**4. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (5th July, 2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 1 seat at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (5th July, 2017) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Pathology) qualification for 1 seat granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Bharat S. Borole, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01.07.2016 after the cut off date. He has only 3 publications against the required 4.
2. Dr. Anagha P. Amale is promoted as Assoc. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column "Benefit of publication" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publication against requirement of 2; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
3. Workload of Biopsies was only 342 in 2016 implying daily average of < 1 which is grossly inadequate.
4. Workload of CT guided FNAC was only 04 during 2016.
5. Pathological post-mortems are not performed.
6. Workload of PT, APTT, TT investigations is NIL in 2016.
7. HPLC is not available.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found



unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14.07.2017) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 2 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Maharashtra Institute of Medical Education & Research, Pune be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

6. **Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 8 to 9 seats in respect of students being trained at SMS Medical College, Jaipur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (14th July, 2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 8 to 9 seats at SMS Medical College, Jaipur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14th July, 2017) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 8 to 9 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at SMS Medical College, Jaipur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

7. **Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (11.07.2017) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (11.07.2017) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Prafulla V Sakhare, Assoc.Prof., is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 15.11.2016 after the cut off date. He has no publications.
2. Bed Occupancy is 70 % at 10 a.m. on day of assessment.
3. There was only 1 Major Operation on day of assessment.
4. Total number of Major Operations in 2016 was 199 implying daily average of 0.66 which is grossly inadequate.
5. Workload of Impedance was NIL on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days.
6. Equipment like Nerve Stimulator/Monitor, OAE are not available.
7. Hearing Aid trials are not available.
8. Neonatal Screening Programme is not available.
9. There is no participation in National Programme for Prevention & Control of Deafness.
10. CPC is not held.
11. MRI is not available.
12. The following procedures were nil during the last 3 years:
  - (i) Myringotomy
  - (ii) Laryngo tracheoplasty
  - (iii) Rhinoplasty
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14th July, 2017) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Skin & VD)

qualification against increased intake from 3 to 4 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Kota because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Devendra Yadav, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted in October, 2015 after the cut off date. He has no publications.
2. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment is 60 %.
3. Average Bed Occupancy of randomly selected days is 37.50 %.
4. Workload of LASER for Hair Reduction & LASER for Pigment Removal is NIL in 2016.
5. Workload of the following procedures is inadequate in 2016:
  - (a) Nail Surgeries: 10;
  - (b) NUVB/PUVA Therapy: 20;
  - (c) Cryo Surgical procedures: 31.
6. Equipment like LASER for Hair Reduction, LASER for Pigment Removal are not available.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Dr. Sumedh Chaudhary is promoted as Assoc. Prof. after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publication against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.

2. Resultantly faculty complement is incomplete in Unit III & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Both Senior Residents in Unit I – Dr. Sagar Raghuvanshi & Dr. Asish Asudani – do not possess 3 year experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post; resultantly there is no eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
4. Dr. Ikrar Raja, Senior Resident in Unit IV possesses experience of only 1 year as Resident in a teaching hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post; there is no another Senior Resident in the Unit.
5. Total number of Minor Operations has decreased from 1,032 to 495 during the preceding 3 year period.
6. Specialty clinic like Fracture clinic, Hand clinic are not run.
7. There are 5 tables in 2 O.T.s implying > 1 table in each O.T. which is not as per norms.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Attendance at Specialty clinics like Postnatal clinic, Family Welfare clinic is very low: 1-2 cases/month.
4. Specialty clinic registers are not maintained properly as detailed in the report.
5. Admission registers are not maintained properly as detailed in the report.
6. Issue of Blood component of randomly selected days is < 1/day.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Dr. Kirti Rana is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left blank implying NIL publication against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
5. Dr. Dalpat Singh, Assoc. Prof., is not eligible. He was Asst.Prof. for 3 years and 7 months only. He was promoted on 22.06.2017 after the cut off date without two research publications.
6. Shortage of Faculty Assoc.Prof. -2, Asst.Prof. -1 & Senior Resident: 1.
7. Workload of DSA is NIL on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days.
8. Workload of CT guided FNAC was NIL on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days.
9. No details pertaining to examination are shown in Part III of SAF.

