3. **Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Siddhartha Medical College, Vijaywada.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 01.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats at Siddhartha Medical College, Vijaywada granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 01.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Siddhartha Medical College, Vijaywada be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

4. **University of Delhi, Delhi - Recognition of DM(Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at VP Chest Institute of Medical Sciences, Delhi.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05.04.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2014) and compliance dated 22.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at VP Chest Institute of Medical Sciences, Delhi granted by University of Delhi, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05.04.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2014) and compliance dated 22.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by University of Delhi, Delhi in respect of students being trained at VP Chest Institute of Medical Sciences, Delhi because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Thoracic Surgeon is yet not available .Institute has stated that it will be filled in 6 months.
2. Deficiency of Dr .S.N .Gaur not having 2 y special training remains as it is.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

5. **People's University/Barkatulla University, Bhopal - Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 03.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 03 seats at Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal granted by People's University/Barkatulla University, Bhopal.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 03.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 03 seats granted by People's University/Barkatulla University, Bhopal in respect of students being trained at Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

6. **People's University/Barkatulla University, Bhopal - Recognition of MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 03.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 01 seat at Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal granted by People's University/Barkatulla University, Bhopal.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 03.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 01 seat granted by People's University/Barkatulla University, Bhopal in respect of students being trained at Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

7. MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai - Recognition of MD(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at MGM Mission's Medical College, Navi Mumbai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11.04.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2014, 18.03.2015 and 30.06.2015) and compliance dated 27.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats at MGM Mission's Medical College, Navi Mumbai granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11.04.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2014, 18.03.2015 and 30.06.2015) and compliance dated 27.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radio-Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at MGM Mission's Medical College, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Siddhartha Medical College, Vijaywada be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

8. Delhi University, Delhi - Recognition of MD(Radio diagnosis/Radiology) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (16.05.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 19.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio diagnosis/Radiology) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi granted by Delhi University, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (16.05.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 19.10.2016 submitted by the

college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radio diagnosis/Radiology) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats granted by Delhi University, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi because of the following facts:-

1. Col A K Singh, Professor, he was Associate Professor for 3 years against the requirement of 4 years. In Articles quoted at Sr. No. 7 to 11 he is not first or 2nd Author. Article at Sr. No.5,6 are case reports. Article at Sr.No.3 is in 2016 after his promotion. Hence they cannot be considered. He is left with 3 publications against the required 4. Hence not eligible to be professor. He was graded specialist only for 2 years 4 months and he was never classified specialist against the requirement of 5 years as Graded/Classified Specialist when promoted Assoc.Prof.
2. Dr. Vikas Rastogi – Assoc.Prof., in earlier report dated 8.4.2015 he was shown Asst.Prof. from July 2011 to December 2012 and Assoc.Prof. from Jan, 2013. Now in compliance dated 19.10.2016 he is shown Asst.Prof. from August 2011 to Jan.,2013 and Assoc.Prof. from May 2014. Such retrospective changes to make the faculty eligible are not allowed.
3. Dr. K. Uday Bhanu – in report dated 8.04.2015 he was shown Sr. Resident from January 2012 to December, 2014 and Asst.Prof. from 2007 to 2010 and January, 2015 to onward. In compliance dated 19.10.2016 – he has been shown as Asst.Prof. from 2006 to 2007, 2008 to 2010 and 2012 to till date. April 2014 to December 2014. January 2015 to till date. The dates quoted overlap and such retrospective changes are not permissible.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 4 after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

9. Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University) - Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Jagdeesh Marthandam – In Report dated 04.05.2016 – he was shown:
 - (i) Tutor – 1999 to 2001 at Kasturba Manipal for 2 years.
 - (ii) Sr. Resident from 19.04.2004 to 23.03.2008- 3 years and 11 month at Vinayak Mission.
Now in compliance dated 13.10.2016, he is shown Jr. Resident at Vinayak Mission from 19.04.2004 to 23.03.2008 which in earlier report was Sr. Resident.
He is shown Jr. at Kasturba Manipal from 1999 to 2001 which in earlier report was Tutor.
He is also shown as Jr. Resident from January, 2002 to December, 2003 (2 years) at Madras ENT Research Institute, Chennai which was not shown in earlier report. Such retrospective changes to make the faculty eligible are not allowed.
2. Dr. Preethi D – She was Tutor at Madras Medical College in earlier report which has now been converted to Jr. Resident. Such retrospective changes are not allowed.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

The matter be placed before Ethics Committee.

10. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University - Recognition of DM(Gastroenterology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.05.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (October,2013 & 30.11.2015) and compliance dated 06.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Gastroenterology)

qualification against increased intake from 01 to 04 seats at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.05.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (October, 2013 & 30.11.2015) and compliance dated 06.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DM(Gastroenterology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 04 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

11. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University - Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015) and compliance dated 05.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015) and compliance dated 05.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut, Kerala be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

12. JSS University, Mysore - Renewal of recognition of DGO qualification for 06 seats in respect of students being trained at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 08.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DGO qualification for 06 seats at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore granted by JSS University, Mysore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 08.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the

recognition of DGO qualification for 06 seats granted by JSS University, Mysore in respect of students being trained at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

13. KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum - Recognition of DM(Cardiac Anaesthesiology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (13.07.2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2014) and compliance dated 28.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Cardiac Anaesthesiology) qualification for 01 seat at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (13.07.2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2014) and compliance dated 28.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DM(Cardiac Anaesthesiology) qualification for 01 seat granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

14. Manipal University, Manipal - Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 14.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 06 seats at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore granted by Manipal University, Manipal.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 14.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 06 seats granted by Manipal University, Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

15. NIMS University Jaipur - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 , 18.11.2015 & 21.03.2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 01 seat at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 , 18.11.2015 & 21.03.2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualification for 01 seat granted by NIMS University, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

16. NIMS University, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 & 18.11.2015) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 04 seats at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 & 18.11.2015) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 04 seats granted by NIMS University, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Perdeep Goyal , Asst.Prof. is not eligible. He is DNB from Sector 16, General Hospital, Chandigarh, which is a non-teaching hospital. It is wrongly stated in faculty table that he passed DNB from Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh. Resultantly, he was not eligible ab-initio to be appointed as Sr. Resident and then as Asst.Prof. because he has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a Medical College. Resultantly, Unit-II left with 2 faculty only and it cannot be considered a PG Unit.
2. In report dated 20.06.2016 – There were 4 units but now in compliance there are 3 units.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Letter of Permission for starting of **MD (Paediatrics)** course to the National Institute of Medical Sciences was granted by the erstwhile Board of Governors in supersession of the Medical Council of India on **28.02.2011**.

2. The Postgraduate Committee further noted that Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000 provides as under:

(2) The Institution shall apply for recognition of the post-graduate medical qualification to the Central Government through the affiliating University when the first admitted batch shall be due to appear for the examination to be conducted by the affiliating University.

(3) Failure to seek timely recognition as required in sub-clause (2) shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post-Graduate Course."

3. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further noted that vide Council letters dated **02.12.2015 & 20.09.2016**, it was informed inter alia to the College as under:

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats."

4. The National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur had applied for recognition on **05.08.2013**. Subsequently, the inspection for recognition was conducted on **31.05.2014**. Thereafter, the deficiencies had been communicated to the college authorities on **31.07.2014**. The compliance dated **23.04.2015** submitted by the College was considered by P.G Committee on 27.05.2015 and P.G Committee decided to verify compliance by way of assessment and same was verified on 18.11.2015. Compliance verification assessment was considered by the P.G. Committee on 24.11.2015. The decision of the P.G. Committee was communicated to the college authorities on 02.12.2015. Compliance received from college authorities vide letter dated 28.12.2015. Compliance considered by the PG Sub-committee on 15.02.2016 and decided to place the matter before P.G Committee. The matter alongwith compliance dated 28.12.2015 was placed before the P.G. Committee at its meeting held on 01.03.2016. The decision of the P.G Committee was communicated to the college on 11.03.2016. Compliance received from college authorities vide letter dated 04.04.2016 was placed before the P.G Sub-Committee at its meeting held on 19.05.2016 and the committee decided to place the matter before P.G. Committee. The

matter alongwith compliance dated 04.04.2016 was placed before P.G Committee at its meeting held on 03.06.2016 and the P.G Committee decided to verify compliance by way of assessment which was verified on 20.06.2016. Compliance verification assessment report (20.06.2016) was placed before the P.G Committee at its meeting held on 01.07.2016. The decision was communicated to the college authorities on 20.09.2016. Compliance received from the college authorities vide letter dated 13.10.2016 was placed before the P.G. Sub-Committee on 21.11.2016 and decided to place the matter before P.G. Committee.

