1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The minutes of the meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee held on 10.01.2017 confirmed.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

Minutes of the meetings dated 30.12.2016 and 10.01.2017 are still not received from the Oversight Committee. Action has been taken by the Council on the directions of the Ministry of Health & F.W. vide their letter dt. 25.01.2017 subject to approval of Oversight Committee.

3. Starting of MD (Physiology) course at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (6th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th August 2016) and compliance dated 14th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow for Starting of MD (Physiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (6th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th August 2016) and compliance dated 14th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. With regard to Dr. Seema Singh, Professor & HOD, experience shown in earlier assessment dt. 30/08/2016 & present assessment are at variance as under:

Such retrospective changes made by the Principal to make her appear as eligible are not permissible. Further her date of promotion in the present assessment is shown as 12/07/2016 which was before the date of previous assessment – i.e. 30/08/2016 which also is not permissible. Hence she cannot be considered.

Her promotion is not as per Regulations, she was promoted Professor after the cut-off date. In the publication quoted at Sl. No. 3 & 4 neither name of the Journal and reference nor Author name has been given without which, they cannot be considered.

Further, the college got first Letter of Permission to start MBBS course on 13/07/2013. Dr. Seema Singh has been shown Assoc. Professor from 16/12/2011 when the college was not in existence and it is not feasible.

2. Dr. RubinaBano has been shown Assoc. Professor from 27/06/2013 to 30/08/2013 in the report dated 06/01/2017. However, this period is not shown in earlier report dated 30/08/2016 and there is no certificate of this experience attached. Her Promotion is not as per Regulations. She was Assoc. Professor for 3 years against the requirement of 4 years and she was promoted Professor after the cut-off date. She has only 3 publications against the requirement of 4.
3. Dr. SMA Waseem Asst. Professor was absent on the day of Assessment.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Physiology) course at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences

& Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. Seema Singh, Professor, Deptt. Of Physiology brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in postgraduate course in Physiology course at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for Physiology course at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/01/2017 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

4. Starting of MD (Pharmacology) course at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (5th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th August 2016) and compliance dated 14th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow for Starting of MD (Pharmacology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (5th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th August 2016) and compliance dated 14th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. On the day of compliance verification assessment, both Dr. M.S. Sawadkar, Professor and Dr. Ahmed Najmi, Asso. Prof. are on winter vacation. Dr. Ahmed Najmi, Asso. Prof. has joined only on 07/12/2016 and has never been verified even once at this institute.
2. Promotion of Ahmed Najmi, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 4 years 3 months without any publications.
3. On day of assessment only 1 Asst. prof. & 2 Tutors are available.
4. Clinical Pharmacology laboratory is only in a small room with only 2 beds.
5. Animal House is not available in the Institute. It is located in Pharmacy college which is not permissible. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Pharmacology) course at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. Seema Singh, Professor, Deptt. Of Physiology brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. 2. Permission to conduct medico-legal post-mortems is not available.
3. Permission for carrying out other medico-legal work is still awaited.
4. Open Mortury with Fly Proofing not available.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Promotion of Dr. M. MahboobUIHaque, Professor & HoD is not as per Regulations. He was Assoc. Professor for 3 years 1 month and promoted Professor on 08/02/2016 after the cut-off date. He has 3 publications against the requirement of 4.
2. In Embryology laboratory, Chick embryo slides are not available. Facilities are inadequate.
3. Neuro Anatomy laboratory is still not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Genetics laboratory is not available in this department. Even so, no instruments pertaining to Cytogenetics are available. Karyotyping facilities are not available. Hence facilities are inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (6th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th August 2016) and compliance dated 14th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow for Starting of MD (Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (6th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th August 2016) and compliance dated 14th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. Pradeep Tandon, Professor & HOD is appointed as Professor after cut-off date; however there are only 3 publications to his credit against requirement of 4 as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Veenu Jain is promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of “Benefit of publications” in the faculty table, it is stated

“No” implying NIL publications against requirement of 2 as per Regulations; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered. However as the deficiency is not shown previously, not shown now.

