The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence was received from Dr. Bhanu Prakash Dubey, Dr. Deelip Govindrao Mhaisekar & Dr. Raja Babu Panwar, Members, Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

**1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 15/02/2018.

**2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted the Action Taken Report on the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 15/02/2018.

- (1) Personal hearing was given to Dr. Shubha Phadke, Prof. & Head of Medical Genetic, Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh. She was pleading that prior qualification of DM(Medical Genetics) should be only MD(General Medicine) & MD(Paediatrics). All others should be deleted. The Council has received directions from the Oversight Committee vide letter No. OC/2018/584-85, dated 28.02.2018, which reads as under:-

*“the OC recognize that the DM(Medical Genetics) entails clinical evaluation of patients, diagnosis and treatment of the patients. At AIIMS, DM(Medical Genetics) course is open to MD/MS in clinical disciplines only. The PG in Non-clinical subjects may be candidate for the DM(Basic Medical Genetics)/Ph.D. courses. The concerns of the institution running DM(Medical Genetics) course that in case non-clinician are part of this program, there is danger of inappropriate care and harm to patients to be managed by them as a part of their training and practice in the course of DM course. Therefore, the OC directs that its directions given earlier be followed. This matter should be closed as such to mitigate further un-certainty and decision may be put on website by 01.03.2018”.*

The same was conveyed Dr. Shubha Phadke that PG Section is directed to get the necessary amendments done in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations 2000 as directed by Oversight Committee.

The matters may be placed before the General Body of the Council for approval.

- (2) The Postgraduate Committee granted personal hearing to Dr. M. Deshmukh Milind, of the Department of DVL, Dr. Vasantarao Pawar Medical College & Research Centre, Nashik, as per earlier decision of the PG Committee at its meeting held on 10.10.2017. Dr. M. Deshmukh, appeared before the Committee and he agreed that his signature in the Declaration Form and Departmental Register differ since his signature differently in department. The Postgraduate Committee decided to refer the matter to the Ethics Committee.

**3. Inclusion of DM (Paediatric Neurology) – Reference received from Dr. A. Sampth, Hon’ble MP, Lok Sabha - regarding.**

Read: the letter dated 09.09.2017 received from the Ministry of Health & Family welfare, New Delhi with regard to inclusion of DM (Paediatric Neurology) in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 09.09.2017 received from the Ministry of Health & Family welfare, New Delhi with regard to inclusion of DM (Paediatric Neurology) in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 and noted that the subject has already been approved by Postgraduate Committee in its joint meeting in Academic Committee on 14.07.2015 and General Body on 01.10.2015. The subject of DM (Paediatric Neurology) be included in the Schedule of course in the first Schedule.

MSR, TEQ etc. which has already been approved by Competent Authorities is reconfirmed.

**4. Request of Dr. Sarthak Kamath K. as PH candidate to choose subjects of MD-Radio-Diagnosis, MD-Psychiatry and MD-Dermatology.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the E-mail dated 05/03/2017 received from Sh. Narasimha Kamath K. (Father of Dr.Sarthak Kamath K.), Bangalore with regard to consideration of Dr.Sarthak Kamath K. as PH candidate to choose subjects of MD-Radio-Diagnosis, MD-Psychiatry and MD-Dermatology and decided that legal opinion of the Law Officer be obtained specially in view of the fact that Dr. Sarthak Kamath K has disability more than maximum prescribed limit. The matter may be resubmitted after clear opinion from Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 16/11/2017 received from the Director of Education, Training and Professionalism, Medical Council, Dublin along with letters dated 23/08/2017 & 25/08/2017 from the the Central Govt., Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi as well as letter dated 14/08/2017 received from the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland and opinion of the Law Officer with regard to recognition of courses of Royal College of Physicians of Ireland and the Committee noted that opinion of Law Officer is not clear. Information received from Medical Council of Dublin is incomplete. There is no reply to query 2 and 3 sent to them. The Law Officer be asked to re-examine the whole case and give a clear opinion whether such courses fall within the ambit of qualifications included in the Gazette Notification of Government of India and whether they can be considered as recognized qualifications or not.

In view of the above, the Committee decided to re-submit the matter after getting the Legal Opinion with full information.

Read: the matter with regard to amendment in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 regarding Broad Speciality category mentioned under the heading A & C.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to amendment in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 and noted that the following qualifications neither being conducted at any Institute nor any institute applies for starting of these specialities:-

7. Diploma in Allergy & Clinical Immunology
8. Neuro-Pathology (DNP)

After detailed discussions, the Committee decided that there is no need to delete the aforesaid diplomas from schedule since some institute may apply in future for these courses. Let them stay if they are already recognized qualifications.

**11. Amendment for deletion of M.Ch. (Reproductive Medicine) from Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 – reg.**

Read: the matter with regard to amendment for deletion of M.Ch. (Reproductive Medicine) from Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter and noted that the earlier nomenclature was DM(Reproductive Medicine) and subsequently, the nomenclature was to be changed as M.Ch.(Reproductive Medicine & Surgery). The office inadvertently had requested the Central Govt. for inclusion of M.Ch.(Reproductive Medicine) and hence, the Central Govt. issued the notification for inclusion as M.Ch.(Reproductive Medicine). Later on the office had requested the Central Govt. to issue notification by nomenclature of M.Ch. (Reproductive Medicine & Surgery) which has also been done. Now both the nomenclatures exist in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

In view of the above, the Committee decided to recommend to the Central Govt. for deletion of M.Ch.(Reproductive Medicine) from the Regulations of the Council on Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 by suitable notification from the Central Govt.

However, if any batch has passed out with the nomenclature of M.Ch.(Reproductive Medicine) that will remain a recognized and equivalent qualification.

