The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence was received from Dr. K S Sharma, Dr. Raja Babu Panwar, Dr. (Mrs.) Rani Bhaskaran & Dr. D.J.Borah, Member(s), Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 28th March, 2017.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted the Action Taken Report on the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 28.03.2017

The Dean and other college authorities of Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai as directed vide Council's letter dated 05/04/2017 appeared before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee on 18/04/2017 and they explained their stand on payment of stipend to postgraduate students. They are paying stipend @ rates of Govt. of Maharashtra from November, 2015. As observed from the report of Committee, the arrears of stipend accrued due to lesser payment prior to November, 2015 has not been practically paid. The amount of arrears credited to students account were subsequently reverted back to college accounts by the bank on the basis of loose bank cheques signed by the student in favour of college prior to date of disbursement/credit in their account. Thus practically, the payment of arrear of stipend to PG student prior to November, 2015 in actual term was not disbursed. A covering action in the matter was taken by releasing the payment and simultaneously receiving it back. The arrears amount transferred to the student ranges from 2-10 lakhs, college authorities could not provide notification regarding hike of tuition fee to the Sub-Committee. The tuition is unlikely to be in the range of 2-10 lakhs. The argument by college authorities that amount received from students is tuition fee does not hold any ground since the same was not supported by any documents and was not explained when specifically asked by the committee that fee amount cannot be exactly the same as arrears. This is strengthened from the examples of few cases of PG students of 2013 admission as listed below, to whom disbursement was made in May, 2016:

The same amount was transferred back to the college accounts by the bank.

In view of above, the Committee decided to advise the college authorities to substantiate their arguments with documents that arrears of stipend has actually been paid to the PG students before taking further action in the matter.

3. Starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17th March 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (6th February 2017) and compliance dated 3rd March 2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17th March 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (6th February 2017) and compliance dated 3rd March 2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Procedures like Intra Aortic Balloon Insertion, Stress Echo, EPS/RFA studies are not yet done in the department. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Specialty clinic like combined clinic with CVTS is not yet available. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Equipment for HUTT, EPS/RFA are not yet available. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. OPD attendance on the day of assessment was 42 only and OPD attendance one day before (16.03.2017) was 35 only, which is inadequate.
5. Dr. Ashok V. Deshpande, Senior Resident is possessing the degree of MD (Anaesthesia), hence not eligible in Cardiology.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Sangli, Maharashtra under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

4. Starting of M.Ch. (Urology) course at Government Medical College, Kota, Rajasthan under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20th March 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th January 2017) and compliance dated 3rd March 2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of M.Ch. (Urology) course at Government Medical College, Kota, Rajasthan under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20th March 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th January 2017) and compliance dated 3rd March 2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Deficiency of Assistant Prof. Dr. Nitinlaskary stays as it is. He is DNB from non-teaching and he has no 3 years experience in a medical college when appointed Assistant Prof. and hence not eligible. Resultantly, there is no Assistant Prof. in the department.
2. Promotion of Dr. Sunilgokhroo, Assoc. Prof. is not as per Regulations. He was promoted on 31.03.2016 after the cut off date without any publications. Resultantly, there is no Assoc. Prof. in the department.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of M.Ch. (Urology) course at Government Medical College, Kota, Rajasthan under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

5. Starting of M.Ch. (Neuro Surgery) course at Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under Swami Rama Himalayan University, Dehradun U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17th March 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (3rd February 2017) and compliance dated 1st March 2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of M.Ch. (Neuro Surgery) course at Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under

1. Dr. Amit Handa is DNB from non-teaching Institution. He has no 3 years teaching experience in a medical college at the time of appointment. Hence, not eligible. Resultantly, there is no Sr. Resident in the Unit.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of M.Ch.(Neuro Surgery) course at Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under Swami Rama Himalayan University, Dehradun u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

6. Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Neuro Surgery) course at King George Medical University, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under King Georges Medical University, Lucknow U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17th March 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th January 2017) and compliance dated 25th Febraury 2017 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Neuro Surgery) course at King George Medical University, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under King Georges Medical University, Lucknow U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17th March 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th January 2017) and compliance dated 25th Febraury 2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Professor & HOD Dr. Bal Krishna Ojha was not available on the day of assessment.
2. With regard to promotion of Dr. Sunil K. Singh as Professor after cut-off date, out of 5 publications cited in the list, 3 are case reports which cannot be considered; resultantly there are only 2 research publications against requirement of 4 & hence his promotion is not as per Regulations and he cannot be considered. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. There is no Senior Resident in any of 2 Units.
4. Carotid Doppler is not available in the department.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

1. With regard to the remark "*None of the faculty has D.M. qualification.*", the Institute has asked for exemption as this is a new Super Specialty. However, particulars of special training of 2 years as required in absence of D.M. qualification are not provided in respect of any faculty. Resultantly deficiency remains as it is.
2. With regard to remark "*There are only 18 beds*", the Institute has stated there are 20 beds; however assessor has remarked "*No evidence produced.*" Resultantly, deficiency remains as it is.
3. All Senior Residents & Jr. Residents are staying outside the campus. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Institute is running DNB course in Respiratory Medicine with 4 candidates.
5. DLCO is not available.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

2. The department has no laboratory facility of its own. MOU with Center of DNA fingerprinting & Diagnostics cannot be a substitute for having own laboratory & cannot be accepted. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of DM (Medical Genetics) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad under NIMS Deemed University, Telangana u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (03/02/2017) and compliance dated 04/03/2017 and 21/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. As per MCI Regulation on Teacher's Eligibility Qualification, requirement for Associate Professor in Neurology is as below:-

 - (iii) In the faculty table signed by Dean and Assessor he is shown Asst.Prof. in column of designation and Assoc.Prof. in the column of experience, which is not feasible. Resultantly, there is no Assoc.Prof. in the Department.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

19. Increase of seats in DM (Neurology) course at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (03/02/2017) and compliance dated 01/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in DM (Neurology) course at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (03/02/2017) and compliance dated 01/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in DM (Neurology) course at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2017-2018 from **1(One) to 2(Two)** students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (06/02/2017) and compliance dated 27/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Promotion of Dr. Kiranmai Ismal as Professor is not as per Regulations. Out of 4 publications cited in the list, in 1 he is 3rd author which cannot be considered. In another publication it is shown as "Allied author" which also cannot be considered. Resultantly, he does not have 4 eligible research publications; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. His postgraduate degree is also not recognized.
2. Resultantly there are only 2 faculty in the Unit & faculty complement is incomplete.
3. With regard to the remark that "*The only Unit has 40 beds*", the Institute has submitted that 40 beds are required for 4 seats. This contention is not correct as Regulations prescribe that 10 additional beds are required to the prescribed strength of 20 beds for a Superspecialty Unit; hence a Unit in Superspecialty department cannot have > 30 beds.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in DM (Nephrology) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

22. Starting of M.Ch. (Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery) course at Padmashree Dr. D Y Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune, Maharashtra under Dr. D Y Patil University (Deemed), Pimpri, Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (24/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (3rd February 2017) and compliance dated 07/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of M.Ch. (Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery) course at Padmashree Dr. D Y Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune, Maharashtra under Dr. D Y Patil University (Deemed), Pimpri, Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

1. On the day of assessment OPD only 33, which is inadequate.
2. Deficiency already conveyed at Sr. No.3 stays as such.

3. The department was started in 2004. Dr. Chadrakant Wahegaonkar, Prof. has been given teaching experience from 2000 when the department was not in existence. Hence, it is not permissible. Resultantly, he was Asst.Prof. for 1 year only against the requirement of 2 years and his promotion is not as per regulations.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of M.Ch. (Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery) course at Padmashree Dr. D Y Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune, Maharashtra under Dr. D Y Patil University (Deemed), Pimpri, Pune u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