3. Frozen Section is yet to be started. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Pathological post-mortems are not performed. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Tests on HPLC have not yet started. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. Workload of CT guided FNAC is only 3 in 2016. On day of assessment it was NIL.
7. Workload of Bone Marrow Biopsy; TT investigation was NIL on day of assessment.
8. Workload of USG guided FNAC is only 101 in 2016 which is inadequate. Deficiency remains as it is.
9. Materials available for Pathological examination is available in lesser quantities on day of assessment as detailed in the report.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Equipment like Holter is not available. Bronchoscope is not available in the department.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior under MP Medical Science University, Jabalpur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

28. Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior under MP Medical Science University, Jabalpur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

3. Shortage of Senior Residents: 1.
4. MRI is outsourced. Deficiency remains as it is.

5. Mammography is not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. 5 Static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6.
7. Workload of DSA is NIL on day of assessment.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior under MP Medical Science University, Jabalpur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Contention of the institute that the promotion is in order as the MCI circular was issued on 03/09/2015 and the promotion was done before that is not correct as the Notification regarding publications was issued on 21/07/2009 and came into effect from that date and the Circular dt. 03/09/2015 was only by way of a clarificatory circular.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Biochemistry) course at GCS Medical College, Ahmedabad under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (07/10/2016) and compliance dated 12/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. PallaviKalantri, Senior Resident is shown working at this continuously from 23/01/2010 till date as Junior/Senior Resident; however in the previous assessment dt. 07/10/2016, she has not been shown in any capacity whatsoever. No explanation is given for this dichotomy.
2. Dr. Vijay Muchal, Senior Resident is shown working at this continuously from 01/09/2010 till date as Junior/Senior Resident; however in the previous assessment dt. 07/10/2016, he has not been shown. No explanation is given for this dichotomy.
3. Dr. Sanket Agrawal, Senior Resident in Unit IV does not have any experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
4. Dr. Promila R is DNB in 2009. No information about the institution from where DNB was obtain is given. She cannot be Senior Resident from 2003.
5. No demotion orders of Dr. Madhu Goyal have been submitted from Assoc. Professor to Asst. Professor.
6. No demotion orders of Neepa Choudhary have been submitted with regard to experience revised from Senior Resident to Junior Resident.

7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted the factual matrix in respect of Dr. Pallavi Kalantri, Senior Resident; Dr. Vijay Muchal, Senior Resident as noted above and Dr. Vinay Tanuway, Professor; Dr. Preetesh Chaudhary, Assistant Professor; Dr. Avinash Jain, Assistant Professor; Dr. Gaurav Sabu, Senior Resident; Dr. Jayant Sharma, department of Orthopaedics; Dr. Suraj Tripathi, Professor; Dr. Prem Nyati, Professor, department of Pharmacology; Dr. Parikshit Sharma, Associate Professor; Dr. Sunil Nayak, Senior Resident, department of DVL; Dr. Mayur Maheshwari, Associate Professor; Dr. Irfan Qureshi, Associate Professor; Dr. Apoorva Shrivastava, Associate Professor; Dr. Ashish Agrawal, Professor; Dr. Dilip Kothari, Assistant Professor; Dr. Prakash Chhajlani, Assistant Professor, department of General Surgery; Dr. Abhijeet Khandelwal, Assistant Professor; Dr. Deepak Nagar, Assistant Professor, department of Respiratory Medicine; Dr. Sudhir Mourya, Professor; Dr. Abha Pandit, Asso. Prof.; Dr. Prasanna Yadav, Professor; Dr. Arun Chopra, Senior Resident; Dr. Ajay K. Singh; Dr. Radhe Shyam; Dr. Chandrasekhar S. Naik, department of General Medicine; Dr. Gajendra S. Tomar, Professor; Dr. Anjali Patil, Senior Resident; Dr. Naziya N. Noor; Dr. Smita Jain, Senior Resident; Dr. Arnab K. Nandi, Senior Resident, department of OBG; Dr. Gopal P. Dhoot, Professor; Dr. Deepanshi Agrawal, Senior Resident, department of Radio-Diagnosis, brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in postgraduate course in Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Pharmacology, DVL, General Surgery, Respiratory Medicine, General Medicine, OBG and Radio-Diagnosis courses at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Pharmacology, DVL, General Surgery, Respiratory Medicine, General Medicine, OBG and Radio-Diagnosis courses at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/01/2017 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

“...
8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to refer the matter before Ethics Committee.

Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in postgraduate course in Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Pharmacology, DVL, General Surgery, Respiratory Medicine, General Medicine, OBG and Radio-Diagnosis courses at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Pharmacology, DVL, General Surgery, Respiratory Medicine, General Medicine, OBG and Radio-Diagnosis courses at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/01/2017 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved

by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29/08/2016) and compliance dated 10/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sri Venkateshwara Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Puducherry under Pondicherry University, Puducherry for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29/08/2016) and compliance dated 10/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Casualty beds are shown as 25; however out of them 20 beds are shown as Emergency ward beds, which is not Casualty. Resultantly, Casualty beds are only 5 against requirement of 25 as per Regulations. Hence deficiency remains as such.
2. With regard to remark "Endoscopy & Dialysis not available in with this department", it is observed that Paediatric Endoscopy is done by adult Endoscopist. The facility of Dialysis earmarked for use of Paediatrics department was not in use on day of assessment. Deficiency remains as such.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Sri Venkateshwara Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Puducherry under Pondicherry University, Puducherry u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

50. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at RajaRajeswari Medical College & Hospital, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (08/09/2016) and compliance dated 16/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Bidar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bidar under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of MD (Pathology) and Diploma in Clinical Pathology (DCP) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (08/09/2016) and compliance dated 16/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Deficiency of faculty: **(a)** Asst. Prof.: 1; **(b)** Tutor: 1 remains as such.
2. Workload of CT guided FNAC & USG guided FNAC, which was NIL in the last assessment report, is not shown in compliance.
3. Procedures like Bone Marrow Biopsy & Coagulation workup are still not performed.
4. Equipment like ABG Analyzer, Coagulometer, Cytospin & HPLC are yet not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Pathological post-mortems are not performed.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Pathology) and Diploma in Clinical Pathology (DCP) course at Bidar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bidar under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

54. Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (11/08/2016) and compliance dated 21/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (11/08/2016) and compliance dated 21/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Facilities for retinal Surgery are not yet available. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. Raju Akkimaradi, Assistant Professor and Dr. N.B. Sanakal, Senior Resident, as per the assessment report of MS(Orthopaedics), brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in postgraduate course in MS (Orthopaedics) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for MS (Orthopaedics) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/12/2016 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S.

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to refer the matter before Ethics Committee.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Bidar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bidar under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

56. Starting of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at Karnataka Institute of Medical Sciences, Hubli under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (05/12/2016) and compliance dated 27/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Karnataka Institute of Medical Sciences, Hubli under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to refer the matter before Ethics Committee.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (07/10/2016) and compliance dated 12/12/2016 and 29/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore for Increase of seats in MD (Pharmacology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (07/10/2016) and compliance dated 12/12/2016 and 29/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. With regard to promotion of Dr. SurajTripathi, Professor, in the compliance it is stated that he is promoted w.e.f. 08/05/2013. However in the assessment report it is shown that he is promoted w.e.f. 30/10/2013 which was after cut-off date for publications. Such retrospective changes so as to make him eligible are not permissible. Hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. Order dated 08/05/2013 is not a Demotion Order.
2. With regard to promotion of Dr. Prem Nyati, Professor, in the compliance it is stated that he is promoted w.e.f. 08/05/2012. However in the assessment report it is shown that he is promoted w.e.f. 09/05/2011 which did not fulfill requisite teaching experience as Asso. Prof. Such

retrospective changes so as to make him eligible are not permissible. Hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.

