The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 27.10.2017.

2. **Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.**

Action is being taken on the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 27.10.2017.

The decision in respect of Item No. 176 of the meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Committee held on 10.10.2017 be read corrected as under instead of earlier decision:-

**142. PC-PNDT – Regarding.**

Read: the letter dated 27/09/2017 received from the President, the Federation of Obstetric & Gynaecology Societies of India with regard to PC-PNDT.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 27/09/2017 received from the President, the Federation of Obstetric & Gynaecology Societies of India with regard to PC-PNDT and discussed the matter in detail and observed that :-

“Requirement of Ultrasound machine with Doppler/ Vaginal probe facilities for interventional procedures is prescribed by Medical Council of India in the Minimum Standard Requirements for the department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology. It is thus implied that these ultrasound machines are for use by the specialists working in the department of obstetrics and Gynecology. Use of Sonography machine is also an essential aspect of Clinical assessment and practice by the specialists in Obstetrics and Gynaecology. However, in this respect a period of training (six months) be made compulsory for Gynaecologists before they are allowed to use the ultrasound machine”.

**143. Inclusion of DM(Paediatric Neurology) in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 – Regarding.**

Read: the letter dated 09/09/2017 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to inclusion of DM (Paediatric Neurology) in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 09/09/2017 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to inclusion of DM (Paediatric Neurology) in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 and noted that the item is incomplete and decided that matter may be brought again before the Postgraduate Committee by PG Section with all relevant details.

**144. Inclusion of (1) DM in Renal and Transplant Pathology and (2) M.Ch. in Abdominal Organ Transplantation course in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.**

Read: the letter dated 26/10/2015 received from Sh. V.G. Vanzara, Joint Secretary to Government of Gujarat, Health & Family Welfare Department, Gandhinagar along with the minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 27/01/2017 and Minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 16/03/2017 with regard to Inclusion of (1) DM in Renal and Transplant Pathology and (2) M.Ch. in Abdominal Organ Transplantation course in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 26/10/2015 received from Sh. V.G. Vanzara, Joint Secretary to Government of Gujarat, Health & Family Welfare Department, Gandhinagar along with the minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 27/01/2017 and Minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 16/03/2017 with regard to Inclusion of (1) DM in Renal and Transplant Pathology and (2) M.Ch. in Abdominal Organ Transplantation course in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 and decided that the recommendations of the Academic Committee as reproduced below are approved:-

*“The Academic Committee meeting held on 27<sup>th</sup> January, 2017 discussed the Office note from PG Committee regarding inclusion of (1) DM in Renal and Transplant Pathology and (2) M.Ch. in Abdominal Organ Transplantation in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000. It noted that the following:*

*Mr. V.G. Vanzara, Joint Secretary to the Govt. of Gujarat, Health & Family Welfare Department, Govt. of Gujarat, Gandhinagar has stated that the University of Transplantation Sciences, Ahmedabad, has planned to start two new courses (1)DM in Renal and Transplant Pathology and (2) M.Ch. in Abdominal Organ Transplantation and requested to include above mentioned two subjects in the schedule of medical subjects list of Medical Council of India.*

*The Academic Committee noted that (1) DM in Renal and Transplant Pathology and (2) M.Ch. in Abdominal Organ Transplantation are not included in the Postgraduate Regulation, 2000. The Committee noted that justification for starting these courses have not been given by the Gujarat University of Transplantation Services, Ahmedabad. **The Academic Committee opined that there is not valid academic reason for recommending the inclusion of the said two superspecialities courses in the PG Regulations as of now.**”*

**145. Inclusion of DM(Regenerative Medicine & Translational Science) and MD (Regenerative Medicine & Translational Science) in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.**

Read: the letter dated 06/09/2016 received from Sh. Amit Biswas, Under Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi along with the letter dated 18/04/2016 received from Calcutta School of Tropical Medicine, Kolkata and minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 27/10/2016 and minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 22/12/2016 with regard to Inclusion of DM(Regenerative Medicine & Translational Science) and MD (Regenerative Medicine & Translational Science) in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 06/09/2016 received from Sh. Amit Biswas, Under Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi along with the letter dated 18/04/2016 received from Calcutta School of Tropical Medicine, Kolkata

and minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 27/10/2016 and minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 22/12/2016 with regard to Inclusion of DM(Regenerative Medicine & Translational Science) and MD (Regenerative Medicine & Translational Science) in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000. The Postgraduate Committee is of the considered opinion that as on date these are research subjects and those universities /institutes which want to work on this subject may do so by creating special chair. There is no justification as on today to start these subjects at broad and super-speciality levels in medical institutions. Hence, the suggested inclusion in PG regulations is not approved.

