The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (17/02/2017) and noted the following:

1. Bed Occupancy on day of assessment is 70%. Average bed occupancy of randomly selected days is 65%.
2. The only Unit has 36 beds which is not as per Regulations.
3. Total number of Major Operations of all Surgeries combined is only 191 last year implying daily average of 0.64 which is inadequate.
4. No Specialty clinic is run by the department.
5. The column of Stipend paid by Institution is left blank. It needs to be clarified whether any stipend is being paid to Residents or not.
6. Year of passing M.Ch. is not given for any faculty.
7. Paramedical staff is grossly inadequate. Only one retired Perfusionist is working on demand.
8. Total CABG during last 3 years: 30, 28 & 35, which is grossly inadequate.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Cardio Vascular & Thoracic Surgery) course at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

130. Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery) course at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (17/02/2017) and noted the following:

1. The only Unit has 82 beds which is not as per Regulations.
2. On Inspection day, there was no OPD and average of 3 Random days OPD is 36, which is inadequate.
3. On Inspection day, there were only 3 MRI in entire hospital.
4. Total number of IPD patients has decreased from 1,623 in 2014 to 1,595 in 2016.
5. Total number of follow-up patients has decreased from 2,862 in 2014 to 2,494 in 2016.
6. Total Surgeries have decreased from 1,545 in 2014 to 1,410 in 2016.
7. Workload of operations like Endoscopic Plastic Surgery, face lift is NIL during last 3 years.
8. Specialty clinics like Breast clinic, Liposuction clinic, Cosmetic clinic are not run.
9. Services like Liposuction, Breast Augmentation Surgeries, LASER Scar Removal are not provided.
10. Equipment like LASER, Forehead & Facelift Instruments, Breast Dissectors & Retractors, Electric Saw, Silicone Implants, etc. are not available.
11. The column of Stipend paid by Institution is left blank. It needs to be clarified whether any stipend is being paid to Residents or not.
12. Promotion of Dr. P. Ramesh, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He was promoted on 22/11/2016 after the cut-off date. He has only 1 publication to his credit. In the remaining 2, he is 4th Author, which cannot be considered.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery) course at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (14/02/2017) and noted the following:

1. The only Unit has 35 beds which is not as per Regulations.
2. Bed Occupancy is 57% on day of assessment. Average occupancy of randomly selected days is 40%.
3. Services like APC, Push Enteroscopy, Ultrasound Abdomen, Manometry, Paediatric EUS, Paediatric Gastroenterology, etc. are not available.
4. Equipment like Ultrasound, Argon Plasma Coagulation, Paediatric Endoscope, Paediatric Colonoscope are not available.

5. Specialty clinic like Liver clinic, Hepatitis B, C clinic are not run.
6. The column of Stipend paid by Institution is left blank. It needs to be clarified whether any stipend is being paid to Residents or not.
7. Dr. G. Swathi, Senior Resident was not available on the day of Assessment.
8. All the above indicate that clinical workload is inadequate even to start the course.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in DM (Medical Gastroenterology) course at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

132. Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (15/02/2017) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (15/02/2017) and noted the following:

1. Dr. Saraath Chandra Reddy was not available on inspection day. Unit-II left with 2 faculty and it cannot be considered a PG Unit.
2. Two Units have 55 beds each which is not as per Regulations.
3. Unit I, which is the Unit of Professor & HOD does not have Asso. Prof.; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Dr. Rajamani Kamsani, Senior Resident in Unit II does not have 3 y experience as Resident in the department; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
5. Both Dr. Rajiv Reddy & Dr. D. Anesh, Senior residents in Unit III do not have 3 y experience as Resident in the department; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
6. OPD attendance on day of assessment is 24. Average OPD attendance is 25.
7. Workload of operations like Breast Augmentation, Microscopic Surgery, Endoscopic Plastic Surgery, Face lift, Tandon Transfer, hair Transplant is NIL during last 3 years.
8. Skin Bank is not available.
9. Dr. Srinath and Dr. Sarath Chandra Reddy both Unit-III have been appointed as Civil Asst. Surgeon, which cannot be considered. There is no Order appointing them as Asst. Professor. Hence, not eligible to be Asst. Professor.
10. MRI in entire hospital were Nil on inspection day.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery) course at Osmania Medical College,

Hyderabad under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

133. To frame suitable Regulations to incorporate the provisions of combined counseling for admission to both UG and PG courses.

Read: the decision of the Executive Committee of the Council taken at its meeting held on 25/01/2017 on the letter dated 23.01.2017 received from the Joint Secretary, Ministry of Health & F.W., Govt. of India with regard to framing suitable Regulations to incorporate the provisions of combined counseling for admission to both UG and PG courses along with the draft amendment and Justifications.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the decision of the Executive Committee of the Council taken at its meeting held on 25/01/2017 on the letter dated 23.01.2017 received from the Joint Secretary, Ministry of Health & F.W., Govt. of India with regard to framing suitable Regulations to incorporate the provisions of combined counseling for admission to both UG and PG courses along with the draft amendment and Justifications and the Committee endorsed the decision taken by the Executive Committee. The matter be placed before the General Body of the Council..