5. The above clearly brings out that the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur has despite repeated opportunities failed to fulfil the requirement of Regulations in respect of clinical material, human resources and infrastructure. Thus, the training of postgraduate students in the discipline of **MD(Paediatrics)** is not possible in the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur.
6. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that aggrieved by grant of non-recognition of their courses certain students who have passed out from the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur had filed writ petitions before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee recalled that the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in its order dated 04.03.16 in WP (C) No. 1854/2016 – Dr. Shivendera Kumar Singh & Ors vs. Union of India has observed as under:-
 7. *Having heard learned counsel for parties, the Court is of the opinion that degrees of the students who have taken admission in post-graduate courses in accordance with law should not be unnecessarily withheld on the ground of lack of compliances by respondent no. 3-College.*
7. Similar observations are recorded in Order dated 23.05.16 in WP (C) No. 4773/2016 – Dr. Nitin Johar & Ors. vs. Union of India & Ors of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi.
8. Therefore, keeping in view the observations of the Hon'ble High Court the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government that the **MD(Paediatrics)** qualification awarded by the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students admitted in the **MD(Paediatrics)** course for the academic year 2011-12; 2012-13 and 2013-14 be recognized and included in the First Schedule to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.
9. Further, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in its Order dated 04.03.16 in WP (C) No. 1854/2016 – Dr. Shivendera Kumar Singh & Ors vs. Union of India has observed as under:-
 10. *In the opinion of this Court, respondent no. 2-MCI should normally take action against the delinquent college by either withdrawing its permission for the post-graduate courses in the subsequent academic session or by levying penalties in case of non-compliance.*

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decides as under:-

- (I) All admissions that have been made on or after the examination of first batch in 2014 in the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur are in gross violation of Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000. Therefore, the College was not entitled in law to make any admission for batches from academic year 2014-15 onwards. Keeping in view that the provisions of MCI Regulations are mandatory and binding the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur was not entitled to admit students in **MD(Paediatrics)** course from the academic year 2014-15. Therefore any admission that have been made in violation of Regulation

6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 by the National Institute of Medical Sciences are illegal.

- (II) The National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur is restrained from making any application for starting the **MD(Paediatrics)** course for a period of 05 years.

Matter be placed before Ethics Committee.

17. NIMS University, Jaipur - Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 18.11.2015) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 18.11.2015) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats granted by NIMS University, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Dr. Nishant Y.K. Sharma, Sr. Resident is DNB from a non-teaching (Deen Dayal Upadhaya – Delhi) hospital. He has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college. Hence, not eligible.
 2. There is no other Sr. Resident in the Unit-II.
 3. Dr. Mukesh Tiwari is promoted as Professor with only 3 years experience as Assoc. Prof.; however only 2 research publications are cited in the faculty table against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. His 3rd publication is a case report & 4th is review articles which cannot be considered.
 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.
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1. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Letter of Permission for starting of **MS (Orthopaedics)** course to the National Institute of Medical Sciences was granted by the erstwhile Board of Governors in supersession of the Medical Council of India on **03.03.2011**.
 2. The Postgraduate Committee further noted that Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000 provides as under:
(2) The Institution shall apply for recognition of the post-graduate medical qualification to the Central Government through the affiliating University when the first admitted batch shall be due to appear for the examination to be conducted by the affiliating University.
(3) Failure to seek timely recognition as required in sub-clause (2) shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post-Graduate Course."
 3. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further noted that vide Council letters dated **30.04.2016 & 20.09.2016**, it was informed inter alia to the College as under:

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

The Compliance verification assessment report was considered by the P.G. Committee on 24.11.2015. The decision of the P.G. Committee was communicated to the college on 02.12.2015. Compliance received from college authorities vide letter dated 28.12.2015 was considered by the PG Sub-committee 15.02.2016 and decided to place the matter before P.G Committee. The matter alongwith compliance dated 28.12.2015 was placed before the P.G. Committee at its meeting held on 01.03.2016. The decision of the P.G Committee was communicated to the college on 11.03.2016. Compliance received from college authorities vide letter dated 04.04.2016 was placed before the P.G Sub-Committee at its meeting held on 19.04.2016 and the committee decided to place the matter before P.G. Committee. The matter alongwith compliance dated 04.04.2016 was placed before P.G Committee at its meeting held on 26.04.2016 . The decision was communicated to college on 30.04.2016. Compliance received from the college authorities vide letter dated 26.05.2016. Compliance dated 26.05.2016 was placed before the P.G. Sub-Committee on 10.06.2016 and decided to verify compliance by way of assessment which was verified on 20.06.2016. Compliance verification assessment report was considered by P.G Committee on 01.07.2016. Decision of P.G Committee was communicated to the college on 20.09.2016. Compliance submitted by the college on 13.10.2016 was placed before P.G. Sub-Committee on 21.11.2016 and the sub committee decided to place the matter before P.G Committee.

The above clearly brings out that the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur has despite repeated opportunities failed to fulfil the requirement of Regulations in respect of clinical material, human resources and infrastructure. Thus, the training of postgraduate students in the discipline of **MS (Orthopaedics)** is not possible in the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 for 01 seat and June, 2015 (01 to 03) seats & 18.1.2015) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for

Recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification for 3 seats at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 for 01 seat and June, 2015 (01 to 03) seats & 18.1.2015) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD/MS(OBG) qualification for 3 seats granted by NIMS University, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Archana Sharma, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulation. She was Asst.Prof. for 4 years 2 months against the requirement of 5 years without any publications. Hence, she cannot be considered. Date in earlier report was 14.01.2013 which has now been changed to 14.02.2013 in compliance verification report. Resultantly, Unit-II left with 2 faculty which cannot be considered.
2. There is no Sr.Resident in Unit-III.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In the meantime, the fresh request u/s 11(2) for increase of seats from 01 to 03 received u/s 11(2) from the central Govt. vide letter No. U12012/218/2015-ME(PII) Pt, dated 29.04.2015. Letter of Permission for 01 to 03 seats granted by MCI vide letter No. 88-(22)/2011-Med-102971 dated 31.03.2012. The Combined Item i.e. Compliance verification assessment report (18.11.2015) for 01 seat and assessment report (26.06.2015) for increase of seats from 01 to 03 was placed before the PG Committee on 24.11.2015. The decision of the P.G. Committee was communicated to the college on 02.12.2015. Compliance received from college authorities vide letter dated 28.12.2015. Compliance considered by the PG Sub-committee 15.02.2016 and decided to place the matter before P.G Committee. The matter alongwith compliance dated 28.12.2015 was placed before the P.G. Therefore, keeping in view the observations of the Hon'ble High Court the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government that the **MD/MS(OBG)** qualification awarded by the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students admitted in the **MD/MS(OBG)** course for the academic year 2011-12; 2012-13 and 2013-14 be recognized and included in the First Schedule to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.
9. Further, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in its Order dated 04.03.16 in WP (C) No. 1854/2016 – Dr. Shivendera Kumar Singh & Ors vs. Union of India has observed as under:-
 10. *In the opinion of this Court, respondent no. 2-MCI should normally take action against the delinquent college by either withdrawing its permission for the post-graduate courses in the subsequent academic session or by levying penalties in case of non-compliance.*

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decides as under:-

- (I) All admissions that have been made on or after the examination of first batch in 2014 in the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur are in gross violation of Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000. Therefore, the College was not entitled in law to make any admission for batches from academic year 2014-15 onwards. Keeping in view that the provisions of MCI Regulations are mandatory and binding the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur was not entitled to admit students in **MD/MS(OBG)** course from the academic year 2014-15. Therefore any admission that have been made in violation of Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 by the National Institute of Medical Sciences are illegal.
- (II) The National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur is restrained from making any application for starting the **MD/MS(OBG)** course for a period of 05 years.

19. NIMS University, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05.04.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & November, 2015) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology) qualification for 01 seat at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05.04.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & November, 2015) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology) qualification for 01 seat granted by NIMS University, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Dr. Vinod Shah, Prof. is already 70 years of age. Resultantly, there is deficiency of Assoc.Prof.-1.

2. In respect of Dr .Lalit Krishna, the deficiency pointed out was "As per table in compliance verification report, Dr .Lalit Krishna was Junior Resident at SMS Medical College, Jaipur for 2 years (20/11/1987 to 19/11/1989). Now in the compliance, the same has been changed to Senior Resident which is not permissible". No explanation is submitted for this.
 3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.
1. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Letter of Permission for starting of **MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology)** course to the National Institute of Medical Sciences was granted by the erstwhile Board of Governors in supersession of the Medical Council of India on **03.03.2011**.
 2. The Postgraduate Committee further noted that Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000 provides as under:
 - (2) The Institution shall apply for recognition of the post-graduate medical qualification to the Central Government through the affiliating University when the first admitted batch shall be due to appear for the examination to be conducted by the affiliating University.
 - (3) Failure to seek timely recognition as required in sub-clause (2) shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post-Graduate Course."
 3. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further noted that vide Council letters dated **11.05.2016 and 20.09.2016**, it was informed inter alia to the College as under:

Admissions done (if any) against these **seats i.e. 01 seat** after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats."
 4. The National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur had applied for recognition on **05.08.2013** . Subsequently, the inspection for recognition was conducted on **16.06.2014**. Thereafter, the deficiencies had been communicated to the college on **18.03.2015**. Compliance received from the college vide letter dated 23.04.2015 was considered by P.G Committee on 27.05.2015 and P.G Committee decided to verify compliance by way of assessment and same was verified on 18.11.2015. Compliance verification assessment was considered by the P.G. Committee on 24.11.2015. The deficiencies pointed out by the P.G. Committee was communicated to the college on 02.12.2015. Compliance received from college authorities vide letter dated 28.12.2015 was considered by the PG Committee at its meeting held on 01.03.2016 and the committee decided to verify the compliance by

way of assessment which was verified on 05.04.2016. Compliance verification assessment report (05.04.2016) was placed before the P.G Committee at its meeting held on 06.05.2016 and deficiencies pointed out by the PG Committee was communicated to the college authorities on 11.05.2016. Compliance received from the college authorities vide letter dated 04.06.2016. Compliance dated 04.06.2016 was placed before the P.G. Committee on 01.07.2016 and the deficiencies communicated to college on 20.09.2016. Compliance submitted by the college on 13.10.2016 and was considered by the PG Committee on 07.03.2017.

5. The above clearly brings out that the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur has despite repeated opportunities failed to fulfill the requirement of Regulations in respect of clinical material, human resources and infrastructure. Thus, the training of postgraduate students in the discipline of **MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology)** is not possible in the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur.
6. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that aggrieved by grant of non-recognition of their courses certain students who have passed out from the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur had filed writ petitions before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee recalled that the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in its order dated 04.03.16 in WP (C) No. 1854/2016 – Dr. Shivendera Kumar Singh & Ors vs. Union of India has observed as under:-
 7. *Having heard learned counsel for parties, the Court is of the opinion that degrees of the students who have taken admission in post-graduate courses in accordance with law should not be unnecessarily withheld on the ground of lack of compliances by respondent no. 3-College.*
7. Similar observations are recorded in Order dated 23.05.16 in WP (C) No. 4773/2016 – Dr. Nitin Johar & Ors. vs. Union of India & Ors of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi.
8. Therefore, keeping in view the observations of the Hon'ble High Court the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government that the **MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology)** qualification awarded by the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students admitted in the **MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology)** course for the academic year 2011-12; 2012-13 and 2013-14 be recognized and included in the First Schedule to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.
9. Further, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in its Order dated 04.03.16 in WP (C) No. 1854/2016 – Dr. Shivendera Kumar Singh & Ors vs. Union of India has observed as under:-
 10. *In the opinion of this Court, respondent no. 2-MCI should normally take action against the delinquent college by either withdrawing its permission for the post-graduate courses in the subsequent academic session or by levying penalties in case of non-compliance.*

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee Medical Education Committee decides as under:-

- (I) All admissions that have been made on or after the examination of first batch in 2014 in the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur are in gross violation of Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000. Therefore, the College was not entitled in law to make any admission for batches from academic year 2014-15 onwards. Keeping in view that the provisions of MCI Regulations are mandatory and binding the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur was not entitled to admit students in **MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology)** course from the academic year 2014-15. Therefore any admission that have been made in violation of Regulation 6 (2) and (3)

of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 by the National Institute of Medical Sciences are illegal.

- (II) The National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur is restrained from making any application for starting the **MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology)** course for a period of 05 years.

20. NIMS University, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat granted by NIMS University, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Dr. N S Kothari, Professor – is already 70 years of age.
 2. Dr. Viveka Nand Goswami, Professor - is already 70 years of age.
 3. Department left with 2 faculty. Resultantly deficiency of Asst.Prof.-1.
 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.
1. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Letter of Permission for starting of **MD(Forensic Medicine)** course to the National Institute of Medical Sciences was granted by the erstwhile Board of Governors in supersession of the Medical Council of India on **03.03.2011**.
 2. The Postgraduate Committee further noted that Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000 provides as under:
(2) The Institution shall apply for recognition of the post-graduate medical qualification to the Central Government through the affiliating University when the first admitted batch shall be due to appear for the examination to be conducted by the affiliating University.
(3) Failure to seek timely recognition as required in sub-clause (2) shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post-Graduate Course."
 3. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further noted that vide Council letters dated **30.04.2016 and 20.09.2016**, it was informed inter alia to the College as under:
Admissions done (if any) against these **seats i.e. 01 seat** after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

Committee at its meeting held on 01.03.2016. The decision of the PG committee was communicated to college on 11.03.2016. Compliance received from college authorities 04.04.2016 was placed before the P.G. Committee at its meeting held on 26.04.2016. The decision was communicated to college on 30.04.2016. Compliance received by the college on 26.05.2016. Compliance was considered by the PG Committee 03.06.2016 and decided to verify compliance by way of assessment, which was verified on 20.06.2016. Compliance verification assessment report (20.06.2016) was placed before the P.G Committee at its meeting held on 01.07.2016. The decision was communicated to college on 20.09.2016. Compliance received from the college authorities vide letter dated 13.10.2016 was placed before the PG Committee on 07.03.2017.
5. The above clearly brings out that the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur has despite repeated opportunities failed to fulfil the requirement of Regulations in respect of clinical material, human resources and infrastructure. Thus, the training of postgraduate students in the discipline of **MD(Forensic Medicine)** is not possible in the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015 & 21.03.2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2.016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 2 seats at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015 & 21.03.2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2.016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Microbiology) qualification for 2 seats granted by NIMS University, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

22. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Renewal of recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 07.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification for 02 seats at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 07.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

23. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences, Deemed University - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04.04.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013 , December, 2014 & 03.07.2015) and compliance dated 05.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 06 seats at Rural Medical College, Loni granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences, Deemed University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04.04.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013 , December, 2014 & 03.07.2015) and compliance dated 05.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 06 seats granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences, Deemed University in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. The deficiency of Dr .S.S .Gite, Senior Resident not having 3 y experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident remains as it is .The Gazette Notification cited by the Institute refers to equivalence of DNB qualification with MD/MS degree and not to appointment of a person as a Senior Resident without 3 y experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital.
2. The deficiency of Dr .A.D .Patil, Senior Resident not having 3 y experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident remains as it is. The Gazette Notification cited by the Institute refers to equivalence of DNB qualification with MD/MS degree

- and not to appointment of a person as a Senior Resident without 3 y experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital.
3. Dr .M.B .Chandurkar – It is not given whether he is 1st or 2nd Author in publication quoted. All are in Forensic Medicine Journal. Deficiency stays as such.
 4. Dr. Satish Varpe – Neither Author names, nor volume and page no. of publication given. Hence they cannot be considered. Deficiency stays as such.
 5. Dr. Laxman Gadekar, Assoc.Prof. - Neither Author names, nor volume and page no. of publication given. Hence they cannot be considered. Deficiency stays as such.
 6. Dr. Amol Pathak, Assoc.Prof. – Neither Author name, nor journal name & reference given about 2 publications accepted . deficiency stays as such.
 7. No faculty table attached.
 8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 02 to 06 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Read: the Council Assessor’s Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 30.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat at Sri Mookambika Instt. of Medical Sciences, Kulasekharan, Tamil Nadu granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor’s Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 30.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS (Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sri Mookambika Instt. of Medical Sciences, Kulasekharan, Tamil Nadu be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of

Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

25. NIMS University, Jaipur - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 06 seats in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (9th June, 2014 04.01.2016 and 09.04.2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2.016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 06 seats at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur granted by NIMS University, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20.06.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (9th June, 2014 04.01.2016 and 09.04.2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2.016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification for 06 seats granted by NIMS University, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at National Institute of Medical Science & Research, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

1. Abu Narman – Sr. Resident, Dr. Jayant Jain, Sr. Resident, Dr. Kushal Monga, Sr.Resident and Dr. Ritu Roy – As per faculty table signed by Dean and Assessor all the above mentioned doctors were shown as Resident in earlier report in column of experience and not Sr. Resident.
 2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.
1. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Letter of Permission for starting of **MS(General Surgery)** course to the National Institute of Medical Sciences was granted by the erstwhile Board of Governors in supersession of the Medical Council of India on **28.02.2011**.
 2. The Postgraduate Committee further noted that Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000 provides as under:
(2) The Institution shall apply for recognition of the post-graduate medical qualification to the Central Government through the affiliating University when the first admitted batch shall be due to appear for the examination to be conducted by the affiliating University.
(3) Failure to seek timely recognition as required in sub-clause (2) shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post-Graduate Course."
 3. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further noted that vide Council letters dated **22.04.2016 and 20.09.2016**, it was informed inter alia to the College as under:
Admissions done (if any) against these **seats i.e. 06 seats** after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students

admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.”

4. The National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur had applied for recognition on **05.08.2013**. Subsequently, the inspection for recognition was conducted on 09.06.2014. The matter was considered by the PG Committee on 23.09.2014 and matter was deferred. After receiving clarification vide letter dated 19.11.2014, the assessment report dated 09.06.2014 and information received from college authorities on 19.11.2014 was placed before the PG Committee on 18.02.2015. Thereafter, the deficiencies had been communicated to the college on 18.03.2015. Compliance received from college authorities vide letter dated 23.04.2015. The Compliance was considered by P.G Committee on 27.05.2015 and P.G Committee decided to verify compliance by way of assessment and same was verified on 04.01.2016. Compliance verification assessment was considered by the P.G. Committee on 19.01.2016. The decision of the P.G. Committee was communicated to the college on 27.01.2016. Compliance received from college authorities vide letter dated 02.03.2016. Compliance considered by the PG Sub-committee 08.04.2016 and decided to conduct re-assessment immediately. The Compliance verification assessment was carried out on 09.04.2016. The compliance assessment report 09.04.2016 was placed before the P.G. Committee at its meeting held on 13.04.2016. The decision of the P.G Committee was communicated to the college on 22.04.2016. Compliance received from college authorities vide letter dated 16.05.2016. Compliance was placed before the P.G Sub-Committee at its meeting held on 10.06.2016 and the PG Sub Committee decided to verify compliance by way of assessment which was verified on 20.06.2016. Compliance verification assessment report (20.06.2016) was placed before the P.G Committee at its meeting held on 01.07.2016. The decision was communicated to college on 20.09.2016. Compliance received from the college authorities vide letter dated 13.10.2016. Compliance dated 13.10.2016 was placed before the P.G. Sub-Committee on 21.11.2016 and decided to place the matter before P.G. Committee.
5. The above clearly brings out that the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur has despite repeated opportunities failed to fulfil the requirement of Regulations in respect of clinical material, human resources and infrastructure. Thus, the training of postgraduate students in the discipline of **MS(General Surgery)** is not possible in the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur.
6. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that aggrieved by grant of non-recognition of their courses certain students who have passed out from the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur had filed writ petitions before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee recalled that the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in its order dated 04.03.16 in WP (C) No. 1854/2016 – Dr. Shivendera Kumar Singh & Ors vs. Union of India has observed as under:-
 7. *Having heard learned counsel for parties, the Court is of the opinion that degrees of the students who have taken admission in post-graduate courses in accordance with law should not be unnecessarily withheld on the ground of lack of compliances by respondent no. 3-College.*

7. Similar observations are recorded in Order dated 23.05.16 in WP (C) No. 4773/2016 – Dr. Nitin Johar & Ors. vs. Union of India & Ors of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi.
8. Therefore, keeping in view the observations of the Hon'ble High Court the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government that the **MS(General Surgery)** qualification awarded by the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students admitted in the **MS(General Surgery)** course for the academic year 2011-12; 2012-13 and 2013-14 be recognized and included in the First Schedule to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.
9. Further, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in its Order dated 04.03.16 in WP (C) No. 1854/2016 – Dr. Shivendera Kumar Singh & Ors vs. Union of India has observed as under:-
 10. *In the opinion of this Court, respondent no. 2-MCI should normally take action against the delinquent college by either withdrawing its permission for the post-graduate courses in the subsequent academic session or by levying penalties in case of non-compliance.*

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee Medical Education Committee decides as under:-

- (I) All admissions that have been made on or after the examination of first batch in 2014 in the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur are in gross violation of Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000. Therefore, the College was not entitled in law to make any admission for batches from academic year 2014-15 onwards. Keeping in view that the provisions of MCI Regulations are mandatory and binding the National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur was not entitled to admit students in **MS(General Surgery)** course from the academic year 2014-15. Therefore any admission that have been made in violation of Regulation 6 (2) and (3) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 by the National Institute of Medical Sciences are illegal.

The National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur is restrained from making any application for starting the **MS(General Surgery)** course for a period of 05 years.

26. MJP Rohilkhand University, Bareilly - Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Shri Ram Murti Smarak Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bareilly.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24.05.2016) and compliance dated 15.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Shri Ram Murti Smarak Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bareilly granted by MJP Rohilkhand University, Bareilly.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (24.05.2016) and compliance dated 15.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by MJP Rohilkhand University, Bareilly in respect of students being trained at Shri Ram Murti Smarak Instt. of Medical Sciences, Bareilly because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Promotion of Dr. Rajneesh Madhok, Professor & HOD is not as per regulations. He was Assoc.Prof. 3 years and 2 months against the requirement of 4 years. Only two publications have been quoted against the requirement of four.
2. Deficiency of Dr .Shivi Mohini, Senior Resident being not eligible as Senior Resident remains as it is .Her experience as Senior Resident wherein she was appointed without 3 y experience as Resident cannot be considered as Junior Resident.
3. Deficiency 2 & 3 stays as such.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 01 to 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

27. Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 12 to 14 seats in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Ajmer.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30.09.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013 & November, 2014) and compliance dated 06.04.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 12 to 14 seats at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Ajmer granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30.09.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2013 & November, 2014) and compliance dated 06.04.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 12 to 14 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Ajmer because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty : Asst .Prof .:2 remains as it is.
2. Shortage of Senior Residents :2.

3. Dr .C.K .Meena, Professor was absent on day of assessment.
4. Unit-5 left with 2 faculty, No Sr. Resident. Hence, it cannot be considered a PG unit.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 12 to 14 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

28. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University - Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Jubilee Mission Medical College & Research Institute, Kerala.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03.11.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (04.07.2015) and compliance dated 06.04.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats at Jubilee Mission Medical College & Research Institute, Kerala granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03.11.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (04.07.2015) and compliance dated 06.04.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University in respect of students being trained at Jubilee Mission Medical College & Research Institute, Kerala be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

29. Aligarh Muslim University - Recognition of MD(Radiotherapy) qualification for 1 seat and (DMRT) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at J.N. Medical College, Aligarh.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2014 & Feb., 2016) and compliance dated 27.07.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radiotherapy) qualification for 1 seat and (DMRT) qualification for 02 seats at J.N. Medical College, Aligarh granted by Aligarh Muslim University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2014 & Feb., 2016) and compliance dated 27.07.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radiotherapy) qualification for 1 seat and (DMRT) qualification for 02 seats granted by Aligarh Muslim University in respect of students being trained at J.N. Medical College, Aligarh be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

30. SherEKashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar (Deemed University) - Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Soura, Srinagar.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015 & 21.03.2016) and compliance dated 16.05.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats at Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Soura, Srinagar granted by SherEKashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar (Deemed University).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015 & 21.03.2016) and compliance dated 16.05.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats granted by SherEKashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Soura, Srinagar because of the following facts:-

1. In the last assessment a remark was "In the faculty table, exact date of joining in a particular post is not provided; hence it is difficult to verify experience & thereby eligibility". In the present assessment also, in the faculty table, date of joining & promotion are not shown; only year is shown. Hence it is not possible to verify eligibility of faculty. Deficiency continues as it is.
2. Data of clinical material like Bed Occupancy, Major & Minor Operations of the department on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days are not provided.
3. Cryo Cautery/LEEP are not available.

4. Intra Uterine Insemination service is not available .
5. With regard to deficiency of Central O2 and Central Suction being not available, it is not clear from report whether it is rectified or not.
6. Compliance verification not in prescribed SAF.
7. Clinical workload of Department on assessment day not given.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

31. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at ESI-PGIMSR, Manickatala, Kolkata.

Read: the Council Assessor’s Report (22nd July, 2016) and Legal Opinion dated 09/12/2016 on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats at ESI-PGIMSR, Manickatala, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor’s Report (22nd July, 2016) and Legal Opinion dated 09/12/2016 and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at ESI-PGIMSR, Manickatala, Kolkata be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

32. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at ESI-PGIMSR,ESI-Hospital,Andheri(E), Mumbai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08.08.2016) along with the Council Assessor’s Report (May, 2014 for 02 seats, 02.03.2016 cva for 02 seats and 08.08.2016 for 02 to 03 seats) and compliance dated 07.04.2016 submitted

by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 03 seats at ESI-PGIMSR,ESI-Hospital,Andheri(E), Mumbai granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08.08.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 for 02 seats, 02.03.2016 cva for 02 seats and 08.08.2016 for 02 to 03 seats) and compliance dated 07.04.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Pathology) qualification for 03 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at ESI-PGIMSR,ESI-Hospital,Andheri(E), Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

33. Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University - Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 5 seats in respect of students being trained at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 07.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 5 seats at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi granted by Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 07.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 5 seats granted by Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University in respect of students being trained at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

34. Vinayaka Mission's University, salem - Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 21.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, salem.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and compliance dated 21.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that

MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

35. Indira Gandhi Instt of Med. Sc., Patna (Deemed Univ.) - Recognition of DM(Gastroenterology) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences,Sheikhpura Patna.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09.05.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015) and compliance dated 27.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Gastroenterology) qualification for 1 seat at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences,Sheikhpura Patna granted by Indira Gandhi Instt of Med. Sc., Patna (Deemed Univ.).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09.05.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2015) and compliance dated 27.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DM(Gastroenterology) qualification for 1 seat granted by Indira Gandhi Instt of Med. Sc., Patna (Deemed Univ.) in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences,Sheikhpura Patna be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

36. King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University) - Renewal of recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 15 seats in respect of students being trained at King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 28.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 15 seats at King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow granted by King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 28.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 15 seats granted by King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Units IV, V & VI have only 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as PG Units.
2. Promotion of Dr. H.S. Pahwa, Professor as Asso. Prof. is not as per Regulations as he has been promoted with experience of only 4 year experience as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 year as per Regulations. As his promotion as Asso. Prof. is not as per TEQ Regulations, which being Statutory Regulations are mandatory & binding for all, his subsequent teaching experience cannot be considered. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. With regard to Dr. Anita Singh, deficiency of not having 3 year experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital remains as it is & her appointment as Senior Resident is contrary to Regulations. The Notification cited by the Institute refers to equating DNB qualification with MD/MS and not to appointment as Senior Resident.
4. With regard to Dr. Anand K. Mishra, Asso. Prof., no details of publications are cited in the compliance although he was promoted with experience of only 4 year as Asst. Prof. during transitory period. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 15 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

37. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Renewal of recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification for 5 seats and DMRD qualification for 8 seats in respect of students being trained at Madras Medical College, Chennai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification for 5 seats and DMRD qualification for 8 seats at Madras Medical College, Chennai granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification for 5 seats and DMRD

qualification for 8 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Madras Medical College, Chennai be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

38. MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai - Recognition of MD (General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 8 seats in respect of students being trained at MGM Mission's Medical College, Navi Mumbai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11.04.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (December, 2014 & 30.06.2015) and compliance dated 18.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 8 seats at MGM Mission's Medical College, Navi Mumbai granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11.04.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (December, 2014 & 30.06.2015) and compliance dated 18.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 8 seats granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at MGM Mission's Medical College, Navi Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

39. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at ESI-PGIMSR,ESI Hospital, K.K Nagar, Chennai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 20.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats at ESI-PGIMSR,ESI Hospital, K.K Nagar, Chennai granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 20.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesia) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at ESI-PGIMSR,ESI Hospital, K.K Nagar, Chennai because of the following facts:-

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Deficiency of promotion of Dr .Ilango Ganesan as Asso .Prof .not being as per Regulations remains as it is .Both his publications are case reports & cannot be considered .Contention of the Institute that there was no clarity regarding publications is not correct as the Gazette Notification issued on 21/07/2009 was self-explanatory .Further the contention that he was eligible for promotion based upon 5 y experience as Asst .Prof .before cut-off date is irrelevant as he was promoted after cut-off date with both publications being case reports .
2. CT Scan & MRI are not available.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

40. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at KanyaKumari Government Medical College, Asaripallam.

