1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 5th June, 2017.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted the Action Taken Report on the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 5th June, 2017.

3. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of DGO qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015 & 21.03.2016 & 07.10.2016) and compliance dated 27/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DGO qualification for 2 seats at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015 & 21.03.2016 & 07.10.2016) and compliance dated 27/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DGO qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

4. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at MNR Medical College, Sangareddy.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015 & 01.04.2016 & 05.10.2016) and compliance dated 23/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats at MNR Medical College, Sangareddy granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015 & 01.04.2016 & 05.10.2016) and compliance dated 23/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 06 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at MNR Medical College, Sangareddy because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. B. Madhu Mohan Reddy, Professor is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 12.10.2016 after the cut of date. Two out of Four publications are case reports which cannot be considered. Hence, his promotion is not as per regulations.

2. Promotion Dr. N. Amarendra Prasad, Assoc. Prof., is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01.06.2016 after the cut of date. He has no publications.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 04 to 06 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

5. **The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015 & 04.04.2016 & 04.10.2016) and compliance dated 22/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (11/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015 & 04.04.2016 & 04.10.2016) and compliance dated 22/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Chengalpattu Medical College, Chengalpattu because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. T. Raghupathy, Prof., Unit-I was shown as Prof. from 01.01.2014 in the report dated 04.04.2016. His earlier experience prior to this was as Assoc.prof.. Now in the present assessment report he has been shown Professor from 19.05.2007. Such retrospective changes to make the faculty eligible are not allowed.
2. Promotion of Dr. Sankar Lingam, Associate Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 10.06.2016 after the cutoff date. He has no publication against the required 2. Hence his promotion is not as per Regulations.
3. Designation of Dr. Periasamy is shown as "Professor/Associate Professor" in the column of "Designation" as well as in the column of "Experience" in the

faculty table which is not feasible. There is no such designation. He has to be either Prof. or Assoc.Prof..

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 03 to 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

Note: The Dean and faculty concerned should be asked to given his clarification about the deficiency at Sr. No.1.

6. **Saurashtra University, University Road, Rajkot - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats in respect of students being trained at M. P. Shah Medical College, Jamnagar, Gujarat.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 29/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at M. P. Shah Medical College, Jamnagar, Gujarat granted by Saurashtra University, University Road, Rajkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2016) and compliance dated 29/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by Saurashtra University, University Road, Rajkot in respect of students being trained at M. P. Shah Medical College, Jamnagar, Gujarat be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

7. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 05/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016) and compliance dated 05/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

8. Vinayaka Mission's University, salem - Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015, 01.03.2016 & 29.09.2016) and compliance dated 16/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 4 seats at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, salem.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015, 01.03.2016 & 29.09.2016) and compliance dated 16/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 4 seats granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, salem in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

9. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Renewal of recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 01 seat and DGO qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr BR Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (23/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 25/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 01 seat and DGO qualification for 02 seats at Dr BR Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (23/03/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 25/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 01 seat and DGO qualification for 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Dr BR Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Shakila Shetty is promoted as Professor & HOD after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered. No experience details have been given about previous ranks without which her eligibility cannot be decided.
2. Dr. Vijaykumar Koravi, Senior Resident in Unit I has experience of only 8 m as Junior Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
3. Dr. Madhuri Saha, Senior Resident in Unit II does not have any experience as Junior Resident in a medical college affiliated teaching hospital before

appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.

4. OPD attendance on day of assessment till 2 p.m. was only 94 which is inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. MS(OBG) for 01 seat and DGO for 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

10. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr Vaishampayan Memorial Medical College, Solapur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 01/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Dr Vaishampayan Memorial Medical College, Solapur granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 01/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr Vaishampayan Memorial Medical College, Solapur because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. P.H. Waghmare, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01.01.2016 after the cut of date. He has only 1 publication against the required 2.
2. The 1st assessment was held in May, 2014 and no compliance was given by now during the last 3 years. Admissions done, if any, during this period are illegal, not as per regulations.
3. Blood Component Separation Facility is still not available.
4. Dr. K.V. Ingole is promoted as Professor after cut-off date on 06.06.2015; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left

blank implying NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 02 to 03 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

11. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Renewal of recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahadevappa Rampure Medical College, Gulbarga.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 03/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at Mahadevappa Rampure Medical College, Gulbarga granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (02/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 03/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Social & Preventive Medicine / Community Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Mahadevappa Rampure Medical College, Gulbarga be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

12. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of MD (Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 04/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 04/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (Forensic Medicine) qualification for 1 seat granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

13. North-Eastern Hill University - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2014) and compliance dated 15/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong granted by North-Eastern Hill University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2014) and compliance dated 15/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats granted by North-Eastern Hill University in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Assoc. Prof.: 1.
5. Promotion of Dr. Mohd Yunus, Addl.Prof., is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years. He has no publication. In the earlier report he was shown Asst.Prof. from 01.02.2005 to 28.08.2008, which has now been changed in the present assessment report from 29.08.2005 to 28.08.2008. Such retrospective changes to make the faculty eligible are not allowed.
2. Promotion of Dr. Nari Mary Lyngdoh, Assoc.Prof., is not as per regulations. She was Asst.Prof. for 4 years 6 months against the requirement of 5 years. And she has no publication.
3. Central O₂ and Central Suction are not available.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 02 to 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. 1. Dr. Radhe Shyam, Professor & HOD is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publication against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Gurinder Singh, Assoc.Prof in Unit II, was not available on the day of assessment.
3. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
4. There is no Senior Resident in Unit II.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and compliance dated 21/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch.(Neuro Surgery) qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at N.R.I. Medical College and Hospital, Guntur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. M. Rama Krishna Reddy is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table it is stated "No" implying NIL publication against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. None of 2 Senior Residents has 3 years' experience in Neurosurgery before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no eligible Senior Resident.
3. On the day of assessment, OPD was 52, which is bare minimum to start the course.
4. The first assessment was in November, 2014, no compliance has been received till, the present one during the last 3 years. Admission done if any during this period is illegal and not as per regulations.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015 & 31.03.2016) and compliance dated 06/03/2017 submitted by the college

authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Immuno Haematology & Blood Transfusion) qualification for 02 seats granted by Manipal University, Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

29. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at ESI & PGIMSR Manicktala, Kolkata.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 08/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 1 seat at ESI & PGIMSR Manicktala, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 08/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesia) qualification for 1 seat granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at ESI & PGIMSR Manicktala, Kolkata because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of faculty for Institute running only PG courses (faculty deficiency calculated for 50 MBBS): Asst. Prof.: 2.
2. Dr. Biswas is promoted as Assoc. Prof. with experience of only 3 y 5 m as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 y as per TEQ Regulations which being Statutory Regulations are mandatory & binding & are required to be followed by all. Resultantly his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. There were only 04 Major Operations & 3 Minor Operations for the whole hospital on day of assessment, which is inadequate.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(One) seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

31. Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot - Renewal of recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (18.06.2016) and compliance dated 28/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/04/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (18.06.2016) and compliance dated 28/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 02 seats granted by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot in respect of students being trained at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana because of the following facts:-

1. There is no Assoc. Prof. in the only Unit; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

32. D.Y. Patil Education Society Deemed University, Kolhapur - Renewal of recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 19/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society Deemed University, Kolhapur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 19/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat granted by D.Y. Patil Education Society Deemed University, Kolhapur in respect of students being trained at Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Kolhapur be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

33. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (15.04.2014 and 30.06.2015) and compliance dated 31/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (15.04.2014 and 30.06.2015) and compliance dated 31/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. J. Suchitra, Senior Resident, Unit II, does not have 3 year experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. Other 2 Senior Residents in the Unit, Dr. A. Saranyaa & Dr. R. Sumathi were absent on day of assessment; resultantly there is no eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
2. OPD attendance on day of assessment was only 95 which included 20 children for immunization which is inadequate even to start PG course.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 02 to 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

Mandal University, Bihar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (16/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (September, 2015) and compliance dated 17/03/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 2 seats and DCH qualification for 1 seat granted by B.N. Mandal University, Bihar in respect of students being trained at Kathiar Medical College, Kathiar be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

35. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 05.04.2016) and compliance dated 25/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats at Government Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 05.04.2016) and compliance dated 25/03/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Anuja Elizabeth George, Professor, is not as per regulations. She was promoted on 03.08.2016 after the cut of date without any publication.
2. Promotion of Dr. S. Pradeep Nair, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 15.08.2016 after the cut of date without any publication.
3. There is no Assoc. Prof. in Unit D1; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. There is no Senior Resident in Unit I.
5. Dr. M. Sruthi, Senior Resident in Unit D2 is part time & hence cannot be considered. There is no other eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
6. Bed Occupancy is 36.70 % on day of assessment. Average bed occupancy of randomly selected days is 46 % .
7. Workload of the following procedures is NIL in last year:
 - (a) Acne Surgery;
 - (b) Skin Grafting Procedures;
 - (c) Nail Surgeries;
 - (d) LASER Procedures.
8. Equipment for LASER procedures are not available.
9. Details of research publications from the department in last 3 years are not provided.
10. Only E-journals are available in the Central Library.
11. Prescribed SAF has not been used.
12. Reply to the deficiencies pointed out earlier not given.
13. Column No.7, 8, 9,26,27,28 & 29 of the SAF have been left blank.
14. There is no publication during the last 3 years.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 03 to 05 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. 36. Recognition of DM(Gastroenterology) qualification for one seat in respect of student being trained at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sheikhpura, Patna since 2014- reg.

Read: the letter dated 13/05/2017 received from the Dean, Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sheikhpura, Patna with regard to recognition of DM(Gastroenterology) qualification for one seat in respect of student being trained at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sheikhpura, Patna since 2014.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 13/05/2017 received from the Dean, Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sheikhpura, Patna and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DM(Gastroenterology) qualification for 01 seat granted by Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences(Deemed University), Patna in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sheikhpura, Patna be recognised on or after 2014 instead of 2015.

37. Recognition of various P.G. Courses of NIMS, Jaipur – Court Order received from Hon'ble Delhi High Court – regarding.

Read: the Court Order dated 28.04.2017 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi received through Legal Section, MCI with regard to recognition of various P.G. Courses of National Institute of Medical Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Court Order dated 28.04.2017 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in Dr. Shivendra Kumar Singh & Ors. v/s. Bhanu Pratap & Ors – contempt case No.882 of year 2016 in the Hon'ble Delhi High Court. The relevant part of the order reads as under:

"....

6. Before parting with this case, this Court once again reiterates that it is not understood as to why the petitioners students who had completed their specialization/post-graduate courses were not allowed to take benefit of their new degrees/qualifications for a considerable period of time. If, as according to the MCI, the respondent No.3 was not rectifying the deficiencies, then the Institute had to be penalized and not the students. By depriving the petitioners students of their post-graduate degrees and / or by not allowing them to appear in the super specialization examination, injustice has been perpetrated upon the petitioners students who are blameless and who had taken admission through open competitive examination on the strength of letter of permission granted by the MCI/UOI to the Specialization/post-graduate courses.

7. This Court suggests that in the event the medical institute does not remove the deficiencies within a reasonable period of time, then it should be saddled with exemplary costs and its recognition for other course should be withdrawn. But as the penalty for non-compliance has to be stipulated by MCI/UOI, this Court leaves the final decision to be taken by the MCI/UOI."

In view of above suggestions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee after deliberations decided to make following addition to Regulation 6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000.

(1) Addition in clause 6(1) of PGMER

The prior permission granted by the Central Government for Postgraduate Degree/Postgraduate Diploma courses shall be for three and two academic years respectively.

