Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

14. Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu - Renewal of recognition of DCH qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (25.04.2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DCH qualification for 2 seats at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi granted by Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (25.04.2017) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of DCH qualification for 2 seats granted by Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu in respect of students being trained at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

15. North-Eastern Hill University - Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28.04.2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong granted by North-Eastern Hill University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28.04.2017) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD/MS(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats granted by North-Eastern Hill University in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

16. Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University) - Recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (29.04.2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (29.04.2017) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

17. Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University) - Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (2nd May, 2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (2nd May, 2017) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Radhika S, Sr. Resident, is not eligible. She was Jr. Resident for 1 year. Tutor is not a designation in Radio-diagnosis Department. Hence, she cannot be considered. Resultantly, there is a deficiency of Sr. Resident -1.
2. DSA is not available in the department.
3. Bed Occupancy in General Medicine, General Surgery & O.G. was 41 % on day of assessment.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 4 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no

compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

18. North-Eastern Hill University - Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28.04.2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 2 seats at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong granted by North-Eastern Hill University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28.04.2017) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD/MS(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 2 seats granted by North-Eastern Hill University in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty : (a) Assoc.Prof. -2, & Asst.Prof. -1.
2. Promotion of Dr. Nari Maru Lyngdoh, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. She was Asst.Prof. for 4 years and 6 months against the requirement of 5 years. She has no publications.
3. In 2012, 2014 & 2015, the college has admitted 4 students per year. However, they have Letter of Permission only for 2 students.
4. Total number of minor operation during the last 3 years were 170 in 2014, 220 in 2015 and 277 in 2016, which means less than 1 per day which is grossly inadequate.
5. Total number of Major Operations for the whole hospital on assessment day was only 10, average of randomly selected days is only 09, which is inadequate.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

19. North-Eastern Hill University - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (29.04.2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 2 seats at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong granted by North-Eastern Hill University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (05.05.2017) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by JSS University, Mysore in respect of students being trained at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. P. Akkamahadevi is appointed as Professor of Emergency Medicine from the post of Professor of Anaesthesia without any experience in Emergency Medicine.
2. Dr. R. Sridhar, Senior Resident does not have any experience as Resident in Emergency Medicine before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post. There is no other eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
3. There is one Unit, 50 beds, out of these 20 are casualty beds and 30 are emergency medicine beds. Resultantly, casualty beds are inadequate for a college of 200 UG seats.
4. After merger of Casualty beds, it is managed by Emergency Medicine department which implies that there is no separate staff for Casualty.
5. There are only 2 publications from the department.
6. Period of training of Professor and HOD and Assoc.Prof. and other faculty is in their own department. During the period of training there was no other staff in the department. Hence, it is not understood under whom they have taken training and who was giving training when there was no other staff in department.

7. Madhu Srinivasarangan, Asst.Prof. is DNB from non-teaching hospital. He has no 3 years teaching experience in a medical college when appointed and hence not eligible.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Promotion of Dr. Albert Anil Kumar, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was Asst. Prof. for 4 years 11 months against the requirement of 5 years. He has no publication. There is no other Assoc.Prof. in the Department.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Ambala because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Manjeet Singh, Professor & HOD, is not as per regulations. He was Assoc.Prof. for 3 years against the requirement of 4 years. Out of 5 publications quoted, 3 are case reports and name of the journal is not given in one of them. Hence they cannot be considered.
2. Promotion of Dr. Rakesh K. Gautam, is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years. One of the 2 publications is case report, which cannot be considered.
3. Promotion of Dr. Harinder Singh Sandhu, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was Asst. Prof. for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years. He has no publications.
4. Promotion of Dr. Ashwani Ummat, Assoc.Prof. is the as per regulation. He was promoted on 01.05.2016 after the cut off date. 2 out of 3 publications cited are related to Obst. & Gynae. and not of Orthopaedics, which cannot be considered.
5. Promotion of Dr. Vivek Sharma, Professor. is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01.08.2016 after the cut-off date. 2 out of 4 publications are case report, which cannot be considered.
6. Dr. Sneh Prabhakar, Senior Resident, Unit III, is DNB from non-teaching hospital. He has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college when appointed as Sr. Resident. Hence, not eligible.