Further, the Postgraduate Committee decided that DM (Reproductive Medicine) will also remain recognized and equivalent to M.Ch. (Reproductive Medicine & Surgery).

**12. Medical Council of India permission to transfer PMR dept. of B.J. Medical College to Govt. Spine Institute and approval for starting PMR course at Govt. Spine Institute, Ahmedabad with affiliation of B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad.**

Read: the letter dated 02/01/2018 received from the Dean, B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad along with the letter dated 18/11/2017 received from the Director, Govt. Spine Institute & Physiotherapy College, Ahmedabad with regard to permission to transfer Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation department of B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad to Govt. Spine Institute, Ahmedabad with affiliation of B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 02/01/2018 received from the Dean, B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad along with the letter dated 18/11/2017 received from the Director, Govt. Spine Institute & Physiotherapy College, Ahmedabad and noted that it is not clear from the agenda that Government Spine Institute is a part of B.J. Medical College for MBBS course or not. If yes, no action is required to be taken. If, Government Spine Institute is a separate independent institute then they should apply independently for the course like any other Government PG Institute following due procedure. B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad is not an affiliating university. Hence there can be no affiliation with B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad. The office may obtain the above information from Dean, B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad and re-submit the item.

**13. Regarding the recognition of DDVL at Stanley Medical College, Chennai.**

Read: the letter dated 12/10/2017 received from Dr. Jintu Philip & Dr. D. Rajesh, DDVL Students (May, 2015 – May, 2017), Govt. Stanley Medical College, Chennai with regard to recognition of DDVL qualification at Stanley Medical College, Chennai along with the opinion of the Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 12/10/2017 received from Dr. Jintu Philip & Dr. D. Rajesh, DDVL Students (May, 2015 – May, 2017), Govt. Stanley Medical College, Chennai and observed that the letter of MCI dated 25.10.2017 merely refers to withdrawal of discharge notice and does not refer to recognition. To that extend, Opinion of Law Officer is incomplete. Hence, his opinion be obtain again and matter be re-submitted after that. Meanwhile decision to direct the institute to forward formal request u/s 11(2) through affiliating university is reiterated.

**14. Issues related to MCI for PG seats – regarding.**

Read: the letter dated 07/11/2017 received from the Dean, University School of Medicine and Para Medical Health Sciences, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, New Delhi with regard to issues related to MCI for PG seats.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 07/11/2017 received from the Dean, University School of Medicine and Para Medical Health Sciences, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, New Delhi with regard to issues related to MCI for PG seats and noted that the letter has not been routed through Vice-Chancellor/Registrar of the university and it has been written without caring for quality and standard of medical education. The Committee decided as under:-

1. The responsibility of MCI is not only to increase the number of seats but also to maintain adequate standard of medical education and to provide adequate training to PG students. Hence the suggestion to increase number of PG seats per unit cannot be accepted.
2. Inclusion of ICU/HDU beds in bed count of unit: The matter has already been decided in last meeting dated 15/02/18.
3. Creation of more super-specialities within parent department of Broad specialities using same clinical material & infrastructure cannot be accepted. We have to produce super-specialists and not general practitioners
4. Suggestion to dispense with the number of beds/units in Dermatology, Ophthalmology, ENT and Psychiatry cannot be accepted. However reducing the requirement of percentage bed occupancy can be considered. Matter be got examined by a subcommittee which should involve experts from concerned subjects.
5. Suggestion to dispense with the concept of units and sanction PG seats (1 for 6 beds in broad specialities & 1 for 4 beds in super-specialities) giving 20 seats to a department having 120 beds is figment of imagination. Needless to say that we want to produce competent specialists & super-specialists and not generalists.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that reply be sent through Vice-Chancellor of the university.

**15. Inclusion of certain Armed Forces Medical Colleges in the list of Armed Forces Teaching Institutes for consideration of teaching experience - Regarding.**

Read: the letter dated 27/10/2017 received from the Director General Medical Services (Air), Air Headquarters, New Delhi with regard to Recognition of Teaching Hospitals of the Armed Forces Medical Services: Institute of Aerospace Medicine, IAF, Bangalore and inclusion of Armed Force Medical Colleges in the list of Teaching Institution for consideration of teaching experience.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 27/10/2017 received from the Director General Medical Services (Air), Air Headquarters, New Delhi and DGAFMS, New Delhi requesting inclusion of Institute of Aerospace Medicine in the list of Armed Forces teaching institutes recognized by Medical Council of India.

The Postgraduate Committee approved the above request that institute be included in the list of Armed Forces teaching institutes for Aerospace Medicine & related subjects.

**16. Change in the eligibility qualifications for admission to D.M. (Clinical Hematology) course – Regarding.**

Read: the letter dated 09/11/2017 received from the Dean, Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow with regard to Change in the eligibility qualifications for admission to D.M. (Clinical Hematology) course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 09/11/2017 received from the Dean, Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow with regard to Change in the eligibility qualifications for admission to D.M. (Clinical Hematology) course and noted that the Dean, Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow has requested that MD(Pathology) & MD(Biochemistry) be deleted as Pre-qualification for admission to DM(Clinical Haematology) and retain only MD(Medicine) & MD(Paediatrics). The Postgraduate Committee while scrutinizing 10(A) applications of this subject received from Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow noted that there are faculty members in this department with MD(Pathology). What will happen to them if this pre qualification is deleted? The matter may be re-submitted after getting clarifications from the institute.