(2) Addition in clause 6 (2) of PGMER

In the event of deficiencies being found in the assessment, the Institution shall be granted an opportunity to submit compliance within 30 days from the date of communication of deficiencies by the Council twice. 10. On the day of assessment OPD was 112, it is bare minimum to start the course and does not justify for increase in PG seats from 5 to 8.
11. No proof of resident submitted by Dr. Harsha Vardhan Reddy, Asst.Prof. and Dr. K.Sankar, Asst.Prof. and Dr. G.Paul Kiran, Asst.Prof.
12. No MD degree was available in case of Dr. N.Sechassayana, Ast.Prof.
13. No ID proof was submitted by Dr.S.Ganesh and Dr. Uma Sudhan E. both Jr. Residents.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

2. OPD attendance is only 74 on day of assessment.
3. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment is 45 %.
4. There was only 1 Major, 1 Minor & Nil Daycare Operation, 2- Caesarian Section, & 1- deliveries on day of assessment, which is inadequate.
5. From the last 3 years data, average daily deliveries was 2.5 & Caesarian Section 1.9, which is grossly inadequate.
6. There were only 1 death out of 3847 admitted patients, which indicates that no complicated deliveries or real sick patients are admitted.
7. Total number of patients admitted last year (IPD) is 3847.
Total number of Major and Minor Operations (excluding day care) and deliveries and caesarians Section was 4144 which is more than number of admitted patients which is not feasible. The data is fictitious and is an attempt to provide misleading information.
8. There was no woman in the labour room at the time of taking the round.
9. Routine post-operative cases were kept in HDU.
10. There are only 3 cabins for examination of patients in OPD where Specialty clinics are also run.
The records produced for the clinics seems to be inflated and fake. In the family planning register, the entries for Tubectomy have the ages of the women written as 45 years, 55 years, 56 and also 58 years. High risk pregnancy register has main diagnosis of anemia and UTI, meaning thereby that no other high risk factor cases are visiting the hospital.
11. Data of clinical material provided by Institute seems to be inflated.
12. Prenatal diagnosis services are not available.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

4. Faculty table not signed by any of the faculty members.
5. 30 beds in Emergency Medicine department are bifurcated in 2 hospitals at Miraj & Sangli which is not permissible. Casualty beds are counted towards these beds which is not permissible.
6. Experience details of the faculty in different ranks and departments are not given.
7. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment is 40 %.
8. Instruments are inadequate as detailed in the report.
9. Departmental Library has only 40 books. There is no book on Emergency Medicine. NIL books have been purchased during last 3 years.
10. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 06 on day of assessment.
11. Blood Bank of GMC Miraj is not functional.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MD (Emergency Medicine) course at Government Medical College, Miraj, Sangli, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

10. Bed occupancy in dialysis section was 66%.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

PG Admission Rules are specific that no candidate who has secured < 50 % marks can be admitted. On perusal of the Rank List of General Quota Candidates issued by the Office of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Thiruvananthapuram, it is seen that score of Paper 1, paper 2, Total score and Rank is provided. However, the Maximum marks out of which such score is obtained is not stated. Therefore, the Institute be asked to obtain Maximum marks of each paper from the Office of the Commissioner for Entrance Examination, Thiruvananthapuram within 3 days from the receipt of the Council letter, and in the event it is observed that the combined percentage of marks obtained by Dr. Ancil George Thomas in Paper I and paper II is below 50%, then he should be discharged as these marks have to

be considered with reference to the whole of Examination and not with reference to either paper. Institute be asked to submit compliance within 2 weeks. With regard to non-payment of stipend to Residents, Sub-committee has observed that explanation of college that they are in service candidates receiving salary from State Govt. be accepted.

42. Rohilkhand Medical College, Bareilly, U.P.

Sub-committee has accepted submission of the Institute that there is no consensual agreement with State Govt.; hence admissions are in order.

With regard to non-payment of stipend to Residents, Sub-committee has observed that explanation of college that they are in service candidates receiving salary from State Govt. be accepted.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that in respect of Government Medical Colleges wherein the seats on MCI website /records is shown as Recognized and intake capacity is shown as Zero, or less than what they have been admitting for many years (prior to introduction of Section 10A) the admission made by these Government Medical Colleges against these seats till the academic year 2017-18 be accepted. However, for admission from the academic year 2018-19 onwards the process of renewal of recognition as prescribed in Regulation 6(4)(5) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation 2000 be immediately initiated and number of seats depending upon the available faculty and infrastructure be fixed.

All such Government Medical Colleges be informed accordingly. The intake capacity for future admissions shall be determined on the basis of assessment conducted for renewal of recognition.
