, Senior Resident in Unit I and Dr. P.P. Bhatt, Senior Resident in Unit III do not possess experience as Junior Resident of 3 years in a medical college; hence not qualified for the post.
7. None of the Senior Resident is eligible because they do not have 3 years experience as Junior Resident at the time of appointment. Resultantly, there is deficiency of 4- Senior Residents.
8. Faculty table is not signed by faculty members.
9. Promotion of Dr. Khemchandra D. Borole, Associate Professor, Unit-1 is not as per Regulations. He was Assistant Professor for 4 years 3 months against the requirement of 5 years without any publication. Out of the 3 publications quoted two are case reports and one is review article.
10. There is great disparity in the salary paid to faculty members. Some of the Asstt. Professors are paid four times the salary of their Professor. This raises strong suspicion about their full time regular appointment. Hence this discrepancy cannot be accepted. The Details in this regard given below:-

3. Bed occupancy in O.G. was 40 % and Surgery including Urology & Neurosurgery was 40-50 % and also in Orthopaedics at 40 – 50 %.
4. O.T. list in Gynaecology O.T. showed 5 patients; but none of the patients was in preoperative room or O.T. or ward. Rather, one patient by name of Jaswinder was lying in preoperative ward whose name was not in the list.
5. On enquiring about O.G. surgeries done on previous day, emergency & elective surgery registers showed 3 patients – Satwant for Retained Placenta, Harpreet for LSCS & Amarjeet for LSCS. None of these patients could be located in postoperative ward neither in Gynaecology nor in Obstetrics.
6. One patient by name of Basant Kaur was stated to be Post Hysterectomy patient but she was healthy & apparently no Surgery was done on her; simply dressing was applied on lower abdomen. Matter may be referred to Ethics Section.
7. A third register was produced which had entries of all those patients who were shown on O.T. lists of 14th January (i.e. day prior to assessment) and also had entries of all patients who were listed on O.T. lists of 15th January (i.e. day of assessment) and were shown as operated at that hour of day – i.e. 11 a.m.

14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

8. Dr. Vaishali Kotambkar, Associate Professor promoted on 23.06.2015 after the cut of date without any publications which is not as per Regulations.
9. Dr. Pravin Sapkal is shown as Associate Prof. as well as Asstt. Prof. both which is not feasible.
10. Faculty table is signed only by 2 persons and no other faculty member signed the faculty table.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

10. Biometric attendance extract was not provided to the assessors despite asking.
11. Photocopies of publications were not provided.

4. Dr. A. Sarkar has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 y 11 m as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 y. Both the publications of which the benefit is given are case reports; hence cannot be considered; resultantly his promotion is not as per Regulations.
5. Beds occupied in SICU on day of assessment are not given.
6. In this report, it is shown that SICU is with Anaesthesiology department; however in the report of General Surgery, it is shown that SICU is with General Surgery department.
7. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (04 in no.) is inadequate.
8. Museum is not upto the mark.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/01/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (04th November 2015) and compliance dated 31/12/2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:-

1. 21 patients were stated to be examined before 10:00 a.m. on day of assessment. On further enquiry it was told that all patients were sent for USG. On physical verification only 1 patient was there for antenatal USG. In OPD till 11:30 a.m., only 4 antenatal patients, 13 postnatal patients & 13 Gynaecological patients were there. Hence there is gross discrepancy in data supplied & physical verification.
2. Not a single patient was admitted till 11:30 a.m. either in Obstetrics or in Gynaecology.
3. There were only 2 Major operations & NIL Daycare operations on day of assessment.
4. With regard to major Surgeries, on physical verification, it was found that Unruptured Ectopic Pregnancy managed conservatively was shown as Major Surgery; In fact it is not a Surgery at all. It is medical management. Internal Iliac Ligation was shown as another major Surgery; in fact it was not a separate Surgery but carried out with LSCS. B lynch was shown as part of major Surgery; it was also carried out with LSCS. Physical verification of record did not show any Obstetric Hysterectomy. Not a single Laparotomy or PPH was found. All these facts imply that there is no improvement in Major Obstetric operations.