**146. Change of nomenclature, pay parity, creation of post in Medical Colleges, District Hospitals for Audiologist and Speech Language Pathologist.**

Read: the letter dated 20/03/2016 received from Dr. Krishna Y., Secretary/ President, Indian Speech and Hearing Association, Manipal along with the minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 27/10/2016 and minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 22/12/2016 with regard to Change of nomenclature, pay parity, creation of post in Medical Colleges, District Hospitals for Audiologist and Speech Language Pathologist.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 20/03/2016 received from Dr. Krishna Y., Secretary/ President, Indian Speech and Hearing Association, Manipal along with the minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 27/10/2016 and minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 22/12/2016 with regard to Change of nomenclature, pay parity, creation of post in Medical Colleges, District Hospitals for Audiologist and Speech Language Pathologist and decided that if degree holders are available, they should be preferred over diploma holders. However, in view of the paucity of the available trained manpower, degree in Audiology & Speech Language Pathology cannot be made an essential requirement in medical colleges & district hospitals.

**147. Request to consider Dr. Sarthak Kamath K. as PH candidate to choose subjects of MD-Radio-Diagnosis, MD-Psychiatry and MD-Dermatology.**

Read: the E-mail dated 05/03/2017 received from Sh. Narasimha Kamath K. (Father of Dr. Sarthak Kamath K.), Bangalore with regard to consideration of Dr. Sarthak Kamath K. as PH candidate to choose subjects of MD-Radio-Diagnosis, MD-Psychiatry and MD-Dermatology.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the E-mail dated 05/03/2017 received from Sh. Narasimha Kamath K. (Father of Dr. Sarthak Kamath K.), Bangalore with regard to consideration of Dr. Sarthak Kamath K. as PH candidate to choose subjects of MD-Radio-Diagnosis, MD-Psychiatry and MD-Dermatology and decided to defer the matter and directed the office to put it up again with all relevant updated information.

**148. Preparation of protocol for PG thesis.**

Read: the letter dated 05/10/2016 received from Dr. Abhaya Indrayan, Former Professor, Delhi University, Delhi along with the minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 27/01/2017 and minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 16/03/2017 with regard to preparation of protocol for PG thesis.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 05/10/2016 received from Dr. Abhaya Indrayan, Former Professor, Delhi University, Delhi along with the minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 27/01/2017 and minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 16/03/2017 with regard to preparation of protocol for PG thesis and noted the same.

**149. Inclusion of DM(Paediatric Hematology Oncology) course in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.**

Read: the E-mail dated 19/10/2016 received from Dr. Mamta Manglani, Professor & Head, Paediatrics, L.T.M. Medical College & General Hospital, Mumbai along with a copy of letter dated 28/09/2016 received from the Dean, L.T.M. Medical College & General Hospital, Mumbai and minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 27/01/2017 and Minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 16/03/2017 with regard to Inclusion of DM(Paediatric Hematology Oncology) course in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the E-mail dated 19/10/2016 received from Dr. Mamta Manglani, Professor & Head, Paediatrics, L.T.M. Medical College & General Hospital, Mumbai along with a copy of letter dated 28/09/2016 received from the Dean, L.T.M. Medical College & General Hospital, Mumbai and minutes of the Academic Committee meeting held on 27/01/2017 and Minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 16/03/2017 with regard to inclusion of DM(Paediatric Hematology Oncology) course in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000. The Postgraduate Committee decided to approve minutes of the Academic Committee since DM(Paediatrics Oncology) already exists in the PGMER,2000 and there is no justification of inclusion of DM(Paediatric Hematology Oncology) course in PGMER, 2000.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the correspondence from the college, recommendations of PG monitoring Sub-Committee and Central Govt. letter dated 26.05.2017 vide which the Central Govt. had intimated the procedure to conduct mop up round of counseling which is as under “In order to ascertain the number of seats that still remain vacant after the counseling the State Govt. or the authority designated by the State Govt. shall conduct manual counseling for allotment of students. After the completion counseling, the State Govt. shall determine the number of seats that are still vacant and thereafter shall forwarded a list of students in order of merit, equaling to ten times the number of vacant seats to the medical college so that in case of any stray vacancy arising in any college the said seat may be filled up from the said list. **2. Admission of PG students (Broad-Specialty) at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry for the Academic Year 2017-18 – Regarding.**