**17. Eligibility of MD Radiodiagnosis for various DM courses i.e. Neurology, Gastroenterology, Oncology, Respiratory Medicine/Pulmonology and Cardiology- Regarding**

Read: the letter dated 06/11/2017 received from the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith a representation dated 05/10/2017 received from Dr. Sushant Agarwal, Registrar, Department of Radiology, Guwahati Medical College & Hospital, Guwahati, Assam and letter dated 27/10/2017 received from Sh. Aditya Duhan (Radiologist in practice and training) and Dr. Muzaffar MD(Radio-Diagnosis) with regard to eligibility of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) for various DM course i.e. Neurology, Gastroenterology, Oncology, Respiratory Medicine/ Pulmonology and Cardiology.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 06/11/2017 received from the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith a representation dated 05/10/2017 received from Dr. Sushant Agarwal, Registrar, Department of Radiology, Guwahati Medical

College & Hospital, Guwahati, Assam and letter dated 27/10/2017 received from Sh. Aditya Duhan (Radiologist in practice and training) and Dr. Muzaffar MD(Radio-Diagnosis) with regard to eligibility of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) for various DM course i.e. Neurology, Gastroenterology, Oncology, Respiratory Medicine/ Pulmonology and Cardiology and the Committee decided that eligibility of MD(Radiodiagnosis) for admission to DM courses in Neurology, Gastroenterology, Oncology, Respiratory Medicine, Pulmonary and Cardiology cannot be accepted. Imaging is only a small part of training in these subjects and MD(Radiodiagnosis) syllabus does not includes, rest of the areas in these super-specialities.

**18. Thesis checking by external examiners only of MD/MS/DM & M.Ch. courses.**

Read: the letters dated 02/11/2017 & 19/12/2017 received from the Controller of Examinations, King George Medical University, Lucknow with regard to thesis checking by external examiners only of MD/MS/DM & M.Ch. courses.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letters dated 02/11/2017 & 19/12/2017 received from the Controller of Examinations, King George Medical University, Lucknow with regard to thesis checking by external examiners only of MD/MS/DM & M.Ch. courses and decided to refer the matter before the Academic Committee. It will be pertinent to note that there is no thesis in DM/M.Ch.

**19. Inclusion of M.Ch. (Colorectal Surgery) course in the regulations of the Council of Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000-Regarding.**

Read: the letter dated 29/10/2017 received from Prof. Nisar A. Chowdri, Head Colorectal Surgery, Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar along with the recommendations of the Academic Committee as well as Executive Committee with regard to inclusion of M.Ch. (Colorectal Surgery) course in the regulations of the Council of Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 29/10/2017 received from Prof. Nisar A. Chowdri, Head Colorectal Surgery, Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences, Srinagar along with the recommendations of the Academic Committee as well as Executive Committee with regard to inclusion of M.Ch. (Colorectal Surgery) course in the regulations of the Council of Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 and decided to reiterate its earlier decision dated 27.07.2017.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that Dr. Nisar A Chowdri, has not routed his letter through Dean of the Institute and MCI corresponds only through Head of the Institute. Representation be routed through his Dean.

**20. Inclusion of DM (Aviation Human Engineering) and DM (Environmental and space Physiology) in the Schedule to PGMER, 2000-Regarding.  
and  
Draft Guidelines, MSR and TEQ for the proposed (a) DM in Aviation Human Engineering (b) DM in Environmental & Space Physiology Regarding.**

Read: the letter dated 23/11/2017 received from the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the letter dated 15/09/2017 received from the Air Chief Marshal BS Dhanoa and letter dated 27/10/2017 received from the Director General Medical Services (Air), Air Headquarters, New Delhi with regard to inclusion of DM (Aviation Human Engineering) and DM (Environmental and space Physiology) in the Schedule to

PGMER, 2000 along with draft Guidelines & MSR of (a) DM in Aviation Human Engineering (b) DM in Environmental & Space Physiology as well as recommendations of the Academic Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 23/11/2017 received from the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith the letter dated 15/09/2017 received from the Air Chief Marshal BS Dhanoa and letter dated 27/10/2017 received from the Director General Medical Services (Air), Air Headquarters, New Delhi with regard to inclusion of DM (Aviation Human Engineering) and DM (Environmental and space Physiology) in the Schedule to PGMER, 2000 along with draft Guidelines & MSR of (a) DM in Aviation Human Engineering (b) DM in Environmental & Space Physiology as well as recommendations of the Academic Committee and the Postgraduate Committee observed that the guidelines has been prepared keeping in view only for the Aero Space Institutes. It is not clear whether this course can be started only at this institute or any other institute can also be considered for starting this course. Although, this is a new super-speciality, guidelines during the transit period have not been shown. It also needs to be clarified that from where we will be sending the Assessors during 10(A)/11(2) requests and from where the examiners will come at the time of examination. The item is referred back to the Academic Committee for re-consideration in view of above observations and it should be re-submitted later.

**21. Syllabus(Guidelines), MSR and TEQ for DM (Clinical Immunology & Rheumatology) - Regarding.**

Read: the matter with regard to Syllabus(Guidelines), MSR and TEQ for DM (Clinical Immunology & Rheumatology) along with the recommendations of the Academic Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Syllabus(Guidelines), MSR and TEQ for DM (Clinical Immunology & Rheumatology) along with the recommendations of the Academic Committee and approved with the following modification:-

- (i) Resident staff shall comprise of 1 Sr. Resident & 2 Jr. Resident per unit.
- (ii) Journal requirements shall be 3 international/nation journals.
- (iii) Title of theory paper 4 shall be recent advances in Clinical Immunology & Rheumatology.

**22. Syllabus(Guidelines), MSR and TEQ for the proposed DM (Organ Transplant Anaesthesia & Critical Care) - Regarding.**

Read: the matter with regard to Syllabus(Guidelines), MSR and TEQ for the proposed DM (Organ Transplant Anaesthesia & Critical Care) along with the recommendations of the Academic Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Syllabus (Guidelines), MSR and TEQ for the proposed DM (Organ Transplant Anaesthesia & Critical Care) along with the recommendations of the Academic Committee and approved with the following modification:-

1. Requirement of ICU beds shall be 5 in regular ICU and 5 & 5 beds in step down ICU.
2. Resident Staff shall comprise of 1 Sr. Resident & 2 Jr. Residents per unit.
3. Requirement of Anaesthesia Technician shall be 1 in each O.T. & ICU. This be increased by 25% to cater to leave reserve, etc.