The eligibility required for Sr. Resident is as follows:-

- a) *Senior Resident : Senior Resident shall be a registered doctor who either has.*
 - i) *a recognized post graduate degree from a statutory university with 3 years experience of residency in the concerned speciality while pursuing degree course,*
 - or
 - ii) *a recognized postgraduate diploma from a statutory university in the concerned specialty with 2 years experience of residency in the concerned specialty while pursuing diploma course and 1 year residency experience in the concerned specialty obtained after acquiring the PG diploma or,*
 - iii) *A graduate doctor with recognized MBBS degree and registered in IMR who has got 3 (three) years experience as a resident doctor in the concerned speciality.*

7. Dr. Vikas Choudhary, Senior Resident has only 1 year experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.

Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Ambala because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Sanjeev Gupta, Professor & HOD is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, out of 4 publications cited in the list, 3 are Case Reports & 1 is a review article and one of them is in non-indexed journals, which cannot be considered; resultantly there is NIL research publication to his credit against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Aneet Mahendra is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, out of 4 publications cited in the list, 3 are Case Reports & 1 is a review article and

one of them is in non-indexed journal, which cannot be considered; resultantly there is NIL research publication to his credit against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.

1. Promotion of the Dr. Savita Kapila, Prof. is not as per regulations. She was Asst.Prof. for 3 years 2 months against the requirement of 5 years. She has no publication, which cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Praveen Gupta, Professor was not available on the day of assessment. Resultantly, there are only 2 faculty in Unit II & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Promotion of Dr. Sunita Gupta, Professor, is not as per regulations. She was Assoc.Prof. for 3 years against the requirement of 4 years. 3 out of 6 publications are case report and one in non-indexed journal, which cannot be considered.
4. Dr. Sant Ram Gupta, Senior Resident in Unit III does not have any experience as Junior Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 6(six) seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Many faculty members have not signed the faculty table.
2. Dr. Sumit Arora is promoted as Assoc. Prof. after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left blank implying NIL publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. The following were not available on the assessment day:-
 - (i) Dr. Vineet Dabas, Asst.Prof.

4. For 8 Units, total 24 faculty are required @ 3/PG Unit; however total 16 faculty are available; resultantly there is deficiency of faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 8.
5. Unit-wise distribution of faculty & Residents is not provided by the department.

6. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology clinic are not conducted.
7. Services like Upper GI Endoscopy, Colonoscopy are not provided by the department.
8. Total number patients in OPD has decreased from 1,37,783 to 1,28,576 during the period of preceding 3 years.
9. Total number patients in IPD has decreased from 10,372 to 9,812 during the period of preceding 3 years.
10. Details of Examiners appointed by the department are not provided.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

reports which cannot be considered. She is left with 2 publications against the required four.

2. Promotion of Dr. Arunkumar A, Prof., Unit-II, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01.09.2016, after the cut off date without any publication.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 04 to 05 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. Promotion of Dr. Hari Shanker Pandey, Assoc.Prof., is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. for 4 years 6 months against the requirement of 5 years. He has no publication.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

2. Promotion of Dr. A Siva Prasad, Assoc.Prof., is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 09.07.2016 after the cut-off date. In one of the two quoted publications he is not 1st & 2nd author. Resultantly, Unit-I has no other Assoc.Prof. and it cannot be considered a PG Unit.
3. Dr. B. Srinivas, Assoc.Prof. was not available on the day of assessment. Resultantly, Unit-II left with 2 faculty.
4. There is no Sr. Resident in the Department.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

3. Promotion of Dr. K.B. Rangaswamy, Prof. & Head, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 22.03.2014 after the cut off date. He has only 2 publications against the required 4.
4. Duration of DCH course is 2 years, Dr. Malini A.L., Sr. Resident has been shown to be working for 3 years during DCH course.
5. Promotion of Dr. T.S. Anand Kumar, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was Assoc.Professor for 3 years 8 months and promoted on 01.08.2015 after the cut off date. He has only 3 publications against the required 4.
6. In report dated 05.10.2015 in case of Dr. Manjesh T, Sr. Resident, no experience as Jr. Resident (at Tumkur) from 01.11.2011 to 16.12.2013 was shown. She was shown Sr. Resident there from 01.10.2011 to date, which has been changed to 16.12.2013 in the present report at Tumkur and she is shown JR. Resident from 02.01.2011 to 16.12.2013. Such retrospective changes to make the faculty eligible are not allowed.