The Postgraduate Committee considered the correspondence from the college, recommendations of PG monitoring Sub-Committee and Central Govt. letter dated 26.05.2017 vide which the Central Govt. had intimated the procedure to conduct mop up round of counseling which is as under "In order to ascertain the number of seats that still remain vacant after the counseling the State Govt. or the authority designated by the State Govt. shall conduct manual counseling for allotment of students. After the completion counseling, the State Govt. shall determine the number of seats that are still vacant and thereafter shall forwarded a list of students in order of merit, equaling to ten times the number of vacant seats to the medical college so that in case of any stray vacancy arising in any college the said seat may be filled up from the said list. This letter is addressed to all Principal Secretaries of states UTs.

**3. Admission of PG students (Broad-Specialty) at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Pondicherry for the Academic Year 2017-18 – Regarding.**

5. **University of Delhi, Delhi - Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Maulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi.**

Read:the Council Assessor's Report (17.10.2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Maulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi granted by University of Delhi, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (17.10.2017) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from **03 to 05** seats granted by University of Delhi, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Maulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. J.C. Passey, Professor, Unit-II, has not signed the faculty table. It means he was not available on the day of assessment. Resultantly, Unit-2A is left with only 1 faculty.
2. There are 3 Units but total faculty available are 5 Professors against requirement of total 9 @ 3/PG Unit. Resultantly, there is deficiency of Asst. Prof.: 4.
3. Units 1, 2 A have only 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as PG Units.
4. Unit 2 B has only 1 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit.
5. No Senior Resident has signed the faculty table.
6. Details of patients attending Specialty clinics are not provided.
7. Equipment like OAE is not available.
8. Nil new book has been purchased for Departmental library during last 3 years.
9. Why not assessment for recognition was not done till now when the seats were permitted from 3 to 5 in the year 2010. Permission was granted for increase of seats only till the first batch appeared in examination.
10. The college admitted 6 students in 2010 against the permitted 5 seats which is not permissible.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 03 to 05 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Medical College and Hospital, Guntur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (13.10.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2017) and compliance dated 13.07.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Geriatrics) qualification for **02(Two)** seats granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at MGM Mission's Medical College, Navi Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Read: the compliance Verification Assessment Report (23.10.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Reports (April, 2016 & 17.02.2017) and compliance dated 27.06.2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 10 to 12 seats in respect of student being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the compliance Verification Assessment Report (23.10.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Reports (April, 2016 & 17.02.2017) and compliance dated 27.06.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 10 to 12 seats granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the compliance Verification Assessment Report (05.10.2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 15.06.2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(ENT) qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Kadapa because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. U. Srinivasa Rao, Asso. Prof. was absent on day of assessment; resultant faculty complement is incomplete in the only Unit; hence, it cannot be considered as a PG Unit.
2. MRI is not available.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against this seat i.e. 1(One) seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**11. Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University, Jabalpur - Renewal of Recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (30.06.2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of Recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior granted by Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University, Jabalpur alongwith observations dated 25.10.2017 of the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter pertaining to query raised by O.C. with regard to recommendation of PG Committee to recommend Renewal of Recognition in spite of remarks of Assessor.

Assessor has made the following remarks:

- Registration of Institutional Human Ethics Committee not done.
- Renewal of Institutional Animal Ethics Committee is pending.

In this regard, it is observed as under:

- (1) At Item No. 15 on P.12 of SAF Part I Institution information, it is shown that Institutional Ethics Committee is in place and its detailed composition is also shown which is as per prescribed guidelines of ICMR.
- (2) At Item No. 16 on P.20 of SAF Part II Departmental information, it is shown that Animal Ethics Committee is in place. Further it has applied for Renewal of Registration is pending.

Further, as the faculty, equipment, infrastructure & other facilities are available as per MCI requirement and it is a Govt. Institute, it was recommended for Renewal of Recognition.

Still for minor deficiencies pointed out by the assessor a note will be sent to the college for their rectification. However, keeping in mind that there is acute shortage of faculty in basic departments, these deficiencies were not considered significant enough to hold the renewal of recognition of degree which had been started with proper letter of permission in the year 2010 and already stood recognized. Hence, it was decided by the Postgraduate Committee to recommend renewal of recognition.