Read: the Council Assessor’s Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 18.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 3 seats at KanyaKumari Government Medical College, Asaripallam granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor’s Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 18.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualification for 3 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at KanyaKumari Government Medical College, Asaripallam be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

41. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Narayana Medical College, Nellore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 27.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at Narayana Medical College, Nellore granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 27.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Narayana Medical College, Nellore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

42. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine/Forensic Medicine & Toxicology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Narayana Medical College, Nellore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 27.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine/Forensic Medicine & Toxicology) qualification for 02 seats at Narayana Medical College, Nellore granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 27.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Forensic Medicine/Forensic Medicine & Toxicology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Narayana Medical College, Nellore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

43. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09.05.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 24.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other

teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 02 seats at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09.05.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 24.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Chalmeda Anandrao Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

44. D.D.U. Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of DGO qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (26.09.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June,2015) and compliance dated 04.04.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DGO qualification for 02 seats at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur granted by D.D.U. Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (26.09.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June,2015) and compliance dated 04.04.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of DGO qualification for 02 seats granted by D.D.U. Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh in respect of students being trained at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

45. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni - Renewal of recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (5th December, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat at Rural Medical College, Loni granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (5th December, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat

granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

46. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni - Renewal of recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 2 seat in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (10th December, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 2 seat at Rural Medical College, Loni granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (10th December, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 2 seat granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

47. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni - Renewal of recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (2nd December, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 2 seats granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

48. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni - Renewal of recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (13th December, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of

MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 2 seats at Rural Medical College, Loni granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (13th December, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 2 seats granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

49. **Annamalai University, Annamalainagar - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 12 to 15 seats in respect of students being trained at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28-29.05.2014) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 12 to 15 seats at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar granted by Annamalai University, Annamalainagar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28-29.05.2014) and noted that the college authorities had admitted 15 students during the last 3 years. They have to submit compliance to the deficiency pointed out in the earlier assessment report for recognition of these additional 3 students for the last three consecutive years. The present reply that they do not want to increase seats from 12 to 15 now will not recognize these three batches which has already been admitted.

50. **Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad - Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences , Barabanki.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (14th December, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 1 seat at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences , Barabanki granted by Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14th December, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Pathology) qualification for 1 seat granted by Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Faizabad in respect of students being trained at Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, Barabanki be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

51. King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University) - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Lucknow.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (22.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014, 27.07.2015 & 31.03.2016) and compliance dated 14.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats at Command Hospital, Lucknow granted by King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (22.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014, 27.07.2015 & 31.03.2016) and compliance dated 14.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats granted by King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Lucknow because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Suresh Talwar, Asso. Prof. has experience of only 2 year as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 y. Further it is not clear as to how he is shown as Assoc. Prof. in May 1993 on the basis of 2 year experience as Asst. Prof. Resultantly, deficiency of not having Asso. Prof. in the only Unit remains as it is.
2. In respect of Dr. Dr. P.M. Patil, Senior Resident, he is shown as having worked at Base Hospital, Delhi from January 2012 to March 2014; however this period is shown as 3 year 3 month in the faculty table which is clearly an error. As per details provided in the faculty table, he has only 2 year 3 month experience as Resident against requirement of 3 y; hence not qualified to hold the post; as he is surplus SR in the Unit, not shown as deficiency.
3. Dr. Rajesh Verma, Professor & Head – In the earlier report dated 31.03.2016 signed by Dean and Assessor, Dr. Rajesh Verma was Asst.Prof. for 4 year 11 months (Total done by college itself and not MCI as stated in compliance). (March2004 to June 2008 (4 year 3 month & July 2008 to Feb.,2009 (8 months) Total 4 year and 11 months). This has now been changed to December, 1996 to June, 2000 and March, 2004 to August, 2005) 5 years. Such retrospective changes to make the faculty eligible cannot be allowed.
He was Assoc.Prof. in earlier report from March 2009 to May 2011 and June 2011 to Feb 2013, which has been changed to September, 2005 to June 2008 and July 2008 to October, 2009. This cannot be allowed to be done retrospectively.
4. Promotion of Dr. Suresh Talwar, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. only for 2 years against the requirement of 5 years. Resultantly no Assoc.Prof.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

Place the matter before the Ethics Committee

52. Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai - Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (22.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 29.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai granted by Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (16.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August , 2015) and compliance dated 18.04.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Rheumatology) qualification for 2 seats at King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow granted by King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (16.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August , 2015) and compliance dated 18.04.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Rheumatology) qualification for 2 seats granted by King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow (Deemed University) in respect of students being

trained at King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Anupam Wakhlu, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 14.07.2015. In publications quoted, in eleven of them, he is not 1st or 2nd author. One is not related to Rheumatology and two are review articles. Only one is left to his credit as research article against the requirement of 4.
2. Deficiency of Puneet Kr – stays as such, he has no 2 years special training in Rheumatology. Sr. Resident ship cannot be counted as training.
3. Dr. Urmila Dhakar, Asst.Prof. – MD(Medicine), no DM or 2 years special training, hence not eligible.
4. None of 7 Senior Residents possess 3 years experience as Resident in Rheumatology before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. Resultantly, there is no eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Peoples College of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bhanpur, Bhopal because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.
2. Dr. Vivake Kumar Dey promoted Prof. on 22.02.2016 without any publications.
3. Deficiency of Dr. M.S. Suresh stays as such. He was Asst.Prof. for 2 years 2 months. Against the requirement of 5 years. There is no certificate from DGAFMS regarding his period and places of posting as Graded/Classified specialist and Advisor without which his eligibility cannot be decided.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 02 to 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. Bed occupancy in PICU is 70%.
3. Dr. Peter Prasanth Kumar promoted as Professor on 01.08.2016 after the cut off date, he has 3 publications against the requirement of four. In 4th he is not an author. No other Assoc.Prof. in Unit-I.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Act, 1956.

Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

58. Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem - Renewal of recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats and recognition against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College & Hospital, Puducherry.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (23.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 29.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats and recognition against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College & Hospital, Puducherry granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (23.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 29.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats and not to recognize against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem in respect of students being trained at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College & Hospital, Puducherry because of the following facts:-

1. Dean Dr. P. Ansuya was on leave on day of assessment on official duty regarding Student Exchange Programme at Naresuan University, Thailand. It is not clear whether such student exchange programme is conducted with permission from MCI.
2. It is not permissible that students should complete 3 years mandatory duration of course after the exam.
3. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. Surwage Pawan Perbhakar, Asst.Prof. – is not recognized. Unit-III, left with 2 faculty only.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. As per statements attached for August - October 2016, more than 90 Residents are getting stipend of Rs. 8,000 p.m. only which is much less than that paid by State Govt. to Residents. It is also contrary to the claim of the Institute that it has been paying stipend @ rates of Govt. of Karnataka from 2015-2016 onwards.
2. UHC: Public Health Nurse is not available.
3. One remark was that "At RHTC, no Paramedical staff except 1 Staff Nurse (not PHN) and 1 Health Educator were present." Presently, PHN is shown to be present; however nothing is mentioned about availability of other Paramedical Staff at RHTC which was the deficiency pointed out.

Deficiency remains as it is. It also needs to be clarified whether PHN, Health Educator & other staff are employees of State Govt. or of the Institute.

4. RHTC: Details of patients admitted in RHTC on day of assessment are not provided.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Attendance at Speciality clinics like Hansen's clinic (06/month); Bullous disorders clinic (09/month) continue to remain low. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. There was only 1 Minor Operation on day of assessment.

4. Total number of Minor Operations in 2016 was 277 implying daily average of 0.92 which is inadequate. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Total number of Daycare Operations in 2016 was 220 implying daily average of 0.73 which is inadequate. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. MRI is installed & under process of commissioning (not yet functioning).
2. Unit 4 has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Dr. S.W. Patil Sr.Resident not eligible as he has no 3 years experience from a medical college. He is DNB in Family Medicine from non-teaching hospital. No other SR.Resident in Unit-3.
4. Dr. S M Sonone – shown JR/Sr.Resident/Registrar, No such designation exists. You have to specify he is Jr.Resident or Sr. Resident.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 4. Promotion of Dr. Atul Padmawar, Assoc.prof. is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 18.09.2014 after the cut-off date without any publications. Unit I left with 1 AP only.
5. Dr. Pooja Uttarwar, Senior Resident in Unit 3 does not have 3 year experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
6. Dr. Varsha Chavan – No date of joining given as Lecturer.
7. There is only 1 Major & only 1 Minor Operation on day of assessment.
8. Deficiency of publications stays. Two publications submitted (not accepted.).
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Declaration Form of Col A K Perbhakaran is not attached without which his eligibility cannot be decided. There is no certificate from DGAFMS regarding his places and period of posting as Graded/Classified Specialist and Advisor without which his eligibility cannot be decided.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. If Dr. P.K. Sasidharan, Professor, is shown working continuously in this college since 1987, why his name did not figure in any of previous reports.
3. Postgraduate Degree qualification of Dr. Vineeth Rajgopal, AP is not recognized.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 28.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad because of the following facts:-

1. As per faculty table signed by Dean & Assessor in report dated 19.04.2016 Dr. Vikram Lokhande, Assoc. Prof., was promoted Assoc.Prof. on 01.09.2014 The statement in compliance verification report that he was promoted on 01.06.2014 is incorrect, in the earlier report he was AP upto 31.08.2014 at MGM Aurangabad. This amounts to supplying misleading information for which college has already been issued show cause notice under Section 8(3)(1)d) of MCI Act.