23. Starting of DM (Neurology) course at U.P. Rural Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Etawah, Uttar Pradesh under U.P. University Medical Sciences, Saifai, Etawah U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (7th February 2017) and compliance dated 18/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of DM (Neurology) course at U.P. Rural Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Etawah, Uttar Pradesh under U.P. University Medical Sciences, Saifai, Etawah U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (7th February 2017) and compliance dated 18/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. Vivek K. Verma, Senior Resident does not possess 3 y experience in Neurology; hence not qualified to hold the post. Contention of the Institute that he is eligible is not correct as 3 y experience as Resident is mandatory for appointment as Senior Resident. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Dr. D. Roy, Senior Resident does not possess 3 y experience in Neurology; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. Resultantly there is no eligible Senior Resident.
4. Interventional Neurology services are not available.
5. As per SAF in report dated 07.02.2017 (page 12 signed by Dean and Assessor) independent department of Neurology was created in September, 2009. Now the college authorities wants to change this date to 03.10.2006, such retrospective changes to make the faculty eligible is not allowed.
6. Dementia clinic and combined clinic are not functional.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of DM (Neurology) course at U.P. Rural Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Etawah, Uttar Pradesh under U.P. University Medical Sciences, Saifai, Etawah u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

24. Starting of M.Ch. (Gynaecological Oncology) course at Acharya Harihar Regional Cancer Centre, Cuttack under Utkal University U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (03/02/2017) and compliance dated 04/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of M.Ch. Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (01/02/2017) and compliance dated 01/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in DM (Neonatology) course at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (01/02/2017) and compliance dated 01/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. One remark was regarding appointment of Dr. P. Suman Rao, Professor & HOD, who could not have been appointed from 2005 as the department was created in 2011. Presently it is stated that she was appointed as Lecturer in Neonatology in Paediatrics from 15/03/2005. Her experience till 15/06/2011 is in department of Paediatrics which cannot be considered for department of Neonatology. Hence deficiency remains as it is.
2. With regard to Dr. Chandra Kala, Assoc. Prof., who is shown as Asso. Prof. from 05/11/2007, her experience till 15/06/2011 cannot be considered in department of Neonatology.
3. Dr. Mascarenhas D. Dylan & Dr. Hema D., both Senior Residents do not have 3 y experience as Resident in Neonatology before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
4. With regard to payment of stipend to Residents @ rates of State Govt. of Karnataka, it is stated that it would be paid from 01/03/2017. Nothing is mentioned about payment of arrears.
5. The department of Neonatology was created in 2011, Dr. Suman Rao P., as Asst.Prof. from October, 2005 to July, 2007 and Assoc.prof. August 2007 to

2011 was in Paediatric Department. Hence, cannot be considered in Neonatology.

6. On assessment day OPD was only 30 which is inadequate.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in DM (Neonatology) course at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

26. Orders of Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in (1) Writ Petition (Civil) No. 12900 of Year 2016 filed by Sh. Aravindh S. Anand & Anor. V/s Medical Council of India and (2) Review Petition (Civil) No. 1136 of Year 2016 filed by Dr. Geetha N. & Others V/s Dr. Aravindh S. Anand – change of nomenclature of MD (Radio Therapy) to MD (Clinical Oncology) – req.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to change of nomenclature of MD (Radio-Therapy) to MD (Clinical Oncology) along with the Orders of Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in (1) Writ Petition (Civil) No. 12900 of Year 2016 filed by Sh. Aravindh S. Anand & Anor. V/s Medical Council of India and (2) Review Petition (Civil) No. 1136 of Year 2016 filed by Dr. Geetha N. & Others V/s Dr. Aravindh S. Anand and approved the following recommendations of the Sub-Committee taken at its meeting held on 24.03.2017:-

“The Sub-Committee recommended that MD(Radio-therapy) nomenclature will be changed to MD(Radiation Oncology) and the matter be placed before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee for its approval.”

The matter be placed before the General body of this Council for its approval.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015, 22.04.2016) and compliance dated 24/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats at Shadan Institute Of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015, 22.04.2016) and compliance dated 24/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Shadan Institute Of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

28. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of ENT qualification for 01 to 02 seats and DLO qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at N.R.I. Medical College and Hospital, Guntur.