**12. Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine/Forensic Medicine & Toxicology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at V.S.S Medical College, Burla, Sambalpur - Correction regarding.**

Read: the letter dated 04.10.2017 received from Dr. Braja Kishore Dash, Professor & HOD, Department of FM&T, V.S.S. Medical College, Burla with regard to correction of Date/Year of examination for first batch to 2000 for Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine/Forensic Medicine & Toxicology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at V.S.S Medical College, Burla, Sambalpur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 04.10.2017 received from Dr. Braja Kishore Dash, Professor & HOD, Department of FM&T, V.S.S. Medical College, Burla for recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine/Forensic Medicine & Toxicology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Sambalpur University in respect of students being trained at V.S.S Medical College, Burla, Sambalpur be recognized from 2000 for 2 seats instead of 2012 and noted that the request is not routed through the Dean and MCI only accepts the correspondence received from Dean. The said Institute may be directed to send the request through the Dean.

**13. Recognition of DMRT course in Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Kerala- representation regarding.**

Read: the representation of Dr. Ayesha Jaleel, Ernakulam, Kerala with regard to recognition of DMRT qualification in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the representation of Dr. Ayesha Jaleel, Ernakulam, Kerala with regard to recognition of DMRT qualification in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kozhikode, Calicut and noted that neither the course was started with the permission from Medical Council of India nor any request for recognition u/s 11(2) was ever made to MCI. The college discontinued the course on its own in 2016. The MCI has no record of any kind regarding this course. Hence, it was decided that the matter cannot be considered. Further, it was also noted that no request has come from Dean of the Institute.

**14. Proposal for inclusion of MD(Laboratory Medicine) in PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 – req.**

Read: the letter dated 09/10/2017 received from the Under Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to inclusion of MD(Laboratory Medicine) in PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 along with the opinion of the Chairman, Academic Cell.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 09/10/2017 received from the Under Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to inclusion of MD(Laboratory Medicine) in PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 along with the opinion of the Chairman, Academic Cell and after detailed deliberations, the Committee noted that the Postgraduate Committee had considered the matter on 17-06-2016 and resolved that

“There are already MD Biochemistry, Microbiology and Pathology courses running in all the medical colleges and they are recognized qualifications. There is no justification to start a combination course of laboratory medicine which will have a curriculum overlapping all these course programmes.” This decision was later approved by the then O.C. on 15-09-2016, Academic Committee on 27-10-2016, Executive Committee on 22-12-2016 and forwarded to Central Govt. on 18-09-2017.

Now the Central Govt. has forwarded on 09-10-2017, a letter dated 18-07-2017 written by Dr. Randeep Guleria (in his capacity as Director, AIIMS, New Delhi (which is the only institute in the country running MD Laboratory Medicine course) to reconsider the matter in the light of above letter. It is recommended in the above letter that

1. M.D laboratory medicine be included in P.G. medical education regulations 2000.
2. To include laboratory medicine as a feeding course for superspeciality courses in Haematopathology, infectious diseases, immunology, medical genetics and clinical hematology.
3. To equate MD laboratory medicine to MD pathology, MD microbiology, and Biochemistry as essential qualification for all those jobs of specialists/teaching cadre in CHS/state health services which include laboratory services.

The Committee decided that the matter be referred to a Sub-Committee which should Associate Experts from the stakeholder departments (Biochemistry, Pathology & Microbiology) and deliberate on the whole issue and submit its recommendations to the PG Committee at the earliest. The following are the members of the Sub-Committee:-

1. Dr. Raja Babu Panwar – Convener
2. Dr. Datteswar Hota – Member
3. Dr. K S. Sharma – Member

**15. Equivalence of DNB with MD/MS – regarding.**

Read: the E-mail dated 01/11/2017& 06.11.2017 received from the Under Secretary (MEP), Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the papers with regard to equivalence of DNB with MD/ MS.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the E-mail dated 01/11/2017 & 6.11.2017 received from the Under Secretary (MEP), Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the papers with regard to equivalence of DNB with MD/ MS.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reviewed the whole issue of DNB equivalence with MD/MS (earlier notifications, correspondence from Govt.& views of Supreme Court mandated oversight committee). In a meeting with oversight committee on 22-9-2017, it was discussed that it is common observation that DNB candidates trained in non-teaching hospitals need practical experience in medical colleges for improvement in knowledge and skills to come at par with those trained in teaching institutions.