4. Requirement of nursing staff shall be as prescribed by Nursing Council of India in respect of ICUs.
5. Requirement of Physiotherapist shall be 1.
6. Posting of Residents in 1 year to Nephrology & in II year to Clinical Immunology, Immunopathology, Radiology shall be deleted.
7. Journal requirements shall be 3 International/National Journals.

**23. Syllabus(Guidelines) and MSR for DM (Neuroradiology) - Regarding.**

Read: the matter with regard to Syllabus (Guidelines) and MSR for DM(Neuroradiology) along with the recommendations of the Academic Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Syllabus (Guidelines) and MSR for DM(Neuroradiology) along with the recommendations of the Academic Committee and the PG Committee observed as under:

(1) The following shall be deleted in "Assessment"

1. Assessment of theory is done individually and marks will be given separately by each examiner. The average of all marks will be taken into consideration
- (2) Marking pattern in Practicals & Viva shall be prescribed for other subjects.
- (3) Requirements for dedicated 3 O.T.s for Neurosurgery and Emergency cases is too high which be reduced to 1 O.T. Emergency operations can be carried out in Emergency O.T. available in the Institute.
- (4) It is not understood why should the department of Neuro-radiology have bed complement of 20 beds. This be re-examined.
- (5) Amongst Non-teaching staff, role of "Chief Technical Officer" and "Senior Technical Officer" are not defined. This requirement be deleted.
- (6) Total of 24 Radiation Technologists is too high. This be reduced to 4.
- (7) Total of 10 Nursing staff is too high. This be reduced to 4.
- (8) Other Non-teaching staff may be deleted.

In view of above, it was decided to refer back to Academic Committee for reconsideration.

- 24. (1) Advantages of Super Speciality Based Syllabus for NEET SS Exam - Regarding.**
- (2) Request to conduct NEET SS exam based on a fair exam pattern - Regarding.**
- (3) Broadening rule of eligible course of Superspeciality in Neurology in view of Acute Shortage of Neurologist and consider to include MD (Psychiatry) (with ex months of experience in General Medicine & neurology) as eligible qualification for Neurology Super-Speciality.**

Read: the letters dated 07/12/2017 received from Dr. J. Kiran, All India Medical Super Speciality Aspirant & Residents, Secunderabad, Telangana and letters dated 05/12/2017 & 16/01/2018 received from Dr. Yogesh Shankar Pawar, Nasik with regard to Advantages of Super Speciality Based Syllabus for NEET SS Exam; request to conduct NEET SS exam based on a fair exam pattern and Broadening rule of eligible course of Superspeciality in Neurology in view of Acute Shortage of Neurologist and consider to include MD (Psychiatry) (with ex months of experience in General Medicine & neurology) as eligible qualification for Neurology Super-Speciality.



The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letters dated 07/12/2017 received from Dr. J. Kiran, All India Medical Super Speciality Aspirant & Residents, Secunderabad, Telangana and letters dated 05/12/2017 & 16/01/2018 received from Dr. Yogesh Shankar Pawar, Nasik with regard to Advantages of Super Speciality Based Syllabus for NEET SS Exam; request to conduct NEET SS exam based on a fair exam pattern and Broadening rule of eligible course of Superspeciality in Neurology in view of Acute Shortage of Neurologist and consider to include MD (Psychiatry) (with six months of experience in General Medicine & neurology) as eligible qualification for Neurology Super-Speciality and noted that the matter pertains to Conduct of NEET Examination. Applicant be directed to represent to National Board of Examinations for the same.

The Committee further decided that point (3) of the above item be referred to the Academic Committee of the Council for its consideration and recommendations.

**25. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at GSL Medical College & GSL General Hospital, Lakshmipuram, Rajahmundry.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (19/01/2018 along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2017) and compliance dated 18/09/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 06 seats at GSL Medical College & GSL General Hospital, Lakshmipuram, Rajahmundry granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (19/01/2018 along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2017) and compliance dated 18/09/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 06 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at GSL Medical College & GSL General Hospital, Lakshmipuram, Rajahmundry because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Anindita Mishra Prof & HOD is not as per regulations. He was Assoc. Prof. for 3 years. All his publications are after promotion which cannot be considered.
2. There is no Declaration Form of Dr. Vinay N.V.P. showing his demotion from Professor to Associate Professor.
3. Dr. Indira Neil Mekal, Astt. Prof., is not eligible. He is DNB from non-teaching & has no 3 yrs experience as JR in a teaching hospital when appointed first as SR & then as Asstt. Prof.
4. DSA is only C arm in the Department.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 03 to 06 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of

permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**26. Ranchi University - Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) & DMRD qualifications for 01 seat each in respect of students being trained at Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences, Ranchi.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12/01/2018 along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 08/09/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) & DMRD qualifications for 01 seat each at Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences, Ranchi granted by Ranchi University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (12/01/2018 along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 08/09/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radio Diagnosis) & DMRD qualifications for 01 seat each granted by Ranchi University in respect of students being trained at Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences, Ranchi because of the following facts:-