3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Pharmacology) course at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Prof.; Dr. Prasanna Yadav, Professor; Dr. Arun Chopra, Senior Resident; Dr. Ajay K. Singh; Dr. Radhe Shyam; Dr. Chandrasekhar S. Naik, department of General Medicine; Dr. Gajendra S. Tomar, Professor; Dr. Anjali Patil, Senior Resident; Dr. Naziya N. Noor; Dr. Smita Jain, Senior Resident; Dr. Arnab K. Nandi, Senior Resident, department of OBG; Dr. Gopal P. Dhoot, Professor; Dr. Deepanshi Agrawal, Senior Resident, department of Radio-Diagnosis, brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in postgraduate course in Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Pharmacology, DVL, General Surgery, Respiratory Medicine, General Medicine, OBG and Radio-Diagnosis courses at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Pharmacology, DVL, General Surgery, Respiratory Medicine, General Medicine, OBG and Radio-Diagnosis courses at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/01/2017 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Dr. C. Rohan Reddy, Senior resident does not have 3 y experience as Resident in Emergency Medicine; hence he cannot be considered as Senior Resident. Contention of the Institute that he is a Post PG Senior Resident is not correct as there is no such entity. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Dr. Md. Fawad Ali, Dr. Niharika Reddy, Dr. Manasa B. Navya & Dr. Avinash Yaramati, all Senior Residents do not have 3 y experience as Resident in Emergency Medicine; hence they cannot be considered as Senior Residents. Contention of the Institute that they are Post PG Senior Residents is not correct as there is no such entity. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. With regard to remark that faculty does not have special training in Emergency Medicine, Institute has stated in compliance that they were posted in this department as faculty which is not same as receiving training. Hence deficiency remains as such.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (07/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (25/11/2016) and compliance dated 14/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Retinal Surgeries are not performed as yet. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Equipment like Fundus Fluorescein Angiography is not available.
3. Reply to deficiencies 2, 3 is not satisfactory. It indicates only two persons are working, others being full time is doubtful.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course at Great Eastern Medical School & Hospital, Ragolu, Srikakulam under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

72. Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (07/10/2016) and compliance dated 12/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (07/10/2016) and compliance dated 12/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. Mita V. Joshi is appointed as Asso. Prof. after last assessment on 30/11/2016. She is DNB from a non-teaching hospital and has only 2 y 4 m experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident. Hence her appointment as Senior resident itself is contrary to Regulations; therefore subsequent promotion to Asst. Prof. & Asso. Prof. cannot be regularized and she cannot be considered. Further Dr. Mita Joshi, Assoc. Professor, Unit-I was promoted after 4 years 4 months as Asst. Professor. In none of the 4 publications quoted, reference of the publications (year, volume, page) not given without which, they cannot be considered. No other Assoc. Professor in Unit.
2. Resultantly there is no Asso. Prof. in Unit I and faculty complement is incomplete as there are only 2 faculty & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Dr. Pradeep Gandhi was shown Professor in earlier report from 17/03/2015. Now, shown Assoc. Professor. No Orders have been given.
4. Dr. Vandane Talgote, Professor promoted on 30/09/2016. 2 of the 4 publications quoted are Review Articles.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted the factual matrix in respect of Dr. Pallavi Kalantri, Senior Resident; Dr. Vijay Muchal, Senior Resident, department of Paediatrics; Dr. Vinay Tanuway, Professor; Dr. Preetesh Chaudhary, Assistant Professor; Dr. Avinash Jain, Assistant Professor; Dr. Gaurav Sabu, Senior Resident; Dr. Jayant Sharma, department of Orthopaedics; Dr. Suraj Tripathi, Professor; Dr. Prem Nyati, Professor, department of Pharmacology; Dr. Parikshit Sharma, Associate Professor; Dr. Sunil Nayak, Senior Resident, department of DVL; Dr. Mayur Maheshwari, Associate Professor; Dr. Irfan Qureshi, Associate Professor; Dr. Apoorva Shrivastava, Associate Professor; Dr. Ashish Agrawal, Professor; Dr. Dilip Kothari, Assistant Professor; Dr. Prakash Chhajlani, Assistant Professor, department of General Surgery; Dr. Abhijeet Khandelwal, Assistant Professor; Dr. Deepak Nagar, Assistant Professor, department of Respiratory Medicine; Dr. Sudhir Mourya, Professor; Dr. Abha Pandit, Asso. Prof.; Dr. Prasanna Yadav, Professor; Dr. Arun Chopra, Senior Resident; Dr. Ajay K. Singh; Dr. Radhe Shyam; Dr. Chandrasekhar S. Naik, department of General Medicine; Dr. Gajendra S. Tomar, Professor; Dr. Anjali Patil, Senior Resident; Dr. Naziya N. Noor; Dr. Smita Jain, Senior Resident; Dr. Arnab K. Nandi, Senior Resident, department of OBG; Dr. Gopal P. Dhoot, Professor; Dr. Deepanshi Agrawal, Senior Resident, department of Radio-Diagnosis, brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in postgraduate course in Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Pharmacology, DVL, General Surgery, Respiratory Medicine, General Medicine, OBG and Radio-Diagnosis courses at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Pharmacology, DVL, General Surgery, Respiratory Medicine, General Medicine, OBG and Radio-Diagnosis courses at Index Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Indore, Madhya Pradesh under Malwanchal University, Indore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/01/2017 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