6. Workload of PSG was only 06 in 2016.
7. Workload of Neuropathological investigation was only 55 in 2016.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Workload of the following was very low in 2016:
  - (a) External Ventricular Drainage: 11;
  - (b) Lumbar Puncture: 14;
  - (c) Evoke Potentials: 14.
4. Equipment like Spinal Endoscopy set, Ultrasonic Aspirator, Stereotactic system are not available.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Workload of Operations like Ear Surgery, Liposuction, Fat Filling, Micro Surgery, Endoscopic Plastic Surgery, Face Lift, Acute Burn care, Nerve Repair, Hair Transplant was NIL on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days.
4. Workload of Endoscopic Plastic Surgery, Fat filling was NIL in 2016.
5. Equipment like Ear Lobe Clamp, LASER are not available.
6. Services like LASER for Scar Removal are not available.
7. Skin Bank is not available.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Dr. Priya Sadawarte is promoted as Assoc. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column "Benefit of publication" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publication against requirement of 2; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
2. Institute is paying stipend to I/II/III year Residents @ Rs. 48,413; Rs. 48,881 & Rs. 49,349 respectively which is less than that paid by State Govt. to Residents & is contrary to PG Regulations. Further, it is shown that the same amount is being paid by State Govt. to I/II/III years, which is incorrect.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Unit II has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Unit III has only 1 faculty & is headed by Asst. Prof.; hence it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit.
4. Dr. Mukesh Suwalka, Senior Resident in Unit I has only 2 y experience as Resident in a teaching hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no another Senior Resident in the Unit.
5. The column "Stipend paid by the Institution to Residents "is left blank. It needs to be clarified whether stipend is being paid to Residents & if so, at what rates.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 04 to 05 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Dr. G. Rama Krishna is promoted as Assoc. Prof. after cut-off date; however the column "Benefit of publications", it is stated "NIL" implying NIL publication against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. Also, details of his Academic qualification are not provided; hence also it cannot be verified whether he is eligible or not.
2. Details of Academic qualification & experience of Dr. Srinivasulu, Assoc. Prof. are not provided.
3. Details of Academic qualification & experience are not provided in respect of any Senior Resident. Similarly Academic qualification for JRs is not provided in faculty table.
4. The only Unit has 60 beds which is not as per Regulations.
5. Workload of Neuropathological investigations was NIL on day of assessment.
6. Workload of EEG investigations has decreased from 1,825 to 1,534 during 3 year period.
7. Workload of Evoked Potentials was only 28 in 2016.
8. Specialty clinic like Stroke clinic, Dementia clinic are not run.
9. In the column "Stipend paid by the Institute to Residents", it is stated "—" implying no stipend is being paid to Residents which is contrary to PG Regulations.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Promotion of Dr. Sanjeev Narang, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 29.11.2014 after cut off date without 4 required research publications.
2. Dr. Navin Jain, Assoc.Prof., was absent on the day of assessment.
3. Equipment like Microwave for IHC are not available.
4. Pathological post-mortems are not performed.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Total number of books in Departmental library is shown as 232. However number of books purchased in last 3 years is shown as 386 which is not feasible.
4. No details of participation in National mental Health Programme are provided.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 10. Faculty table not signed by any of the faculty members.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. There was NIL Major Operation on day of assessment.
4. Workload of USG guided Prostate & Kidney Biopsy is NIL during the period of preceding 3 years.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Compliance is not satisfactory.

No compliance is submitted with regard to the following deficiencies:

- (1) Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 2.
- (2) Inadequacy of Major & Minor Operations on day of assessment.
- (3) Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

With regard to deficiency of inadequate experience of Dr. Biswas, compliance is still not satisfactory. His experience as Visiting Professor at Washington University cannot be considered. Therefore deficiency of his promotion being not as per Regulations remains as such.

Institute has further stated that full compliance would be submitted upon receipt of reply from MCI with regard to deficiency # 2 (i.e. Inadequate experience of Dr. Biswas. This is not correct. Institute is required to submit full compliance with regard to rectification of all deficiencies.