1. Faculty deficiency : Asst.Prof. -2.
2. Dr. Chandra Mohan, Prof & HOD was absent on the day of assessment day.
3. Promotion of Dr. Suresh Kumar Topo, Prof. is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 24-10-17 after the cut off date. He has no publications.
4. Promotion of Dr. Parasnath Ram Assoc. Prof is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01-07-16 after the cut off date. He has no publications.
5. Promotion of Dr. Rajiv Kumar Ranjan -Assoc Prof is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01-07-16 after the cut off date. He has no publications.
6. Rakesh Kr Virodhi, Sr. Resident, is not eligible. He is DMRD & MD Anatomy. He has no 3 year experience as Jr. Resident when appointed Sr. Resident.
7. Puja Bhagat, Sr. Resident, is not eligible. She is DMRD .She has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident when appointed Sr. Resident.
8. Rajiv Martin Dean-Sr. Resident, is not eligible. He is DMRD. He has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident when appointed Sr. Resident.
9. Jitender Kumar SR is not eligible. He was appointed on 20-12-2017. He is not MD
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 1(one) each in degree and diploma after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of

permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**27. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Father Muller Medical College, Mangalore.**

- (iii) Echo, TMT,EMG and NCV are in PPP mode with a private diagnostic centre which is located outside the campus. This is not allowed
- (iv) Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

3. Dr. Raghu Nandan, Asstt Prof., was not available on the day of assessment. There is no conference attendance certificate attached.
4. Dr. Goutham Kampalli, Asstt Prof was not available on the day of assessment. There is no conference attendance certificate attached.
5. Dr. Prudhvinath K, Sr. Resident is not eligible. He is DNB from non-teaching hospital. He has no 3 years experience as JR when appointed SR. Unit-III has no other Sr. Resident.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 10(Ten) seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 3. It is not given that who looks after the 170 non-teaching beds.
4. Unit-III has only 2 faculty. Hence it cannot be considered PG Unit
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. Dr. Ritu Gupta Assoc. Prof & Dr. Akhil P Singh, Asstt Prof. were absent on assessment day.
3. There is no full time speech therapist he works on contractual basis for 3 days in a week which cannot be accepted.
4. BERA machine not in working condition.
5. Nerve Stimulator/Monitor not available.
6. Neonatal Screening programme not yet started.
7. Speech & Voice analysis service not available.
8. There is no Participation in National Programme for prevention & control of deafness.
9. There are deficiencies of CSSD, Central Library and Residential Quarters Deficiency stays as such. Central Library area is very small (only 360 sq. meter against the requirement of 2400 sq. meters).
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**70. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Bankura Sammilani Medical College, Bankura.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15/01/2018 along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 06/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 2 seats at Bankura Sammilani Medical College, Bankura granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15/01/2018 along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 06/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(DVL) qualification for 2 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Bankura Sammilani Medical College, Bankura be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**71. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Gandhi Medical College, Secundrabad.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/01/2018 along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2017) and compliance dated 27/09/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at Gandhi Medical College, Secundrabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/01/2018 along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2017) and compliance dated 27/09/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Gandhi Medical College, Secundrabad because of the following facts:-

1. DLCO-still not available.
2. Departmental Library has only 29 Books.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**72. Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of MD (General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 10 to 14 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr SN Medical College, Jodhpur.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/01/2018 along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2016) and compliance dated 03/05/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 10 to 14 seats at Dr. S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/01/2018 along with the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2016) and compliance dated 03/05/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD (General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 10 to 14 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Dr SN Medical College, Jodhpur because of the following facts:-

1. Faculty Deficiency : Astd. Prof: 1
2. Dr. Nirmal Vyas, Astd.Prof.-appointed 20-11-17 : No 1 year experience as Sr.Resident after PG, hence not eligible
3. Bronchoscopy not provided in the department.
4. Unit D-MDM has only 2 faculty and it cannot be considered PG unit
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 10 to 14 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

*"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."*

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**73. Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University - Recognition of DM(Paediatric Cardiology) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (24/11/2017 along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 14/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Paediatric Cardiology) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi granted by Amrita Vishwa

Vidyapeetham University and letter dated 30/01/2018 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter and noted that this is a referred back item from OC in which the following queries have been raised:

1. To issue clarification about training requirement, especially with regard to consideration of in house training and the competent authority to clarify the training:
2. The OC desired that the PGMEC may have a re-look at the previous reports in these cases for acceptance of the faculty members (on the basis of qualification/training) when the letter of permission (LOP) was issued. In case the LOP was issued on the basis of qualification of teachers which they currently have, the PGMEC may re-consider their decision.

As per TEQ regulations there is requirement of two years special training in the subject concerned or PG degree in that subject. It is but natural to presume that special training should be imparted in an institution which has been recognised for PG course in that subject and by faculty who have the required training in that subject. In the present case LOP under section 10-A was granted by BOG in the year 2011 ignoring the above TEQ regulations. Should an error committed once be perpetuated citing that as a precedent or it should be rectified atleast in future. However, this is also a fact that new super-speciality courses cannot be started unless some relaxation in TEQ is given because pre-recognized institutions and prequalified faculty are not available. The PG committee decided to leave the matter to the wisdom of OC and their considered final decision.

**74. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of DM(Paediatric Nephrology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at St. Johns Medical College, Bangalore.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/11/2017 along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 21/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Paediatric Nephrology) qualification for 01 seat at St. Johns Medical College, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore and letter dated 30/01/2018 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that this is a Referred back item from OC in which the following queries have been raised:

1. To issue clarification about training requirement, especially with regard to consideration of in house training and the competent authority to clarify the training :
2. The OC desired that the PGMEC may have a re-look at the previous reports in these cases for acceptance of the faculty members (on the basis of qualification/training) when the letter of permission (LOP) was issued. In case the LOP was issued on the basis of qualification of teachers which they currently have, the PGMEC may re-consider their decision.

