The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 28.12.2017.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee - action taken thereon.

Action will be taken on the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 28.12.2017 after approval of the Oversight Committee.

3. Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course at GMERS Medical College, Gotri, Vadodara under The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda, Vadodara U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (19/12/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (06/09/2017) and compliance dated 18/10/2017 received through the Central Government letter dated 15/11/2017 as submitted by the college authorities at the time of hearing granted by MOHFW for Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course at GMERS Medical College, Gotri, Vadodara under The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda, Vadodara U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (19/12/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (06/09/2017) and compliance dated 18/10/2017 received through the Central Government letter dated 15/11/2017 as submitted by the college authorities at the time of hearing granted by MOHFW and noted the following:

1. Promotion of Dr. Rakesh Kumar Shrivastava, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. for 1 years 8 months and Assoc.Prof. for 3 years 3 months. He is not eligible for promotion even with publications.
2. Promotion of Dr. Chirag V Thakkar, Assoc.Prof., is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. for 2 years 9 months only against the requirement of 5 years. Hence not eligible.
3. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Assoc. Prof.: 1; (b) Asst. Prof.: 2.
4. Unit 1 which is the Unit of Professor & HOD does not have Assoc. Prof.; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
5. Units 2 & 3 have only 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as PG Units.
6. Resultantly, there is no Unit which can be considered as PG Unit.
7. MRI is not available.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

6. There were only 2 Minor & NIL Daycare Operations on day of assessment.
7. Equipment like Cryocautery is not available.
8. ART Service is not available.
9. MRI is not available.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Unit 2 is headed by Asst. Prof. who is the only faculty in the Unit; hence it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit.
6. Unit 3 has only 1 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit.
7. Resultantly there is no Unit which can be considered as PG Unit.
8. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment is 42 %.
9. Specialty clinics like Paediatric Cardiology clinic, Paediatric Gastroenterology clinic are not run.
10. Dialysis machine is not available.
11. MRI is not available.

12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Also KMIO does not receive the Trauma (Surgical & Orthopaedics), Obstetric Emergencies and other Medical Emergencies. KMIO does not have training facility in those areas. Hence, training of PG students will be inadequate.

12. All deficiencies pointed earlier stays as such.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Dr. Pavani Kalyanam is promoted as Assoc. Prof. of Emergency Medicine from the post of Asst. Prof. of Anaesthesia without any experience in the department of Emergency Medicine.
3. Dr. Patantali Rao is promoted as Assoc. Prof. of Emergency Medicine from the post of Asst. Prof. of Anaesthesia without any experience in the department of Emergency Medicine.
4. Dr. N. Anupama Priyadarshini is promoted as Assoc. Prof. of Emergency Medicine from the post of Asst. Prof. of Anaesthesia without any experience in the department of Emergency Medicine.
5. None of Senior Residents has any experience as Resident in Emergency Medicine; hence not qualified to hold the post.
6. No information has been provided when independent department of Emergency Medicine was established (Govt. order).
7. Medicine, Surgery & Orthopaedics faculties are posted by rotation in Emergency Department.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Emergency Medicine) course at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

63. MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016 & 28.12.2016) and compliance dated 17/05/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesia) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016 & 28.12.2016) and compliance dated 17/05/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Anaesthesia) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition.

Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016 & 30.03.2017) and compliance dated 30/06/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 03 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Dr BR Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore because of the following facts:-

1. Bed Occupancy is 56 % on day of assessment.
2. Workload of Frozen Section is only 23 during preceding 8 months' period – i.e. only 3/month which is inadequate.
3. There were only 5 Major Operations on day of assessment (Excluding 6 Cataract operations); resultantly Histopathology workload is inadequate. It cannot be understood that from where 38 specimens of Histopath came, when there were only 5 major and 10 minor operations done in the entire hospital.
4. Apheresis machine is not available in Blood Bank.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 3(Three) till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016 & 03.03.2017) and compliance dated 16/06/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (10/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016 & 03.03.2017) and compliance dated 16/06/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

73. Delhi University, Delhi - Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015 & 31.03.2016) and compliance dated 10/08/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi granted by Delhi University, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015 & 31.03.2016) and compliance dated 10/08/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats granted by Delhi University, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

There is only 1 unit with 45 beds and maximum permissible seats are 4, however, the College is already admitting 6 students. In future the institute will admit only 4 students which is maximum permissible with the existing number of unit and beds.

74. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University - Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Thrissur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 25/09/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 2 seats at Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Thrissur granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 25/09/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur/ Kerala University in respect of students being trained at Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Thrissur because of the following facts:-

1. Bed Occupancy on day of assessment is 60%.
2. Inspected Orthopaedic department on 20.11.2017. Unit I and Unit II IPD patients were clumped with Urology department. Half of the patients in Orthopaedic ward were of Urology Department. 2-3 patients of IPD were admitted for Physiotherapy. On day of inspection there were 5 major surgeries 8 minor surgeries. However, on assessment of last one week OT list, on an average there were 2 major surgeries per day.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 2(Two) after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Charan Singh University in respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

76. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 07 seats in respect of students being trained at Gandhi Medical College, Secundrabad.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (14/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2017) and compliance dated 26/09/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 06

to 07 seats at Gandhi Medical College, Secundrabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (14/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2017) and compliance dated 26/09/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 06 to 07 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Gandhi Medical College, Secundrabad be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

77. Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University - Recognition of DM(Paediatric Cardiology) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (24/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 14/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Paediatric Cardiology) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi granted by Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (24/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 14/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Paediatric Cardiology) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats granted by Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University in respect of students being trained at Amrita School of Medicine, AIMS, Kochi because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Mahesh K., Professor & Dr. Shine Kumar K.H., Professor, did FNB in 2006 from their own college. The certificate does not give that it was 1 year or 2 year course. The college got 1st LOP to start Paediatric Cardiology in 2013-14. It cannot be understood how they imparted training in Paediatric Cardiology in 2006 when the department was not in existence.
2. Dr. Balu Vaidyanathan, could not be Assistant Professor and doing special training simultaneously. It cannot be counted as special training in Paediatric Cardiology. He was not available on the day of assessment. No conference certificate attached.
3. Dr. R.Krishna Kumar has been straightway appointed as Assoc.Prof. He never worked as Asst.Prof. Resultantly, his appointment is not as per regulations.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek

timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 21/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Paediatric Nephrology) qualification for 01 seat at St. Johns Medical College, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (28/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 21/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Paediatric Nephrology) qualification for 01 seat granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at St. Johns Medical College, Bangalore because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Aparna Iyengarbe, Professor & HOD, was Asst.Pof., Assoc.Prof., Additional Professor and Professor till 01.05.2014 in Paediatric Department. She has been shifted to Paediatric Nephrology Department directly on 01.05.2014 without any previous experience in Paediatric Nephrology. Hence, not eligible. The department was created on 01.05.2012 and hence, her previous experience cannot be in Paediatric Nephrology when the department was not in existence.
2. None of the faculty possesses D.M. Paediatric Nephrology qualification. They are initially appointed in Paediatrics & then shifted to Paediatric Nephrology subsequently without any special training of 2 year in Paediatric Nephrology. Hence, not eligible.
3. Bed Occupancy on day of assessment was 50%.
4. The assessment day OPD was only 30.
5. The department has 18 beds only. Dialysis beds cannot be counted towards the number of beds.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e.1(One) after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek

timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2016 & 28.12.2016) and compliance dated 15/05/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of DDVL qualification for 2 seats granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at PSG Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 13/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Konaseema Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Foundation, Amalapuram granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2016) and compliance dated 13/10/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Konaseema Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Foundation, Amalapuram because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Antaryami Sahoo, Professor & HOD was absent on day of assessment.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 01 to 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Scs in respect of students being trained at Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, Gangtok be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (24/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 20/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Clinical Pharmacology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at Nizams Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad granted by Nizams Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Hyderabad.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (24/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 20/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Clinical Pharmacology) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by Nizams Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Hyderabad in respect of students being trained at Nizams Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad because of the following facts:-

1. In the previous assessment, it was pointed out that it was not clear as to who is treating the patients on the beds shown in this department. In this assessment also it is not clear who is treating the patients that were shown. The department cannot admit 40 patients only for clinical pharmacological training. They have to be treated for their ailment by competent persons.
2. Departmental library has only 55 books. There is no separate Library room. It is in 1 almirah in the room of Professor & HOD. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (23/11/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016 & 07.04.2017) and compliance dated 01/07/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at ESI-PGIMSR,ESI-Hospital, Rajajinnagar, Bangalore because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Nataraj M.S., Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 15.03.2016 after cut off date without any publication.
2. Dr. Prasad C.G.S., Professor was shown to have been promoted on 25.07.2015 in the previous report which has now been changed to 20.01.2017. However,

- there is no order for changing the promotion date. Such retrospective changes to make the faculty eligible are not allowed.
3. As per the attendance sheet, there are only 5 Sr.Resident present. There is no name of Bindu S., in the faculty table. There is deficiency of Sr. Resident -1.
 4. Dr. Omar Kamal, Senior Resident does not have any experience as Resident in a teaching hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post. Deficiency remains as it is.
 5. Dr. Niranjana C.S., Sr. Resident, is not eligible. He is DNB from non-teaching and he has no 3 years experience as resident from a teaching hospital.
 6. There is only 1 print Journal in Library after 2013. Deficiency remains as it is.
 7. Workload of Major & Minor Operations have shown a decreasing trend in previous 3 years which is still continuing.
 8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

91. to 104. Items were withdrawn by the office.

Postgraduate Committee unanimously observed and resolved that –

There has been a mushroom growth of journals, purely as business venture. They publish substandard articles and there are complaints that such publications are done for monetary considerations. MCI has become an indirect promoter of their business interests by making publications compulsory for promotion. It was noticed that 3-4 articles by same author have been published in same issue of the journal and at times, the author is not able to tell even the title of the article published under his name. The very purpose for which certain number of publications were made compulsory for promotions thus stand defeated. After detailed deliberations, the Postgraduate Committee resolved that –

1. A Committee of three experts be constituted by the President in each subject which will draw a list of standard journals by name (not by indexing or impact factor) and articles published only in those journals will be accepted as research articles for the purpose of benefit in promotions.
2. A Standing Committee of MCI be constituted by the President which will hear representations from those journals which may feel left out in the first list and the Committee will have the power to include or exclude any journal from the list at any time.

The matter may be placed before the General Body.