“...
8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to refer the matter before Ethics Committee.

76. Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course at Prathima Institute of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar, Telangana under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

1. Dr. Mariam Philip, Professor & HoD- only 2 publications were quoted in earlier report. How, it is stated to be 5 now. Out of 5 publications quoted, she is 3rd Author in one and one is not a Research Article. Only 3 publications left.

2. Workload for LASER procedures was very low in 2016:
 - (a) LASER for Scar Revision: 25;
 - (b) LASER for Pigment Removal: 30;
 - (c) LASER for Hair Reduction: 44.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) course at Dr. Somervel Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College, Karakonam, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28th December 2016) and compliance dated 5th January 2017 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh under Sharda University, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh for Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

1. Regarding inadequate OPD attendance as pointed out in earlier assessment report, no data are submitted whether it has increased & if so,

to what extent. It is only stated *“All efforts are being made to improve this figure in future as well.”*

2. There is no Medical Officer for RNTCP. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Paramedical staff like PFT Technician is not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Equipment like DLCO is not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh under Sharda University, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

81. Starting of MD (Radio Diagnosis) course at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh under Sharda University, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28th December 2016) and compliance dated 5th January 2017 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh under Sharda University, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh for Starting of MD (Radio Diagnosis) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. With regard to Dr.Owais Ahmed, he does not have 3 y experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence he is not qualified to hold the post.Deficiency remains as it is.
2. With regard to Dr. Ashish K. Satpathy, he does not have 3 y experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence he is not qualified to hold the post. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. With regard to Dr. Tushar Gupta, he does not have 3 y experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence he is not qualified to hold the post. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. DSA is not available in the department. Having a central facility is not a substitute for having DSA in the department.
5. Dr. Rakhee Kumar – First Article has no Author names. 2nd Article – is in West African Journal of Radiology which is peer reviewed online journal and cannot be considered.
6. Dr. Satish Pathak has no relieving Orders.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Radio Diagnosis) course at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh under Sharda University, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

82. Starting of MS (Obstetrics & Gynaecology) course at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh under Sharda University, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28th December 2016) and compliance dated 5th January 2017 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh under Sharda University, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh for Starting of MS (Obstetrics & Gynaecology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28th December 2016) and compliance dated 5th January 2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Deficiency 2 & 11 stay as such.
2. Unit 3 has only 18 beds; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit. Contention of the Institute that it be considered as UG Unit cannot be accepted when it is applying for PG course as all Units have to be PG Units of 30 beds minimum.
3. Dr. Dolly Mishra has experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital of only 2 y against requirement of 3 y; hence not qualified to hold the post. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Dr. Niti Vijay does not have any experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post. Deficiency remains as it is. Reference of the Institute to Notification dt. 30/08/2012 is of no relevance as the said Notification refers to requirement of 1 y additional Senior Residency for appointment as Asst. Prof. and does not refer to appointment of a person who does not have 3 y experience in a medical college hospital as Senior Resident.