As per TEQ regulations there is requirement of two years special training in the subject concerned or PG degree in that subject. It is but natural to presume that special training should be imparted in an institution which has been recognised for PG course in that subject and by faculty who have the required training in that subject. In the present case LOP under section 10-A was granted by BOG in

the year 2013 ignoring the above TEQ regulations. Should an error committed once be perpetuated citing that as a precedent or it should be rectified atleast in future. However, this is also a fact that new super-speciality courses cannot be started unless some relaxation in TEQ is given because pre-recognised institutions and prequalified faculty are not available. The PG committee decided to leave the matter to the wisdom of OC and their considered final decision.

**75. Nizams Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Hyderabad - Recognition of DM(CI. Pharm. & Thereapeutics) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Nizams Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (24/11/2017 along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 20/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(CI. Pharm. & Thereapeutics) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at Nizams Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad granted by Nizams Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Hyderabad and letter dated 30/01/2018 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that this is a referred back item from OC in which same two queries reproduced below have been raised as in item 73 & 74.

1. To issue clarification about training requirement, especially with regard to consideration of in house training and the competent authority to clarify the training :
2. The OC desired that the PGMEC may have a re-look at the previous reports in these cases for acceptance of the faculty members (on the basis of qualification/training) when the letter of permission (LOP) was issued. In case the LOP was issued on the basis of qualification of teachers which they currently have, the PGMEC may re-consider their decision.

The following is for reply to Oversight Committee:

- In this case there is no issue of special training. In the previous assessment, it was pointed out that it was not clear as to who is treating the patients on the beds shown in this department. In the assessment report also it is not clear who is treating the patients that were shown. The department cannot admit 40 patients only for clinical pharamacological training. They have to be treated for their ailment by some competent persons.
- It was also pointed out that departmental library has only 55 books. There is no separate library room. It is in one almirah in the room of Professor & HOD. Deficiency remains as it is.
- The institution has been asked to respond to these questions only.

**76. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru.**

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27/02/2017 along with the Council Assessor's Report (June,2016) and compliance dated 19/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities



for Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27/02/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June,2016) and compliance dated 19/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**77. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of DM(Cardiology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at A. J. Institute of Medical Sciences, Mangalore.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (10.01.2018) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Cardiology) qualification for 01 seat at A. J. Institute of Medical Sciences, Mangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (10.01.2018) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DM(Cardiology) qualification for 01 seat granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at A. J. Institute of Medical Sciences, Mangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**78. Aligarh Muslim University - Recognition of (DMRT) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at J.N. Medical College, Aligarh-retrospectively reg.**

Read: the letter dated 20/01/2018 received from the Registrar, Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh with regard to retrospective recognition of (DMRT) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at J.N. Medical College, Aligarh granted by Aligarh Muslim University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the course has already been recognised for 2 seats from 2014 when first batch appeared in examination and inspection under section 11-2 of IMC Act was done.

For retrospective recognition from 1971. The PG committee perused govt. letter 09-03-15. The BOG and later PG committee had recommended recognition of DGO qualification of Goa Medical College retrospectively from the date of first examination

when the first batch students appeared in examination. Wide letter dated 09-03-15 mentioned above the Govt. asked MCI to confirm that they are satisfied with fulfillment of all required norms by the college during the period between first examination and the actual inspection/assessment (which was several years later because the college applied for recognition inspection late). Obviously PG committee cannot confirm/satisfy any such thing.

Keeping in mind the above observations of the Govt. PG committee decided that the matter of retrospective recognition from 1971 when the first batch passed out be referred to govt. for appropriate decision. The PG committee has already recommended recognition of the course from 2015 when recognition inspection was done for the first time & the same has been notified.

**79. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Retrospective effect for recognition of M.Ch (Cardio Vascular and Thoracic Surgery) qualification in respect of student being trained at Government Medical College, Kottayam - reg.**

Read: the letter dated 08/01/2018 received from the Principal, Govt. Medical College, Kottayam with regard to retrospective effect for recognition of M.Ch (Cardio Vascular and Thoracic Surgery) qualification in respect of student being trained at Government Medical College, Kottayam granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 08/01/2018 received from the Principal, Govt. Medical College, Kottayam with regard to retrospective effect for recognition of M.Ch (Cardio Vascular and Thoracic Surgery) qualification in respect of student being trained at Government Medical College, Kottayam granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur. The above qualification has been recognised from 2014 onwards when request for recognition inspection under section 11-2 of IMC act was received for the first time and course/examination was inspected by MCI.

For retrospective recognition from 1999 the PG committee for retrospective recognition from 1971. The PG committee perused govt. letter 09-03-15. The BOG and later PG committee had recommended recognition of DGO qualification of Goa Medical College retrospectively from the date of first examination when the first batch students appeared in examination. Wide letter dated 09-03-15 mentioned above the Govt. asked MCI to confirm that they are satisfied with fulfillment of all required norms by the college during the period between first examination and the actual inspection/assessment (which was several years later because the college applied for recognition inspection late). Obviously PG committee cannot confirm/satisfy any such thing.

Keeping in mind the above observations of the Govt, PG committee decided that the matter of retrospective recognition from 1999 when the first batch passed out be referred to govt. for appropriate decision. The PG committee has already recommended recognition of the course from 2015 when recognition inspection was done for the first time & the same has been notified.

**80. D.D.U. Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats and Renewal of recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 2 seats & DDVL qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur**

Read: the letter dated 29/12/2017 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats and Renewal of recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 2 seats & DDVL qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur granted by D.D.U. Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 29/12/2017 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats and Renewal of recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 2 seats & DDVL qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur granted by D.D.U. Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur and noted that this is a referred back item from govt.

The institution has one unit of 30 beds against which maximum three seats can be permitted. That is why the institute was directed to admit 3 students per year in future. The ministry may be informed accordingly.