Medical College and Hospital, Guntur granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014 & July, 2015 for 1 diploma seat and May, 2015 for 1 to 2 degree seats) and compliance dated 20/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize ENT qualification for 01 to 02 seats and DLO qualification for 1 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at N.R.I. Medical College and Hospital, Guntur because of the following facts:-

1. Faculty table gives no experience details of faculty without which their eligibility cannot be decided.
2. Promotion of Dr. Y. Subba Rayudu, Professor, is not as per regulations. She was promoted on 01.11.2014 after the cut off date without any publication.
3. There is no Sr. Resident in the Department.
4. Promotion of Dr. KVS Kumar Chaudhary is not as per regulations. He was Astit.Prof. for 4 years 8 months against the requirement of 5 years and he has no publication.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 to 02 seats for degree & 1 seat for diploma after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 4. Faculty table not signed by any faculty members.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Unit 2 is headed by Dr. Prasanth Ganesan, Assoc. Prof. even though Professor Dr. T.S. Ganesan is available. No reasons are given for this dichotomy.
2. There is no Senior Resident in any of 2 Units.
3. Dr. Jai Kumar, Asst.Prof. is not eligible as she is DM(Paediatrics Haematology Oncology). This is not acceptable qualification for DM(Oncology).
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. As per college authorities Dr. Rajendra Prasad Butala, Asst.Prof. was promoted Assoc.Prof. on 01.07.2015 and was shown Asst.Prof. by error but as per Assessor he is Asst.Prof. only.
2. Promotion of Dr. Amit Dhond, Assoc.Prof.is not as per Regulation. he was Asst.Prof. for 4 years 9 month against the requirement of 5 years and promoted Assoc.prof. on 04.03.2015 after the cut of date. He has no publication. Resultantly, Unit-IV left with only 2 faculty.
3. Despite directions, the college authorities have not paid the arrears of stipend to PG students. They have adjusted the stipend towards the tuition fee, which is not permissible.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. As per Assessor available faculty on assessment day was Assoc.Prof.-1, Asst.Prof.-3 and Sr. Resident -2. This does not tally with the faculty table.

2. Dr. Meena Kumar, shown Sr.Resident in earlier assessment report from 15.05.2015, now he has been changed as Jr. Resident, which is not permissible.
3. Dr. Raveesha H.S., was shown in the earlier assessment report as Tutor from 04.04.2010 to 31.07.2011, which is now changed as Jr. Resident, which is not permissible.
4. Resultantly, there is a Deficiency of Sr. Resident-2.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. The name and Declaration Form of the person who has been appointed as faculty in Unit-III has not been given.

4. The revised promotion order and fresh joining report of Pagadapally Srinivas are not attached. Deficiency stays as such.
5. Dr. V.Seetha, Prof., Unit-II, was not available on the day of assessment. She has not signed the faculty table.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Sripathi is promoted after cut-off date; however in the list of publications, only 3 research papers are cited against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. Reference of the Institute to MCI circular dt. 03/09/2015 is not relevant as the requirement of publications is a Statutory requirement prescribed in the TEQ Regulations which are required to be followed by all. Hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Although State Govt. of Karnataka increased stipend of Residents w.e.f. August 2015, stipend at enhanced rate is paid by the Institute from June 2016 only; there is no mention of payment of arrears.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 02 to 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2016) and compliance dated 04/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that M.Ch. (Urology) qualification for 2 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Dr SN Medical College, Jodhpur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

64. Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 07 seats in respect of students being trained at Sri Guru Ram Das Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Sri Amritsar.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (07/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 01/11/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 07 seats at Sri Guru Ram Das Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Sri Amritsar granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (07/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 01/11/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 07 seats granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Sri Guru Ram Das Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Sri Amritsar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

65. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification for 01 seat and recognition of DPM qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Dr. Pinnammaneni Siddhartha Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Foundation, Chinnaoutpalli.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 20/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification for 01 seat and recognition of DPM qualification for 01 seat at Dr. Pinnammaneni Siddhartha Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Foundation, Chinnaoutpalli granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 20/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Dr. Pinnammaneni Siddhartha Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Foundation, Chinnaoutpalli be renewed.

The Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that the DPM qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Dr. Pinnammaneni Siddhartha Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Foundation, Chinnaoutpalli recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

66. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Institute of Child Health, Kolkata.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 15/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats at Institute of Child Health, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 15/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Institute of Child Health, Kolkata be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

67. KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum - recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats and renewal of recognition against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 19/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats and renewal of recognition against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 19/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

68. Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of DM(Neurology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Kota, Rajasthan.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2016) and compliance dated 03/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Neurology) qualification for 2 seats at Government Medical College, Kota, Rajasthan granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2016) and compliance dated 03/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Neurology) qualification for 2 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Kota, Rajasthan because of the following facts:-

1. With regard to Dr. Trilochan Srivastav who is shown as Professor, in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "Not needed if he is considered as Associate Professor" which implies that there are NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. Contention of the Institute that they are not needed if he is

- considered as Asso. Prof. is not correct as he cannot be considered as Asso. Prof. unless the Institute downgrades him as such and submits fresh orders along with fresh joining report.
2. There are 44 beds in the department which are divided into 2 segments – 30 teaching & 14 Non-teaching beds. It is not clear who is managing these 14 Non-teaching beds and whether additional staff is appointed for managing these 14 beds.
 3. Dr. Bharat Bhushan, Assoc.Prof. is not eligible. His appointment is in Department of Medicine and he has worked as Asst.Prof. and Assoc.Prof. in Medicine. Hence, not eligible to be appointed/posted as Assoc.Prof. in Neurology Department straight away.
 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 18/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 20 seats granted by Manipal University, Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore be renewed.

The Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that the MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 20 to 22 seats granted by Manipal University, Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

70. The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai - Renewal of recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 05/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 3 seats at Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

71. Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry - Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) and DA qualifications for 02 seats each in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 26/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) and DA qualifications for 02 seats each at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 26/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) and DA qualifications for 02 seats each granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

72. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) and DMRD in respect of students being trained at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 02/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) and DMRD at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 02/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD (Radio-Diagnosis) and DMRD granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Assoc. Prof.: 1 & Sr.Resident -1.
2. CT Scan is not in working order on day of assessment. This was the remark during earlier assessment also which implies that deficiency remains uncorrected.
3. DSA is not available.
4. Dr. N.Venkata Kumar, Sr.Resident is not eligible, he has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 05/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 3 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. M. Sujatha, is not as per regulations. As per faculty table in the earlier report dated 28.04.2016 signed by the dean and Assessor, she was Asst.Prof. for 3 years (7.11.2001 to 6.11.2004) She was shown Assoc.prof. from 7.11.2004 which now has been changed to Asst.Prof. in the present assessment report. Such retrospective changes to make the faculty eligible are not allowed.
2. Dr. Sheeba, was shown in earlier assessment report as Asst.Prof. which has now been changed to Assoc.Prof. from 6.5.2004. Such retrospective changes are not allowed.
3. Dr. M. Sujatha, Asso. Prof. in Unit I came late.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 3(Three) seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015 & 18.04.2016) and compliance dated 26/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015 & 18.04.2016) and compliance dated 26/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad because of the following facts:-

1. In respect of Dr. Mohd. Abdul Razek, experience shown in the present assessment is at variance from that shown in previous assessment as under:

Such retrospective changes so as to make a person eligible are not permissible; hence he cannot be considered.

2. Dr. Jawed Zaheer Siddiqui is shown as "Senior Resident" in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table; however in the column of "Experience", it is shown as "Junior Resident" w.e.f. 12/2014 till date. No explanation is given for this dichotomy.
3. Dr. Khaja Ali Hassan, Asst.Prof., his date of experience has been changed in the faculty table, without any certificate of experience from competent authority. This is not allowed.
4. If the 3 Sr. Resident (Dr. Abdul Rafeek, Khan Sajid Abdul Jabbar and Dr. Jawed Zaheer Siddiqui) had worked as Jr.Resident for 3 years as stated now, why was the same not mentioned in the earlier report. It seems to be only after thought to make the faculty eligible. No proof of payment of salary for the period of JRship has been provided.
5. Faculty Deficiency Asst.prof. -1.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e increased intake from 03 to 05 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. There are no print journals in the library. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Promotion of Dr. M. Tony, Professor, is not as per regulation. He was promoted on 14.01.2015 after the cut-off without any publications. One of the 2 publications quoted is after his promotion and cannot be considered. He is left with one publication against the required 4.
3. Promotion of Dr. Rajeev V M. Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was promoted in July, 2016 after the cut-off date without any publications.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. 1. Promotion of Dr. Trilochan Srivastav, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01.04.2015 after the cut-off date without 4 required publications. MCI cannot consider him Assoc.Prof. it is the institute which has to demote him and submit demotion order and fresh joining report. His publication quoted at Sr. No.2-3 are after his promotion in 2016 and there is no acceptance letter of his publication quoted at Sr. No.1.
2. Dr. Bharat Bhusan, is not eligible to be appointed as Assoc.Prof. His previous experience as Asst.Prof. is in Medicine Department and not in Neurology Department. Hence not eligible.
3. The only Unit has 44 beds which are classified as 30 teaching beds & 14 non-teaching/service beds. It is not clear who is looking after 14 non-teaching/service beds. There is no extra staff in department.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