7. With regard to Dr. Mayuri Ahuja, Senior resident, the remark was that no experience as Junior Resident was shown in earlier assessment. In compliance submitted by the college, she is shown as having worked at this institute from 24/05/2012 to 31/05/2013 as Junior Resident. This experience is not shown in the faculty table in earlier assessment report which leads to doubts regarding genuineness of such experience.
8. There were total 600 Major Gynaec Operations giving daily average of 2.00 which is inadequate. Deficiency remains as it is.
9. Prenatal Diagnosis services are not fully established.
10. IUI services are not available.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. There is no Professor.
2. Space in OPD is inadequate. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Examination room for male/female is not separate. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. With regard to remark that "No separate Specialty clinics are held", details of Specialty clinics like clinics held, average attendance, Name of

i/c faculty, etc. are not provided. It is stated that they are held between 12 - 1 p.m. (i.e. for 1 hour) which is inadequate.

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) course at U.P. Rural Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Etawah, Uttar Pradesh under U.P. University Medical Sciences, Saifai, Etawah u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

105. Starting of MD (Bio-Chemistry) course at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th August 2016) and compliance dated 14th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow for Starting of MD (Bio-Chemistry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th August 2016) and compliance dated 14th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. Seema Singh, Professor, Deptt. Of Physiology brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in postgraduate course in Physiology course at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for Physiology course at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/01/2017 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

“...
8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Bio-Chemistry) course at Integral Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Integral University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to refer the matter before Ethics Committee.

2. Promotion of Dr. Sunil Kumar, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. He was promoted Assoc. Professor 24/08/2015 after the cut-off date without any publication.
3. Bed Occupancy is 20% on day of assessment.
4. Number of Major Operations on day of assessment is NIL.
5. BERA is not available in the department. Deficiency remains as it is.

6. Impedance Audiometry was non-functional on day of assessment & for last 2-3 months no Impedance Audiometry is done.
7. Investigative facilities like Nerve Conduction, EMG are not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
8. Nerve Stimulator/Monitor are not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/01/2017 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

2. Dr.Amit Mishra, Senior Resident in Unit 1 does not possess 3 years experience in the department, hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
3. Dr. Nishant, Senior Resident in Unit 3 does not possess 3 years experience in the department, hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
4. Speciality clinics like Hand clinic, Arthroplasty clinic are not run. Providing services as required in regular OPD clinics cannot be a substitute for speciality clinics. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (General Medicine) course at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh under Sharda University, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

16. Starting of MD (Psychiatry) course at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh under Sharda University, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

2. Attendance at speciality clinics is only 1-2 patients in each clinic.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

6. MRI workload for the whole hospital on the day of assessment was only 03.

4. Dr. Sreenidhi Sediguli, Senior resident does not possess any experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
5. DSA is not available in the department. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Radio Diagnosis) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted the factual matrix in respect of Dr. Dhanesh Vijayan, Senior Resident, Dr. N.S. Sajeer, Senior Resident, Dr. Chandan Tekade, Senior Resident, Dr. Chandan Tekade, Senior Resident, as noted above and Dr. Gopi Mohan R., Assoc. Professor of Paediatrics; Dr. S. Baiju, Assoc.Prof., Dr. Lakshmi V, Asst.Prof., Dr. Baby N.Mathew, Asst.Prof. and Dr. A.V.M.Karniyil, Sr. Resident of MS(General Surgery) and Dr. R. Jayakrishnan, Professor, Dr. V.S. Vinod, Assoc. Prof. and Dr. A.S. Arunkumar, Asst. Prof., of Orthopaedics, brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee

decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member have been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for starting of postgraduate course in Paediatrics, Radio-Diagnosis, General Surgery and Orthopaedics courses at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for Paediatrics, Radio-Diagnosis, General Surgery and Orthopaedics course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 10/01/2016 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

“...
8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to refer the matter to Ethics Committee.