It is also a fact that large majority of specialists working in non-teaching hospitals (irrespective of number of beds) have no teaching experience and they are focused on one particular area which is their field of specialization whereas postgraduate trainees need wider exposure. At the same time most of the consultants are working at multiple hospitals and they are provided an OPD chamber for a few hours on limited weak days. Still more important is the fact that in private hospitals (irrespective of their bed strength) all patients are paid patients and they expect to be treated only by the consultant of their choice for whom they are paying. They do not allow trainees to handle them or perform any procedure on them on account of which trainees do not get adequate hands on experience. It will be pertinent to mention here that Medical Council of India does not count private ward beds in teaching institutions as teaching beds.

Fully realising that there is shortage of faculty in newly opened medical institutions, but this aspect alone cannot outweigh the quality of medical teachers to be appointed since that is going to affect the standards of medical education in the country (present and more so in future). After detailed deliberations the Post Graduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision dated 10/10/2017 that:

- (I) Those candidates who pass DNB(broad as well as super-speciality courses) from non-teaching institutions be required to work as senior resident for three years in a teaching institution in the department concerned for appointment to the post of Assistant professor.
- (II) They may be considered eligible for appointment to the post of senior resident immediately after passing DNB without asking them to do 3 years junior residency before appointing them as senior resident.

**Note:** (The Oversight committee has already approved this decision with appreciation.)

**16. Starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 – hearing granted to medical colleges by the MOHFW – Review regarding.**

Read: to review the matters with regard to starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 where the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi granted hearing to the college authorities.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reviewed the matters with regard to starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 where the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi had granted hearing to the college authorities and noted that the Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgment dated 20/08/2015 in Royal Medical Trust & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. Reported in (2015) 10 SCC 19 has in



paragraph 27 of the judgment laid down the mode and manner in which the application for establishment of new medical college, renewal of permission of existing and increase in intake capacity has to be processed, at all stages. It reads as under:-

"27...

*The Schedule giving various stages and time limits must accommodate very possible eventuality and at the same time must comply with the requirements of observance of natural justice at various levels. In our view the Schedule must ideally take care of:*

*"(A) Initial assessment of the application at the first level should comprise of checking necessary requirements such as essentiality certificate, consent of affiliation and physical features like land and hospital requirement. If an applicant fails to fulfill these requirements, the application on the face of it, would be incomplete and be rejected. Those who fulfill the basic requirements would be considered at the next stage."*

The Committee also noted the order dated 31/08/2015 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP # 15043/2015 Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College v/s MCI &Anr., which reads as under:

"...

15. *In the instant case, the application was admittedly incomplete when it was filed. Though there is a dispute whether it was filed before 31st August, 2014. It was submitted on behalf of the MCI that it was filed on 02.09.2014. Be that as it may. Even assuming that it was filed before 31.8.2014, admittedly it was an incomplete application as the essentiality certificate issued by the Government of Maharashtra was not enclosed along with the application form due to which application came to be rejected and delay has taken place for which the petitioner has to blame itself.*

...

20. *On an analysis of the aforesaid decisions, it is crystal clear that the time schedule is required to be strictly observed. ...*

...

23. *Considering the statutory time schedule and that the same is already over and in the facts and circumstances of the case, it would not be appropriate to direct inspection to be made and thereafter a decision to be taken for the current academic session 2015-16 as that would be in breach of the law laid down in various decisions of this Court which is binding. Thus, we direct that the application which has been submitted by the college for the academic session 2015-16 be considered for the next academic session, subject to fulfillment of other requisite formalities, as may be necessary, and thereafter the MCI shall conduct an inspection well-in-time as per the time schedule fixed under the Regulations of 1999. The Special Leave Petition is dismissed with the aforesaid modification. Ordered accordingly."*

The Postgraduate Committee considered all the applications which had been returned by MCI to Central Govt. as they did not fulfill the qualifying criteria as per regulations and have been now sent back by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare for review.

The PG committee has considered the law laid down by Hon'ble Supreme Court in cases of royal medical trust & others v/s Union of India and others (2015) 10 Sec 19 and SLP# 15043/2015 PadamshreeDr D.Y Patil Medical College v/s MCI and others, legal opinion obtained from law officer of the Council and reasons recorded for returning the applications and decided to reiterate the earlier decision of the office and return the applications to the Central Govt.

17. **Prior qualification (entry level) for admission in Super-Speciality Courses – Regarding.**

Read: the matter with regard to prior qualification (entry level) for admission in Super-Speciality Courses.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to prior qualification (entry level) for admission in Super-Speciality Courses and noted that the prior qualification (entry level) for admission in Super Speciality courses has not been prescribed for the following super-speciality courses which have already been included in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 and approved with the following modification:-

Above was approved in view of time bound nature of 10-A applications received. It was further decided that TEQ, MSR, syllabus etc. in these cases (which has also not been approved) should be prepared by the concerned sections and brought before PG committee at the earliest.