**81. King George's Medical University, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh- Recognition of M.Ch(Gastroenterology Surgery) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Lucknow-representation req.**

Read: the letter dated 16/01/2018 received from the Dean, Academic for Comdt., Command Hospital, Central Command, Lucknow with regard to Recognition of M.Ch(Gastroenterology Surgery) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Lucknow granted by King George's Medical University, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the institute was granted LOP on 28-06-12 by MCI for starting M.Ch surgical gastroenterology with annual intake of two students. Recognition inspection was done in July 2015 when first batch appeared in examination. The report was not satisfactory and MCI recommended not to recognise the course. The institution submitted compliance for which compliance verification assessment was done on 27-10-2016. The report was again not found satisfactory.

No compliance after that was submitted by the institute. The course has been discontinued by the institute w.e.f. 2013-14 (only one batch was admitted) In the light of facts explained above.

The Postgraduate Committee decided to seek legal opinion from the Law Officer about recognition of one batch which was admitted in 2012.

**82. Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 – withdrawal of application.**

Read: the letter dated 06/02/2018 received from the Principal, Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Karnataka withdrawing the request for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre,

Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 06/02/2018 received from the Principal, Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Karnataka withdrawing the request for starting of DM (Nephrology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 and decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for starting of DM(Nephrology) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

**83. Guidelines, MSR and TEQ for MD (Family Medicine) – regarding.**

Read: the Guidelines, MSR and TEQ for MD (Family Medicine) along with the recommendations of the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Guidelines, MSR and TEQ for MD (Family Medicine) along with the recommendations of the Oversight Committee and approved with the following amendments :

1. It is prescribed that the department will have 30 beds. This should be amended as "Each unit shall have 30 beds.
2. Prescribed qualifications are MD/DNB (Family medicine), This should be amended as MD (Family medicine).
3. During transit period, prescribed qualifications are MD (General Medicine), MD (Paediatrics), MS (General Surgery), MS (O.G.). This should be amended as MD (General Medicine) or MD (Paediatrics) only.
4. Number of Books in departmental library is prescribed at 30. This should be amended as minimum 80.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

About observations by Oversight Committee regarding DNB, it is clarified that DNB remains the eligibility with all its required experience conditions as has been notified from time to time. However It is not mentioned as a Primary qualification in TEQ regulations in any subject.

**84. Consideration of the matter of one time increase of seats in Clinical branches (Broad Speciality) in Government Medical Colleges/ PG Institutes as per Teacher: Student ratio – regarding.**

Read: the matter of one time increase of seats in Clinical branches (Broad Speciality) in Government Medical Colleges/ PG Institutes as per Teacher: Student ratio along with the letter dated 23/02/2018 received from the Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi and the recommendations of the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter of one time increase of seats in Clinical branches (Broad Speciality) in Government Medical Colleges/PG Institutes as per Teacher: Student ratio along with the letter dated 23/02/2018 received from the Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi and noted that the Chairman PG Committee in meeting held on 05-10-2017 had suggested approximate increase of one thousand seats under 10-

A during the year 2018-19 since we had done one round of scrutiny of all 10-A applications received by that time and increase of about 1100 seats have been recommended under section 10-A this year.

Since one time increase to Govt. medical colleges/PG institutes as per revised teacher student ratio had already been given during the year 2017-18 and most of those fulfilling the criteria had already availed this opportunity, it was neither expected nor proposed by chairman PG committee an estimation of 2000 seats during 2018-19. The colleges were given enough time and opportunity to apply this year. Even if the exercise is repeated not much yield is expected.

The Postgraduate Committee also considered observations of Oversight Committee about stop admission recommendations on MCI website in some M.P. Colleges.

Regarding observations of OC about stop admission recommendations of GB on 16-11-2007 in medical colleges at Indore, Jabalpur and Rewa it is clarified that there are many very old colleges which are admitting PG/UG students in excess without LOP and courses were started before section 10-A of IMC act come into existence. In a meeting in the Ministry of health & family welfare in which deans of these colleges were invited, it was decided that these colleges should apply for continuation of recognition inspection and MCI should fix up the number of seats depending upon available infrastructure and manpower for future admissions and the process is going on. Some how stop admission recommendations have not been removed from website but in reality the admission was never stopped by the govt.

The PG section is directed to take note of other suggestions made by Oversight Committee and take appropriate action and relevant part of the observations be communicated to UG section as well.

**85. Amendments in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 with regard to lowering the minimum percentile for admissions in Postgraduate Courses.**

Read: the matter with regard to Amendments in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 with regard to lowering the minimum percentile for admissions in Postgraduate Courses along with the letter dated 22/02/2018 received from the Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi and recommendations of the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Amendments in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 with regard to lowering the minimum percentile for admissions in Postgraduate Courses along with the letter dated 22/02/2018 received from the Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi and recommendations of the Oversight Committee and decided that this is a policy issue and be referred to the General Body of the Council.

**The minutes of this item is read and confirmed**

**86. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Recognition of MD (Social & Preventive Medicine/ Community Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Shimoga Institute of Medical Sciences, Shimoga – correction – regarding.**

Read: the letter dated 20/02/2018 received from Dr. Vijay Kumar Mane with regard to Recognition of MD (Social & Preventive Medicine/ Community Medicine)

qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Shimoga Institute of Medical Sciences, Shimoga granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 20/02/2018 received from Dr. Vijay Kumar Mane with regard to Recognition of MD (Social & Preventive Medicine/ Community Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Shimoga Institute of Medical Sciences, Shimoga granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (Social & Preventive Medicine/ Community Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Shimoga Institute of Medical Sciences, Shimoga granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore be recognized from 2014 instead of 2015 because the college had applied for recognition inspection under Section 11(2) but MCI could not conduct the inspection.