1. With regard to Dr. Chandrahas Prasad, the remark was that his promotion is not as per Regulations. In the present assessment, Assessor has observed that his 6 publications are in E Journals & only 2 in print journals. Hence deficiency of his promotion being not as per Regulations remains as such. Further, in the faculty table, in the column of "Designation" he is shown as "Associate Professor" but in the column of "Experience", it is shown as "Professor" w.e.f. 22/02/2016 till date which implies that his downgrading is only a sham. In this view of the matter, he cannot be considered.
2. Frozen Section is under process of installation.
3. Equipment like Cytospin, HPLC are not available in the department.
4. Pathological post-mortems are not performed. Deficiency remains as it is.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Narayan Medical College & Hospital, Sasaram, Bihar under Veer Kunwar Singh University, Bihar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

49. Starting of MD (Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) course at Calcutta National Medical College, Kolkata, West Bengal under West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

3. Academic qualification & experience as Resident are not shown in respect of two out of 3 Senior Residents in Unit II. With regard to 3rd SR, Dr. T. Gitaranjan Devi, she has passed DNB from a non-teaching hospital & she does not have 3 y experience as Resident in a medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident. Resultantly, there is no eligible Senior resident in Unit II.
4. Average OPD attendance is 80-90/day.
5. Equipment like Paediatric Endoscope, Paediatric Bronchoscope, Computerized Flow Meter are not available in the department.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course at Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Medical Sciences, Porompat, Imphal, Manipur under Manipur University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

51. Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Kamineni Academy of Medical Sciences and Research Centre, Hyderabad under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (23/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (22/08/2016) and compliance dated 12/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kamineni Academy of Medical Sciences and Research Centre, Hyderabad under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Starting of MD (Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15th December 2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (11th August 2016) and compliance dated 21st November 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Coimbatore Medical College, Coimbatore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai for Starting of MD (Pharmacology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (07th September 2016) and compliance dated 22nd December 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at King George Medical University, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under King Georges Medical University, Lucknow for Increase of seats in MD (Respiratory Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (07th September 2016) and compliance dated 22nd December 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:-

1. Unit III has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Bed Occupancy is 73.5 % at 10 a.m. on day of assessment.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at King George

Medical University, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under King Georges Medical University, Lucknow u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 for the academic session 2017-2018.

54. Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (4th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th August 2016) and compliance dated 9th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur for Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (4th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th August 2016) and compliance dated 9th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Promotion of Dr. Gopi Mohan R, Assoc. Professor is not as per regulations. In the first assessment report dated 29/08/2016, he has been shown Asst. Professor from 01/10/2009 till 31/03/2015. While in compliance submitted 23/01/2017, he has been shown Asst. Professor from 01/10/2009 till 01/01/2017 without any supporting documents. He has 2 indexed journals online publications and one indexed print version Journal, which cannot be considered.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. Gopi Mohan R., Assoc. Professor as noted above and Dr. S. Baiju, Assoc.Prof., Dr. Lakshmi V, Asst.Prof., Dr. Baby N.Mathew, Asst.Prof. and Dr. A.V.M.Karniyil, Sr. Resident of MS(General Surgery) and Dr. R. Jayakrishnan, Professor, Dr. V.S. Vinod, Assoc. Prof. and Dr. A.S. Arunkumar, Asst. Prof., of Orthopaedics, brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member have been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for starting of postgraduate course in Paediatrics, Radio-Diagnosis, General Surgery and Orthopaedics courses at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for Paediatrics, Radio-Diagnosis, General Surgery and Orthopaedics course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 10/01/2016 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

“...
8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document: If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to refer the matter to Ethics Committee.

7. Equipment like Endoscope, Bronchoscope, PFT & Colour Doppler are not available in the department.
8. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 06 on day of assessment.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.