5. Infertility clinic was very dirty; it was not cleaned up. It seems that it is run occasionally.
6. There was only 1 patient posted for elective LSCS on day of assessment. There was no emergency LSCS. Random checking of record showed that there were only 5 LSCS from 04/01/2016 to 18/01/2016.
7. There was not a single case of Eclampsia in 2015. There was no patient of PIH on day of assessment.
8. There was not a single patient of in Obstetric postoperative ward of Forceps or vacuum delivery. There was discrepancy in records of O.G. register & Anaesthesia register.
9. Only 1 patient for labour was admitted in HDU. Remaining patients were such who can be managed as outpatients.
10. There was no maternal mortality in 2015 & in 2016 upto 18/01/2016, implying high risk patients are not catered to, indicating poor teaching material.
11. Total number of blood units supplied is 09/day. Daily average consumption of O.G. department is shown as 3-4 in 2015, implying 33-45 % of total blood consumption of the entire hospital which is not feasible,
12. With regard to USG, PNDT records are not properly maintained. These forms were not filled in 3 copies & patients' consent was not taken. Total USG in January 2016 upto date of assessment (i.e. 17 days) was only 46 implying daily average of < 3.
13. It was observed that patients were kept in ward for 8 days waiting for report of D & C and still report was not available. Explanation of institute regarding data mismatch in IPD & operative data is not tenable.
14. No separate USG machine or Endoscopy is available for O.G. department.
15. There was discrepancy in TDS Form 16 supplied by institute & Form 16 downloaded from TRACES website. In majority of faculty, total salary paid was more in Form 16 supplied by college than downloaded from TRACES.
16. NO MTP is carried out as per record.
17. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (22nd January 2016) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Maharashtra Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Latur, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for Increase of seats in MS(ENT) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (22nd January 2016) and noted the following:-

1. There were only 2 Major & 4 Minor operations on day of assessment.
2. Total number of Major operations in 2015 were only 520 implying daily average of 1.73 which is inadequate.
3. Total number of Minor operations in 2015 were only 410 implying daily average of 1.37 which is inadequate.
4. Staff & facilities in Central research Laboratory are inadequate.
5. Workload of BERA was NIL on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days. It was only 26 in 2015 which is grossly inadequate.
6. Operation like Laryngo\Tracheoplasty has not been performed.
7. Speech & Voice Analysis services are not available.
8. Equipment like OAE, Nerve Stimulator / Monitor are not available.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the scheme for increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at Maharashtra Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Latur, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

81. Increase of seats in MD (Geriatrics) Course from 1 to 3 seats at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the Academic Year 2016-17.

Read: the E-mail dated 27th January 2016 received from Seshadri Mandalam with regard to application for Increase of seats in MD (Geriatrics) course for 1 to 3 seats at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the Academic Year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the E-mail dated 27th January 2016 received from Seshadri Mandalam with regard to application for Increase of seats in MD (Geriatrics) course for 1 to 3 seats at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the Academic Year 2016-17 and decided to agree with the opinion of the Law officer and wait for decision of the Hon'ble High Court of Madras (even after the last date of sending the recommendations to Central Govt. i.e. 31st of January, 2016).

82. Starting of MD (Family Medicine) Course for 4 seats at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the Academic Year 2016-17.

Read: the E-mail dated 27th January 2016 received from Seshadri Mandalam with regard to Starting of MD (Family Medicine) course for 4 seats at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the Academic Year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the E-mail dated 27th January 2016 received from Seshadri Mandalam with regard to Starting of MD (Family Medicine) course for 4 seats at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the Academic Year 2016-17 and decided to agree with the opinion of the Law officer and wait for decision of the Hon'ble High Court of Madras (even after the last date of sending the recommendations to Central Govt. i.e. 31st of January, 2016).

83. Starting of MD(Psychiatry) course at Mysore Medical College and Research Institute, Mysore for the academic year 2016-17 – hearing granted to medical colleges where MCI has recommended for disapproval of the scheme.

Read: The matter along with Central Govt. letter dated: 28/01/2016 for review of applications for Starting of MD(Psychiatry) course at Mysore Medical College and Research Institute, Mysore for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter along with Central Govt. letter dated: 28/01/2016 for review of application for Starting of MD(Psychiatry) course at Mysore Medical College and Research Institute, Mysore for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956 and noted that the institute had not submitted the Consent of Affiliation for the academic year 2016-17 neither with the application nor after the request of the Council vide letter dated : 11/09/2015. The Consent of Affiliation dated: 25/04/2015 for the academic year 2016-17 now forwarded by the Central Govt. vide letter dated: 28/01/2016 and received in Council office on 29/01/2016 cannot be accepted/considered at this stage, since, the last date of sending the recommendations of MCI to the Central Govt. is 31st January 2016 (only 2 days left i.e. Saturday & Sunday).