3. Gp.Capt V Vasdev, Professor, passed MD(Medicine) in 2002, he cannot be Asst.Prof. in 2001. He was Assoc.Prof. for 2 years against the requirement of 4 years when promoted Professor. Hence, his promotion is not as per regulations.
4. Promotion of Dr.(Col.) G.D. Choudhury, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was never Asst.Professor and he cannot be straight away considered as Assoc.Professor. At SGPGI, Lucknow, he was a postdoctoral student and not Assoc.Prof.
5. Promotion of Dr. (Surg Capt) S Ranjan,, Assoc.Prof., is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. for 3 years 8 months against the requirement of 5 years when promoted Assoc.Prof. He has no publication.
6. Following faculty were not available on the assessment day.
 - (i) Dr. (Col.) S Viswanath, Assoc.Prof.
 - (ii) Dr. (Lt. Col.) Arun Hedge, Asst.Prof.
 - (iii) Dr. (Lt. Col.) M Manrai, Ast.Prof.

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

3. All Sr. Residents are MD(Paediatrics) they do not have 3 years experience as Jr. Resident when appointed as Sr. Resident.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

1. Promotion of Dr. Reshma Chavan, Assoc.Prof., is not as per regulations. She was promoted on 17.02.2016, all her publications are in institutional journal, which cannot be accepted.
2. Dr. Chandak R N., Sr. Resident, is not eligible. He has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a Medical College when appointed Sr. Resident.
3. Blood components separation facilities are not available, which is a statutory requirement for starting PG course.
4. Bed occupancy was 17.3% on the day of assessment, which is grossly inadequate.
5. There was nil major operation on the day of assessment.
6. BERA & OAE still not functional.
7. Facility for Hearing Aid Trails, Speech & Voice Analysis still not available.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

1. Average daily OPD is 45%, which is inadequate. There are 99 beds in 4 units against the required 120 beds. There is deficiency of 21 beds.
2. Out of 10 beds of SICU, only 1 was occupied by the deserving patient. Hence, occupancy was only 10%. All other patients there did not require stay in SICU.
3. None of the Sr. Residents have signed the faculty table which means there was no Sr. Resident on the day of the Assessment.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

There is no certificate from DGAFMS about his period and places of posting as Graded/Classified specialist and Advisor without which his eligibility cannot be decided. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015 & 04.04.2016 & 04.10.2016) and compliance dated 22.02.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 3 to 5 seats granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society Deemed University, Kolhapur in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

113. Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University (upto 2008) & Ayush and Health University (from 2009), Raipur - Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Pt. J N M Medical College, Raipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014, 23.07.2015 & 28.03.2016 & 06.10.2016) and compliance dated 23.02.2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification

against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats at Pt. J N M Medical College, Raipur granted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University (upto 2008) & Ayush and Health University (from 2009), Raipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014, 23.07.2015 & 28.03.2016 & 06.10.2016) and compliance dated 23.02.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats granted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University (upto 2008) & Ayush and Health University (from 2009), Raipur in respect of students being trained at Pt. J N M Medical College, Raipur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Abha Singh is Director Professor & Dean of the Institute, she cannot be holding both the post/designation simultaneously.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 02 to 05 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Medicine, AIMS, Kochi be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

115. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore-Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at SS Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015 & 17.03.2016 & 04.10.2016) and compliance dated 22.02.2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 03 seats at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015 & 17.03.2016 & 04.10.2016) and compliance dated 22.02.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 03 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

116. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualifications against increased intake from 3 to 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April,2015, 05.04.2016 & 27.10.2016) and compliance dated 20.02.2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualifications against increased intake from 3 to 4 seats at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April,2015, 05.04.2016 & 27.10.2016) and compliance dated 20.02.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualifications against increased intake from 3 to 4 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

117. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD (General Medicine) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Latur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013, 06.10.2015 & 24.11.2016) and compliance dated 22.02.2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (General Medicine) qualification for 04 seats at Govt. Medical College, Latur granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013, 06.10.2015 & 24.11.2016) and compliance dated 22.02.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (General Medicine) qualification for 04 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Latur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

118. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore-Recognition of M.Ch (Surgical Oncology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Vydehi Institute Of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015 & 17.10.2016) and compliance dated 03.03.2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch(Surgical Oncology) qualification for 02 seats at Vydehi Institute Of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015 & 17.10.2016) and compliance dated 03.03.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that M.Ch(Surgical Oncology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Vydehi Institute Of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

119. University of Delhi, Delhi - Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 06 seats and Renewal of recognition of DGO qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Hospital, New Delhi.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2013 & 26.09.2016) and compliance dated 02.03.2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 06 seats and Renewal of recognition of DGO qualification for 03 seats at Kasturba Hospital, New Delhi granted by University of Delhi, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2013 & 26.9.2016) and compliance dated 02.03.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 06 seats and not to renew recognition of DGO qualifications granted by University of Delhi, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Hospital, Delhi because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of the Dr. Sangita Ajmani, Professor, is not as per regulations. She was promoted on 26.07.2016 after the cut off date without any publication.
2. Dr. Sonia Miglani, Asst.Prof., is DNB from non-teaching hospital, she has no one year experience after DNB from teaching hospital/medical college when appointed as Senior Resident; hence not eligible.
3. Dr. Manju Arora, Assoc.Prof., is DNB from non-teaching hospital, she has no 1 year experience after DNB from teaching hospital/medical college when appointed as Senior Resident; hence not eligible.
4. There is no other Sr. Resident in any of the Unit.
5. Bed occupancy is 71%.
6. On the day of assessment number of deliveries and cesarean sections is not given.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 03 to 06 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Nephrology) qualification for 1 seat at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August,2016) and compliance dated 07.3.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Nephrology) qualification for 1 seat granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai because of the following facts:-

1. Faculty table not signed by any of the faculty members.
2. OPD twice a week. There is no OPD on the assessment day, hence assessment day clinical material not verified.
3. Deficiency of Dr. K.S. Mehta, HoD stays as such. She passed DNB from non-teaching hospital in 1997. She cannot be Lecturer, Sr. Lecturer/Assoc. Professor from 1988 to 1998. Resultantly, her promotion is not as per regulations. There is no other Professor in the Department.
4. Dr. Atim Pajai, Asst.Prof. was not available on the day of assessment.
5. There is no Sr. Resident in the Department.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Arun Singhal, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi with regard to Counselling by DGHS for all Medical Educational Institutions in a State, including those established by the Central Government be read as under:

"The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee approved the following substitution to be made in Regulation 9A of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000:

Clause 9A (2) shall be substituted as under:-

The Designated Authority for counselling for the 50% All India Quota seats of the contributing States, as per the existing scheme for Diploma and MD/MS courses shall be the Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India. Further, the Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India shall conduct counselling for all postgraduate courses [Diploma, MD/MS, DM/M.Ch] in Medical Educational Institutions of the Central Government, Universities established by an Act of Parliament and the Deemed Universities. Furthermore, the Directorate General of Health Services shall conduct the counselling for all Superspecialty courses (DM/M.Ch) in Medical Educational Institutions of the Central Government, Medical Educational Institutions of the State Government, Universities established by an Act of Parliament, Universities established by an Act of State/Union Territory Legislature, Medical Educational Institutions established by Municipal Bodies, Trust, Society, Company or Minority Institutions.

Clause 9A (3), shall be substituted as under:-

The counselling for admission to Diploma and MD/MS in all Medical Educational Institutions in a State/Union Territory, including, Medical Educational Institutions established by the State Government, University established by an Act of State/Union Territory Legislature, Municipal Bodies Trust, Society, Company or Minority Institutions shall be conducted by the State/Union Territory Government."