2. It is clearly written that IPD is number of patients admitted and not total beds occupied. Explanation given is unsatisfactory.
3. Dr. Isaac Philomena, AP was absent on the day of assessment.
4. Dr. M. Vaishali B, Sr. Resident, not eligible, as she does not have 3 years experience as Resident in a medical college before appointment as Senior Resident;. She is DNB from non-teaching hospital.
5. With respect to Dr. Vishal V. Chaudhary, Senior Resident, in the present assessment, he is shown to have worked as Resident at this Institute from 02/07/2007 to 31/03/2009; however in the previous assessment dt. 19/04/2016, this period was not shown at all. Such retrospective changes to make him eligible are not permissible & he cannot be considered. He was not shown Jr.Resident at MGM Aurangabad from 02.07.2007 to 31.03.2009. He was Jr. Resident at Auragabad only from 08.02.2016. This amounts to supplying misleading information to which college has been issued show cause notice under Section 8(3)(1)d) of MCI Act.
6. Dr. Pallavi A. Gurav, Senior Resident in Unit 1 does not have 3 years experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
7. Reply to deficiency 5 is unsatisfactory.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Such retrospective changes to make them eligible are not permissible & they cannot be considered.
2. Postgraduate Degree qualification of Dr. Rakesh Das, AP is not recognized.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 05.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD (General Medicine) qualification for 4 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Government Vellore Medical College, Vellore because of the following facts:-

1. Dr .M.A .Shakeel Ahmed, as per assessment dated 26.04.2016 faculty table signed by Dean and Assessor, Dr. M.A. Shakeel Ahmed was Sr. Resident from 27.04.2007 to 26.04.2008 which now in compliance verification has been shown as Asstt.Prof. which is not permissible. This amounts to

supplying misleading information. Earlier remark was that "his promotion as Assoc .Prof .was not as per Regulations as he was promoted with experience of 4 y 9 m as Asst .Prof ".The period as Asst .Prof .was shown from 27/04/2008 to 23/01/2013 .In the present assessment, his period as Asst .Prof .is shown from 26/04/2007 to 23/01/2013 –i.e .5 y 9 m so as to make him eligible .Such retrospective changes are not permitted & he cannot be considered .

2. CT Scan is 4 slice against requirement of 16 slice .
3. Promotion of Dr .J .Philomena, Professor & HOD, is still not as per regulations. He was promoted on 04.05.2015. Only 2 publication and they are also in 2016 after his promotion.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 4(Four) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 2. It is not given that Dr. Sunil P was AP for how much period without which he cannot be accepted on Assoc.prof. He was absent on assessment day.
3. Deficiency of faculty) :a (Asst .Prof :.3.
4. Promotion of Dr. Suresh Raghvan – Professor is not as per regulations. He was AP for 4 years , Assoc.Prof. 1 year and promoted on 01.08.2015. He has no publication. He was absent on assessment day.
5. Unit M4 left with one AP only.
6. Unit M5 left with one AP only.
7. Dr. H. Purnima Assoc.Prof., promoted on 01.08.2015. He has no publications. Hence her promotion is not as per regulations.
8. Dr. K.P. Udayamma, Assoc.Prof. , promoted on 01.08.2015 without any publication. Hence his promotion is not as per regulations.
9. Dr. Sunil Preghosh P was absent on the day of assessment.
10. Unit M3; M4; M5 have only 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as PG Units .
11. Dr .T.K .Suma is shown as ”Professor “in the column of ”Designation “in the faculty table; however, in the column of experience, it is shown as ”Asso .Prof “.w.e.f .15/07/2013 till date .
12. Details of Experience of Dr .M.M .Shahul Hameed, Professor in Unit M3 are not provided; hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion as Professor is as per Regulations or not .
13. Details of Qualification & Experience of Dr .Ashish George, SR in Unit M2; Dr .Tony Joseph, SR in Unit M3; Dr .P .Arun & Dr .N .Aarthi, both SR in Unit M4; Dr .Remya Das & Dr .Anjana Prabhakar, both SR in Unit M5; Dr .Deepak Thomas, SR in Unit M6 are not provided; hence it is not possible to verify whether their appointment as SR is as per Regulations or not .There is no other SR in the respective Units .
14. Bed occupancy on assessment day cannot be 267. There are only 200 beds in the department.
15. Deficiency Indian and Foreign journals stays as such. Only order placed, not yet received.
16. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 06(Six) to 07(Seven) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Even if we considered 15 extra beds for cataract, still there cannot be 44 admissions daily on 45 beds, there are always some patients who requires admission for more than one day. The only Unit has 45 beds (30 Regular +15 Cataract) which is not as per Regulations .
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Dr. Heneth Ranjee Williams Asst.Prof. is DNB from teaching or non-teaching institute is not provided without with his eligibility cannot be decided.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Promotion of Dr. Dileep K. Jha as Professor is not as per regulations. His teaching experience as Asst. Prof. is less than 5 years. He has no publications. He was absent on the day of assessment.
2. Dr. Dileep k. Jha, Professor & HOD; Dr. Ruby Dey, Asst.Prof. & Dr. Bhawna Thapa, Asst. Prof. were absent on the day of assessment.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 3(Three) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. In respect of Dr .G .Manimozhi; Dr .A .Nakkeeran; Dr .Muhtiah; Dr . Sravana Kumar & Dr .Venkatachalam, their experience as Resident has been amended retrospectively so as to make them eligible which is not permissible & they cannot be considered .It is also observed that their experience shown in present assessment is at variance with that shown in earlier assessment .Dean cannot make such changes retrospectively.
2. Resultantly there is Shortage of Senior Residents :2.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Unit II is the Unit of Dr .Rajendra N .Shewale who is Professor & HOD . However Dr .Viranchi N .Vaidya is shown as incharge of the Unit which is not permissible .
2. In respect of Dr .Dinesh P .Vibhute, there is variance in the experience as Resident as shown in previous assessment with that shown in the present assessment .In the present assessment, he is shown as having worked as Resident at this Institute from 01/01/2013 to 31/12/2015 –the period which is not shown in the previous assessment dt .21/04/2016 at all. Such retrospective changes are not permissible & he cannot be considered .
3. Bed Occupancy was 70 %on day of assessment .
4. There were only 2 Minor & NIL Daycare Operations on day of assessment .
5. It is clearly written that IPD means total number of patients admitted. Explanation given in an after thought to counter the deficiency.
6. Dr. Gadker G N. Assoc.prof. Unit-I was absent.
7. Prof. & HOD - Dr. Shewale Rajender Narain is in Unit-II. Then how could Vidya Viranchi Narender, Assoc.Prof. could be I/c of this Unit. It means Prof & HoD is not regular faculty.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 29.09.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats and not to renew the recognition for 04 seats granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem in respect of students being trained at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College & Hospital, Puducherry because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty) :a (Asst .Prof :.1.
2. Unit IV has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit .
3. There is no Sr.Resident in Unit-IV.
4. It is not permissible that 3 years training period could be completed after the examination. Deficiency stays as such.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 04 to 05 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

1. Dr .Jayanthi Arulneyam is appointed as Associate Professor without any experience as Assistant Professor of General Medicine .Her experience in Madras Medical College from 14/11/1996 to 27/08/2002 is in Neurology which cannot be considered for General Medicine .
2. One remark was "Dr .Mark Christopher, shown as in charge of Cardiovascular clinic is not shown as faculty in any of the Units". In the present assessment it is stated that he was not present on day of assessment; however nothing is stated about who is in charge of Cardiovascular clinic .
3. Other remark was "Dr .George Kurian, shown as in charge of Gastroenterology clinic is not shown as faculty in any of the Units". In the present assessment it is stated that he was not present on day of assessment; however nothing is stated about who is in charge of Gastroenterology clinic .
4. Dr .Ravindra Bharathi, Senior Resident in Unit 3 is shown to have worked as Resident in I.G .Govt .Hospital from 2013 to 2016 .However he has done DNB in Family Medicine during the same period .It is not specified in the faculty table in which department he has worked as Resident during this

- period .Hence his appointment as Senior Resident is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered .
5. Dr. Ali Hasan K, assoc.Prof. – was absent on the day of assessment.
 6. Dr. Jayanthi Arulneyan – Assoc.Prof., Unit-II, she was AP in Neurology & promoted Assoc.Prof. in Medicine. Hence her promotion not as per regulations.
 7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 3(Three) seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30.12.2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (December, 2014, 06.10.2015 & 05.04.2016) and compliance dated 13.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 10 to 14 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05.01.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014, 23.03.2015 & 06.04.2016) and compliance dated 06.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 01 seat granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr. Panjabrao Alias Bhausaheb Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati because of the following facts:-