In view of above, the committee decided to reiterate the earlier decision of the Council office to return the application.

84. Starting of various courses at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17

Read: The matter along with legal opinion received from the Additional Solicitor General of India dated: 28/01/2016 for starting of various courses at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter along with legal opinion received from the Additional Solicitor General of India dated: 28/01/2016 for starting of various courses at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 along with the following observations made by it while considering the assessment reports of the said college in its previous meeting dated: 19/01/2016:

“ ...

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that Dr. Rajeev Kumar Agarwal has submitted experience certificate dated 30/05/2007 of Meenakshi Medical College, Hospital & Research Institute, Kancheepuram. However, in response to Council letter dated 19/01/2016, the Meenakshi Academy has stated that it is not a valid certificate issued by their office and has also informed that Dr. Rajeev Kumar Agarwal, M.S. has never worked at Meenakshi Medical College, Hospital & Research Institute, Kancheepuram, till date. This clearly shows that such certificate has been forged. He has also appeared in pre-pg assessment carried out by the Council on 23rd & 24th July, 2015 and compliance verification assessment carried out on 31/08/2015 and submitted the same documents during these assessments.

The Council office has vide letter dated 05/01/2016 sought confirmation regarding issuance of certificate dated 05/11/2008 bearing reference no. SMCH/2008/327 regarding the work of Dr. Chandra Prakash Singh on the post of Asst. Professor in the department of Orthopaedics in Santosh Medical College & Hospital, Ghaziabad from 05/06/2006 to 30/09/2008. The College authorities have vide their letter dated 05/01/2016 stated that this certificate has not been issued by their institution and that Dr. Chandra Prakash Singh has worked as

Senior Resident in Orthopaedics from 01/08/2006 to 16/11/2007 and as Asst. Professor from 17/11/2007 to 30/09/2008.

The Council office has vide letter dated 05/01/2016 sought confirmation regarding issuance of certificate dated 25/02/2010 bearing reference no. F2() Estt./Gaz/10/331 regarding the experience of Dr. P.K. Vasishtha in the department of Orthopaedics in Government Medical College, Kota as Asst. Professor from 09/07/1980 to 18/04/1986; Assoc. Professor from 19/04/1986 to 27/02/2003 and Professor from 28/02/2003 to 31/12/2009. The College authorities have vide their letter dated 05/01/2016 confirmed the experience of Dr. P.K. Vasistha. However, it has been noted that the Government Medical College, Kota has been established only in 1992. On seeking further confirmation from the Government Medical College, Kota vide letter dated 06/01/2016, the college authorities vide their letter dated 18/01/2016 submitted as under:

"In continuation of this office letter no. 13 Dated: 05-01-2016 it is certified that on the basis of record available Dr. P.K. Vasistha, Retired Professor in Orthopedic of this college had worked in the following capacity:-

01.	Assistant Professor - (RNT Medical College Udaipur)	09-07-1980 to	18-04-1986
02.	Associate Professor - (Dr. S.N. Medical College Jodhpur)	19-04-1986 to	27-09-1987
03.	Associate Professor - (RNT Medical College Udaipur)	28-09-1987 to	19-10-1993
04.	Associate Professor - (Medical College Kota)	20-10-1993 to	27-02-2003
05.	Professor - (J.L.N. Medical College Ajmer)	28-02-2003 to	20-02-2004
06.	Professor - (Medical College Kota)"	21-02-2004 to	31-12-2009

The above shows that he never worked as Asst. Professor at Government Medical College, Kota. Further, Dr. P.K. Vasistha also appeared in pre-pg assessment carried out by the Council on 23rd & 24th July, 2015 and submitted the same documents during this assessment."

The Committee also noted that the legal opinion had been sought on this issue in its earlier meeting dated 19/01/2016 and now the opinion of learned ASG, Sh. Tushar Mehta has been received, which is as under:-

" ...

1. The Querist – Medical Council of India has sought my opinion in the case of Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh with regard to starting of Postgraduate courses in the various specialties from the academic year 2016-17 under Section 10A of the IMC Act, 1956. In the case of the applicant medical college, the querist while considering the case of the applicant medical college for starting various Postgraduate courses, has found that certain faculty members have been employed by the applicant medical college with fake / forged experienced certificates.
2. The issues which is required to be considered is as to whether in view of the faculty members employed by the applicant medical college with fake / forged experienced certificates, the querist could invoke Regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 in the light of judgment dated 29.09.2015 passed by the Hon'ble Delhi High Court in the W.P. (C) No. 7106 of 2015- Malla Reddy Institute of Medical Sciences & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr.
3. I have gone through the relevant documents of the case and have discussed the matter with the advocates for the querist. Before giving any specific opinion in the matter it is appropriate to consider Regulations 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 the relevant portion of the same is reproduced hereunder :-

"

8(3) (1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document :

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

.....”