134. Starting of DM (Medical Gastroenterology) course at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (22/02/2017) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal for Starting of DM (Medical Gastroenterology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (22/02/2017) and noted the following:

1. There is no Professor.
2. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Professor: 1; (b) Asso. Prof.: 1.
3. Workload of procedures like APC, Push Enteroscopy is NIL.
4. The column of "Stipend paid by Institute to Residents" is left blank. It needs to be clarified whether stipend is to be paid to Residents or not.
5. Equipment like Paediatric Gastroscope, Paediatric Colonoscope, Argon Plasma Coagulation are not available.
6. Specialty clinic like Hepatitis B,C clinic is not run.
7. Services like EUS, Manometry, etc. are not available.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of DM (Medical Gastroenterology) course at Kakatiya Medical College, Warangal under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

135. Increase of PG seats in Govt. Medical Colleges – recommended for increase of seats – reg.

Read: the letter dated 07/02/2017 received from Sh. C.K. Mishra, Secretary, Govt. Of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Nirman Bhawan, New Delhi along with the recommendations of the Postgraduate Medical Education Sub-Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee perused the letter dated 07/02/2017 received from Sh. C.K. Mishra, Secretary, Govt. Of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Nirman Bhawan, New Delhi along with the recommendations of the Postgraduate Medical Education Sub-Committee and noted that in exercise of powers conferred by Section 33 of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956), the Medical Council of India with the previous sanction of the Central Government had further amended the "Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000" vide notification dated 31/01/2017, which is reproduced as under:

"...

2. In the "Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000", the following additions / modifications / deletions / substitutions, shall be as indicated therein:-

3. In Clause 12(1) under the heading "Number of Postgraduate Students to be admitted", the following shall be added:-

Provided that in Public funded Government Medical Colleges the teacher:student ratio shall be 1:3 for Professor and 1:2 for Associate Professor if the Associate Professor is a unit head, in all clinical subjects.

4. In Clause 12(2) under the heading "Number of Postgraduate Students to be admitted", the following shall be added:-

Provided that in Public funded Government Medical Colleges the teacher:student ratio shall be 1:3 for Professor and 1:2 for Associate Professor if the Associate Professor is a unit head, in all clinical subjects."

Thereafter, the Medical Council of India had received a D.O. letter No. U.12011/25/2016-ME-I (Pt) dated 07/02/2017 received from Sh. C.K. Mishra, Secretary, Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi addressed to the President, MCI, which is reproduced below:

"I write to you with regard to the amendment notification dated 31.01.2017 in PGME Regulations, 2000 whereby the teacher student ratio has been revised in all clinical subjects in the case of Government Medical Colleges. We thank MCI for this measure which was urgently required to increase the number of PG seats in the country.

2. *A perusal of the existing regulations would suggest that the Departments of General Medicine, General Surgery and OBG, to be recognised for training of PG students shall have at least 60 beds. All other clinical departments would need to have minimum 30 beds. Further, a unit shall normally have 30 beds and a minimum of 3 full time faculty of whom one shall be a Professor, one Associate Professor and one Assistant Professor. The second or subsequent unit may be headed by an Associate Professor.*

3. *As a corollary to the above, MCI may recommend that in Government Medical Colleges in the Departments of Medicine, Surgery and OBG which are already running PG courses, minimum of 6 PG seats and 4 PG seats in all other clinical departments may be granted effective from academic session 2017-18. This may be proposed by MCI as one time measure on its own. There is usually no dearth of clinical material in government hospitals.*

4. *Other than the minimum seats as above, MCI is requested to compute the admissibility of PG seats as per the revised norms and the actual availability of units/*

faculty in the departments. States have been requested to furnish the requisite information on unit/faculty availability to MCI to facilitate the decision.

5. Such permissions are contemplated to be in exemption of Section 10A and shall be eligible for grant of recognition u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, after obtaining approval of Oversight Committee.

6. While requesting for this one time increase, I may also draw your kind attention to the budget speech 2017-18 wherein the Central Government has decided to increase 5000 PG seats in the country. May I therefore suggest that the seat creation may be done expeditiously so that they accrue in the academic year 2017-18 itself."

The above matter along with the letter dated 07.02.2017 was placed before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee at its meeting held on 13/02/2017 and the Committee decided as under:

"...

As desired by Central Government in the letter reproduced above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted the information sought by the Central Government/ MCI office in this regard from all Government Medical Colleges, which are already running Postgraduate courses about the available eligible Professors and Assoc. Professors working in their colleges for consideration of the grant of additional PG seats to them as desired by the Central Government. They should also supply the number of clinical units and beds in each department and declaration form (duly filled) of each Professor and Assoc. Professor giving their experience details in different ranks, their appointment/ promotion dates and print out/ reprint of Research publications to their credit in Indexed Journals during the period they were working in different ranks (only those articles in which, they were first or 2nd Author). All this information is required to decide their eligibility to be Professor/ Assoc. Professor for grant of additional PG seats.

However, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that no seat be given to those:

1. Whom MCI has already denied PG seats for the academic year 2017-18.
2. Promotion of Professor/ Assoc. Professor should be as per MCI Regulations fulfilling the required time period and necessary publications, if promotion is after cut-off date.
3. The department must fulfill the criteria of required number of units/ beds as per Regulations."

In the meantime, the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi had already communicated to all the DME/ Colleges to send the requisite information on unit/faculty availability to MCI to facilitate the decision.

Thereafter, the Medical Council of India vide Circulars dated 09/02/2017, 13/02/2017 and 16/02/2017 had also communicated to the Dean/ Principal of all the Government Medical Colleges; the Director of all the Postgraduate Medical Institutes and the Director, Medical Education, all the states to submit department-wise information with regard to details of teaching faculty i.e. Professor and Assoc. Professor with their designation-wise teaching experience, the number of units as well as unit-wise bed strength of only clinical degree courses, which are recognized/ permitted by the MCI/ MOHFW.

All the information received from the Government Medical Colleges/ Govt. PG Institutes till 23/02/2017 was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee at its meeting held on 23/02/2017. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee had considered all the applications, which were received as per format sent by MCI and which contained information about faculty/ units/ beds in every unit/

Declaration Forms of faculty with supporting documents, etc. and decided to recommend to the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi as under:
