The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence was received from Dr. Deelip Govindrao Mhaisekar, Dr. Dhruva Jyoti Borah & Dr. Raja Babu Panwar, Members, Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 09.01.2018.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

Action will be taken on the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 09.1.2018 after approval of the Oversight Committee.

3. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, Bhubaneswar under KIIT University, Bhubaneswar U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the matter with regard to Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, Bhubaneswar under KIIT University, Bhubaneswar U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the E-mail dated 14/12/2017 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, Bhubaneswar under KIIT University, Bhubaneswar U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the E-mail dated 14/12/2017 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee and noted that this is a referred back matter by O.C. MCI has permitted increase from 3 > 9 seats. Oversight Committee has referred back stating as under:

In case of item number 69, the increase approved is (MS-OBG) from 3-9, in this case clinical work, reported in CVA, appears inadequate for the annual intake of 9 students. Therefore, the Oversight Committee has desired to know the objective criteria followed by the PGMEC, in such cases.

In case of increase in seats the criteria followed is as under:-

In a unit of 30 beds maximum permissible seats are 3 and in a unit of 40 beds maximum permissible seats are four provided they have the requisite number of faculty in each unit. In the present case there are 3 units of 30 beds each, all units have full faculty complement. As per compliance verification report the clinical material was below:-

1. OPD attendance: 202.
2. Bed occupancy : 87%.
3. Major operations:8.
4. Minor operations :5.
5. Day care operations: 10.
6. Normal deliveries: 4.
7. Caesarean Sections:2.

Thus, there is no deficiency. Hence, increase in seats 3 to 9 was recommended.

4. Starting of MD (Paediatrics) and MS (Otorhinolaryngology) courses at Shimoga Institute of Medical Sciences, Shimoga (Karnataka) under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19- consideration of compliance.

Read: the matter with regard to Starting of MD (Paediatrics) and MS (Otorhinolaryngology) courses at Shimoga Institute of Medical Sciences, Shimoga (Karnataka) under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the E-mail dated 14/12/2017 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of MD (Paediatrics) and MS (Otorhinolaryngology) courses at Shimoga Institute of Medical Sciences, Shimoga (Karnataka) under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the

academic year 2018-19 along with the E-mail dated 14/12/2017 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee and noted that

This is a referred back matter wherein MCI has recommended LOP even though there is no MRI. (It is refused in the same institute for MD(Paediatrics), Oversight Committee has referred back the matter.

MRI is not mandatory in the subjects of Ophthalmology, Otorhinolaryngology, DVL(Dermatology) and Anaesthesia. It is required in all other clinical subjects including Paediatrics.

5. **Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at GCS Medical College, Ahmedabad under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.**

Read: the matter with regard to Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at GCS Medical College, Ahmedabad under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19- consideration of compliance verification assessment report along with the E-mail dated 14/12/2017 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at GCS Medical College, Ahmedabad under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19- consideration of compliance verification assessment report along with the E-mail dated 14/12/2017 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee and noted that:

In case of item numbers 41 and 98 the assessor has recorded deficiencies in CVA report. The Oversight Committee desires that PGMEC may have a relook at these items and record reasons for overruling the assessor's observations/remarks.

Assessor has remarked as under:-

- (1) CVTS Surgery department is not available.

Dean has stated in assessment report that Dr. Bhavna who is M.Ch. is working in the Institute and is carrying out Thoracic operations & procedures. Even otherwise existence of CTVS department is not mandatory requirement for starting of MD(Respiratory Medicine).

- (2) With regard to Dr. Nitesh K Parmar, Registration for additional qualification is not available.

Dean has stated that he has applied for additional Registration and has attached receipt for the same. This is acceptable and there is no justification.

- (3) In OPD only 2 rooms are available & space is inadequate.

As per MSR Regulations, 4 examination rooms are required only in Major departments. As Pulmonary Medicine is a minor department. 2 examination rooms are adequate & hence there is no deficiency of space.

In view of above, Postgraduate Committee considered it appropriate to grant 2 seats.

6. **Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior under Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University, Jabalpur**

U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19- consideration of compliance verification assessment report.

Read: the matter with regard to Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior under Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University, Jabalpur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the E-mail dated 14/12/2017 received from the Oversight Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at Gajra Raja Medical College, Gwalior under Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University, Jabalpur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the E-mail dated 14/12/2017 received from the Oversight Committee and noted that

This is a referred back matter by Oversight Committee asking that MCI may define acceptable parameters for the PPG mode (i.e. in item no.38 one of the deficiencies is MRI in PPP mode).

It is clarified that installation of MRI in PPP mode is acceptable provided it is installed in the institute's hospital premises itself and faculty and residents have access to reporting. It is not acceptable if installed outside the institute and there is an MOU only.

7. Starting of various postgraduate courses at Bundelkhand Medical College, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the matter with regard to Starting of various postgraduate courses at Bundelkhand Medical College, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of various postgraduate courses at Bundelkhand Medical College, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 and the Committee noted that Pre-PG Compliance Verification Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Bundelkhand Medical College, Sagar, Madhya Pradesh under Dr.Harising Gour University, Sagar was considered by the Executive Committee of the Council at its meeting held on 14/12/2017 and the Committee has decided as under:

"The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (06th December, 2017) alongwith previous assessment report (21st July, 2017 and 16th& 17th May, 2017) and noted the following:-

1. *Blood Component Separation facility is not available.*
2. *Deficiency of faculty is 22.64 % as detailed in the report.*
3. *There is no faculty in Skin & VD.*
4. *Shortage of Residents is 29.03 % as detailed in the report.*
5. *Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.*

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to grant 01(One) month time to the institute to submit the compliance on rectification of deficiencies to the Council.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to return all the applications of postgraduate courses in respect of the above institution."

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the last date for sending the final recommendations to the Central Government is 31st of January as per the time schedule as prescribed in Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000.

In view of above, the Committee decided to return the above proposals to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the schemes for the academic year 2018-19.

8. Starting of various postgraduate courses at Bidar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bidar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the matter with regard to Starting of various postgraduate courses at Bidar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bidar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of various postgraduate courses at Bidar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bidar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017 and the Committee noted that Pre-PG compliance verification Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Bidar Institute of Medical Science, Bidar under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences has been considered by the Executive Committee of the Council at its meeting held on 14/12/2017 and the Committee has decided as under:

"The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (24.11.2017) alongwith previous assessment reports (14.06.2017 and 16th& 17th May, 2016) and noted the following:-

1. *Deficiency of faculty is 13.33 % as detailed in the report.*
2. *Shortage of Residents is 20.96 % as detailed in the report.*
3. *Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment is 61 %.*
4. *There were only 3 Major Operations on day of assessment.*
5. *Histopathology workload is NIL. Deficiency remains as it is.*
6. *Intercom is not available in Hospital building. Deficiency remains as it is.*
7. *Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.*

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to grant 01(One) month time to the institute to submit the compliance on rectification of deficiencies to the Council.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to return all the applications of postgraduate courses in respect of the above institution."

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the last date for sending the final recommendations to the Central Government is 31st of January as per the time schedule as prescribed in Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the above proposals to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the schemes for the academic year 2018-19.

9. Starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Shaheed Hasan Khan Mewati Govt. Medical College, Nalhar, Nuh, Haryana under Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the matter with regard to Starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Shaheed Hasan Khan Mewati Govt. Medical College, Nalhar, Nuh, Haryana under Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Shaheed Hasan Khan Mewati Govt. Medical College, Nalhar, Nuh, Haryana under Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017 and noted that:

This is a referred back item from Oversight Committee stating that assessor has remarked as under:-

1. Many equipments in Central Research Laboratory were found non functional because there were no electricity points for many equipments.
2. Bac-T alert and Vite K-2 are non functional (because of delay in procurement of propriety items.

P.G. Committee has recommended grant of LOP for the following reasons:

This is a Govt. Institute. Deficiency of electric points (not available or non-functional) is a very minor issue. Bac-T alert and Vite-K-2 is not an essential requirement (not pointed out by the Assessor during main inspection on 27.07.2017). Still the college is having this facility and procurement of propriety items is in process.

10. Starting of various postgraduate courses at Basaveshwara Medical College & Hospital, Chitradurga u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the matter with regard to Starting of various postgraduate courses at Basaveshwara Medical College & Hospital, Chitradurga u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of various postgraduate courses at Basaveshwara Medical College & Hospital, Chitradurga u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14.12.2017 with regard to starting of various postgraduate courses at Basaveshwara Medical College & Hospital, Chitradurga u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 and noted that the Executive Committee at its meeting held on 14.12.2017 while considering the matter with regard to revocation of clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation(Amendment), 2010 Part II dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016 in respect of Basaveshwara Medical College & Hospital, Chitradurga.

The Executive Committee also decided that Institute be asked to submit the compliance for rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month for further consideration of the matter.

Clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulation (Amendment), 2010 Part II dated 16th April, 2010 and amended on 18.03.2016 is reproduced below:

“(c) Colleges which are already recognized for award of M.B.B.S. degree and/or running Postgraduate courses.

If it is observed during any inspection / assessment of the institute that the deficiency of teaching faculty and/or Residents is more than 10% and/or bed occupancy is <70%, compliance of rectification of deficiency from such an Institute will not be considered for issue of renewal of permission in that academic year and further such an Institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in that academic year and will be issued show-cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that Institute should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognised under section 11 (2) of IMC Act, 1956 alongwith direction of stoppage of admission in the permitted postgraduate courses.”

The Committee further noted that the time schedule as prescribed in Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000, the last date for sending the final recommendations to the Central Government is 31st of January.

In view of above, the Committee decided to return the above proposals to the Central Government for disapproval of the schemes for the academic year 2018-19.

11. Starting of various courses at Veer Chandra Singh Garhwali Govt. Medical Sc. & Research Instt, Srinagar, Pauri Garhwal, Uttrakhand u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 – req.

Read: the matter with regard to Starting of various courses at Veer Chandra Singh Garhwali Govt. Medical Sc. & Research Instt, Srinagar, Pauri Garhwal, Uttrakhand u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of various courses at Veer Chandra Singh Garhwali Govt. Medical Sc. & Research Instt. Srinagar, Pauri Garhwal, Uttrakhand u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of various courses at Veer Chandra Singh Garhwali Govt. Medical Sc. & Research Instt, Srinagar, Pauri Garhwal, Uttrakhand for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017 and noted Pre-PG assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities for starting of PG courses at Veer Chandra Singh Garhwali Medical Sciences & Research Institute, Garhwal was carried out by the Council Assessors on 16th & 17th May, 2017. The matter along with assessment report was considered by the Executive Committee of the Council at its meeting held on 23rd May, 2017. The Committee noted the various deficiencies and decided to grant 1(one)months time to the institution to submit the compliance on rectification of deficiencies to the Council.

The decision of the Executive Committee was communicated to the college authorities vide Council letter dated 26.05.2017 with the request to submit the compliance. Reminders in this regard were also sent on 03.08.2017, 08.09.2017, 13.10.2017 & 14.12.2017. However, no information/compliance has been received from the College authorities till date.

It is pertinent to mention here that earlier the facts of the above case were communicated to the Central Govt. vide letter dated 29.09.2017, as the last date of sending the first recommendations to GOI was 30th September.

The Committee further noted that the last date for sending the final recommendations to the Central Govt. is 31st January as per the time schedule as prescribed in "The Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Post-graduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission Capacity in any Course of Study or Training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000" ..

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the above proposals to the Central Government for disapproval of the schemes for the academic year 2018-19.

12. Starting of various courses at Starting of following course at Sri Bhausaheb Hire Government Medical College, Dhule, Maharashtra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 – reg.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of various courses at Starting of following course at Sri Bhausaheb Hire Government Medical College, Dhule, Maharashtra u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the recommendations of the Executive Committee dated 14/12/2017 and the Committee noted that Pre-PG compliance verification assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Sri Bhausaheb Hire Government Medical College, Dhule under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik has been considered by the Executive Committee at its meeting held on 14/12/2017 and decided as under : -

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification assessment report (6th & 7th December, 2017) along with previous assessment report (19th & 20th July, 2017) and noted the following-:

1. *Deficiency of faculty is 17.85 % as detailed in the report.*
2. *Shortage of Residents is 28.57 % as detailed in the report.*
3. *Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 63.42 %.*
4. *OPD: Computers at Registration counters are not in use. There is no seating arrangement in waiting area. Teaching areas are not available in some departments. Plaster Cutting room is not separate.*
5. *Wards: STP/ETP is not available. Seating capacity in Demonstration rooms of some wards is inadequate.*
6. *Casualty: Central O₂ and Central Suction are not available. Disaster Trolley is not available.*
7. *O.T.: Central O₂ and Central Suction are not available.*
8. *ICUs: Central O₂ and Central Suction are not available.*
9. *CT Scan available is 6 slice against minimum 16 slice required.*
10. *Examination Hall: Capacity of Examination Hall is 200 against 250 required.*

11. *Lecture Theaters: Only 2 Lecture Theaters are available against requirement of 3. They are not of Gallery type. Audiovisual aids are not available.*
12. *Central Library: Available area is 763 sq.m. against requirement of 1,000 sq.m. Students' Reading room (Outside) & Students' Reading room (Inside) are not available.*
13. *Central Research Laboratory is not available.*
14. *Students' Hostels: Furniture is inadequate. Visitors' room, A.C. Study room with Computer & Internet and Recreation room are not available.*
15. *Interns' Hostel: Furniture is inadequate. Visitors' room, A.C. Study room with Computer & Internet and Recreation room are not available.*
16. *Residents' Hostels: Furniture is inadequate. Visitors' room, A.C. Study room with Computer & Internet and Recreation room are not available.*
17. *Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.*

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to grant 01(One) month time to the institute to submit the compliance on rectification of deficiencies to the Council.

The Executive Committee of the Council further decided to return all the applications of postgraduate courses in respect of the above institution.

The Postgraduate Committee also noted that the last date for sending the final recommendations to the Central Government is 31st of January as per the time schedule as prescribed in Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the above proposals to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the schemes for the academic year 2018-19.

13. Starting of various courses at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 – reg.

Read: the matter with regard to Starting of various courses at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of various courses at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 and noted that the matter pertains to valid Certificate of Affiliation for the current Academic Year. In this regard, opinion of Law Officer is as under:

"The file of PG Section for starting of MD (Radio-Diagnosis), MD (Paeditrics), MS (General Surgery) and MS (Orthopedics) has been referred for my opinion in context of order dated 27.10.17 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in WPs (C) Nos. 214/2017; 215/2017; 236/2017 and 239/2017. These writ petitions were filed before the Hon'ble Supreme Court challenging the disapproval of application for academic year 2017-18. The Hon'ble Supreme Court was pleased to pass the following order:-

"We find that the application (s) dated 07.04.2016 cannot be considered for the present academic year 2017-2018. However, it is directed that the same application shall be considered for the year 2018-2019 subject to the regulations of law.

The writ petitions are disposed of accordingly."

2. *From perusal of pre-page notes it is seen that the applicant has till date not furnished consent of affiliation for academic year 2018-19. Furthermore, the application submitted by the applicant in these subjects for academic year 2018-19 has been recommended disapproval on 29.09.2017 on the ground that COA of 2017-18 was submitted with the application whereas the application was for 2018-19. Thereafter, the Central Government vide its letter dated 31.10.2017 had forwarded the representation dated 26.10.17 of the College and in its covering letter stated that the Hearing Committee of the Central Government had recommended that "MCI may review the case after the affiliation is received from the University for the year 2018-19."*
3. *Further, the Council vide letter dated 19.12.17. has informed the Central Government of the decision dated 14.11.17 of the PG Committee that the applications that have not fulfilled the qualifying criteria cannot be reviewed. In the list that has been enclosed with this letter contains the name of Travancore Medical College and the subject under reference.*
4. *Therefore, in absence of a valid consent of affiliation for academic year 2018-19, the applications of 2017-18 that have been directed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court to be considered for 2018-19, cannot be further processed as the applicant has failed even after the orders of the Hon'ble Apex Court to furnish a valid CoA."*

The Postgraduate Committee noted the decision of the Executive Committee as detailed above.

The Postgraduate Committee noted the decision of Executive Committee and opinion of Law Officer. The institute has not submitted valid Consent of Affiliation for the year 2018-19. The Postgraduate Committee noted that last date for sending the final recommendations to Central Govt. is 31st January, 2018.

In view of above, the Committee decided to reiterate the earlier decision taken by Office to return the above proposals to the Central Govt. for disapproval of the schemes for the academic year 2018-19.

14. Starting of MD(Psychiatry) course at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 – Withdrawal of Course.

Read: the matter of Starting of MD (Psychiatry) course at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the institute has withdrawn the proposal for starting of MD(Psychiatry) course at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

In view of above, the Committee decided to return the above proposals to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the schemes for the academic year 2018-19.

15. Starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 – hearing granted to medical colleges by the MOHFW – Review regarding.

Read: review the matters with regard to starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 where the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi granted hearing to the college authorities.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matters with regard to starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 where the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi granted hearing to the college authorities and noted all the applications which had been returned by MCI to Central Govt. as they did not fulfill the qualifying criteria as per regulations and have now been sent back by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare for review.

“The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reviewed the matters with regard to starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 where the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi had granted hearing to the college authorities and noted that the Hon’ble Supreme Court in its judgment dated 20/08/2015 in Royal Medical Trust & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. Reported in (2015) 10 SCC 19 has in paragraph 27 of the judgment laid down the mode and manner in which the application for establishment of new medical college, renewal of permission of existing and increase in intake capacity has to be processed, at all stages. It reads as under:-

“27...

The Schedule giving various stages and time limits must accommodate very possible eventuality and at the same time must comply with the requirements of observance of natural justice at various levels. In our view the Schedule must ideally take care of:

“(A) Initial assessment of the application at the first level should comprise of checking necessary requirements such as essentiality certificate, consent of affiliation and physical features like land and hospital requirement. If an applicant fails to fulfill these requirements, the application on the face of it, would be incomplete and be rejected. Those who fulfill the basic requirements would be considered at the next stage.”

The Committee also noted the order dated 31/08/2015 passed by the Hon’ble Supreme Court in SLP # 15043/2015 Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College v/s MCI &Anr., which reads as under:

“... ”

15. *In the instant case, the application was admittedly incomplete when it was filed. Though there is a dispute whether it was filed before 31st August, 2014. It was submitted on behalf of the MCI that it was filed on 02.09.2014. Be that as it may. Even assuming that it was filed before 31.8.2014, admittedly it was an incomplete application as the essentiality certificate issued by the Government of Maharashtra was not enclosed along with the application form due to which application came to be rejected and delay has taken place for which the petitioner has to blame itself.*

“... ”

20. *On an analysis of the aforesaid decisions, it is crystal clear that the time schedule is required to be strictly observed. ...*

“... ”

23. *Considering the statutory time schedule and that the same is already over and in the facts and circumstances of the case, it would not be appropriate to direct inspection to be made and thereafter a decision to be taken for the current academic session 2015-16 as that would be in breach of the law laid down in*

various decisions of this Court which is binding. Thus, we direct that the application which has been submitted by the college for the academic session 2015-16 be considered for the next academic session, subject to fulfillment of other requisite formalities, as may be necessary, and thereafter the MCI shall conduct an inspection well-in-time as per the time schedule fixed under the Regulations of 1999. The Special Leave Petition is dismissed with the aforesaid modification. Ordered accordingly."

The PG committee has considered the law laid down by Hon'ble Supreme Court in cases of royal medical trust & others v/s Union of India and others (2015) 10 Sec 19 and SLP# 15043/2015 Padamshree Dr. D.Y Patil Medical College v/s MCI and others, legal opinion obtained from law officer of the Council and reasons recorded for returning the applications and decided to reiterate the earlier decision of the office and return the applications to the Central Govt."

16. Starting of MD (Hospital Administration) course at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (09/06/2017) compliance dated nil vide Central Government letter dated 15/11/2017 and 19/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MD (Hospital Administration) course at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (09/06/2017) compliance dated nil vide Central Government letter dated 15/11/2017 and 19/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Starting of MD (Hospital Administration) course at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2018-2019 restricting the number of admissions to **3(Three)** students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

17. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Government Medical College, Chandigarh under Punjab University, Chandigarh U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19- consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (02/08/2017) compliance dated 22/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Government Medical College, Chandigarh under Punjab University, Chandigarh U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (02/08/2017) compliance dated 22/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

Compliance is not satisfactory.

1. Deficiency with regard to promotion of Dr. Alka Sehgal, Professor & HOD as Professor being not as per Regulations due to inadequate publications remains as it is. She has only 2 publications to her credit against requirement of 4. She is 3rd/4th author in 2 other publications which cannot be considered.
2. Separate Obstetric HDU/OICU is not available.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (29/05/2017) compliance dated 22/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

2. Dr. Rachana V Gaidole, Asst.Prof., is not eligible. She is DNB from non-teaching hospital and no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident when appointed first as Sr. Resident and then Asst.Prof.
3. Dr. Praviv E Borkar, Sr. Resident, is not eligible. He is DNB from non-teaching hospital and he has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident from a teaching hospital when appointed Sr. Resident. There is no other Sr. Resident in Unit-4.
4. OPD attendance on day of assessment is only 100 which is bare minimum to start PG course.
5. Total number of IPD patients has decreased from 10,429 in 2014 to 5,467 in 2016.
6. Total number of Minor Operations has decreased from 1,812 in 2014 to 1,312 in 2016.
7. Total number of Daycare Operations has decreased from 320 in 2014 to 295 in 2016.

4. OPD attendance upto 2 p.m. on day of assessment was 90. Gynaec OPD was only 22.
5. Bed Occupancy at 10 a.m. on day of assessment was 72 %.
6. Total number of OPD patients has decreased from 67,160 in 2014 to 61,723 in 2016.
7. Total number of IPD patients has decreased from 10,403 in 2014 to 10,033 in 2016.

3. OT runs only 4 days in a week, not every day.
4. In the previous assessment, deficiency was pointed out with regard to number of Units as the Institute is running only PG courses which is required to have facilities as required for 50 UG intake which requires 3 Units and the Institute has 2 Units. In the compliance, it was stated that 3rd Unit is made functional. However Assessor has verified that only 2 Units are functional with 66 beds. Resultantly there is deficiency of 1 Unit & 24 beds.
5. There was NIL Major Operation on day of assessment.

6. At present, elective operations in the concerned department are being performed four days in a week, i.e. On Monday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday due to shortage of resident doctors in the department of Anaesthesia. Hence, the inspection day (3.1.2018) being Wednesday, there is no major operations.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

81. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Kolkata.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04.01.2018) alongwith the Council Assessor's previous Report (s)(July, 2016) and compliance dated (08.02.2017) submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2018) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 08/02/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Kolkata be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

82. Surrendering of various PG Diploma Seats/ Submission of De-notification of the PG Diploma Seats by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare – request for increase of PG Degree seats in lieu of surrendering the PG Diploma seats in respect of Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry – Reg.

Read: the letter dated 05/01/2018 received from the Dean, Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry with regard to Surrendering of various PG Diploma Seats/ Submission of De-notification of the PG Diploma Seats by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare – request for increase of PG Degree seats in lieu of surrendering the PG Diploma seats along with the letter dated 17/04/2017 received from the Central Government.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 05/01/2018 received from the Dean, Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry with regard to Surrendering of various PG Diploma Seats/ Submission of De-notification of the PG Diploma Seats by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare – request for increase of PG Degree seats in lieu of surrendering the PG Diploma seats along with the letter dated 17/04/2017 received from the Central Government.

The P.G. Committee perused its own resolution dated 21-22 Feb 2014 and General body resolution dated 29-03-17. Relevant parts of which are reproduced below:

1. P.G. Committee resolution dated 21-22 Feb 2014:

Similarly, for all future applications, i.e. applications which are already received by the MCI but still to be considered for increase in PG degree seats (where the applicant medical college/ institution) has declared that he has stopped/ discontinued PG diploma courses) and the further action by the MCI including the conduct of inspection etc. is still to be undertaken, the concerned medical college/institution would be required to approach the Ministry of Health, Govt. of India for necessary correction in the seat matrix of PG diploma courses by deleting the number of seats of PG diploma courses which are declared to be stopped/ discounted by the applicant medical college/ institution and also for the modification of the recognition notification, as stated above and making available to the MCI the corrected seats matrix of PG diploma courses and **also the copy of amended notification and it is only whereafter the MCI would get into a position for proceeding further with the application of any PG medical college/ institution seeking to increase its PG degree seats**, after having declared that they have stopped/ discontinued PG diploma courses.

2. The General Body resolution dated 29-03-2017:

"In view of above, the council decided that the institution as and when submits the application for surrendering/stoppage of the diploma courses by way of undertaking & Central Govt. by way of notification deleting/removing the name of the course from first schedule of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 and from the matrix of the courses of the college **only thereafter the college may apply for increasing the equal number of seats in corresponding degree courses u/s 10(A) with requisite documents required as per regulations to the Central Govt.** The Central Govt. shall forward such applications to the MCI. MCI after verifying the documents shall make appropriate recommendations to the Central Govt. without any physical verification in normal circumstances. However, MCI, May, if so required carry out physical verification assessment before making any recommendation to Central Govt."

The Committee further noted that the corrected seat matrix of diploma courses by deleting the number of diploma seats has been notified by the Central Govt. on 04-01-2018 and made available to MCI on 05-01-2018 i.e. more than 7 months after the last date of receipt of 10-A application in MCI office. Moreover, the Government of India forwarded the request of the institute on 17.04.2017 whereas the last date for receipt of applications u/s 10(A) was 15.04.2017. Thus the college is not entitled to any increase in Degree sets in lieu of surrendered Diploma seats during the academic year 2018-19.

The Committee also noted that there are some grey areas in this item. Apparent logical decisions are not supported by provisions in regulations and Postgraduate Committee has no power to over-rule the provisions in the regulations. By the above decision, the college will lose diploma as well as degree seats (in lieu of these) during the current academic year (2018-19). Hence, the Postgraduate Committee decided that matter may be referred to Oversight Committee and Central Government for their considered final decision in the matter.

83. Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course at Government Medical College, Srinagar under University of Kashmir U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/01/2018) along with the Council Assessor's Report (01/08/2017) and compliance dated 15/11/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course at Government Medical College, Srinagar under University of Kashmir U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/01/2018) along with the Council Assessor's Report (01/08/2017) and compliance dated 15/11/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course at Government Medical College, Srinagar under University of Kashmir u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2018-2019 from **2(Two) to 6(Six)** students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

84. Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College & Hospital, Puducherry under Vinayaka Missions University, Salem U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/01/2018) along with the Council Assessor's Report (25/05/2017) and compliance dated 26/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College & Hospital, Puducherry under Vinayaka Missions University, Salem U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/01/2018) along with the Council Assessor's Report (25/05/2017) and compliance dated 26/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course at Aarupadai Veedu Medical College & Hospital, Puducherry under Vinayaka Missions University, Salem u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2018-2019 from **2(Two) to 3(Three)**

students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

85. Starting of various Postgraduate courses at GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar, Gujarat under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the matter with regard to Starting of various Postgraduate courses at GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar, Gujarat under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the opinion of the Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to Starting of various Postgraduate courses at GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar, Gujarat under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the opinion of the Law Officer.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the Central Govt. vide its letter dated: 15/11/2017 forwarding therewith the compliances submitted by GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar for starting of following courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with recommendation of the Hearing Committee constituted by the Central govt. seeking review of the scheme for starting the following courses:-

1. MD (General Medicine)
2. MS (General Surgery)
3. MD (Respiratory Medicine)
4. MD (Psychiatry)
5. MD (DVL)
6. MS (OBG)
7. MD (Paediatrics)
8. MS (Ophthalmology)
9. MD (Radio-Diagnosis)
10. MS (Otorhinolaryngology)
11. MD (Anaesthesiology)

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the Council office had deemed appropriate to seek the guidance of the Oversight Committee in the matter and had vide letter dated : 05/01/2018 and reminder dated: 16/01/2018 communicated to the Oversight Committee as under :-

"I am to inform you that the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi vide letter dated 13/04/2017 forwarded the applications dated 05/04/2017 received from GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar for starting of following postgraduate courses at GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19:

1. MD (General Medicine)
2. MS (General Surgery)
3. MD (Respiratory Medicine)
4. MD (Microbiology)
5. MD (Psychiatry)
6. MD (DVL)
7. MS (OBG)
8. MD (Pathology)

9. MD (Paediatrics)
10. MS (Ophthalmology)
11. MD (Radio-Diagnosis)
12. MS (Otorhinolaryngology)
13. MD (Anaesthesiology)

Out of the above 13 applications, the Council vide letter dated 19/05/2017 returned the following applications for starting of following postgraduate courses at GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 as the college was not recognized for MBBS degree at the time of submission of applications for starting of Postgraduate courses:

1. MD (General Medicine)
2. MS (General Surgery)
3. MD (Respiratory Medicine)
4. MD (Psychiatry)
5. MD (DVL)
6. MS (OBG)
7. MD (Paediatrics)
8. MS (Ophthalmology)
9. MD (Radio-Diagnosis)
10. MS (Otorhinolaryngology)
11. MD (Anaesthesiology)

In this connection, kind attention is invited to clause 1(1) of the Qualifying Criteria of "The Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Post-graduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission Capacity in any Course of Study or Training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000", which reads as under:

"The Medical college/institution must be recognized by the Medical Council of India for running Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery/Postgraduate Course; however, the Medical College/Institute which is not yet recognized by the Medical Council of India for the award of MBBS Degree may apply for starting of a Postgraduate Course in preclinical and para-clinical subjects of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pharmacology, Pathology, Microbiology, Forensic Medicine and Community Medicine at the time of third renewal – i.e. along with the admission of fourth batch for the MBBS Course."

In reference to Council's letter dated 19/05/2017, the Under Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi vide letter dated 15/11/2017 has forwarded the compliance submitted by the College Authorities at the time of hearing granted by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi and recommended to review the scheme.

On perusal of the compliance submitted by the College Authorities, it was observed that the said institute is recognized for MBBS course vide Central Government Notification dated 05/05/2017 i.e. after the cut-off date of receipt of applications by the Central Government.

It is further informed that the matters with regard to starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 where the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi granted hearing to the college authorities was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee at its meeting held on 14/11/2017 and the Committee decided as under:

"The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reviewed the matters with regard to starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 where the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi had granted hearing to the college authorities and noted that

the Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgment dated 20/08/2015 in Royal Medical Trust & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. Reported in (2015) 10 SCC 19 has in paragraph 27 of the judgment laid down the mode and manner in which the application for establishment of new medical college, renewal of permission of existing and increase in intake capacity has to be processed, at all stages. It reads as under:-

"27...

The Schedule giving various stages and time limits must accommodate very possible eventuality and at the same time must comply with the requirements of observance of natural justice at various levels. In our view the Schedule must ideally take care of:

"(A) Initial assessment of the application at the first level should comprise of checking necessary requirements such as essentiality certificate, consent of affiliation and physical features like land and hospital requirement. If an applicant fails to fulfill these requirements, the application on the face of it, would be incomplete and be rejected. Those who fulfill the basic requirements would be considered at the next stage."

The Committee also noted the order dated 31/08/2015 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP # 15043/2015 Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College v/s MCI &Anr., which reads as under:

"...

15. In the instant case, the application was admittedly incomplete when it was filed. Though there is a dispute whether it was filed before 31st August, 2014. It was submitted on behalf of the MCI that it was filed on 02.09.2014. Be that as it may. Even assuming that it was filed before 31.8.2014, admittedly it was an incomplete application as the essentiality certificate issued by the Government of Maharashtra was not enclosed along with the application form due to which application came to be rejected and delay has taken place for which the petitioner has to blame itself.

...

20. On an analysis of the aforesaid decisions, it is crystal clear that the time schedule is required to be strictly observed. ...

...

23. Considering the statutory time schedule and that the same is already over and in the facts and circumstances of the case, it would not be appropriate to direct inspection to be made and thereafter a decision to be taken for the current academic session 2015-16 as that would be in breach of the law laid down in various decisions of this Court which is binding. Thus, we direct that the application which has been submitted by the college for the academic session 2015-16 be considered for the next academic session, subject to fulfillment of other requisite formalities, as may be necessary, and thereafter the MCI shall conduct an inspection well-in-time as per the time schedule fixed under the Regulations of 1999. The Special Leave Petition is dismissed with the aforesaid modification. Ordered accordingly."

The Postgraduate Committee considered all the applications which had been returned by MCI to Central Govt. as they did not fulfill the qualifying criteria as per regulations and have been now sent back by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare for review.

The PG committee has considered the law laid down by Hon'ble Supreme Court in cases of royal medical trust & others v/s Union of India and others (2015) 10 Sec 19 and SLP# 15043/2015 PadamshreeDr D.Y Patil Medical College v/s MCI and others, legal opinion obtained from law officer of the Council and reasons

recorded for returning the applications and decided to reiterate the earlier decision of the office and return the applications to the Central Govt."

A Legal Opinion has also been obtained from the Law Officer, MCI. The opinion is reproduced below:

"The file of GMERS Medical College, Gandhi Nagar of the PG Section with respect to application made for starting of PG courses in 11 clinical subjects has been referred for my opinion. Briefly stated the facts are as under:

Firstly, the application dated 05.04.2017 of GMERS Medical College was forwarded to the Council office by Central Government letter dated 13.04.2017.

Secondly, it was recommended for disapproval to the Central Government on 11.05.2017 by placing reliance upon Clause 3(1) of the "Opening of a High Course of Study or Training (including Post-Graduate course of Study of Training) and Increase of Admission Capacity in any Course of Study or Training (Including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000 [hereinafter in Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Post-graduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission Capacity in any Course of Study or Training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000 Regulations]

3. QUALIFYING CRITERIA: The medical college/institution shall qualify for opening a New or Higher Course of Study or training (including a post-graduate Course of Study of Training) in the medical colleges/institutions of the following conditions are fulfilled:

(1) The Medical college/institution must be recognized by the Medical Council of India for running Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery/Postgraduate Course, however, the Medical College/Institute which is not yet recognized by the Medical Council of India for the award of MBBS Degree may apply for starting of a Postgraduate Course in preclinical and para-clinical subjects of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pharmacology, Pathology, Forensic medicine and Community Medicine at the time of third renewal- i.e., along with the admission of fourth batch for the MBBS course.

2. The Central Government had vide its letter dated 15.11.2017 has stated as under:

"Keeping in view the fact that the Government is aiming to increase PG seats in Government Medical Colleges, the Ministry is also forwarding the compliance of all those Government Medical Colleges which were recommended for disapproval by the Hearing Committee on 13.11.2017 to MCI for review."

The five medical colleges of whom application has been returned to MCI citing above grounds are:

1. Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad
2. Mohan Kumaramangalam Medical College, Salem
3. Shri Krishna Medical College, Bihar
4. Guru Gobind Singh Medical College, Punjab
5. GMERS Medical College, Gadhinar

3. On query from PG Section it has been informed that the only application that has been rejected of the above medical colleges by virtue of Regulation 3(1) of the Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Post-graduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission Capacity in any Course of Study or Training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or

Training) Regulations, 2000 Regulation is of GMERS College while the other 4 applications are on receipt of compliance being further processed.

4. The Dean of the Medical College in his letter dated 10.11.2017 addressed to the Central Government has stated as under:

"With reference to your letter cited above this college has applied for starting Postgraduate courses in 13 subjects, I request you to consider our application vide below mentioned reasons.

Medical Council of India, New Delhi letter Point No.3 qualification criteria, I am to state that Medical Council of India has recognized this institute on 6th April 2017 (copy enclosed) and Govt. of India has issued said on 05.05.2017 (copy enclosed) for reorganization of this institute. Meanwhile in anticipation of this, institute has submitted proposal of postgraduate courses.

I request you to sir in benefit of students and poor patients' interest and saving of Postgraduate inspection fees Rs. 52,00,000 (Rupees Fifty Two Lacs) postgraduate and please consider our application of starting postgraduate courses."

5. It is further stated on the pre-page note that the General Body of the Council in its meeting held on 29.03.2017 had decided to approve for the recognition of MBBS qualification awarded by GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar. The requisite notification including the MBBS qualification in the first schedule of the IMC Act has been thereafter issued by the Central Government of 05.05.2017.

6. It is also noted on the pre-page note that the last date for making application to the Central Government for starting/increase of PG Courses as per the approved time schedule was 07.04.2017.

7. It may be noted that for the last two academic years the Council and Central Government has initiated in a scheme for one time increase in PG clinical courses in broad specialty for Government Medical Colleges of the Country based upon the teacher student ratio. Communication for seeking information from the Government Medical Colleges has been made for academic years 2017-18 on 13.02.2017 and 16.02.2017 while for academic year 2018-19 it has been made on 22.12.2017.

8. Keeping in view the observations made by the Central Government in its letter dated 15.12.2017 requiring MCI to review its decision in view of the objective of increasing PG seats in Government Medical Colleges and the fact that the Council has as early as 29.03.2017 agreed for recognition for MBBS qualification awarded by GMERS Medical College and that the communication from the Council to Central Government also has been made on 06.04.2017 i.e. one day before the last date of making application to the Central Government. Thus, in so far as the Council is concerned the qualification stand recognized. However, the procedural requirement in this regard is accomplished only once the requisite notification is issued by the Central Government which is on 05.05.17.

9. Therefore, in these circumstances, when the Council and Central Government has embarked upon an exercise of increasing PG seats in Government Medical Colleges in clinical courses, based upon student-teacher ratio and that the rejection by virtue of Regulation 3 (1) referred appears to be hyper technical, I am of the view that application of the GMERS Medical College deserves to be further processed. However, as Council has consistently applied Regulation 3(1), prior to making any exception it would be appropriate to seek guidance from the Hon'ble Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee regarding the processing of the application."

Therefore, you are requested to convey the advice/ recommendations of the Oversight Committee on the above matter at the earliest as the matter is time bound and has to be recommended to the Central Government by 31st January, 2018."

The Oversight Committee had in response to the above mentioned Council letter responded as under: -

"Please refer to your letter dated 05.01.2018 on the above mentioned subject, the Oversight Committee considered the Council's proposal on the basis of information and documents furnished to it.

The Oversight Committee has desired that MCI may furnish its specific proposal/ recommendations in this case, keeping in view the provisions of the Regulations, directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court/ other courts and precedence in such similar cases. MCI may also inform if there is violation of any Regulation/ Court order, if the decision is taken to process applications for starting of PG courses at this point of time."

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the applications for starting/increase of seats in PG courses are required to be processed in accordance with the provisions of the "Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Post-graduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000" and it was observed that the college was not recognized for MBBS degree by the last date of receipt of application by the Central Government i.e. between 15th March to 7th April (both days inclusive of any year). The notification recognizing GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar, Gujarat for MBBS Degree has been issued on 05/05/2017.

In this regard, it may be noted that as per Clause 3(1) of the "Opening of a Higher Course of Study or Training (including Post-graduate course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission Capacity in any Course of Study or Training (Including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000 [hereinafter in Opening and Increase Regulations]" provides as under:-

3. QUALIFYING CRITERIA: The medical college/institution shall qualify for opening a New or Higher Course of Study or training (including a post-graduate Course of Study or Training) in the medical colleges/institutions if the following conditions are fulfilled:

(1) The Medical college/institution must be recognized by the Medical Council of India for running Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery/Postgraduate Course; however, the Medical College/Institute which is not yet recognized by the Medical Council of India for the award of MBBS Degree may apply for starting of a Postgraduate Course in preclinical and para-clinical subjects of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pharmacology, Pathology, Microbiology, Forensic Medicine and Community Medicine at the time of third renewal – i.e. along with the admission of fourth batch for the MBBS Course;

The Postgraduate Committee noted that MBBS degree awarded by GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar was not included in the First Schedule of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956, at the time of making applications for PG Courses. Consequently, the MBBS qualification of GMERS Medical College, Gandhinagar was not a recognized medical qualification in terms of Indian Medical Council Act, 1956. Accordingly, the college was not entitled to make an application in terms of Regulation 3(1) referred above.

Furthermore, Clause 4 of above Regulation requires that the application complete in all respect submitted by the last date as prescribed in the Regulation shall be registered and incomplete application will be returned.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in view of the above said statutory provisions, the application/s submitted by College authority were returned to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi vide Council letter dated 11/05/2017.

Further, the matters with regard to starting of various postgraduate courses as quoted above in respect of said college for the academic year 2018-19 where the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi had granted hearing to the college authorities were considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee at its meeting held on 24/01/2018 and the Committee decided as under:

"The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reviewed the matters with regard to starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 where the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi had granted hearing to the college authorities and noted that the Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgment dated 20/08/2015 in Royal Medical Trust & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. Reported in (2015) 10 SCC 19 has in paragraph 27 of the judgment laid down the mode and manner in which the application for establishment of new medical college, renewal of permission of existing and increase in intake capacity has to be processed, at all stages. It reads as under:-

"27...

The Schedule giving various stages and time limits must accommodate very possible eventuality and at the same time must comply with the requirements of observance of natural justice at various levels. In our view the Schedule must ideally take care of:

"(A) Initial assessment of the application at the first level should comprise of checking necessary requirements such as essentiality certificate, consent of affiliation and physical features like land and hospital requirement. If an applicant fails to fulfill these requirements, the application on the face of it, would be incomplete and be rejected. Those who fulfill the basic requirements would be considered at the next stage."

The Committee also noted the order dated 31/08/2015 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP # 15043/2015 Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College v/s MCI &Anr., which reads as under:

"...

15. In the instant case, the application was admittedly incomplete when it was filed. Though there is a dispute whether it was filed before 31st August, 2014. It was submitted on behalf of the MCI that it was filed on 02.09.2014. Be that as it may. Even assuming that it was filed before 31.8.2014, admittedly it was an incomplete application as the essentiality certificate issued by the Government of Maharashtra was not enclosed along with the application form due to which application came to be rejected and delay has taken place for which the petitioner has to blame itself.

...

20. On an analysis of the aforesaid decisions, it is crystal clear that the time schedule is required to be strictly observed. ...

...

23. Considering the statutory time schedule and that the same is already over and in the facts and circumstances of the case, it would not be appropriate to direct inspection to be made and thereafter a decision to be taken for the current academic session 2015-16 as that would be in breach of the law laid down in various decisions of this Court which is binding. Thus, we direct that the application which has been submitted by the college for the academic session 2015-16 be considered for the next academic session, subject to fulfillment of other requisite formalities, as may be necessary, and thereafter the MCI shall conduct

an inspection well-in-time as per the time schedule fixed under the Regulations of 1999. The Special Leave Petition is dismissed with the aforesaid modification. Ordered accordingly."

The Postgraduate Committee considered all the applications which had been returned by MCI to Central Govt. as they did not fulfill the qualifying criteria as per regulations and have been now sent back by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare for review."

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee has considered the law laid down by Hon'ble Supreme Court in cases of royal medical trust & others v/s Union of India and others (2015) 10 SCC 19 and SLP(C) No. 15043/2015 Padamshree Dr D.Y Patil Medical College v/s MCI and others, and reasons recorded for returning the applications and decided that the application for starting of Postgraduate Courses by the GMERS Medical College cannot be processed as the notification of the Central Govt. recognizing the MBBS qualification had been issued only on 05/05/2017 whereas the last date of making application for Postgraduate courses was 7th April 2017.

In view of non-fulfillment of qualifying criteria laid down in Regulations the applications should be recommended to Central Govt. for disapproval."

The PG Committee, however decided to seek the opinion of the Hon'ble Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee for timely decision.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/01/2018) along with the Council Assessor's Report (19th June 2017) and compliance dated 23/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course at Kilpauk Medical College, Chennai, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2018-2019 from **1(One) to 6(Six)** students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

87. Starting of M.Ch (Cardio Vascular & Thoracic Surgery) course at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh under Aligarh Muslim University U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (13th November 2017) for Starting of M.Ch (Cardio Vascular & Thoracic Surgery) course at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh under Aligarh Muslim University U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 along with the letter dated 03/01/2018 received from the Secretary to the Oversight Committee. (Referred back item from O.C.)

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/01/2018) along with the Council Assessor's Report (06/07/2017) and compliance dated 22/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Pondicherry under Pondicherry University, Puducherry U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

104. Starting/ increase of seats in various Postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic session 2018-19 – Hearing granted to Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh where MCI has recommended for disapproval of schemes – reg.

Read: the letter dated 09/01/2018 from the Under Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to hearing granted to Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh where MCI has recommended for disapproval of schemes for Starting/ increase of seats in various Postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic session 2018-19

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 09/01/2018 from the Under Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi with regard to hearing granted to Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh where MCI has recommended for disapproval of schemes for Starting/ increase of seats in various Postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic session 2018-19 as per details provided by UG Section. The Committee noted that the Pre-PG Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for starting of PG course at Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal under Barkatullah University was carried out by the Council's Assessors on 3rd & 4th May, 2017. The said assessment report alongwith a letter dated 04.05.2017 of the Dean, Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal and a complaint/letter dated 03.05.2017 of Sh. Arvind Yadav was considered by the Executive Committee at its meeting held on 23.05.2017 and it was decided that in view of the gross deficiencies Clause 8 (3) (1) (c) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 be invoked against the college. The college authorities were granted one month time to submit the compliance report regarding the rectification of deficiencies. This decision was communicated by Council letter dated 26.05.2017 to the college authorities and was endorsed to the Central Govt. also. The college had submitted the compliance report on 22.06.2017 that was verified by the Council's Assessor on 20.07.2017. The compliance verification report alongwith the representation dated 20.07.2017 and 25.07.2017 was considered by the Executive Committee of the Council on 08.08.2017 and in view of the persisting gross deficiencies the Executive Committee decided to continue the application of Clause 8 (3) (1) (c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, and granted further opportunity of one month to the college authorities to submit the compliance report. This decision was conveyed vide Council letter dated 16.08.2017 to the college authorities and was endorsed to the Central Govt. also.

3. Subsequently, compliance verification assessment was conducted on 23.09.2017 and the Executive Committee alongwith the representation dated 24.09.2017 of the college authorities considered the matter in the Executive Committee meeting on 26.09.2017. In view of the persisting deficiencies in the college, the Executive Committee decided to apply Clause (8)(3)(1)(c) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, and also decided not to consider the college for processing applications for postgraduate courses in the current Academic year (2018-19) and to issue show cause notice as to why the recommendation for withdrawal of recognition of the courses run by that college should not be made for undergraduate and postgraduate courses which are recognized u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act,1956, along with direction of stoppage of admissions in permitted postgraduate courses and further decided that the institute be asked to submit the compliance of rectification of the above deficiencies within 01 month.

4. In view of the application of Clause 8(3)(1)(c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, it was also decided to return the application for Postgraduate

courses submitted by the college. This decision has been conveyed to the Central Govt. vide Council letter dated 10.10.2017 and was endorsed to the Central Govt. also.

5. All the above decisions have been duly approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court Mandated Oversight Committee on MCI. It is pertinent to add that the Oversight Committee vide its letter dated 16.11.2017 after consideration of the representations dated 12.10.17 and 21.10.17 in pursuance of the Order dated 06.11.17 in W.P. No. 18408/2017 – Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal Vs. Union of India & Ors., of the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh, Principal Seat at Jabalpur had decided to disapprove the request of college authorities for grant of permission for starting of Postgraduate courses in 10 subjects, and removal of the penal consequences of Clause 8 (3) (1) (c) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999.

6. The above chronology of events in respect of the applicant medical college clearly brings out that sufficient opportunities have been granted to the college for rectifying deficiencies and till date there has been no rectification. Furthermore, the college has failed to submit compliance rectification report as sought for by the Council letter dated 10.10.2017 both directly to Council as well as to the Central Government at the time of hearing.

7. Further, it is brought to your notice that the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Medical Council of India Vs. State of Karnataka (1998) 6 SCC 131 has held as under:

“Regulations framed under section 33 of the Medical Council Act with the previous sanction of the Central Government are statutory. These regulations are framed to carry out the purposes of the Medical Council Act and for various purposes mentioned in section 33. If a regulation falls within the purposes referred under section 33 of the Medical Council Act, it will have mandatory force.”

8. The Hon'ble Division Bench of the Hon'ble Delhi High Court in WP (C) No. 5041/2015 titled as Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr., vide its judgment dated 28.05.2015, had upheld the validity of Regulation 8(3)(1) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 and no opportunity could be granted to an institution who had failed to fulfill the minimum requirements as provided in the said Regulations. The said judgment had been challenged before the Hon'ble Supreme Court wherein no stay was granted and leave was granted in the matter. It is also necessary to note that the Hon'ble Larger Bench of the Hon'ble Delhi High Court in WP (C) No. 7106/2015 titled as Malla Reddy Institute of Medical Science & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. And WP (C) No. 8541/2015 titled as Lord Buddha Siksha Pratisthan & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr., vide its judgment dated 29.09.2015 had even though upheld the validity of the aforesaid Regulations however had observed that an opportunity should be given to the medical college to rectify the deficiencies. The Council had approached the Hon'ble Supreme Court by way of SLP (C) No.31535/2015-Medical Council of India Vs. Malla Reddy Institute of Medical Science & Anr. And SLP (C) No.30742/2015- Medical Council of India Vs. Lord Buddha Siksha Pratisthan & Anr. against the judgment dated 29.09.2015 passed by the Hon'ble Larger Bench of the Hon'ble Delhi High Court. The Hon'ble Supreme Court vide its judgment dated 27.04.2016 in the aforementioned matters has set-aside the judgment dated 29.09.2015 passed by the Hon'ble Larger Bench of the Hon'ble Delhi High Court and has allowed the appeals filed by the Council. Thus the judgment dated 28.05.2015 passed by the Hon'ble Division Bench of the Hon'ble Delhi High Court in WP (C) No. 5041/2015 titled as Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr., stands revived and is the authoritative pronouncement on the validity of Regulation 8(3)(1) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999.

9. In view of the provision of Clause 8 (3) (1) (c) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 referred above, wherein it is provided that “.... compliance of

rectification of deficiency from such an institute will not be considered for issue of renewal of permission in that Academic year and further such an institute will not be considered for processing applications for postgraduate courses in that Academic year....” , it is not permissible in law for the Council to cause the physical verification.

In view of the binding Regulations of the Council and the decision dated 16.11.2017 of the Oversight Committee physical verification of the Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal with reference to starting of postgraduate courses for the Academic year 2018-19 cannot be considered.

The PG Committee noted that since the Clause 8(3)(1)(c) imposed by the Executive Committee of the Council has not yet been revoked, the postgraduate applications cannot be processed further. Also as the last date for processing of PG applications is 31st January, 2018.

In view of above, the PG Committee decided to return the proposals for starting of various Postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses at Chirayu Medical College & Hospital, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh to the Central Government for disapproval of the schemes for the academic year 2018-19.

105. Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course at ESI-Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 - Representation received from Dean, ESI PGMSR, Basaidarapur, New Delhi.

120. Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed Medical College, Barpeta, Assam under Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/01/2018) along with the Council Assessor's Report (21st June 2017) and compliance dated nil received through the Central Government letter dated 15/11/2017 & compliance dated 16/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed Medical College, Barpeta, Assam under Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/01/2018) and compliance dated nil received through the Central Government letter dated 15/11/2017 & compliance dated 16/12/2017 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed Medical College, Barpeta, Assam under Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 and noted the following:

- (i) Blood component separation facility still not available.
- (ii) Frozen section, Histochemistry, HPLC not available.
- (iii) Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed Medical College, Barpeta, Assam under Srimanta Shankardeva University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

121. Application received for Starting of MS(General Surgery) course at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956 for the Academic Year 2018-19.

Read: the matter alongwith ministry letter no. U.12012/33/2017-ME-[FTS3133726] dated: 23/01/2018 forwarding therewith the order dated: 17/01/2018 of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in WP No. (C) No. 430/2018 & CM 1828/2018 tilted School of Medical Sciences & Research Vs Union of India & others directing the MCI to accept the application of the institute and process it as per the provisions of the IMC Act 1956 & Regulations with regard to application received for starting of MS(General Surgery) course at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956 for the Academic Year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter alongwith ministry letter no. U. 12012/33/2017-ME-[FTS3133726] dated: 23/01/2018 forwarding therewith the order dated: 17/01/2018 of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in WP No. (C) No. 430/2018 & CM 1828/2018 tilted School of Medical Sciences & Research Vs Union of India & others

directing the MCI to accept the application of the institute and process it as per the provisions of the IMC Act 1956 & Regulations with regard to application received for starting of MS(General Surgery) course at School of Medical Sciences & Research, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10(A) of IMC Act 1956 for the Academic Year 2018-19. The Committee further noted the Council, letter dated 23.01.2018 written to the Oversight Committee, which is reproduced as under:-

"I am directed to inform you that as per practice and procedure, the application was scrutinized in accordance with the provisions of the "Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission capacity in any course of study or training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000" and it was observed that the college authorities have submitted Consent of Affiliation dated: 05/04/2017 for the academic session 2017-18 and not for 2018-19, which is not acceptable as per regulations.

Accordingly, the application was returned to Central Govt. vide Council letter dated: 06/06/2017.

All applications deficient on similar grounds i.e. invalid Consent of Affiliation were returned to the Central Government, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi.

Subsequently, the Central Govt. granted hearing to the applicant college and forwarded the compliance to MCI for review.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee at its meeting held on 14/11/2017 considered/reviewed the matters with regard to starting/ increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Specialty) courses for the academic year 2018-19 where the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi had granted hearing to the college authorities and noted that the Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgment dated 20/08/2015 in Royal Medical Trust & Anr. Vs. Union of India & Anr. Reported in (2015) 10 SCC 19 has in paragraph 27 of the judgment laid down the mode and manner in which the application for establishment of new medical college, renewal of permission of existing and increase in intake capacity has to be processed, at all stages. It reads as under:-

"27...

The Schedule giving various stages and time limits must accommodate very possible eventuality and at the same time must comply with the requirements of observance of natural justice at various levels. In our view the Schedule must ideally take care of:

"(A) Initial assessment of the application at the first level should comprise of checking necessary requirements such as essentiality certificate, consent of affiliation and physical features like land and hospital requirement. If an applicant fails to fulfill these requirements, the application on the face of it, would be incomplete and be rejected. Those who fulfill the basic requirements would be considered at the next stage."

The Committee also noted the order dated 31/08/2015 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP # 15043/2015 Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College v/s MCI & Anr., which reads as under:

"...

15. *In the instant case, the application was admittedly incomplete when it was filed. Though there is a dispute whether it was filed before 31st August, 2014. It was submitted on behalf of the MCI that it was filed on 02.09.2014. Be that as it may. Even assuming that it was filed before 31.8.2014, admittedly it was an incomplete application as the essentiality certificate issued by the Government of Maharashtra was not enclosed along with the application form due to which application came to be rejected and delay has taken place for which the petitioner has to blame itself.*

...
20. *On an analysis of the aforesaid decisions, it is crystal clear that the time schedule is required to be strictly observed. ...*

...
23. *Considering the statutory time schedule and that the same is already over and in the facts and circumstances of the case, it would not be appropriate to direct inspection to be made and thereafter a decision to be taken for the current academic session 2015-16 as that would be in breach of the law laid down in various decisions of this Court which is binding. Thus, we direct that the application which has been submitted by the college for the academic session 2015-16 be considered for the next academic session, subject to fulfillment of other requisite formalities, as may be necessary, and thereafter the MCI shall conduct an inspection well-in-time as per the time schedule fixed under the Regulations of 1999. The Special Leave Petition is dismissed with the aforesaid modification. Ordered accordingly."*

The Postgraduate Committee considered all the applications both Government & Private which had been returned by MCI to Central Govt. as they did not fulfill the qualifying criteria as per regulations including those with invalid Consent of Affiliation and which had been sent back by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare for review.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee had considered the law laid down by Hon'ble Supreme Court in cases of royal medical trust & others v/s Union of India and others (2015) 10 Sec 19 and SLP# 15043/2015 PadamshreeDr D.Y Patil Medical College v/s MCI and others, legal opinion obtained from law officer of the Council and reasons recorded for returning the applications and decided to reiterate the earlier decision of the office and return the applications to the Central Govt.³

The above minutes have also been approved by the Oversight Committee vide its letter dated: 14/12/2017.

The above decision was communicated to the Central govt. vide Council letter dated: 19/12/2017 in respect of said college and various other Govt./Pvt. Medical Colleges, which were rejected on the similar grounds.

Further, it may please be noted that as per the time schedule in the regulations of the Council the last date for sending the final recommendations of the Council for broad specialty postgraduate courses is 31st January. This week there is a national holiday on 26th January (Friday) and as per the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, the assessments cannot be conducted two days before or after a National Holiday. Hence, it would not be possible to conduct any assessment in such a short span of time and send the recommendations within the time schedule.

In view the position explained above, you are requested to provide your valuable opinion in this regard as soon as possible for further consideration in the matter."

The Postgraduate Committee decided to ratify the Council letter dated 23.01.2018 addressed to the Hon'ble Supreme Court Mandated Oversight Committee as it covers all aspects of the case both legally and procedurally and decided to refer the same to the Oversight Committee for opinion and further necessary action.

122. Starting/increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 – hearing granted to medical colleges where MCI has recommended for disapproval of scheme – req.

Read: the Central Govt. letter dated 17.01.2018 with regard to starting/increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 granting hearing to medical colleges by the Central Government where MCI has recommended for disapproval of scheme.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Central Govt. letter dated 17.01.2018 with regard to starting/increase of seats in various postgraduate (Broad Speciality) courses for the academic year 2018-19 granting hearing to medical colleges by the Central Government where MCI has recommended for disapproval of scheme and noted the remarks of the Central Government that "As per Hearing Committee, the college has not contested for these courses. It being a Government college, Ministry sent the names to MCI for review vide letter dated 15.11.2017.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that no compliance has been submitted by the institute and there is no provision to consider the matter without submission of the compliance by the concerned medical college.

In view of the above, the Committee decided to recommend for disapproval of the Scheme of the following courses for the academic year 2018-19:-

123. Surrender of Postgraduate Diploma seats in 12 subjects – Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune – reg.

Read: the matter alongwith the observation of the Oversight Committee vide letter dated letter 22.01.2018 as well as earlier recommendations of the Postgraduate Committee taken at its meeting held on 28.12.2017 with regard to surrender of postgraduate diploma seats in 12 subjects at Dr.D.Y. Patil Medical College & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune. (This is a referred back item from O.C.)

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee re-considered the entire matter alongwith the observation of the Oversight Committee vide letter dated letter 22.01.2018 as well as earlier recommendations of the Postgraduate Committee taken at its meeting held on 28.12.2017 with regard to surrender of postgraduate diploma seats in 12 subjects at Dr.D.Y. Patil Medical College & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune and the Postgraduate Committee perused its own resolution dated 21-22 Feb 2014 and General body resolution dated 29-03-17. Relevant parts of which are reproduced below:

1. P.G. Committee resolution dated 21-22 Feb 2014:

Similarly, for all future applications, i.e. applications which are already received by the MCI but still to be considered for increase in PG degree seats (where the applicant medical college/ institution) has declared that he has stopped/ discontinued PG diploma courses) and the further action by the MCI including the conduct of inspection etc. is still to be undertaken, the concerned medical college/institution would be required to approach the

Ministry of Health, Govt. of India for necessary correction in the seat matrix of PG diploma courses by deleting the number of seats of PG diploma courses which are declared to be stopped/ discounted by the applicant medical college/ institution and also for the modification of the recognition notification, as stated above and making available to the MCI the corrected seats matrix of PG diploma courses and **also the copy of amended notification and it is only whereafter the MCI would get into a position for proceeding further with the application of any PG medical college/ institution seeking to increase its PG degree seats**, after having declared that they have stopped/ discontinued PG diploma courses.

2. The General Body resolution dated 29-03-2017:

"In view of above, the council decided that the institution as and when submits the application for surrendering/stoppage of the diploma courses by way of undertaking & Central Govt. by way of notification deleting/ removing the name of the course from first schedule of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 and from the matrix of the courses of the college **only thereafter the college may apply for increasing the equal number of seats in corresponding degree courses u/s 10(A) with requisite documents required as per regulations to the Central Govt.** The Central Govt. shall forward such applications to the MCI. MCI after verifying the documents shall make appropriate recommendations to the Central Govt. without any physical verification in normal circumstances. However, MCI, May, if so required carry out physical verification assessment before making any recommendation to Central Govt."

The Committee further noted that the corrected seat matrix of diploma courses by deleting the number of diploma seats has been notified by the Central Govt. on 08.12.2017 and made available to MCI on 13.12.2017 i.e. more than 7 months after the last date of receipt of 10-A application in MCI office. Moreover, the Government of India has forwarded the request of the institute on 13.12.2017 whereas the last date for receipt of applications u/s 10(a) was 15.04.2017. Thus the college is not entitled to any increase in degree seats in lieu of surrendered diploma seats during the year 2018-19.

In the earlier decision, it was inadvertently missed that surrender of diploma course, their denotification and correction in seat matrix has been done only on 08.12.2017 which is much after the last date of receipt of 10-A applications. Error is regretted.

The Committee also noted that there are some grey areas in this subject. Apparent logical decisions are not supported by provisions in regulations. PG Committee has no power to over-rule the provisions in the regulations. In the coming academic session, the college will lose diploma as well as degree seats. Hence, the Postgraduate Committee decided that matter may be referred to Oversight Committee and Central Government for their considered final decision in the matter.

124. Starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sheikhpura, Patna, Bihar under Indira Gandhi Instt. Of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Patna u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the matter alongwith institute letter dated 18.01.2018 as well as the compliance dated 25.09.2017 with regard to starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sheikhpura, Patna, Bihar under Indira Gandhi Instt. Of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Patna u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter alongwith institute letter dated 18.01.2018 as well as the compliance dated 25.09.2017 with regard to starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sheikhpura, Patna, Bihar under Indira Gandhi Instt. Of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Patna u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19 and noted that there has been a typographical error in the earlier decision of the Postgraduate Committee dated 28.11.2017. The Committee observed that the following deficiencies as pointed out at its meeting held on 22.08.2017 still persist:-

1. Dr. Santosh Kumar, Professor is promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 3 year 7 month as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 y; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Indrajit Kumar is promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 2 year 5 month as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 4 year; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. He is not eligible even with publications.
3. Unit-I left with only 2 Asst. Professors.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS(Orthopaedics) course at Indira Gandhi Instt. Of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Patna u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2018-19.

Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