2. MCI cannot consider Dr. Suneel Kothari as Assoc.Prof., it is the institute/Government which has to down grade him and submit demotion order and fresh joining report to the MCI. He was shown Professor in earlier report and not considered due to inadequate publications.
3. Similarly, MCI cannot consider Dr. Dileep Garg as Asst.Prof. it is the institute/Government which has to down grade him and submit demotion order and fresh joining report. He was shown Assoc.Prof. in earlier report.
4. As per faculty table signed by Dean and Assessor's Dr. Arvind Kumar Shukla, is shown as Professor at SMS Medical College, Jaipur from 01.04.2011 till date. Hence he cannot be considered at Jodhpur.
5. Dr. Mahendra K. Regar, Senior Resident does not have 3 years experience in Paediatric Surgery; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

3. One remark was "Total number of all Major Operations combined is only 191 last year implying daily average of 0.64 which is inadequate." Assessor has reported that "The number of operations has not improved since last inspection."
4. No specialty clinics are run. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. There is nil paramedical staff on regular basis.
6. Nursing staff is inadequate.
7. Another remark was "Total CABG during last 3 years 30, 28 & 39 which is grossly inadequate." In the present assessment, Assessor has reported that "Total number of CABG has not increased more than number." Quoted earlier.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in M.Ch. 1. On assessment day there was no OPD (OPD is held only twice a week). Average of last 3 days OPD was 50 only, which is bare minimum even to start the course. The department already has 3 seats.
2. OPD has decreased from 4856 in 2015 to 4476 in 2016
3. IPD has decreased from 1623 in 2014 to 1595 in 2016.
4. Similarly, total numbers of major operation have also decreased.
5. Deficiencies pointed out at Sr.No.4,5,6,7 & 10 conveyed earlier remain as such.

5. Dr. Verghese Louis, Senior Resident has only 5 months experience as Junior Resident in the subject in a medical college affiliated hospital against requirement of 3 years; hence not qualified to hold the post.
6. Resultantly, there is no eligible Senior Resident.
7. With regard to payment of stipend @ rates of Govt. of Karnataka, it is stated that it would be paid @ rates of Govt. of Karnataka w.e.f. 01/03/2017. There is no mention of payment of arrears.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

4. With regard to remark that eligibility of Dr. Guruprasad Bhosale & Dr. Manisha Modi as Professor cannot be determined as they have stated in faculty table that they are presently PG teaches for M.D. (Anaesthesiology) at Gujarat

University, it is stated that they have given an undertaking that they will withdraw their candidature as PG teachers from Gujarat University as & when permission to start D.M. course in IKDRC-ITS is granted. This is not feasible as it implies that they are teachers for both Organ Transplant Anaesthesia & Critical Care as well as for Anaesthesiology which is not permissible. So long as they remain as PG teachers in Anaesthesiology, they cannot be considered as teachers of Organ Transplant Anaesthesia & Critical Care.

5. With regard to promotion of Dr. Rajkiran Shah as Assoc.Prof. not being as per regulations due to inadequate publications, Institute has stated that he can be considered as Asst.P:rof. This is not correct. He cannot be considered as Asst.Prof. by MCI unless he is downgraded by the Institute and fresh orders with fresh joining report are submitted.
6. With regard to promotion of Dr. Rajnish Nama as Assoc.Prof. not being as per regulations due to inadequate publications, Institute has stated that he can be considered as Asst.Prof. This is not correct. He cannot be considered as Asst.Prof. by MCI unless he is downgraded by the institute and fresh orders with fresh joining report are submitted.
7. Workload of Endoscopic procedures like ERCP is very low – 10 years.
8. Workload of Operations like Radical Cholecystectomy (3-4/year), Haepatojejunostomy (5-6/year) is very low.
9. Stipend being paid to Senior Residents is Rs.45,000/-p.m. which is lower than that paid to first year Junior Residents which is Rs.45,580/-p.m. which is not feasible.
10. MRI is not available.
11. With regard to remark that there is no Sr.Resident, 2 Sr. Resident are appointed – 1 is MD(Anaesthesiology) & 2nd is DNB from GMERS, Sola. They have no experience in Organ Transplant Anaesthesia as such. Hence not eligible.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