In view of above, Institute be directed to submit full compliance with rectification of all deficiencies.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. 1. Deficiency of faculty remains as such. Deficiency of promotion of Dr. Bala Chander being not as per Regulations also remains as such.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Institute be directed to submit full compliance with rectification of all deficiencies.

  3. Dr. R. Sasikala, Sr.Resident, was absent on the day of assessment. There is no other Sr. Resident in Unit-III.
  4. Dr. R.K. Muthuraman, Senior Resident has experience of only 2 y as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
  5. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 54.40 %.
  6. NIL new book has been purchased for Departmental Library in last 3 years.
  7. The column of "Stipend paid by State Govt. to Residents" is left blank which is not feasible. The column "Stipend paid by the Institute to Residents" is also left blank implying there is no commitment on part of the Institute to Residents which needs to be clarified.
  8. There is no hostel for PG students.
  9. There is no child Psychologist.

4. Dr. Anand A. Verma is appointed as Senior Resident in August 2017; however he is 51 y of age & hence cannot be accepted.
5. Academic qualification & Experience as Resident are not shown in the faculty table in respect of Dr. Priyanka Rana, Senior Resident; which means she is not working in this institute.
6. Workload of Mammography, DSA, CT guided FNAC, USG guided FNAC, as verified by Assessor was NIL on day of assessment.
7. Office space for faculty is inadequate.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MD

3. Dr. P.G. Rathi, Sr. Resident & Dr. S.M. Sonone, Sr. Resident, are not eligible, they have no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident when appointed as Sr. Resident.
4. There is only 1 Junior Resident in Units II, III, IV against the requirement of 2 each.
5. There is a separate Unit formed for managing ICCU/MICU implying other Unit members & Residents are not exposed to training in intensive care.
6. ICU: There was not a single patient on Ventilator on day of assessment. There were very few critically ill patients in ICU. Only 2 beds were occupied in ICCU on day of assessment.
7. Total number of IPD patients has decreased from 41,492 in 2014 to 39,005 in 2016.
8. In table 8, page-5, operations and deliveries have also been filled up, which is not feasible in the Medicine Department. Date is non-genuine.
9. Journals in the Central Library are available only upto December, 2016. No current journal for year 2017 available.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Dr. A.D. Wagh, Sr. Resident, not eligible. He has only 2 years experience as Jr. Resident against the requirement of 3 years when appointed as Sr. Resident.
4. OPD attendance upto 2 p.m. on day of assessment is 101 which is just adequate to start PG course.
5. Gynaec OPD upto 2 p.m. on day of assessment was 41 which is inadequate.
6. There was NIL Major Operation on day of assessment. Average of randomly selected days is only 1/day, which is inadequate even to start the course.
7. NIL bed was occupied in OICU on day of assessment.
8. IUI, ART are not available.
9. Endoscopy is not available independently for this department.
10. Total number of Major Operations has decreased from 381 in 2014 to 229 in 2016. Further, total 229 Major Operations in 2016 implies daily average of 0.76 which is grossly inadequate.
11. Total number of Minor Operations has decreased from 2,556 in 2014 to 2,360 in 2016.
12. Total number of Daycare Operations has decreased from 1,834 in 2014 to 1,561 in 2016.
13. Total number of Normal Deliveries has decreased from 939 in 2014 to 904 in 2016.

5. Average OPD attendance of randomly selected days is only 58, which is inadequate.
6. There were only 02 Major & 04 Minor Operations on day of assessment. Average number of Major Operations of randomly selected days is zero.
7. Total number of Major Operations has decreased from 1,318 to 1,250 during the preceding 3 year period.
8. Only 2 beds were occupied in SICU on day of assessment.
9. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic, Urology clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology clinic, Neuro Surgery clinic, Paediatric Surgery clinic are not run.
10. Total number of patients in OPD in 2016 were 36240.  
Total number of patients admitted (IPD) in 2016 were 37391. IPD is more than OPD, this is not feasible. This also means 124 admissions per day on 120 beds, which is not feasible. Data is non-genuine.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.