4. Regulations 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, deals with the situation where a medical college had tried to play fraud with the Council by submitting fake / forged documents in relation to teaching faculty. The conduct of a medical college plays a vital role while evaluating the applications of the medical college for grant of permission for starting various medicine courses as well as increase of seats. The above mentioned Regulations categorically provides that, if during an inspection, a medical college is found to have employed teaching faculty with fake / forged documents or had submitted false Declaration Forms, the Council must take a serious view of the conduct of the medical college. In such a situation the medical college will not be considered for grant of permission for the two academic sessions.
5. The Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgment dated 06.09.2013 in the case of **Rohilkhand Medical College & Hospital, Bareilly Versus Medical Council of India & Another** – (2013) 15 SCC 516, has categorically held that MCI can take action under Regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations if prima facie it is established that fake teachers were shown by the College to seek permission from MCI. The relevant portion of the said judgment is quoted as under :-

“.....**30.** We have now to examine the legality of decision of the MCI taken on 13.07.2013 in the light of the above factual and legal scenario. We have already indicated that when sanction –was accorded on 20.06.2013 it was categorically stated by the MCI that the same was accorded subject to certain conditions. It was stated therein that in case false/wrong declaration or fabricated documents have been used for procuring permission of the Board of Governors of the increased intake and if said misconduct was brought to the notice or comes to the knowledge of the MCI, at any stage during the current academic year (2013-14) institution/college would not be liable to be considered for renewal of the permission against increased intake for the next academic year and that renewal of permission against the increased intake for the academic year 2013-14 and for the next academic year and the same would be liable to be revoked.

31. Having received the letter of the CBI as well as the charge-sheet the impugned order dated 13.07.2013 was issued by the MCI revoking the letter of permission granted for the academic year 2013-14.

32. We are of the view that the above decision taken by the MCI is in accordance with the Establishment of Medical Colleges Regulations (Amendment 2010 Part II). The above-mentioned Regulations was issued by the MCI in exercise of its powers under Section 33 of the IMC Act, 1956 with the previous sanction of the Central Government. Clause 8.3 of the Regulations deals with the Grant of Permissions, sub-clause 8(3)(1)(d) deals with the colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked/forged documents. Those provisions are extracted herein below:

“8(3)(1)(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked/forged documents:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked/forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of

permission /recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree/processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

However, the office of the Council shall ensure that such inspections are not carried out at least 3 days before upto 3 days after important religious and festival holidays declared by the Central/State Government.”

...

35. The Council s are governed by Establishment of Medical Colleges, Regulations, (Amendment), 2010 (Part II), especially clause 8(3)(1)(d), in the event of which, when MIC finds that the college has employed fake/forged documents for renewal of – permission/recognition for processing applications etc., that institute will not be able to be considered for renewal of permission/ recognition for award of MBBS Degree/ processing the application for post-graduate courses for two academic years i.e. that academic year and the next academic year. In this case, CBI letter was received on 11.07.2013 by the MCI and it was placed before the Board of Governors on 12.07.2013 and the revocation order was passed on 13.07.2013 revoking the renewal of permission for the 2nd batch of students against the increased intake from 100 to 150 students for the academic year 2013-14.

36. We are of the considered view that the MCI need not wait till the culmination of the trail initiated on the basis of the charge-sheet filed by the CBI. The investigation by a premier agency like the CBI has prima facie revealed that the college has used fake and forged materials to get sanction for the intake for the year 2008-09, in our view, that is sufficient for the MCI to take action in accordance with the Regulations 8(3)(1)(d) of Regulations 2013.....”