**87. Surrendering of various PG Diploma Seats/ Submission of De-notification of the PG Diploma Seats by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare – request for increase of PG Degree seats in lieu of surrendering the PG Diploma seats – Reg.**

Read: the letter dated 19/02/2017 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee along with the letter dated 05/01/2018 received from the Dean, Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry with regard to Surrendering of various PG Diploma Seats/Submission of De-notification of the PG Diploma Seats by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare – request for increase of PG Degree seats in lieu of surrendering the PG Diploma seats along with the letter dated 17/04/2017 received from the Central Government.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 19/02/2017 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee along with the letter dated 05/01/2018 received from the Dean, Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry with regard to Surrendering of various PG Diploma Seats/Submission of De-notification of the PG Diploma Seats by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare – request for increase of PG Degree seats in lieu of surrendering the PG Diploma seats along with the letter dated 17/04/2017 received from the Central Government and discussed a letter dated 19.02.2018 received from the Secretary, Oversight Committee inviting attention to the OC letter dated 30.01.2018 and informed that OC discussed this issue in view of the MCI's communications and decided as under :-

- a. *The prevailing view in various medical college (and also supported by the MCI) has been that since diplomas do not provide any advantage in a future academic career, college should surrender their diploma seats and seek conversion to postgraduate seats. If that version is correct, the surrender and conversion should have occurred concurrently and the delay now being experienced and also responsible for the proposed disallowance of sanction of postgraduate seats (in lieu of surrendered diploma seats) would not have occurred. If the medical colleges had surrendered their diploma seats in anticipation of a concurrent conversion to PG seats, they are now faced with a situation wherein they can neither admit students for diploma nor for PG courses.*
- b. *If the version above is correct, the MCI may furnish clarification about how this surrender + conversion to PG seats came about – what was the administrative process (and under what regulation): and whether the present situation in which a college which had surrendered their diploma seat in anticipation of a concurrent conversion, and now finds itself unable to admit students to neither course is acceptable.*

- c. *MCI may furnish clarification in this matter and the council may rectify the procedure (through SOP/Executive order/ Amendment of concerned Regulation) so that from next year (for Academic session 2019-20) institutions may apply (by prescribed date, April 2018) for increase of PG degree seats with undertaking that in case their application succeed, then the institution will surrender the PG Diploma seats, equal to number of PG degree seats sanctioned:*

*The Council may, in case of Government Institution convert PG Diploma seats on the basis of undertaking and information on prescribed proforma/ application form, under section 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956, and after due assessment process, under section 10(A) of IMC Act, 1956 in case of private institutions."*

The PG Committee is of the considered opinion that the assumption that no medical college/institute wants to retain Diploma seats (since they do not provide any advantage in future academic career) may not be correct. This is supported by the fact that till date only three colleges have surrendered the Diploma courses out of hundreds such institutions which are running diploma courses. Needless to say that academic is not the only career people adopt. Many people doing private practice, working in state health services or serving in private sector prefer diploma course.

The simple answer to this problem is that those who want to surrender diploma should apply for surrender of diploma one year in advance. For example the present college under reference should have requested for surrender of diploma from the academic year 2019-20 rather than 2018-19 and applied under section 10-A for conversion from diploma to degree seats well within time frame alongwith a copy of Govt. Notification deleting the diploma courses and revised seat matrix for the academic year 2019-20. For the current year they should have retained and admitted candidates on their sanctioned diploma seats.

Alternatively they should apply well in advance to the Central Govt. and get the notification done for deletion of diploma courses well before the last date of applications under section 10A for increase/start of new PG courses for that academic year and apply under section 10A to the Central Govt. within the prescribed time frame along with copy of notification deleting the diploma seats from schedule I and revised seat matrix of that college. Those running medical colleges are wise people and plan their strategies for 50 years in advance.

Past experience shows that no undertakings are fulfilled and decision taken on the basis of undertaking becomes another matter of litigation.

Note: (Resolutions of General Body and Postgraduate Committee detailing surrender procedure have already been conveyed in minutes of meeting dated 15.02.2018).

**88. Starting of DM (Onco Pathology) course at Tata Memorial centre, Mumbai, Maharashtra under Homi Bhabha National Institute (Deemed University), Mumbai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 – consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24<sup>th</sup> November 2017) and compliance dated 09/01/2018 submitted by the college authorities for starting of DM (Onco Pathology) course at Tata Memorial centre, Mumbai, Maharashtra under Homi Bhabha National Institute (Deemed University), Mumbai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (24<sup>th</sup> November 2017) and compliance dated 09/01/2018 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter

of Permission for starting of DM(Onco Pathology) course at Tata Memorial Centre, Mumbai, Maharashtra under Homi Bhabha National Institute (Deemed University), Mumbai u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2018-2019 restricting the number of admissions to **3(Three)** students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

**89. C.S.J.M. University, Kanpur- GSVM Medical College, Kanpur with regard to recognition of Diploma in Cardiology in respect of students being trained at GSVM Medical College, Kanpur- representation received through Central Govt. Ministry of Health & Family Welfare - req.**

Read: the Central Govt. vide letter No. Z.20015/10/2018-ME-I, dated 01.02.2018 (received in this Council on 06.02.2018) alongwith D.O. letter of Dr. Harsh Vardhan, Hon'ble Minister (Science & Technology and Earth Sciences) dated 03.01.2018, representation of Dr. Rajesh Kumar Srivastava, Dr. Rakesh Singh as by Principal, GSVM Medical College Kanpur through Registrar, C.S.J.M. University, Kanpur regarding recognition of Diploma in Cardiology granted by Kanpur University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter and noted that Diploma in Cardiology is not prescribed in Regulations of the Council on Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000. The institute was never permitted for the said course. However, in light of the Govt. letter dt. 01.02.2018, the Committee decided that legal opinion be obtained from the Law Officer and resubmit the matter.