**18. Representation received from PA to Director, AIIMS, New Delhi email dated 08.11.2017.**

Read: the letter dated 09/11/2017 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee forwarding therewith the letter dated 13/01/2016 and 08/11/2017 received from the Registrar, AIIMS and PA to Director, respectively with regard to (i) recognition of degrees and fellowship awarded by AIIMS, New Delhi and (ii) change of nomenclature from DM (Pulmonary Medicine and Sleep Disorders) to DM(Pulmonary Critical Care & Sleep Medicine) awarded by AIIMS.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 09/11/2017 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee forwarding therewith the letter dated 13/01/2016 and 08/11/2017 received from the Registrar, AIIMS and PA to Director, respectively with regard to (i) recognition of degrees and fellowship awarded by AIIMS, New Delhi and (ii) change of nomenclature from DM (Pulmonary Medicine and Sleep Disorders) to DM(Pulmonary Critical Care & Sleep Medicine) awarded by AIIMS and noted that the Section 23 of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences Act, 1956 (25 of 1956), which is as under:

*"It is also notified for general information that in accordance with section 23 of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences Act, 1956 (25 of 1956), the medical degrees and diplomas granted by the said Institute shall be recognized medical qualifications for the purposes of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956) and shall be deemed to be included in the First Schedule to that Act."*

In view of above, no further action is required. A list of all degrees/Diplomas being awarded by AIIMS, New Delhi (with nomenclature as it exists) be obtained from Director AIIMS, New Delhi and forwarded to Central Govt. for inclusion in first schedule to IMC Act 1956.

**19. Strategy to increase PG seats by 25% next year – regarding.**

Read: the Central Government letter dated 17/10/2017 referring to the meeting chaired by Principal Secretary to the Hon'ble Prime Minister on 14/10/2017 along with letter dated 31.10.2017 received from Lav Agarwal, Joint Secretary, Govt. of India, MOHFW, Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi, letter dated 01.11.2017 received from Sh. Amit Biswas, Under Secretary, Govt. of India, MOHFW Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi and email dated 13.11.2017 received from Sh. Amit Biswas, Under Secretary, Govt. of India, MOHFW Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi with regard to strategy to increase PG seats by 25% next year.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Central Government letter dated 17/10/2017 referring to the meeting chaired by Principal Secretary to the Hon'ble Prime Minister on 14/10/2017 along with letter dated 31.10.2017 received from Lav Agarwal, Joint Secretary, Govt. of India, MOHFW, Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi, letter dated 01.11.2017 received from Sh. Amit Biswas, Under Secretary, Govt. of India, MOHFW Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi and email dated 13.11.2017 received from Sh. Amit Biswas, Under Secretary, Govt. of India, MOHFW Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi with regard to strategy to increase PG seats by 25% next year and it was resolved that the teacher student ratio for pre and para clinical departments should also be increased as has been done for clinical subjects. However, this will only increase the vacancy percentage in non-clinical subjects as already 60% seats in these subjects are lying vacant.

**20. Information regarding NEET – PG 2018.**

Read: the letter dated 27/09/2017 received from Sh. Dinesh Chand, Deputy Director, National Board of Examination with regard to information regarding NEET-PG 2018 along with the opinion of the Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 27/09/2017 received from Sh. Dinesh Chand, Deputy Director, National Board of Examination with regard to information regarding NEET-PG 2018 along with the opinion of the Law Officer and decided that the syllabus for NEET PG should be prepared by the National Board of Examinations (being competent authority to conduct NEET PG Examination).

**21. Eligibility for the post of Senior Professor in Neonatology.**

Read: the letter dated 26/10/2017 received from Dr. Geeta Gathwal, Senior Professor & Head, Department of Paediatrics, Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak with regard to eligibility for the post of Senior Professor in Neonatology.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 26/10/2017 received from Dr. Geeta Gathwal, Senior Professor & Head,

Department of Paediatrics, Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak with regard to eligibility for the post of Senior Professor in Neonatology and noted that all experience of Dr. Geeta Gathwal is in the department of Paediatrics as Lecturer/Associate Professor/Professor. Hence, she is not qualified to be a Professor in the Department of Neonatology as Professor. She is eligible only to be Assistant Professor in the Department of Neonatology. (on account of her DM Degree in Neonatology).