6. As per Regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, if it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with fake / forged documents and that the institute has submitted Declaration Forms of such a teacher, then the institution will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of MBBS degree and the processing of applications for Postgraduate courses for two academic years including the present academic year and the next academic year.
7. As pointed out above, the conduct of the medical colleges plays a vital role in the maintaining the standard of medical education in the Country so as to ensure that the students undergoing medical course get best of teaching & training in their medical colleges, in this regard the querist has amended its Regulations from time to time to ensure that the medical college fulfils the minimum requirement for running the various medicine courses. If during the courses of consideration of application submitted by a medical college, it is found that the medical college had at any stage tried to conceal material facts or has misrepresented or created any fake / forged documents including experience certificates / declaration forms in order to procure positive recommendation from the querist so as to obtain permission from the Central Government, the same cannot be taken lightly as any relaxation in aspect of the concealment, misrepresentation or creation of fake / forged documents will encourage other similarly placed institutions to indulge such malpractices.
8. It is noted that certain the provisions of the Establishment of Medical College, 1999 which had been introduced vide amendment dated : 16.04.2010 i.e. Regulations 8(3)(1)(a), 8(3)(1)(b), 8(3)(1)(c) & 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 were challenged before the Hon'ble Delhi High Court by way of W.P. (C) No. 7106 of 2015- Malla Reddy Institute of Medical Sciences & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. And W.P. (C) No. 8541 of 2015- Lord Buddha Siksha Pratisthan & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr., wherein the Hon'ble Delhi High Court after considering various aspects of the medical education was pleased to uphold the aforesaid Regulations however had observed that an opportunity should be given to the college to rectify the deficiencies. The relevant portion of the judgment dated 29.09.2015 passed in

W.P. (C) No. 7106 of 2015- Malla Reddy Institute of Medical Sciences & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. And W.P. (C) No. 8541 of 2015- Lord Buddha Siksha Pratisthan & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. Is reproduced hereunder:-

“

48. In the light of the above discussion, we are of the view that it is mandatory to provide to the applicant/institute concerned an opportunity to rectify the defects/deficiencies specified by MCI even in cases which fall within the ambit of the provisos (a) to (d) to Regulations 8(3)(1) of the Regulations.

49. It may be added that in fact, the contention of the MCI that the provisos (a) to (d) carves out an exception to the power of the Central Government to provide an opportunity and time to the applicant to rectify the deficiencies and thus in cases where the said provisos are invoked, no opportunity need be given to the applicant is based on an erroneous interpretation of Regulation 8(3)(1) of the Regulations.

50. On a careful reading of Regulation 8(3)(1), it appears to us that what is provided thereunder is grant of permission to establish a medical college initially for a period of one year and the renewal of the same on yearly basis subject to verification of the achievements of annual targets prescribed by MCI under Regulation 8(2). It is no doubt true that Regulation 8(3)(1) also states that “the Central Government may at any stage convey the deficiencies to the applicant and provide him an opportunity and time to rectify the deficiencies”. However, the contention of MCI that by virtue of the provisos (a) to (d), an exception has been carved out to the power conferred on the Central Government to provide an opportunity and time to the applicant to rectify the deficiencies, is fallacious. We are afraid that this is not the import of Regulation 8(3)(1). According to us, the provisos (a) to (d) which imposed a bar on grant of renewal in the circumstances specified therein would only work as an exception to the main part of Regulation 8(3)(1) specifying the process of renewal of permission on yearly basis but W.P. (C) 7106/2015 & W.P.(C) 8541/2015 Page 43 of 43 not to the requirement of providing opportunity to rectify the deficiencies.

51. Therefore, we are of the view that it is not open to MCI and/or Central Government to deny an opportunity to the applicant/institute concerned to rectify the deficiencies specified by MCI even in cases which fall within the ambit of the provisos (a) to (d) of Regulation 8(3)(1) of the Regulations. However, it is essential for both MCI and Central Government to observe the time schedule as held in Royal Medical Trust (supra).

52. For the aforesaid reasons, we hold that the provisos (a) to (d) to Regulation 8(3)(1) of the Regulations shall not in any way circumvent the opportunity of being heard/opportunity to rectify the deficiencies provided under sub-Sections (3) and (4) of Section 10-A of the Medical Council Act. However, the same shall be in strict adherence to the time Schedule fixed in the Regulations and in conformity with the Schedule as laid down in Royal Medical Trust (supra).

.....”