1. Dr .A.K .Deshmukh is promoted as Assoc .Prof .after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications "in the faculty table, it is stated "No "implying NIL publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered .
2. Dr .V.B .Lewate, Senior Resident has experience of only 2 year as Resident against requirement of 3 year; hence not qualified to hold the post .
3. Dr .K.H .Agrawal, Senior Resident has experience of only 2 year as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital against requirement of 3 year; hence not qualified to hold the post .
4. MRI still not installed and non-functional.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. There are 2 Units but both the Units have 22 beds each; resultantly none of the Unit has full complement of 30 beds.
2. Dr. V.T. Ranjith is shown as "Associate Professor" in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table; however in the column of "Experience" it is shown as "Assistant Professor" w.e.f. 18/01008 till date. This dichotomy needs to be clarified. Further in the column of "Benefit of publications" it is stated "No" implying NIL publications.
3. As per report dated 7.4.2016 Dr. Jayati Poduwal was Asst.Prof. at this college from 11.08.2008 to 30.07.2010 and 06.06.2011 to 02.08.2013 (4 years 2 months). This has now been changed to 06.06.2011 to 16.06.2014. Such retrospective changes to make the faculty eligible are not allowed.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2014) and compliance dated 02.12.2016 & Undertaking dated 02/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Subharti Medical College, Meerut be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. 1. Dr. Sanjay Kumar Nigam, Prof. He was Assoc.Prof. for 3 years and 4 months against the requirement of 4 years. He has no publications.
2. Dr. Anita Tandon, Assoc.Prof. She was Asst.Prof. for 4 years. No reference of the publications quoted has been given (year, volume, page, author name) without which they cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Parul Josh, Assoc.Prof. – He was Asst.Prof. for 4 years and 2 months. No reference of publications quoted given. (year, volume, page, author name) without which they cannot be considered.
4. Total number of organs/parts/tissues removed after Surgery has decreased from 8,503 in 2013 to 7,631 in 2015 .
5. Workload of total number of Biopsies has decreased from 7,931 in 2013 to 6,856 in 2015 .
6. Workload of CT guided FNAC is only 31 in 2015 & of USG guided FNAC is only 65 in 2015 which is inadequate .
7. Pathological post-mortems are not performed .
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/

compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

106. Dr B R Ambedkar University, Agra, U.P. - Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Rama Medical College and Hospital, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19.12.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats at Rama Medical College and Hospital, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh granted by Dr B R Ambedkar University, Agra, U.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19.12.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats granted by Dr B R Ambedkar University, Agra, U.P. in respect of students being trained at Rama Medical College and Hospital, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Uday Narain Singh, Prof. – He was Asst.Prof. for 4 years and 11 months, in the two publications quoted, no full reference (year, volume, page, author name).
2. Dr. Ipsita Chaudhary, Assoc.Prof. promoted on 14.08.2014 after the cut off date. No full reference of publications quoted given. Hence, her promotion not as per regulations.
3. Dr. Pallavi Anand – Assoc.prof. – promoted on 15.07.2016 after cut off date. No full reference (year, volume, page, author name). Hence, her promotion not as per regulations.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

107. Dr B R Ambedkar University, Agra, U.P. - Recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification from 2 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Rama Medical College and Hospital, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19.12.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pharmacology)

qualification from 2 to 3 seats at Rama Medical College and Hospital, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh granted by Dr B R Ambedkar University, Agra, U.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19.12.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Pharmacology) qualification from 2 to 3 seats granted by Dr B R Ambedkar University, Agra, U.P. in respect of students being trained at Rama Medical College and Hospital, Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

108. Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni - Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (15.12.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 1 seat at Rural Medical College, Loni granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (15.12.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 1 seat granted by Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Loni in respect of students being trained at Rural Medical College, Loni because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Manju Jha, Prof. & Head, was Asst.prof. for 3 years and 1 months against the requirement of 5 years. Hence, her promotion is not as per regulations. There is no certificate from DGAFMS regarding her period and places of posting as Graded/Classified Specialist and Advisor without which her eligibility cannot be decided.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

109. Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of MD (Pharmacology) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at SMS Medical College, Jaipur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (14.07.2015) along with the letter dated 07/12/2016 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the letter dated 09/10/2015 received from the Registrar, Rajasthan University of Health Sciences on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Pharmacology) qualification for 1 seat at SMS Medical College, Jaipur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14.07.2015) along with the letter dated 07/12/2016 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the letter dated 09/10/2015 received from the Registrar, Rajasthan University of Health Sciences and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (Pharmacology) qualification for 1 seat granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at SMS Medical College, Jaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

110. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of MD/MS (Anatomy) qualification in respect of students being trained at Kannur Medical College, Kannur (Trust)- W.P No. 1782/2016 filed by Dr. Shashi Kiran Shukla before the Hon'ble High Court Kerala- reg.

Read: the letter dated 08/12/2016 received from the Principal, Kannur Medical College, Kannur along with the matter of W.P No. 1782/2016 filed by Dr. Shashi Kiran Shukla before the Hon'ble High Court Kerala and Opinion dated 19/01/2017 of the Law Officer with regard to Recognition of MD/MS (Anatomy) qualification in respect of students being trained at Kannur Medical College, Kannur under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the the letter dated 08/12/2016 received from the Principal, Kannur Medical College, Kannur along with the matter of W.P No. 1782/2016 filed by Dr. Shashi Kiran Shukla before the Hon'ble High Court Kerala and noted the following operative opinion of the Law Officer:

"... The file of Kannur Medical College under Kerala University of Health Sciences, for recognition of MD(Anatomy) course has been referred for my opinion. The Principal, Kannur Medical College, vide his letter dated 08.12.2016 forwarded the order dated 18.11.2016 of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in WP©No.1782 of 2016. The order reads as under:-

Petitioner, a MBBS Degree holder has acquired MD in Anatomy in the 2011-2014 batch from the 4th respondent college. The college is affiliated with Kerala University of Health Science. According to the petitioner, her course is also permitted by Medical Council of India even before joining the PG course. Petitioner has registered her MBBS degree in the Travancore Medical Council for Modern Medicine. Petitioner has successfully completed her post graduation and passed the

examination in November, 2014. The 4th respondent has issued a Pass Certificate to the petitioner. Mark list was issued by the Kerala University of Health Science, the respondent No.5. Degree certificate was also issued.

2. However, when petitioner applied for registration in the Travancore Cochin Council for Modern Medicine with required documents and prescribed fee on 17.3.2015, it was not granted on the ground that, MD - Anatomy is not recognized by the Indian Medical Council. Even though petitioner makes her efforts by issuing communication to the Medical Council of India and other statutory authorities, it did not attain any fruitful result. It is in this background seeking appropriate direction this writ petition is filed.

3. Fourth respondent has filed a counter affidavit making various contentions. However, the fact remains that, there was no correspondence by and between the 4th respondent college and the 2nd respondent, enabling the 2nd respondent to approve the MD course conducted by the 4th respondent.

4. Today when the matter is taken up, learned counsel for 2nd respondent fairly submitted that if a request is mooted by the 4th respondent before the 2nd respondent within a time frame, necessary action will be taken by the 2nd respondent in order to ventilate the grievance voiced by the petitioner.

5. Therefore, there will be a direction to the 4th respondent to submit a request to the 2nd respondent within three weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this judgment, which shall be processed by the 2nd respondent, at the earliest and at any rate within a period of three months and attain finality. If there are no other legal impediments standing in the way and other consequential actions shall also be taken by the 2nd respondent in accordance with the action so taken.

Writ petition is disposed of accordingly."

2. The representation/request of Principal, Kannur Medical College, Kunnur dated 08.12.2016 has been received in the Council office on 22.12.2016. As Kerala University of Health Sciences, Central Government and the Council all are parties to the aforesaid matter before the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala, therefore, the issue that the request/representation for recognition is not routed through the Central Government is not material at this stage.

3. The issue here in is that the Kannur Medical College, Kannur was granted permission to run the MD(Anatomy) course under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur. However, since, academic year 2014-15, no admission has been taken place in the said institute and the time of final examination of the 1st batch recognition assessment could not be carried out.

4. It may be recalled that similar situation arose in the case of MD(Anatomy) course of Mahatma Gandhi Medical College, Jaipur wherein the course had been discontinued and at the time of passing of 1st batch the assessment could not be conducted. The Postgraduate Committee in order to mitigate the plight of students who had been admitted on the strength of valid letter of permission considered the matter and decided to carry out an assessment for verification of facilities at the institute.

5. This is a part of the decision of the Postgraduate Committee on 09.02.2016. Thereafter the Postgraduate Committee has recommended for recognizing the course this decision has been approved by the General Body of the Council. The Central Government has also issued notification recognizing the course. The case of recognition of MD(Anatomy) qualification) of Kannur Medical College is similar. Therefore, the above precedent should form the basis of taking decision in this case also.

6. It may be noted that there are time bound directions issued by the Hon'ble High Court to take decision in the matter and it has to attain finality within 3 months from the date of receipt of request of the college authorities in the Council office."

In view of above the Postgraduate Committee decided to approve the opinion of Law Officer and to carry out an assessment for verification of facilities at the institute.

111. Recognition of M.Ch (Cardio Thoracic Vascular Surgery) (CTVS) qualifications for 2 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of students being trained at RNT Medical College, Udaipur- reg.