2. On Assessment day OPD was 46 only and average OPD of last three days was 35, which is inadequate even to start the course. The Department is already having one seat.
3. IPD decreased from 1678 in 2015 to 1386 in 2016.
4. Total number of neonates on phototherapy has also decreased. Deficiency stays as such.
5. None of 8 Sr. Residents possess 3 years experience in Neonatology; hence not qualified to hold the post; resultantly there is no eligible Sr. Resident.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in DM (Neonatology) course at Seth GS Medical College, Mumbai, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

101. Starting of DM (Medical Gastroenterology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad under NIMS Deemed University, Telangana U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (03/02/2017) and compliance dated 30/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of DM (Medical Gastroenterology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad under NIMS Deemed University, Telangana U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (03/02/2017) and compliance dated 30/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. Nayana Joshi, Addl.Prof. is M.Sc. Genetics Ph.D, which is not acceptable qualification in Gastroenterology.
2. Dr. Sukanya B,, Assoc.Prof. is DNB from non-teaching hospital. She has no 3 years experience in a medical college when appointed as Astd.Prof. MCI cannot consider her in any other rank, it is for the college to demote here and submit the demotion order and fresh joining report. She was promoted Assoc.Prof. without two research publications. For both the reasons she is not eligible to be appointed Assoc.Prof.
3. There is no other Assoc.Prof. in the department.
4. No separate speciality clinic is being run.
5. Deficiency of equipment like EUS remains as such.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of DM (Medical Gastroenterology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad under NIMS Deemed University, Telangana u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

102. Starting of M.Ch. (Surgical Oncology) course at Yenepoya Medical College, Karnataka under Yenepoya University, Road, Deralakatte, Mangalore, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (07/02/2017) and compliance dated 01/04/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of M.Ch. (Surgical Oncology) course at Yenepoya Medical College, Karnataka under Yenepoya University, Road, Deralakatte, Mangalore, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (07/02/2017) and compliance dated 01/04/2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. M. Vijaykumar, Profess is also Vice-Chancellor of the University; resultantly he cannot be a full time Professor and Head in the department. There is no other Professor.
2. Head of Department is Assoc.Prof. which is not permissible.
3. Dr. H.T. Amar Rao, Sr. Resident does not have 3 year experience as Resident in the subject in a medical college affiliated hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Sr. Resident in the Unit.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of M.Ch. (Surgical Oncology) course at Yenepoya Medical College, Karnataka under Yenepoya University, Road, Deralakatte, Mangalore, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

103. Starting of M.Ch (Surgical Gastroenterology/G.I. Surgery) course at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under King Georges Medical University, Lucknow U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (30th January 2017) and compliance dated 29/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of M.Ch (Surgical Gastroenterology/G.I. Surgery) course at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under King Georges Medical University, Lucknow U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (30th January 2017) and compliance dated 29/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory

1. With regard to Dr. Anshuman Pandey, deficiency of not having 2 years training remains as such as Sr. Residency cannot be a substitute for Special Training required as he does not have M.Ch. qualification. Further, although he is promoted after cut-off date, the column of benefit of publications in the faculty table is left blank implying nil publications against required of 4. Hence his promotion is not as per regulations.
2. None of 4 Sr. Residents possesses 3 years experience as Resident in the subject; hence not qualified to hold the post; resultantly, there is no eligible Sr. Resident.
3. Workload of Lino-renal shunt is very low – only 1.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of M.Ch (Surgical Gastroenterology/G.I. Surgery) course at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under King Georges Medical University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The minutes of the items relating to Section 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 were read out, approved and confirmed in the meeting itself.