9. I have been informed that the querist has approached the Hon'ble Supreme Court by way of SLP(C) No. 30142/2015 against above judgment dated : 29.09.2015 passed by the Hon'ble Delhi High Court wherein Hon'ble Apex Court vide its order dated : 06/11/2015 was pleased to issue notice and the same is pending adjudication.
10. In the present case the querist has found three faculty member of the applicant medical college with faked/forged experience certificates. The medical college has also submitted Declaration Forms of these faculty members endorsing that the principal/Dean/head of the Department has verified the faculty member's credentials including the experience certificate and had satisfied themselves with the said experience certificates thus it is evident that the institution was trying to play fraud with the querist. These faculty members were presented by the medical college initially during the pre-postgraduate inspection of the medical

college, thereafter during the inspection for the MBBS course and finally during the inspection conducted for start of various postgraduate courses. It is seriously doubtful whether fake/forged documents can fall within “defect” or “deficiency”.

11. The querist after considering assessment report of the postgraduate course had initially found the college to have fulfilled the requirements for grant of permissions to start two Postgraduate courses being MS(Ophthalmology) & MD(Radio-Diagnosis) and the querist has recommended to the Central Govt. to grant the permission to start the aforesaid postgraduate courses from the academic year 2016-17.
12. Whereas in the other 8 postgraduate specialties for which applications had been received from the applicant medical college, the querist has found various deficiencies in infrastructure, teaching faculty, clinical material and other physical facilities to be existing the applicant college. In any case what is also required to be considered by the querist in the present opinion is as to what action is to be taken against the medical college which has indulged in submitting fake/fabricated documents.
13. In the present case the experience certificate of three faculty members were found to be fake/fabricated which was been confirmed in response to the clarification sought from the institutions from where the teaching experience was shown. The applicant medical college has also endorsed the Declaration Forms of these faculty members which means that the applicant medical college was hand in glove with the faculty members in order to secure permission for starting various Postgraduate courses.
14. In light of above, I am of the opinion that such malpractices like creating and using fabricated documents cannot be condoned or ignored by the querist since these institution will ultimately produce half-baked doctors who will serious harm to the society. Therefore, in order to set an example to other colleges not to indulge in such malpractices, I am of the considered opinion that the querist may consider invoking Regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical Regulation, 1999 in the case of applicant medical college for misleading the querist as well as Central Government by creating and using fake/forged documents including experience certificate as well as submitting false Declaration Forms in this regard. It is also open to the querist to withdraw the positive recommendation in respect of two postgraduate courses as had been sent earlier to the Central Govt.”

The Postgraduate Committee decided to accept the above opinion and decided to withdraw the recommendations made for issue of LOP to Central Govt. for starting of MD(Radio-Diagnosis) & MS(Ophthalmology) vide letter dated : 27/10/2015 and further decided to debar the college for starting/increase of seats in respect of any postgraduate courses for 2(Two) academic years i.e. 2016-17 & 2017-18 as mandated by Clause 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment Medical College Regulation 1999. The Postgraduate committee also decided to refer the misdemeanor committed of the college by producing false declaration forms to the Executive Committee and Ethics Committee for appropriate decision at their end.

85. Application for Starting/Increase in seats of various PG Courses at Tagore Medical College and Hospital, Chennai, Tamilnadu for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956 - Hearing granted by Central Govt. medical Colleges where MCI has recommended for disapproval of the scheme..

Read : The matter along with Central Govt. letter dated : 08/12/2015 for review of applications for Starting/Increase in seats of various PG Courses at Tagore Medical College and Hospital, Chennai, Tamilnadu for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter along with Central Govt. letter dated : 08/12/2015 for review of applications for Starting/Increase in seats of various PG Courses at Tagore Medical College and Hospital, Chennai, Tamilnadu for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956 and decided to ratify the action taken by the office to reiterate the earlier decision of the committee to disapprove and return the applications.

86. Starting of/Increase of in various Postgraduate Courses in respect of various medical college for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956

Read: The matter along with the Central Govt., Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi vide letters dated 27/11/2015, 08/12/2015, 23/12/2016, 13/01/2016, 21/01/2016 & 28/01/2016 with regard to grant of hearing to the authorities/representatives of the various medical colleges and based on the compliance submitted by the college authorities in support of their claim the committee recommended for review of the scheme.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter along with Central Govt. letter dated : dated 27/11/2015, 08/12/2015, 23/12/2016, 13/01/2016, 21/01/2016 & 28/01/2016 and noted that the action has already been taken on the concerned matters and communicated to the concerned quarters and no further action is required in this regard.

The minutes of this meeting were read and confirmed in the meeting itself.

The meeting was planned for 29th & 30th January, 2016. Accordingly, the notice was sent. The deliberations on all items were concluded on 29th January, 2016 itself. Hence, there is no need to continue the meeting on 30th January, 2016.

Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