Read: the letter dated nil received from Dr. Budhi Prakash Bhatia, Jodhpur with regard to Recognition of M.Ch (Cardio Thoracic Vascular Surgery) (CTVS) qualifications for 2 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of students being trained at RNT Medical College, Udaipur along with the opinion dated 20/01/2017 of the Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated nil received from Dr. Budhi Prakash Bhatia, Jodhpur and noted the following opinion of the Law Officer, which is as under:-

"The request received from Dr. Budhi Prakash Bhatia, Jodhpur for recognition of M.Ch.(Cardio Thoracic Vascular Surgery) (CTVS) obtained by him from R.N.T. Medical College, Udaipur has been referred for my opinion.

Briefly, stated the case is that he was admitted in the college in 2013 and the recognition assessment that was scheduled for 17.09.2016 could not be carried out as the requisite documents were received only after the conduct of examination. He has stated that no admissions have been made thereafter.

He has prayed for:

"It is respectfully prayed that the taking into account my future, I may kindly be recognized as Practitioner of M/ch.(Cardio Thoracic Vascular Surgery) (CTVS) as I am not responsible for the non-inspection of the above said institute and course and I have done the said course in good faith from the institute permitted by the Rajasthan Government and University of Health Science, Rajasthan (Jaipur)."

It may be recalled that similar situation arose in the case of recognition of MD(Anatomy) course of Mahatma Gandhi Medical College, Jaipur wherein the course had been discontinued and at the time of passing of 1st batch the assessment could not be conducted. The Postgraduate Committee in order to mitigate the plight of students who had been admitted on the strength of valid letter of permission considered the matter and decided to carry out an assessment for verification of facilities at the institute. Thereafter, the course has been recognized and notification in this regard has been issued by the Central Government.

The Postgraduate Committee may take appropriate decision in light of the above precedent keeping in view the fact that the students has obtained a super-speciality qualification on the strength of valid Letter of Permission and he cannot be made to suffer as there has not been any admission in the subsequent batches."

In view of above the Postgraduate Committee decided to approve the opinion of Law Officer and to carry out an assessment for verification of facilities at the institute.

112. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik – Recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Latur.

Read: the Dean, Govt. Medical College, Latur vide letter dated 08.03.2016 with regard to recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification at Govt. Medical College, Latur granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Dean, Govt. Medical College, Latur vide letter dated 08.03.2016 and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Pharmacology) qualification granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Latur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

113. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (11.01.2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (11.01.2017) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 2 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

114. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification and Diploma in Forensic Medicine for 1 seat each in respect of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (12th & 13th January, 2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification and Diploma in Forensic Medicine for 1 seat each at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (12th & 13th January, 2017) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification and Diploma in Forensic Medicine for 1 seat each granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

115. Teerthanker Mahaveer University, Moradabad - Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Teerthanker Mahaveer Medical College and Research Centre, Moradabad.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (20th January, 2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 2 seats at Teerthanker Mahaveer Medical College and Research Centre, Moradabad granted by Teerthanker Mahaveer University, Moradabad.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (20th January, 2017) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by Teerthanker Mahaveer University, Moradabad in respect of students being trained at Teerthanker Mahaveer Medical College and Research Centre, Moradabad because of the following facts:-

1. Permission to conduct medico-legal post-mortems is not available. There is no mortuary on the campus.
2. Workload related with examination of victims & accused of sexual assault cases is very low –7 & 14 respectively in 2016 .
3. Workload related with age estimation of victims & accused of sexual assault cases is very low –9 in 2016 .
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19.12.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats at Father Muller Medical College, Mangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19.12.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Father Muller Medical College, Mangalore because of the following facts:-

1. It is stated that the Institute is paying stipend to Residents @ Rs .25,000 p.m .which is less than that paid by State Govt .& is contrary to PG ME Regulations .Further, it is also stated the State Govt .is also paying stipend @ the same rates which is incorrect and amounts to provide misleading information .
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (12.12.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 02 seats at Guru Govind Singh Medical College, Faridkot granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (12.12.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Guru Govind Singh Medical College, Faridkot because of the following facts:-

1. Facilities for Retinal Surgery are not available .
2. Equipment like Vitrectomy machine, Slit Lamp Biomicroscope, Schiotz Tonometer, Streak Retinoscope, Non-contact Tonometer, 90 D & 78 D with Slit Lamp, Perkin's Tonometer are not available .
3. There is decrease in OPD, IPD major Operation, Minor Operation and day care Operation in the year 2016. (even after adding average of 1 month more).
4. No facilities for Vitreo-Retinal Surgery.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

118. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 02 seats and recognition against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12.01.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 07.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 02 seats and recognition against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12.01.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 07.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry be renewed.

The Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

119. The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai - Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Stanley Medical College, Chennai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12.01.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 03.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 2 seats at Stanley Medical College, Chennai granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12.01.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 03.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 2 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Stanley Medical College, Chennai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

120. D.Y. Patil Education Society Deemed University, Kolhapur - Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12.01.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 26.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 4 seats at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society Deemed University, Kolhapur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12.01.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 26.10.2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 4 seats granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society Deemed University, Kolhapur in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

121. Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the letters dated 07/02/2017 received from the Dean, Index Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Indore submitting therewith the reply/ clarifications to the Show-Cause Notices issued u/s 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 with regard to increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the show cause notice dated 28.02.2017 and reply of show cause notice dated 07.02.2017 from Index Medical College and the request of college authorities through email 06.03.2017 and personal hearing through Asst. Dean for alternate date for hearing as they are not able to come today. The request was accepted and alternate date be conveyed to the college.

122. Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the letters dated 03/02/2017 received from the Principal, S. Nijalingappa Medical College & Hanagal Shri Kumareshwar Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot submitting therewith the reply/ clarifications to the Show-Cause Notices issued u/s 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 with regard to increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the show cause notice dated 28.02.2017 and reply of show cause notice dated 03.02.2017 as well as the oral submission of the Chairman of the College and the Dean alongwith all the faculty concerned and heard in detail during the personal hearing. They had admitted that variance in the experience dates has been done but no order for this or modified fresh joining reports were submitted at the time of the compliance verification assessment.

The matter was referred to Ethics Committee.

123. Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the letters dated 03/02/2017 received from the Dean, Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu submitting therewith the reply/ clarifications to the Show-Cause Notices issued u/s 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 with regard to Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the show cause notice dated 29.01.2017 and reply of show cause notice dated 02.02.2017 as well as the oral submission of the Vice-chancellor, Dean and concerned faculty and their legal representatives and heard in detail during the personal hearing. Vice-Chancellor and the Dean admitted that variations pointed out in the experience details of various faculty members have been done and no modified orders or fresh modified joining reports were attached with the compliance verification assessment report.

The matter was referred to Ethics Committee.

124. Starting of various postgraduate courses at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the letters dated 04/02/2017 received from the Dean/Director, Integral Institute of medical Sciences, Uttar Pradesh submitting therewith the reply/ clarifications to the Show-Cause Notices issued u/s 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 with regard to Starting of various postgraduate courses at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the show cause notice dated 31.01.2017 and reply of show cause notice dated 04.02.2017 as well as the written /oral submission dated nil received on 08.03.2017 of the Dean, Vice-Dean alongwith all the faculty concerned and heard them in detail during the personal hearing. They submitted that demotion orders had been done but no fresh joining report was obtained from concerned faculty at the time of compliance verification assessment Report. A copy of demotion orders (without joining report) was sent to the Council earlier).

The matter was referred to Ethics Committee.

125. Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at Mahatma Gandhi Missions Medical College, Aurangabad, Maharashtra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the letters dated 06/02/2017 received from the Dean, Mahatma Gandhi Missions Medical College, Aurangabad submitting therewith the reply/ clarifications to the Show-Cause Notices issued u/s 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 with regard to Increase of seats in various

postgraduate courses at Mahatma Gandhi Missions Medical College, Aurangabad, Maharashtra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the show cause notice dated 29.01.2017 and reply of show cause notice dated 06.02.2017 as well as written/oral submission dated 07.03.2017 of the Sh. Sudhir Kadam, Management representative and the Dean along with the concerned faculties and heard them in detail during the personal hearing. They had admitted that during compliance verification assessment. No revised orders or fresh joining reports of the faculty giving changed dates of experience were provided to the Assessor.

The matter was referred to Ethics Committee.

126. Starting/Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the letters dated 02/02/2017 and 04/02/2017 received from the Principal, Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand submitting therewith the reply/clarifications to the Show-Cause Notices issued u/s 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 with regard to Starting/Increase of seats in various postgraduate courses at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the show cause notice dated 29.01.2017 and reply of show cause notice dated 02.02.2017 as well as the written / submissions dated 06.03.2017/oral submissions of the Dean, representative of management and the concerned faculty and heard them in detail during personal hearing. It was brought out that DGAFMS experience certificate issued to Dr. Girish Gupta had been attached with the original assessment report as well as compliance verification assessment. This was confirmed by office and according to this compliance Dr. Girish Gupta is eligible to be appointed Professor.

The matter was referred to Ethics Committee.

127. Starting of various postgraduate courses at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the letters dated 01/02/2017 received from the Principal, Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala submitting therewith the reply/ clarifications to the Show-Cause Notices issued u/s 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 with regard to Starting of various postgraduate courses at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the show cause notice dated 29.01.2017 and reply of show cause notice dated 01.02.2017 as well as the written submission received on 08.03.2017/oral submission of the Vice-Chancellor, the Dean and the concerned faculty and heard them in detail during personal hearing. They had agreed that revised promotion/demotion order and fresh joining report were not attached with the compliance verification assessment report in cases of those faculties in whom variations in experience details were made.

The matter was referred to Ethics Committee.
